GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech is tied for second nationally this season with six fumble recoveries.

2.5/4.5/8

Georgia Tech Jr. LB **Charlie Thomas** stuffed the stat sheet with 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles last Saturday against No. 21/20 North Carolina. He is one of only two players from a Power 5 conference with 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles in a game this season (joining Missouri's Blaze Alldredge, who accomplished the feat versus Central Michigan on Sept. 4). Thomas' 2.5 sacks/4.5 TFL/eight total tackles performance was also only the 11th by an ACC player since 2000.

In an odd schedule twist caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, Pitt is visiting Bobby Dodd Stadium for the third-straight season. As ACC Coastal Division rivals, Pitt is scheduled to play at Georgia Tech in odd years. However, in 2020, Notre Dame joined the ACC for one season, divisions were scrapped and the schedule was rearranged due to Covid-19. The scrambled schedule saw Pitt travel to Tech for a second-straight year. The ACC returned to its pre-Covid schedule format for 2021, which left Pitt playing GT in Atlanta for a third-consecutive season. Tech will travel to Pitt for the first time in four years in 2022.

Georgia Tech had eight sacks in last Saturday's 45-22 win over North Carolina. The Yellow Jackets' eight sacks were their most in a game since they had eight at Duke on Nov. 10, 2007.

The Jackets also had 13 tackles for loss in last Saturday's win over UNC, their most in a game since they had 14 against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 11, 2008 and their most in an ACC game since they had 14 against Clemson on Sept. 29, 2007.

Georgia Tech's roster includes just 13 seniors eligibility-wise, which is the fourth-fewest among all Power Five-conference teams (Colorado - 6, Oregon - 8, Utah - 11).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- give it consecutive wins for the first time since it won four-straight from Oct. 25-Nov. 17, 2018;

- be its first win over Pitt since 2017, snapping a three-game losing streak against the Panthers;

GEORGIA TECH THIRD-YEAR HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, is in his third season as Georgia Tech football's head coach. He was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018.

Despite the challenges associated with overhauling Georgia Tech's football culture, including installing a pro-style spread offensive attack after 11 years of option football at Tech, as well as the unprecedented and unexpected obstacles presented by the Covid-19 pandemic, Collins' two-year tenure as the Yellow Jackets' head coach has been marked by a bevy of accomplishments. They include:

- Back-to-back nationally lauded recruiting classes. Collins' first full recruiting class at Georgia Tech in 2020 was ranked No. 24 nationally by *Rivals*, then re-ranked No. 8 nationally by *Bleacher Report* during the '20 season based on the impressive play of Tech's newcomers, which included three true-freshman starters on offense: RB Jahmyr Gibbs (who earned freshman all-America recognition from The Athletic), QB Jeff Sims and RT Jordan Williams. It was only the second top-25 recruiting class in Georgia Tech history, and the first since 2007, a class that was compiled when Collins served as the Yellow Jackets' director of player personnel. His second recruiting class at Tech in 2021 is also a top-20 class when including the rankings of eight highly ranked transfers, six of which have multiple seasons of eligibility remaining. In all, Georgia Tech has added 18 four- or five-star recruits and 13 of the 45 highest-ranked recruits in program history (according to *247Sports*) since the arrival of Collins and his staff in January 2019.

- The development of three NFL Draft picks in two seasons – TE Tyler Davis (2020), WR Jalen Camp (2021) and P Pressley Harvin III (2021). Davis, who was recruited by Collins to come to The Flats as a graduate transfer in 2019, became Georgia Tech's first NFL Draft pick at any position in three years, the first non-specialist to be drafted from Tech in four years, the first Yellow Jacket tight end to be selected in 28 years and, as a sixth-round pick, the highest selection ever for a GT tight end in the NFL Draft. When Camp and Harvin were both selected in 2021, it marked the first time that Tech had multiple picks in the same NFL Draft since 2016.

- Harvin winning the 2020 Ray Guy Award as college football's top punter. Under Collins' tutelage, Harvin became the first Yellow Jacket to win one of college football's major individual awards since Durant Brooks won the Guy Award in 2007 and only the third unanimous All-American in Georgia Tech history, joining Calvin Johnson (2006) and Ken Swilling (1990)

- Memorable victories, including a 28-21 overtime win at Miami in 2019 (Tech's first-ever win over the Hurricanes at Miami's Hard Rock Stadium), a thrilling 16-13 come-from-behind triumph at Florida State to open the 2020 season (the Yellow Jackets' first season-opening true road win since 2007) and a perfect record in nationally televised primetime contests – a 28-26 win over NC State in 2019 and a 46-27 victory over Louisville in 2020.

Prior to taking the reins at Georgia Tech, Collins put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in Temple's 121-year football history. Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th – 2013) and scoring defense (23rd – 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' coaching career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins has also served on the staffs at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City. Under Collins, Tech became only

the second college football program in the nation to partner with renowned creative agency J1S and the first program in the nation to enter into a partnership with best-selling author and branding consultant Jeremy Darlow. Collins' focus on giving his student-athletes the resources and tools to assist in building their personal brand is a main reason that Georgia Tech is widely expected to be a place where student-athletes can maximize opportunities in the name, image and likeness era.

Collins' innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts have not only helped Georgia Tech land the two highest-rated recruiting classes in school history, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 50, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (5).

OFFENSE

- Carter's 92 receiving yards against NIU were the most by a Georgia Tech wide receiver in a season opener since DeAndre Smelter had 132 yards in the 2014 opener against Wofford and the most by a Yellow Jacket wideout in a season opener against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Calvin Johnson had 111 yards against Notre Dame in 2006.

- R-Jr. **Adonicas Sanders** has become one of Georgia Tech's most reliable receivers with 38 receptions for 476 yards over the past 22 contests (beginning with the fifth game of the 2019 campaign vs. North Carolina). Prior to his current 22-game stretch, Sanders had just three receptions for 25 yards over the first two-plus seasons of his collegiate career.

- In all, Georgia Tech returned four wide receivers this season — Carter, Harris, So. **Peje' Harris** and So. **Marquez Ezzard** — that caught at least nine passes for 124 yards in 2020.

- By comparison, as recently as three seasons ago (2018), Georgia Tech only had four different wideouts that caught a pass all season.

TIGHT ENDS

- In 2019, Georgia Tech reintroduced the tight end position to its offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position going into the 2019 season was **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn, who wound up catching 17 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown for Tech in '19.

- Davis went on to become the first Georgia Tech tight end selected in the NFL Draft in 28 years (since Tom Covington — San Francisco 49ers, 1992) when the Jacksonville Jaguars took him with their sixth-round pick (No. 206 overall) in the 2020 draft. No Tech tight end has ever been selected higher in the NFL Draft than Davis.

- Davis' departure left Tech with only two tight ends on its roster with any game experience at the position in 2020 — true sophomores **Dylan Deveney** and **Dylan Leonard**.

- Deveney and Leonard each missed three of Georgia Tech's 10 games last season. In just seven games apiece, they combined to catch seven passes for 61 yards and one touchdown.

- Since the beginning of last season, Tech is 4-5 with both Deveney and Leonard in the lineup and 1-4 without one or both of them.

- Deveney missed the first two games of this season due to injury, but made his season debut at Clemson (Sept. 18) and set a career-high with four receptions against the Tigers' staunch defense (prev. career high: 2, 3 times - last vs. Pitt on Dec. 10, 2020).

- One of the best stories on Georgia Tech's roster is Jr. TE **Jack Coco**, who lost 40 pounds in the 2020 offseason to transition from offensive line to tight end. Coco, who caught four passes for 22 yards while playing all 10 games last season, received a scholarship during the 2021 offseason.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Georgia Tech's offensive line has paved the way for an offensive resurgence that has seen the Yellow Jackets post the eight highest yardage totals of the **Geoff Collins** era over the past 13 games.

- The offensive linemen on Georgia Tech's 2021 roster have combined for a whopping 219 collegiate games played and 171 starts.

- Tech's offensive front has paved the way for the Yellow Jackets to rank fifth in the ACC and 39th nationally in rushing offense this season (196.2 ypg).

- In this season's opener versus Northern Illinois (Sept. 4), the offensive front paved the way for Georgia Tech to average 5.2 yards per carry as a team, led by two rushers with at least 96 yards on the ground (**Jahmyr Gibbs** - 99; **Jordan Mason** - 96).

- Last season, Georgia Tech ranked fourth the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 ypg) in 2020.

- Georgia Tech returned three starting linemen from last season — Sr. RG **Ryan Johnson**, Jr. C **Mikey Minihan** and Fr. RT **Jordan Williams**. They combined to make 29-of-30 potential starts for Tech in 2020.

Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach Geoff Collins has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past nine seasons...

- Over the past 10 seasons, Collins' defenses have:
- ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
- ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
- ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
- ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
- ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained six times (twice in top 6)
- ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
- ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

Through three games this season, Georgia Tech's defense ranks among the top 35 nationally in seven different statistical categories.

Since the beginning of 2019 (Collins' first season at Georgia Tech), the Yellow Jackets' 26 fumble recoveries rank second nationally.

Last Saturday, Georgia Tech's defense stymied one of the nation's top offenses in a 45-22 win over No. 21/20 North Carolina.

Georgia Tech held North Carolina, which entered the game ranked sixth nationally in total offense, to 22 points and 369 total yards, nearly 21 points and 185 yards below their season averages of 42.7 points and 553.3 yards per game coming in.

Georgia Tech recorded eight sacks in last Saturday's win over North Carolina, its most in a game since it had eight at Duke on Nov. 10, 2007. Five of the Yellow Jackets' eight sacks came in the first half.

Tech's eight sacks against UNC are tied for fifth in single-game program history.

Georgia Tech's defense also recorded 13 tackles for loss in last Saturday's win over North Carolina, its most in a game since it had 14 against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 11, 2008, and its most against an ACC opponent since it had 14 against Clemson on Sept. 29, 2007. Ten of the Yellow Jackets' 13 tackles for loss came in the first half.

Tech's 13 tackles for loss against UNC are tied for fifth in single-game program history.

North Carolina's 63 total rushing yards were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech since 2018 and tied for the third-fewest that the Yellow Jackets have surrendered since 2014.

Prior to last Saturday's stellar defensive performance against North Carolina, Georgia Tech's defense also turned in a memorable performance when it limited No. 6 Clemson to 14 points and 284 yards of total offense in the narrow 14-8 defeat (Sept. 18).

Clemson's 14 points against Georgia Tech marked the first time that the Tigers scored fewer than 20 points in an ACC game since a 28-6 loss to Tech on Nov. 15, 2014.

Clemson's 284 yards of total offense against Georgia Tech marked the first time that the Tigers were held to under 300 yards in an ACC game since they managed just 190 yards during the 28-6 loss to Tech in 2014.

Georgia Tech limited Clemson to just 126 passing yards, marking the first time since 2018 (118 passing yards in ACC championship game vs. Pitt), the first time in a regular-season game since 2015 (97 passing yards vs. Notre Dame) and only the 15th time since 2000 that the Tigers were held to 130 passing yards or less in a game.

Of the 16 times since 2000 that Clemson has had 130 passing yards or less, Georgia Tech has been the opponent four times (2006, 2009 ACC championship game, 2014).

Georgia Tech's safety with seven seconds to go in the fourth quarter at Clemson was the Yellow Jackets' first safety since Sept. 29, 2019 at Temple.

On Sept. 11, Georgia Tech limited Kennesaw State's high-powered option offense to just 272 total yards, including just 161 on the ground (3.7 avg.), well below its averages of 357.2 total yards, 268.0 rushing yards and 4.7 yards per rush last season.

DEFENSE

• The Yellow Jackets' stout defensive effort versus KSU was buoyed by 10 tackles for loss, which at the time was their most in a game since they also had 10 TFL versus Alabama A&M on Nov. 23, 2013.

• For much of the season opener against Northern Illinois (Sept. 4), Tech's defense turned in one of its best performances of the Collins' era. Most notably, at the time, NIU's 301 yards were the second-fewest that the Yellow Jackets have allowed in three seasons under Collins, behind only the 261 surrendered against USF on Sept. 7, 2019.

• Additionally, Tech did not allow NIU to pick up a first down on eight of its 12 defensive series. The eight defensive series without a surrendering a first down were the Yellow Jackets' most in a game since it held Virginia without a first down on eight different series on Nov. 4, 2017.

• Since the beginning of the 2019 season, Georgia Tech has held 13-of-26 opponents to 200 passing yards or less (169 vs. USF, Sept. 7, 2019; 30 vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14, 2019; 124 at Temple, Sept. 28, 2019; 176 at Duke, Oct. 12, 2019; 200 at Miami, Oct. 19, 2019; 198 at Florida State, Sept. 12, 2020; 194 at Syracuse, Sept. 26, 2020; 145 at Boston College, Oct. 24, 2020; 199 vs. Notre Dame, Oct. 31, 2020; 196 vs. Pitt, Dec. 10, 2020; 136 vs. Northern Illinois, Sept. 4, 2021; 111 vs. Kennesaw State, Sept. 11, 2021; 126 vs. No. 6 Clemson, Sept. 18, 2021).

• Tech's 13 games with opponents passing for 200 yards or less since 2019 rank third in the ACC and are tied for 13th among all Power 5 conference teams.

• Late last season, Georgia Tech also held consecutive opponents to less than 100 rushing yards (68 vs. Duke on Nov. 28 and 88 on Dec. 5 at NC State) for the first time since it limited Mercer and Vanderbilt to 85 yards on the ground apiece on Sept. 10 and 17, 2016.

• Prior to last season, Tech had not held NCAA Division I FBS opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground in consecutive games since 2013, when it achieved the feat against Virginia (68 yds. on Oct. 26) and Pitt (-5 yds. on Nov. 2).

• Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's most experienced secondaries in 2021. The Yellow Jackets' defensive backs have combined to make 129 career starts (**Tariq Carpenter** - 35, **Tre Swilling** - 32, **Juanyeh Thomas** - 25, **Zamari Walton** - 22, **Wesley Walker** - 8, **Myles Sims** - 2, **Tobias Oliver** - 3, **Jaylon King** - 1 and **Derrick Allen** - 1). That ranks third nationally among all Power Five conference teams, behind only Indiana (157) and Oklahoma State (134). (credit: Penn State Athletics).

• Jr. LB **Charlie Thomas** has been a force to be reckoned with over Georgia Tech's last three games.

• Last Saturday against No. 21/20 North Carolina and its potent offense, Thomas recorded 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles, en route to being named ACC co-Linebacker of the Week.

• Thomas' 2.5 sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss were both career highs.

• Thomas became one of only two players from a Power 5 conference and four NCAA Division I FBS players overall with 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles in a game this season.

• On Sept. 18 at No. 6 Clemson, Thomas racked up a career-high 12 tackles (prev.: 9, 2X - last vs. USF, Sept. 7, 2019), which helped limit the Tigers to their lowest points (14) and yardage (284) totals in an ACC game since 2014.

• Thomas nearly matched his previous career high for tackles by halftime at Clemson, as he racked up eight stops in the first half alone.

• On Sept. 11 versus Kennesaw State, Thomas became the first Georgia Tech linebacker since at least 2000 with two interceptions in a single game.

• For the season, Thomas leads Georgia Tech in both sacks (2.5) and tackles for loss (6.5).

• Thomas ranks third in the ACC and is tied for 16th nationally with 1.6 TFL per game this season.

• R-So. DL **Jordan Domineck** went viral and was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the third time in his career following his performance against Kennesaw State (Sept. 11).

• Domineck's award came on the strength of him filling the stat sheet with five tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack, two forced fumbles and a 70-yard fumble return for a touchdown against KSU.

• Domineck became the first NCAA Division I FBS student-athlete since 2009 to record a sack, three tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and a fumble return for a touchdown in a single game, and only the third FBS player to accomplish the feat since 2000.

• Domineck scoop-and-score came in the first quarter with Georgia Tech leading but Kennesaw State driving deep in Tech territory. Domineck forced a fumble on an attempted pitch by Kennesaw State QB Xavier Shepherd, picked up the loose ball and ran 70 yards for the score, dropping Shepherd with a vicious stiff arm along the way.

• Domineck's fumble return went viral on social media, sparked by an admiring mention on Twitter from Baltimore Ravens QB Lamar Jackson.

• Domineck's 70-yard fumble return was the third-longest official fumble return in Georgia Tech history, behind only Jr. DB **Zamari Walton's** 93-yard return for a touchdown last season versus Notre Dame (Oct. 31, 2020) and a 90-yard return by Kofi Smith vs. Wake Forest on Nov. 21, 1998 (*note: fumble returns became an official NCAA stat in 1992*).

• Domineck picked up third forced fumble of the season in last Saturday's 45-22 win over No. 21/20 North Carolina.

• For the season, Domineck is tied for third nationally in forced fumbles (0.75/gm) and tied for 20th in fumble recoveries (1). He leads the ACC in forced fumbles and is tied for third in the conference in fumbles recovered.

• Domineck ranks second among all active FBS student-athletes in career forced fumbles per game (.26).

• Last season, Domineck's three forced fumbles (.38/gm) ranked third in the ACC and 16th nationally, while his two fumble recoveries were tied for third in the ACC and 12th nationally with teammate **Tre Swilling**.

• According to ESPN Stats & Info, Domineck pressured the quarterback on 15.2% of his pass rushes in 2020. That was tops among all returning ACC student-athletes in 2021 and eighth among all returning Power Five conference players.

• Four Power Five conference players that entered the 2021 NFL Draft had a better pressure rate than Domineck's 15.2% last season. All four were selected in the first 118 picks of the draft. (credit: ESPN Stats & Info)

• Jr. LB **Quez Jackson**, who led Georgia Tech in tackles in five of its 10 games last season, has recorded a team-high 36 tackles through four games this season.

• In addition to ranking sixth in the ACC and t-30th nationally in tackles (9.0 per game), Jackson is also tied atop the nation's statistical rankings with two fumble recoveries this season.



DEFENSE

• Last season, Jackson was the only NCAA Division I FBS student-athletes in the nation to record at least 80 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions and a fumble recovery in 10 games or fewer last season. The only other player to accomplish the feat was Appalachian State's D'Marco Jackson, who did it in 12 games.

• Jr. LB **Ayinde Eley**, a graduate transfer from Maryland, has made an impressive debut in White and Gold, leading Georgia Tech in tackles in two of the first four games of the season — 11 vs. Northern Illinois (Sept. 4) and 10 vs. Kenesaw State (Sept. 11).

• Eley followed up with seven tackles in his first ACC game versus Clemson (Sept. 18) and five last Saturday against North Carolina, giving him 33 stops for the season, which ranks second on the squad behind Jackson.

• With 33 tackles in his first four games as a Yellow Jacket, Eley ranks seventh in the ACC and 52nd nationally with 8.2 tackles per game this season.

• Eley, who made 11 starts over three seasons at Maryland, was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection as a sophomore in 2019 after recording 79 tackles, four tackles for loss, a half-sack, two fumble recoveries, an interception and five passes defended in 11 games (nine starts).

• Eley was one of only three Power Five conference players to record at least 75 tackles, four TFL, two fumble recoveries and five passes defended in 2019, joining Miami's Shaq Quarterman and Utah's Terrell Burgess.

• Fr. DEs **Kyle Kennard** and **Jared Ivey** teamed up to combine for 3.0 sacks and 4.0 tackles for loss in last Saturday's win over North Carolina.

• Kennard set career highs with 2.0 sacks and 3.0 tackles for loss against the Tar Heels.

• Kennard, who has only played in three of Georgia Tech's first four games of the season, leads the Jackets and ranks 11th in the ACC with 0.67 sacks per game.

• Ivey registered the first sack and forced fumble of his career in the win over UNC.

• In his sixth season with the Yellow Jackets, r-Sr. DT **Dijmon Brooks** recorded his first-ever forced fumble and only the second fumble recovery of his career in last Saturday's win over North Carolina.

SPECIAL TEAMS

• In addition to bursting on the scene as one of college football's most dynamic running backs as a true freshman in 2020, **Jahmyr Gibbs** also established himself as one of the nation's top kickoff returners.

• Reprising the role this season, Gibbs ranks second the ACC and 25th nationally in kickoff returns, averaging 24.0 yards per return.

• Last season, Gibbs averaged 25.6 yards per kickoff return, which would have ranked second in the ACC and 23rd nationally if he qualified for the official statistical rankings (with eight returns, he fell just two returns short).

• In kickoff coverage, Georgia Tech is allowing just 18.5 yards per kickoff return this season, which continues an upward trajectory since the Jackets ranked 126th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams after allowing 26.3 yards per return in 2018, the season before Collins' arrival on The Flats.

• Georgia Tech has rarely needed to cover a kickoff in 2021, as Fr. PK **Gavin Stewart** has put 14 of his 22 kickoffs this season into the end zone for touchbacks, while six others have been fair-caught and only two have been returned.

• Georgia Tech also pulled off a perfectly executed onside kick in the fourth quarter of its upset bid at No. 6 Clemson (Sept. 18). With the Yellow Jackets trailing 14-6 with 1:19 to go in the ballgame, Fr. PK **Jude Kelley's** onside kick took a textbook second hop, which was fielded by Jr. WR **Malachi Carter** along the sideline to give the Jackets possession with an opportunity to tie the game (Tech drove 51 yards in 1:04 after recovering the onside kick, but its potential game-tying drive stalled at the 1 yard line with 15 seconds left on the clock).

• The successful onside kick was Georgia Tech's fourth in its last 15 games. The Yellow Jackets also recovered onside kicks last season against Notre Dame (Oct. 31, 2020) and Boston College (Oct. 24, 2020) and in the 2019 season finale versus Georgia (Nov. 30, 2019).

• Just four games into his American football career, Fr. P **David Shanahan** is averaging 41.2 yards per punt over 17 attempts.

• Shanahan's 41.2-yard average ranks eighth in the ACC.

• Shanahan averaged a whopping 52.7 yards per punt in his debut against Northern Illinois (Sept. 4). The 52.7-yard average spanned three punts and included a 63-yarder.

• Shanahan's 52.7-yard average vs. NIU is tied for the seventh-best single-game punting average in Georgia Tech history.

• Head coach **Geoff Collins** states repeatedly that special teams are the No. 1 priority within Georgia Tech's program, a philosophy that is highlighted by the fact that a student-athlete cannot earn playing time on offense or defense if they aren't able to contribute on special teams.

• The emphasis on special teams has paid dividends since his arrival in 2019, most notably in blocked kicks.

• Georgia Tech has blocked four kicks in the last 21 games.

• Prior to blocking four kicks in the past 21 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 23 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the eighth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• The nation's most blocked kicks over the past eight seasons (since 2013) belong to Temple (29). Six of those came in the last two seasons of Collins' tenure as the Owls' head coach (2017-18). Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Perhaps Georgia Tech's biggest focuses throughout the offseason were to improve its turnover margin and cut down its penalties from a year ago. Through four games, are one of the nation's most improved teams in both areas.

- Through four games this season, Georgia Tech ranks 12th nationally with just 139 total penalty yards (34.8 per game). The Jackets have committed a total of just 22 penalties through four contests.

- Last season, Tech ranked 119th out of 127 NCAA Division I FBS teams in penalty yardage per game (74.9 ypg).

- Tech also currently ranks 12th nationally in turnover margin at plus-five (+1.25/gm). The Yellow Jackets have eight takeaways (22nd nationally) and just three giveaways (20th nationally) through four games.

- Last season, Tech ranked 111th out of 127 NCAA Division I FBS teams in turnover margin at minus-seven (-.70/gm).

- As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses since the beginning of last season. In their five wins since the beginning of last season, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in all five games and are plus-11 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has not won the turnover battle in any of its nine defeats since the beginning of last season and is minus-14 overall in turnover margin in those nine losses.

- Georgia Tech has outgained each of its first four opponents this season (429-301 vs. Northern Illinois on Sept. 4; 412-272 vs. Kennesaw State on Sept. 11; 298-284 at No. 6 Clemson on Sept. 18; and 394-369 vs. No. 21/20 North Carolina).

- Tech outgained Clemson this season for the first time since the Yellow Jackets had a 353-190 advantage in total yards during a 28-6 victory over the Tigers on Nov. 15, 2014. In the previous six meetings (2015-20), Clemson had outgained Georgia Tech by an average of 532-214.

- Georgia Tech outgained each of its first two opponents of the season by at least 100 yards (182 yds. vs NIU, 140 yds. vs. KSU), which marked the first time since 2018 that Tech outgained consecutive opponents by 100-plus yards since 2018 (465-323 at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 565-374 at North Carolina on Nov. 3).

- Prior to the first two games of this season, Georgia Tech had only outgained an opponent by 100-plus yards twice in the past two seasons (the Yellow Jackets had yardage advantages of 438-307 at Florida State on Sept. 12, 2020 and 523-382 vs. Duke on Nov. 28, 2020).

- Georgia Tech had 10 more first downs than Northern Illinois in the season opener (25-15), which tied for Tech's largest advantage in first downs in three seasons under head coach **Geoff Collins** (the Yellow Jackets also had 10 more first downs than USF — 21-11 — in a 14-10 win on Sept. 7, 2019).

- Despite returning 17 student-athletes that started at least half of last year's games on offense or defense, Georgia Tech remains one of major college football's youngest teams.

- Two years after having just eight seniors on its roster (which was the second-fewest in NCAA Division I FBS in 2019), Tech has just 13 seniors on its 2021 roster, which is the fourth-fewest in the nation among Power Five conference teams and tied for the eighth-fewest among all FBS teams (credit: Old Dominion athletics).

- One of the nation's youngest rosters faces one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2021. Most notably, four of the 12 teams on Tech's regular-season schedule are currently ranked in the *Associated Press* top 25 — No. 2 Georgia, No. 9 Notre Dame and No. 25 Clemson — while three others (Boston College, North Carolina and Virginia Tech) are receiving votes.

- Tech was the only team in the nation that had four of the AP's preseason top 10 teams and five of the top 15 on its schedule (Clemson, UGA, ND, UNC and Miami).

- Pundits and ratings systems were unanimous in ranking Georgia Tech's schedule among the three toughest in the nation.

- As part of Georgia Tech athletics' ongoing partnership with Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, the organizations have teamed up once again to have the Yellow Jackets' success on "Money Down" — head coach **Geoff Collins'** term for third and fourth downs — benefit Children's this season.

- Fans are encouraged to make pledges to Children's based on the Jackets' success on "Money Down." To lead the way, Collins' has pledged for the second-straight year to donate \$10 to Children's for every "Money Down" stop that the Yellow Jackets make on defense and each "Money Down" that the Jackets convert into a first down on offense this season.

- So far, Collins' 2021 pledge stands at \$620, thanks to the Yellow Jackets' 36 "Money Down" defensive stops and 26 "Money Down" offensive conversions this season.

- Last season, Georgia Tech had a total of 162 "Money Down" defensive stops and offensive conversions (93 defensive stops, 69 offensive conversions). Including Collins' \$1,620 donation, the Money Down benefit raised a total of \$10,404 for Children's.

- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, Georgia Tech has played games in seven different National Football League stadiums (Mercedes-Benz Stadium - Atlanta, Ford Field - Detroit, TIAA Bank Field - Jacksonville, Hard Rock Stadium - Miami, Lincoln Financial Field - Philadelphia, Heinz Field - Pittsburgh and Raymond James Stadium - Tampa Bay), which is the most NFL stadiums that any college football team has played in during that span.
