# **GAME NOTES**

## **NELSON AMONG COUNTRY'S TOP PLAYERS**

- » Third-year sophomore Mat Nelson has a .324 batting average and leads the nation with 15 home runs (in 30 games played).
- » Nelson also ranks second in home runs per game, fourth in RBI (48) and 9th in slugging percentage (.802).
- » It took Nelson just 31 team games to hit his 15th home run, the fourth-fastest in FSU history:

- » Against Boston College, Nelson hit a pair of home runs. Friday (4/16), Nelson's grand slam was his second of the season and FSU's fourth of the year. It was FSU's first hit of the game.
- » Saturday (4/17), Nelson hit a three-run HR for the Noles first hit. He added a double and RBI single Sunday (4/18) and had 9 RBI for the series.
- » At Louisville, Nelson had a double in each game and a home run in the last two games of the series. Nelson's three-run home run Saturday (4/10) gave the Noles an 8-4 lead and traveled 459 feet.
- » Nelson tied a career high with 5 RBI against Jacksonville (4/6), with an RBI single in the first inning and a grand slam in the third inning.
- » Nelson hit two home runs against Wake Forest (3/28), including the first of back-to-back-to-back HR with Robby Martin and Elijah Cabell. FSU last hit three straight HR in 2010.
- » Nelson leads FSU with a .324 batting average and is second with a .433 on-base percentage. In ACC games, those numbers jump to .337 and .451, respectively.
- » Nelson is Top 10 in the ACC in HR (15, 1st), RBI (48, 1st), slugging pct. (.802, 2nd), total bases (89, 2nd) and runs (34, 4th).
- » As FSU's catcher, Nelson has thrown out 10 of 23 would-be basestealers.
- » Entering the season, Nelson was rated the No. 228 prospect for the upcoming draft and is the No. 7 catcher nationally, according to D1Baseball.
- » Nelson was coached in high school by the late Roy Halladay, an MLB Hall of Famer. The pair helped Calvary Christian to a state championship in 2017 and won a state-record 60 consecutive games.

## **MESSICK PACES FSU PITCHING**

- » Freshman Parker Messick was named to the midseason Watch List for the Golden Spikes Award, given to the nation's top player.
- » Messick is 2nd in the ACC with a 2.70 ERA and leads the league with 77 strikeouts.
- » In ACC games, Messick's ERA falls to 1.89 with a .195 batting average against.
- » Messick ranks fifth nationally with 77 strikeouts and 16th in the country with 13.86 strikeouts per nine innings.
- » Messick hit double-digit strikeouts in three straight games, the first Nole to do that since Drew Parrish in 2018.
- » He set a career-high with 12 K's vs. North Carolina (4/2), FSU's most since Parrish K'd 13 vs. Wake Forest in the 2019 ACC Tournament.
- » Messick hit a home run in his first collegiate at-bat against Virginia Tech (3/14).
- » At No. 6 Miami (3/19), he DH'd and pitched, throwing 6.2 innings with 10 strikeouts and going 1-for-4 with 3 RBI at the plate.
- » Messick was named the College Baseball Foundation John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Week and is on the Olerud Award Watch List.
- » Messick is the first Nole with a HR in his first career AB to hit a home run since Jonathan Foster did it in 2018.

## **489 FEET!**

- » Third-year sophomore Elijah Cabell has eight home runs this season.
- » Since being re-inserted in the starting lineup vs. Wake Forest (3/27), Cabell has seven home runs.
- » He became the first Seminole since Chris Marconcini in 2015 with a home run in four straight games (3/27-28 vs. Wake Forest, 3/31 vs. Mercer, 4/2 vs. North Carolina).
- » At Louisville, Cabell had a pair of two-run home runs - the first traveled 411 feet at 117 mph opposite field to tie the game Friday (4/9) and the second gave FSU a 4-2 lead Sunday (4/11).
- » His first of the year was a 489-foot home run in the series finale against Pitt (2/28), easily clearing the left-centerfield fence.
- » The ball was tracked at 115 mph off the bat.
- » Ball-tracking provider TrackMan is a vital tool that tracks home run distance, exit velocity on batted balls, pitch speed and rotation among a number of other statistical uses.
- » In 2019, Cooper Swanson (471.0) and Cabell (465.7) had the longest tracked home runs in the country.
- » In 2020, Cabell had FSU's two longest tracked hits - home runs that traveled 429 and 426 feet.
- » Against Wake Forest (3/26), Cabell entered as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning and hit a two-run single, leading FSU to a 2-1 win. He was back in the starting lineup the next day.
- » Cabell has reached base in a career-high 20 consecutive games.

## **#RBIMartin PACES OUTFIELD**

- » Robby Martin, the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week for his performance against No. 5 Florida and No. 6 Miami, is hitting .323 with 34 RBI, 6 doubles, 7 home runs and 30 runs scored.
- » Martin is fourth in the ACC with 34 RBI and 13th with 30 runs scored.
- » At Florida (4/13), Martin had all three of FSU's hits. His RBI double against the Gators was the 100th of his career.
- » All 13 of Martin's extra-base hits have come in the past 22 games.
- » Martin is ranked the No. 6 outfielder in the country by D1Baseball and the No. 91 prospect in the MLB Pipeline Draft 150.

## **A WEEK TO REMEMBER**

- » According to Baseball America, Florida State had 'the best week of any team in the country this year' when they beat No. 5 Florida (3/16) and swept No. 6 Miami (3/19-21).
- » The Noles outscored its in-state rivals 44-4 over the four games, beating the Gators 10-2 and the Hurricanes 13-1, 9-1 and 12-0.
- » The 32-run margin of victory at Miami was the worst in Miami's nearly 80-year history.
- » At the plate, FSU hit .335 with 18 extra base hits. On the mound, the Noles had a 1.00 ERA and 50 strikeouts in 36 innings.
- » Robby Martin was named the NCBWA and Perfect Game National Hitter of the Week and the ACC Player of the Week, hitting .550 with 3 home runs, 3 doubles, 9 runs scored and 12 RBI. He struck out just once in 20 at-bats.
- » As a result, FSU jumped back into the Top 25 in all the major polls.

## **9 WINS vs. TOP 20 TEAMS**

- » FSU's first 10 games of March came against ranked teams, beating No. 16 Virginia 2-of-3, at No. 18 Virginia Tech 2-of-3, a win vs. No. 5 Florida and a sweep at No. 6 Miami.
- » FSU added a win at No. 7 Louisville (4/10).

## **'MEAT' 5-1 vs. IN-STATE RIVALS**

- » Second-year Florida State head coach Mike Martin is 5-1 against Florida and Miami.
- » In 2020, FSU beat No. 1 Florida 2-0, snapping FSU's 11-game losing streak in the series before the season was canceled.
- » In 2021, FSU beat No. 5 Florida and swept No. 6 Miami in the same week.

## **PITCHING LEADS THE ACC**

- » Florida State leads the ACC with a 3.17 earned run average and .215 batting average against. No. 2 in each category is Notre Dame, at 3.70 and .234.
- » In ACC games, FSU's ERA drops to 3.05, ahead of No. 2 Notre Dame (3.72).
- » Parker Messick, at 1.89, is the only qualifying pitcher in the league with an ERA below 2.00. His 74 K's in ACC games also lead the league.
- » Bryce Hubbard 8th in the league with 57 strikeouts and a .218 batting average against.

- » Hubbard and Sunday starter Conor Grady lead FSU with four wins and Grady has started FSU's last two shutouts. In a rubber match vs. UNC (4/4), Grady tied his career high with 7.0 IP and set a season high with 10 K.
- » Grady retired the last 16 batters faced vs. UNC.
- » D1Baseball released its Top 150 Starting Pitchers, and Florida State is the only school in the country with four pitchers ranked:

- » FSU, Virginia and Wake Forest are tied for the ACC lead with three shutouts.
- » All three of FSU's shutouts have come in ACC play. The last time FSU shut out three ACC opponents in a regular season was 2014, when the Noles did it 5 times.

## **AAA34K**

- » Pitching coach Jimmy Belanger stresses 'AAA34K' to his pitchers - any pitch, any time, anywhere, three pitches for strikes.
- » The philosophy has helped FSU put together one of the top pitching staffs in the country.
- » FSU ranks 6th nationally with 11.9 strikeouts per nine innings. FSU's 385 total K's rank 6th and lead the ACC.
- » In Belanger's first year in 2020, FSU ranked seventh in strikeouts with 208 in 17 games.
- » The Seminoles are 12th nationally, allowing just 7.11 hits per nine innings. FSU ranked 13th in hits/9 in the shortened 2020 season.
- » Carson Montgomery, the nation's top recruit that reached campus prior to the 2021 season, struck out nine batters in back-to-back mid-week starts, despite throwing just 8.2 combined innings in that span.
- » At Florida (4/13), Montgomery allowed two unearned runs in 4.1 innings. As a team, FSU allowed just one earned run in 9.2 innings pitched while striking out 13 Gators.

## **FSU AMONG NAT'L LEADERS IN K's**

- » Florida State ranks 6th in the country with 11.9 strikeouts per nine innings. The Noles have K'd at least 10 batters 25 times this season.
- » The Noles K'd a season-high 19 batters vs. Pitt (2/28) and 18 in back-to-back games vs. UCF (3/24) and Wake Forest (3/26).

## DE SEDAS WALKS OFF NORTH CAROLINA

- » Shortstop Nander De Sedas has hit home runs the past three weekends - a walk-off vs. North Carolina (4/3), a go-ahead HR at Louisville (4/10) and a solo shot vs. Boston College (4/16).
- » It was FSU's first walk-off HR since Reese Albert vs. NC State in 2018.
- » De Sedas had missed three games prior to the North Carolina series with an oblique injury.
- » He was 6-for-17 against No. 5 Florida and No. 6 Miami, with a home run and two doubles. His home run at Miami was his second of the year.
- » Against the Gators and Hurricanes, he reached base at a .421 clip, with a walk and an HBP against just two strikeouts.
- » De Sedas has started 108 games for the Seminoles, second-most on the team (Reese Albert, 133).
- » In the field, FSU did not commit an error in Coral Gables.

## CROWELL THRIVING IN LINEUP

- » Wyatt Crowell has four doubles and FSU's first triple of the season.
- » The freshman from Forsyth, Ga., is also a pitcher, throwing 7.0 relief innings this year.
- » Crowell had a career-high three hits vs. Wake Forest (3/28) and a triple vs. Mercer (3/31).
- » Crowell tied his career-high with three hits against Boston College (4/16).
- » Against North Carolina (4/3), Crowell entered the game as a relief pitcher, remained as the DH and notched two hits in two at-bats. He scored the winning run on Nander De Sedas's two-run walk-off home run.
- » He started a 7-6-2 assist in the first inning at Miami, the first assist of his career.
- » Crowell tied the game at No. 18 Florida (4/13) on a sacrifice fly, his third RBI of the year.

## ANDERSON WOWS IN MIDWEEK START

- » Third-year sophomore Jack Anderson threw 6.2 perfect innings against Mercer (3/31) in his third career start.
- » Anderson retired the first 20 batters of the game. He set a career high with 6.2 IP and 6 K's.
- » At No. 7 Louisville (4/10), Anderson pitched the final 3.0 innings to lock up his first win since the 2019 season.
- » At No. 18 Florida (4/13), Anderson was the first pitcher out of the bullpen and struck out 4 of the 7 batters faced.
- » For the season, Anderson has a 29-3 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 23.1 innings pitched.

## MARTIN LEADS FSU AT THE PLATE

- » Second-year freshman Tyler Martin, FSU's leadoff hitter, has reached base safely in 43 of his 46 career starts. He leads FSU with a .476 on-base percentage.
- » Martin leads the ACC with 30 walks, is 4th in OBP and 7th with 33 runs scored.
- » Martin hit his first career home run vs. UCF (3/24), a 398-foot shot that gave FSU a 3-2 lead in the fifth inning. Martin was 3-for-4 with three runs scored against the Knights.
- » Martin's second home run, and first career grand slam, came against Boston College (4/16).
- » Martin set career highs with five hits and four runs scored at No. 18 Virginia Tech (3/14).
- » Martin started on Opening Day at first base, his first time playing the position in college. He was FSU's primary third baseman in 2020 and has spent time both seasons as a designated hitter.

- » Martin is the son of head coach Mike Martin, Jr. and the grandson of legendary FSU coach Mike Martin.

## LACEY DIGS IN AT THIRD

- » Utility player Logan Lacey has started at third base, left field and center field this season.
- » For his career, Lacey has started 20 games at 3B, 4 games in RF, 4 games in CF and 3 games in LF.
- » Lacey tied a career high with three hits at Louisville (4/10). He leads FSU with 9 doubles on the season.
- » Versus Jacksonville (4/6), Lacey tied a career-high with three hits and two doubles.
- » Against No. 6 Miami and No. 5 Florida, Lacey hit .474 (9-for-19) with three doubles, a home run and 7 RBI.
- » His pinch-hit, 2-R HR at No. 18 Virginia Tech (3/12) gave FSU a 4-3 lead in the 8th inning. FSU won the game, 6-4.
- » Against No. 5 Florida, Lacey also had three hits, including a two-run double in the second inning that gave FSU a 5-0 lead.
- » At Miami (3/21), he was a triple shy of the cycle before exiting the game in the fourth inning.
- » Lacey was back in the starting lineup vs. North Carolina (4/2-4).

## HANEY WILL WEAR No. 11 IN 2021

- » Sixth-year pitcher and 2021 team captain Chase Haney will wear No. 11 for the 2021 season in honor of former head coach Mike Martin.
- » Martin wore the number for 46 years as a player and coach for the Seminoles, becoming the winningest coach in college baseball history along the way.
- » Florida State retired Coach Martin's No. 11 jersey on Opening Day, joining No. 34 Dick Howser and No. 39 J.D. Drew as the only Seminoles to receive such an honor.
- » Haney has been FSU's team captain each of the past two seasons. He has earned his bachelor and Master's degrees and is working towards a second bachelor's degree.
- » Haney ranks 2nd in FSU history with 131 relief appearances and is 5 shy of tying the school record. Haney has appeared in eight straight games and 10 of the past 11.
- » Haney has a 2.96 ERA and a 16-5 record in his career; he had a 2.41 ERA in a career-high 37.1 innings pitched in 2019.
- » Haney had a 3-0 record in 2020 and is 3-1 in the 2021 season.

- » Against Illinois State in what proved to be the season finale (3/11), Albert hit solo home runs in his first two plate appearances. It was FSU's only multi-HR game of the year and the second of Albert's career.
- » Albert's first 2-HR game came in Game One of the Baton Rouge Super Regional in 2019, a 6-4 FSU win over LSU en route to the College World Series.

## NOLES BEAT UNC 2-of-3

- » Florida State won its fourth ACC series of the year, taking the final two games vs. North Carolina (4/2-4).
- » Florida State had a 1.33 earned run average, allowing just 18 hits and 4 ER in 27 innings, while striking out 33.
- » Parker Messick (12) and Conor Grady (10) each set season-highs for K's. Grady did not allow a walk in Sunday's 8-0 shutout.
- » FSU has three ACC shutouts this year, FSU's most in a regular season since having 5 in 2014.
- » Elijah Cabell hit a pair of home runs against the Tar Heels - a 3-R HR Friday that tied the score 3-3 and a 3-R HR Sunday in the first inning that gave FSU a 4-0 lead.

## NOLES DOMINATE NO. 6 MIAMI

- » Florida State swept No. 6 Miami by a combined 34-2, FSU's first sweep in Coral Gables since 2002 and first overall since 2012.
- » Robby Martin and Mat Nelson combined for 14 hits, with four doubles, three home runs and 15 RBI.
- » As a team, Miami mustered just 13 hits all weekend.
- » Logan Lacey and Nander De Sedas had 11 hits, 5 XBH and 6 RBI in the series. All four players homered in Sunday's finale.
- » On the mound, Parker Messick, Bryce Hubbart and Conor Grady all started and earned wins. The trio combined to allow just nine hits and two runs in 17.2 innings, with 25 strikeouts.
- » FSU's bullpen allowed four hits in 9.1 innings.

## OFFENSE LEADS NOLES PAST GATORS

- » Robby Martin had his first career multi-HR game vs. Florida (3/16), hitting a three-run home run in the first inning and a two-run shot in the sixth inning.
- » Catcher Mat Nelson went back-to-back with Martin in the sixth inning. FSU has gone back-to-back three times this season and back-to-back-to-back once.
- » Parker Messick and Wyatt Crowell, freshman pitchers for the Seminoles, each had two hits.
- » On the mound, freshman Carson Montgomery was one out shy of his first win. The Windermere native struck out 9 batters and allowed just 3 hits and 2 runs in 4.2 innings.
- » Chase Haney, Hunter Perdue and Davis Hare allowed just one hit over the final 4.1 innings to secure the win. Haney is 3-1 on the year and Hare has a pair of saves.

## BATS COME TO LIFE AT VIRGINIA TECH

- » The Seminoles won 2-of-3 games at No. 18 Virginia Tech (3/12-14), clinching the series in the rubber match with a 14-7 win.
- » FSU hit for the home run cycle in the finale - Mat Nelson's fourth (3-R), Parker Messick's first (solo), Nander De Sedas's first of the season (2-R) and Robby Martin's grand slam.

- » Messick, FSU's Friday night starting pitcher, took his first at-bats as a Seminole in the game. He finished 3-for-5 with a home run in his first collegiate at-bat.
- » First baseman Tyler Martin was 5-for-6 at Virginia Tech (3/14), FSU's first five-hit game since 2018. Martin set career highs with hits (5), runs scored (4) and doubles (2).

## PITCHING LEADS NOLES PAST #16 UVA

- » Florida State won 2-of-3 games against No. 16 Virginia, winning the first two games 2-0 and 9-4.
- » The Seminoles' starting pitching was superb in all three games, combining for 26 strikeouts in 21.0 innings, allowing two runs on nine hits for a .130 batting average against and 0.86 ERA.
- » Freshman Parker Messick was named ACC Pitcher of the Week after throwing 8.0 IP and 11 strikeouts in FSU's 2-0 win (3/5).
- » Messick's 8.0 IP were the most for a Nole since Drew Parrish went 8.0 in the 2019 College World Series vs. Arkansas.
- » Hunter Perdue pitched a perfect ninth inning for his first career save.
- » On 3/6, Bryce Hubbart made his first start of the season, striking out six in a career-high 6.0 innings without allowing a run. The one hit he allowed came in the first inning.
- » The Cavaliers were held scoreless the first 15 innings in Tallahassee before scoring four unearned runs against the FSU bullpen.
- » On 3/7, Conor Grady was the hard-luck loser after allowing two runs in 7.0 innings with nine strikeouts. He retired the final 13 batters he faced.
- » Wyatt Crowell threw the final two innings without allowing a runner. In total, FSU retired the final 19 batters of the game.

## OPENING WEEKEND RECAP

- » Florida State won 2 of 3 games against North Florida, sweeping a doubleheader after dropping the season opener.
- » FSU hit four home runs, including two from catcher Mat Nelson. Reese Albert and Vince Smith also went deep.

## SEMINOLE BASEBALL TRADITIONS

### ANIMALS of SECTION B

- » Formed in 1977, the Animals of Section B are college baseball's most recognized fan group that support the Noles.
- » The name originated in 1978 when Sol Carroll, "FSU's No. 1 Fan", brought donuts to the section. After a while, the section threw the donuts at Sol, who in turn called the fans "Animals" and the name stuck.
- » When Seminole Field (now Dick Howser Stadium) opened in 1983, the Animals were located in Section B, thus the full name The Animals of Section B.
- » The Animals have a song and cheer book used to rattle opposing teams. They have a 'K' counter that racks up as FSU pitchers record strikeouts; they also have duck calls for when the bases are loaded (ducks on the pond), among a number of other recognizable traditions.

### O CANADA

- » The Canadian national anthem was first sung by the Animals of Section B in 1988 during the Calgary Winter Olympics.
- » On its origins: "It was just watching the Olympics every day and hearing the anthem every day. It was in their minds. [FSU] was losing and they thought, 'Hey. Let's hum the Canadian National Anthem.' And they won, and it's been a tradition ever since." - Shannon Thomas, Animals 'Zookeeper'.
- » The anthem now can be heard every home game before the Seminoles bat in the fifth inning.

### FLYING HIGH CIRCUS

- » Founded in 1947 by Jack Haskin, FSU's Flying High Circus is an extra-curricular activity under the Division of Student Affairs.
- » The Flying High Circus is located past the right field wall at Dick Howser Stadium.
- » Made up entirely of current Florida State students, it is primarily an aerial stage presentation with no animal acts.
- » Student performers rig all their own equipment, sew their own costumes, produce lights and sound for performances and set up the Big Top tent on campus.
- » A one-semester, one credit hour Introduction to Circus course is offered to students which includes the basics of juggling, walking the high wire, aerial ballet, and rigging.
- » The circus generates its own revenue with shows at Halloween and in April on campus and over the summer at Calloway Gardens in Georgia.

- » Smith, a true freshman from East Lake, Fla., started at third base, FSU's first freshman third baseman to start on Opening Day since Dylan Busby in 2015 against Oakland.

- » On the mound, Chase Haney earned his second career save.
- » Freshman Carson Montgomery started game two for FSU. He did not allow an earned run in four innings.
- » Bryce Hubbard and Conor Grady earned the two wins on the mound for FSU.

## **OPENING WEEKEND**

- » Florida State has not dropped a season-opening, head-to-head series since 1981.
- » That continued in 2021 as FSU took 2-of-3 against North Florida despite dropping the Opening Day contest.

## **SIMMONS FIGHTS BACK FROM CANCER**

- » First baseman Dylan Simmons had six RBI on opening weekend, ranking third in the ACC after a week of play. His 4 RBI-game against the Ospreys was a career-best.
- » Simmons was scheduled to enroll at FSU in summer 2019, but was diagnosed with Stage I lymphoma in late May.
- » Instead of enrolling at FSU, Simmons stayed home in Jacksonville for chemotherapy and radiation treatments at the Mayo Clinic.
- » Simmons was declared 'cancer-free' in December and enrolled at FSU for the spring 2020 semester.
- » On Opening Night (February 14, 2020), it was just 260 days since Simmons first received his cancer diagnosis.
- » Simmons hit .378 (14-for-37) in 12 games played in 2020, including a career-high three hits at No. 1 Florida on March 10.

## **NOLES ROUND UP LOCAL RECRUITS**

- » Over the years, Florida State has had a number of outstanding players from the Tallahassee area, including Link Jarrett and 2017 All-American Tyler Holton.
- » In 2021, five Seminoles claim Tallahassee as their hometown - Danny Andzel, Logan Lacey, Tyler Martin, Brandon Walker and Mercer transfer Garrett Mathes.
- » Pitcher Leighton Alley, from St. Augustine, Fla., spent the past season at Tallahassee Community College.
- » Overall, 35 of FSU's 41 players hail from the Sunshine State.

## **RECRUITING PHILOSOPHY**

- » Second-year head coach Mike Martin, Jr., along with assistants Mike Metcalf and Jimmy Belanger, hit the ground running in regards to recruiting.

- » Looking for players 'with an edge' that play hard, Metcalf, FSU's recruiting coordinator, says FSU is also interested in fast-paced athletes that shine in the classroom, in the community and on the field.
- » Martin, Jr. has also stressed the importance of mental health for his student-athletes and players regularly meet with clinical and sport psychologists.
- » Both of FSU's recruiting classes under Martin have ranked in the Top 10 nationally.

## **SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR 2021**

- » Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the Atlantic Coast Conference will allow teams to play up to 50 games in 2021, down from the usual 56.
- » ACC teams will also play 12 conference series (up from 10), with 6 home and 6 away series.
- » For FSU's midweek games, only one was on the road (at Florida). FSU's other non-conference games will be played at Dick Howser Stadium.

## **COACHES IN FIRST SEASONS**

- » Mike Martin, Jr.'s first season as FSU head coach was certainly unconventional, to say the least.
- » After 22 years as an assistant coach and 3 years as a player for the Noles, Martin and the 2020 team played just 17 games before the college baseball season was canceled nationwide due to the COVID-19 epidemic.
- » Among Martin's highlights of his freshman campaign was a 2-0 win at No. 1 Florida, snapping the Gators' 11-game win streak in the series. He is 5-1 combined against Florida and Miami.
- » Martin is the ninth head coach in FSU's 73-year history. He is the fourth straight head coach, dating back to 1975, that is an FSU alumnus.

- » Prior to the 2020 season, the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association named its annual Coach of the Year trophy after former FSU head coach Mike Martin.
- » Martin won more games than any coach in NCAA history, finishing his 40-year career with a 2,029-736-4 record.
- » Martin is the third Seminole with a national baseball award named in his honor, joining Dick Howser (NCBWA Player of the Year) and Buster Posey (Catcher of the Year).
- » Martin's No. 11 jersey was retired on Opening Day 2021. The field at Dick Howser Stadium was named in his honor in 2005.

## **FSU ALUMS ACROSS COLLEGE BASEBALL**

- » Mike Martin, Jr., is one of three current Atlantic Coast Conference baseball coaches that graduated from Florida State.
- » Pitt's Mike Bell played at FSU from 1994-95 and was the Noles pitching coach from 2012-18 before taking the Panthers job.

- » Notre Dame hired Link Jarrett, an FSU shortstop from 1991-94, prior to the 2020 season. Jarrett started his coaching career at Flagler College in 1999 before assistant jobs at FSU, Mercer, East Carolina and Auburn. He was the head coach at UNC-Greensboro from 2013-19.
- » Former Florida State pitcher and 21-year pitching coach Jamey Shouppe is in his eighth season as Florida A&M's head coach. Former FSU All-American pitcher Bryan Henry is Shouppe's pitching coach for the Rattlers.
- » FSU also has assistant coaches at NC State (Chris Hart, FSU player from 1999-03; coach at NC State since 2005) and Georgia Tech (James Ramsey, FSU player from 2008-12; coach at GT since 2019).

## FIRST STARTS ON THE MOUND

- » Two Seminoles have made their first career starts on the mound in 2021 - second-year player Parker Messick and freshman Carson Montgomery.
- » Messick came out of FSU's bullpen in the shortened 2020 season. Montgomery was the nation's top prospect to reach campus before the 2021 season and is FSU's highest-rated recruit ever to make it to campus.
- » Bryce Hubbard was the only Seminole pitcher to make his first career start in 2020.
- » Hubbard made three starts, throwing deeper into the game in each successive outing. He started the season finale against Illinois State on March 11.

## 42 STRAIGHT NCAA REGIONAL APPEARANCES

- » The Seminoles ended the 2019 season in a familiar place, playing in Omaha at the College World Series.
- » The appearance was FSU's 23rd all-time appearance and former head coach Mike Martin's 17th trip, tied for the most for any one coach.
- » The 2019 season also produced a 42nd consecutive NCAA appearance as an at-large berth from the ACC. The Noles were the three-seed in the Athens Regional.
- » It was the first time ever that FSU was NOT a No. 1 or No. 2 seed in a regional. The last time FSU was not a No. 1 was in 2006 (also in Athens). The last time FSU did not host a regional was in 2010 (No. 1 seed in UConn regional).
- » Entering 2021, FSU's 57 regional appearances and 42 consecutive appearances rank second, behind Texas and Miami, respectively:

Mike Martin, Jr. enters his second season as the Florida State baseball head coach in 2021, following a 12-5 record in his first season. Shortened by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Seminoles ended Martin's inaugural campaign with three straight wins, including a road shutout at No. 1 Florida.

In Martin's first year as head coach, the Seminoles had one of the nation's top recruiting classes, finishing third by Baseball America and sixth by Collegiate Baseball and D1Baseball.

In 2020, Florida State finished second in the country with 43 hit by pitches and third nationally with 116 walks. Martin's pitching staff proved to be one of the nation's elite as well, ranking fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (12.1) and in the Top 20 in earned run average (2.50) and hits allowed per nine innings (6.27).

Behind its hit by pitch and walk totals, the Noles ranked 17th in on-base percentage (.415) and runs scored (135, 7.94 per game).

Martin helped oversee the growth of a handful of players, including sophomore outfielder Elijah Cabell, who finished in the Top 10 in the country in home runs (eighth) and RBI (fourth) while leading the NCAA with 15 hit by pitches.

Senior pitcher Chase Haney led the country with 12 appearances and led FSU with three wins. Antonio Velez was in the Top 25 in WHIP (10th), hits allowed per nine innings (17th) and ERA (22nd). Velez and freshman pitcher Parker Messick combined to allow just three hits in FSU's 2-0 win at No. 1 Florida on March 10.

Martin was elevated to head coach on June 21, 2019, after 22 years as a Seminole assistant coach at his alma mater. Focusing on hitting and recruiting, the former All-American catcher for the Seminoles compiled eight straight Top 10 recruiting classes from 2011-2018, while his offenses had a combined .300 batting average in his tenure.

As an assistant coach, Martin and Florida State made the postseason and won at least 40 games every year, with eight College World Series appearances, 17 NCAA super regionals and six Atlantic Coast Conference titles. He coached 16 Major Leaguers, 16 freshman All-Americans, 21 first-team All-Americans and 41 student-athletes who have earned first, second or third team All-America accolades. In all, 77 Seminoles earned All-ACC honors and 65 hitters have been selected in the Major League Baseball draft during that stretch.

Martin coached four Seminole hitters that captured National Player of the Year honors - Shane Robinson, Tony Thomas, Buster Posey and James Ramsey.

Prior to joining Florida State's staff, Martin was FSU's starting catcher from 1993-95, leading FSU to the College World Series in 1994 and 1995. He was drafted out of college by San Diego in the ninth round in 1995. Before coming to Florida State, Martin played high school ball at the MacLay School in Tallahassee and at Manatee Community College in 1992.

Martin has two sons, Tyler, an infielder for the Seminoles, and T.J.
