#### **TOP STORYLINES**

- No. 7 Georgia Tech baseball comes off a red-hot series in which it downed then-No. 5 Georgia to begin ACC play against Virginia Tech on March 11-13 at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium.
- The Jackets own a 39-20 all-time advantage against the Hokies, dating back to 1980, including 11-straight weekend series in favor of Georgia Tech.
- The 7th-ranked Jackets have proved to be every bit of the offensive powerhouse they were touted to be in the preseason. Through 13 games, Tech nationally ranks fifth 25 home runs, 16th with 142 hits, and 18th with 121 runs.
- Chandler Simpson has been the spark plug for Tech, ranking 11th in the nation in hits (23) and seventh in runs (20). He's batting .460 on the year with a .556 on-base percentage.

- **Kevin Parada** has also been unstoppable at the plate, currently ranking No. 3 in the country in hits (25), fifth in home runs (7), sixth in RBI (20) and second in total bases (51). He's hitting .472 with a .556 OBP and just five strikeouts in 53 at-bats.
- Also red-hot at the plate are **Drew Compton** (.383), **Tres Gonzalez** (.316), **Tim Borden II** (.308), and **Andrew Jenkins** (.292).
- Tech's pitching has continued to show its power as **Chance Huff** pitched a career-long 7.0 innings against UGA, holding them to three hits, a solo HR and striking them out six times.
- On Saturday the team combined for 13 strikeouts and had freshmen **Cody Carwile** and **Aeden Finateri** combine for six two-hit innings.
- **Zach Maxwell** led the way with seven strikeouts against UGA and now sports a 2.25 ERA on the year.

#### IT STARTS AT HOME...

- "It Starts at Home" has been the offseason motto for Georgia Tech, putting an emphasis on getting victories at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium after going 26-11 in 2019.
- Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .755 percent of its games at home (973-312-1).
- · Georgia Tech struggled at home last season in a rarity, losing six-straight at home (its most since 1976).
- Tech rebounded and finished 7-1 at home to close the regular season.
- Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full season - 2017 and 2021.
- In 28 games at home in 2021, Tech hit .298.

#### THE FRIENDS OF JIM POOLE

- The "Friends of Jim Poole" that span from the business, MLB and Georgia Tech worlds established an endowed scholarship in spring to honor former Yellow Jacket standout and MLB relief pitcher Jim Poole, who was diagnosed last year with ALS.
- The endowment was created to recognize him and how his legacy will continue to have an impact on Georgia Tech student-athletes in the baseball program, teaching them self-reliance and how to apply their lessons learned on the baseball field to the rest of their life.
- A Georgia Tech Hall of Famer, Poole had a terrific year at Tech before being selected in the ninth round by the LA Dodgers and having a successful 11-year career in the Major Leagues.
- Poole then went on to be a highly successful business-
- Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease, with an estimated 30,000 people living with ALS in the U.S. at any given time. Primarily affecting people between the ages of 40 and 70, ALS is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. There is no known cure.

GT BASEBALL RECORD IN ONE-RUN GAMES

#### **OFFENSE**

- Georgia Tech baseball looks to continue its annual tradition of being one of the top offensive ACC teams in the country.
- This year may prove to be special, however, as D1Baseball has tabbed Georgia Tech to have one of the best lineups in the country.
- The praise is thanks to the return of a plethora of talent at the plate, including preseason all-American Kevin Parada, Andrew Jenkins, Drew Compton, Tres Gonzalez, Colin Hall, Jake DeLeo, John Anderson and Stephen Reid.
- Between those eight players, Tech returns 137 extra-base hits, 49 home runs and 222 RBI.
- The lineup has proved powerful through 13 games of 2022 as the team is hitting .312 for 121 runs, 142 hits, 27 doubles and 25 home runs.
- The lineup will also be infused with UAB-transfer **Chandler Simpson**, who swiped a record 55 bags in the Northwoods League last summer.
- Georgia Tech hit .300 in ACC play last season to lead all teams, despite playing 36 league games.
- Proving how powerful Georgia Tech's lineup will be is D1Baseball's power rankings for each respective position (including starting pitcher and relief pitcher).
- Tech sports a top-150 player in each of the positions, led by the No. 5 catcher in Parada.

 Georgia Tech is one of only 10 programs with top 50 infielders at each position (joining Arizona State, Arkansas, UNC Charlotte, Florida State, LSU, Notre Dame, Ole Miss, Texas and Vanderbilt).

## INFIELDERS

- Georgia Tech baseball will have to replace one of the country's most elite middle infield combos in Luke Waddell and Austin Wilhite this season.
- Up to the task will be transfer **Chandler Simpson** and **John Anderson**.
- Simpson was a force to be reckoned with on Opening Weekend, hitting .500 for six hits, and a bases-clearing triple that gave Tech the lead and win on Sunday against Wright State.
- He then hit .556 in five games in five games the next week, having 10 hits and 10 runs in 18 at-bats, including a double and a grand slam that bounced off the Gardner-Webb outfielder's head.

- Simpson was a Conference USA all-freshman selection in 2021 at UAB, leading the team with 24 stolen bases in 54 games, while hitting .288.
- Through 13 games, he ranks second in the ACC and 17th nationally in stolen bases with nine.
- Overall, the team ranks fifth in the ACC in stolen bases at 18.
- He also ranked as one of the toughest to strikeout in the nation a trait also shared by Waddell only seeing three strikes 16 times in 2021, the least in C-USA.
- Anderson will look to have a breakout season after being limited in action behind the veteran Wilhite.
- Anderson has struggled at the plate to open the season, hitting just .111 in 10 games.
- Despite limited action last season, Anderson took full advantage, hitting .277 in just 18 appearances, finishing with 13 hits. 1 doubles four home runs and 10 RBI.
- Also vying for time in the middle infield is transfer **Tim Borden II** and **Jadyn Jackson**.
- Borden has started the last four games at second base and has impressed, hitting .308 with eight hits and two home runs.
- A 2020 freshman all-American at Louisville, Borden arrives on The Flats after a sophomore slump where he hit .220 with three doubles and five RBI.
- Borden received the start on Feb. 23 vs. Presbyterian at second base and homered in his first Georgia Tech plate appearance.
- A lockdown defender, Borden was scorching hot in 2020 before the season was shortened due to the Covid-19 pandemic, hitting .444 with two doubles, a home run and nine BBI.
- Recruited as a top-10 shortstop out of the state of Georgia, Jackson has been a constant in the Tech dugout.
- Up and down at the plate, Jackson's highlight also came in 2020, hitting a walkoff RBI single against Virginia Tech to give Tech the 4-3 win.
- As for the corners, Georgia Tech will look to steady veterans in **Drew Compton** at third and **Andrew Jenkins** at first.
- Both rated as top-15 infielders by D1Baseball, both are as steady on defense as they are dangerous at the plate.
- Compton has been on fire to start the season, hitting .383 with four doubles and five home runs through 13 games.
- Compton's ability at the plate was evident from the very get-go when he became just the third Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his very first collegiate plate appearance.

- A versatile defender, Compton played both first and third last year, before settling at designated hitter after Jenkins and former teammate Justin-Henry Malloy caught fire.
- Compton finished last season hitting .294 for 55 hits, 10 doubles, a triple and 13 home runs for 37 RBI.
- Compton really caught fire in the NCAA Tournament, mashing four home runs in the Nashville Regional.
- Compton is the first Yellow Jacket to have four or more home runs in a NCAA Tournament since Matt Wieters had five in 2006 (three in Regionals, one in Super, one in the College World Series).

- Holding down first base will be Jenkins, who helped the team go 20-12 when he played the position last season.
- Jenkins through 13 games is hitting a fine .292, recording 14 hits, four doubles and 12 RBI.
- Jenkins finished last season hitting .302 for 38 hits, 12 doubles, a triple and nine home runs for 34 RBI.
- Jenkins made a name for himself by catching fire down the stretch, hitting .400 over the team's last 17 contests, including six doubles and six home runs, slugging .771 and reaching base at a .462 clip over the stretch.
- One of his 2021 highlights came in the ACC Tournament when Jenkins walked off Louisville in the 12th inning with a double to left field to send Tech to the semifinals for the second-straight tournament.
- Jenkins hit a home run in five of the last nine games of 2021.
- Continuing its tradition of being #CatcherU, Georgia
   Tech once again sports one of the best catchers in college baseball with highly rated recruit Kevin Parada.
- Parada has once again been tremendous to start his sophomore campaign, hitting .480 with 24 hits, five doubles, six home runs, 21 RBI and a .559 on-base percentage.

- He's struck out just five times in 53 at-bats.
- On Feb. 28, Parada was named National Player of the Week after hitting .571 with 12 hits, four doubles and five home runs for 17 RBI during their previous five games.
- He homered in four-straight games and twice in the first game of the Saturday doubleheader with Gardner-Webb.
- His home run against Georgia State marked his sixth in eight days.
- Rated as one of the top backstops in the country, Parada was named a consensus preseason all-American this season after earning consensus freshman all-American status last year.
- Parada made 48 starts behind the plate last season as a true freshman, leading the ACC through NCAA Regionals with 20 doubles.
- Parada became the first Georgia Tech freshman to lead the team in hitting since Matt Murton in 2001, finishing at .318 for 70 hits, 20 doubles, two triples and nine home runs for 42 RBI.
- Recorded four four-hit games last season -- only two other ACC players even recorded three.
- Parada is largely considered to be a first-round MLB Draft prospect in the summer of 2022 as a draft-eligible sophomore.

#### **OUTFIELDERS**

- "There might not be a better defensive [outfield] trio in the country" says D1Baseball about Georgia Tech's outfield of **Tres Gonzalez, Colin Hall** and **Jake DeLeo**.
- Veteran and team captain Hall will anchor the outfield in center field, having now played all outfield positions for Georgia Tech.
- Hall raised his average considerably after a cold opening weekend, hitting .467 from Feb. 22-26 for seven hits and a home run for seven RBI. He also stole four bases.
- Hall hit a leadoff home run in the ninth inning against Mercer on March 8 to tie the game, despite eventually falling 5-4 on the night.
- Hall had appeared in a whopping 154 games and made 148 starts in his career entering his final year of competition.
- For his career, Hall has hit .279 with 49 extra-base hits, including nine home runs for 91 RBI.
- Hall was sidelined last season after just 19 games, due to an injury sustained on March 20 at Wake Forest.
- Another team captain in the outfield is Gonzalez, who was named a preseason all-ACC nod from Perfect Game.
- Gonzalez has been red-hot to start 2022, hitting .333 for 12 hits, three doubles and a homer for 12 RBI.
- Last season, Gonzalez appeared in all 56 games, hitting .279 for 57 hits, 16 doubles, a triple and three home runs.

- An on-base machine, Gonzalez finished fourth in the ACC with 44 walks and registered a .422 on-base percentage.
- DeLeo has also proved himself a stellar outfielder, making 25 starts last season in left field and 21 starts in right field.
- DeLeo had started the season hot, hitting .318 for seven hits, five doubles and a home run through six games.
- DeLeo suffered an undisclosed injury on Feb. 25 against Gardner-Webb and is considered day-to-day.
- Last season, DeLeo hit .254 for 46 hits, eight doubles, a triple and two home runs for 22 RBI and co-led the team with five steals overall.
- DeLeo became the first Yellow Jacket since Wade Bailey in 2017 to record five hits when he went a perfect 5-for-5 in the rubber match at then-No. 12 Virginia Tech.
- Also an option in the outfield or as the designated hitter is **Stephen Reid**.
- Reid has been up and down offensively, currently hitting .200 for 10 hits and three home runs for 11 RBI.
- Reid has continued to show his ability to do damage with power, hitting .263 for 52 hits, 11 doubles and nine home runs for 42 RBI last season.
- Led the team with 12 multi-RBI games and tied for second with RBI on the season.
- In the elimination game against then-No. 4 Vanderbilt in the NCAA Regional, Reid had two hits, including a key home run, for four RBI.



#### PITCHING

- Georgia Tech has stockpiled perhaps its highest number of pitchers in history as it looks to be just as dangerous on the mound as it is at the plate.
- Despite having to replace the likes of starters Brant Hurter and Andy Archer, Tech returns a host of talent, including ERA-leader Zach Maxwell, closer Luke Bartnicki, Josiah Siegel, Dawson Brown, Marquis Grissom, Jr., Dalton Smith, Chance Huff and Cort Roedig.
- Tech will also return veterans **Sam Crawford** and **Joseph Mannelly**.
- In its Opening Weekend, the pitching staff struck out 40 batters. The last two times Tech has struck out 40 or more hitters, the team has swept an opponent (Clemson, NC State 2021).
- Overall, Tech has worked to a team ERA of 4.53 with 144 strikeouts -- good for 18th nationally.
- Georgia Tech's starting lineup for Opening Week was Huff on Friday, Maxwell on Saturday and freshman Aeden Finateri on Sunday.
- Huff pitched terrifically, allowing just a wind-aided home run in game one against Wright State, but went 5.0 and struck out 19, walking just one.
- Huff followed that up with a terrific start against Gardner-Webb, going 6.0 innings, allowing just one hit and one walk, while striking out nine.
- Huff has continued to be sensational, going a career-long 7.0 innings against then-No. 5 Georgia, allowing just three hits, a solo home run and striking out six.
- Huff is transitioning out of the bullpen to starter on Friday after posting a 9.99 ERA last season in 20 appearances.
- Huff finished with a 1-0 record and two saves, while striking out 22 on the season.
- Huff has worked hard in the offseason to stretch his stamina out and also improve controlling, leading the team in preseason work.
- Maxwell struggled in the first inning, walking three, but settled to go 3.0 innings and strike out five, allowing just two from the opening inning.
- Maxwell then responded greatly with a career start against Gardner-Webb, going a career-long 6.0 innings, allowing three hits, one run and two walks, and striking out a career-best 11 batters.
- Hard-throwing Maxwell was once again impressive last season, leading the team with a 3.09 ERA, 2-2 record and a whopping 56 strikeouts.
- Maxwell set the school record with 15.75 strikeouts per 9 innings last season, good for best among the ACC with at least 30 innings.
- Maxwell is currently sixth in the nation and atop the ACC in strikeouts per 9 innings at 17.25.

- Maxwell will also be transitioning from relief to starter, but in his case, it will be back to starter after playing that role in 2020.
- In 2020, Maxwell became the third true freshman to start Opening Day for the Yellow Jackets on the mound since Kris Wilson in 1995 (Xzavion Curry - 2017)

- For 2020, Maxwell finished with a 3.14 ERA and 1-1 record, striking out 20 overall.
- Rated as the No. 3 right-handed pitcher in Connecticut, Finateri has impressed all preseason long, earning a start in the opening rotation as a true freshman.
- In his first outing, he went 4.0 innings and allowed four earned runs on four hits, striking out five overall.
- Earning a host of showcase honors, Finateri worked to a 0.50 ERA from 2017-20, recording a career WHIP of 0.96.
- Starting this season in the bullpen will be Grissom, who will look to have his first fully healthy season as after coming on only in the second half of 2021.
- Grissom looked strong in his first appearance, going 2.0 innings, surrendering three hits but no runs or walks, all while striking out four.
- Overall, in a pair of starts and five appearances, Grissom has worked to a 6.10 ERA and 1-2 record.
- Grissom is in the starting rotation for the second-straight time this weekend against Virginia Tech.
- Grissom finished with a 5.58 ERA in nine appearances and seven starts, getting one save and striking out 33.
- In his final start of 2021 against then-No. 4 Vanderbilt, Grissom worked 4.1 innings without an earned run.
- Grissom, Jr. was rated the 11th overall pitcher in the country by Perfect Game.
- Grissom hails from tremendous Atlanta stock in being the son of Big Leaguer Marquis Grissom, a former Atlanta Braves outfielder who played 17 seasons in the MLB, helping take the Braves to the 1995 World Series.
- Returning to the closer role for Georgia Tech will be Luke Bartnicki, who despite some tough-luck outings that forced a 6.00 ERA, provided seven saves on the year.
- In an effort to be more consistent, Bartnicki went to work hard in the offseason and slimmed down 20 pounds to 220, the best shape of his college career.
- Through four appearances, Bartnicki has a 8.10 ERA in just 3.1 innings.
- Also returning is **Josiah Siegel**, who finished the year with a 3.77 ERA and 2-1 record.

- Also recording a save, Siegel struck out 22 in 28.2 innings and held opponents to a .250 average.
- Siegel was terrific in his first appearance, working 3.0 no-hit innings against Wright State (Feb. 19), striking out four for the decision.
- Through three appearances and one start, Siegel currently has a 7.11 ERA and 1-0 record.
- Another sophomore back on the mound will be **Dawson** Brown, who finished with a 2-0 record and 4.40 ERA in iust 14-0 innings.
- Brown was ultra-impressive on opening weekend, making two appearances, including closing Sunday's matchup against Wright State where he picked up his first save of his career.
- Brown has looked great as a potential closer/stopper out of the bullpen - holding a 0.00 ERA through five appearances before three runs crossed against him vs. then-No. 5 Georgia and one against Mercer.
- Dawson is son of Georgia Tech Hall of Famer and six-time all-star and two-time ERA title winner Kevin Brown. Kevin helped the Marlins to the 1995 World Series before signing the first \$100 million contact with the LA Dodgers in 1998.
- A veteran of the bullpen is **Dalton Smith**, who despite a 6.51 ERA, worked 22 crucial appearances including five starts.
- He finished with a save and 2-2 record as well as 36 strikeouts.
- Smith made just one appearance, got one out and the Friday night winning decision against Wright State.
- Smith then started against Georgia Southern (Feb. 22), allowing just one earned run on four hits in 1.2 innings.
- Veterans **Sam Crawford** and **Joseph Mannelly** will also help lead the stable of arms.
- Crawford was successful in his first appearance of 2022, going 2.0 innings and allowing just one run, while striking out three.
- Crawford currently holds a 6.23 ERA through three appearances.
- Crawford made 10 starts last season before moving back to the bullpen for eight appearances.
- He finished with a 6.00 ERA and 37 strikeouts in 51.0 innings.
- Mannelly looked as good as he has looked his entire career at Tech, making two appearances and picking up the win on Sunday vs. Wright State.
- Through eight appearances, Mannelly holds a 10.38 ERA and a 1-0 record.
- Mannelly finished with a 5.81 ERA and impressed down the stretch with a 2-0 record.
- In 18 appearances and 31.0 innings, Mannelly finished with 33 strikeouts.



#### PITCHING

- **Cort Roedig** is also promised to return to form for Georgia Tech.
- After being hampered by a nagging injury sustained in the 2020 summer, Roedig is fully healthy and prepared to return to his old ways.
- Through his first three appearances, he holds a 3.00 ERA in 3.0 innings of work.
- In the one-and-a-half healthy years prior to 2021, Roedig posting a 4.34 ERA (2020) and 4.88 ERA (2019) over a combined 14 starts.
- Two young bullpen options that have emerged are freshman lefty Cody Carwile and righty Aeden Finateri.
- Carwile in three appearances and six innings has a 1-0 record and 1.50 ERA, allowing just one hit (a home run) to sport a .056 opponents batting average.
- Finateri started the first two weekends and struggled to the tune of a 7.04 ERA, but looked dominant out of the pen at then-No. 5 Georgia, throwing three shutout innings and punching out five.
- Jackson Finley, who had been sensational in relief for Georgia Tech, will miss much of the season after Tommy John Surgery.
- He's projected to return to the mound near the end of the season with him maintaining the ability to hit for Tech until then.

## DANNY BORRELL

- Looking to get a full year under his belt is Georgia Tech pitching coach Danny Borrell, who arrived on The Flats after 18 years in the New York Yankees organization as both a player and the pitching coordinator for their world-renowned farm system.
- Borrell became the youngest pitching coordinator in the MLB when hired in 2015 by the Yankees, where he led approximately 180 pitchers per year and 11 pitching coaches over nine minor league affiliates.
- In total, he developed 34 Big Leaguers during his tenure with New York including MLB All-Stars Dellin Betances and Luis Severino.
