WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss and Georgia Tech are meeting for the fifth time, with the series tied at 2-2.
- Three of the four contests between the Rebels and Yellow Jackets have been in bowl games.
- Georgia Tech won the lone non-neutral game between the two teams in 1946, 24-7 (Grant Field).
- 56 of the 125 players (45 percent) on the Rebel roster are newcomers and are in their first season at Ole Miss.
- Ole Miss has allowed just 13 total points through the first two games of 2022, the fewest allowed to start a season by a Rebel squad since 1991 (3pts).
- Ole Miss is 159-92-7 (.630 winning pct.) all-time during the month of September after vacated wins.
- The Rebels are 112-41-6 (.723 winning pct.) all-time versus non-conference opponents during the month.
- A total of 36 different Rebels have made their Ole Miss debut during the first two weeks of the season.
- The Rebels rank No. 9 in FBS in sacks per game (4.0) and No. 12 in tackles for loss per game (10.0).
- The Ole Miss defense leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally with six takeaways through two games this year.
- **Quinshon Judkins** (95.5) and **Zach Evans** (91.5) are the only pair of teammates in the country averaging 90-plus yards rushing per game.
- TE **Michael Trigg** is second in the SEC, No. 9 nationally with three receiving TDs.
- WR **Jonathan Mingo** is No. 2 in the SEC in yards per reception (21.5).
- LB **Khari Coleman** ranks No. 12 in FBS in total sacks (2.5).
- DT **KD Hill** was awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award and will wear No. 38 throughout the 2022 season.

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will be first, followed by head football coach Lane Kiffin at noon. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+ (ESPN App). Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (noon). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE: Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season (noon). The number is available through the SEC office at 205-348-3000.

PRACTICES: Practice footage is available periodically on the Ole Miss FTP site. At open practices, video is permitted for stretch only, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Photographers must use tight shots and no formations.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 2) daily newspapers; 3) network affiliate television stations; 4) magazines, non-broadcast radio stations and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/ videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by IMG College in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/ Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with IMG College (336-831-0719 or cabell.philpott@imgworld.com), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW: The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 7 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on TheSeasonOleMiss.com and airs on ESPN.

LAST 4 GAMES AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Dec. 30, 2013 • Nashville, Tenn. • Music City Bowl • Ole Miss 25, Georgia Tech 17: Bo Wallace threw one touchdown and ran for two more, and the Rebel defense held the Georgia Tech triple-option attack in check en route to a 25-17 victory in the 2013 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl. Wallace, who was named the game's MVP, finished the game 22-32 for 256 yards, as well as a career-high 86 yards rushing on 13 carries. Defensively, the Rebels held the Yellow Jackets to just seven points in the first three quarters of play and allowed less than 300 total yards in the victory.

Dec. 30, 1971 • Atlanta, Ga. • Peach Bowl • #17 Ole Miss 41, Georgia Tech 18: In a soggy night game in Georgia Tech's backyard, Ole Miss walloped the Yellow Jackets 41-18 for a Peach Bowl victory. Ole Miss scored five touchdowns and forced five Tech turnovers in the one-sided affair. Quarterback Norris Weese received the Most Valuable Offensive Player trophy after passing for 116 yards and a touchdown and rushing for 32 yards and another score. Linebacker Crowell Armstrong received Most Valuable Defensive Player honors.

Oct. 12, 1946 • Atlanta, Ga. • Georgia Tech 24, Ole Miss 7: Georgia Tech's defense held Ole Miss to just 62 total yards, and the Rebels lost on the road 24-7. The lone Ole Miss score came on a 25-yard pass play from Bobby Wilson to "Hairline" Harper.

Jan. 1, 1953 • New Orleans, La. • Sugar Bowl • #2 Georgia Tech 24, #7 Ole Miss 7: In a battle of two of the nation's top teams, Georgia Tech prevailed 24-7 in the 1953 Sugar Bowl. Neither team had lost all season, and it was an evenly matched game with Georgia Tech holding a 295-287 edge in total yards, but the Rebels were plagued by six turnovers. Ole Miss scored first on a Wissy Dillard 4-yard run, but the Rebels could not hold off Tech the rest of the way. It was the first of eight Sugar Bowl appearances for Ole Miss from 1953-70.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin (Fresno State, 1998) is in his third season at Ole Miss and helped lead the Rebels to back-to-back bowl appearances in his first two years in Oxford. Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, part of an ongoing 11-game home win streak for Kiffin's teams. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories in his first season, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Kiffin is in his 11th year at the NCAA level and has posted an all-time record of 76-42. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as a graduate assistant.

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH GEOFF COLLINS

In his fourth season as head coach, Georgia Tech's Geoff Collins carries a 10-26 coaching record with the Yellow Jackets into his matchup with the Rebels. This marks Collins' sixth season as a head coach in college football, having served two years at the helm of Temple prior to heading to Georgia Tech, where he led the Owls to a record of 15-10 and clinched back-to-back bowl games appearances for the team. Since arriving on campus for the Yellow Jackets, Collins has made waves in overhauling the Georgia Tech program, converting the team from an option offense to a pro-style spread offense while also adding three of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in program history. Prior to becoming a head coach in the NCAA, Collins spent time as defensive coordinator for the likes of Florida, Mississippi State and Florida International across the seven-year stretch of 2010-16. Collins also had experience within the Georgia Tech program prior to his hiring as head coach in 2019, serving as a graduate assistant and tight ends coach for the team from 1999-2001 and later returning in 2006 as director of player personnel.

YELLOW JACKETS SCOUTING REPORT

Georgia Tech enters their matchup with the Rebels with a record of 1-1 on the year, as the Yellow Jackets were able to come away with a 35-17 victory over Western Carolina last weekend to get their first tally in the win column for 2022. Coming off of a 3-9 season in 2021, including going 2-6 in conference play, the Yellow Jackets will rely heavily upon the team's returning talent to help lead the team to success in 2022. The team's offense is headlined by junior running back Dontae Smith, who comes off of a 2021 season that ended with him earning a Second-Team All-ACC nod from Pro Football Focus serving as a rotational back in the team's offense. Alongside Smith will be sophomore quarterback Jeff Sims, who brings back his dual-threat capabilities to the Yellow Jacket backfield for a second season after appearing in seven games in 2021. Georgia Tech's defense also includes a pair of playmakers within the linebacking core, including Third-Team All-ACC linebacker (PFF) Charlie Thomas as well as senior Ayinde Eley, who ended his 2021 season with 90 total tackles for the Yellow Jackets. Georgia Tech's defense is rounded out with defensive lineman Keion White, who currently leads the team in sacks (3) in 2022. White entered the 2022 season as a member of the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List, with Thomas earning a spot on the list as well.

OLE MISS-GEORGIA TECH SERIES HISTORY

- Ole Miss and Georgia Tech are meeting for the fifth time, with the series tied at 2-2.
- Three of the four contests between the Rebels and Yellow Jackets have been in bowl games.
- Georgia Tech won the lone non-neutral game between the two teams in 1946, 24-7 (Grant Field).
- Ole Miss has won the last two meetings in the series.
- This game marks the first game in a home-and-home series with the Yellow Jackets ... The Rebels will host Georgia Tech next year in 2023.

TACKLIN' FUEL

TCU transfer **Khari Coleman** has registered 6.5 tackles for loss through the first two games on the season and ranks No. 12 in FBS in total sacks (2.5). With his 5.0 TFL in the season opener vs. Troy, Coleman became just the third Rebel since 1999 to tally five or more tackles for loss in a single game. Mark Robinson registered 5.0 TFL last season and Kendrick Clancy had 6.0 in 1999. Coleman earned Freshman All-America accolades in 2020 after a stellar freshman campaign for the Horned Frogs. Coleman ranked second in the Big 12 and seventh nationally with 15.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman on his way to being named the Big 12 Co-Defensive Freshman of the Year. The 10.0 tackles for loss were the most by any SEC team in their season opener and are the most in an Ole Miss opening game since 2014.

DYNAMIC DUO

The Rebels rank second in the SEC and No. 11 in FBS in rushing offense (249 ypg) and are lead by a bevy of new faces carrying the rock. True Freshman **Quinshon Judkins** leads the Ole Miss rushing attack. The Pike Road, Alabama, native has tallied 191 rushing yards on 24 carries through two collegiate games. Judkins ranks second in the SEC and No. 7 in the FBS with 7.96 yards per carry. **Zach Evans**, a running back transfer from TCU, has registered 31 carries for 183 yards and one TD. The duo are the only pair of teammates in the country averaging 90-plus yards rushing per game.

PORTAL MANIA

Looking to replace 33 letterwinners, including 14 total starters, Kiffin and the Rebels turned to the transfer portal to help strengthen its roster for 2022. The Rebels brought in a total of 28 transfers, including 24 portal transfers that ranked No. 2 according to 247Sports. USC transfer QB **Jaxson Dart** was rated the No. 3 overall transfer and started three games in 2021 for the Trojans. RB **Zach Evans** was also ranked in the top 10 in 247Sports' transfer rankings. Evans was ranked as the No. 2 running back and No. 8 overall player in the transfer portal. TE **Michael Trigg** was the third Rebel to be ranked as a top 20 transfer, rated as the No. 1 tight end and No. 19 overall player. 56 of the 125 players (45 percent) on the Rebel roster are newcomers and are in their first season at Ole Miss.

THE BIG MEN UP FRONT

Arguably one of the deepest positions for the Rebels in 2022 is the offensive line. Preseason All-America selection **Nick Broeker** anchors a line for an Ole Miss offense that finished sixth in the FBS last season in total offense. Broeker played in every single snap for the Rebels and has started 23 straight games. **Jeremy James** and **Caleb Warren** also both return after starting 13 and 11 games respectively last season. **Eli Acker**, redshirt freshman **Jayden Williams** and WKU transfer **Mason Brooks**, **Hamilton Hall**, **Cedric Melton** and **Reece McIntyre** will all see time on the experienced o-line for the Rebels.

A BIG, DYNAMIC TARGET

One of Ole Miss' biggest additions through the transfer portal was **Michael Trigg**. The 6-foot-3, 240-pound tight end transfer from USC had a career-day Saturday vs. Central Arkansas. Trigg tied a school record with three receiving touchdowns vs. the Bears. He became the 11th Rebel and just the second tight end to haul in three TD receptions. Trigg ranks second in the SEC, ninth nationally in receiving TDs. Among tight ends, Trigg leads the SEC and is tied for the national lead in TD receptions.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Dating back to last season's game against Liberty, Ole Miss has held seven straight opponents to 21 or fewer points. It is the longest active streak among Power 5 teams and the longest streak by any Ole Miss team since a streak of seven straight games in 2014. The Ole Miss defense leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally with six takeaways through two games this year. In their season opener, the Rebel defense held Troy to 60 yards rushing on 33 attempts. It was the fewest rushing yards by an Ole Miss opponent since the 2020 Egg Bowl in which the Rebels gave up only 39 yards. Ole Miss has allowed just 13 total points through the first two games of 2022, the fewest allowed to start a season by a Rebel squad since 1991 (three points).

MANY OPTIONS

One of the most exciting factors of the talent on the Ole Miss roster would be the depth at the receiver position. Ole Miss came into the year having to replace its top four reception leaders from a season ago. Even with so many new names added to the receiver roster, the relationships between the athletes have not let competition get in the middle of the purpose of the team: to win. Veteran **Jonathan Mingo** has started 26 games in his career and hauled in 22 catches for 346 yards and three TDs in 2021 after battling a foot injury early in the season. Transfers **Jaylon Robinson**, **Malik Heath** and **Jordan Watkins** all bring valuable collegiate experience that will continue to help the Rebel offense.

KD HILL RECEIVES CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD, WILL WEAR NO. 38

Ole Miss DT **KD Hill** was recently named the winner of the 2022 Chucky Mullins Courage Award. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. A native of Eufaula, Alabama, Hill becomes the 32nd recipient in the 33-year history of the award. Hill will wear Mullins' No. 38 number throughout the 2022 season. Hill has appeared in 35 career games for the Rebels, including 11 starts at nose tackle last season. The two-year starter for the Rebels registered 24 total tackles on the season in 2021, including two tackles for loss.

NEW FACES IN THE BACKFIELD

The Rebel running back position continues to look much different for the Rebels in 2022 as they had to replace some of the best to ever carry the football at Ole Miss. Both **Jerrion Ealy** and **Snoop Conner** have moved on to the professional game, while the No. 3 back, **Henry Parrish Jr.**, is now at Miami. The trio combined for 1,968 yards and 21 touchdowns on the ground a year ago. Despite the losses, the Rebels have plenty of viable candidates to fill the void. TCU transfer **Zach Evans** seems set for the lead role in the room after running with the ones for the majority of camp. After that, the Rebel coaches will have some decisions to make with several talented runners and only one football to share between them. **Ulysses Bentley IV** brings more veteran experience to the room after transferring from SMU. True freshman **Quinshon Judkins** has impressed in fall campus and brings a powerful running attack to the field for the Rebels. **Kentrel Bullock**, the lone returning scholarship running back remaining from 2021, will also play an important role in the Ole Miss running game.

HEAVY HITTER

Many Rebels are transitioning from high school or life at another university, but **Tyhone Malone** is making a different transition—from baseball back to football. Malone appeared in seven games for the Rebels on the baseball diamond, leading all non-starters with a .444 batting average and two home runs in just nine at-bats. While he wasn't on the Rebels' travel roster as they conquered Omaha and brought a national championship back home to Oxford, he certainly showed he has what it takes to compete on the diamond in the SEC, and now he's back looking to prove the same on the gridiron.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Ole Miss has four players on its roster from outside the U.S., including two Canadian players (**Jaden Dicks** and **Tavilus Robinson**). Offensive lineman **Tobias Braun** (Germany) and punter **Fraser Masin** (Australia) round out the Rebels who add a little international flavor. Robinson appeared in 11 games last season for the Rebels and registered 28 total tackles, including 3.5 sacks.

A FRESH START

Eleven Rebels have made their first career starts at some point for Ole Miss this season: QB **Luke Altmeyer**, LB **Troy Brown**, QB **Jaxson Dart**, RB **Zach Evans**, WR **Malik Heath**, CB **Davison Igbinosun**, WR **Jaylon Robinson**, S **Ladarius Tennison**, TE **Michael Trigg**, WR **Jayden Williams**, S **Isheem Young**. Prior to Ole Miss, Brown had 30 starts at Central Michigan, Young 21 at Iowa State, Evans eight at TCU, Heath nine at Mississippi State, Robinson six at UCF, Dart three starts at USC.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin heads into his third season at the helm of the Ole Miss football program after leading the Rebels to back-to-back bowl appearances in his first two years in Oxford.

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, part of an ongoing nine-game home win streak for Kiffin's teams.

The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). Ole Miss has eclipsed 600 yards of total offense seven times under Kiffin after hitting that mark just 16 times in the program's history before his arrival.

The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game this season compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020, leading the program to an Outback Bowl win over No. 7 Indiana and a 5-5 record against an all-SEC schedule. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set during the Tigers' run to a national title in 2019.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

Kiffin has more than 11 years of head coaching experience, including 10 years at the NCAA level where he has posted an all-time record of 76-42.

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained).

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American AJ McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

OXFORD, Miss. — New names and faces were an important part of the outcome as the Rebels defeated the Troy Trojans, 28-10, on Saturday afternoon.

A total of 27 new Rebels made their debut on Saturday, helping push Ole Miss to its 10th straight home victory dating back to Nov. 14, 2020 — the longest home winning streak in program history since winning 33 in a row from Nov. 1, 1952 to Nov. 7, 1964.

Defensively, junior TCU transfer Khari Coleman was a one-man wrecking crew in his Rebel debut, terrorizing the Troy backfield with 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks on eight total tackles — marking just the third time since 1999 that a Rebel has notched at least 5.0 tackles for loss, joining Mark Robertson's 5.0 in 2021 and Kendrick Clancy's 6.0 in 1999. After Ole Miss won the opening coin toss and deferred, Troy took the kickoff and had an eight-play drive to midfield. But the Trojans stalled there as the Rebel defense stepped up. Dart was 1-for-3 on his first drive as a Rebel that also stalled for Ole Miss near midfield.

After another early Troy drive produced nothing, the Rebels went to work for the game's first points. Nine plays and 82 yards later, Ulysses Bentley IV took it in from two yards out for a touchdown, and the PAT by Jonathan Cruz made it 7-0 Rebels with 2:25 to go in the first. On that drive Dart connected on a 16-yard pass to Jonathan Mingo, and a big Evans rush of 46 yards setup the Bentley score.

Ole Miss added two touchdowns in the second quarter, a two-yard scamper by Mingo and then another two-yard rush, this time by the freshman Judkins to the right pylon to give Ole Miss an early 21-0 lead with 6:38 to go in the first half.

Troy got its first points of the game to end the first half on a 31-yard field goal by Brooks Buce as time expired, making it a 21-3 game at the break.

The Rebels took the second half opening kickoff and impressively drove 75 yards in 13 plays, capped by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Dart to senior wide receiver Malik Heath. The extra point by Cruz made it 28-3 Rebels, and even though there was a lot of time remaining, this one was all but over less than five minutes into the third quarter.

Later in the quarter, Ole Miss seemed poised for more points at the Troy 22 after Miles Battle intercepted a Gunnar Watson pass with 6:26 to go in the third. But on the very next play, Dart was intercepted in the end zone by the Trojans' Markeis Colvin.

In the fourth quarter, Troy scored its lone touchdown on fourth and goal at the Rebel 3-yard line on a pass from Watson to Rajae Johnson, the end of a 39-yard drive that took 11 plays. The point after by Buce was good, and it was 28-10.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss grabbed the lead from the jump and never looked back in a dominant 59-3 victory over Central Arkansas at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday night. The Rebels played well in all three facets of the game with seven touchdowns on offense, as well as one on special teams, while forcing four turnovers.

After winning the coin toss and taking the kickoff, Altmyer immediately took a shot down the sideline to Mingo for a 36-yard gain. Ole Miss ran the ball four straight times before Altmyer punched the first score of the game with a 7-yard touchdown pass to Trigg.

The Rebel defense stopped Central Arkansas' offense on its first drive and forced a punt. The Bears' fumbled the snap, which was picked off the ground by Tennison and taken to the end zone. Central Arkansas was unable to get anything going on offense on the ensuing drive, and Ole Miss blocked a punt to regain the ball on the UCA's 4-yard line. It took two plays for Altmyer and Trigg to connect on their second touchdown of the night.

Following a Bears' three-and-out, Ole Miss would score once more before the end of the first quarter. He put the offense in position to score with a 26-yard pass to Malik Heath down the middle of the field on a 1st-and-24.

The scoring settled down in the second quarter as Cruz's field goal were the only points of the frame. Ole Miss went into the half leading 31-0.

Ole Miss ramped it back up to start the second half. The defense forced a three-and-out, giving the ball to the Rebel offense. On the second play of the drive, Dart launched a 51-yard bomb to Mingo with an incredible catch over the Bears' cornerback. Two plays later, Zach Evans bulldozed his way into the endzone. On the very next drive, Dart found Dayton Wade behind the defense for a 39-yard reception. The next play, he located Trigg open to the left for six, extending the Rebel lead to 45 after the Cruz extra point. Trigg became just the 11th Rebel to score three touchdowns in a single game.

The Rebels' offense continued to command the game as they crossed the goal line one more time before the third quarter finished.

In the fourth, Central Arkansas marched down the field, cutting a big chunk of the field by throwing it deep for 36 yards. However, the Bears settled for a field to get on the board, down 52-3. As the game was nearing its end, UCA fumbled on a punt return and Ole Miss recovered it inside the 10. Ulysses Bentley IV put the cherry on top with an 11-yard rushing touchdown.
