GAME INFO

TAR HEELS AND JACKETS

- UNC plays its lone road game in a stretch of six weeks when it travels to Atlanta to take on Georgia Tech on Saturday, Sept. 25. Kickoff from Mercedes-Benz Stadium is set for 7:30 p.m. ET on ACC Network.
- UNC is 9-19-1 all-time on the road at Georgia Tech. The Tar Heels are 3-9 at the Yellow Jackets going back to 1997, but did earn a 38-22 win in their most recent trip to Atlanta in 2019.
- In the 2019 victory, then freshman Sam Howell threw four touchdown passes and completed 33 of 51 attempts for 376 yards as Carolina piled up 587 yards of total offense. Javonte Williams ran 17 times for 138 yards and a TD.
- The two Coastal Division rivals did not play in 2020 after the schedule was reconfigured due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The two squads met every season between 1980-2019.
- The series dates back to 1915 when the Jackets started a streak of four-straight victories that year with a 23-3 win in Atlanta.
- UNC's first win came on the road in 1929 by a margin of 18-7.

LAST TIME OUT

- Sam Howell threw five touchdown passes and ran for a career-best 112 yards as No. 21 North Carolina took over after halftime to beat Virginia 59-39 last Saturday night
- Tennessee graduate transfer Ty Chandler ran for a career-high 198 yards with two touchdowns, and Josh Downs had eight catches for 203 yards and a pair of TDs.

BROWN VS. GEORGIA TECH

- North Carolina head coach Mack Brown owns a 7-3-1 record against Georgia Tech.
- UNC earned road wins in 1993, 1997 and 2019.
- Brown is 6-1 over his last seven meetings with the Yellow Jackets that spans the 1992-97 and 2019 seasons.

CAROLINA IN THE POLLS

- Carolina is ranked No. 21 in the Associated Press poll this week. The Tar Heels sit at No. 20 in the Amway Coaches Poll.

UP NEXT

- Carolina begins a critical three-game ACC home-stand by hosting Duke on Saturday, Oct. 2. The Tar Heels have won both meetings with the Blue Devils since the return of Mack Brown for the 2019 campaign.

The branding program contained in Blueprint 919 seeks to help football student-athletes determine who they are, define their key traits, develop their image, recognize their target audiences, and maximize their external presence.

CHRIS SMITH FIELD AT KENAN STADIUM

• The Eddie and Jo Allison Smith Foundation made a transformational gift in 2020 to support the Carolina football program with resources to build on its recent success and secure future excellence. The field at Kenan Stadium is now Chris Smith Field, recognizing the Smith Family and their son Chris, a 1987 graduate of Carolina.

• The family foundation is headed by longtime Carolina leader and benefactor Eddie Smith Jr. '65 of Greenville, North Carolina, and was cofounded with his late wife Jo Allison Smith. Their gift will support staffing needs, fund facility improvements and help build an endowment to cover future operating costs.

CAROLINA ALL-AMERICANS

• The Carolina football program has developed 73 student-athletes, who combined to earn 90 All-America honors. Of those 90 honors, 20 were earned under Mack Brown's guidance. Of note, current cornerbacks coach Dre Bly garnered three first-team honors, two of which came with Brown at the helm.

CAROLINA AND THE NFL DRAFT

• The Carolina football program has produced 253 NFL Draft picks. Of those selections, the Tar Heels have produced 24 first-round selections, which are the most of any school in the state of North Carolina, ahead of NC State (17), Duke (6) and Wake Forest (5).

FAMILY AFFAIR

• The UNC football lettermen have taken to calling themselves the Carolina Football Family, and nowhere is that more evident than this year's roster. The 2021 Tar Heels have one set of brothers and six players who are sons of former Tar Heels, who all played for Mack Brown. The Fox brothers, Tomon and Tomari, are a pair of defensive menaces from Lawrenceville, Ga. In addition, cornerbacks coach Dre Bly is the uncle of freshman wide receiver Josh Downs.

• As for the second generation Tar Heels, **Jefferson Boaz's** father Jay Boaz played for Coach Brown at UNC from 1991-94. **Christopher Holliday** is the son of Tar Heel great and current Associate Athletic Director for Football Corey Holliday (1990-93). **Caleb Hood** is the son of Errol Hood, who was recruited by Brown and played at UNC from 1998-2001. **Drake Maye** is the son of Mark Maye, who played for the Tar Heels from 1983-88, and the brother of Luke, a former Carolina basketball great from 2015-19. **Jeffrey Saturday** is the son of Jeff Saturday, who played at Carolina from 1994-97; and **Will Crowley** is the son of Pat Crowley, who spent his time at UNC from 1986-89.

• **Thomas Flynn** is the son of Keith Flynn, who played football at Carolina and is a 1983 grad.

• UNC currently has eight former players on staff that played for Coach Brown during his first stint in Chapel Hill. Six of the eight went on to play in the NFL. **Tommy Thigpen** (Co-DC/ILB) and **Dre Bly** (CB) serve as assistant coaches, while **Natrone Means** joined the staff this year as an offensive analyst. **Corey Holliday** serves as the Associate Athletic Director for Football, **Rick Steinbacher** is a Senior Associate A.D., who is the football sport administrator, and **Kevin Donnalley** was hired as the Director of High School Relations. In addition, **Dwight Hollier** is the department's Senior Associate A.D. for Student-Athlete Health, Well-Being and Program Outreach, while **Clint Gwaltney** is the Senior Associate A.D. for Event Management.

MACK FACTS

ACTIVE CAREER WINS LEADER

With 261 career victories, Mack Brown has produced the most wins of any active coach in the nation. He is trailed by Nick Saban at Alabama (259), Brian Kelly at Notre Dame (254), Willie Fritz at Tulane (184) and Kirk Ferentz at Iowa (183). Brown's 261 wins rank seventh on the NCAA all-time list for coaches with at least 10 years at an FBS institution. He has won 158 games at Texas, 86 at UNC, 11 at Tulane and six at Appalachian State.

ONE OF FIVE WITH A TITLE

Mack Brown is one of only five active head coaches who has won a National Championship. Brown, who won the title with Texas following the 2005 season, is accompanied by Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Ed Orgeron (LSU), Nick Saban (Alabama) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson).

BROWN BECOMES UNC'S WINS LEADER

Mack Brown took over as the Tar Heels' all-time wins leader after the 20-17 victory over Duke on Oct 26, 2019. Brown's 73rd win surpassed Dick Crum, who posted 72 victories from 1978-87.

10-WIN SEASONS

Mack Brown has led his teams to 12 seasons of 10 or more victories during his career. He led UNC to three 10-win campaigns in his first stint with the program before guiding Texas to nine consecutive seasons of 10 wins or more. Brown posted his first 10-win season in 1993 and the Tar Heels went on to post 10 wins in 1996 and '97.

BROWN IN THE POLLS

Mack Brown-led teams have finished ranked in the final Top 25 polls 17 times during his coaching career. He led Texas to 12 Top-25 finishes and UNC to five. Of the 17 occasions, Brown's teams have finished in the Top 10 nine times, including six Top-5 finishes.

BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

Mack Brown has produced 136 NFL Draft picks, including 26 first-round selections and 19 second-round picks. During his first stint at UNC, Brown guided 64 players who would go on to be drafted, including nine first rounders and 10 second rounders. Of note, Brown's 1996 Carolina roster saw 22 players go on to have their names called at the NFL Draft.

ACC HONOR ROLL

BARTON NAMED TO COLLEGE HALL OF FAME

- Carolina legend Harris Barton has been included on the 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class. Barton was a four-year starter for the Tar Heels, first at center and then at tackle as one of the best offensive linemen ever to play in college football. He was a first-team All-America in 1986.
- Barton becomes the seventh Carolina football player inducted into the hall of fame, joining Dre Bly, William Fuller, Charlie Justice, Don McCauley, Jim Tatum and Art Weiner.
- Carolina greats Ken Huff and Julius Peppers have been placed on the 2022 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame.
- Huff, a 1974 consensus first team All-America and recipient of the 1974 Jacob's Blocking Trophy as the ACC's best offensive lineman, captained the College All-Stars vs. Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers.
- Peppers was a unanimous first-team All-American in 2001, won the Chuck Bednarik Award for the nation's top defensive player and the Rotary Lombardi Award, which at the time was given to the nation's top interior lineman.
- An announced is expected in early 2022.

SEASON TICKETS SOLD OUT

- North Carolina football season tickets have sold out for the second time in as many full-capacity seasons.
- Carolina was one of eight programs nationally to sell out its entire home schedule and the only team in the ACC to do so in 2019.

CLOSE CALLS

- Since the return of Mack Brown to take over the program in 2019, Carolina owns a 17-11 overall record.
- Nine of the 11 losses have been by seven points or less with two setbacks coming in overtime.
- The first two losses in 2020 came by a mere three points at FSU and at Virginia.
- Nine of Carolina's 13 games in 2019 were decided by seven points or fewer. That was the most by any team in the AP Poll era going back to 1936.
- UNC lost 43-41 in six overtimes at Virginia Tech in the longest game in ACC history.
- Carolina won 20-17 over Duke, marking the first time since 2010 that three or more wins have come by four points or less.

WINNING THE 4Q

- Carolina led the nation in fourth-quarter scoring margin spanning the 2019 and 2020 seasons at +116.
- In 2019, Carolina ranked third in FBS (1st ACC) with a +69 (120-51) point differential in the fourth quarter.
- Carolina was +47 in 2020 in the fourth quarter, the fourth best mark nationally.
- In comparison, UNC ranked ninth worst in FBS in 2017-18 at -72.

- *For his career, Sam Howell is 117 of 180 (65.0%) with 1,753 yards and 24 total touchdowns (21 passing, 3 rushing) against two turnovers in the fourth quarter.*

- The first two turnovers came in his 26th career game, a pair of interceptions at Virginia Tech in 2021.
- Howell was 40 of 62 with 640 yards and seven touchdowns in the fourth quarter in 2020, and was 62 of 93 with 947 yards and 12 TDs (0 INTs) in the fourth quarter during his 2019 Freshman All-America season. He ranked second nationally in TD passes and third in passing yards in the fourth quarter in 2019.

UNC SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Tar Heels will open the season with a road conference game for the first time since 2005 at Georgia Tech.
- **Virginia Tech:** Carolina opens a season against the Hokies for the first time since 1946, a game played in Chapel Hill that ended in a 14-14 tie.
- **Georgia State:** First ever meeting between the two schools in football. The Tar Heels are scheduled to visit the Panthers in 2022.
- **Georgia Tech:** The two Coastal Division rivals did not play in 2020 after the schedule was revamped due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The two squads met every season between 1980-2019. This game will be played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- **Florida State:** The Seminoles make their first visit to Chapel Hill since 2009. The three most recent meetings in 2010, 2016 and 2020 all were played in Tallahassee, Florida.
- **Notre Dame:** The Tar Heels and Fighting Irish are in the midst of playing head-to-head over the span of three-successive seasons. UNC hosted Notre Dame in 2020 and will do that again in 2022.
- **Wake Forest:** The 2021 matchup is the culmination of a home-and-home non-conference series between the two in-state ACC rivals. Carolina played in Winston-Salem in 2019. This season will also mark the first time the two have played in three-straight seasons since 2002-04.
- **Pitt:** Similar to Georgia Tech, the Coastal Division foes did not play last season, the first time since the Panthers joined the ACC for the 2013 campaign. This season marks the fourth-straight meeting in Pittsburgh that will be play on Thursday night.
- **Wofford:** First ever meeting between the two schools in football.
- **NC State:** The Carolina-State game returns to the final weekend of the regular season, a place it held in the schedule between 2014-2019. Since the return of Mack Brown to Chapel Hill, the Tar Heels have won both games over the Wolfpack by a combined score of 89-31.

DON'T BLINK

- North Carolina ranks second in the ACC with 553.3 yards of offense per game. The Tar Heels have gone over 600 yards in back-to-back games heading into Saturday's game with Georgia Tech.
- UNC's 118 points over the last two weeks are tied for the 2nd most points in consecutive games, tying the feat against Virginia Medical and Wake Forest in 1914, and trails only the 125 points scored against Duke and Miami in 2015.

- The Tar Heels have compiled 1,306 total yards the last two games - 607 yards in the home opener against Georgia State and 699 last week against ACC foe Virginia.
- Carolina has accumulated 600 or more yards of offense five times in its last 13 games.
- Since Mack Brown's return in 2019, Carolina has posted six of the top-20 single-game total yard figures in school history. That includes a record 778 yards at Miami in 2020.
- Sam Howell has 875 yards alone of offense the last two weeks, 659 through the air and 216 on the ground. He has tossed 8 TDs in 2 games.
- Howell is the third UNC QB to ever have back-to-back 400-yard total offense games, joining Marquise Williams (Notre Dame and Georgia Tech in 2014) and Mitch Trubisky (James Madison and Pitt in 2016).

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY

- Sam Howell joined a group of only four FBS quarterbacks to ever have back-to-back games with 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards.

- Howell became just the second UNC QB to ever compile 300+ passing yards and 100+ rushing yards in a game against Georgia State. The other was Marquise Williams against Notre Dame in 2014.
- Howell also joined Williams as the only QBs to pass for three and rush for two scores in a game (Williams vs. Baylor in 2015 Russell Athletic Bowl).
- Howell accumulated 456 total yards (sixth most at UNC) against Georgia State with 352 passing and a career-high 104 rushing yards.
- In the postgame Howell added, "He's my favorite Tar Heel ever," when talking about Williams, Carolina all-time total offense leader who played from 2012-15.
- Howell added 412 total yards against Virginia, a career-high 112 yards on the ground and 307 passing yards. He also tossed five TDs.

HOWELL THE FIRST

- Sam Howell has become the first Carolina QB to ever have back-to-back 100-yard rushing games, and only the third to do it twice at all. Marquise Williams did it six times (once in 2013, twice in 2014, three times in 2015) and Gayle Bomar twice (once each in 1967 and 1968). Other QBs who did it once include Danny Talbott in 1965, Ricky Lanier 1969, Chuck Sharpe 1979, Jason Stanicek 1992, Ronald Curry 2000 and Darian Durant 2003.

(Note: Charlie Justice did it in consecutive

games three times, once each in 1946, 1947 and 1948, and 12 times total; Hosea Rodgers 3 times in 1947-48; and Billy Hayes twice in 1949; but none was classified as a quarterback, no one was in those days, although they did much of the team's passing.)

STARTING A NEW STREAK

- UNC snapped a four-game losing streak against Virginia with a resounding 59-39 win last Saturday night in Chapel Hill in the 126th playing of the South's Oldest Rivalry.
- The two teams combined for 98 points, the most in the series. The previous high was 85 last year in Virginia's 44-41 win at home.
- The Tar Heels' 59 points were the most against Virginia in an ACC game, the most since 1936 (59 in Charlottesville) and the most at home since 1935 (61).
- Carolina gained 699 total yards, its most ever against Virginia and the sixth most in any game in school history. It was the third most by the Tar Heels in a game coached by Mack Brown.
- Carolina had 35 first downs against Virginia. The only time the Tar Heels had more in a game was 36 vs. Pitt in 1974.

DOWNSDAY(S)

- Sophomore wide receiver Josh Downs has been Sam Howell's favorite target each of the first three weeks of the 2021 season.
- Downs is tied for second in the ACC and leads UNC with 24 receptions. He leads the ACC (2nd nationally) with 399 receiving yards and is second with four receiving touchdowns.
- In his first collegiate start at Virginia Tech, Downs caught eight of 11 targets for 123 yards and one dazzling touchdown, a 37-yard screen pass in the third quarter.
- He caught eight balls for 73 yards against Georgia State and scored a touchdown.
- He recorded a career-high 203 receiving yards against Virginia, the eighth most in program history, and had two receiving touchdowns from 59 and 37 yards in the first quarter.
- First UNC receiver since 2011 to catch a TD in each of the first three games of a season.
- His 250 Yards after catch and 17 first downs rank second nationally.

- Tennessee transfer Ty Chandler rushed for a career-high 198 yards and Carolina racked up 392 yards on the ground against Virginia.
- Chandler's previous career high was 158 rushing yards at UT against UTEP in 2018.
- He busted out a 60-yard run against the Cavaliers and scored a pair of rushing TDs.
- True freshman Caleb Hood added 66 yards on nine carries and scored his first collegiate TD on a five-yard run in the third quarter.
- UNC entered the Virginia game with only 347 rushing yards over the first two weeks of the season.

TAKEAWAY ARTISTS

- Carolina already has five takeaways on defense through three games in 2021.
- The Tar Heels are almost halfway to the 11 turnovers they created in 2020.
- Ja'Qurrious Conley has a pair of interceptions and a fumble recovery. Power Echols has a pick and Desmond Evans has scooped up one fumble.

CAUSING A RUCKUS

- Sophomore linebacker Kaimon Rucker has started the last two games and responded with the best game of his collegiate career last week against Virginia with two sacks, a forced fumble and five total tackles.

A GAME OF FIRSTS

- Senior Antoine Green and junior Emery Simmons both scored their first touchdowns of the season against Georgia State.
- Graduate student Ty Chandler scored his first rushing touchdown as a Tar Heel on a 2-yard run with 2:46 to play in the third quarter.
- Sophomore QB Jacolby Criswell connected with freshman Bryson Nesbit for a 47-yard touchdown strike with 4:03 to play in the game. It was Criswell's first touchdown pass and Nesbit's first touchdown catch.
- True freshman Power Echols had his first career interception early in the fourth quarter and returned it 17 yards.
- British Brooks notched his first career blocked punt and the first blocked punt by UNC since Bug Howard vs. Virginia Tech in 2015.

- Tomon Fox was credited with a half sack against Virginia Tech that moved him past Lawrence Taylor for sole possession of fifth place in program history. He has 22.5 career sacks. Fox also ranks seventh with 34.5 career tackles for loss.

DEFENSE DOMINATES 2ND HALF AT VT

- Carolina's defense surrendered three points in the second half against Virginia Tech, a key reason why the Tar Heels were still threatening to send the game into overtime in the final minutes of the fourth quarter.
- An interception from Ja'Qurrious Conley and several three-and-outs forced were vital for UNC in staying the game after falling behind 14-0 at the half.
- *"Ja'Qurrious Conley is gonna be a really, really good football player," Mack Brown said. "He's tough, he's big, he can run, he'll hit you and*

- Conley also picked up a fumble in the first quarter that ended a Hokie drive at the UNC 9-yard line. Trey Morrison forced the fumble when he jarred the ball loose from Virginia Tech's Keshawn King.

NEW-LOOK BACKFIELD

- Grad transfer Ty Chandler and sophomore D.J. Jones were the featured backs for Carolina in the season opener at Virginia Tech. Chandler rushed for 66 yards on 10 carries, while Jones gained 43 yards on six attempts.
- They combined for 109 yards and averaged 6.8 yards per carry on 16 attempts. Jones had the longest rush of the night, 29 yards, while Chandler had a 23-yard rush of his own.

ESPN'S TOP-100 COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYERS

- Sam Howell (No. 5) and Tony Grimes (No. 80) are listed among ESPN's list of the top-100 college football players in 2021.
- Only Oklahoma's Spencer Rattler (No. 1) was a higher-rated quarterback on the list.
- Grimes is among 20 sophomores listed.

DOWNS READY TO BREAKOUT IN 2021

- Sophomore wide receiver Josh Downs was selected in the preseason as a top-10 potential breakout player in 2021 according to ESPN staff writer David Hale.
- **Stat comparison:** In his only significant action last season, Downs caught four passes for 91 yards and two touchdowns in UNC's bowl game against Texas A&M. That stat line looked nearly identical to that of Florida's Kadarius Toney (7 catches, 92 yards, 2 TDs) against the Aggies. Toney went on to become a first-round draft pick.
- **Why he's poised for a breakout:** North Carolina waved goodbye to its two most established receivers in Dymari Brown and Dazz Newsome, but there's little concern about the Tar Heels' passing game. With QB Sam Howell still at the helm, the yards are going to come, and there seems little doubt that Downs, a speedy slot receiver, will get his fair share of them. His coming-out party in the Orange Bowl -- a game Brown missed because of an opt-out -- was just the first taste. UNC's defensive backs have raved about the competition in 7-on-7s, lauding Downs as a potential All-ACC star for 2021.

DOWNS SNAGS PRESEASON HERBIE AWARD

- ESPN analyst Kirk Herbstreit pegged sophomore receiver Josh Downs as his 'Breakout Star' for the upcoming 2021 season.
- After playing behind slot receiver Dazz Newsome, now with the Chicago Bears, most of last season, Downs showed out in the Orange Bowl last season with a pair of touchdowns, including a 75-yard grab to the house.

SCORING SPREE IN 2020

- UNC was second in the ACC to Clemson in scoring offense with 41.7 points per game. That figure was ninth in the nation.
- Carolina ranked fifth nationally and led the ACC with 537.3 yards per game of total offense.
- UNC shattered the previous school record of 486.9 yards per game set in 2015.
- UNC twice set a school record for total offensive yards in a game last season. The first occurrence was the 742 yards against Wake Forest, breaking the previous record of 721 vs. ODU in 2013.
- Carolina then put up 778 yards of offense at No. 9 Miami in the regular-season finale.
- UNC gained 500 or more yards in eight of the final 10 games of the 2020 campaign. The Tar Heels registered six-straight 500+ yard outings, the first time it's happened in at least 50 years, dating back to existing records that begin in 1971.
- Carolina has more than 400 yards of total offense in 18 of its last 20 games.
- UNC scored 40 or more points in seven games last season and 10 of the last 16 games going back to the end of the 2019 campaign.
- The 2020 season was the first in Carolina history that saw the Tar Heels score 50 or more points against four ACC opponents.

AERIAL ATTACK IN 2020

- Sam Howell led the ACC with 30 passing touchdowns (sixth nationally) and a 179.09 passing efficiency. He ranked second in the league with 298.8 passing yards per game and 311.0 yards of total offense per game.
- 17 of his 30 passing TDs went for 20 yards or longer, and eight went for 40+ yards.
- Howell led the nation with four passes of 70 or more yards.

- The NFLPA Collegiate Bowl unveiled its 2021-22 preseason Big Board on Aug. 27. The Tar Heels had five players listed.

ASANTE DRAWS INSPIRATION FROM BROTHER

- Junior LB Eugene Asante enjoyed a breakout performance in the Orange Bowl last season with a game- and career-high 10 tackles.
- Asante draws inspiration from his older brother, Larry Asante, who played at Nebraska and then spent six years in the NFL, before seeing his career end in 2015 when he was cut by the Oakland Raiders.
- "His career didn't end the way me and my family dreamed of ... I need to go 110 percent because in the real world your dreams can get cut at any time."

KIERNAN'S DUBLIN BEGINNINGS

- Sophomore punter Ben Kiernan played his high school football at Raleigh's Wakefield High School, but he didn't arrive in the U.S. until he was 15. Kiernan spent the first decade and a half of his life in Dublin, Ireland, where he played rugby and soccer. Seeking more opportunities and better colleges, Kiernan's parents decided to move to the Raleigh area. After moving just two weeks prior to the start of the 8th grade, Kiernan's father Mike had a chance encounter with the football coach at Food Lion and he told him to have Ben try out for football, where he would punt a football for the first time.
 - Kiernan's twin older brothers, Tom and Jack, played rugby at NC State.
 - Kiernan's 13-year-old sister Freya is in a lifetime battle with cerebral palsy. The Kiernan's adopted Freya, who was born in China, when she was nine months old.

SAM HOWELL JUNIOR SUPERLATIVES

- Sam Howell is one of four FBS quarterbacks to ever record back-to-back games with 300+ passing yards and 100+ rushing yards. Louisville's Lamar Jackson is the only other Power 5 QB to do so in 2017.
- Howell is the third UNC QB to ever have back-to-back 400-yard total offense games, joining Marquise Williams (Notre Dame and Georgia Tech in 2014) and Mitch Trubisky (James Madison and Pitt in 2016).
- His three first-quarter touchdown passes against Virginia were the most by a UNC quarterback vs. an FBS team in a quarter since Bryn Renner tossed three in the fourth quarter at Louisville in 2012.
- Passed Russell Wilson (NC State) for sixth in career passing touchdowns in ACC history with 77. Florida State's Chris Weinke is fifth with 79.
- Set career highs with 112 rushing yards and 15 carries against Virginia.
- Howell has thrown a touchdown pass in all 28 games as a Tar Heel, the longest active streak in the country.
- Howell has thrown multiple TD passes in 23 of 28 career games. He has tossed three or more touchdowns 16 times, four or more six times and five or more on three occasions.
- Has passed Marquise Williams for fourth place in UNC history with 8,094 passing yards.
- Has passed Bryn Renner for fourth place in school history with 8,526 yards of total offense.
- Howell's performance against Georgia State – 352 passing yards and 104 rushing yards – marked just the second time a UNC QB has thrown for 300+ and rushed for 100+ in the same game. The first to do so was Marquise Williams, who had 303 passing yards and 132 rushing yards against Notre Dame in 2014.
- It was the second time a UNC quarterback passed for three and rushed for two scores in a game (Williams vs. Baylor in the 2015 Russell Athletic Bowl in Orlando).
- Howell's 62-yard touchdown scamper against Georgia State was a career long and the longest run by a UNC QB since Darian Durant's 63-yard score against Clemson on Oct. 25, 2003.

SAM HOWELL SOPHOMORE SUPERLATIVES

- Sam Howell's 30 touchdown passes in 2020 led the ACC and ranked sixth nationally.
- Sam Howell set a UNC single-game records with 550 passing yards, seven total touchdowns and six touchdowns against Wake Forest on Nov. 14, 2020. Marquise Williams held the previous yardage record with 494 against Duke in 2015; six other Tar Heels had previously passed for five touchdowns in a game (Bryn Renner did that twice).
- Howell's seven total touchdowns against Wake Forest were the most in Kenan Stadium history.
- Howell's 550 passing yards were the third most in ACC history. Only Clemson's Deshaun Watson (580 vs. Pittsburgh in 2016) and Miami's Steven Morris (566 vs. NC State in 2012) passed for more yards in a game than Howell.
- Howell is just the third FBS player since 2000 to throw for 550 yards and six touchdowns and also score a rushing touchdown in a single game. Buffalo's Drew Anderson accomplished the feat against Western Michigan in 2017. Texas Tech's B.J. Symons did so vs. Ole Miss in 2003.
- Howell's six passing touchdowns vs. Wake Forest tied the ACC record set eight previous times, and most recently by Miami's Jarren Williams vs. Louisville in 2019.
- Howell's 68 career touchdown passes were are the most in ACC history by a sophomore quarterback. Clemson's Trevor Lawrence tossed 66.
- Howell became the second Tar Heel ever to score touchdowns by pass, rush and catch in the same game at Miami. Marquise Williams accomplished that against Notre Dame in 2014.

SAM HOWELL FRESHMAN SUPERLATIVES

- Sam Howell's 38 passing touchdowns in 2019 were the most by a true freshman in FBS history. The previous record was 30 from Clemson's Trevor Lawrence in 2018.
- Howell's 38 touchdowns were the second most ever by an ACC freshman quarterback. Florida State's Jamies Winston threw 40 touchdown passes in 2013 as a redshirt freshman.
- Howell's 38 touchdowns were the third most in ACC history, trailing only Deshaun Watson's record 41 TD passes for Clemson in 2016 and Winston's 40 in 2013.
- Howell set the UNC single-season record with 38 touchdown passes, surpassing Mitch Trubisky's 30 in 2016.
- Howell ranked fourth nationally and led all ACC QBs with 38 passing TDs. His 3,641 passing yards led the ACC and ranked 14th nationally.
- Howell's 3,641 passing yards were the most ever by an ACC true freshman quarterback.
- Howell was second in the ACC in pass efficiency at 160.3 and third in total offense (277.4 ypg).
- Howell threw multiple touchdowns in all 13 games.
- Joined James Winston as the only ACC QBs in the last 15 years to throw 35+ TDs (38), throw 10 or fewer INTs (7), throw for 3,000 yards (3,641), average eight yards per attempt (8.6), and complete 60% of the passes (61.4).
- Howell had eight games in 2019 with three or more touchdown passes.
- Howell's touchdown-interception ratio of plus 31 (38-7) was the best in UNC history. Mitch Trubisky was plus 24 (30/6) in 2016. Howell's plus 31 was eight better than UCF's Dillon Gabriel (+22) and nine better than USC's Kedon Slovis (+21).
- Led or tied among ACC QBs in completions of 10+ yards (154), 30+ yards (30) and 40+ yards (17).
- Tied then UNC school record and set freshman record with 5 TD passes at Virginia Tech. Set UNC freshman records for completions (33) and attempts (51) at Georgia Tech and yards (401) at NC State.
- In leading Carolina to seven wins and a bowl victory in 2019, Howell won more games last season than the Tar Heels did in the two previous seasons combined (5).

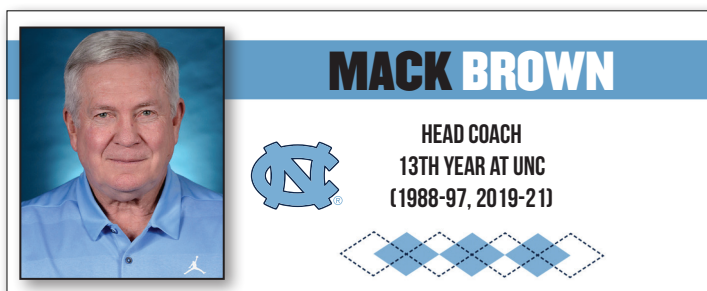

HEAD COACH MACK BROWN



Mack Brown, whose charismatic style and disciplined approach propelled the University of North Carolina to the top five and the University of Texas to the 2005 BCS National Championship, began his second stint as head coach in Chapel Hill on Nov. 27, 2018 with the goal of leading another Carolina resurgence.

A 43-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Brown has served as a head coach for 32 seasons with stops at Texas (1998-2013), North Carolina (1988-97, 2019-20), Tulane (1985-87), and Appalachian State (1983). Over his 32 seasons, Brown has posted a record of 259-132-1 (.662). Those 259 career victories rank seventh on the FBS all-time list and are the most among active coaches. The 2005 Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year and the 2008 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year, Brown is one of a handful of coaches in college football history to lead two separate programs to top-five national finishes. Brown continued a remarkable turnaround in year two of his return to Carolina, leading the Tar Heels from two wins in 2018 to the Orange Bowl in 2020. Carolina, which went 8-4, spent much of the season ranked in the Top 25, finishing the regular season at No. 13 in the College Football Playoff rankings and ending the year ranked 18th in the AP Poll and 17th in the Coaches Poll. This marked just the second time since Brown's departure in 1997 that Carolina finished a season in the Top 25. Under his guidance, Carolina produced four All-Americans, 13 All-ACC selections, a Top-15 recruiting class and averaged a 3.0 GPA over the spring and fall semesters.

In his first season back at the helm at North Carolina in 2019, Brown led the Tar Heels to a winning season and a resounding victory in the Military Bowl. The seven wins were two more than UNC had won in its previous two seasons combined (5) and the Heels won a bowl game for the first time since 2013. Carolina played close games seemingly all season. Its nine games decided by seven points or less were the most since 1936 and the Tar Heels' six losses came by a total of just 26 points. Brown's '19 UNC squad produced two NFL Draft picks, five NFL free-agent signees, 11 All-ACC honors and freshman QB Sam Howell was named ACC Offensive Rookie and Rookie of the Year before earning Freshman All-America honors.

MACK BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

- Dating back to 1986 when he was the head coach at Tulane, Mack Brown had a player selected in 28 straight NFL Drafts prior to 2014. In fact, Brown has had a player selected in the NFL Draft in 30 of his 32 drafts as a head coach.
- Mack Brown has coached 20 players (16 Texas/four UNC) who have been drafted in the first round in his past 19 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached a first-round selection in 12 of his last 20 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached 78 NFL Draft picks over his last 19 years.
- Of those 78 NFL Draft picks, 60 picks were chosen in the first four rounds.
- In 32 drafts as a head coach at North Carolina (1988-97, 2019-20), Texas (1998-2013), Tulane (1985-87) and Appalachian State (1983), Mack Brown has seen 115 of his former players selected in the NFL Draft.

Prior to returning to Carolina, Brown served as both a college football studio analyst and color analyst for ESPN.

At the completion of his Texas tenure in 2013, Brown was one of just four active coaches to reach the 200-victory plateau. He was also one of only two coaches nationally to lead his teams to 21 bowls in 22 seasons, and the only one to have 23 winning seasons in the previous 24 years. His 225 wins from 1990 to 2013, which combined the last eight years of his first stint at UNC and his entire Texas tenure, were the most of any coach in the country.

As a result, Brown was inducted into the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in December of 2018. He is the sixth Tar Heel to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame and the second coach, joining innovator Carl Grey Snavely, who was inducted in 1965. In addition to the College Football Hall of Fame, Brown is also a member of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame, the Longhorn Hall of Honor, the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame and the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame.

Brown has also succeeded in preparing his student-athletes for the next level. In the 31 NFL Drafts during Brown's time as a head coach, the NFL has picked 110 of his student-athletes, and at least one was selected in 28 straight drafts. He had 20 players selected in the first round of the draft from 1998 to 2013, and three members of his 1997 Carolina squad were picked in the first round of the 1998 NFL Draft, which tied for the most of any collegiate program.

With all of the success on the field, the primary emphasis has remained the same with Brown's squads -- maintaining a high level of achievement in the classroom and in the community. Eighty percent of his players at North Carolina received their degrees and he increased the pace at Texas, while more than a third of his players at UT regularly

earned 3.0 grade point averages and achieved spots on the Big 12 Commissioner's and Athletics Director's Honor Rolls.

Brown's first stint as head coach of the Tar Heels came from 1988-97. He led Carolina to a record of 69-46-1 (.599), which included three 10-win seasons, six consecutive bowl games, a Top-Five finish, a Top-10 finish and two Top-20 finishes.

At UNC, Brown recruited and coached several of the finest players in school history. From his 1997 squad alone, DE Greg Ellis (No. 8, Dallas Cowboys), LB Brian Simmons (No. 17, Cincinnati Bengals) and DT Vonnie Holliday (No. 19, Green Bay Packers) were selected among the first 19 picks in the 1998 NFL Draft.

Along with that trio of first-rounders, Brown also helped develop several other Tar Heel standouts. CB Dré Bly, who is currently Carolina's DBs coach, was a three-time All-American who recorded an ACC-record 20 interceptions during his career and played 11 seasons in the NFL. Corey Holliday, who currently serves as UNC's Associate A.D. for Football Administration, finished his career as the leading receiver in Carolina history, was a CFA/Hitachi Scholar-Athlete, and is a former member of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Dwight Hollier, who currently serves as UNC's Senior Associate A.D. for Student-Athlete Health, Well-Being & Program Outreach, made more than 500 tackles during his Carolina career and also

played in the NFL. RB Natrone Means, who rushed for more than 1,000 yards in his final two seasons at UNC, went on to lead the San Diego Chargers to Super Bowl XXIX and the Jacksonville Jaguars to the 1996 AFC title game.

QBs Jason Stanicek and Mike Thomas combined to rewrite Carolina's passing and total offense records. DT Marcus Jones, a consensus first-team All-American, earned ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1995. CB Thomas Smith came to UNC in 1989 as a walk-on from a small high school in North Carolina and departed as a first-round pick of the AFC Champion Buffalo Bills. RB Leon Johnson, one of the premier all-purpose offensive threats in ACC history, played eight seasons in the NFL. TE Freddie Jones, a second-round draft choice of the San Diego Chargers in 1997, was one of the NFL's top pass-catching tight ends and played eight seasons in the NFL.

During his first 10 seasons at Carolina, the Tar Heels featured a Lombardi Award finalist, a two-time Thorpe Award finalist, a Butkus Award finalist and semifinalist, 16 All-Americans, 34 first-team All-ACC selections, an ACC Defensive Player of the Year and an ACC Rookie of the Year. Brown also helped his players with professional aspirations as 38 of his Tar Heels heard their names called in the NFL Draft, including 16 in the first three rounds. In addition to the three first-rounders in 1998, Marcus Jones (Tampa Bay Buccaneers '96) and Thomas Smith (Buffalo Bills '93) were first-round selections; Freddie Jones (San Diego Chargers '97), Rick Terry (New York Jets '97), Bucky Brooks (Buffalo Bills '94) and Natrone Means (San Diego Chargers '93) were second-round picks; and James Hamilton (Jacksonville Jaguars '97), William Henderson (Green Bay Packers '95), Jimmy Hitchcock (New England Patriots '95), Rondell Jones (Denver Broncos '93), Brian Bollinger (San Francisco 49ers '92), Kevin Donnalley (Houston Texans '91) and Darrell Hamilton (Denver Broncos '89) were chosen in the third round.
