TOP STORYLINES

• Georgia Tech football continues a challenging opening stretch to its 2022 season on Saturday when it hosts No. 20/17 Ole Miss for a highly anticipated battle at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• Despite both teams having been founding members of the Southeastern Conference in 1932 and competing in the SEC together from 1933 until Georgia Tech's departure from the league following the 1963 season, Saturday's meeting is only the second-ever regular-season matchup between Tech and Ole Miss and the first since Oct. 12, 1946 (a 24-7 GT win in Atlanta).

• The Yellow Jackets have squared off in three bowl games since their lone regular-season matchup — the 1953 Sugar Bowl (a 24-7 GT win that clinched the 1952 national championship for the Yellow Jackets), the 1971 Peach Bowl (a 41-18 Ole Miss win) and the 2013 Music City Bowl (a 25-17 Ole Miss win).

• Georgia Tech (1-1) is coming off a 35-17 win over Western Carolina. Playing on four days' rest, the Yellow Jackets fell into an early 14-7 hole, but held the Catamounts to just three points over the final 51:02 of the contest and cruised to the comfortable victory.

• Tech averaged 7.1 yards per rush, 6.7 yards per play and 1.77 points per minute of possession while limiting WCU to 3.0 yards per rush, 5.2 yards per play and 0.42 points per minute of possession in last Saturday's triumph.

• Under third-year head coach Lane Kiffin, Ole Miss opened the 2022 season with wins over Troy (28-10) and Central Arkansas (59-3). The Rebels have won 12 of their last 15 games since the beginning of last season and haven't lost to an unranked team during that stretch.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

1
Dontae Smith is the only running back in NCAA Division I FBS to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game this season, which he did with 102 yards and three scores on 11 carries last Saturday against Western Carolina. Florida QB Anthony Richardson is the only other FBS player to accomplish the feat this season, which he did against Utah on Sept. 3.

 LB **Ayinde Eley** is the only player in all of FBS with at least 20 tackles, two tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble this season.

3
Jeff Sims is in his third season as Georgia Tech's starting quarterback. He is the first Tech signal-caller to start three-straight season openers since Justin Thomas from 2014-16.

5
 Saturday's meeting is the fifth all-time between Georgia Tech and Ole Miss. The teams have only met once previously in the regular season, a 24-7 Tech triumph on Oct. 12, 1946.

7
 Georgia Tech's defense has racked up seven sacks through two games, which is its most through two games since it totaled 11 sacks during the first two games of the 2007 campaign. The Yellow Jackets are on pace for 42 sacks during the regular season, which would be their most in any regular season since they had 48 regular-season sacks in '07.

 Fourteen Georgia Tech football student-athletes have already achieved the goal of earning a bachelor's degree — DB **Kenny Bennett**, DL **Daniel Carson**, LB **Ayinde Eley**, RB **Hassan Hall**, TE **Peje' Harris**, WR **E.J. - up it to 2-1 on the season;
- give the Yellow Jackets consecutive wins for the first time since it won four-straight games from Oct. 25-Nov. 17, 2018;
- be its second win over a nationally ranked team in its last 12 games, joining a 45-22 rout over No. 21/20 North Carolina on Sept. 25 of last season;
- up it to 3-2 all-time against Ole Miss;
- be its first win over Ole Miss since a 24-7 triumph in the 1953 Sugar Bowl, which clinched the 1952 national championship for the Yellow Jackets;
- be its first win over an SEC opponent since a 33-18 victory over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.

GEORGIA TECH THIRD-YEAR HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, is in his fourth season as Georgia Tech football's head coach. He was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018.

Despite the challenges associated with overhauling Georgia Tech's football culture, including installing a pro-style spread offensive attack after 11 years of option football at Tech, as well as the unprecedented and unexpected obstacles presented by the Covid-19 pandemic, Collins' three-year tenure as the Yellow Jackets' head coach has been marked by a bevy of accomplishments. They include:

- Three-straight nationally lauded recruiting classes. Collins' first full recruiting class at Georgia Tech in 2020 was ranked No. 24 nationally by Rivals, then re-ranked No. 8 nationally by Bleacher Report during the '20 season based on the impressive play of Tech's newcomers, which included three true-freshman starters on offense. It was only the second top-25 recruiting class in Georgia Tech history, and the first since 2007, a class that was compiled when Collins served as the Yellow Jackets' director of player personnel. His second recruiting class at Tech in 2021 was also a top-20 class when including the rankings of eight highly ranked transfers, six of which had multiple seasons of eligibility remaining. In 2022, Collins and his staff put together the second-best class of incoming freshmen in school history based on percentage of four-star prospects, as well as a group of 17 transfers which was ranked No. 20 nationally by 247Sports. In all, Georgia Tech has added 34 four- or five-star recruits and 18 of the 50 highest-ranked high-school recruits in program history (according to 247Sports) since the arrival of Collins and his staff in January 2019.

- The development of four NFL Draft picks in three seasons – TE Tyler Davis (2020), WR Jalen Camp (2021), P Pressley Harvin III (2021) and DB Tariq Carpenter (2022). Davis, who was recruited by Collins to come to The Flats as a graduate transfer in 2019, became Georgia Tech's first NFL Draft pick at any position in three years, the first non-specialist to be drafted from Tech in four years, the first Yellow Jacket tight end to be selected in 28 years and, as a sixth-round pick, the highest selection ever for a GT tight end in the NFL Draft. When Camp and Harvin were both selected in 2021, it marked the first time that Tech had multiple picks in the same NFL Draft since 2016. In 2022, Carpenter became the first defensive player drafted out of Tech since '16.

- Harvin winning the 2020 Ray Guy Award as college football's top punter. Under Collins' tutelage, Harvin became the first Yellow Jacket to win one of college football's major individual awards since Durant Brooks won the Guy Award in 2007 and only the third unanimous All-American in Georgia Tech history, joining Calvin Johnson (2006) and Ken Swilling (1990)

- Memorable victories, including a 45-22 rout over No. 20 North Carolina in Tech's inaugural "Mayhem at Mercedes-Benz Stadium" game last season, a thrilling 16-13 come-from-behind triumph at Florida State to open the 2020 season (the Yellow Jackets' first season-opening true road win since 2007), a 28-21 overtime win at Miami in 2019 (Tech's first-ever win over the Hurricanes at Miami's Hard Rock Stadium) and a pair of nationally televised primetime victories – a 28-26 win over NC State in 2019 and a 46-27 victory over Louisville in 2020.

Prior to taking the reins at Georgia Tech, Collins put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in Temple's 121-year football history. Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th – 2013) and scoring defense (23rd – 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' coaching career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins has also served on the staffs at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. In addition to the four Jackets drafted under Collins' tutelage and running back Nathan Cottrell, who made the Jacksonville Jaguars as an undrafted free agent out of Tech in 2020, Collins' NFL pupils include Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive

MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City. Under Collins, Tech became only the second college football program in the nation to partner with renowned creative agency J1S and the first program in the nation to enter into a partnership with best-selling author and branding consultant Jeremy Darlow. Collins' focus on giving his student-athletes the resources and tools to assist in building their personal brand is a main reason that Georgia Tech has been at the forefront for student-athletes being able to maximize name, image and likeness opportunities.

Collins' innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts have not only helped Georgia Tech land the two highest-rated recruiting classes in school history, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 51, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (6).

• The Yellow Jackets have squared off in three bowl games since their lone regular-season matchup — the 1953 Sugar Bowl (a 24-7 GT win that clinched the 1952 national championship for the Yellow Jackets), the 1971 Peach Bowl (a 41-18 Ole Miss win) and the 2013 Music City Bowl (a 25-17 Ole Miss win).

• The Yellow Jackets have lost five-straight games to SEC foes, dating back to a 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016).

• The Jackets' last regular-season win over an SEC opponent came in the final game of the 2016 regular season, a 28-27 triumph at Georgia (Nov. 26).

• Tech's last home win over an SEC squad also came in 2016, as it defeated Vanderbilt, 38-7, at Bobby Dodd Stadium on Sept. 17, 2016 (six years to the day prior to this Saturday's matchup versus Ole Miss).

NOTING LAST SATURDAY'S WIN OVER WCU

• After a slow start, Georgia Tech dominated the final 50-plus minutes of action to roll past Western Carolina, 35-17, last Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• Playing on just four days' rest following its season opener against No. 4 Clemson on Labor Day night, Tech allowed WCU to score touchdowns on each of its first two possessions and trailed, 14-7, with 5:37 to go in the first quarter.

• However, Tech's defense went on to keep Western Carolina out of the end zone for the final 50:37 of the ballgame, while the Yellow Jackets' offense scored touchdowns on five of their first nine possessions to cruise to the win.

• Georgia Tech averaged 7.1 yards per rush, 6.7 yards per play and 1.77 points per minute of possession while limiting WCU to 3.0 yards per rush, 5.2 yards per play and 0.42 points per minute of possession.

• 243 of the Yellow Jackets' 343 yards of total offense and all five of their touchdowns came on the ground.

• Tech's five rushing touchdowns were its most in a game since it ran for seven touchdowns in a 49-28 win at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2018.

• Defensively, Georgia Tech only allowed Western Carolina to cross midfield three times in its final 11 possessions. The Catamounts only got inside the Yellow Jackets' 35 yard line once during those final 11 possessions of the game.

• Tech's defense forced four turnovers, a turnover on downs and three punts while surrendering only a fourth-quarter field goal over WCU's final 11 possessions.

• The Jackets' four takeaways were their most in a game since they forced five turnovers in a 56-33 win over Duke on Nov. 28, 2020 and marked only the third time since 2015 that they have recorded at least four takeaways in a game (Tech's four takeaways in a 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016 being the only other occasion).

• Georgia Tech's three interceptions were its most in a game since it had three in a 38-28 win at North Carolina on Nov. 3, 2018.

• The Yellow Jackets' three INTs matched their total from the entire 2021 season.

• Georgia Tech's defense recorded 10 tackles for loss and four sacks, while the offense allowed only three TFL and zero sacks.

• R-Jr. RB **Dontae Smith** set career highs and recorded his first 100-yard rushing game with 102 rushing yards (prev.: 82 vs. Kennesaw State — Sept. 11, 2021) and three rushing touchdowns (prev.: 2 vs. Duke — Nov. 28, 2020).

• Smith became the first running back in NCAA Division I FBS this season to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game. Florida QB Anthony Richardson is the only other FBS player to accomplish the feat this season, which he did against Utah on Sept. 3.

• Three different Yellow Jackets scored rushing touchdowns — Smith (3), So. WR **Nate McCollum** (on a 40-yard reverse in the second quarter) and r-Jr. **Dylan McDuffie** (from 2 yards out in the third quarter).

• Defensively, r-Jr. DB **Derrick Allen**, r-Jr. DB **Myles Sims** and Sr. LB **Charlie Thomas** all had interceptions for the Yellow Jackets, while r-Sr. **Ayinde Eley** recovered a fumble. The interceptions were both career firsts for Allen and Sims, while Thomas' was the third of his career. Eley recovered a fumble for the second-straight game.

• Despite not entering the game until after halftime due to a targeting penalty in the second half of the season opener against Clemson, Thomas racked up eight tackles (seven solo), two tackles for loss, a sack and an interception. He became the first Yellow Jacket and only the 16th ACC player since 2000 with at least eight tackles, two TFL, a sack and an interception in a single game.

OFFENSE

• For the majority of observers, the most noticeable change when head coach **Geoff Collins** took the reins at Georgia Tech prior to the 2019 season was the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.

• The continued offensive transformation at Tech received a boost this offseason with the hire of four new assistant coaches on the offensive side of the ball, highlighted by offensive coordinator **Chip Long**.

• A 16-year Division I coaching veteran, including 14 at the major-conference level, Long has helped lead teams to 13 bowl games over the past 16 seasons. He has five years of experience as offensive coordinator, including ultra-successful stints at Memphis (2016) and Notre Dame (2017-19).

• Among all currently active offensive coordinators, Long was the sixth-highest-rated OC in the nation during his four-year stint with Memphis and ND, according to analytics produced by *SportsSource Analytics/Coaches By The Numbers*. Among current offensive coordinators, Long is one of only four OCs to receive a five-star rating from *Coaches By The Numbers* from 2016-19, joining Oklahoma's Bill Bedenbaugh, Ohio State's Kevin Wilson and Penn State's Mike Yurcich.

• Georgia Tech has totaled at least 400 yards of offense in 11-of-24 games dating back to the beginning of the 2020 season. Prior to the beginning of the 2020 season, the Jackets had gone 16 games without compiling 400 yards of total offense (dating back to Nov. 3, 2018).

• Georgia Tech has rushed for at least 260 yards seven times under Collins (2019-pres.), including three times last season (271 vs. Northern Illinois, Sept. 4; 270 at Virginia, Oct. 23; 261 vs. North Carolina, Sept. 25).

• Since the beginning of the 2019 season, Tech's seven games with at least 260 rushing yards is tied for fourth-most in the ACC (North Carolina - 10; Boston College - 8; Virginia Tech - 8; **Georgia Tech - 7**; Syracuse - 7; Clemson - 7).

• In the passing game, Georgia Tech's 23 completions against No. 4 Clemson on Sept. 5 were its sixth-most in a game over the past 20 seasons.

• Nineteen of the Yellow Jackets' 25 highest completion totals since the beginning of the 2002 season have come in their last 34 games.

• After ranking 125th out of 127 teams nationally in 2020 with 25 turnovers (2.5 per game), Georgia Tech improved to 44th nationally with 15 turnovers in 2021 (1.25 per game) and are tied for 36th nationally with just two turnovers through two games this season (1.0 per game).

• Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has had an average of 1.3 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 2.0 turnovers per game in losses.

QUARTERBACKS

• **Jeff Sims** is in his third season as Georgia Tech's starting quarterback.

• Sims is the first Georgia Tech signal-caller to start three-straight season openers since Justin Thomas (2014-16).

• In 2020, Sims became the first true freshman to start the season at quarterback for Georgia Tech since Reggie Ball in 2003.

• In just 19 collegiate games (he was limited to 10 games in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic and seven last season due to injury), Sims has accounted for 4,567 yards of total offense (3,613 passing, 953 rushing) and 36 touchdowns (26 passing, 10 rushing).

• In the season opener against No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5), Sims moved into Georgia Tech's all-time top 10, now currently with 4,567 yards of total offense.

• Sims also ranks ninth in Georgia Tech history in passing yards, eighth in touchdown passes, eighth in completions (285), fourth in completion percentage (.572) and eighth in passing efficiency (126.6).

• Sims turned in perhaps the finest performances of his career last season at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, when he returned from an injury sustained in the season opener versus Northern Illinois and came off the bench to lead Georgia Tech to a 45-22 victory over No. 20/21 North Carolina (Sept. 25).

• Despite not entering the game until less than four minutes remained in the first half, Sims ran for 128 yards and three touchdowns on 10 carries and completed 10-of-13 passes for 112 yards and a score in the rout over UNC.

• Sims' .769 completion percentage against UNC was the highest by a Yellow Jacket (min. 10 attempts) since Joshua Nesbitt completed 78.6% of his passes (11-of-14) against Mississippi State on Oct. 3, 2009.

• A week after the win over UNC, Sims put together one of the most prolific passing performances in school history versus Pitt (Oct. 2), completing 24-of-33 passes for 359 yards and two touchdowns. His 24 completions and 359 passing yards were both career highs, while his .727 completion percentage and two touchdown passes both rank second in his collegiate career.

• Sims' 359 passing yards against Pitt were the eighth-most by an individual in Georgia Tech history, and the most by a Yellow Jacket since George Godsey threw for a school-record 486 yards against Virginia on Nov. 10, 2001.

RUNNING BACKS

• For the second-straight season, Georgia Tech is deploying a three-headed monster at running back in r-Jr. **Dontae Smith**, r-Jr. **Dylan McDuffie** and Sr. **Hassan Hall**.

• Through two games this season, the trio has combined for 184 rushing yards and four touchdowns while splitting 40 carries (20 carries for 132 yards and three touchdowns for Smith, 11 carries for 39 yards for McDuffie and nine carries for 22 yards for Hall).

• The trio has also combined to catch nine passes out of the backfield through two games (three receptions apiece).

• Smith turned in the best performance of his career when he exploded for 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns on just 11 carries in last Saturday's win over Western Carolina.

OFFENSE

- The 100-yard rushing game was the first of Smith's career and his 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns were both career highs (prev.: 82 rushing yards vs. Kennesaw State on Sept. 11, 2021 and two rushing touchdowns vs. Duke on Nov. 28, 2020).

- Smith is the only NCAA Division I FBS running back and one of only two FBS players overall to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game this season.

- Smith became the first Georgia Tech running back to run for at least 100 yards and three touchdowns in a game since Synjyn Days ran for 171 yards and three scores in a 49-34 win over No. 8 Mississippi State in the 2014 Orange Bowl (three GT QBs have accomplished the feat during that span — **Jeff Sims** vs. North Carolina, 2022; Tobias Oliver at Virginia Tech, 2018; and TaQuon Marshall vs. Tennessee, 2017).

- Smith is leading Georgia Tech's running backs in yards per rush for the third-straight season — 6.6 this season, 5.6 last season and 6.9 in 2020.

- Smith is averaging a gaudy 6.2 yards per rush for his career (871 yards on 141 carries).

- Smith has scored 10 career touchdowns on just 141 carries (one TD every 14.1 carries).

- McDuffie came to Georgia Tech after rushing for 1,049 yards last season at Buffalo, en route to third-team all-Mid-American Conference honors.

- McDuffie's 2-yard touchdown run last Saturday against Western Carolina was his first as a Yellow Jacket.

- McDuffie is used to being a part of a three-man rotation at RB, as he was one of three backs to rush for at least 400 yards for the Bulls in 2021.

- McDuffie averaged 5.2 yards per carry over his four seasons at Buffalo (2018-21), including three seasons with at least 5.0 yards per carry (5.0 in 2018, 6.5 in 2019, 5.1 in 2021).

- An Atlanta native, Hall returned home after amassing 3,843 all-purpose yards (1,299 rushing, 175 receiving, 2,369 kickoff return) and 13 touchdowns (11 rushing, two kickoff return) in his four seasons at Louisville.

- Hall earned second-team all-ACC honors as an all-purpose back and third-team recognition as a return specialist as a sophomore in 2019, when he rushed for 501 yards and five touchdowns, caught 12 passes for 99 yards and averaged 30.5 yards per kickoff return (good for third nationally).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech's wide receivers corps is led by sixth-year senior **Malachi Carter**.

- Carter tops Georgia Tech's roster with 49 career games. He needs to play in just six more games this season to break Tech's all-time record for games played in a career of 54, which is currently shared by Jamal Golden (2011-15), Jemea Thomas (2009, '11-13), T.J. Barnes (2009-12) and Rod Sweeting (2009-12).

- With 1,121 career receiving yards, Carter needs just 4 yards to move into Georgia Tech's all-time top 20 for career receiving yards. He would become the first Yellow Jacket to rank among Tech's all-time top 20 in receiving yards since Ricky Jeune, who ranks 13th in school history with 1,492 receiving yards from 2015-17.

- Last season, Carter led Georgia Tech in receiving yards (489) and receptions (37) and ranked second on the team in yards per reception (13.2 - min. 10 receptions).

- So. WR **Nate McCollum** set career highs with six receptions and 55 receiving yards in this season's opener against No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 10). He surpassed his previous career highs of three receptions (2X – most recently at Virginia on 10/23/2021) and receiving yards (49 vs. Pitt on 10/2/2021) in the first half of the opener against Clemson.

- Last Saturday against Western Carolina, McCollum set a career high with 47 rushing yards (prev.: 7 vs. Duke – Nov. 28, 2020), highlighted by his first-career rushing touchdown, which came from 40 yards out on a reverse.

- r-Sr. WR **E.J. Jenkins**' 13-yard touchdown reception against Clemson (Sept. 5) was the second of his career at the NCAA Division I FBS level (prev.: 16-yarder vs. Troy, playing for South Carolina on 10/2/2021). Prior to playing at South Carolina in 2021, Jenkins played at FCS St. Francis (Pa.) from 2017-20.

- Jenkins' three receptions against Clemson were tied for second on the team behind McCollum's six while Jenkins' 34 receiving yards were second on the squad behind McCollum's 55.

TIGHT ENDS

- In 2019, Georgia Tech reintroduced the tight end position to its offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position going into the 2019 season was **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn, who wound up catching 17 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown for Tech in '19.

- Davis went on to become the first Georgia Tech tight end selected in the NFL Draft in 28 years (since Tom Covington — San Francisco 49ers, 1992) when the Jacksonville Jaguars took him with their sixth-round pick (No. 206 overall) in the 2020 draft. No Tech tight end has ever been selected higher in the NFL Draft than Davis, who is now a member of the Green Bay Packers.

- Georgia Tech's current tight ends room is led by **Dylan Leonard**, who is in his fourth season with the Yellow Jackets.

- Leonard, a former walk-on, has caught 16 passes for 141 yards over 29 games and 12 starts as a Yellow Jacket.

- Leonard set career highs for receiving yards in three-consecutive games to close last season, with three catches for 21 yards vs. Boston College (Nov. 13), two catches for 28 yards at No. 6 Notre Dame (Nov. 20) and two catches for 43 yards against No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 27).

- Leonard has missed the Yellow Jackets' first two games of the season due to injury.

- The Jackets' tight ends were bolstered in the offseason by the arrival of **Luke Benson**, who played in 34-of-35 games over the past three seasons at Syracuse and caught 19 passes for 261 yards and five touchdowns with the Orange.

- Benson earned third-team freshman all-America honors from *Pro Football Focus* after catching eight passes for 176 yards and three touchdowns as a true freshman in 2019.

- Benson has caught three passes for 28 yards in his first two games with the Yellow Jackets.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- One of the youngest overall positions on Georgia Tech's roster, the offensive linemen on Tech's 2022 roster have combined for just 113 collegiate games played and 48 starts.

- Three Georgia Tech offensive linemen made their first-career starts in the season opener against Clemson (Sept. 5) — r-Fr. RG **Joe Fusile**, So. C **Weston Franklin** and r-Fr. LT **Corey Robinson II**.

- Last Saturday versus Western Carolina, r-So. LG **Pierce Quick** made his first-career start.

- Despite the lack of experience, Georgia Tech's offensive line is tied for 25th nationally and third in the ACC with just two sacks allowed through two games this season.

- Georgia Tech is on pace to surrender just 12 regular-season sacks this season (1.0/gm). Last season, the Yellow Jackets allowed 33 sacks (2.75/gm), which ranked 102nd nationally.

DEFENSE

TEAM

• Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past nine seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18) and Georgia Tech.

- Over the past 11 seasons, Collins' defenses have:
 - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
 - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
 - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
 - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
 - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained six times (twice in top 6)
 - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
 - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

• Through two games this season, Georgia Tech ranks among the nation's top 20 in three different defensive statistical categories and the in top 35 nationally in five.

• The uptick in sacks and tackles for loss this season is especially encouraging for a unit that ranked 98th (1.67/gm) and 89th (5.2/gm), respectively, in those categories last season.

• Georgia Tech has recorded at least three sacks in each of its first two games of the season (three vs. Clemson on Sept. 5, four last Saturday vs. Western Carolina), which marks the first time since the second and third games of the 2017 season that Tech has had three or more sacks in back-to-back games (five vs. Jacksonville State, three vs. Pitt).

• Another huge turnaround for Georgia Tech's defense this season has been its three interceptions, which all came in last Saturday's win over Western Carolina. Last season, Tech intercepted just three passes the entire season, which ranked 125th out of 130 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

• Georgia Tech has picked up where it left off last season with two fumble recoveries through two games.

• Tech has ranked among the top 25 nationally in fumble recoveries each of the past two seasons — No. 2 nationally with 12 fumble recoveries in 2020 and tied for No. 16 with 10 recoveries in 2021.

• Since the beginning of 2019 (Collins' first season at Georgia Tech), the Yellow Jackets' 32 fumble recoveries are tied for fourth nationally.

• Tech has also ranked among the nation's leaders in total turnovers gained (18 - No. 25 nationally in 2020) and defensive touchdowns (2 - tied for 25th nationally in 2021) over the past two seasons.

• Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 3.1 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 0.9 takeaways per game in losses.

• Yellow Jackets that record takeaways have the opportunity to sign the "Get The Ball Board" on Georgia Tech's sideline. Introduced by Collins when he was the defensive coordinator at Western Carolina in 2002, the "Get The Ball Board" has evolved from players simply adorning the board with their signatures to signing with their social media handles, an incentive that has become even more valuable with the dawn of name, image and likeness opportunities for student-athletes.

• Playing on just four days' rest following its season opener against No. 4 Clemson on Labor Day night, Tech allowed Western Carolina to score touchdowns on each of its first two possessions last Saturday, but rallied to keep WCU out of the end zone for the final 50:37 of the Yellow Jackets' 35-17 win.

• Tech only allowed Western Carolina to cross midfield three times in its final 11 possessions of last Saturday's game. The Catamounts only got inside the Yellow Jackets' 35 yard line once during those final 11 possessions.

• Tech's defense forced four turnovers, a turnover on downs and three punts while surrendering only a fourth-quarter field goal over WCU's final 11 possessions.

• The Jackets' four takeaways against WCU were their most in a game since they forced five turnovers in a 56-33 win over Duke on Nov. 28, 2020 and marked only the third time since 2015 that they have recorded at least four takeaways in a game.

• Georgia Tech's three interceptions last Saturday against WCU were its most in a game since it had three in a 38-28 win at North Carolina on Nov. 3, 2018.

• Georgia Tech's defense turned in a solid performance in last Monday's season opener against No. 4 Clemson, especially for the first two-and-a-half quarters of the game.

• Tech's defense forced five punts (including four three-and-outs) and a turnover on the Clemson's first eight possessions of last Monday's ballgame. The Tigers averaged just 18.5 yards per possession over those first eight series.

• The Yellow Jackets also limited Clemson to just four plays of 20 or more yards and none longer than 29 yards. Over the last six games of last season, Tech opponents averaged 7.2 offensive plays of 20-plus yards and 3.3 plays of 30-plus yards per contest.

• For the first month of last season, Georgia Tech's defense was one of the top units in the country statistically, as it ranked in the top 35 nationally in seven different statistical categories through four games.

• However, the Yellow Jackets' defense went through perhaps the most challenging stretch in all of college football over the last nine games of last season, highlighted by facing five teams that finished ranked among the top 30 nationally in total offense — No. 11 North Carolina, No. 2 Pitt, No. 31 Duke, No. 5 Virginia, No. 28 Miami (Fla.) and No. 26 Georgia.

• Additionally, during that same stretch, the Jackets faced four quarterbacks that ranked among the 20 nationally and five QBs that ranked among the top 40 nationally in passing efficiency — No. 4 Stetson Bennett (Jr. - Georgia), No. 8 Kenny Pickett (Sr. - Pitt), No. 13 Tyler Van Dyke (So. - Miami), No. 17 Brennan Armstrong (Jr. - Virginia), No. 18 Sam Howell (Jr. - North Carolina) and No. 37 Jack Coan (Sr. - Notre Dame).

• Georgia Tech's defensive struggles in the second half of last season can be attributed in large part to explosive plays.

Oct. 30 vs. Virginia Tech

• Against Virginia Tech, nearly half of the yards that Georgia Tech allowed (232-of-491) came on just six plays. On VT's other 72 snaps, Georgia Tech surrendered just 3.6 yards per play (259 total yards) while keeping the Hokies out of the end zone over the final three quarters of the game.

Nov. 6 at Miami (Fla.)

• Against Miami, the Hurricanes gained 356 of their 563 yards in just 13 plays. The Yellow Jackets allowed just 3.3 yards per play on Miami's other 63 snaps (207 total yards).

Nov. 13 vs. Boston College

• Against Boston College, the Eagles gained 322 of their 505 yards on just 12 plays. BC averaged just 3.8 yards per play on its other 48 snaps (183 total yards).

Nov. 20 at Notre Dame

• For the fourth-straight week, explosive plays were Tech's downfall on defense at No. 6 Notre Dame, as the Fighting Irish gained 371 of their 514 yards on just 13 plays. ND averaged just 3.1 yards per play on its other 46 snaps.

• Eley, who made 11 starts over three seasons at Maryland, was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection as a sophomore in 2019 after recording 79 tackles, four tackles for loss, a half-sack, two fumble recoveries, an interception and five passes defended in 11 games (nine starts).

• Eley was one of only three Power Five conference players to record at least 75 tackles, four TFL, two fumble recoveries and five passes defended in 2019, joining Miami's Shaq Quarterman and Utah's Terrell Burgess.

• Sr. LB **Charlie Thomas** also had a strong start to the 2022 season, especially considering he has played the equivalent of less than five quarters through two games due to being disqualified from the season opener vs. No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5) due to a third-quarter targeting penalty, then being forced to sit out the first half of last Saturday's game against Western Carolina as a result of the penalty.

• In less than five quarters of play, Thomas has racked up 18 tackles, two tackles for loss, a sack and an interception.

• In the second half of last Saturday's game against WCU alone, Thomas had eight tackles with two tackles for loss, a sack and an interception.

• Despite playing just one half against WCU, Thomas became the first Georgia Tech player and only the 16th ACC player since 2000 with at least eight tackles, two TFL, a sack and an interception in a single game.

• Georgia Tech has received the much-anticipated services of a healthy **Keion White** this season, as the r-Sr. DL is tied for the ACC lead and for fifth nationally with three sacks this season (1.5/gm).

• White, who was limited to just four games and four total tackles due to an injury last season, tied for 10th in NCAA Division I FBS with 19 tackles for loss at Old Dominion in 2019.

• White had 2.0 sacks in his first extensive playing time with the Yellow Jackets in the season opener against Clemson (Sept. 5). He became one of only three Yellow Jackets to record two or more sacks in a game since the beginning of last season (Thomas – 2.5 and **Kyle Kennard** – 2.0 vs. North Carolina, 9/25/2021 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium).

• White represented Georgia Tech on The Athletics' Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks List" this season due to the 6-5, 286-pounder's ability to run at 21 miles per hour and bench press 225 pounds 38 times, along with a 32-inch vertical jump.

• r-Jr. DBs **Derrik Allen** and **Myles Sims** both recorded the first interceptions of their collegiate careers last Saturday against Western Carolina.

• Thomas' interception against WCU was the third of his career. The previous two both came in last season's 45-17 win over Kennesaw State (Sept. 11, 2021).

SPECIAL TEAMS

• After ranking 10th in the ACC and 68th nationally in kick-off returns and last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns last season, Georgia Tech is off to an encouraging start in the return game in 2022.

• Through two games, Tech ranks second in the ACC and 13th nationally in punt returns (17.0 avg.) and sixth in the ACC and 46th nationally in kickoff returns (22.33 avg.).

• Individually, So. **Nate McCollum** ranks second in the ACC and seventh nationally in punt return average (17.0 avg.) and Sr. **Hassan Hall** ranks 30th nationally in kickoff return average (22.3 avg.).

• After having never played in an American football game prior to the season opener, So. P **David Shanahan** averaged a solid 41.5 yards per punt over 61 attempts as a true freshman in 2021.

• In two games as a sophomore (only the 13th and 14th American football games of his life), Shanahan has taken his game to the next level, as he ranks second in the ACC and 16th nationally in punting at 45.4 yards per punt.

• Of Shanahan's 11 punts this season, four have traveled 50 or more yards and three have been downed inside the opponent's 20 yard line.

• Shanahan averaged a whopping 52.7 yards per punt in his debut against Northern Illinois last season (Sept. 4, 2021), which is tied for the seventh-best single-game punting average in Georgia Tech history.

• Georgia Tech So. PK **Gavin Stewart** has picked up right where he left off in 2021 by forcing touchbacks on seven of his nine kickoffs through two games this season.

• Last season, Stewart put 36 of his 52 kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks last season, while nine others were fair-caught and only seven were returned.

• r-Fr. PK **Jude Kelley's** 45-yard field goal against Clemson (Sept. 5) was a career long, surpassing his 32-yard game-winner against Florida State as a true freshman in 2020, and the longest by a Georgia Tech kicker since Wesley Wells' 48-yarder vs. Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018.

• Kelley is an astounding 5-for-5 for his career on onside kick attempts, including 3-for-3 last season.

• On the strength of three outstanding fourth-quarter kickoffs in Georgia Tech's 48-40 loss at Virginia last season (Oct. 23, 2021) – including two successful onside kicks in the final 80 seconds of the game – Kelley was named the ACC Specialist of the Week.

• Kelley perfectly executed a pair of onside kicks – one with 1:16 remaining in the game and one with 20 seconds to go – that helped the Yellow Jackets nearly erase a 21-point deficit in the final four minutes of their 48-40 defeat at UVA.

• Thanks in large part to the successful onside kicks, which were recovered by **Malachi Carter** and Juanyeh Thomas, respectively, Tech was able to rally from a 48-27 deficit with 3:50 remaining in the game to cut it 48-40 and had the ball at the UVA 31 yard line as time expired.

• Earlier in the fourth quarter at Virginia, Kelley also executed a perfectly placed sky kick that pinned UVA at its own 4 yard line.

• Kelley and the Yellow Jackets also pulled off a perfectly executed onside kick in the fourth quarter of its upset bid at No. 6 Clemson (Sept. 18). With the Yellow Jackets trailing 14-6 with 1:19 to go in the ballgame, Kelley's onside kick was recovered by Carter to give the Jackets possession with an opportunity to tie the game (Tech drove 51 yards in 1:04 after recovering the onside kick, but its potential game-tying drive stalled at the 1 yard line with 15 seconds left on the clock).

• As a team, Georgia Tech has had six successful onside kicks in its last 22 games. The Yellow Jackets also recovered two onside kicks by Kelley in 2020 against Notre Dame (Oct. 31) and Boston College (Oct. 24), as well as one by former GT PK Brenton King in the 2019 season finale versus Georgia (Nov. 30).

• Head coach **Geoff Collins** states repeatedly that special teams are the No. 1 priority within Georgia Tech's program, a philosophy that is highlighted by the fact that a student-athlete cannot earn playing time on offense or defense if they aren't able to contribute on special teams.

• The emphasis on special teams has paid dividends since his arrival in 2019, most notably in blocked kicks.

• Georgia Tech has blocked four kicks in the last 30 games.

• Prior to blocking four kicks in the past 30 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 23 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the 11th-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• The nation's most blocked kicks over the past nine seasons (since 2013) belong to Temple (34). Six of those came in the last two seasons of Collins' tenure as the Owls' head coach (2017-18). Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

MISCELLANEOUS

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the past two seasons. In their seven wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in six of seven games and are plus-13 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 14 of its 17 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-20 overall in turnover margin in those 17 losses.

• Through two games this season, Georgia Tech ranks fourth in the ACC and 16th nationally in turnover margin at plus-three (1.5/gm). The Yellow Jackets are 15th nationally in takeaways (5) and 36th nationally in fewest giveaways (2).

• Georgia Tech fields one of the nation's youngest teams in 2022, as 79.4% of its roster is comprised of underclassmen, which is the highest percentage among Power Five conference teams and the second-highest overall in NCAA Division I FBS (credit: University of Colorado).
