



Widely regarded as one of college football's top young coaches and recruiters, head coach Geoff Collins is in his third season at Georgia Tech. A metro-Atlanta native, Collins was named the 20th head coach in Georgia Tech football history on Dec. 7, 2018, after recording 15 wins in two seasons as head coach at Temple.

Despite the challenges associated with overhauling Georgia Tech's football culture, including installing a pro-style spread offensive attack after 11 years of option football at Tech, as well as the unprecedented and unexpected obstacles presented by the Covid-19 pandemic, Collins' twoyear tenure as the Yellow Jackets' head coach has been marked by a bevy of on- and off-field accomplishments, including the addition of two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in program history.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida, Mississippi State, FIU and his alma mater, Western Carolina. He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools.

Collins played outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina. He is married to the former Jennifer Haynes and they have a daughter, Astrid (5).







TODD STANSBURY Director of Athletics

Todd Stansbury, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was introduced as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

In his fifth year as the director of athletics at his alma mater, Stansbury has overseen one of the most successful years in Georgia Tech history in 2020-21. Most notably, Georgia Tech athletics earned a 44th-place finish in the 2020-21 Learfield IMG College Directors' Cup standings, which is the nation's most-recognized all-sports ranking for college athletics, with points awarded based on teams' finishes in NCAA Championships.

Despite the challenges presented by the Covid-19 pandemic, the Yellow Jackets had 11 of 17 teams participate in NCAA postseason play in 2020-21. The 11 teams in the NCAA postseason were Tech's most since a school-record 12 teams contributed towards the Directors' Cup standings in 2009-10.

The 44th-place Directors' Cup finish represents a remarkable turnaround for Georgia Tech under the watch of Stansbury. Just three years ago (2017-18), Tech only had three teams that earned Directors' Cup points and placed 121st in the final standings.





DR. ÁNGEL CABRERA Institute President

Ángel Cabrera is Georgia Tech's 12th president.

He and his wife, Beth, met at Georgia Tech where they each earned an M.S. and Ph.D. in psychology — and he attended as a Fulbright Scholar. He also studied electrical and computer engineering at Universidad Politécnica de Madrid in his native Spain.

Before returning to Georgia Tech as president, he led IE Business School in Madrid, Thunderbird School of Global Management (now part of Arizona State University), and George Mason University in Virginia. He has been recognized as a Young Global Leader by the World Economic Forum, Henry Crown Fellow by the Aspen Institute, and Great Immigrant by the Carnegie Corporation of New York. He has served on the boards of three public companies and the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond. He is currently serving on the boards of the Bankinter Innovation Foundation, the Atlanta Committee for Progress, the Metro Atlanta Chamber, and the National Geographic Society.

Beth and Ángel are the parents of Alex, a Georgia Tech alumnus and graduate student at Carnegie Mellon, and Emilia, a college student at Harvard.




Baratunde A. Cola knows just what it takes to be a student and an athlete at the highest,

A professor of heat transfer, combustion and energy systems in the George W. Woodruff School of Mechanical Engineering, Cola was named faculty athletics representative (FAR) to the Georgia Tech Athletic Association with his three-year term beginning in July 2020. The FAR serves as the liaison between the Institute and the Athletic Association on issues regarding rules compliance, developments at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and activities related to Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) membership.

Cola began his education at Vanderbilt University where he was a football student-athlete and the starting fullback in 2002. He graduated with a bachelor's of education degree after winning the football program's dedication award, before going on to earn his





BOBBY DODD STADIUM

Cozily nestled in the shadow of Atlanta's skyline, Bobby Dodd Stadium at Historic Grant Field is easily one of the nation's most unique and historic settings for college football. The venerable facility — the oldest on-campus stadium in NCAA Division I FBS — opened in 1913 and 2021 will be its 109th season as the home of Georgia Tech football. The Georgia Tech students who built Grant Field more than 100

years ago wouldn't recognize the home of Tech football if they saw it now. Not only has the skyline around the stadium changed dramatically, but the facility has steadily grown and improved during its rich history. Today's Bobby Dodd Stadium seats 55,000 fans in a modern, comfortable facility that embraces the tradition that has made Tech's venerable stadium a cornerstone of college football for a century. It is located in the heart of Georgia Tech's midtown Atlanta campus, bordered by Techwood Drive on the east, North Avenue on the south and Bobby Dodd Way on the north.

Tech actually began playing football on the site in 1905, but in 1913, the original concrete west stands were largely built by Tech students and seated 5,600. The concrete east stands were completed in ime for the 1924 season. A year later, the south stan bringing the seating capacity of the horseshoe-shaped stadium to approximately 30,000. The west stands were rebuilt in 1944 to up capacity to 44,000, followed by the addition of stands in the north end zone in 1958 and upper decks on the east (1962) and west sides (196 which brought the stadium's capacity to an all-time high of 58,121. Stadium capacity dipped to 46,000 in 1985 following the removal of seats in the south end zone to make way for the Wardlaw Center, but after a major renovation project from 2001-03, which included bowling in and adding an upper deck to the north end of the facility, capacity moved to its current 55,000.



HOME OF THE JACKETS



With an eye toward providing Georgia Tech's football team with better resources for skill development and practice facilities, the Yellow Jackets utilize the John and Mary Brock Football Facility and Hugh S. Spruill Strength and Conditioning Center on campus. Additionally, the Yellow Jackets call home to the Georgia Tech Football Headquarters which includes a renovated 8,100-square-foot locker room, 3,300-square-foot Mr. and Mrs. Gregg Garrett and Family Players' Lounge, meeting rooms and coaches' offices.

Georgia Tech unveiled its newly renovated football locker room (pictured above) prior to the start of the 2018 season. The \$4.5 million overhaul of the 8,100-square-foot locker room began following the completion of the 2017 season and was funded by a gift from an anonymous donor.

Features of the state-of-the-art locker room include: 116 individual lockers that each include a touch-screen display, a charging station for student-athletes' mobile phones, tablets and laptop computers, and a mechanical system for ventilation and drying; enhanced audio-visual systems to keep student-athletes informed and entertained; modernized visual displays throughout the space; a hydration station that puts a variety of sports drinks at student-athletes' fingertips, including Powerade (in liquid and "slushie" form) and Core Power (the official protein drink of Georgia Tech athletics); a hydrotherapy

area, including hot and cold tubs to assist in student-athletes' everyday recovery and rehabilitation; an upgraded steam room; increased shower and restroom capacity.

Built in 2011, the John and Mary Brock Football Facility is an 88,000-square-foot indoor practice facility that allows Georgia Tech football to work out in uninterrupted comfort regardless of weather conditions. Adjacent to Alexander-Rose Bowl Field (the Yellow Jackets' outdoor practice facility), the John and Mary Brock Football Facility features an artificial turf playing surface, a raised platform for guests and recruits to view practice, six air hangar doors that lead to the outdoor practice fields and a ceiling that is 65 feet above the middle of the field at its highest point.

Georgia Tech football works year-round in one of the nation's finest strength facilities - the Hugh S. Spruill Strength and Conditioning Center. Located on the ground floor of the William C. Wardlaw Center at the south end of Bobby Dodd Stadium, the facility includes a 10,000-square-foot weightlifting facility furnished with some of the most impressive strength-and-conditioning equipment in the country and a fully stocked nutrition bar. The Spruill Center also contains a 3,000-square-foot space dedicated to agility, speed and quickness training and a 1,000-square-foot covered outdoor area for specialized training.




THIS IS GEORGIA TECH

TECH TRADITIONS

Ramblin' Wreck Fight Song

The Georgia Tech fight song grew out of an old folk ballad, "The Sons of the Gamboliers."

Howard D. Cutter, a member of Tech's first graduating class (Mechanical Engineering, 1892), wrote in the November-December 1942 issue of the Georgia Tech Alumnus that the "Ramblin' Wreck" had its origins during the first two years after Tech opened in 1888, inspired when the entire student body traveled to Athens to see Tech's baseball team defeat Georgia.

By the early 1900s, "Ramblin' Wreck" was an established tradition. The earliest existing published version of the song appeared in the Blueprint, the Institute's yearbook, in 1908.

In 1910, Michael A. Greenblatt, Tech's first bandmaster, discovered the band playing "Ramblin' Wreck" to the tune of "Sons of the Gamboliers," and made his first arrangement of the song in the form of a handwritten manuscript.

When Frank Roman succeeded Greenblatt as bandmaster in 1911, he wrote a new adaptation of "Ramblin' Wreck," accompanied by many trumpet flourishes, that became nationally known. His is the version that continues to be popular today.

The fame of the song spread to such proportions that in 1959 it was sung by Richard Nixon and Nikita Khrushchev at their historic face-to-face meeting in Moscow.

In 1984, the law firm of Newton, Hopkins & Ormsby investigated the copyright of "Ramblin' Wreck" and found that a number of people have had various versions of the song copyrighted. The original version of the song is in the public domain and can be played without payment of royalties.

I'm a Ramblin' Wreck from Georgia Tech and a hell of an engineer, A helluva, helluva, helluva, helluva, hell of an engineer, Like all the jolly good fellows, I drink my whiskey clear, I'm a Ramblin' Wreck from Georgia Tech and a hell of an engineer.

Oh, if I had a daughter, sir, I'd dress her in White and Gold, And put her on the campus, to cheer the brave and bold. But if I had a son, sir, I'll tell you what he'd do. He would yell, "To Hell with Georgia," like his daddy used to do.

White and Gold

In the fall of 1891, before Georgia Tech organized a football team of its own, a game was scheduled between Auburn and Georgia. A rivalry was already established in baseball between Tech and Georgia, so Tech students were invited to the game to cheer, of course, for Auburn.

The students appointed a committee to recommend colors to be worn and cheers to be used at the game. The committee suggested white and gold, and about 200 students attended the game wearing those colors.

In 1893, when Georgia Tech's football team played Georgia for the first time, a group of young women from the Lucy Cobb Institute for Girls attended the game to cheer for Tech, dressed in white and gold.

Oh well it's up with the White and Gold

Down with the Red and Black Georgia Tech is out for the victory We'll drop the battle axe on Georgia's head When we meet her, our team is sure to beat her Down on the old farm there will be no sound Till our bow-wows rip through the air When the battle is over, Georgia's team will be found With the Yellow Jackets swarming around.

Oh, I wish I had a barrel of rum and sugar three thousand pounds, A college bell to put it in and a clapper to stir it around. I'd drink to all good fellows who come from far and near. I'm a ramblin', gamblin', hell of an engineer.


