TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech looks to bounce back from a heartbreaking 22-21 loss to Northern Illinois in its season opener when it hosts nearby Kennesaw State in a battle for metro Atlanta bragging rights on Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Last Saturday's loss came despite Georgia Tech having a 429-301 advantage in total yards, driving into NIU territory on 9-of-12 offensive possessions and holding the Huskies without a first down on 8-of-12 defensive series.
- Although they are separated by just 22 miles on Interstate 75, Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State are meeting for the first time in football. The schools agreed to the matchup in 2014, a year before Kennesaw fielded its first football team in 2015.
- Georgia Tech is playing against an opponent from the metro Atlanta area for the first time in 93 years. In their first 128 seasons of football, the Yellow Jackets played just three opponents from the metro Atlanta area a total of 12 times — Ft. McPherson (1894, 1904, 1913), Camp Gordon (1918) and Oglethorpe (1920-28). Tech was 10-2 in those 12 matchups, capped by a 32-7 win over the Oglethorpe Stormy Petrels on Nov. 3, 1928.
- Although only in its seventh season of existence, Kennesaw State has established itself as one of the nation's top programs in NCAA Division I FCS. The Owls have earned three FCS playoff berths in the past four seasons (including quarterfinal appearances in 2017 and 2018) and have won two Big South Conference championships (2017 and 2018). They are currently ranked No. 22 in the FCS national rankings, following last Thursday's season-opening 35-25 win over NAIA Reinhardt.
- Three of Kennesaw State's full-time coaches have previously spent time on the staff at Georgia Tech, including seventh-year head coach Brian Bohannon, who spent five seasons as quarterbacks and fullbacks coach at Tech (2008-12) before becoming the first head coach in KSU history in 2013.

GEORGIA TECH THIRD-YEAR HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, is in his third season as Georgia Tech football's head coach. He was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018.

Despite the challenges associated with overhauling Georgia Tech's football culture, including installing a pro-style spread offensive attack after 11 years of option football at Tech, as well as the unprecedented and unexpected obstacles presented by the Covid-19 pandemic, Collins' two-year tenure as the Yellow Jackets' head coach has been marked by a bevy of accomplishments. They include:

- Back-to-back nationally lauded recruiting classes. Collins' first full recruiting class at Georgia Tech in 2020 was ranked No. 24 nationally by *Rivals*, then re-ranked No. 8 nationally by *Bleacher Report* during the '20 season based on the impressive play of Tech's newcomers, which included three true-freshman starters on offense: RB Jahmyr Gibbs (who earned freshman all-America recognition from The Athletic), QB Jeff Sims and RT Jordan Williams. It was only the second top-25 recruiting class in Georgia Tech history, and the first since 2007, a class that was compiled when Collins served as the Yellow Jackets' director of player personnel. His second recruiting class at Tech in 2021 is also a top-20 class when including the rankings of eight highly ranked transfers, six of which have multiple seasons of eligibility remaining. In all, Georgia Tech has added 18 four- or five-star recruits and 13 of the 45 highest-ranked recruits in program history (according to *247Sports*) since the arrival of Collins and his staff in January 2019.

- The development of three NFL Draft picks in two seasons – TE Tyler Davis (2020), WR Jalen Camp (2021) and P Pressley Harvin III (2021). Davis, who was recruited by Collins to come to The Flats as a graduate transfer in 2019, became Georgia Tech's first NFL Draft pick at any position in three years, the first non-specialist to be drafted from Tech in four years, the first Yellow Jacket tight end to be selected in 28 years and, as a sixth-round pick, the highest selection ever for a GT tight end in the NFL Draft. When Camp and Harvin were both selected in 2021, it marked the first time that Tech had multiple picks in the same NFL Draft since 2016.

- Harvin winning the 2020 Ray Guy Award as college football's top punter. Under Collins' tutelage, Harvin became the first Yellow Jacket to win one of college football's major individual awards since Durant Brooks won the Guy Award in 2007 and only the third unanimous All-American in Georgia Tech history, joining Calvin Johnson (2006) and Ken Swilling (1990)

- Memorable victories, including a 28-21 overtime win at Miami in 2019 (Tech's first-ever win over the Hurricanes at Miami's Hard Rock Stadium), a thrilling 16-13 come-from-behind triumph at Florida State to open the 2020 season (the Yellow Jackets' first season-opening true road win since 2007) and a perfect record in nationally televised primetime contests – a 28-26 win over NC State in 2019 and a 46-27 victory over Louisville in 2020.

Prior to taking the reins at Georgia Tech, Collins put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in Temple's 121-year football history. Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th – 2013) and scoring defense (23rd – 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' coaching career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins has also served on the staffs at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City. Under Collins, Tech became only

the second college football program in the nation to partner with renowned creative agency J1S and the first program in the nation to enter into a partnership with best-selling author and branding consultant Jeremy Darlow. Collins' focus on giving his student-athletes the resources and tools to assist in building their personal brand is a main reason that Georgia Tech is widely expected to be a place where student-athletes can maximize opportunities in the name, image and likeness era.

Collins' innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts have not only helped Georgia Tech land the two highest-rated recruiting classes in school history, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 50, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (5).

GEORGIA TECH-KSU SERIES HISTORY

• Separated by just 22 miles on Interstate 75, Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State are meeting for the first time in football.

• The schools agreed to the matchup in 2014, a year before Kennesaw fielded its first football team in 2015.

• Georgia Tech has only faced opponents from the Big South Conference on two other occasions — a 10-7 win over Gardner-Webb on Oct. 11, 2008 and a 59-3 win over Presbyterian on Sept. 8, 2012.

ABOUT KENNESAW STATE

• Although only in its seventh season of existence, Kennesaw State has established itself as one of the nation's top programs in NCAA Division I FCS.

• The Owls have earned three FCS playoff berths (2017, 2018, 2019) and have won at least one game in each of their postseason appearances. They advanced to the FCS quarterfinals in 2017 and 2018.

• KSU has won two Big South Conference championships (2017 and 2018).

• The Owls are currently ranked No. 22 in the FCS national rankings, following last Thursday's season-opening 35-25 win over NAIA Reinhardt.

• Three of Kennesaw State's full-time coaches have previously spent time on the staff at Georgia Tech, including seventh-year head coach Brian Bohannon, who spent five seasons as quarterbacks and fullbacks coach at Tech (2008-12) before becoming the first head coach in KSU history in 2013.

• The other former Yellow Jackets on Bohannon's staff include defensive line coach Liam Klein (GT graduate assistant, 2004-06; GT director of player personnel, 2007-14) and running backs coach Joe Speed (GT inside linebackers coach, 2010-12; GT outside linebackers coach, 2012; GT secondary coach, 2013-15; GT cornerbacks coach, 2016-18).

• Klein was a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2006 when current Tech head coach Geoff Collins served as the Yellow Jackets' director of player personnel. Klein then took over Collins' role as director of player personnel when Collins left Tech for the same position at Alabama in 2007.

TECH vs. OPPONENTS FROM METRO ATLANTA

• Saturday's game versus Kennesaw State marks only the 14th time in Georgia Tech's 129-season football history that it will play an opponent that is also based in the metro Atlanta area.

• Tech has not played an opponent from metro Atlanta since a 32-7 win over Oglethorpe on Nov. 3, 1928.

• Oglethorpe, a university located Brookhaven, Fort McPherson, an Army base that was located southwest of downtown Atlanta, and Camp Gordon, a temporary World War I training camp that was located in Chamblee, fielded the only other teams from the metro Atlanta area that Georgia Tech has ever played in football.

• Tech played Fort McPherson three times (1894, 1904 and 1913), Camp Gordon once (1918) and Oglethorpe nine times (1920-28). GT was 2-1 versus Fort McPherson, 1-0 versus Camp Gordon and 8-1 against the Oglethorpe Stormy Petrels. Fort McPherson closed in 2011, Camp Gordon was demobilized in 1919 after the conclusion of WWI and Oglethorpe fielded its last football team in 1941.

• Following Saturday's game versus Kennesaw State, Georgia Tech is scheduled to play nearby Georgia State twice in the upcoming decade — 2024 at Tech's Bobby Dodd Stadium and 2026 at GSU's Center Parc Stadium.

OFFENSE

• For the majority of observers, the most noticeable change when head coach **Geoff Collins** took the reins at Georgia Tech prior to the 2019 season was the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.

• Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave Patenaude**. Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins for two seasons at Temple (2017-18).

• With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).

• In last Saturday's season opener against Northern Illinois, Georgia Tech amassed 429 yards of total offense, nearly 40 yards better than last season's 389.9 yards-per-game average and Georgia Tech's sixth-highest total in its last 27 games, dating back to Nov. 10, 2018

• Georgia Tech's 25 first downs last Saturday against NIU were the most that it has recorded in three seasons under Collins and its most in the last 27 games, dating back to the Yellow Jackets picking up 27 first downs at North Carolina on Nov. 3, 2018.

• Tech's 17-play, 97-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter of last Saturday's game against Northern Illinois is tied for the 11th-longest scoring drive by yards in program history (longest since a 99-yard TD drive at Pitt on Sept. 15, 2018) and is tied for the 21st-longest scoring drive by plays in program history (longest since a 17-play field goal drive and 18-play TD drive vs. North Carolina on Sept. 30, 2017).

• The Yellow Jackets' 273 rushing yards last Saturday against Northern Illinois marked the fifth time in Collins' 23 games at the helm that Georgia Tech has rushed for at least 260 yards, which is tied for the second-most in the Atlantic Coast Conference during that span (Boston College - 7; Clemson - 5).

• Last season, Georgia Tech averaged 389.9 yards of total offense per game this season, 103.6 yards per game more than it averaged in 2019, when it finished last in the ACC and 127th out of 130 teams nationally with 286.3 ypg.

• Georgia Tech racked up at least 400 yards of total offense six times in 2020, marking only the second time in the last six seasons that the Yellow Jackets had at least 400 yards in six of their first 10 games of a season (Tech also eclipsed the 400-yard mark six times in its first 10 games of 2018).

• Tech had at least 400 yards of total offense in each of its first four games of last season (438 at Florida State, 471 vs. UCF, 453 at Syracuse, 450 vs. Louisville). Going into the 2020 season, the Yellow Jackets had gone 16 games without compiling 400 yards of total offense, with their last 400-yard game coming on Nov. 3, 2018 at North Carolina.

• Prior to last year, the last time that Georgia Tech had four-straight 400-yard games at any point in a season was in 2011, the last time the Yellow Jackets opened a season with four-straight 400-yard games was in 2011 and the last time the Jackets opened a season with 400-yard games against four-straight NCAA Division I-A/FBS opponents was 1999.

• Seven different Yellow Jackets had at least 100 receiving yards last season — wide receivers Camp (342), Carter (244), **Adonias Sanders** (216), Ahmearon Brown (183) **Peje Harris** (138) and **Marquez Ezzard** (124) and running back Gibbs (303). The last time Tech had as many as seven players with 100 receiving yards through 10 games was 2001 — a group that was comprised of current Georgia Tech offensive analyst **Will Glover**, Russell Matvay, Levon Thomas, Joe Burns, Kelly Campbell, Jonathan Smith and Kerry Watkins.

• Georgia Tech was one of only six NCAA Division I FBS teams with three players that rushed for at least 350 yards through 10 games last season — QB **Jeff Sims** (492), RB **Jahmyr Gibbs** (460) and RB **Jordan Mason** (352). The other teams on the list were Appalachian State, Coastal Carolina, Florida State, Kentucky and Nebraska.

• The Yellow Jackets' offensive output would have been even more impressive last season if they had limited turnovers and better red-zone production. The Jackets ranked 125th out of 127 teams nationally last season with 25 turnovers and ranked 121st nationally in red-zone offense (.667).

• Since the beginning of last season, Tech has committed 21 turnovers in their eight losses and have just five turnovers in their three wins last season.

• According to a formula developed by ESPN, Georgia Tech returned 84% of its offensive production in 2021, which ranked 21st nationally.

• Statistically, Georgia Tech returned 96% of its passing yards, 98% of its rushing yards, 69% of its receiving yards and 85% of its scoring in 2021.

• Sims' 277 passing yards versus Florida State were the most by any Georgia Tech quarterback since Justin Thomas threw for 282 yards against Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014 and the most by a GT QB against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Taylor Bennett threw for 309 against Maryland on Oct. 6, 2007.

• Sims became only the third Georgia Tech quarterback since 2000 to throw for at least 250 yards in a season opener, joining Thomas (282 vs. Wofford, 2014) and Tevin Washington (271 vs. Western Carolina, 2011).

• In addition to throwing for 277 yards against FSU, Sims also ran for a game-high 64 yards, giving him 341 yards of total offense, the most by any Georgia Tech player since Ta-Quon Marshall had 369 versus Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2017.

• Sims is only the third Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Rookie of the Week as many as three times and the fifth to earn the honor multiple times.

• After Sims left Saturday's season opener versus Northern Illinois due to injury, redshirt freshman **Jordan Yates** saw the first significant action of his collegiate career.

• Yates responded in a big way, completing 12-of-18 passes for 135 yards and a touchdown and running nine times for 27 yards and another score (all career highs) in nearly leading the Yellow Jackets to victory after entering the game facing a 14-0 deficit in the second quarter.

• Yates led Georgia Tech to three touchdowns in his eight possessions at the helm against NIU, including a 17-play, 97-yard touchdown drive in his first series behind center.

• For his career, Yates has seen action in six games (two as a true freshman in 2019, three in 2020 and one this season) and completed 20-of-38 passes for 189 yards and run 24 times for 36 yards and another score.

• Georgia Tech added another reserve quarterback in the offseason in **Trad Beatty**, a graduate transfer from Temple. Beatty, who was recruited to Temple by Collins in 2018, played in five games over three seasons with the Owls (2018-20), including starts versus Tulane and No. 18 SMU in 2020.

RUNNING BACKS

• Joining Sims in taking the college football world by storm as a true freshman in 2020 was running back **Jahmyr Gibbs**.

• In his 2021 debut (and only the eighth game of collegiate career) last Saturday against Northern Illinois, Gibbs recorded 178 all-purpose yards — 99 rushing, 17 receiving and 62 on kickoff returns.

• Gibbs' 99 rushing yards and 178 all-purpose yards against NIU were both the second-highest totals of his career, behind only last season's 105 rushing yards at Syracuse (Sept. 26) and 219 all-purpose yards vs. UCF (Sept. 19).

• In just seven games last season, Gibbs rushed for 460 yards (5.2 avg.), caught 24 passes for 303 yards (12.6 avg.), returned eight kicks for 205 yards (25.6 avg.) and scored seven touchdowns (four rushing, three receiving).

• Despite playing in just six-and-a-half games last season, Gibbs became the first NCAA FBS Division I true freshman this millenium with at least 450 rushing yards, 300 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games of the season.



OFFENSE

• Since 2000, Gibbs is one of only seven Power Five players overall with 450 rushing yards/300 receiving yards/200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games, joining Reggie Bush (USC - 2004), Marion Grice (Arizona State - 2013), Christian McCaffery (Stanford - 2015), Joe Mixon (Oklahoma - 2016), Saquon Barkley (Penn State - 2017) and Lynn Bowden, Jr. (Kentucky - 2019).

• Gibbs became the first Georgia Tech player with 450 rushing yards, 300 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in a single-season since Orwin Smith in 2011.

• Twice in his seven games last season, Gibbs had at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards, one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown (Sept. 19 vs. UCF and Oct. 9 vs. Louisville). It was an accomplishment that was only achieved 14 times in NCAA Division I FBS in 2020. Gibbs and Clemson's Travis Etienne were the only Power Five conference players to do it multiple times.

• In last season's collegiate debut against UCF, Gibbs became only the third ACC player since 2000 to compile at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards and 90 kickoff return yards in a game, joining Duke's Deon Jackson (Oct. 27, 2018 vs. Pitt) and Clemson's C.J. Spiller (Oct. 24, 2009 vs. Miami).

• Gibbs was named second-team freshman all-America by The Athletic as an all-purpose back and honorable mention all-ACC as a return specialist following his outstanding freshman campaign in 2020.

• Prior to this season, Gibbs was tabbed as one of 10 potential breakout players in college football by ESPN.

• Jr. RB **Jordan Mason** also opened his 2021 campaign in style with 96 rushing yards on just 15 carries (6.4 avg.) last Saturday against NIU.

• Last Saturday's 96-yard rushing performance against NIU marked the 10th time in Mason's career that he has rushed for at least 94 yards in a game. In a bit of tough luck, he has only gone over the 100-yard mark four times in those 10 games, as he has finished with 94 yards twice, 95 once, 96 once and 99 twice.

• Since Mason made his collegiate debut in 2018, his six games with between 94-99 rushing yards are the most in all of NCAA Division I FBS.

• In fact, since Mason's debut in 2018, no FBS player has rushed for between 90-99 yards more times than Mason's six (La.-Lafayette's Elijah Mitchell has done so five times).

• Last season, Mason was limited to just six games due to an injury sustained during the season opener at Florida State.

• In the five games he played after returning to the lineup last season, Mason totaled 351 yards from scrimmage (297 rushing, 54 receiving).

• In 377 career carries, Mason has been held to negative yardage only 35 times.

• Since the beginning of the 2018 season, Mason is one of only nine players that has averaged at least 5.5 yards per rush on a minimum of 13 carries against six-time-defending ACC champion Clemson, and one of only five to accomplish the feat during the regular season.

• Rounding out perhaps the deepest stable of running backs in all of college football are sophomores **Dontae Smith** and **Jamious Griffin**.

• With Smith and Griffin, Georgia Tech had four running backs (and five rushers overall) with at least 200 yards on the ground last season.

• Smith ranked fourth on the team with 296 rushing yards and third with three touchdowns in nine games last season. He led the team with a 6.9 yards-per-carry average.

• Smith's only carry in last Saturday's season opener was a 15-yard touchdown run on a fourth-and-1 play that tied the game at 14-14 midway through the fourth quarter. The touchdown run was Smith's fourth in just 54 career carries (one TD every 13.5 carries)

• Griffin rushed for 229 yards last season (fourth on the team) and two touchdowns this season despite playing in only seven games.

WIDE RECEIVERS

• Jr. **Malachi Carter** put up one of the best performances by a wide receiver in recent Georgia Tech history last Saturday versus Northern Illinois.

• Carter caught six passes for a career-high 92 yards and a touchdown against NIU. The 92 receiving yards were the most by a Georgia Tech wide receiver in a season opener since DeAndre Smelter had 132 yards in the 2014 opener against Wofford and the most by a Yellow Jacket wideout in a season opener against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Calvin Johnson had 111 yards against Notre Dame in 2006.

• Carter's 20 receptions, 290 receiving yards and three touchdowns last season were tops among Georgia Tech's returning wide receivers in 2021.

OFFENSE

- Despite only seeing significant playing time in 19 career games (the final eight of 2019, all 10 last season and one this season), **Adonicas Sanders** has become one of Georgia Tech's most reliable receivers with 35 receptions for 456 yards over those 19 contests. Prior to his current 19-game stretch, Sanders had just three receptions for 25 yards in his entire career.

- With 105 yards on seven receptions last season at NC State (Dec. 5), Sanders became the first Yellow Jacket with 100 receiving yards in a game since with 100 receiving yards in a game since A-back Clinton Lynch had 111 yards at USF on Sept. 8, 2018 and the first Tech wide receiver to accomplish the feat since Ricky Jeune had 103 yards at Virginia on Oct. 31, 2015.

- Graduate transfer **Kyric McGowan** made an impressive Georgia Tech debut last Saturday versus Northern Illinois, hauling in a 22-yard touchdown catch from **Jordan Yates** late in the first half. McGowan nearly became the first Yellow Jacket with two touchdown receptions in a game since 2019, but his would-be 2-yard TD catch on fourth-and-goal in the third quarter was overturned on replay.

- In all, Georgia Tech returned four wide receivers this season — Carter, Harris, So. **Peje' Harris** and So. **Marquez Ezzard** — that caught at least nine passes for 124 yards last season.

- By comparison, as recently as three seasons ago (2018), Georgia Tech only had four different wideouts catch a pass all season.

TIGHT ENDS

- In 2019, Georgia Tech reintroduced the tight end position to its offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position going into the 2019 season was **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn, who wound up catching 17 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown for Tech in '19.

- Davis went on to become the first Georgia Tech tight end selected in the NFL Draft in 28 years (since Tom Covington — San Francisco 49ers, 1992) when the Jacksonville Jaguars took him with their sixth-round pick (No. 206 overall) in the 2020 draft. No Tech tight end has ever been selected higher in the NFL Draft than Davis.

- Davis' departure left Tech with only two tight ends on its roster with any game experience at the position in 2020 — true sophomores **Dylan Deveney** and **Dylan Leonard**.

- Deveney and Leonard each missed three of Georgia Tech's 10 games last season. In just seven games apiece, they combined to catch seven passes for 61 yards and one touchdown.

- Tech is 3-4 last season with both Deveney and Leonard in the lineup and 0-4 without one or both of them, including last Saturday's opener versus Northern Illinois, which Deveney missed due to injury.

- One of the best stories on Georgia Tech's roster is Jr. TE **Jack Coco**, who lost 40 pounds in the 2020 offseason to transition from offensive line to tight end. Coco, who caught four passes for 22 yards while playing all 10 games last season, received a scholarship during the 2021 offseason.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Georgia Tech's offensive line has paved the way for an offensive resurgence that has seen the Yellow Jackets post the seven highest yardage totals of the **Geoff Collins** era over the past 11 games.

- Last Saturday versus NIU, the offensive front paved the way for Georgia Tech to average 5.2 yards per carry as a team, led by two rushers with at least 96 yards on the ground (**Jahmyr Gibbs** - 99; **Jordan Mason** - 96).

- The offensive linemen on Georgia Tech's 2021 roster have combined for a whopping 198 collegiate games played and 156 starts.

- Behind its offensive front, Georgia Tech ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 ypg) last season.

- Georgia Tech returned three starting linemen from last season — Sr. RG **Ryan Johnson, Jr. C Mikey Minihan** and Fr. RT **Jordan Williams**. They combined to make 29-of-30 potential starts for Tech in 2020.

DEFENSE
TEAM

- Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past nine seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18) and Georgia Tech.

- Over the past 10 seasons, Collins' defenses have:
 - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
 - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
 - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
 - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
 - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained six times (twice in top 6)
 - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
 - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

- For much of last Saturday's season opener against Northern Illinois, Tech's defense turned in one of its best performances of the Collins' era. Most notably, NIU's 301 yards were the second-fewest that the Yellow Jackets have allowed in three seasons under Collins, behind only the 261 surrendered against USF on Sept. 7, 2019.

- Additionally, Tech did not allow NIU to pick up a first down on eight of its 12 defensive series. The eight defensive series without a surrendering a first down were the Yellow Jackets' most in a game since it held Virginia without a first down on eight different series on Nov. 4, 2017.

- Collins' and defensive coordinator **Andrew Thacker's** aggressive, attacking style of defense was on display in 2020, as Georgia Tech finished among the national leaders in fumble recoveries (12 - No. 2 nationally) and turnovers gained (18 - No. 25 nationally).

- Since the beginning of last season, Georgia Tech forced 11 turnovers in its three wins and just eight in its eight losses.

- Yellow Jackets that record takeaways have the opportunity to sign the "Get The Ball Board" on Georgia Tech's sideline. Introduced by Collins when he was the defensive coordinator at Western Carolina in 2002, the "Get The Ball Board" has evolved from players simply adorning the board with their signatures to signing with their social media handles.

• Late last season, Georgia Tech also held consecutive opponents to less than 100 rushing yards (68 vs. Duke on Nov. 28 and 88 on Dec. 5 at NC State) for the first time since it limited Mercer and Vanderbilt to 85 yards on the ground apiece on Sept. 10 and 17, 2016.

• Prior to last season, Tech had not held NCAA Division I FBS opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground in consecutive games since 2013, when it achieved the feat against Virginia (68 yds. on Oct. 26) and Pitt (-5 yds. on Nov. 2).

• Tech finished with 62 tackles for loss in 10 games last season (6.2 per game). In 2019, the Yellow Jackets averaged 5.1 TFL per game (61 total in 12 games). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 4.2 TFL per game.

• Tech's 62 tackles for loss last season were its most through 10 games since 2013 (66) and marked only the fourth time since 2000 that it had 60 TFL or more through 10 contests (2008 - 83; 2007 - 95; 2005 - 78).

• Tech also has 19 sacks through eight games this season (2.11 per game). Last year, the Yellow Jackets averaged 1.4 sacks per game (17 total). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 116th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 1.3 sacks per game.

• Tech also had 21 sacks in 10 games last season (2.1 per game). In 2019, the Yellow Jackets averaged 1.4 sacks per game (17 total). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 116th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 1.3 sacks per game.

• On the analytics front, Georgia Tech had a pressure rate at 27.8% and a non-blitz pressure rate of 25.1% in 2020. Both represented a significant uptick from 2019, when the Yellow Jackets finished with a 25.8% pressure rate (107th nationally) and a 24.2% non-blitz pressure rate (91st nationally - credit: ESPN Stats & Info).

• Georgia Tech's 27.8% pressure rate in 2020 was its best in the past decade (prev.: 27.4% in 2015 - credit: ESPN Stats & Info).

• Georgia Tech boasted one of the nation's most experienced secondaries in 2021. The Yellow Jackets' defensive backs have combined to make 114 career starts (**Tariq Carpenter** - 33, **Tre Swilling** - 29, **Juanyeh Thomas** - 22, **Zamari Walton** - 22, **Wesley Walker** - 6 and **Myles Sims** - 2). That ranks third nationally among all Power Five conference teams, behind only Indiana (142) and Oklahoma State (121). (credit: Penn State Athletics).

• Jr. LB **Ayinde Eley**, a graduate transfer from Maryland, made an impressive debut in White and Gold last Saturday against Northern Illinois, finishing with a team-high 11 tackles.

• Eley, who made 11 starts over three seasons at Maryland, was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection as a sophomore in 2019, after recording 79 tackles, four tackles for loss, a half-sack, two fumble recoveries, an interception and five passes defended in 11 games (nine starts).

• Eley was one of only three Power Five conference players to record at least 75 tackles, four TFL, two fumble recoveries and five passes defended in 2019, joining Miami's Shaq Quarterman and Utah's Terrell Burgess.

• Jr. LB **Quez Jackson**, who led Georgia Tech in tackles in five of its 10 games last season, was tied for second on the team last Saturday with seven stops.

• Jackson was also the first Yellow Jacket to get to sign the #GetTheBall board in 2021 following his recovery of a fumble forced by r-Fr. DB **Wesley Walker** in the fourth quarter, which set up a touchdown that gave Tech a 21-14 lead midway through the final period.

• The fumble recovery was the second of Jackson's career (prev.: vs. Louisville, Oct. 9, 2020) and the forced fumble was the first of Walker's career.

• Jackson finished eighth in the ACC with 8.0 tackles per game last season (80 total).

• Jackson was the only NCAA Division I FBS student-athletes in the nation in 2020 to record at least 80 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions and a fumble recovery in 10 games or fewer last season. The only other player to accomplish the feat was Appalachian State's D'Marco Jackson, who did it in 12 games.

• Jr. DL **Jordan Domineck** became a force for the Yellow Jackets in 2020, finishing the season with 35 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries in nine games this season. His four sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries were all team highs.

• For the season, Domineck's three forced fumbles (.38/gm) ranked third in the ACC and 16th nationally, while his two fumble recoveries tied for third in the ACC and 12th nationally with teammate **Tre Swilling**.

• According to ESPN Stats & Info, Domineck pressured the quarterback on 15.2% of his pass rushes last season. That is tops among all returning ACC student-athletes in 2021 and eighth among all returning Power Five conference players.

• Four Power Five conference players that entered the 2021 NFL Draft had a better pressure rate than Domineck's 15.2% last season. All four were selected in the first 118 picks of the draft. (credit: ESPN Stats & Info)

• Domineck turned in one of the most dominant performances in recent college football history versus Duke on Nov. 28 of last season with two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery for a touchdown.

• Domineck's forced fumble and fumble recovery for touchdown came when he strip-sacked Duke QB Chase Brice in the end zone, then fell on the loose ball for a touchdown that gave Georgia Tech a 28-23 lead late in the first half. Tech never relinquished the lead after Domineck's first-career touchdown.

• Domineck became the first Power Five conference player with two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery for a touchdown since since NC State's Brian Slay did it against Liberty on Sept. 3, 2011.

• Domineck also became the first Power Five player to accomplish the rare two sacks/2.5 TFL/FF/FR/TD feat against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since UCLA's Akeem Ayers versus Arizona State on Nov. 21, 2009.

• Domineck was also quite disruptive during a two-game stretch versus Syracuse (Sept. 26) and Louisville (Oct. 9) last season. He recorded 10 tackles, three TFL, two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery came in the two-game stretch against the Orange and Cardinals.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- In addition to bursting on the scene as one of college football's most dynamic running backs as a true freshman in 2020, **Jahmyr Gibbs** also established himself as one of the nation's top kickoff returners.
- Reprising the role in last Saturday's season opener versus Northern Illinois, Gibbs averaged 20.7 yards per kickoff return.
- Last season, Gibbs averaged 25.6 yards per kickoff return, which would have rank second in the ACC and 23rd nationally if he qualified for the official statistical rankings (with eight returns, he fell just two returns short).
- Gibbs returned the opening kickoff vs. UCF (Sept. 19, 2020) 75 yards on the first play of his collegiate career. The 75-yard return was the longest kickoff return by a Yellow Jacket since **Juanyeh Thomas** (then a true freshman himself) returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown at Georgia on Nov. 24, 2018.
- Gibbs also had what would have been a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown erased by a holding penalty at Boston College (Oct. 24).
- After ranking 126th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams in kickoff coverage in 2018 (26.3 yards per return), Georgia Tech allowed 20.8 yards per return in 2020, an improvement of five-and-a-half yards per return in less than two seasons.
- In last Saturday's season opener versus NIU, Georgia Tech did not allow a kickoff return, as Fr. PK **Gavin Stewart** put three of his four kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks and the fourth was fair-caught. It marked only the second time since the beginning of last season that Georgia Tech's opponents did not return a kickoff (prev.: vs. UCF, Sept. 19, 2020).
- Playing in his first-ever American football game, Fr. P **David Shanahan** averaged a whopping 52.7 yards per punt in his debut against Northern Illinois. The 52.7-yard average spanned three punts and included a 63-yarder.
- Shanahan's 52.7-yard average is tied for the seventh-best single-game punting average in Georgia Tech history.

- Head coach **Geoff Collins** states repeatedly that special teams are the No. 1 priority within Georgia Tech's program, a philosophy that is highlighted by the fact that a student-athlete cannot earn playing time on offense or defense if they aren't able to contribute on special teams.
- The emphasis on special teams has paid dividends since his arrival in 2019, most notably in blocked kicks.
- Georgia Tech has blocked four kicks in the last 18 games, all in the final seven games of the season (two punts, a field goal and an extra point).

- Prior to blocking four kicks in the past 17 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.
- Georgia Tech has blocked 23 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the eighth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.
- The nation's most blocked kicks over the past eight seasons (since 2013) belong to Temple (29). Six of those came in the last two seasons of Collins' tenure as the Owls' head coach (2017-18). Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

MISCELLANEOUS

• Georgia Tech had 10 more first downs than Northern Illinois in last Saturday's season opener (25-15), which tied for Tech's largest advantage in first downs in three seasons under head coach **Geoff Collins** (the Yellow Jackets also had 10 more first downs than USF — 21-11 — in a 14-10 win on Sept. 7, 2019).

• Georgia Tech also had a 128-yard advantage in total yardage in last Saturday's season opener versus Northern Illinois (429-301), which was Tech's third-best yardage margin under Collins (the Yellow Jackets had yardage advantages of 141 and 131 yards versus Duke and Florida State, respectively, last season).

• Despite returning 17 student-athletes that started at least half of last year's games on offense or defense, Georgia Tech remains one of major college football's youngest teams.

• Two years after having just eight seniors on its roster (which was the second-fewest in NCAA Division I FBS in 2019), Tech has just 13 seniors on its 2021 roster, which is the fourth-fewest in the nation among Power Five conference teams and tied for the eighth-fewest among all FBS teams (credit: Old Dominion athletics).

Most notably, Georgia Tech faces five teams that were ranked in the top 15 of the *Associated Press* preseason top-25 poll — No. 3 Clemson, No. 5 Georgia, No. 9 Notre Dame, No. 10 North Carolina and No. 14 Miami (Fla.).

• Tech is the only team in the nation that has four of the AP's preseason top 10 teams on its schedule (Clemson, UGA, ND and UNC).

• Pundits and ratings systems are unanimous in ranking Georgia Tech's schedule among the three toughest in the nation.

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses since the beginning of last season. In their three wins since the beginning of last season, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in all three games and are plus-six overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech have not won the turnover battle in any of its eight defeats since the beginning of last season and is minus-13 overall in turnover margin in those eight losses.

• As part of Georgia Tech athletics' ongoing partnership with Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, the organizations have teamed up once again to have the Yellow Jackets' success on "Money Down" — head coach **Geoff Collins'** term for third and fourth downs — benefit Children's this season.

• Fans are encouraged to make pledges to Children's based on the Jackets' success on "Money Down." To lead the way, Collins' has pledged for the second-straight year to donate \$10 to Children's for every "Money Down" stop that the Yellow Jackets make on defense and each "Money Down" that the Jackets convert into a first down on offense this season.

• Last season, Georgia Tech had a total of 162 "Money Down" defensive stops and offensive conversions (93 defensive stops, 69 offensive conversions). Including Collins' \$1,620 donation, the Money Down benefit raised a total of \$10,404 for Children's.

• Fans can pledge at buzz.gt/MoneyDown2021 to contribute to the cause this season.

• Since the beginning of the 2016 season, Georgia Tech has played games in seven different National Football League stadiums (Mercedes-Benz Stadium - Atlanta, Ford Field - Detroit, TIAA Bank Field - Jacksonville, Hard Rock Stadium - Miami, Lincoln Financial Field - Philadelphia, Heinz Field - Pittsburgh and Raymond James Stadium - Tampa Bay), which is the most NFL stadiums that any college football team has played in during that span.
