Tech Set for NCAA Tallahassee Regional

Georgia Tech begins its quest for a 30th all-time trip to the NCAA Championship finals Monday at the NCAA Tallahassee Regional at the Seminole Legacy Golf Club. It is one of six regional qualifying tournaments being held around the country Monday through Wednesday to determine the 30-team field for the NCAA Division I Men's Championship, which begins May 28 in Scottsdale, Ariz.

The top five teams in each regional qualifier advance to the NCAA Championship. Tech is the No. 5 seed in Tallahassee, behind host Florida State, Georgia, Liberty (Atlantic Sun Conference champion) and LSU. Georgia Southern (Sun Belt champion), TCU, Indiana, Kansaa and Southern California are seeded 6 through 10, followed by Ohio State, Davidson (Atlantic 10 champion), Florida A&M (MEAC champion) and Long Island University (Northeast champion).

The Yellow Jackets are playing in an NCAA regional for the 23rd straight year and for the 30th time in the 32 years the NCAA has used a regional qualifying format for its championship (the NCAA Championship and regionals were not conducted last spring due to COVID-19).

Tech is playing in an NCAA regional in Tallahassee for the second time, having finished fourth and advancing to the finals from Tallahassee in 2013 at Golden Eagle Golf and Country Club. The Jackets have won five NCAA regionals all-time, most recently in 2014 in Raleigh, N.C. Since then, Tech has advanced only twice (2015, 2019) in five regionals, twice falling short by one stroke.

As the fifth seed, the Yellow Jackets will begin round 1 from the 10th tee from 9 to 9:44 a.m., paired with LSU and Georgia Southern. Teams and individuals will be re-paired according to score after the first and second rounds.

Tournament Information

Eighty-one teams and 45 individuals are competing for spots in the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championship finals in six regional qualifying tournaments. The top five teams and one individual from each regional will advance to the finals, which will be conducted May 28-June 2 at Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, Ariz., which has a field of 30 teams and six individuals

Each regional is a 54-hole, stroke-play event with 13 teams and 10 individuals, or 14 teams and five individuals, competing. Tech is part of a regional field that includes 14 teams and five individuals

The Tallahassee regional in which Tech will compete includes eight teams that are ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation according to Golfstat. In order of seed, the field includes Florida State (No. 2), Georgia (11), Liberty (16), LSU (23), Georgia Tech (27), Georgia Southern (32), TCU (43) and Indiana (46).

Competition begins at 8:30 a.m. Monday and Tuesday, and at 8 a.m. for Wednesday's final round at Florida State's campus course, Seminole Legacy Golf Club, which measures 7,505 yards and plays to a par of 72.

The other five regional sites are: Albuquerque, N.M. (UNM Championship Course, host: New Mexico); Kingston Springs, Tenn. (Golf Club of Tennessee, host: Vanderbilt); Stillwater, Okla. (Karsten Creek Golf Club, host: Oklahoma State); Cle Elum, Wash. (Tumble Creek Golf Club, host: Washington); and Noblesville, Ind. (Sagamore Golf Club, host: Ball State).

Tech in NCAA Regional Competition

Georgia Tech has advanced through an NCAA regional 24 times in 29 tries, and all but four times since the NCAA went to a six-regional qualifying format in 2009. Head coach Bruce Heppler's teams have won five regional tournaments outright, most recently in 2014, and tied for one other.

The NCAA began using regional qualifying tournaments in 1989, first with the 81 teams split among three sites (27 teams each), then among six sites with either 13 or 14 teams each beginning in 2009. Since the NCAA went to six regional sites in 2009, Tech has advanced to the championship finals six times - third in 2009 (Bowling Green, Ky.), third in 2010 (Milton, Ga.), tied for third in 2011 (Radford, Va.), fourth in 2013 (Tallahassee, Fla.), first in 2015 (Raleigh, N.C.) and fourth in 2019 (Pullman. Wash.)

Tech's first four victories all occurred in 27-team regionals in 1991 (New Haven, Conn.), 1998 (Daufuskie Island, S.C.), 1999 (Providence, R.I.) and 2002 (Roswell, Ga., tied with Clemson). Only the 2014 win in Raleigh occurred in a 13-team field.

Team Update

Georgia Tech sits No. 27 nationally in the most recent Golfstat rankings and No. 26 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Index. The Yellow Jackets tied for fifth place at the 2021 Atlantic Coast Conference championship against a field that included four top-10 teams and 10 altogether that reside among Golfstat's top 50 teams. Also this spring, the Jackets won the Wyoming Desert Intercollegiate in February in California, and posted runner-up finishes at the Calusa Cup and Linger Longer Invitational.

Tech's quintet to compete in the NCAA regional has quite a different look from the team that competed in 2019 and advanced to the NCAA Championship in Fayetteville, Ark. Gone are two U.S. Amateur champions in Andy Ogletree and Tyler Strafaci, as well as a Georgia Amateur champion in Luke Schniederians.

Only senior **Noah Norton (Chico, Calif.)**, a two-time All-ACC honoree, and junior **Connor Howe (Ogden, Utah)**, who had combined to play 118 of those 160 rounds, return to compete during the 2021 postseason and have NCAA postseason experience.

Freshman Christo Lamprecht (George, South Africa) has been a regular in the Yellow Jackets lineup since the first spring event in January, and head coach Bruce Heppler has rotated five other players through the two other spots in the lineup. Senior Will Dickson (Providence, R.I.) and junior Ben Smith (Novi, Mich.) competed for the Yellow Jackets in their two events, a second-place finish at the Calusa Cup and a tie for fifth at the ACC Championship

Redshirt sophomore **Bartley Forrester (Gainesville, Ga.)**, who owns the only collegiate victory (2020 Puerto Rico Classic) among the current members of the team, has seen action in five events this spring and will be the alternate in case one of the Yellow, Jackets is sidelined.

Tee Shots

- Georgia Tech has won one tournament this spring, the Wyoming Desert Intercollegiate, and has a pair of runner-up finishes at the Calusa Cup and the Linger Longer Invitational. The Calusa Cup had a limited field that included five teams ranked in the Golfstat top 15, and the Yellow Jackets finished behind only No. 2 Oklahoma, and ahead of No. 1 Florida State. No. 7 Wake Forest. No. 8 Texas and No. 15 Florida.
- Tech tied for fifth place at the ACC Championship in Milton, Ga., one stroke shy of advancing to the match play portion of the championship.
 The Yellow Jackets finished ahead of Wake Forest, who is the top seed at the NCAA Cle Elum Regional, and one stroke behind FSU, the top seed in Tallahassee
- The five advancing teams from the 2013 Tallahassee Regional were, in order of finish, North Florida, Washington, Florida State, Georgia Tech and Oklahoma.
- Georgia Tech is currently ranked No. 27 nationally in Golfstat, its highest of the season after starting out at No. 40 in the first ranking on Feb. 28. Ahead of the Jackets in the ranking are Florida State (No. 2), Georgia (11), Liberty (16) and LSU (23). Those teams have combined to win nine events this spring.
- According to the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings, Tech has faced the 49th-most difficult schedule in Division I -- Tech has gone 4-17-1 vs. the nation's top 25 teams, 15-22-2 vs. the top 50, 42-28-2 vs. the top 100.
- Though Tech began the spring with an inexperienced team on the golf course, the Yellow Jackets started two seniors, two juniors and a freshman in the ACC Championship.
- Collectively, Tech's ACC Tournament lineup has compiled nine individual top-10 finishes, three each by freshman Christo Lamprecht and senior Noah Norton, two by Connor Howe and one by Ben Smith.
- No Tech player ranks higher than No. 103 in the Golfstat rankings
 Lamprecht is No. 103.
- No Tech player was voted to the All-ACC team for the first time since 2016, and for only the third time since 1985.
- Tech's 2019 NCAA Finals team had four payers with stroke averages under 72. Only Christo Lamprecht is under 72 (71.89) on this team
- Georgia Tech's collective average team score of of 287.17 is six strokes higher than the 2019 championship team (281.03, which ranked fourth in the nation).
- According to Golfstat national statistical rankings, Tech is No. 16 in most birdies (428), No. 5 in eagles (18) and No. 52 in comparison to par (1.32)

Tech Golf APR Perfect for 15 Straight Years

Bruce Heppler's golf program again earned a perfect four-year APR score of 1000 for the four-year period ending in the 2018-19 academic year in the NCAA's survey announced in May. The Yellow Jackets have earned a perfect four-year score every year since its inception in 2006, and has also received an APR Public Recognition Award every year. Among Power 5 conferences, Tech is one of two men's golf teams and 12 programs overall that have achieved the feat.

APR is an annual scorecard of academic achievement calculated for all Division I sports teams. It measures eligibility, graduation and retention each semester or academic term and provides a clear picture of the academic performance for each team in every sport.

Heppler ACC Coach of the Year 10 times

Georgia Tech Bruce Heppler has been named ACC Coach of the Year 10 times in his 25-year tenure on The Flats. That is the most for one coach in conference history.

Tech won the Atlantic Coast Championship in April for the 18th time, matching Wake Forest for the most in conference history. The Yellow Jackets have won six tournaments altogether, more than any other Division I team in 2018-19, bringing to 59 the total number of titles earned by the Jackets under Heppler. He has coached Tech to 13 of its 18 ACC titles.

Tech at Crabapple

Georgia Tech's golf team has competed in three collegiate events at the Capital City Club's Crabapple course, including two NCAA championship events.

Tech hosted the NCAA Southeast Regional at Crabapple in 2010, finishing third among the 13 teams to advance to the NCAA Championship. That team included current PGA Tour pro Chesson Hadley and Korn Ferry Tour members J.T. Griffin and Paul Haley II.

Tech was the host institution for the NCAA Championship at Crabapple in 2013, finishing second in stroke play and defeating UNLV in the match play quarterfinals before falling in the semifinals to eventual national champion Alabama. Leading that team were current Korn Ferry Tour players Anders Albertson, Seth Reeves and Ollie Schniederjans.

Most recently, Tech hosted a match play event at Crabapple in 2014, defeating Auburn and Georgia. Albertson, Reeves, Schniederjans and current PGA Tour pro Richy Werenski were the leaders of that unit.

Tech's NCAA Championship History

Georgia Tech has reached the NCAA Championship finals 29 times since 1985 (30 times in program history), which is tied for fifth most in that time period behind Oklahoma State (34), Arizona State (32), Florida (31) and Texas (31). Tech has posted nine top-8 finishes in the last 15 tries.

The Yellow Jackets have qualified for match play four times since the advent of the stroke-play/match-play format in 2009, finishing third in 2010, second in 2011, second in 2013, fifth in 2014. Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012, 2016, 2017 or 2018.

Tech lost to the eventual champion three times in its four forays into match play - Augusta State by the score of 3-2 in the quarterfinals in 2010 and 2011 and to Alabama (3-0-2) in 2013.

Tech has been the runner-up in the NCAA Championship four times (1993, 2000, 2002 and 2005, all before the advent of match play), more than any team in the history of the championship except Houston, Michigan, Texas and Wake Forest, who also have four, and Oklahoma State, which has five.

In 1993 and 2002, the Yellow Jackets led after 54 holes, but finished second by one shot to Florida in 1993, and by four shots to Minnesota in 2002.

In 2000, the Yellow Jackets rallied to tie Oklahoma State after 72 holes, but lost to the Cowboys on the first hole of a playoff. Tech and OSU matched the lowest 72-hole team score in NCAA Championship history (36-under-par 1,116) at the Grand National Lake Course in Opelika, Ala. In 2005, Tech finished 11 shots behind Georgia, and seven shots ahead of third-place Washington.

Since Bruce Heppler became Tech's coach, the Jackets have finished in the top eight 11 times.

Three Tech players have won national collegiate championships. Troy Matteson did it most recently in 2002 at Ohio State. Watts Gunn (1927) and Charlie Yates (1934) won national titles under a match play format before the NCAA took sponsorship of the championship in 1939.

Tech and NCAA Match Play

The 2009 NCAA Championship featured a new twist with the team champion determined via match play. The top eight teams after 54 holes of stroke play advance to a match play tournament format.

The NCAA added a fourth round of stroke play in 2016 for the top 15 teams and nine individuals not on those teams, after which the national individual champion and the top eight teams for match play will be determined

Match play is a format that Bruce Heppler has supported vigorously. Under Heppler, Georgia Tech finished in the top eight of the NCAA Finals seven times in 10 tries under the 72-hole, stroke-play format. Tech is one of only two teams (Oklahoma State is the other) to have advanced to match play four times in the six years the current format has been in effect

In the stroke-play/match play era, the Yellow Jackets have finished 10th, third, second, second and fifth, respectively, in the stroke-play portion the NCAA Championship in five tries (Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012 or 2016). Tech lost to the eventual national champion three of the four times it has qualified for match play (Augusta State in the 2010 and 2011 quarterfinals, Alabama in the 2013 semifinals).

Tech has had success in other match-play events in recent years, reaching the finals of the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship four times in six appearances.

Georgia Tech Match Play History

While match play in college golf may be infrequent, Georgia Tech is no stranger to it, having participated in 10 regular season match play events since 2000, as well as three times since the NCAA added match play to determine its champion. Here is a history of Tech's participation.

Tech's ACC Championship History

Georgia Tech has won 18 ACC men's golf championships, putting the Yellow Jackets in a tie with Wake Forest for the most titles in conference history. Tech's titles have all come from 1985 to the present. Wake Forest's most recent title came in 1989.

Tech has won the ACC Championship 10 times in the last 14 years, including the last two in a row. The Yellow Jackets won the 2019 championship with a tournament record score of 827 (37-under-par), breaking the previous mark of 831 (-33) set by the Jackets in 2011.

The 2020 ACC Tournament was not held after the 2020 spring season was cut short due to COVID-19.

Tech has won 13 of its conference titles under current head coach Bruce Heppler, 11 of those outright (1999, 2001, 2002, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2018, 2019) and two shared (2006, 2007). The Yellow Jackets won five championships (1985, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994) under previous head coach Puggy Blackmon.

Twelve of Tech's ACC titles have been won at the Old North State Club in New London, N.C., site of the event 22 of the last 25 years. The first occurred in 1999 by 10 strokes over North Carolina and Duke. Tech won its 2018 crown without an individual finishing higher than 12th place.

Georgia Tech has produced 10 ACC individual champions, including Bob McDonnell (1985), David Duval (1991, 1993), Mikko Rantanen (1994), Bryce Molder (2000), Cameron Tringale (2006), Chesson Hadley (2010), Paul Haley (2011), Albertson (2013, 2015) and Ollie Schniederjans (2014). Albertson and Duval are among five ACC players.

Tech Lineup Notes

Will Dickson (Senior, Providence, R.I.) — Has three top-20 finishes to his credit this spring after seeing action in just two events over his career previously at Tech ... Tied for 41st at the ACC Championship, and is fifth on the team in stroke average (73.72) ... Began to show promise last fall by finishing 13th or higher in all four amateur events he played, including a fourth-place effort in the Orlando International Amateur in December ... Was Tech's top finisher in both January events (15th at Camp Creek Invitational, 11th at Southwestern Invitational), and tied for 15th in a strong field at the Calusa Cup ... Golfstat ranking is 319, Golweek/Sagarin 318 ... Graduated May 8 with a degree in business administration

Bartley Forrester (Sophomore, Gainesville, Ga.) — The only member of Tech's current team to win a collegiate tournament, sharing medalist honors at the Puerto Rico Classic last February in his second career start ...
