TOP STORYLINES

- No. 20 Georgia Tech returns home for a brief reprieve, hosting SEC foe Auburn on Tuesday at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium.
- Auburn is Georgia Tech's second-most played opponent in program history and the Jackets' oldest opponent. Tech and Auburn first squared off on April 10, 1897.
- The Jackets stopped the skid on Sunday when they won 4-2 over Notre Dame and will look to continue in the midweek before a pivotal ACC series against Virginia Tech.
- After a cold series offensively, Tech moves to No. 2 in the ACC, hitting .294 as a team.
- Georgia Tech also finds itself among the ACC's best in doubles (second), hits (second), on-base percentage (second), slugging percentage (second) and triples (second).
- True freshman **Kevin Parada** still leads the Jackets and is fifth in the ACC, hitting .378 on 42 hits.
- Also hitting north of .300 is **Luke Waddell** (.327), **Drew Compton** (.324), **Tres Gonzalez** (.322) and **Justyn-Henry Malloy** (.301).
- Gonzalez ranks third in the ACC in walks (23) and fourth in on-base percentage (.475), while Parada ranks second with 10 doubles.
- Getting the start on Tuesday and making his first collegiate appearance will be true freshman RHP **Marquis Grissom, Jr.**
- The son of two-time MLB all-star and former Atlanta Brave, Grissom, Jr. was rated as the 11th overall pitcher in the country by Perfect Game.
- In three years of showcase ball, the Atlanta native recorded a 6-2 record and a 2.30 ERA over 107 innings. He struck out 107 hitters for a better than 2:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

- Both Grissom and Brown come from terrific Atlanta stock in being the sons of Marquis Grissom and Kevin Brown.

- Grissom is a former Atlanta Braves outfielder who played 17 seasons in the Big Leagues, helping take the Braves to the 1995 World Series.

- A Georgia Tech Hall of Famer, Brown was a six-time all-star and two-time ERA title winner. He helped the Marlins to the 1995 World Series before signing the first \$100 million contact with the LA Dodgers in 1998.

- Tres Gonzalez** and Maxwell were both selected in the 2019 MLB Draft but chose to attend Georgia Tech. Maxwell was taken in the 30th round by the New York Yankees and Gonzalez was selected in the 37th round by the Dodgers.

- Drew Compton** ranked 10th in the nation at first base entering 2021 after being rated the fifth-best freshman position freshman last season.

STRENGTH-OF-SCHEDULE

- Since the beginning of the 2019 year, head coach Danny Hall has talked frequently about how the non-conference schedule needs to be a test and 2021 is no different.

- One year after having the toughest strength-of-schedule in the Atlantic Coast Conference two years in a row, Tech once again will play many of the top teams in the country.

- In the preseason polls, 10 opponents were ranked in the top 25, including No. 2 Louisville and No. 5 Virginia, who are two of the first three home ACC weekends to the season.

CARDIAC JACKETS

- Georgia Tech baseball has been in for exciting baseball over the last three seasons, posting a 13-8 record in one-run games.

- Last season, Tech posted a dramatic 4-3 win on Feb. 18 at Georgia Southern and walked off Virginia Tech on Friday night in its lone ACC weekend to finish 2-2.

- Since 2002, Tech has posted a nearly 60-percent win percentage in one-run games (.585).

IT STARTS AT HOME...

- "It Starts at Home" has been the offseason motto for Georgia Tech, putting an emphasis on getting victories at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium after going 26-11 in 2019.

- Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .760 percent of its games at home (958-307-1).

- Over the previous two seasons alone, Tech recorded 57 home runs at home and outscored its guests 376-242 overall.

- Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in one full season – 2017.

- Currently through 15 home games in 2021, Tech is hitting .318.

SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia Tech and Auburn have faced off a whopping 241 times since their inaugural meeting in 1897.

- Auburn is Georgia Tech's oldest opponent still around, having first squared off April 10, 1897.

- This season, Tech will play all 10 of its most commonly played opponents.

OFFENSE

• Through 24 games, Georgia Tech baseball is continuing its annual tradition of being one of the top offensive teams in the country.

• Georgia Tech picked up where it left off the last two season, ranking second in the ACC and 27th nationally with a .294 average.

• Tech is also hitting .318 at home this season (15 games).

• Five Jackets are hitting north of .300 (**Kevin Parada, Drew Compton, Luke Waddell, Justyn-Henry Malloy, and Tres Gonzalez.**)

• In the month of March, Georgia Tech hit .305, slugged .471 and reached base .379.

• Georgia Tech also finds itself among the ACC's best in doubles (second), hits (second), on-base percentage (second), slugging percentage (second) and triples (second).

• Looking to continue the Jackets' offensive power will be the likes of Waddell, Reid, Compton, Hall and Parada.

• Proven hitters, Waddell hit .300 last season, while Compton hit .321 and Hall hit .228.

• Preseason second-team all-American Waddell remains one of the top shortstops and table setters in America, earning shortstop of the year semifinalist status in 2019 and leading off Team USA against Japan in the summer of 2019.

• Compton remains one of the top underclassmen in the country. He finished second on the team with three home runs and 12 RBI, as well as four doubles and triples.

• Hall is a career .300 hitter who started off 2020 slow. With the season shortened, Hall got back to work and his slump ended when he hit .500 for the fall offseason.

• One of the deepest rosters in the country, also looking to make a dent at the plate will be **Austin Wilhite, Stephen Reid, Jake Holland, Tres Gonzalez and Andrew Jenkins.**

• In addition to the elder statesmen, an infusion of youth like **Kevin Parada** and **Jake DeLeo** from Georgia Tech's second-straight top-8 recruiting class proves to provide the Jackets plenty of options.

INFELDERS

• Georgia Tech baseball returns perhaps one of the country's elite middle infield combo in shortstop **Luke Waddell** and second baseman **Austin Wilhite.**

• Waddell moved to shortstop full-time during the 2019 season but instantly made his way toward becoming a nationally lauded defender, getting named a semifinalist for the Brooks Wallace Shortstop of the Year award.

• Waddell was named a second-team all-American by *D1Baseball* and named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list during the 2021 preseason.

• Waddell has continued to play the part of table setter, hitting .327 early with 37 hits, seven doubles, five home runs and reaching base at a .418 clip.

• He had his team-best 26-game reached base streak (dating back to last season) snapped against Wake Forest (March 19-21).

• Waddell also showed off his new power at the plate with his first career grand slam on March 7 in a comeback bid vs. Pitt.

• Waddell broke a 3-3 tie in the seventh against NC State on Feb. 27 when he launched a three-run homer, his second of the year - the first of three-straight home runs.

• Waddell continues to be one of the toughest strikeouts in the nation, leading the ACC and is 42nd nationally at 11.3 at-bats per strikeout.

• Waddell was the third-toughest to strikeout in the ACC in 2019 and sports a 11.3:1 at-bat-to-strikeout ratio over the last two seasons.

OFFENSE

- To complete the combo, Wilhite remains one of the top second basemen in the country defensively as he opted to return for his second senior season of eligibility.

- Wilhite played in his 200th game as a Yellow Jacket on March 21 and made his 200th start at Georgia Tech a week later on March 28.

- Wilhite is off to a terrific start, both defensively and offensively, hitting .273 in 24 games for 21 hits, two doubles and a home run, and nine RBI.

- Wilhite caught fire in Week 2, hitting .455 over four games (Mercer, NC State) and striking out just once.

- Wilhite continues to be a force in double plays amassing 41 double plays in 2019 and four double plays in 2020.

- Wilhite currently ranks seventh since 2002 in Georgia Tech history with 116 double plays turned in his career.

- For the first time in his collegiate career, Wilhite worked in relief/closing situations on the mound for Georgia Tech.

- Wilhite made his first appearance of the season on Feb. 26 vs. NC State, finishing out the ninth inning of Game suspension. The inning was clean with two K's.

- He made his debut on March 3, 2020 against Tennessee Tech, working just one inning and touching 91 mph with his fastball.

- Due to the shortened season, Wilhite was limited to just three appearances and 4.0 innings, but dealt a 0.00 ERA and three strikeouts, surrendering only two hits.

- Wilhite also returns as Tech's top base thief, stealing 12 bases over the last two years and getting caught just one.

- **Drew Compton** arrived in style as a true freshman at first base last season.

- Compton was rated as the No. 5 overall recruit in the country by *Perfect Game* and shined early, becoming just the third Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his first plate appearance.

- Compton has started 2021 where he left off 2020, hitting a whopping .324 for 33 hits, seven doubles, five home runs and 21 RBI.

- In March, Compton hit .300 for 15 hits, three doubles, three homers for 11 RBI, slugging .540.

- Compton is Georgia Tech's leading hitter to return from 2020, finishing the season hitting .321 with 18 hits, four doubles, one triple and three home runs for 12 RBI in just 16 games.

- After rating him as the fifth-best impact freshman among position players and the 12th-best freshman overall last season, *D1Baseball* continue to laud Compton by ranking him the 10th-best first baseman in the nation.

- Also seeing some time in the field will be versatile infielder **Andrew Jenkins** and Vanderbilt transfer **Justyn-Henry Malloy**.

- After a terrific opening weekend, Jenkins has fallen back to Earth, currently hitting .180 on the season.

- Jenkins has played both first base and designated hitter this season.

- Jenkins hit .364 through the first four games of the 2020 season before suffering an injury that wound up taking him out of the remainder of the year.

- He finished with four hits, one double and a home run for five RBI, reaching base .385.

- Malloy, a transfer from Vanderbilt, has been ultra-impressive defensively at third base, hitting .301 on the season.

- He ranks fifth in the ACC with 21 walks.

- In March, Malloy was red-hot, leading Tech by hitting .370 for 20 hits, five doubles, one triple and three homers for 11 RBI, also drawing nine walks.

- Continuing its tradition of being #CatcherU, Georgia Tech will feature one of the hottest competitions behind the dish between the talents of second-year freshman **Jake Holland** and highly rated recruit **Kevin Parada**.

- Parada has looked ultra impressive in his debut. After hitting .200 during Opening Weekend, he's posted three 4-for-4 games, with his first against Mercer (Feb. 24), finishing with four RBI off a double and a home run.

- He then went 4-for-4 in Game 1 against NC State, finishing a homer shy of the cycle, in his first ACC game, and hit .625 overall for the week to earn ACC Player of the Week honors.

- In total, Parada has four four-hit games on the season. Only three other players in the ACC even have one.

- Among all freshmen in the nation, Parada is fifth in hitting (.378).

- Parada enters as the sixth-best first-year prospect, according to *Perfect Game*. PG also ranked him the fourth-best catcher nationally in his class.

- Parada led an outstanding junior campaign of high school, hitting .447 in 27 games, amassing 34 hits, 11 doubles, three triples and four homers for 28 RBI. His 19 walks helped him record a .556 on-base percentage.

- In 46 games of showcase baseball, Parada hit .390 for six home runs and 49 RBI.

- Holland took part last season in the first all-freshman battery on Opening Day in program history when he caught for frosh RHP **Zach Maxwell** on Feb. 14, 2020 vs. St. Peter's.

- Holland finished the year on a cold slump, hitting .158 for six hits, three doubles and three RBI on the season.

OUTFIELDERS

- "There might not be a better defensive [outfield] trio in the country" says *D1Baseball* about Georgia Tech's outfield of **Tres Gonzalez**, **Colin Hall** and **Jake DeLeo**.

- Veteran and team captain Hall will anchor the outfield in center field, having now played all outfield positions for Georgia Tech.

- After missing five starts as a freshman, Hall has started every game of his career since, totally 134 entering the 2021 season.

- With his start on Feb. 27, Hall made his 100th-consecutive start.

- In March, Hall hit .323 for 10 hits, one double, two triples and four RBI, drawing six walks as well.

OFFENSE

- After a hard collision at first base on March 20, Hall's streak of games started ended at 150 when **Brad Grenkoski** started on March 21 in center. Hall has not played since and remains day-to-day.
- Hall also made a game-saving catch in center field to keep NC State's lead to one before Tech rallied to win on Feb. 27.
- Hall's bat was beginning to warm up when the 2020 season was cut short. He finished hitting .228 in the 16 games for 13 hits, five doubles, one triple and a homer for 10 RBI - one of four double-figure RBI players.
- The last two years, Hall has 27 multi-hit games and 13 multi-RBI games.
- Gonzalez has played tremendously defensively with the bat finally heating up.
- Gonzalez hit .364 for the month of March -- including a gutsy two-out, two-strike squeeze bunt in the eighth inning against then-No. 1 Louisville on March 7 to extend the lead.
- He's currently third in the ACC with 23 walks.
- Gonzalez came on the scene in a big way when the true freshman pinch-hit against Georgia Southern (Feb. 18, 2020) in "The Fog Game", hitting a double and legging out an infield single to score the tying run.
- It was the first RBI of his college career.
- Gonzalez finished the season hitting .368 over 19 at-bats, playing in 13 games and making one start. He recorded seven hits, two doubles and three RBI in 2020.
- DeLeo has also become a stable in right field and has also gotten comfortable at the plate.
- In the month of March, DeLeo hit .296 for 16 hits, two doubles and seven RBI.
- DeLeo hit his first-career home run on April 3 against Virginia.
- DeLeo enters the 2021 as a member of Tech's second-straight top-8 recruiting class and No. 8 outfielder in the country, according to *Perfect Game*.
- He was named the 33rd top first-year prospect nationally.
- Also an option in the outfield or as the designated hitter is **Stephen Reid**.
- Reid has continued to show his ability to do damage with power, hitting .244 for the season with six doubles and four home runs.
- No home run was more important than his go-ahead two-run shot in the eighth against then-No. 13 Notre Dame that gave Tech the much-needed victory, 4-2.
- Reid led the team with five home runs last season for 10 RBI as the team's DH. He hit .273 for 12 hits overall.

PITCHING

- One of the main reason for their recent success has been the Yellow Jacket's pitching staff stockpiling talented arms and highly regarded prospects and getting the most out of them.

- In a combined 125.1 innings, the trio has allowed 47 earned runs for a collective ERA of 3.38.

- The three have also combined to a 3.34:1 strikeout to walk ratio.
- Georgia Tech has regained the services of captain LHP **Brant Hurter**, who led the team with a 2.42 ERA after he rehabbed from Tommy John Surgery prior to the 2020 season.
- In Hurter's first two times out since April 2019, he dealt nine strikeouts and allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings for a 1-0 record and 0.84 ERA.
- Against then-No. 8 NC State and its top-ranked offense, Hurter allowed no earned runs, fanned six and surrendered just two hits in six innings of work.
- After an off night against then-No. 1 Louisville, Hurter had one of his best career games, going 6.0 innings, fanning 11 and allowing no walks or earned runs against Pitt.
- Hurter's boasts the best conference ERA in the ACC from 2019.

- His career opponent batting average ranks ninth since 2002 at Georgia Tech (.250), alongside teammate **Andy Archer**, who currently ranks second (.229).

- Hurter's last appearance before entering this season for Georgia Tech was April 28, 2019.
- Also figuring to be a big piece of the Georgia Tech staff is second-year sophomore RHP **Cort Roedig**.
- Roedig carried his freshman postseason success, allowing just three hits with a 1.08 ERA and .115 OBA in his two tournament starts -- ACC Championship Game and NCAA Regional elimination game -- enter his sophomore campaign, holding a 4.34 ERA.
- His best game of the season came on Feb. 22, 2020 against Ohio State, surrendering just one hit and one run while striking out six in six innings for the win.
- Roedig underwent offseason surgery prior to the 2021 season and is working back to full availability.
- Another big get for the experience of the pitching staff is the return continued work RHP **Andy Archer**, who missed 2019 season with a non-Tommy John elbow injury.

- Through his first eight starts of his career, Archer has been sensational, working the second-lowest ERA in the ACC at 2.47.
- Archer has relished his chance to start, getting his ACC-best fourth-straight win on March 27, working a career-long 8.0 innings on 109 pitches, striking out nine and allowing zero runs en route to shutting out Duke,
- Last year, Archer posted a 4.22 ERA in four appearances, earning two saves and striking out 16 as 2020 Stopper of the Year candidate.

- LHP **Sam Crawford** put folks on notice when he went 6.0 innings for the win in just 68 pitches, surrendering no runs and just two hits, holding batters to a .100 average.
- Despite a tougher start against then-No. 8 NC State and their No. 1 ACC offense, Crawford allowed just one earned run in 3.2 inning to sport a 0.93 ERA entering Week 2 of ACC.

- Crawford had his best start in league play on March 21 at Wake Forest, issuing just one run on four hits in 6.0 innings to move to 2-1 on the year with a 3.52 ERA.

- Despite going 1-1, Crawford has been terrific the last two outings in nail-biters, allowing just three runs in 11.0 innings and walking just two.

PITCHING

- Crawford's story remains a good one as he fought to make the 35-man Georgia Tech roster for two years before finally making it in 2020.

- Crawford then entered the bottom of the eighth on the road at Georgia Southern (Feb. 18, 2020) with runners at the corners and two outs. He proceeded to slam the door shut with 1.1 innings of no-hit ball to close, striking out three overall for the win and cementing himself on the team.

- Crawford finished the shortened 2020 season with a 2-0 record in eight appearances. He worked to a 1.86 ERA, surrendering just six hits and two runs while striking out 14.

- Crawford made his first career collegiate start on Feb. 21 vs. Eastern Kentucky.

- Hard-throwing RHP **Zach Maxwell** has once again showed his ability on the mound, striking out 21 in 12.0 innings and holding a 4.50 ERA for three saves.

- Maxwell touched 100 mph on Feb. 28 against then-No. 8 NC State.

- He then dazzled again with 2.0 innings of one-hit, one-run baseball against then-No. 1 Louisville, striking out three.

- He made two appearances against Pitt, fanning three to get out of a jam on March 12 and getting his first career save on March 13.

- Last season, frosh righty Maxwell got the nod on Feb. 14, 2020, making him the second true freshman to start Opening Day for the Yellow Jackets on the mound since Kris Wilson in 1995 (Xzavion Curry - 2017)

- For 2020, Maxwell finished with a 3.14 ERA and 1-1 record, striking out 20 overall, but issuing 16 walks.

- Playing more of a closing role for Georgia Tech this season is bullpen anchor LHP **Luke Bartnicki**.

- Through his first 14 appearances closing, Bartnicki has allowed just 14 earned runs (five from one outing) over 19.2 innings, striking out 21, for an 6.41 ERA and foursaves.

- His lone bad outing came against Pitt (1.1 IP, 5 ER), but has worked nine appearances for one or fewer runs.

- He then looked back to form against Wake Forest and Duke with two hits in 4.0 straight scoreless innings.

- As a potential starter in 2020, he finished with a 1.76 ERA in four appearances and three starts. In 15.1 innings, he allowed just seven hits and three earned runs, punching out 17 and holding opponents to a .137 average.

- Making his first three starts last season to tremendous success, Bartnicki plays a valuable, versatile role for Georgia Tech.

- Also back is team ERA leader and 2020 freshman all-American LHP **Dalton Smith**.

- Smith has struggled in year two with a 10.00 ERA through six outings.

- Smith posted an impressive 1.46 ERA last season, earning a 3-0 record in six relief appearances. He allowed just two earned runs and punched out 14 as a tremendous stopper for the Jackets.

- Georgia Tech is also hoping to utilize the healthy captain RHP **Hugh Chapman**.

- Chapman was one of two Jackets to appear twice on Opening Weekend (joining Bartnicki) and continued his fine work from a season ago.

- Chapman was solid to start the season but has struggled in his last three outings, giving up five runs overall.

- Chapman got off to his best start in 2020 before the season was cut short. In eight relief appearances, he worked to a 2.25 ERA, allowing just two runs and five hits.

- Chapman has appeared in 40 games in his career with a 2-1 record, but has been bitten by the injury bug throughout his career.

- Georgia Tech will also regain the services of LHP **Joseph Mannely** who is successfully rehabbed from Tommy John surgery.

- Mannely looked sharp early but has allowed 10 runs over his last four outings (5.0 IP).

- Mannely got his first decision, getting the win against Mercer (Feb. 24).

- Prior to his injury, Mannely sported a 0.00 ERA in 2019.

- For the first time in his collegiate career, usual second baseman senior **Austin Wilhite** worked in relief/closing situations on the mound for Georgia Tech.

- Wilhite closed the ninth inning against then-No. 8 NC State striking out two and allowing just one hit.

- He made his debut on March 3, 2020 against Tennessee Tech, working just one inning and touching 91 mph with his fastball.

- Due to the shortened season, Wilhite was limited to just three appearances and 4.0 innings, but dealt a 0.00 ERA and three strikeouts, surrendering only two hits.

- Part of Georgia Tech's second-straight top-8 recruiting class, **Marquis Grissom, Jr.** will also look to establish himself as the highly rated blue chip recruit he was out of high school.

- Grissom, Jr. was rated the 11th overall pitcher in the country by Perfect Game.

- In three years of showcase ball, Grissom, Jr. recorded a 6-2 record and a 2.30 ERA over 107.0 innings of work. He allowed 35 earned runs and 82 hits for a 1.24 WHIP, while striking out 107 hitters for a 2.1:1 strikeout to walk ratio.

- Grissom hails from tremendous Atlanta stock in being the son of Big Leaguer Marquis Grissom.

- Grissom is a former Atlanta Braves outfielder who played 17 seasons in the Big Leagues, helping take the Braves to the 1995 World Series.

- A Georgia Tech Hall of Famer, Brown was a six-time all-star and two-time ERA title winner. He helped the Marlins to the 1995 World Series before signing the first \$100 million contact with the LA Dodgers in 1998.

- RHP **Jackson Finley**, who had been sensational in relief for Georgia Tech, will miss the remainder of the season due to Tommy John Surgery.

- Georgia Tech will also look to utilize the services of Vanderbilt transfer RHP **Chance Huff**, who can run his fastball up to 97.

- Huff made a big stride forward on April 6 vs. USC Upstate, sitting 95-97 mph for two strikeouts in his inning of work.

- Another transfer to the Georgia Tech bullpen is grad transfer RHP **John Medich** from Division III Rhodes College.

- Medich worked his way back from Tommy John surgery to pitch 10 impressive innings last spring with a fastball up to 95.

- Two true freshmen who have worked to the top of the bullpen are LHP **Josiah Siegel** and RHP **Dawson Brown**.

- Siegel leads the bullpen with a 3.86 ERA on eight appearances (11.2 IP) and has a save and got his first career winning decision on Sunday at Notre Dame.

- Brown sports a 4.15 ERA in seven appearances (8.2) and has been an instrumental strike thrower in late spots.

DANNY BORRELL

- Looking to get a full year under his belt is Georgia Tech pitching coach Danny Borrell, who prior to 2020 arrived on The Flats after 18 years in the New York Yankees organization as both a player and the pitching coordinator for their world-renowned farm system.

- Borrell became the youngest pitching coordinator in the MLB when hired in 2015 by the Yankees, where he led approximately 180 pitchers per year and 11 pitching coaches over nine minor league affiliates.

- Borrell helped lead the Yankees to be the best pitching organization in baseball statistically.

- In total, he developed 34 Big Leaguers during his tenure with New York – including MLB All-Stars Dellin Betances and Luis Severino.

- Borrell was drafted by the Yankees in 2000 after a standout career at Wake Forest.

- A two-way player at Wake, Borrell earned freshman All-America and second-team All-America honors en route to leading the Demon Deacons to two ACC titles (1998, 1999).

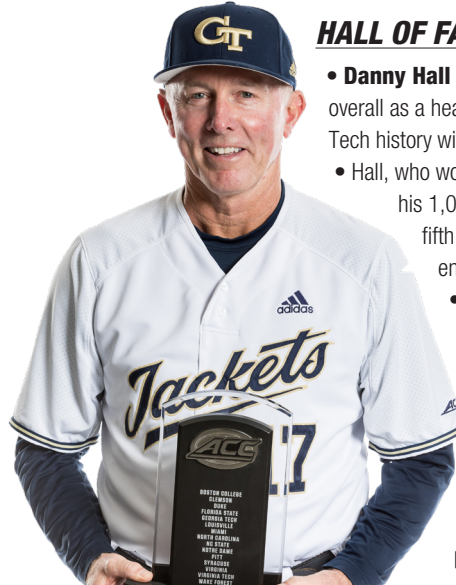

- **Danny Hall** is in his 28th season at Georgia Tech and his 33rd overall as a head coach in 2020. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,088 wins.
- Hall, who won his 1,200th career game on February 24, 2018 and his 1,000th win at Georgia Tech on March 20, 2018, stands fifth among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2020 season.
- In 2019, Hall earned his fourth ACC Coach of the Year honor.
- In his career – both as an assistant and head coach – Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.
- Hall has led Tech to the NCAA Tournament on 21 occasions and guided the Jackets to the NCAA College World Series in 1994, 2002 and 2006 -- the program's only three berths.
