### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech football opens its highly anticipated 2021 season on Saturday night when it hosts Northern Illinois at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Entering its third season under head coach **Geoff Collins**, Georgia Tech returns one of the nation's most-experienced teams. According to a formula developed by ESPN, the Yellow Jackets rank No. 2 in the ACC and No. 13 nationally in total returning production at 83%. Based on the same ESPN formula, the Jackets return 84% of total offensive production (21st nationally) and 82% of their defensive production (23rd nationally) from a year ago.
- Statistically, Georgia Tech returns 96% of its passing yards, 98% of its rushing yards, 69% of its receiving yards, 85% of its scoring, 75% of its tackles, 70% of its tackles for loss, 74% of its sacks, 100% of its interceptions and 83% of its total takeaways from last year.
- The Jackets bring back seven players that started at least half of the games on offense in 2020 and 10 players that started at least half of the games on defense.
- Georgia Tech is 89-35-4 (.711) all-time in season openers, including last year's thrilling 16-13 triumph at Florida State, and 96-26-4 (.778) all-time in home openers (the Yellow Jackets didn't play any home games in 1897 and 1898).
- Georgia Tech has won eight-straight Saturday night games at Bobby Dodd Stadium, dating back to a 31-17 win over No. 6 Clemson in 2011. The Jackets haven't lost at home on a Saturday night since 2009.
- Saturday is Georgia Tech's annual WhiteOut game. The tradition began with a nationally televised primetime win over Miami (Fla.) in 2008. The Yellow Jackets have won five of their last six WhiteOut games, including a 14-10 win over USF in their most recent WhiteOut contest, the 2019 home opener at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

Georgia Tech is the only team in the nation that plays four teams ranked in the *Associated Press*' preseason top 10 in 2021 (No. 3 Clemson, No. 5 Georgia, No. 9 Notre Dame and No. 10 North Carolina). In all, the Yellow Jackets face five of the AP's preseason top 15 teams, as they also square off against No. 14 Miami (Fla.).

Georgia Tech has won eight-straight Saturday night games at Bobby Dodd Stadium, dating back to a 31-17 win over No. 6 Clemson on Oct. 29, 2011. The Yellow Jackets haven't lost at home on a Saturday night since a 30-24 loss to Georgia on Nov. 28, 2009.

Georgia Tech ranks No. 13 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC in total returning production in 2021 at 83%, according to a formula developed by ESPN.

Georgia Tech's roster includes just 13 seniors, eligibility-wise, which is the fourth-fewest among all Power Five-conference teams (Colorado - 6, Oregon - 8, Utah - 11).

# 74

Seventy-four of the 124 student-athletes on Georgia Tech's 2021 roster are freshmen, eligibility-wise. The roster also includes 23 sophomores, 14 juniors and 13 seniors.

# 450/300/200

With 460 rushing yards, 303 receiving yards and 205 kickoff return yards last season, Georgia Tech RB **Jahmyr Gibbs** became the first true freshman from a Power Five conference since at least 2000 to record 450 rushing yards, 300 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games of the season. Since 2000, Gibbs was one of only seven Power Five players overall with 450 rushing yards/300 receiving yards/200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games, joining USC's Reggie Bush (2004), Arizona State's Marion Grice (2013), Stanford's Christian McCaffery (2015), Oklahoma's Joe Mixon (2016), Penn State's Saquon Barkley (2017) and Kentucky's Lynn Bowden, Jr. (2019). Making Gibbs' accomplishment even more impressive is the fact that he has played in just six-and-a-half of the Yellow Jackets' first eight games of the season. He missed the season opener at Florida State and left the eighth game of the campaign versus Duke before halftime due to injury (in what turned out to be his final game of the season).

# 741

Georgia Tech is tied for 19th in NCAA Division I FBS history with 741 all-time victories. The Yellow Jackets' .586 winning percentage (741-518-43) ranks 31st in FBS history.

**GEORGIA TECH THIRD-YEAR HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS**

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, is in his third season as Georgia Tech football's head coach. He was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018.

Despite the challenges associated with overhauling Georgia Tech's football culture, including installing a pro-style spread offensive attack after 11 years of option football at Tech, as well as the unprecedented and unexpected obstacles presented by the Covid-19 pandemic, Collins' two-year tenure as the Yellow Jackets' head coach has been marked by a bevy of accomplishments. They include:

- Back-to-back nationally lauded recruiting classes. Collins' first full recruiting class at Georgia Tech in 2020 was ranked No. 24 nationally by *Rivals*, then re-ranked No. 8 nationally by *Bleacher Report* during the '20 season based on the impressive play of Tech's newcomers, which included three true-freshman starters on offense: RB Jahmyr Gibbs (who earned freshman all-America recognition from The Athletic), QB Jeff Sims and RT Jordan Williams. It was only the second top-25 recruiting class in Georgia Tech history, and the first since 2007, a class that was compiled when Collins served as the Yellow Jackets' director of player personnel. His second recruiting class at Tech in 2021 is also a top-20 class when including the rankings of eight highly ranked transfers, six of which have multiple seasons of eligibility remaining. In all, Georgia Tech has added 18 four- or five-star recruits and 13 of the 45 highest-ranked recruits in program history (according to *247Sports*) since the arrival of Collins and his staff in January 2019.

- The development of three NFL Draft picks in two seasons – TE Tyler Davis (2020), WR Jalen Camp (2021) and P Pressley Harvin III (2021). Davis, who was recruited by Collins to come to The Flats as a graduate transfer in 2019, became Georgia Tech's first NFL Draft pick at any position in three years, the first non-specialist to be drafted from Tech in four years, the first Yellow Jacket tight end to be selected in 28 years and, as a sixth-round pick, the highest selection ever for a GT tight end in the NFL Draft. When Camp and Harvin were both selected in 2021, it marked the first time that Tech had multiple picks in the same NFL Draft since 2016.

- Harvin winning the 2020 Ray Guy Award as college football's top punter. Under Collins' tutelage, Harvin became the first Yellow Jacket to win one of college football's major individual awards since Durant Brooks won the Guy Award in 2007 and only the third unanimous All-American in Georgia Tech history, joining Calvin Johnson (2006) and Ken Swilling (1990)

- Memorable victories, including a 28-21 overtime win at Miami in 2019 (Tech's first-ever win over the Hurricanes at Miami's Hard Rock Stadium), a thrilling 16-13 come-from-behind triumph at Florida State to open the 2020 season (the Yellow Jackets' first season-opening true road win since 2007) and a perfect record in nationally televised primetime contests – a 28-26 win over NC State in 2019 and a 46-27 victory over Louisville in 2020.

Prior to taking the reins at Georgia Tech, Collins put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in Temple's 121-year football history. Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th – 2013) and scoring defense (23rd – 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' coaching career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins has also served on the staffs at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City. Under Collins, Tech became only

the second college football program in the nation to partner with renowned creative agency J1S and the first program in the nation to enter into a partnership with best-selling author and branding consultant Jeremy Darlow. Collins' focus on giving his student-athletes the resources and tools to assist in building their personal brand is a main reason that Georgia Tech is widely expected to be a place where student-athletes can maximize opportunities in the name, image and likeness era.

Collins' innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts have not only helped Georgia Tech land the two highest-rated recruiting classes in school history, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 50, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (5).

**OFFENSE**

• For the majority of observers, the most noticeable change when head coach **Geoff Collins** took the reins at Georgia Tech prior to the 2019 season was the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.

• Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave Patenaude**. Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins for two seasons at Temple (2017-18).

• With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).

• Last season, Georgia Tech averaged 389.9 yards of total offense per game this season, 103.6 yards per game more than it averaged in 2019, when it finished last in the ACC and 127th out of 130 teams nationally with 286.3 ypg.

• Georgia Tech racked up at least 400 yards of total offense six times in 2020, marking only the second time in the last six seasons that the Yellow Jackets had at least 400 yards in six of their first 10 games of a season (Tech also eclipsed the 400-yard mark six times in its first 10 games of 2018).

• Tech had at least 400 yards of total offense in each of its first four games of last season (438 at Florida State, 471 vs. UCF, 453 at Syracuse, 450 vs. Louisville). Going into the 2020 season, the Yellow Jackets had gone 16 games without compiling 400 yards of total offense, with their last 400-yard game coming on Nov. 3, 2018 at North Carolina.

• Prior to last year, the last time that Georgia Tech had four-straight 400-yard games at any point in a season was in 2011, the last time the Yellow Jackets opened a season with four-straight 400-yard games was in 2011 and the last time the Jackets opened a season with 400-yard games against four-straight NCAA Division I-A/FBS opponents was 1999.

• Ten different Georgia Tech players caught passes in last year's opener at Florida State, which were the most Yellow Jackets to catch a pass in a game since 2006 versus Samford and the most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since 2000 versus Georgia.

• Twice last season, three different Jackets caught touchdown passes in a game — Jalen Camp, **Malachi Carter** and **Jahmyr Gibbs** against Louisville (Oct. 9) and Camp, Carter and **Adonics Sanders** against Duke (Nov. 28). Prior to this season, Georgia Tech hadn't had three different receivers with touchdown receptions in the same game since Sept. 12, 2015 vs. Tulane (TaQuon Marshall, Qua Searcy and Michael Summers).

• Tech's 56 points against Duke were its most in a game since a 66-31 win at Louisville on Oct. 5, 2018.

• The Yellow Jackets' 377 rushing yards and 523 total yards against Duke were their most in a game since they had 461 rushing yards and 565 total yards in a 38-28 win at North Carolina on Nov. 3, 2018.

• The Yellow Jackets' offensive output would have been even more impressive last season if they had limited turnovers and better red-zone production. The Jackets ranked 125th out of 127 teams nationally last season with 25 turnovers and ranked 121st nationally in red-zone offense (.667).

• Tech committed 20 turnovers in their seven losses and have just five turnovers in their three wins last season.

• According to a formula developed by ESPN, Georgia Tech returns 84% of its offensive production in 2021, which ranks 21st nationally.

• Statistically, Georgia Tech returns 96% of its passing yards, 98% of its rushing yards, 69% of its receiving yards and 85% of its scoring in 2021.

• Sims' 277 passing yards versus Florida State were the most by any Georgia Tech quarterback since Justin Thomas threw for 282 yards against Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014 and the most by a GT QB against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Taylor Bennett threw for 309 against Maryland on Oct. 6, 2007.

• Sims became only the third Georgia Tech quarterback since 2000 to throw for at least 250 yards in a season opener, joining Thomas (282 vs. Wofford, 2014) and Tevin Washington (271 vs. Western Carolina, 2011).

• In addition to throwing for 277 yards against FSU, Sims also ran for a game-high 64 yards, giving him 341 yards of total offense, the most by any Georgia Tech player since Ta-Quon Marshall had 369 versus Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2017.

• Following his spectacular debut against FSU, Sims was named the ACC Rookie of the Week, as well as one of the Davey O'Brien Award's weekly Great 8 and one of the Manning Award's eight Stars of the Week.

• Sims was named ACC Rookie of the Week for a second time after accounting for 313 yards of total offense (249 passing, 64 rushing) and three touchdowns (two passing, one rushing) versus Louisville (Oct. 9).

• Sims collected his third ACC Rookie of the Week award after throwing for three touchdowns and rushing for 108 yards in Tech's 56-33 win over Duke (Nov. 28).

• Sims is only the third Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Rookie of the Week as many as three times and the fifth to earn the honor multiple times.

• The only other signal-caller on Georgia Tech's roster that has seen action as a Yellow Jacket is redshirt freshman **Jordan Yates**. For his career, Yates has seen action in five games (two as a true freshman in 2019, three as a redshirt freshman in 2020) and completed 8-of-20 passes for 54 yards.

• Georgia Tech added another reserve quarterback in the offseason in **Trad Beatty**, a graduate transfer from Temple. Beatty, who was recruited to Temple by Collins in 2018, played in five games over three seasons with the Owls (2018-20), including starts versus Tulane and No. 18 SMU in 2020.

**RUNNING BACKS**

• Joining Sims in taking the college football world by storm as a true freshman in 2020 was running back **Jahmyr Gibbs**.

• In just seven games last season, Gibbs rushed for 460 yards (5.2 avg.), caught 24 passes for 303 yards (12.6 avg.), returned eight kicks for 205 yards (25.6 avg.) and scored seven touchdowns (four rushing, three receiving).

• Despite only playing in six-and-a-half of Georgia Tech's 10 games last season, Gibbs ranked second on the team in rushing yards (460), receiving yards (303) and receptions (24) and led the squad in all-purpose yards (968) and total touchdowns (7). He ranked second on the squad in rushing touchdowns (4) and tied for second on the team in receiving touchdowns (3).



**OFFENSE**

• Gibbs played in just six-and-a-half of Georgia Tech's 10 games last season. He missed the Yellow Jackets' season opener at Florida State, left the Nov. 28 game versus Duke with more than five minutes to go in the first half and was unavailable for the final two games of the campaign (at NC State, vs. Pitt).

• Despite playing in just six-and-a-half games, Gibbs became the first NCAA FBS Division I true freshman this millennium with at least 450 rushing yards, 300 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games of the season.

• Since 2000, Gibbs is one of only seven Power Five players overall with 450 rushing yards/300 receiving yards/200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games, joining Reggie Bush (USC - 2004), Marion Grice (Arizona State - 2013), Christian McCaffery (Stanford - 2015), Joe Mixon (Oklahoma - 2016), Saquon Barkley (Penn State - 2017) and Lynn Bowden, Jr. (Kentucky - 2019).

• Gibbs became the first Georgia Tech player with 450 rushing yards, 300 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in a single-season since Orwin Smith in 2011.

• Twice in his seven games last season, Gibbs had at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards, one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown (Sept. 19 vs. UCF and Oct. 9 vs. Louisville). It was an accomplishment that was only achieved 14 times in NCAA Division I FBS in 2020. Gibbs and Clemson's Travis Etienne were the only Power Five conference players to do it multiple times.

• At Syracuse (Sept. 26), Gibbs became Georgia Tech's true freshman in four years to eclipse the 100-yard rushing plateau when he ran for 105 yards on 18 carries (5.8 avg.).

• Gibbs became the first Georgia Tech true freshman in four years to rush for 100 yards in a game when he ran for 105 yards on 18 carries (5.8 avg.) on Sept. 26 of last season at Syracuse. The 100-yard rushing game was the first by a true freshman at Tech since Dedrick Mills ran for 169 yards against Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016).

• In his collegiate debut, Gibbs amassed 219 all-purpose yards, including 126 from scrimmage, against No. 14/13 UCF on Sept. 19 of last season.

• On his first collegiate play, Gibbs returned the opening kickoff 75 yards to the UCF 21 yard line, setting up a three-play touchdown drive that gave the Yellow Jackets a 7-0 lead just 55 seconds into the game.

• Gibbs scored two touchdowns vs. UCF on a 9-yard reception in the second quarter and an electrifying 33-yard run in the fourth quarter that pulled the Yellow Jackets within seven points at 28-21.

• Gibbs finished with 93 yards on two kickoff returns, 66 rushing yards on 15 carries and a team-high 60 receiving yards on four receptions against UCF.

• In his debut against UCF, Gibbs became only the third ACC player since 2000 to compile at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards and 90 kickoff return yards in a game, joining Duke's Deon Jackson (Oct. 27, 2018 vs. Pitt) and Clemson's C.J. Spiller (Oct. 24, 2009 vs. Miami).

• Gibbs was named second-team freshman all-America by The Athletic as an all-purpose back and honorable mention all-ACC as a return specialist following his outstanding freshman campaign in 2020.

• Prior to this season, Gibbs was tabbed as one of 10 potential breakout players in college football by ESPN.

• Following an injury that hampered him for much of the first three months the season, RB **Jordan Mason** finished the 2020 season string with has returned to form with 245 rushing yards over the final three games of the campaign (105 vs. Duke on Nov. 28, 99 at NC State on Dec. 5 and 41 vs. Pitt on Dec. 10).

• Mason's 105-yard performance against Duke was the fourth 100-yard rushing game of his career. All four of his 100-yard rushing games have come in his last 13 contests.

• His 99-yard effort against NC State marked the second time in his career that Mason has come up 1 yard short of a 100-yard game (prev.: vs. USF, 2019).

• Mason picked up where he left off in 2019 with 73 all-purpose yards (55 rushing, 18 receiving) and a 19-yard touchdown run in Tech's 2020 season opener against Florida State (Sept. 12), but was injured in the 16-13 win and unavailable for Georgia Tech's next four games, snapping the junior's streak of 26-consecutive games played to begin his collegiate career.

• In the five games he played after returning to the lineup last season, Mason totaled 351 yards from scrimmage (297 rushing, 54 receiving).

• In 362 career carries, Mason has been held to negative yardage only 34 times.

• Since the beginning of the 2018 season, Mason is one of only eight players that has averaged at least 5.5 yards per rush on a minimum of 13 carries against six-time-defending ACC champion Clemson, and one of only four to accomplish the feat during the regular season.

• Mason currently ranks 18th in program history with 1,910 rushing yards. He needs just 90 yards to become only the 17th Yellow Jacket with 2,000 career rushing yards.

• Rounding out perhaps the deepest stable of running backs in all of college football are sophomores **Dontae Smith** and **Jamious Griffin**.

• With Smith and Griffin, Georgia Tech had four running backs (and five rushers overall) with at least 200 yards on the ground last season.

• Smith ranked fourth on the team with 296 rushing yards and third with three touchdowns in nine games last season. He led the team with a 6.9 yards-per-carry average.

• Griffin has rushed for 229 yards last season (fourth on the team) and two touchdowns this season despite playing in only seven games.



**OFFENSE**
**WIDE RECEIVERS**

• Georgia Tech returns four wide receivers — Jr. **Malachi Carter**, Jr. **Adonicas Sanders**, So. **Peje' Harris** and So. **Marquez Ezzard** — that caught at least nine passes for 124 yards last season.

• By comparison, as recently as three seasons ago (2018), Georgia Tech only had four different wideouts catch a pass all season.

• Carter's 20 receptions, 290 receiving yards and three touchdowns last season were tops among Georgia Tech's returning wide receivers in 2021.

• Carter's 89 receiving yards vs. Louisville on Oct. 5 of last season were the most by Georgia Tech wide receiver since Ricky Jeune had 96 at Virginia in 2017.

• Carter's 89 receiving yards against Louisville were eclipsed when Sanders caught seven passes for 105 yards on seven catches at NC State on Dec. 5.

• With his 105-yard performance at NC State, Sanders became the first Yellow Jacket with 100 receiving yards in a game since with 100 receiving yards in a game since A-back Clinton Lynch had 111 yards at USF on Sept. 8, 2018 and the first Tech wide receiver to accomplish the feat since Ricky Jeune had 103 yards at Virginia on Oct. 31, 2015.

• Despite only seeing significant playing time in 18 career games (the final eight of 2019 and all 10 last season), Sanders has become one of Georgia Tech's most reliable receivers with 33 receptions for 447 yards over those 18 contests. Prior to his current 18-game stretch, Sanders had just three receptions for 25 yards in his entire career.

**TIGHT ENDS**

• In 2019, Georgia Tech reintroduced the tight end position to its offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

• The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position going into the 2019 season was **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn, who wound up catching 17 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown for Tech in '19.

• Davis went on to become the first Georgia Tech tight end selected in the NFL Draft in 28 years (since Tom Covington — San Francisco 49ers, 1992) when the Jacksonville Jaguars took him with their sixth-round pick (No. 206 overall) in the 2020 draft. No Tech tight end has ever been selected higher in the NFL Draft than Davis.

• Davis' departure left Tech with only two tight ends on its roster with any game experience at the position in 2020 — true sophomores **Dylan Deveney** and **Dylan Leonard**.

• Deveney and Leonard each missed three of Georgia Tech's 10 games last season. In just seven games apiece, they combined to catch seven passes for 61 yards and one touchdown.

• Tech is 3-4 last season with both Deveney and Leonard in the lineup and 0-3 without one or both of them.

• One of the best stories on Georgia Tech's roster is Jr. TE **Jack Coco**, who lost 40 pounds in the 2020 offseason to transition from offensive line to tight end. Coco, who caught four passes for 22 yards while playing all 10 games last season, received a scholarship during the 2021 offseason.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

• Georgia Tech's offensive line has paved the way for an offensive resurgence that has seen the Yellow Jackets post the six highest yardage totals of the **Geoff Collins** era last season.

• Georgia Tech ranked fourth the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 ypg) last season.

• Tech did not surrender any sacks in games against UCF (Sept. 19) or Louisville (Oct. 9) and only one sack again at Syracuse (Sept. 26) last season.

• The offensive front played a huge role in the Yellow Jackets rushing for 377 yards versus Duke (Nov. 28), the Jackets' highest rushing total since they ran for 461 yards at North Carolina on Nov. 3, 2018.

• Georgia Tech returns three starting linemen from last season — Sr. RG **Ryan Johnson**, Jr. C **Mikey Minihan** and Fr. RT **Jordan Williams**. They combined to make 29-of-30 potential starts for Tech last season.

• With the addition of graduate transfers **Devin Cochran** (Vanderbilt) and **Kenneth Kirby** (Norfolk State), the offensive linemen on Georgia Tech's 2021 roster have combined for a whopping 228 collegiate games played and 170 starts.

**DEFENSE**
**TEAM**

• Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past nine seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18) and Georgia Tech.

- Over the past 10 seasons, Collins' defenses have:
  - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
  - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
  - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
  - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
  - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained six times (twice in top 6)
  - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
  - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

• Collins' and defensive coordinator **Andrew Thacker's** aggressive, attacking style of defense was on display in 2020, as Georgia Tech finished among the national leaders in fumble recoveries (12 - No. 2 nationally) and turnovers gained (18 - No. 25 nationally).

• For the season, Georgia Tech forced 11 turnovers in its three wins and just seven in its seven losses.

• Another staple of Collins' defenses, the defensive touchdown, was also on display in 2020, as Georgia Tech scored defensive touchdowns in two of its last four games of the season.

• On Nov. 28 versus Duke, Jr. DL **Jordan Domineck** forced a fumble on a sack of Blue Devils QB Chase Brice in the end zone, then fell on the loose ball himself for the strip-sack-and-score, which gave the Yellow Jackets a 28-23 lead late in the first half. Tech would never relinquish the lead on its way to the 56-33 victory.

• Jr. DB **Zamari Walton's** 93-yard return of a fumble forced by Jr. DB **Juanyeh Thomas** for a touchdown versus Notre Dame (Oct. 31) was the longest recorded fumble return in Georgia Tech history, breaking the previous record of 90 yards set by Kofi Smith vs. Wake Forest on Nov. 21, 1998 (*note: fumble returns became an official NCAA stat in 1992*).

• Yellow Jackets that record takeaways have the opportunity to sign the "Get The Ball Board" on Georgia Tech's sideline. Introduced by Collins when he was the defensive coordinator at Western Carolina in 2002, the "Get The Ball Board" has evolved from players simply adorning the board with their signatures to signing with their social media handles.

## DEFENSE

- Late last season, Georgia Tech held consecutive opponents to less than 100 rushing yards (68 vs. Duke on Nov. 28 and 88 last Saturday at NC State) for the first time since it limited Mercer and Vanderbilt to 85 yards on the ground apiece on Sept. 10 and 17, 2016.

- Prior to games nine and 10 of last season, Tech had not held NCAA Division I FBS opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground in consecutive games since 2013, when it achieved the feat against Virginia (68 yds. on Oct. 26) and Pitt (-5 yds. on Nov. 2).

- Tech finished with 62 tackles for loss in 10 games last season (6.2 per game). In 2019, the Yellow Jackets averaged 5.1 TFL per game (61 total in 12 games). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 4.2 TFL per game.

- Tech's 62 tackles for loss this season are its most through 10 games since 2013 (66) and mark only the fourth time since 2000 that it has had 60 TFL or more through 10 contests (2008 - 83; 2007 - 95; 2005 - 78).

- Five Yellow Jackets — DL **Jordan Domineck** (8.5), LB David Curry (9.0), LB **Quez Jackson** (4.5), DB Kaleb Oliver (4.0) and DB/LB **Charlie Thomas** (4.0) — recorded at least four tackles for loss last season, which were the most Jackets with at least four TFL through 10 games since 2015.

- Additionally, 12 different Yellow Jackets had at least 2.5 tackles for loss apiece in 10 games last season (Domineck, Curry, Jackson, Oliver, Thomas, DB **Tariq Carpenter** (2.5), DL **Djimon Brooks** (3.0), DL **Aneonneus Clayton** (2.5), DL **Ja'Quon Griffin** (3.5), DL Curtis Ryans (2.5), DL **Kyle Kennard** (2.5) and DL **Sylvain Yondjouen** (2.5). Prior to this season, the last time that as many as 12 different Jackets had at least 2.5 TFL through 10 games was in 2012 (Jeremiah Attaochu, T.J. Barnes, Izaan Cross, Euclid Cummings, Emmanuel Dieke, Shawn Green, Jabari Hunt-Days, Isaiah Johnson, Quayshawn Nealy, Rod Sweeting, Jemea Thomas and Brandon Watts).

- Tech also has 19 sacks through eight games this season (2.11 per game). Last year, the Yellow Jackets averaged 1.4 sacks per game (17 total). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 116th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 1.3 sacks per game.

- Tech also had 21 sacks in 10 games last season (2.1 per game). In 2019, the Yellow Jackets averaged 1.4 sacks per game (17 total). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 116th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 1.3 sacks per game.

- On the analytics front, Georgia Tech had a pressure rate at 27.8% and a non-blitz pressure rate of 25.1% in 2020. Both represented a significant uptick from 2019, when the Yellow Jackets finished with a 25.8% pressure rate (107th nationally) and a 24.2% non-blitz pressure rate (91st nationally - credit: ESPN Stats & Info).

- Georgia Tech's 27.8% pressure rate in 2020 was its best in the past decade (prev.: 27.4% in 2015 - credit: ESPN Stats & Info).

- In last season's opener at Florida State (Sept. 12), Georgia Tech's defense put together its finest performance of the Collins era in a 16-13 triumph.

- Tech's defense limited Florida State to just 307 yards of total offense (3.8 yards per play).

- The Yellow Jackets forced three turnovers in the win at FSU (an interception and two fumbles).

- Perhaps most notably, after the Seminoles racked up 113 yards and 10 points in their first two possessions, Tech's defense surrendered just 194 yards and three points the rest of the way.

- Since the beginning of 2019, Georgia Tech has held 10-of-22 opponents to less than 200 passing yards or less (169 vs. USF, Sept. 7, 2019; 30 vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14, 2019; 124 at Temple, Sept. 28, 2019; 176 at Duke, Oct. 12, 2019; 200 at Miami, Oct. 19, 2019; 198 at Florida State, Sept. 12, 2020; 194 at Syracuse, Sept. 26, 2020; 145 at Boston College, Oct. 24, 2020; 199 vs. Notre Dame, Oct. 31, 2020; 196 vs. Pitt, Dec. 10, 2020).

- Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's most experienced secondaries coming into 2021. The Yellow Jackets' defensive backs have combined to make 109 career starts (**Tariq Carpenter** - 32, **Tre Swilling** - 28, **Juanyeh Thomas** - 21, **Zamari Walton** - 21, **Wesley Walker** - 5 and **Myles Sims** - 2). That ranks third nationally among all Power Five conference teams, behind only Indiana (138) and Oklahoma State (117). (credit: Penn State Athletics).

### INDIVIDUAL

- Jr. LB **Quez Jackson** led Georgia Tech in tackles in five of its 10 games last season (nine at Florida State, nine vs. UCF, nine vs. Louisville, nine at BC and 11 vs. No. 4 Notre Dame).

- Jackson and DB **Juanyeh Thomas** are the Yellow Jackets' only returners in 2021 that led the team in tackles in any game in 2020 (Thomas led Tech with 10 tackles at Syracuse).

- Jackson finished eighth in the ACC with 8.0 tackles per game last season (80 total).

- Jackson was the only NCAA Division I FBS student-athletes in the nation in 2020 to record at least 80 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions and a fumble recovery in 10 games or fewer last season. The only other player to accomplish the feat was Appalachian State's D'Marco Jackson, who did it in 12 games.

- Despite Jackson's gaudy numbers, Georgia Tech actually lost its leading tackler from the past two seasons in LB David Curry, who chose to not utilize what would've been a seventh season of eligibility and signed a free agent contract with the Denver Broncos during the offseason. Curry led the Yellow Jackets in tackles in 2020 (84 in 10 games - fifth in the ACC) and 2019 (97 in 12 games - t-eighth in the ACC).

- Curry's large shoes will be filled by Jr. LB **Ayinde Eley**, a graduate transfer from Maryland. Eley, who made 11 starts over three seasons at Maryland, was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection as a sophomore in 2019, after recording 79 tackles, four tackles for loss, a half-sack, two fumble recoveries, an interception and five passes defended in 11 games (nine starts).

- Eley was one of only three Power Five conference players to record at least 75 tackles, four TFL, two fumble recoveries and five passes defended in 2019, joining Miami's Shaq Quarterman and Utah's Terrell Burgess.

- Jr. DL **Jordan Domineck** became a force for the Yellow Jackets in 2020, finishing the season with 35 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries in nine games this season. His four sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries were all team highs.

- For the season, Domineck's three forced fumbles (.38/gm) ranked third in the ACC and 16th nationally, while his two fumble recoveries tied for third in the ACC and 12th nationally with teammate **Tre Swilling**.

- According to ESPN Stats & Info, Domineck pressured the quarterback on 15.2% of his pass rushes last season. That is tops among all returning ACC student-athletes in 2021 and eighth among all returning Power Five conference players.

- Four Power Five conference players that entered the 2021 NFL Draft had a better pressure rate than Domineck's 15.2% last season. All four were selected in the first 118 picks of the draft. (credit: ESPN Stats & Info)

- Domineck turned in one of the most dominant performances in recent college football history versus Duke on Nov. 28 of last season with two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery for a touchdown.

- Domineck's forced fumble and fumble recovery for touchdown came when he strip-sacked Duke QB Chase Brice in the end zone, then fell on the loose ball for a touchdown that gave Georgia Tech a 28-23 lead late in the first half. Tech never relinquished the lead after Domineck's first-career touchdown.

- Domineck became the first Power Five conference player with two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery for a touchdown since since NC State's Brian Slay did it against Liberty on Sept. 3, 2011.

- Domineck also became the first Power Five player to accomplish the rare two sacks/2.5 TFL/FF/FR/TD feat against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since UCLA's Akeem Ayers versus Arizona State on Nov. 21, 2009.

- Domineck was also quite disruptive during a two-game stretch versus Syracuse (Sept. 26) and Louisville (Oct. 9) last season. He recorded 10 tackles, three TFL, two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery came in the two-game stretch against the Orange and Cardinals.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

- In addition to bursting on the scene as one of college football's most dynamic running backs as a true freshman in 2020, **Jahmyr Gibbs** also established himself as one of the nation's top kickoff returners.

- Gibbs averaged 25.6 yards per kickoff return last season, which would rank second in the ACC and 23rd nationally if he qualified for the official statistical rankings (with eight returns, he fell just two returns short).

- Gibbs returned the opening kickoff vs. UCF (Sept. 19) 75 yards on the first play of his collegiate career. The 75-yard return was the longest kickoff return by a Yellow Jacket since Juanyeh Thomas (then a true freshman himself) returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown at Georgia on Nov. 24, 2018.

- Gibbs also had what would have been a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown erased by a holding penalty at Boston College (Oct. 24).

- After ranking 126th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams in kickoff coverage in 2018 (26.3 yards per return), Georgia Tech allowed 20.8 yards per return in 2020, an improvement of five-and-a-half yards per return in less than two seasons.

- Head coach **Geoff Collins** states repeatedly that special teams are the No. 1 priority within Georgia Tech's program, a philosophy that is highlighted by the fact that a student-athlete cannot earn playing time on offense or defense if they aren't able to contribute on special teams.

- The emphasis on special teams paid dividends has paid dividends since his arrival in 2019, most notably in blocked kicks.

- Georgia Tech has blocked four kicks in the last 17 games, all in the final seven games of the season (two punts, a field goal and an extra point).

- Prior to blocking four kicks in the past 17 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.

- Georgia Tech has blocked 23 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the eighth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

- The nation's most blocked kicks over the past eight seasons (since 2013) belong to Temple (29). Six of those came in the last two seasons of Collins' tenure as the Owls' head coach (2017-18). Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

**MISCELLANEOUS**

- Despite returning 17 student-athletes that started at least half of last year's games on offense or defense, Georgia Tech remains one of major college football's youngest teams.

- Two years after having just eight seniors on its roster (which was the second-fewest in NCAA Division I FBS in 2019), Tech has just 13 seniors on its 2021 roster, which is the fourth-fewest in the nation among Power Five conference teams and tied for the eighth-fewest among all FBS teams.

- One of the nation's youngest rosters will face one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2021. Most notably, Georgia Tech faces five teams ranked in the top 15 of the Associated Press preseason top-25 poll — No. 3 Clemson, No. 5 Georgia, No. 9 Notre Dame, No. 10 North Carolina and No. 14 Miami (Fla.).

- Tech is the only team in the nation that has four of the AP's preseason top 10 teams on its schedule (Clemson, UGA, ND and UNC).

- Pundits and ratings systems are unanimous in ranking Georgia Tech's schedule among the three toughest in the nation.

- As is often the case, turnover margin was a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech won or lost in 2020. In their three wins last season, the Yellow Jackets won the turnover battle in all three games and were plus-six overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech did not win the turnover battle in any of its seven defeats and is minus-13 overall in turnover margin.

- As part of Georgia Tech athletics' ongoing partnership with Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, the organizations have teamed up once again to have the Yellow Jackets' success on "Money Down" — head coach **Geoff Collins'** term for third and fourth downs — benefit Children's this season.

- Fans are encouraged to make pledges to Children's based on the Jackets' success on "Money Down." To lead the way, Collins' has pledged for the second-straight year to donate \$10 to Children's for every "Money Down" stop that the Yellow Jackets make on defense and each "Money Down" that the Jackets convert into a first down on offense this season.

- Last season, Georgia Tech had a total of 162 "Money Down" defensive stops and offensive conversions (93 defensive stops, 69 offensive conversions). Including Collins' \$1,620 donation, the Money Down benefit raised a total of \$10,404 for Children's.

- Fans can pledge at [buzz.gt/MoneyDown2021](http://buzz.gt/MoneyDown2021) to contribute to the cause this season.

- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, Georgia Tech has played games in seven different National Football League stadiums (Mercedes-Benz Stadium - Atlanta, Ford Field - Detroit, TIAA Bank Field - Jacksonville, Hard Rock Stadium - Miami, Lincoln Financial Field - Philadelphia, Heinz Field - Pittsburgh and Raymond James Stadium - Tampa Bay), which is the most NFL stadiums that any college football team has played in during that span.
