- Georgia Tech resumes Atlantic Coast Conference play on Saturday when it visits No. 24 Pitt.
- Georgia Tech (1-3, 0-1 ACC) is facing a nationally ranked opponent for the fifth time in its last six games against NCAA Division I FBS teams (last season at No. 6 Notre Dame, vs. No. 1 Georgia, this season vs. No. 4 Clemson, vs. No. 20/17 Ole
- The Yellow Jackets are making their first visit to ACC Coastal Division rival Pitt since 2018. The Jackets hosted Pitt each of the last three seasons, as the Panthers made regularly scheduled trips to Atlanta in 2019 and 2021 and also visited Tech in 2020 as part of the ACC's revamped schedule amid the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner Brent Key makes his debut as the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach on Saturday. Key took the reins as the Jackets' interim head coach on Monday when Geoff Collins left the role as head coach. Key is the sixth Tech alum to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach and the first since Bill Curry (1980-86).
- In its last game, Georgia Tech outgained UCF, 452-333, and averaged 7.2 yards per play versus just 4.6 for the Knights, in a 27-10 loss. It marked the 24th time since 2000 that Tech averaged at least seven yards per play and held its opponent to five yards per play or less but the first time in those 24 contests that the Yellow Jackets lost.
- Tech linebacker Ayinde Eley continues to put together a historic season, as he is the only NCAA Division I FBS player since at least 2000 to record at many as 42 tackles, six tackles for loss, two sacks, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries over the first four games of a campaign.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

LB Ayinde Eley is the first NCAA Division I FBS player since at least 2000 with at many as 42 tackles, six tackles for loss, two sacks, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries through the first four games of the season.

LB Charlie Thomas is one of only two NCAA Division I FBS players with 38 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and an interception through three games this season (joining Washington State's Daiyan Henley). Thomas is one of only nine FBS players and two ACC players since 2000 to record those numbers through the first four games of a season.

Jeff Sims is in his third season as Georgia Tech's starting quarterback. He is the first Tech signal-caller to start three-straight season openers since Justin Thomas from 2014-16.

Georgia Tech's offense has only turned the ball over four times through four games this season, which marks only the sixth time since 2000 that the Yellow Jackets have had four turnovers or less through four games (2001, 2006, 2007, 2014, 2021 and 2022).

Dontae Smith is one of only five NCAA Division I FBS players overall and three running backs to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game this season, which he did with 102 yards and three scores on 11 carries against Western Carolina on Sept. 10, joining Florida QB Anthony Richardson (vs. Utah - Sept. 3), West Virginia RB C.J. Donaldson (vs. Towson - Sept. 17), UCLA RB Zach Charbonnet (at Colorado - Sept. 24) and Louisville QB Malik Cunningham (vs. USF - Sept. 24).

Brent Key is the sixth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

Georgia Tech's defense has racked up 33 tackles for loss through four games, which is its most through four contests since it totaled 39 TFL during the first three games of the 2007 campaign. The Yellow Jackets are on pace for 99 tackles for loss during the regular season, which would be their second-most in any regular season since 2000 (Tech had 111 TFL during the '07 regular season).

GEORGIA TECH INTERIM HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was named the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022.

Prior to being named interim head coach, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his first three seasons back at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, a pair of all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch. The Yellow Jackets averaged 169 yards per game on the ground in '21, with running back Jahmyr Gibbs rushing for 746 yards en route to all-America honors and tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game). With a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle, two more true freshmen (QB Jeff Sims and Gibbs) were the leading rushers in the Yellow Jackets' No. 4-ranked ACC rushing offense.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

As a four-year starting right guard at Georgia Tech from 1997-2000, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the Atlantic Coast Conference in rushing three times. During Key's junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg).

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks — tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He is tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 6 Baylor. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004 (when Collins was WCU's defensive coordinator).

While making 44 starts at right guard for the Yellow Jackets from 1997-2000, Key was part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. He was voted a team captain and named all-ACC as a senior in 2000. Collins was a graduate assistant on Georgia Tech's staff during Key's junior and senior seasons and, when Collins was promoted to tight ends coach in 2001, Key filled the G.A. spot that Collins vacated.

Key earned a bachelor's degree in management from GT in 2001

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 42, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, are parents to a daughter, Harper.

GEORGIA TECH-PITT SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia Tech and Pitt are meeting for the 17th time overall and the 0th time since the Panthers joined the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2013.
- Pitt leads the overall series, which dates back to 1918, 11-5.
- The Yellow Jackets are 3-6 against the Panthers since Pitt joined the ACC in '13.
- Pitt's current four-game winning streak against Georgia
 Tech is the longest winning streak for either team in series history.
- Four of the last seven meetings between Georgia Tech and Pitt have been decided by 10 points or less (GT is 0-5 in those tight games).
- Prior to becoming conference-mates in 2013, Pitt had won all five regular-season meetings with Georgia Tech (1918, 1919, 1920, 1974 and 1976) but the Yellow Jackets had won both postseason matchups (in the 1956 Sugar Bowl - following the 1955 season - and in the 1956 Gator Bowl).
- Pitt's 32-0 win over Tech on Nov. 23, 1918 (the firstever meeting between the schools) snapped a 33-game unbeaten streak for Head Coach John Heisman's Golden Tornado (as Tech's teams were known at the time).
- Georgia Tech and Pitt are two of college football's all-time winningest programs. Pitt ranks 19th in NCAA Division I FBS history with 752 all-time wins while Georgia Tech is 21st with 744 victories.
- In an odd schedule twist caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, Georgia Tech is traveling to Pittsburgh for first time since 2018
- As ACC Coastal Division rivals, Pitt is scheduled to play at Georgia Tech in odd years. However, in 2020, Notre Dame joined the ACC for one season, divisions were scrapped and the schedule was rearranged due to Covid-19. The scrambled schedule saw Pitt travel to Tech for a secondstraight year.
- The ACC returned to its pre-Covid schedule format for 2021, which left Pitt playing GT in Atlanta for a thirdconsecutive season.
- Prior to last season, Georgia Tech had never previously hosted an ACC opponent for three-straight seasons. In fact, the Jackets have only hosted ACC opponents in consecutive seasons on three occasions — Wake Forest in 1991 and '92, Virginia in 1993 and '94 and Pitt in 2019 and '20/'20 and '21.

OFFENSE

- The continued transformation of Georgia Tech's offense from an option scheme to a pro-style spread attack received a boost this offseason with the hire of four new assistant coaches on the offensive side of the ball, highlighted by offensive coordinator **Chip Long**.
- A 16-year Division I coaching veteran, including 14 at the major-conference level, Long has helped lead teams to 13 bowl games over the past 16 seasons. He has five years of experience as offensive coordinator, including ultra-successful stints at Memphis (2016) and Notre Dame (2017-19).
- Among all currently active offensive coordinators, Long was the sixth-highest-rated OC in the nation during his four-year stint with Memphis and ND, according to analytics produced by *SportsSource Analytics/Coaches By The Numbers*. Among current offensive coordinators, Long is one of only four OCs to receive a five-star rating from *Coaches By The Numbers* from 2016-19, joining Oklahoma's Bill Bedenbaugh, Ohio State's Kevin Wilson and Penn State's Mike Yurcich.
- Through four games with Long at the helm of the Yellow Jackets' offense, Georgia Tech is tied for 29th nationally and third in the ACC with just four turnovers (1.0 per game).
- Tech also ranks in the top 35 nationally in fewest fumbles lost (2 34th) and fewest passes intercepted (2 35th).
- The Yellow Jackets' ball protection marks quite the turnaround from just two seasons ago, when they ranked 125th out of 127 teams nationally with 25 turnovers (2.5 per game) in 2020. The Jackets improved to 44th nationally with 15 turnovers last season (1.25 per game).
- Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has had an average of 1.3 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.8 turnovers per game in losses.
- The Yellow Jackets' offense broke out for 452 yards of total offense last Saturday at UCF, their highest yardage total in a single game since they had 570 yards in a 48-40 loss at Virginia on Oct. 23 of last season.
- Georgia Tech's 452 total yards against UCF were 180 more than the Knights had previously allowed on average this season. UCF's 271.3 yards allowed per game ranked 19th nationally going into last weekend.
- Tech's 314 passing yards against UCF were 192 more than the Knights had previously allowed on average this season. UCF's 121.7 passing yards allowed per game ranked seventh nationally going into last weekend.
- Georgia Tech, which entered last Saturday's game at UCF with just five offensive plays that gained 20 or more yards this season, had nine offensive plays that gained 20 or more yards against the Knights.
- The Yellow Jackets' 59-yard touchdown pass from So. QB Jeff Sims to Sr. WR Malachi Carter was Tech's longest play of the season and the longest play allowed by UCF this season.
- Georgia Tech has totaled at least 400 yards of offense in 12-of-26 games dating back to the beginning of the 2020 season. Prior to the beginning of the 2020 season, the Jackets had gone 16 games without compiling 400 yards of total offense (dating back to Nov. 3, 2018).
- Since the beginning of the 2019 season, Tech's seven games with at least 260 rushing yards is tied for fourth-most in the ACC (North Carolina 10; Boston College 8; Clemson 8; Virginia Tech 8; **Georgia Tech 7**; Syracuse 7).

- In the passing game, Georgia Tech's 23 completions against No. 4 Clemson on Sept. 5 were its sixth-most in a game over the past 20 seasons.
- Georgia Tech's 21 completions against UCF last Saturday were its eighth-most in a game in the last 20 years.
- Twenty of the Yellow Jackets' 26 highest completion totals since the beginning of the 2002 season have come in their last 35 games.

- **Jeff Sims** is in his third season as Georgia Tech's starting quarterback.
- Sims is the first Georgia Tech signal-caller to start threestraight season openers since Justin Thomas (2014-16).
- In 2020, Sims became the first true freshman to start the season at quarterback for Georgia Tech since Reggie Ball in 2003.
- In just 21 collegiate games (he was limited to 10 games in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic and seven last season due to injury), Sims has accounted for 5,063 yards of total offense (4,088 passing, 975 rushing) and 37 touchdowns (27 passing, 10 rushing).
- In the season opener against No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5), Sims moved into Georgia Tech's all-time top 10, now currently with 5,063 yards of total offense.
- Sims also ranks eighth in Georgia Tech history in passing yards, tied for seventh in touchdown passes, seventh in completions (324) and fourth in completion percentage (.577).

RUNNING BACKS

- For the second-straight season, Georgia Tech is deploying a three-headed monster at running back in r-Jr. **Dontae Smith**, r-Jr. **Dylan McDuffie** and Sr. **Hassan Hall**.
- Through four games this season, the trio has combined for 335 rushing yards and four touchdowns while splitting 58 carries (32 carries for 191 yards and three touchdowns for Smith, 24 carries for 103 yards for Hall and 20 carries for 41 yards for McDuffie).
- The trio has also combined to catch 18 passes out of the backfield through four games (seven receptions for Hall, six for Smith and five for McDuffie).
- Smith turned in the best performance of his career when he exploded for 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns on just 11 carries in Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Western Carolina (Sept. 10).
- The 100-yard rushing game was the first of Smith's career and his 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns were both career highs (prev.: 82 rushing yards vs. Kennesaw State on Sept. 11, 2021 and two rushing touchdowns vs. Duke on Nov. 28, 2020).
- Smith is one of only five NCAA Division I FBS players (and one of three running backs) to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game this season

- Against WCU, Smith became the first Georgia Tech running back to run for at least 100 yards and three touchdowns in a game since Synjyn Days ran for 171 yards and three scores in a 49-34 win over No. 8 Mississippi State in the 2014 Orange Bowl (three GT QBs have accomplished the feat during that span — **Jeff Sims** vs. North Carolina, 2022; Tobias Oliver at Virginia Tech, 2018; and TaQuon Marshall vs. Tennessee, 2017).
- Smith is leading Georgia Tech's running backs in yards per rush for the third-straight season 6.0 this season, 5.6 last season and 6.9 in 2020.
- Smith is averaging a gaudy 6.1 yards per rush for his career (930 yards on 153 carries).
- Smith has scored 10 career touchdowns on just 153 carries (one TD every 15.3 carries).
- McDuffie's 2-yard touchdown run against Western Carolina (Sept. 10) was his first as a Yellow Jacket.
- Smith also ranks at the high end of above-average runners nationally, according to *Pro Football Focus*, which has given him a team-high 78.2 grade as a rusher through four games this season. (*Grades from 68-78 are considered above average in PFF's grading scale*)
- PFF also ranks Smith as firmly above average as an overall offensive player with a team-best 72.7 offensive grade.
- McDuffie came to Georgia Tech after rushing for 1,049 yards last season at Buffalo, en route to third-team all-Mid-American Conference honors.



OFFENSE

- McDuffie is used to being a part of a three-man rotation at RB, as he was one of three backs to rush for at least 400 yards for the Bulls in 2021.
- McDuffie averaged 5.2 yards per carry over his four seasons at Buffalo (2018-21), including three seasons with at least 5.0 yards per carry (5.0 in 2018, 6.5 in 2019, 5.1 in 2021).
- Hall put together his best performance as a Yellow Jacket last Saturday at UCF, when he amassed 164 all-purpose yards (54 rushing, 40 receiving, 70 kickoff return), which was easily the highest total by Georgia Tech player this season (prev.: 107 by Nate McCollum vs. Western Carolina – Sept. 10).
- An Atlanta native, Hall returned home after amassing 3,843 all-purpose yards (1,299 rushing, 175 receiving, 2,369 kickoff return) and 13 touchdowns (11 rushing, two kickoff return) in his four seasons at Louisville.
- Hall earned second-team all-ACC honors as an all-purpose back and third-team recognition as a return specialist as a sophomore in 2019, when he rushed for 501 yards and five touchdowns, caught 12 passes for 99 yards and averaged 30.5 yards per kickoff return (good for third nationally).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech's wide receivers corps is led by sixth-year senior **Malachi Carter**.
- Carter tops Georgia Tech's roster with 51 career games. He needs to play in just four more games this season to break Tech's all-time record for games played in a career of 54, which is currently shared by Jamal Golden (2011-15), Jemea Thomas (2009, '11-13), T.J. Barnes (2009-12) and Rod Sweeting (2009-12).
- With a season-high 89 yards last Saturday at UCF, Carter moved into 18th place all-time at Georgia Tech with 1,228 career receiving yards.
- On Sept. 17 against Ole Miss, Carter became the first Yellow Jacket to move into Tech's all-time top 20 in receiving yards since Ricky Jeune, who ranks 13th in school history with 1,492 receiving yards from 2015-17.

• Last season, Carter led Georgia Tech in receiving yards (489) and receptions (37) and ranked second on the team in yards per reception (13.2 - min. 10 receptions).

- This season, Carter's eight receptions are tied for second on the team while his 153 receiving yards rank second on the squad.
- Carter hauled in his first receiving touchdown of the season on a 59-yard reception from QB **Jeff Sims** last Saturday at UCF.
- The 59-yard TD catch at UCF was the longest reception of Carter's career (prev.: 54 at NC State Nov. 21, 2019).
- So. WR **Nate McCollum** leads Georgia Tech in receptions (18) and receiving yards (158) through four games this season. In just four games, he has already eclipsed his career totals for receptions and receiving yards coming into this season (15 receptions for 123 yards over 18 career games from 2020-21).
- McCollum matched a career high with six receptions last Saturday at UCF, equaling the career-best six catches that he had in the season opener against No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5).
- Against Western Carolina (Sept. 10), McCollum set a career high with 47 rushing yards (prev.: 7 vs. Duke – Nov. 28, 2020), highlighted by his first-career rushing touchdown, which came from 40 yards out on a reverse.
- r-Fr. WR **Malik Rutherford** is tied for second on the team with eight receptions and ranks third on the squad with 93 receiving yards this season. He has already surpassed his total receptions (5) and receiving yardage (62) from a season ago, when he played in three games before redshirting.
- r-Sr. WR **E.J. Jenkins** is tied for fourth on the team with seven receptions and ranks fourth on the squad with 88 receiving yards this season.
- Jenkins' 13-yard touchdown reception against Clemson (Sept. 5) was the second of his career at the NCAA Division I FBS level (prev.: 16-yarder vs. Troy, playing for South Carolina on 10/2/2021). Prior to playing at South Carolina in 2021, Jenkins played at FCS St. Francis (Pa.) from 2017-20.

TIGHT ENDS

- Georgia Tech's tight ends room is led by **Dylan Leonard**, who is in his fourth season with the Yellow Jackets.
- Leonard, a former walk-on, has caught 17 passes for 160 yards over 30 games and 13 starts as a Yellow Jacket.
- Leonard set career highs for receiving yards in three-consecutive games to close last season, with three catches for 21 yards vs. Boston College (Nov. 13), two catches for 28 yards at No. 6 Notre Dame (Nov. 20) and two catches for 43 yards against No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 27).
- Leonard missed the Yellow Jackets' first two games of the season due to injury but made his season debut as a reserve against No. 20/17 Ole Miss (Sept. 17), then made his first start of the season last Saturday at UCF.
- Leonard's 9-yard reception at UCF last Saturday was his first catch of the season.
- The Jackets' tight ends were bolstered in the offseason by the arrival of **Luke Benson**, who played in 34-of-35 games over the past three seasons at Syracuse and caught 19 passes for 261 yards and five touchdowns with the Orange.
- Through four games as a Yellow Jacket, Benson ranks fifth on the team with 47 receiving yards.

• Benson earned third-team freshman all-America honors from *Pro Football Focus* after catching eight passes for 176 yards and three touchdowns as a true freshman in 2019.

OFFENSIVE LINE

 One of the youngest overall positions on Georgia Tech's roster, the offensive linemen on Tech's 2022 roster have combined for just 129 collegiate games played and 57 starts.

- Georgia Tech recorded at least three sacks in each of its first two games of the season (three vs. Clemson on Sept. 5, four vs. Western Carolina on Sept. 10), which marked the first time since the second and third games of the 2017 season that Tech has had three or more sacks in back-toback games (five vs. Jacksonville State, three vs. Pitt).
- Another huge turnaround for Georgia Tech's defense this season has been its five interceptions through four games, which has already surpassed its total from all of last season (3), when Tech ranked 125th out of 130 NCAA Division I FBS teams in INTs.
- Georgia Tech has picked up where it left off last year with three fumble recoveries through four games season.
- Tech has ranked among the top 25 nationally in fumble recoveries each of the past two seasons — No. 2 nationally with 12 fumble recoveries in 2020 and tied for No. 16 with 10 recoveries in 2021.
- Since the beginning of 2019, the Yellow Jackets' 33 fumble recoveries are tied for fifth nationally.

- Tech has also ranked among the nation's leaders in total turnovers gained (18 No. 25 nationally in 2020) and defensive touchdowns (2 tied for 25th nationally in 2021) over the past two seasons.

- Last Saturday against UCF, Georgia Tech's defense limited UCF's high-powered offense to just 333 yards, which was 198 yards fewer than it was previously averaging this season. UCF's 532.3 yards per game ranked sixth nationally going into last weekend.
- UCF's 4.6 yards per play was its lowest yards-per-play average in any game under head coach Guz Malzahn, who took the helm at UCF prior to the 2021 season.
- Playing on just four days' rest following its season opener against No. 4 Clemson on Labor Day night, Tech allowed Western Carolina to score touchdowns on each of its first two possessions, but rallied to keep WCU out of the end zone for the final 50:37 of the Yellow Jackets' 35-17 win (Sept. 10).
- Tech only allowed Western Carolina to cross midfield three times in its final 11 possessions. The Catamounts only got inside the Yellow Jackets' 35 yard line once during those final 11 possessions.
- Tech's defense forced four turnovers, a turnover on downs and three punts while surrendering only a fourth-quarter field goal over WCU's final 11 possessions.
- The Jackets' four takeaways against WCU were their most in a game since they forced five turnovers in a 56-33 win over Duke on Nov. 28, 2020 and marked only the third time since 2015 that they have recorded at least four takeaways in a game.

- Georgia Tech's three interceptions against WCU were its most in a game since it had three in a 38-28 win at North Carolina on Nov. 3, 2018.
- Georgia Tech's defense turned in a solid performance in the season opener against No. 4 Clemson, especially for the first two-and-a-half quarters of the game.

- Tech's defense forced five punts (including four three-andouts) and a turnover on the Clemson's first eight possessions. The Tigers averaged just 18.5 yards per possession over those first eight series.
- The Yellow Jackets also limited Clemson to just four plays of 20 or more yards and none longer than 29 yards. Over the last six games of last season, Tech opponents averaged 7.2 offensive plays of 20-plus yards and 3.3 plays of 30-plus yards per contest.
- For the first month of last season, Georgia Tech's defense was one of the top units in the country statistically, as it ranked in the top 35 nationally in seven different statistical categories through four games.
- However, the Yellow Jackets' defense went through perhaps the most challenging stretch in all of college football over the last nine games of last season, highlighted by facing five teams that finished ranked among the top 30 nationally in total offense — No. 11 North Carolina, No. 2 Pitt, No. 31 Duke, No. 5 Virginia, No. 28 Miami (Fla.) and No. 26 Georgia.
- Additionally, during that same stretch, the Jackets faced four quarterbacks that ranked among the 20 nationally and five QBs that ranked among the top 40 nationally in passing efficiency No. 4 Stetson Bennett (Jr. Georgia), No. 8 Kenny Pickett (Sr. Pitt), No. 13 Tyler Van Dyke (So. Miami), No. 17 Brennan Armstrong (Jr. Virginia), No. 18 Sam Howell (Jr. North Carolina) and No. 37 Jack Coan (Sr. Notre Dame).
- Georgia Tech's defensive struggles in the second half of last season can be attributed in large part to explosive plays.

Oct. 30 vs. Virginia Tech

 Against Virginia Tech, nearly half of the yards that Georgia Tech allowed (232-of-491) came on just six plays. On VT's other 72 snaps, Georgia Tech surrendered just 3.6 yards per play (259 total yards) while keeping the Hokies out of the end zone over the final three quarters of the game.

Nov. 6 at Miami (Fla.)

• Against Miami, the Hurricanes gained 356 of their 563 yards in just 13 plays. The Yellow Jackets allowed just 3.3 yards per play on Miami's other 63 snaps (207 total yards).

Nov. 13 vs. Boston College

• Against Boston College, the Eagles gained 322 of their 505 yards on just 12 plays. BC averaged just 3.8 yards per play on its other 48 snaps (183 total yards).

Nov. 20 at Notre Dame

- Clemson, who scored just 14 points in 39 minutes prior to Thomas' disqualification in the season opener (Sept. 5), scored 27 points in 21 minutes after Thomas left the game.
- Last Saturday at UCF, the Knights scored just 16 points through 49 miniutes with Thomas on the field, but scored 11 points in the final 11 minutes of the game after Thomas was once again disqualified due to a targeting call early in the fourth quarter.
- Thomas was a force to be reckoned with throughout the 2021 season, particularly during Georgia Tech's three-game stretch that included games vs. Kennesaw State (Sept. 11), at No. 6 Clemson (Sept. 18) and vs. No. 21/20 North Carolina (Sept. 25).
- In last season's romp over No. 21/20 UNC and its potent offense at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, Thomas recorded 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles, en route to being named ACC co-Linebacker of the Week.
- Thomas was one of only three student-athletes from a Power Five conference and five NCAA Division I FBS players overall with 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles in a game in 2021.

- Georgia Tech has received the much-anticipated services of a healthy **Keion White** this season, as the r-Sr. DL is tied for the ACC lead and for 11th nationally with four sacks this season (1.0/gm).
- White, who was limited to just four games and four total tackles due to an injury last season, tied for 10th in NCAA Division I FBS with 19 tackles for loss at Old Dominion in 2019
- White had 2.0 sacks in his first extensive playing time with the Yellow Jackets in the season opener against Clemson (Sept. 5). He became one of only three Yellow Jackets to record two or more sacks in a game since the beginning of last season (Thomas 2.5 and **Kyle Kennard** 2.0 vs. North Carolina, 9/25/2021 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium).
- White represented Georgia Tech on *The Athletic*'s Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks List" this season due to the 6-5, 286-pounder's ability to run at 21 miles per hour and bench press 225 pounds 38 times, along with a 32-inch vertical jump.
- So. DB **LaMiles Brooks** recorded the first interception of his collegiate career last Saturday at UCF.
- r-Jr. DB **Jaylon King** recorded the first interception of his collegiate career against No. 20/17 Ole Miss (Sept. 17).
- r-Jr. DBs **Derrik Allen** and **Myles Sims** both recorded the first interceptions of their collegiate careers against Western Carolina (Sept. 10).
- Thomas' interception against WCU was the third of his career. The previous two both came in last season's 45-17 win over Kennesaw State (Sept. 11, 2021).
- Six defensive players that have played at least 100 snaps for Georgia Tech this season have above average defensive grades for the season from *Pro Football Focus* DB **LaMiles Brooks** (78.6), DL **Sylvain Yondjouen** (75.4), LB **Ayinde Eley** (73.7), DL **Keion White** (69.4), DL **D'Quan Douse** (72.0) and DB **Miles Sims** (69.5). (Grades from 68-78 are considered above average in PFF's grading scale)

SPECIAL TEAMS

- After ranking 10th in the ACC and 68th nationally in kickoff returns and last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns last season, Georgia Tech is off to an encouraging start in the return game in 2022.
- Through four games, Tech ranks second in the ACC and 10th nationally in punt returns (17.0 avg.) and fourth in the ACC and 14th nationally in kickoff returns (27.4 avg.).
- Individually, So. **Nate McCollum** ranks second in the ACC in punt return average (17.0 avg.) and Sr. **Hassan Hall** ranks second in the ACC and 12th nationally in kickoff return average (27.4 avg.).
- McCollum's 17.0-yard punt return average would be tied for 10th nationally if he met the minimum number of returns to be included in the official NCAA rankings (1.2 returns per game are needed; McCollum currently averages 1.0 return per game).
- After having never played in an American football game prior to the season opener, So. P **David Shanahan** averaged a solid 41.5 yards per punt over 61 attempts as a true freshman in 2021.
- In four games as a sophomore (only the 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th American football games of his life), Shanahan has taken his game to the next level, as he ranks third in the ACC and 30th nationally in punting at 44.4 yards per punt.
- Of Shanahan's 22 punts this season, seven have traveled 50 or more yards and five have been downed inside the opponent's 20 yard line.
- Shanahan averaged a whopping 52.7 yards per punt in his debut against Northern Illinois last season (Sept. 4, 2021), which is tied for the seventh-best single-game punting average in Georgia Tech history.

 Georgia Tech So. PK Gavin Stewart has picked up right where he left off in 2021 by forcing touchbacks on seven of his nine kickoffs through two games this season (he's missed the last two weeks due to injury).

- Last season, Stewart put 36 of his 52 kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks last season, while nine others were fair-caught and only seven were returned.
- r-Fr. PK **Jude Kelley's** 45-yard field goal against Clemson (Sept. 5) was a career long, surpassing his 32-yard game-winner against Florida State as a true freshman in 2020, and the longest by a Georgia Tech kicker since Wesley Wells' 48-yarder vs. Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018.
- Kelley is an astounding 5-for-5 for his career on onside kick attempts, including 3-for-3 last season.
- On the strength of three outstanding fourth-quarter kickoffs in Georgia Tech's 48-40 loss at Virginia last season (Oct. 23, 2021) including two successful onside kicks in the final 80 seconds of the game Kelley was named the ACC Specialist of the Week.
- Kelley perfectly executed a pair of onside kicks one with 1:16 remaining in the game and one with 20 seconds to go – that helped the Yellow Jackets nearly erase a 21-point deficit in the final four minutes of their 48-40 defeat at UVA.
- Thanks in large part to the successful onside kicks, which were recovered by **Malachi Carter** and Juanyeh Thomas, respectively, Tech was able to rally from a 48-27 deficit with 3:50 remaining in the game to cut it 48-40 and had the ball at the UVA 31 yard line as time expired.
- Earlier in the fourth quarter at Virginia, Kelley also executed a perfectly placed sky kick that pinned UVA at its own 4 yard line.
- Kelley and the Yellow Jackets also pulled off a perfectly executed onside kick in the fourth quarter of its upset bid at No. 6 Clemson (Sept. 18). With the Yellow Jackets trailing 14-6 with 1:19 to go in the ballgame, Kelley's onside kick was recovered by Carter to give the Jackets possession with an opportunity to tie the game (Tech drove 51 yards in 1:04 after recovering the onside kick, but its potential game-tying drive stalled at the 1 yard line with 15 seconds left on the clock).
- As a team, Georgia Tech has had six successful onside kicks in its last 23 games. The Yellow Jackets also recovered two onside kicks by Kelley in 2020 against Notre Dame (Oct. 31) and Boston College (Oct. 24), as well as one by former GT PK Brenton King in the 2019 season finale versus Georgia (Nov. 30).
- Georgia Tech has blocked five kicks in the last 33 games.
- Prior to blocking five kicks in the past 33 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.
- Georgia Tech has blocked 24 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the ninth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

MISCELLANEOUS

- As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the past two seasons. In their seven wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in six of seven games and are plus-13 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 14 of its 18 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-20 overall in turnover margin in those 18 losses.
- Through four games this season, Georgia Tech ranks third in the ACC and 20th nationally in turnover margin at plusfour (1.00/gm). The Yellow Jackets are 20th nationally in takeaways (8) and 29th nationally in fewest giveaways (4).
- Georgia Tech fields one of the nation's youngest teams in 2022, as 79.4% of its roster is comprised of underclassmen, which is the highest percentage among Power Five conference teams and the second-highest overall in NCAA Division I FBS (credit: University of Colorado).
