Ranked as high as No. 20 nationally in singles and No. 6 nationally in ITA rankings in doubles with teammate Victoria Flores...Three-time ACC Player of the Week...Went 12-4 in dual singles... Opened the dual season going 3-1 in singles, all straight-set wins...Clinched Tech's win over Wisconsin (1/25) in ITA Kick-Off Weekend, topping Antonela Stoica, 6-3, 6-2, to put the Jackets in the championship match...Cruised to a 6-1, 6-4 victory over No. 8 Shiori Fukuda of No. 12 Ohio State (2/7) in the opening round of ITA National Team Indoors...Followed with another top-10 win against No. 6 Michaela Gordon of top-seeded Stanford (2/8), 0-6, 6-1, 6-2...Went undefeated in the tournament, pocketing a 6-2, 6-2 victory over Emmanuelle Salas of No. 9 Florida State (2/9)... Tabbed ACC Player of the Week following ITA National Team Indoors performance...Collected another top-15 win, defeating No. 15 Natasha Subhash of No. 9 Virginia (2/21), 7-5, 6-4, to give Tech its first lead of the match...Named ACC Player of the Week following win over Subhash...Pocketed a 3-6, 6-3, 1-0 (10-6) victory over No. 3 Alexa Graham of No. 1 North Carolina (3/6)... Capped singles season with a 6-2, 6-1 win over Natalie Novotna at No. 41 Virginia Tech (3/8)... Tabbed ACC Player of the Week following collecting her third win over a top-10 opponent...In doubles action, won first seven matches with Flores...Clinched the doubles point against No. 13 South Carolina (1/26) with a 6-3 decision over Horvit/Shelton to give the Jackets a 1-0 lead... Was deciding doubles match against Ohio State, topping Allen/Boulais, 6-4... Cruised to a 6-2 victory over No. 15 Allen/Hule of No. 9 Florida State to clinch the doubles point against the Seminoles...With a 6-2 victory over No. 41 Gullickson/O'Dell of No. 9 Virginia, gave Tech the early lead in the match...Rolled to a 6-1 victory over No. 11 Meredith/Omirou of No. 12 Wake Forest... Duo went 7-0 against ranked opponents during the season. Fall: Posted a 5-5 singles mark and 5-1 doubles ledger...Defeated No. 41 Alle Sanford of North Carolina in the Furman Fall Classic, 6-3, 6-0, to open the fall schedule...Competed in the ITA All-American Championships in Tulsa, Okla.... 2018-19 (Junior): Spring: Named ITA All-America in singles...First Team All-ACC...Tabbed ACC Co-Player of the Week on March 5...Climbed as high as No. 8 in the ITA national rankings in singles and earned a No. 15 final ranking on May 29... Went 16-7 in dual singles play and 12-8 in dual doubles action...Combined for a 29-12 overall singles ledger and 20-13 overall doubles mark...Went 11-3 in ACC singles action from the No. 1 position and 8-4 against league opponents in doubles... Picked up a super tiebreak victory over No. 22 Maria Mateas at Duke (3/1) for her second ranked singles win of the season...Downed two top-10 singles opponents to close the regular season... Upended No. 6 Alexa Graham of top-ranked UNC (4/12), 7-5, 6-1, before defeating No. 8 Anna Rogers of No. 9 NC State (4/14), 6-4, 7-6 (5)...Helped lift Tech to victory over Ohio State (5/3) in the NCAA Tournament with a straight-set win over Isabelle Boulais, 6-0, 6-4... Won five-straight doubles victories from Feb. 24 against Pitt to March 10 at Louisville with teammate Nadia Gizdova... Picked up a doubles win over Syracuse in the ACC Tournament (4/18). **Fall:** Was 13-5 in singles and 8-5 in doubles during tournament play...Ranked No. 44 in singles in the ITA preseason poll... Advanced to the main draw of the Riviera/ITA All-American Championships in California in Oct. winning three qualifying matches...Reached the round of 16 before falling to Gonzaga's Sophie Whittle in three sets... Advanced to the main draw singles guarterfinals and doubles semifinals with teammate Dalila Said in the ITA Southeast Regionals hosted by Georgia Tech... Opened the spring season going 2-1 in singles at the Michigan Invitational.

2017-18 (Sophomore): Spring: Climbed as high as No. 60 in the ITA national rankings in singles and was half of the top doubles team in the country with Paige Hourigan...All-ACC second team...ITA doubles All-American with Hourigan...Went 20-6 in dual singles play and 11-2 against ACC opponents...Combined for an 18-5 dual doubles record including an 8-3 league mark... Earned the ACC's automatic doubles bid with Hourigan into the NCAA Championships...Earned an at-large bid into singles through an alternate position in the NCAA Championships...Went on a 21-4 match win streak during the course of the regular season...Only conference losses came against Duke's No. 26 Kelly Chen and Virginia Tech's Caroline Daxhelet...Won both singles matches in the ACC Tournament, helping Tech reach the semifinals... Fell in the opening round of the NCAA singles championship to Vanderbilt's No. 10 Fernanda Contreras...Reached the guarterfinals of the NCAA Championships in doubles with Hourigan... Tabbed as the top-seeded doubles team, the pair defeated Denver and Loyola Marymount to reach the guarterfinals against North Carolina's No. 33 Alle Sanford and Sara Daavettila. Fall: Ranked No. 3 doubles team in the country with Paige Hourigan and No. 103 in singles in the preseason fall rankings...Reached the doubles championship match of the ITA Southeast Regionals with teammate Hourigan... Fell in the championship match to FIU's Ulyana Grib and Maryna Veksler... Earned a berth into the ITA National Fall Championships through regionals performance...Duo went 3-1 in California and reached the semifinals...Posted a 5-4 singles record and 11-5 doubles mark during tournament play.

2016-17 (Freshman): Spring - Put together a 23-7 dual singles record and 25-3 doubles mark with partner Paige Hourigan ... Earned NCAA at-large doubles berth with Hourigan ... Duo upset Florida's No. 11 Anna Danilina/Ingrid Neel, 6-1, 3-6, 10-6 in the first round to advance to the round of 16 ... Tandem fell in round of 16 to Alabama's No. 5 Maddie Pothoff/Erin Routliffe 7-5, 5-7, 10-6 ... Duo broke into the ITA rankings at No. 30 on Feb. 21 ... Finished the season ranked No. 17 ... Competed mainly at the No. 4 position in singles play ... After dropping her first ACC match, won next nine matches against ACC foes ... Won all three singles matches in straight sets during Tech's run to the NCAA round of 16. Fall - Saw action in four tournaments ... Went 2-1 in singles play to open the season at the Hall of Fame ITA Grass Court Invitational ... Also posted a 2-1 singles record in the Bulldog Challenge and picked up a pair of doubles wins with Alexa Anton-Ohlmeyer ... Competed for the Selia Mathew Singles Draw title at the Roberta Alison Fall Classic, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Pocketed a three-set win over Clemson (2/28) before defeating No. 79 Eliza Omirou of No. 12 Wake Forest (3/1), 6-4, 6-7 (4), 1-0 (9)...Capped season with a 4-6, 7-6 (6) , 1-0 (12) battle against Nika Kozar of No. 41 Virginia Tech (3/8)...In doubles action, opened spring with a 7-0 record...Picked up a 6-4 victory over No. 23 Dillon/Adams of Furman (1/18)...Pocketed a 6-3 win over Makarova/Markham of Wisconsin (1/25)

Won Tech's only doubles match against No. 9 Virginia (2/21), topping No. 41 Gullickson/'Dell, 6-2...Dropped only four games over the next three matches to pick up wins against Boston College (2/23), Clemson (2/28) and Wake Forest (3/1)...Capped season with a 6-1 win over No. 78 Danailova/Kozar of Virginia Tech (3/8). Fall: Went 8-2 in singles action and 5-2 in doubles...Captured flight two doubles title at Furman Fall Classic with teammate Kenya Jones and reached championship singles match to open the fall...Doubles pair down No. 41 Kelly Chen and Margaryta Bilokin of Duke, 8-4, for the title...Claimed singles title of flight five at Furman Fall Classic, defeating OSU's Luna Domet, 6-4, 6-2...Went 3-1 in singles and 0-1 in doubles at ITA Southeast Regional...Reached quarterfinals of main draw singles at regional after topping No. 62 Ksenia Kuznetsova in the round of 16, 6-3, 6-2... SMU, 1983 NINTH SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

Georgia Tech hired Rodney Harmon July 3, 2012, as the seventh head women's tennis coach in school history.

Harmon led the Yellow Jackets to a fifth place finish in the ACC during a shortened 2019-20 season due to Covid-19. Tech posted a 15-6 overall record and went 5-2 in league play before seasons were suspended due to the pandemic. During the 2020 season, the Jackets captured the ITA Kick-Off Weekend at South Carolina, defeating Wisconsin and USC to claim a spot in the ITA National Team Indoor Championships in February. Tech's No. 1 doubles duo of Kenya Jones and Victoria Flores were tabbed ITA All-Americans at the conclusion of the season. Jones and Flores went 20-2 overall, including a 15-1 dual record and 6-0 ACC ledger, and climbed as high as No. 6 in the ITA national polls. Additionally, Jones earned ITA All-America status in singles after leading the Jackets from the top singles spot, compiling a 17-9 overall record. Tabbed ACC Player of the Week three times during the season, Jones rose to No. 20 nationally in singles.

In 2018-19, the Yellow Jackets recorded their 20th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. Tech defeated No. 25 Ohio State in the round of 64, 4-3, before the Jackets fell to No. 8 Vanderbilt in the round of 32. Junior Kenya Jones was tabbed ITA All-American after going 29-12 overall from the No. 1 singles position. Jones rose as high as No. 8 in the national rankings and finished the campaign ranked No. 15. Additionally, Jones was tabbed all-ACC first team.

The 2017-18 women's tennis season was one for the record books as the Yellow Jackets recorded just the second trip in program history to the NCAA Semifinals. The Jackets capped the year with a 25-6 overall record and 12-2 ACC ledger, reaching the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Tech climbed as high as No. 2 in the national rankings during the season and boasted the No. 1 doubles team in the country, Paige Hourigan and Kenya Jones, for several weeks on the national polls. Three Jackets collected all-ACC honors at the end of the season: Hourigan (first team), Jones (second team) and Johnnise Renaud (third team). Hourigan and Jones also earned the ACC's automatic berth into the NCAA Championships as a doubles tandem. The pair, who were tabbed ITA All-Americans, reached the NCAA quarterfinals after helping the team advance to the semifinals.

After earning their 19th consecutive NCAA Tournament berth, the Jackets defeated Eastern Kentucky and Winthrop in the NCAA Regional to reach the round of 16 where they recorded a comeback win over Pepperdine to clinch a spot in the Elite Eight. In the quarterfinals, Tech posted another comeback win over No. 14 UCLA. After trailing the Bruins, 3-1, Nami Otsuka, Hourigan and Ida Jarlskog lifted the Jackets past the Bruins, 4-3, to the semifinals. Tech fell in the NCAA Semifinals to top-seeded and No. 2 Vanderbilt, 4-2.

In 2016-17, Harmon led the Jackets to a remarkable ledger of 27-5. Tech claimed a share of the ACC regular season championship, going 13-1 in league play and remained undefeated against league opponents until the final match of the regular season. On April 29, the Jackets avenged their only ACC loss of the season at Duke, with a 4-2 win over the Blue Devils in the ACC Championship semifinals. With the win, Tech made its sixth appearance in the ACC Championship match since 1986, but dropped a heartbreaker to UNC, 4-3. Four Jackets earned ACC recognition as Rasheeda McAdoo and Jonnise Renaud were named All-ACC first team, Paige Hourigan was tabbed All-ACC second team and freshman Nami Otsuka was listed on the All-ACC third team. For the second consecutive season, Harmon was named the ACC Coach of the Year. Additionally, Harmon was tabbed the 2017 Wilson/ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year, becoming the second coach in program history to earn the honor.

Tech continued its postseason success in 2017, making its 18th straight NCAA Tournament appearance and hosted the first- and second-rounds at the Ken Byers Tennis Complex. The Jackets upended Alabama State and Northwestern to reach the Sweet 16 for the second straight year before falling to Oklahoma State in the Round of 16 in Athens. McAdoo and Renaud both earned individual NCAA singles bids in addition to earning a doubles bid to the NCAA Championships. The Tech duo of Hourigan/Kenya Jones also received a doubles bid and advanced to the second round. At the conclusion of the season, Harmon was named the Wilson/ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year. In his fourth season on The Flats, Harmon led the Jackets to a 19-9 overall record

and 11-3 ACC ledger. Tech reached the semifinals of the ACC tournament, falling to Miami, but rebounded, earning an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament for the 17th consecutive season. By way of winning the Columbia, S.C. regional, Tech advanced to the round of 16 in Tulsa, Oklahoma where they fell to Ohio State. Harmon was named the ACC Coach of the Year, while Johnnise Renaud was tabbed All-ACC first team and Paige Hourigan was named All-ACC third team. Renaud and Hourigan each earned NCAA singles bids, while the pair of Kendal Woodard/Hourigan earned a doubles bid as well.

During his third season on the Flats, Harmon led his team to a 17-10 overall record and a 9-5 mark in ACC play. The Yellow Jackets made their 16th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round, and finished the season ranked #20 in the ITA Rankings. During the ACC Tournament, the Jackets advanced to their fifth ACC Championship Title Match before falling to Virginia. Georgia Tech finished the ACC season in sixth and both freshmen Johnnise Renaud and Paige Hourigan were named to the All-ACC Second Team.

Harmon's second season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets started off with a bang after sophomores Megan Kurey and Kendal Woodard won the USTA/ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships doubles title. The duo also captured the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional Doubles title during the fall. Kurey and Woodard were ranked as the number one doubles team in the country on February 11, 2014 and received the #6 seed in the 2014 NCAA doubles championships. Woodard garnered conference honors for the second season in a row after being named to the All-ACC First Team while Kurey was named to the All-ACC Second Team.

The Yellow Jackets went 14-10 overall and 9-5 in the ACC during Harmon's second year at the helm of the Jackets. Tech closed out the 2014 regular season with an exciting 4-3 win against No. 1 Duke. The win against the top-ranked team in the country was the first of Harmon's career and fourth in the history of the Yellow Jackets. The Jackets received the six seed in the 2014 ACC Tournament and advanced to the quarter finals before falling to Virginia.

In 2014, Tech received its 15th straight berth in the NCAA Tournament. The Yellow Jackets defeated Purdue in the first round, 4-0, before falling to overall nine seed Vanderbilt, 4-2, in the second round.

Harmon had quite the successful first season on the Flats, leading his team to a 15-10 record and a 7-4 mark in the ACC. The Jackets reached its highest ranking of the season in the ITA rankings at #19 during the week of April 9th. Tech defeated nine ranked teams, including four that were ranked in the top-25. Freshman Kendal Woodard was honored on the 2013 All-ACC Women's Tennis Team while Elizabeth Kilborn, Megan Kurey and Elizabeth Kurey were all named to the All-ACC Academic team during Harmon's first year.

Harmon brings 25 years of player development to the Yellow Jackets with prior experience in both junior and college tennis. Most recently he served as the director of tennis at the Deerwood Country Club in Jacksonville, Fla.

Harmon was the men's tennis head coach at the University of Miami from 1995

until 1997 where he brought in the No. 1 recruiting class in 1996, led by No. 1 recruit Michael Russell. Harmon was the 1996 and 1997 Big East Conference Coach of the Year during his time with the Hurricanes.

Harmon left the Hurricanes to re-join the United States Tennis Association training center headquarters in Boca Raton, Fla., where he advanced to director of men's tennis. During his tenure at the USTA, Harmon served as the head coach of the U.S. men's tennis team at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China.

Before joining Miami, Harmon spent four years as the USTA national coach where he coached future pros including Todd Martin, MaliVai Washington and Alex O'Brien. During his first stint with the USTA, Harmon served as the U.S. men's tennis head coach at the 1993 World University Games in Buffalo, N.Y.

Harmon began his collegiate career at the University of Tennessee before transferring to Southern Methodist University where he graduated from with a Bachelor of Arts in Broadcast/Film in May, 1983. He was the 1980 NCAA Doubles champion at Tennessee with Mel Purcell and advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Singles Championship. Harmon and Purcell were the 1980 ITA Doubles Team of the Year and Harmon won the SEC No. 2 singles title.

After transferring to SMU, Harmon won the 1982 and 1983 Southwest Conference No. 1 singles title. He was inducted into the ITA Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame in 2010.

Alexis Casati joined the Georgia Tech women's tennis program as assistant coach in September 2020. She arrived on The Flats after a stay at SMU.

Casati spent last season at SMU as a volunteer coach where she helped the Mustangs to a 9-5 record (2-1 American) before the season was shortened due to the Covid-19 pandemic. SMU opened the season with a six-match win streak under first-year head coach Jeff Nevolo and was capped with Jackie Nylander earning Texas Region Rookie of the Year honors.

Prior to arriving at SMU, Casati served as the assistant coach at Western Michigan for two seasons. During her stint with the Broncos, Casati tutored four student-athletes to all-MAC honors, and helped guide WMU to an impressive 2018-19 season, finishing third in the MAC after recording only two conference wins in 2017-18. WMU turned in a 12-11 overall record in 2018, its best mark since 2016, and went 11-3 at home.

Casati also helped recruit WMU's 2018 fall recruiting class, the best class since 2014 and the biggest in program history. During her first season with WMU, the Broncos went 11-13 overall, including a 9-3 home record, and had two players earn all-MAC second team honors. Additionally, Denise Azcui became the second Bronco in program history to be named the ITA Division I Midwest Regional Arthur Ashe Jr. Leadership & Sportsmanship Award recipient.

A native of Deerfield, Ill., Casati was a four-year letterwinner at the University of Illinois, finishing with a career singles mark of 67-47 playing mainly at No. 1 and No. 2. She earned all-Big Ten honors her sophomore season and was also a three-time Academic All-Big Ten recipient. Casati was named team captain twice and was a three-time MVP. She finished her freshman season with a 30-10 overall singles mark, tying the Illinois freshman record for singles win in a season.

Casati graduated from Illinois in May of 2017 with a degree in journalism. She earned a master's degree in sports management from Western Michigan in 2019.

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH GEORGIA TECH, 2012 SECOND SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

Austin Roebuck begins his second season as a volunteer assistant coach with the Georgia Tech women's tennis program for the 2020-21 season.

Roebuck arrived on The Flats for the 2019-20 women's tennis season, helping the Yellow Jackets to a 15-6 overall record and 5-2 ACC ledger before the remainder of the season was canceled due to Covid-19. Tech finished the season ranked No. 9 nationally and picked up wins over seven nationally-ranked opponents, including No. 13 South Carolina, No. 12 Ohio State, No. 9 Virginia and No. 12 Wake Forest. The shortened 2019-20 season was highlighted by a trip to the ITA National Team Indoor Championships where Tech upended No. 12 Ohio State, 4-1, to reach the quarterfinals.

Prior to his arrival on The Flats, Roebuck served as the volunteer assistant coach for the men's and women's tennis programs at Kennesaw State for the spring 2019 campaign. While with the Owls, he helped develop practice plans, served as an on-court coach for home dual matches, provided statistical analysis on matches and assisted with travel logistics.

Roebuck has also held stints at the ATi Tennis Academy as the managing partner and director and served as a USTA Team Coach.

A four-year letterwinner for Georgia Tech men's tennis, Roebuck played under head coach Kenny Thorne from 2006-09. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration with a concentration in general management from Georgia Tech in May 2012.

Todd Stansbury, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was introduced as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

In just three full years as the athletics director at his alma mater, Stansbury has overseen a resurgence on The Flats. Most notably, the Yellow Jackets have put together consecutive ultra-successful years athletically.

In 2018-19, Georgia Tech leapt 55 spots in the final Learfield IMG Directors' Cup standings, good for Tech's highest finish in the national all-sports competition since 2010-11.

The Jackets were on pace for a similarly successful campaign in 2019-20. When the sports world came to a halt due to the global Covid-19 pandemic in March 2020, Georgia Tech men's basketball had just finished off the program's best Atlantic Coast Conference season in 24 years, women's basketball was on the NCAA Tournament bubble and golf and women's tennis were both ranked in the top 10 nationally. Additionally, Georgia Tech volleyball won the 2019 National Invitational Volleyball Championship and Tech football, under first-year head coach Geoff Collins, secured only the second top-25-ranked recruiting class in school history.

Academically, Georgia Tech was the only institution from a Power Five conference that had a multiyear NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) higher than the national average in every sport in 2018-19, a feat it nearly replicated in 2019-20, when 13 of its 14 programs compiled an APR above the national average in their respective sports.

In the community, Stansbury led the charge to institute Georgia Tech athletics' Jackets Without Borders international service program, which won the ACC's prestigious Game Changers award for community service in 2019.

Under Stansbury, Georgia Tech athletics has also reached new heights in fundraising. The Alexander-Tharpe Fund, the Georgia Tech Athletic Association's fundraising arm set records for funds raised in consecutive fiscal years (2019 and 2020) and Athletics Initiative 2020, Tech athletics' drive to raise \$125 for facilities, endowments and operations in a three-year span from 2018-20, surpassed its goal six months ahead of its Dec. 31, 2020 deadline.

The uptick in fundraising has led to a much-needed revitalization of Georgia Tech's athletics facilities, including:

a new \$4.5 million football locker room;

a series of exciting upgrades to football's Bobby Dodd Stadium, highlighted by a new state-of-the-art Shaw Sports Turf Legion NXT playing surface, new LED lighting system, new sound system and all new re-branded signage throughout the stadium;

a new \$2.5 million women's basketball locker room and team area;

the \$9 million Phase II renovation project at baseball's Russ Chandler Stadium, featuring a concourse-level atrium that will serve as an iconic point of entry on gamedays, new premium seating areas, including a terrace view club that overlooks the field and Atlanta skyline and a new, expanded, state-of-the-art indoor training facility;

a \$1.2 million investment in new videoboards at several competition venues (baseball, softball, volleyball and tennis, as well as Bobby Dodd Stadium's Callaway Plaza); a refresh of the student-athletes' nutrition center and training table.

Still to come is groundbreaking on the crown jewel of Al 2020, the \$70 million renovation of the Edge/Rice Center. The new Edge/Rice Center will serve as a sleek and innovative home base for Georgia Tech athletics' teams and administration, a one-stop shop for key student-athlete services, an anchor for recruiting efforts and a showcase for the Institute's commitment to student-athlete success and fan engagement.

Stansbury began setting the stage for these accomplishments as soon as he officially arrived back on The Flats on Nov. 28, 2016. In the first months of his tenure as athletics

director, he identified four strategic priorities for Georgia Tech athletics — to define the GT athletics brand, to establish an internal culture, to align the internal structure and to generate new revenue. He has addressed those priorities through a slew of initiatives and accomplishments. Highlights include:

- a significant revenue lift, which can be traced in large part to an innovative overhaul of sales operations that focused on integrating fundraising and ticket sales efforts;
- the establishment of a partnership with adidas to serve as the official apparel provider of Georgia Tech athletics, which was announced on Aug. 22, 2017 and went into affect on July 1, 2018;
- a re-emphasis on Georgia Tech athletics iconic Total Person Program, with investments for additional staff and programming for student-athletes, including the department's first three Jackets Without Borders service trips to Costa Rica (2017) and Puerto Rico (2018 and 2019);
- a comprehensive brand refinement that included defining Georgia Tech athletics' official colors, Tech's first-ever athletics wordmark and a simplification of the iconic interlocking GT logo;
- the creation of Georgia Tech's "Gold Code," which outlines the department's core values, brand differentiators, vision, mission and the Everyday Champions formula Winning + The Institute + Total Person Program = Everyday Champions;
- the establishment of two new offices within the athletics department the office of brand and ideation, which works to identify and tell the story of the Yellow Jackets' brand, and the office of innovation, which oversees Georgia Tech's efforts to build on its status as college athletics' leader in innovation, particularly through collaboration and partnerships with the Institute and innovation hubs throughout Atlanta.

A native of Oakville, Ontario, Stansbury was initially drawn to Georgia Tech when he befriended several Tech football student-athletes while on a family vacation in Florida as a youngster. The student-athletes invited Stansbury and his family to attend a practice on their way back through Atlanta . They accepted and, after visiting campus, Stansbury was determined to attend and play football at Tech.

Several years later, he was offered and accepted a football scholarship to attend Tech. He enrolled in 1980 and played linebacker and special teams for the Yellow Jackets under head coach Bill Curry. He went on to be selected in the third round of the Canadian Football League draft by the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1984 but after a brief CFL career, returned to Atlanta to begin a banking career.

In 1988, he left banking and returned to The Flats to become an academic advisor for Georgia Tech's football program. In 1991, he was promoted to assistant athletics director for academics by legendary A.D. Homer Rice.

After leaving Tech in 1995, Stansbury's career included stops at Houston (associate A.D. - 1997-2000) and Oregon State (executive associate A.D. - 2003-12), as well as three stints as an athletics director at East Tennessee State (2000-03), UCF (2012-15) and Oregon State (2015-16).

Stansbury and his wife, Karen, who were married inside the current Edge Center, reside in Atlanta. After they were married in 1995, the couple traveled the world for 18 months before returning to the United States.

INSTITUTE PRESIDENT

B.S./M.S., UNIVERSIDAD POLITÉCNICA DE MADRID M.S./PH.D., GEORGIA TECH

On Sept. 1, 2019, the Georgia Institute of Technology welcomed Ángel Cabrera as its 12th president. Cabrera came to Georgia Tech after serving for seven years as president of George Mason University (GMU) in Fairfax, Virginia.

Under his leadership for the past year thousands of members of the Georgia Tech community have contributed to a new 10-year strategic plan to be launched fall 2020. The plan is grounded on a new mission statement that was approved by the Board of Regents in May and reaffirms Tech's commitment to "developing leaders who advance technology and improve the human condition."

He is leading the Institute through one of the most critical times in its history in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, internally to prioritize the health and safety of the Tech community and externally to develop innovative solutions to combat the disease.

Cabrera is a Georgia Tech alumnus, the second in the Institute's 135-year history to serve as president. He holds an M.S. and Ph.D. in cognitive psychology from Georgia Tech, which he attended as a Fulbright Scholar. He also holds a telecommunications engineering degree from Universidad Politécnica de Madrid (B.S. and M.S. in computer and electrical engineering).

President Cabrera met his wife, Beth, while both were graduate students at Georgia Tech. Dr. Beth Fraser Cabrera was a management professor at Carlos III University in Madrid and Arizona State University, and currently delivers leadership development programs for business executives. Their son Alex, who recently received his undergraduate degree from the Institute, is a PhD student at Carnegie Mellon University. Daughter Emilia is a senior at Harvard University.

Cabrera serves on the boards of the Atlanta Committee for Progress, the Bankinter Foundation for Innovation, the Metro Atlanta Chamber, and the National Geographic Society. He is serving on the newly formed Task Force to Restore Georgia's Economy.

Under Cabrera's leadership, George Mason University reached the top tier among research universities in the Carnegie Classification and accounted for more than half of all public university enrollment growth in Virginia. Before becoming GMU's president, Cabrera served as dean of IE Business School in Madrid and president of Thunderbird School of Global Management (now part of Arizona State University). As a business educator, Cabrera played a key role in advancing professional ethics, internationalization, and corporate social responsibility. As a senior advisor to the United Nations Global Compact, in 2007 he was the lead author of the "Principles for Responsible Management Education," now adopted by more than 700 schools around the world. Cabrera's research has been published in leading academic journals. He has been quoted by leading global media, including The Economist, BBC, CNN, CNBC, El País, Forbes, The International Herald Tribune, and The New York Times. His op-eds have been published by The Washington Post and the international press, and he has appeared on NPR programs and PBS NewsHour.

He's been named a "Young Global Leader" by the World Economic Forum, a "Star of Europe" by Businessweek, "Henry Crown Fellow" by the Aspen Institute, and "Great Immigrant" by the Carnegie Corporation of New York. He has received honorary degrees from Miami Dade College and Universidad Politécnica of Madrid. He is the first native of Spain to serve as president of an American university.

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE

B.E., VANDERBILT, 2002 PH.D., PURDUE, 2008

Baratunde A. Cola knows just what it takes to be a student and an athlete at the highest collegiate level.

A professor of heat transfer, combustion and energy systems in the George W. Woodruff School of Mechanical Engineering, Cola was named faculty athletics representative (FAR) to the Georgia Tech Athletic Association with his three-year term beginning in July 2020. The FAR serves as the liaison between the Institute and the Athletic Association on issues regarding rules compliance, developments at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and activities related to Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) membership.

Cola began his education at Vanderbilt University where he was a football student-athlete and the starting fullback in 2002. He graduated with a bachelor's of education degree after winning the football program's dedication award, before going on to earn his master's degree from Vanderbilt in 2004.

After six years at Vanderbilt, he began researching thermal applications of carbon nanotubes at Purdue University, interning as a test research and development engineer at Intel Corporation in 2007, as he worked toward earning his Ph.D. from the university in 2008.

From there Cola had a brief stay as a visiting scholar at the University of Texas at Dallas before joining the faculty at Georgia Tech in April 2009 as an assistant professor.

Cola's research is currently focused on understanding and designing thermal transport and energy conversion in nanostructures and devices. His group develops tools to characterize thermal transport across several orders of scale for this purpose. They seek to solve problems with high importance to applications in clean energy (e.g. direct conversion) and the efficient utilization of energy (e.g. more efficient thermal management), and in major industrial segments such as consumer electronics, enterprise services (e.g. the cloud supporting infrastructure), transportation, and lighting.

Cola was promoted to professor at Georgia Tech in 2019.

GEORGIA TECH WINS NCAA WOMEN'S TENNIS TITLE

Jackets Defeat UCLA 4-2 in Championship Match

Athens, Ga. -- Kristi Miller, Amanda McDowell and Christy Striplin won singles matches and then senior Alison Silverio provided the clinching victory at No. 2 singles to give Georgia Tech a 4-2 victory over UCLA in the NCAA championship match Tuesday at Henry Feild Stadium. The championship is the first NCAA title in any sport for Georgia Tech, which has also won four national championships in football via wire service polls.

"I just couldn't be happier," said Tech head coach Bryan Shelton, whose team won its 21st straight match to finish the season at 29-4. "We fought our tails off. For Ali (Silverio) to come through in the clutch one more time for us in the final match of her career is just unbelievable."

Tech fell behind by losing the doubles point and then trailed 2-1 before Miller and Striplin put the Jackets back on top 3-2 with Silverio just beginning her third set. Tech trailed in the remaining match on court six when Silverio finished off 40th-ranked Tracy Lin with a dominating 6-1 win in the third. Silverio had won the first 7-5 but dropped the second, also 7-5. Silverio, who also clinched the Jackets' quarterfinal win over Fresno State, was named the Most Valuable Player of the NCAA Tournament.


McDowell earned Tech's first singles win with a 6-1, 6-0 blitzing of Ashley Joelson at No. 4 singles. The freshman from Atlanta won her 10th straight match and her team-leading 39th of the season. She was undefeated in the NCAA matches to earn a spot on the all-tournament team.

One day after clinching Tech's semifinal win over California, Striplin again provided a key victory as she rallied for a three-set win over Alex McGoodwin at No. 5 singles. After losing the first set, Striplin won 12 of the final 14 games for a 4-6, 6-1, 6-2 victory and was also named to the all-tournament team.

Miller, ranked sixth in the nation, defeated No. 15 Riza Zalameda at No. 1 singles, 6-3, 7-6.

UCLA dominated in doubles winning 8-3 at both No. 1 and No. 2, although the Jackets led on court three when doubles ended. Zalameda and Yasmin Schnack defeated Tech's third-raked duo of Miller and Whitney McCray, and Joelson and Goodwin downed Silverio and Amanda Craddock.

The Bruins earned a singles win from Schnack, who defeated Craddock at No. 3, and Lumpkin was leading for UCLA at No. 6.

2005 ACC CHAMPIONS



CARY, N.C. - Tournament MVP Alison Silverio came back after dropping her first set to win at No. 4 singles and lift sixth-ranked Georgia Tech to a 4-3 victory over No. 12 Miami in the finals of the ACC Championship.

It marks the first ACC Championship in Georgia Tech tennis history.

"I think it's so hard to win an ACC title and it's hard enough to get into the finals, much less complete the task by winning the tournament," said head coach Bryan Shelton. "In 1988, we [the men's team] came so close, just one match away from winning. Kenny [Thorne, head coach for Georgia Tech men's tennis] and I were out there in the end and couldn't quite get it done, so it has been a long time coming to have this opportunity again. It doesn't feel much different, being a coach or player, as it is just as satisfying to win now as a coach. The girls on the court are the ones that got it done though, they deserve all of the credit."

In the tournament, the Yellow Jackets went 11-4 in singles matches, including a perfect 3-0 mark by Silverio. She also teamed with Kristi Miller to clinch the doubles point against the Hurricanes earlier in the day.

The Yellow Jackets carried a 1-0 lead into singles play by earning wins at the No. 1 and 3 doubles positions. After the Hurricane duo of Megan Bradley and Staci Stevens defeated Lyndsay Shosho and Dasha Potapova, 8-5, at the No. 2 slot, the Yellow Jacket duo of Whitney McCray and Kelly Anderson downed Patricia Starzyk and Caren Seenauth, 8-5 at No. 3, setting up the top doubles slot for the clinching point.

No. 18 Miller and Silverio then stopped a comeback by Audrey Banada and Melissa Applebaum to clinch the doubles point for the Yellow Jackets with a 9-7 score at the No. 1 position.

Banada tied the match at 1-1 when she defeated Shosho, 6-1, 6-1, at the No. 5 singles position, and Miami took a 2-1 lead in the match when No. 99 Emily Mowery downed Tech's Kacie Anson, 6-2, 6-0, at the No. 6 position.

After Miami went up 3-1 with a 6-3, 6-4 win by the nation's top-ranked Bradley at No. 1 singles, the Yellow Jackets battled back with wins at the Nos. 2 and 3 positions.

At No. 2, Potapova battled the Hurricane's Stevens, winning 6-2, 7-5, and the Jackets' Anderson came back after winning a tiebreaker in the first set to defeat Applebaum, 7-6 (6), 6-1.

Silverio then came back to win her second set 6-4 after dropping the first by a 5-7 mark and then breezed through the final set, 6-2 against Starzyk, to give the Yellow Jackets their first ACC Championship.

2006 ACC CHAMPIONS



CARY, N.C. - With singles wins by Kelly Anderson, Kristi Miller and Christy Striplin, the 10th-ranked Georgia Tech women's tennis team captured its second ACC Championship in as many years with a 4-1 victory over No. 9 Miami Sunday afternoon at the Cary Tennis Center in Cary, NC.

With the win, the Yellow Jackets tied their previous season-high with their 21st win, moving to 21-5 on the season, while Miami dropped to 19-6.

"Our goal from the first day of practice in the fall was to come back and win the ACC Championship," said Georgia Tech head coach Bryan Shelton. "The girls have kept that goal in front of them all year, and for them to come out and keep that against a great Miami team is just a credit to the heart and discipline that they show every day."

Tech improved to 5-3 against the Hurricanes, and are a perfect 5-0 against Miami since Shelton began coaching on the Flats in 2000. After earning the first ACC Tennis Championship in school history a year ago, the Jackets are now back-to-back champions for the first time in history.

The Jackets took a 1-0 lead in the match with quick victories at the Nos. 2 and 3 doubles slots. The Tech duo of Kacie Anson and Alison Silverio dropped Caren Seenauth and Patricia Starzyk, 8-3, on court three before Anderson and Whitney McCray captured the deciding point with an 8-4 victory over Monika Dancevic and Audrey Banada at the No. 2 position.

"I think that our team stepped up in so many spots today," said Shelton. "It started with our best doubles effort of the year, and it culminated with players stepping up in singles."

Anderson, ranked No. 111 in singles, gave the Jackets a 2-0 edge with a 6-0, 6-3 victory over Starzyk on court five before No. 83 Melissa Applebaum pulled the 'Canes within one point with a 6-2, 6-4 win over No. 60 Lyndsay Shosho at No. 2 singles

ACC Tournament MVP Kristi Miller, the top-ranked singles player in the nation, then pushed the score to 3-0 with a hard-fought 6-4, 6-3 victory over the nation's No. 2 singles player, ACC Player of the Year Audra Cohen, before Striplin clinched the championship for the Jackets with a 6-1, 7-5 win against Seenauth at the No. 6 slot in the lineup.

"Up and down the lineup, I saw quality tennis all day long," added Shelton, "and at the end of the day, we were holding the trophy. I'm just really proud of this group of players."

CARY, N.C. - Christy Striplin won 12 of her last 13 games en route to a 2-6, 6-0, 6-1 victory at No. 5 singles to clinch match point as the fifth-ranked Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets (23-4) captured their third-straight ACC Women's Tennis Championship with a 4-1 win over No. 11 Miami in the title match Sunday afternoon at the Cary Tennis Complex.

"It never gets old," said an elated Bryan Shelton, head coach of the three-time ACC Champion women's tennis

For the third-straight day, the Yellow Jackets were led by freshman Amanda Craddock, who ended the tournament with a 3-0 record in singles and a 2-0 mark in doubles to earn MVP honors. Craddock posted a 6-3, 6-2 win over Miami's 50th-ranked Audrey Banada to tie the match at 1-1 after the Hurricanes won the doubles point to start the day.

"A.C. is well deserving (of MVP honors) after her play this weekend," said Shelton. "Not only did she win, but she won convincingly in all of her matches. She was the catalyst for this team all weekend, and the honor is just a tribute to what she's done all season. She has gotten better and better as the season has gone on."

Freshman Amanda McDowell gave the Yellow Jackets a 2-1 lead with a 6-1, 6-1 victory over Romy Farah at the No. 4 singles spot before Tech's eighth-ranked Kristi Miller stunned top-ranked Audra Cohen, 7-5, 6-2, at the top singles spot to push the score to 3-1. It was the second time in as many ACC Championship matches that Miller has bested Cohen.

"Kristi's win was huge," said Shelton. "Last year she got over the hump, beating Audra at ACC's, and she made shockwaves throughout the rankings. I think the same happened again today. She fell behind early (to Cohen), but got gritty and stuck in there. Once (Miller) got on top, she didn't relinquish the lead. I'm so proud of her effort, especially after losing doubles. She came back strong to lead this team to victory."

Miami began singles play with a 1-0 lead after winning at the Nos. 1 and 3 doubles positions. Banada and Gina Sabatino stopped the Yellow Jacket tandem of Tarryn Rudman and Kirsten Flower, 8-3, at the third doubles spot before Tech's 51st-ranked duo of Alison Silverio and Craddock handed Caren Seenauth and Farah an 8-6 loss at the second doubles position, setting up the top doubles line as the deciding match.

Miami's 33rd-ranked Cohen and Laura Vallverdu then outlasted Miller and Whitney McCray, the nation's thirdranked doubles team, 8-6, to give the Hurricanes the first point of the match.

CARY, N.C. - Sophomore Irina Falconi pulled off a dramatic three-set victory to clinch seventh-seeded Georgia Tech team's 4-3 win over top-seeded and No. 1 ranked North Carolina in the finals of the 2010 ACC Tournament at the Cary Tennis Center.

The Yellow Jackets captured their fourth ACC Tournament title under head Bryan Shelton and first since 2007.
"What an incredible weekend," Shelton said. "It is certainly one of the biggest highlights in our program's history.
It was a really special weekend to be able to see our players believe and execute the game plans. We fought through a lot of adversity this weekend physically but just remained so mentally tough."

Falconi, the tournament MVP, split the first two sets with No. 22 Sanaz Marand before winning the match in the third set. 6-1, 3-6, 6-4.

"That was one of the gutsiest performances that I have seen," said Shelton about Falconi. "For her to be able to steady herself and get to the net on two of the biggest points of the match to clinch it for us was incredible for us."

The Yellow Jackets opened the day by taking two of three doubles matches to open up an early 1-0 lead over the Tar Heels. After Elizabeth Kilborn and Viet Ha Ngo fell on court three, the Jackets tandem of Hillary Davis and Lynn Blau picked up their teammates with an 8-6 victory over Sophie Grabinski and Jelena Durisic. With the point on the line, Tech's No. 1 duo of Falconi and Sasha Krupina came through with an 8-5 win over Marand and Katrina Tsang.

North Carolina pulled even with the Jackets when Jelena Durisic upended Krupina, 6-3, 6-2, at No. 3 singles. The Tar Heels Shinann Featherston followed with a 6-0, 6-2 win over Davis at the sixth position in the lineup to open a 2-1 advantage on Tech.

Kilborn evened the score at 2-2 with a 6-2, 7-5 victory over Grabinski on court five but the Tar Heels would answer right back when No. 51 Tsang finished off Ngo, 6-2, 6-4 at No. 2 singles.

Down 3-2, the Jackets Lynn Blau came from behind to win a huge 1-6, 6-3, 6-3 win over Gina Suarez-Malaguti on court four.

The match came down to Falconi, the nation's top-ranked player, and she did not disappoint. Falconi captured her school-record 26th dual-match victory of the season and has now won 20 straight matches to lead Tech to the title.

"We could not have done this without everyone on the team contributing," Shelton said. "This was truly a team effort this weekend. We got a lift from everyone on the team and it led us to this win."

Kristi Miller became Georgia Tech's first women's tennis All-American when she earned All-American honors in singles as a freshman. The Marysville, Mich., native went on to become the most decorated student-athlete in school history, as she own's Tech's career marks in singles victories (152) and doubles wins (110). A six-time All-American (four-times singles, two-times doubles), Miller has also earned the prestigious Honda Award for Women's Tennis (2006) and is a four-time all-Atlantic Coast Conference honoree. Miller's accolades include being named the 2008 ACC Player of the Year, the ITA National Player to Watch and ACC Tournament MVP in 2006 and the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2005. Miller is a three-time CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and finished her four-year degree with a perfect 4.0 grade point average at Georgia Tech.

LYNDSAY SHOSHO 2006 - DOUBLES



Lyndsay Shosho became the Yellow Jackets' second women's tennis All-American when she teamed with Kristi Miller to advance to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championships in her senior season (2006). The same year, Shosho set the then school record for singles wins in a season with 35 while breaking the mark for doubles victories at Tech. She currently stands fourth in Tech's record books with 83 career doubles wins and eighth with 84 career singles wins. In addition to earning All-America honors, Shosho was twice named All-Atlantic Coast Conference and helped lead Tech to its first two Atlantic Coast Conference Championships.

<u>Whitney McCray</u> 2007 - Doubles



Whitney McCray earned All-American accolades in doubles during the 2007 season when she teamed with Kristi Miller to earn the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Doubles Championships. The Yellow Jacket duo, which reached as high as No. 3 before finishing the season at No. 7 in the national rankings, were ranked in the top-10 for the last three months of the season. McCray ranks second all-time in the Yellow Jacket record books with 101 career doubles wins. She was part of all three ACC Championships and was a key member of Tech's NCAA Championship team in 2007.

AMANDA MCDOWELL 2008 - SINGLES



Amanda McDowell became the first Georgia Tech women's tennis player to win an individual national title when she captured the 2008 NCAA Singles Championship. Only the second Yellow Jacket to earn All-America accolades in singles, McDowell finished her sophomore season with a school record 45 singles wins. She was named the 2008 ITA National Player of the Year and was the 2008 Honda Award recipient for women's tennis.

IRINA FALCONIA 2009 - SINGLES 2010 - SINGLES



Irina Falconi became the fifth Yellow Jacket women to earn All-America honors and just the second freshman to be nationally recognized. Falconi won 30 matches including 18 over nationally-ranked players. She closed out her rookie campaign ranked No. 12 in the nation. In her sophomore, and final campaign on The Flats, by setting a school record for dual match wins, finishing 26-1. She posted a 40-3 overall singles mark, good for fourth all-time in the Tech annals. She posted a 30-3 mark against ranked foes and her. 930 winning percentage is by far the best in school history. Falconi was the No. 1 seed in the 2010 NCAA Singles Tournament and advanced to the quarterfinals.

JILLIAN O'NEILL 2012 - SINGLES



Jillian O'Neill became the sixth Jacket to earn All-America honors when she finished the season ranked No. 12 in the ITA rankings. The Montreal, Quebec, native finished the year with a team-best 30 singles wins and a 17-9 mark from the No. 1 spot in Tech's dual lineup. O'Neill claimed 16 wins over ranked foes. She advanced to the NCAA Singles Championship for the second time in 2012 and finished her two-year Tech career with a 54-29 singles record.

Megan Kurey earned All-American accolades in doubles during the 2014 season when she teamed with Kendal Woodard to earn a 5-8 seed in the NCAA Doubles Championships. The duo finished out the season ranked as the #7 doubles team in the nation. Kurey and Woodard finished the 2014 season with a 13-7 record. The tandem won the 2013 ITA/USTA Southeast Doubles Title and the 2013 USTA/ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships doubles title. Kurey was named to the All-ACC second team in 2014.

Kendal Woodard earned All-American accolades in doubles during the 2014 season when she teamed with Megan Kurey to earn a 5-8 seed in the NCAA Doubles Championships. The duo finished out the season ranked as the #7 doubles team in the nation. Kurey and Woodard finished the 2014 season with a 13-7 record. The tandem won the 2013 ITA/USTA Southeast Doubles Title and the 2013 USTA/ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships doubles title. Woodard was named to the All-ACC first team in 2014 and was named All-ACC in 2013.

PAIGE HOURIGAN 2018 - SINGLES & DOUBLES



Paige Hourigan earned All-American accolades in both singles and doubles her senior season on The Flats. In singles play, Hourigan posted a 24-13 overall recordand went 16-10 in dual action. A four-time all-ACC selection, Hourigan was named to the first team to cap her collegiate career. Ranked as high as No. 12 in the ITA rankings during the season where she finished the year, Hourigan reached the NCAA Tournament round of 16 in singles action before fallling to eventual national champion Arianne Hartono of Ole Miss. Hourigan received at-large bids to the NCAA Singles Championship all four years as a Yellow Jacket. With doubles partner, Kenya Jones, the tandem finished the season ranked No. 1 in the country in the final ITA rankings. The pair went 27-8 overall and 18-5 in dual competition. Earning the ACC's automatic NCAA Tournament bid, the tandem capped their season in the NCAA quarterfinals. They spent the entire season ranked in the top five in the country and both were named all-ACC.

KENYA JONES 2018 - DOUBLES 2019 - SINGLES 2020 - SINGLES & DOUBLES



Kenya Jones earned All-American accolades with doubles partner Paige Hourigan in 2017-18. The tandem finished the season ranked No. 1 in the country in the final ITA rankings. The pair went 27-8 overall and 18-5 in dual competition. Earning the ACC's automatic NCAA Tournament bid, the tandem capped their season in the NCAA quarterfinals. They spent the entire season ranked in the top five in the country and both were named all-ACC. Jones was then tabbed an All-American in singles her junior season, in 2018-19. She finished with a 29-12 overall mark and rose as high as No. 8 in the national rankings. She capped the campaign ranked No. 15 nationally. After a shortened 2019-20 season due to Covid-19, Jones capped her collegiate season earning ITA All-American status in both singles and doubles. She led the Jackets from the top singles and doubles positions all season, compiling an overall 17-9 record in singles, including a 12-4 mark in dual play. Jones posted a 5-2 record against ACC opponents, was named ACC Player of the Week three times and defeated three top-10 players during the spring season. She rose to No. 20 nationally in singles rankings. In doubles with partner Victoria Flores, the tandem went 20-2 overall, including a 15-1 dual record and 6-0 ACC ledger, all from the No. 1 spot. They went 7-0 against nationall ranked opponents and rose to No. 6 nationally in doubles rankings.

In doubles with partner Kenya Jones, Victoria Flores earned her first ITA All-America status following the shortened 2019-20 season due to Covid-19. The tandem went 20-2 overall, including a 15-1 dual record and 6-0 ACC ledger, all from the No. 1 spot. They went 7-0 against nationall ranked opponents and rose to No. 6 nationally in doubles rankings. Jones and Flores finished the season on an eight-match win streak.


