UCFACTS

- Following a successful first road trip of the season, UCF returns to FBC Mortgage Stadium for the third time in the first four weeks to host Georgia Tech. Kickoff is set for 4 p.m. and the game will air live on ESPNU.
- Following the first three games of the season, UCF is the only FBS team to surpass 600 yards of total offense in more than one game this season. The Knights recorded a season-high 653 yards in the road win at Florida Atlantic and also tallied 605 yards in the season opener against South Carolina State.
- UCF's 653 yards of total offense against Florida Atlantic are the fifth most by an FBS team in a single game this season.
- Quarterback John Rhys Plumlee's 460 total offensive yards in the win over the Owls are the second most by a player this season and just three yards shy of tying for the national lead. The senior passed for 339 yards and rushed for 121, as he was responsible for three touchdowns. Plumlee was tabbed American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week and named to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 List on Monday following his performance.
- UCF is averaging 273.0 rushing yards per game, which ranks fourth nationally and leads the AAC. Fifth-year running back Isaiah Bowser is seventh in the nation with five rushing touchdowns to lead the conference. Dating back to the bowl game last year, Bowser has at least one rushing touchdown in each of his last four games, scoring seven total during that span.
- UCF's defense has allowed just 121.7 passing yards per game to rank No. 7 among FBS teams. The Knights are 10th nationally in team passing efficiency defense, which measures the opponent's pass completion percentage, number of interceptions, interception percentage and opponent's total yards passing, at 85.51.

Saturday's game will be the fifth meeting between the programs, but the first in Orlando as each of the previous meetings have been held in Atlanta.

Georgia Tech leads the all-time series, 3-1, with all three of the Yellow Jackets' wins coming with George O'Leary as head coach. O'Leary coached Georgia Tech for eight seasons from 1994-2001 and then coached at UCF for 12 seasons from 2004-2015. O'Leary will do the ceremonial coin toss prior to Saturday night's game.

UCF won the last meeting between the programs, as the Knights compiled 660 yards of total offense en route to a 49-21 victory. The Knights scored 21 points in the second quarter to pull away and earn the win.

THE OPPONENT

• Georgia Tech is in its fourth season under head coach Geoff Collins, who spent the 2008-09 seasons as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at UCF under head coach George O'Leary.

• The Yellow Jackets are off to a 1-2 start to the season, including an 0-1 mark in ACC play. In its last outing, Georgia Tech dropped a 42-0 decision at home against No. 20 Ole Miss.

• GT ranks among the top 10 nationally in tackles for loss with 9.0 to lead the ACC at No. 7 in the country. Linebacker Ayinde Eley is second in the conference with 32 tackles, including five tackles for loss to lead the ACC. Additionally, he has forced a pair of fumbles.

LAST TIME OUT

BOCA RATON, Fla. – After allowing just 18 yards in the second half, UCF football bounced back in a big way with a 40-14 win against Florida Atlantic Saturday night at FAU Stadium. The Knights defense held the Owls to zero yards in the third quarter and only allowed 18 yards in the fourth quarter.

UCF (2-1) has now won all four games in the series against Florida Atlantic (2-2), including a perfect 2-0 record at FAU Stadium.

Florida Atlantic scored on its opening drive of the game, but UCF quickly responded to knot the score at 7-7. Following consecutive passes to Ryan O'Keefe and Xavier Townsend, Knights quarterback John Rhys Plumlee called his own number and scored on a rushing play from seven yards out. The Owls scored a second touchdown with a few seconds remaining in the first quarter, but the Knights defense held Florida Atlantic scoreless for the final three quarters.

A 41-yard field goal from freshman kicker Colton Boomer, making his collegiate debut, cut the UCF deficit to 14-10 and Plumlee scored his second rushing touchdown of the game a few minutes later to give the Knights a 16-14 lead at halftime. The Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native turned in a career performance with 121 rushing yards, a career-high 339 passing yards and 25 completions for three total touchdowns.

The second half was all UCF with the Knights compiling 327 yards of total offense and limiting Florida Atlantic to 18 total yards.

PLUMLEE TABBED AAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Following a stellar performance in Saturday's 40-14 win at Florida Atlantic, UCF quarterback John Rhys Plumlee has been named American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week, the conference announced on Monday.

Plumlee helped lead the Knights to a bounce back win in Boca Raton, as he threw for a career-high 339 yards and completed a career-best 25 passes. He completed nearly 70% of his passes and threw for a touchdown. He gashed the Owls defense with 20 rushing attempts for 121 yards and two rushing touchdowns.

The Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native's 460 total offensive yards in the win over the Owls are the second most by a player in a single game this season and just three yards shy of tying for the national lead.

With Plumlee leading the charge, UCF rushed for 314 yards and passed for 339 yards to surpass 600 yards of total offense for the second time this season.

UCF is the only FBS team to compile 600 or more yards of total offense in two games this season.

Plumlee is the first UCF player to earn AAC Offensive Player of the Week honors since Dillon Gabriel earned the accolade on Oct. 19, 2020.

PLUMLEE NAMED TO DAVEY O'BRIEN GREAT 8 LIST

In addition to earning the AAC honors, Plumlee is one of eight players named to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 List, which recognizes the National Quarterback of the Week.

DEFENSE DOMINATES

After allowing 14 points in the first quarter at Florida Atlantic, the UCF defense dominated for the remainder of the game and held the Owls scoreless for the final three quarters. The Knights held FAU to zero yards of offense in the third quarter and just 18 yards in the fourth quarter.

ELITE TERRITORY

UCF is the only FBS team to compile 600 or more yards of total offense in two games this season. The Knights recorded a season-high 653 yards in the road win at Florida Atlantic and also tallied 605 yards in the season opener against South Carolina State.

THREE GAMES, THREE DIFFERENT DAYS OF THE WEEK

UCF has played three games this season on three different days of the week. The Knights opened the season against South Carolina State on a Thursday, played Louisville on a Friday and then Florida Atlantic last Saturday.

FEELING SPECIAL

UCF blocked a field goal attempt for the first time this season in the win at Florida Atlantic on Saturday, Sept. 17. Following a stellar goal line stop from the defense, redshirt junior defensive tackle Keenan Hester got a great push and leaped into the air to get his hand on a 19-yard field goal attempt from the Owls.

It was UCF's first field goal since Sept. 19, 2020, at Georgia Tech when Noah Hancock blocked a field goal in the second quarter.

It was the second big play on special teams for the Knights this season, after Quadric Bullard blocked a punt and returned it for a touchdown in the season opener against South Carolina State.

RICHARDSON APPROACHING 1,000

Junior running back Johnny Richardson heads into Saturday's game just 17 yards shy of 1,000 career rushing yards. Richardson tallied 65 yards as a freshman, 733 last season and has recorded 185 yards this season.

Richardson broke off a 50-yard rush in the win against Florida Atlantic, which is the longest of his career.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)

HOLLER'S CAREER DAY

Alec Holler turned in a career day against Florida Atlantic, as the tight end reeled in three catches for a career-high 115 yards. Holler nearly doubled his career receiving yards in the contest, as he entered the game with 192 yards.

Holler caught a 64-yard pass from John Rhys Plumlee in the second quarter, which is a career long and also the longest passing play of the season for UCF.

FIRST OF HIS CAREER

Running back RJ Harvey recorded his first career rushing touchdown with a three-yard run in the third quarter at Florida Atlantic. Defensive tackle Lee Hunter notched the first sack of his career in the contest, taking down the Owls quarterback for a loss of seven yards in the third.

COLLEGIATE DEBUTS

Freshman placekicker Colton Boomer and punter Mitch McCarthy both made their collegiate debuts against Florida Atlantic. Boomer drilled a 41-yard field goal on his first attempt of his career in the second quarter.

McCarthy's first career punt went for 46 yards with only a three-yard return. It was the only time UCF punted on the day.

BOWSER'S IN THE ENDZONE

Isaiah Bowser has rushed for at least one touchdown in every game this season. Dating back to the bowl game last year, Bowser has seven touchdowns in his last four games.

Bowser recorded his sixth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns against Louisville. He had four rushing touchdowns in 2021 vs. Bethune-Cookman, two in the 2021 Gasparilla Bowl vs. Florida and two vs. South Carolina State on Sept. 2 in the season opener.

While at Northwestern he had a pair of rushing touchdowns in his first career start in 2018 vs. Rutgers and two vs. Minnesota that same season.

EVERYONE'S WATCHING

The UCF-Louisville game on Sept. 9 was the most viewed ESPN2 Friday game since 2013 with more than 1.8 million viewers. The mark is also the most watched regular season game on ESPN2 since 2017.

KNIGHTS IN ROAD OPENERS

UCF has won its first road game of the season in five of the last six years. The Knights earned a dominant 40-14 win at Florida Atlantic on Sept. 17 to start their road slate with a win. Last year, UCF dropped a 42-35 game at Louisville but opened the 2020 campaign with a 49-21 win at Georgia Tech.

In 2019, the Knights defeated the FAU Owls in their first road game and UCF won 56-17 at UConn in 2018 in the squad's first road game.

HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

UCF's all-time record of 74-23 (.763) at FBC Mortgage Stadium ranks in the top 15 in the nation for best win percentage in a current home stadium.

Since 2017, the Knights are 31-3 in home games at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

The Knights finished last season undefeated at home, marking the seventh time in UCF's FBS era, the ninth overall, and the fourth time in the last five years.

Only 22 teams in the nation completed the 2021 regular season undefeated at home.

MALZAHN'S STILL PERFECT IN HOME SEASON OPENERS

UCF head coach Gus Malzahn improved to 11-0 in home season openers with the 56-10 win against South Carolina State. He owns a 2-0 record at UCF, 8-0 at Auburn and 1-0 mark at Arkansas State.

BULLARD'S SPECIAL

Junior safety Quadric Bullard recorded the first blocked punt for UCF since Sept. 7, 2019 with his block in the fourth quarter against South Carolina State in the season opener. He then recovered the punt in the endzone for the first punt returned for a touchdown for UCF since Nov. 12, 2016 against Cincinnati.

It was Bullard's first career touchdown. He finished the game with a tackle and a pass breakup in addition to the blocked punt.

QUITE THE DEBUT FOR PLUMLEE

Making his debut in a UCF uniform against South Carolina State, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee wowed Knights fans with a stellar performance as he finished the night 20-of-31 passing for 308 yards and four touchdowns. He was also a factor with his legs, accounting for 100 yards rushing on 16 attempts with another score to account for five of UCF's seven touchdowns in the season-opening 56-10 win against South Carolina State.

Playing quarterback for the first time since 2020, Plumlee quickly acclimated to the position and led a Knights offense that piled up 605 total yards, the most by an AAC team in week one or week 0.

It was Plumlee's first game with both a rushing and passing touchdown in his career. Additionally, he tallied a career high with four passing touchdowns.

TRANSFERS MAKING AN IMPACT

UCF added several talented transfers to its roster for the 2022 season and they are already making their presence felt. In addition to Plumlee's strong start, wide receiver Javon Baker has recorded 17 catches for 251 yards and two touchdowns to lead the receiving unit. Tight end Kemore Gamble has tallied four catches for 89 yards with a touchdown this season.

Defensively, linebackers Jason Johnson and Walter Yates III lead the way in tackles with 24 and 15 total stops, respectively. Johnson has started all three games and Yates made his first start for the Knights at Florida Atlantic.

FIRST CATCH, FIRST TOUCHDOWN

Redshirt senior tight end Zach Marsh Wojan recorded his first career catch in the season opener against South Carolina State, reeling in a 21-yard pass from Plumlee for his first career touchdown.

The Vacaville, California, native has started each of the past two games with the team coming out in a two-tight set against Louisville and Florida Atlantic.

SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

A half-dozen UCF football standouts—running back Isaiah Bowser, tight end Kemore Gamble, offensive tackle Tylan Grable, wide receiver Ryan O'Keefe, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee and safety Divaad Wilson—have been named to the watch list for the 2023 Reese's Senior Bowl all-star game (Feb. 4, 2023, in Mobile, Alabama).

LEADING THE CHARGE

Running back Isaiah Bowser, defensive lineman Josh Celiscar, offensive lineman Sam Jackson, linebacker Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste and receiver Ryan O'Keefe have been selected captains of the 2022 UCF football squad by vote of their teammates. Jackson was also a captain during the 2021 season as well.

STRONG RETURNERS

Fifteen returning starters (eight on defense, seven on offense) plus a handful of key specialists are back for Gus Malzahn in 2022 as UCF looks to compete for the

American Athletic Conference championship it last won in 2017 and 2018.

COOL UNDER PRESSURE

UCF led the nation last season in fourth-down conversion percentage at 84.6%. The Knights were successful on 11 of their 13 fourth-down attempts.

This year, UCF is 3-for-5 on fourth-down attempts for a 60% conversion rate.

RETURNING WEAPONS

The Knights return a solid list of weapons for 2022:

- their starting quarterback, Mikey Keene, who threw for 1,730 yards and 17 TDs in 2021
- their top six rushers, led by Isaiah Bowser, who ran for 703 yards and nine TDs in only eight games, and Johnny Richardson, who led the team with 733 yards and three TDs
- four of their top five receivers, paced by Ryan O'Keefe and his 84 receptions for 812 yards and seven TDs
- two of their top four tacklers in safeties Quadric Bullard (83 tackles, 6 PBU) and Divaad Wilson (72 tackles)

WHO'S GONE

The most noteworthy personnel losses for UCF are:

- wide receiver Brandon Johnson (38 catches for 565 yards and 11 TDs in 2021; signed free-agent contract with NFL Denver Broncos)
- offensive linemen Cole Schneider (47 career starts; signed as free agent with NFL Green Bay Packers) and Marcus Tatum (18 career starts; signed as free agent with NFL Jacksonville Jaguars)
- leading tackler Tatum Bethune (108 tackles; 1st-team all-AAC/Pro Football Network)
- linebacker Bryson Armstrong (led the squad in tackles much of the year, finishing with 77 after a season-ending injury in the 10th game)
- defensive end Big Kat Bryant (paced the Knights with 14 tackles for loss, 6 sacks and 10 quarterback hurries, while adding 52 tackles; consensus 1st-team all-AAC; signed free-agent contract with NFL Dallas Cowboys)
- quarterback Dillon Gabriel (started first 3 games in 2021 and 25 in a row in his career before season-ending injury; career totals included 554 of 913 passing for 8,037 yards, 70 TDs, 14 ints.)
- wide receiver Jaylon Robinson (18 rec. for 322, 2 TDs in 2021; 1st-team all-AAC in 2020 with 55 rec. for 979, 6 TDs)
- defensive tackle Kalia Davis (6th-round pick of San Francisco 49ers in 2022 NFL Draft; 17 tackles, 4.5 TFL in 2021 while playing only 5 games)

Starters returning on offense are Keene, Bowser/Richardson (5 starts each), O'Keefe, center Matt Lee, guard Lokahi Pauole, tackle Sam Jackson and tight end Alec Holler (19 for 192, 3 TDs).

Regulars back on defense are end Josh Celiscar (39 tackles in 2021), tackles Ricky Barber (29) and Keenan Hester (24), linebacker Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste (51), plus defensive backs Brandon Adams (19), Davonte Brown (38), Corey Thornton (32), Justin Hodges (35), Bullard and Wilson.

Among specialists returning are placekicker Daniel Obarski (8 of 14 on field goals), punter Andrew Osteen (41.1-yard average) and All-America long snapper Alex Ward.

UCF returns eight players who received either first-, second- or third-team all-conference recognition on at least one all-AAC team in 2021—O'Keefe, Pauole, Bullard, Wilson, Brown, Lee, Thornton and Ward.

DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

UCF hopes to continue its defensive improvement after ranking seventh in the country in pass efficiency defense in 2021 (after standing 104th in 2020)--continuing a string of recent top-12 finishes (8th in 2011, 11th in 2014, 12th in 2016 and 3rd in 2019).

The Knights improved their NCAA standing in passing yards allowed by 86 slots (35th in 2021 at 210.1 after 121st in 2020 at 299.2), including 89 fewer yards per game.

UCF improved by 70 spots in total defense (53rd in 2021 at 369.3 versus 123rd in 2020 at 491.8). That's 122.5 fewer yards allowed per game than last year.

DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT (CONT.)

According to Pro Football Focus, UCF's 2021 "stop rate" (percent of defensive drives that ended in punts, turnovers or turnovers on down) ranked 28th nationally at 69.5%, 31 spots higher than in 2020.

The Knights ranked 28th nationally in rushing, the fourth straight season the Knights have averaged at least 196 yards per game.

NEW FACES

The Knights' spring workouts included four incoming freshmen who enrolled in January (quarterback Thomas Castellanos, defensive back Nikai Martinez, running back Jordan McDonald and tight end Grant Stevens) plus transfers John Rhys Plumlee (QB/Ole Miss), Tylan Grable (OL/Jacksonville State), Kobe Hudson (WR/Auburn), K.D. McDaniel (DE/Kentucky), Ryan Swoboda (OL/Virginia), Koby Perry (DB/Austin Peay), Kemore Gamble (TE/Florida), Lee Hunter (DT/Auburn) and Terrence Lewis (LB/Maryland).

Additional transfers added later to the roster are Javon Baker (WR/Alabama), Will Bohn (QB/Coffeyville), Demarcus Bowman (RB/Clemson/Florida), John Harris (OL/Virginia Tech/Mercer), Branden Jennings (LB/Maryland/Kansas State), Terrell Jackson (DB/Air Force Prep), Jason Johnson (LB/Eastern Illinois), Cameron Kinnie (OL/Georgia), Camden Vining (LB/Army) and Walter Yates (LB/Savannah State).

247Sports rated UCF's incoming list of transfers as the 16th best group in the country—while the Knights' overall combined ranking (incoming freshmen plus transfers) was 38th nationally, highest in program history.

WELCOME TO ORLANDO

The Knights have two new members of their full-time coaching roster: offensive coordinator/quarterback coach Chip Lindsey (most recently head coach at Troy) and wide receiver coach Grant Heard (most recently at Indiana).

MALZAHNS CONTRIBUTE TO UCF

UCF head football coach Gus Malzahn and his wife Kristi have made a \$250,000 gift commitment to McNamara Cove which is part of "The Gateway" football campus project made possible by Sharon and Marc Hagle (<https://ucfknight.com/news/2022/6/28/football-sharon-and-marc-hagle-commit-more-than-5-million-to-ucf-athletics.aspx>).

The commitment marks a major step forward in creating momentum for UCF's Mission XII initiative (www.missionxii.com) as the Knights look toward their official transition to the Big 12 Conference July 1, 2023.

"We are excited about the future for UCF," said Kristi and Gus Malzahn. "We love Orlando, This Place, our amazing fans and our players. McNamara Cove, among other projects and initiatives for UCF Athletics, is a game-changer in the lives of our student-athletes. Just as we always challenge our players, our goal is to use our influence in a positive way and hopefully this gift does that and helps us compete for championships moving forward in the Big 12."

According to UCF vice president and director of athletics Terry Mohajir, "We are grateful that Kristi and Gus made a commitment to help fund our ongoing efforts to further develop the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village, specifically McNamara Cove. We believe this gift will allow us to better serve our student-athletes and the UCF community. We hope their leadership inspires others."

The future vision of the UCF football campus was first presented to UCF Board of Trustees in August 2021, including significant proposed new elements that will enhance the Knights' ability to compete for football championships. The intent is to create a dedicated football campus that will consolidate Knights' facilities in the areas of housing, nutrition, sports medicine and recovery, sports performance, academics and career services.

McNamara Cove will provide UCF student-athletes a place for recovery and recreation each day. It will also deliver one of the most unique tailgating experiences in college football and host many team, alumni and community events throughout the year.

Design of the Hagle Football Gateway project—including McNamara Cove, Nicholson Plaza, a VIP parking lot and renovated practice fields—is underway.

UCF ADDS SPANISH RADIO BROADCAST FOR HOME FOOTBALL GAMES

UCF home football games for the first time in 2022 will feature a Spanish radio broadcast, presented by Florida Blue and accessible through a link from the main athletics webpage, UCFKnights.com.

There are more than 62 million Hispanics in the United States, and an estimated 41.7 million U.S. residents, or 13.5% of the population, speak Spanish at home.

The U.S. Department of Education officially designated UCF as a Hispanic Serving Institution in 2019, paving the way for the university to secure additional federal funding to improve the educational experience of Hispanic and low-income students. To become a qualifying institution, Hispanic enrollment must be at least 25% of full-time-equivalent undergraduate students. UCF's Hispanic enrollment was 28% for Fall 2021.

UCF has invested in numerous pathways that serve Hispanic students and position them to succeed, including peer mentoring programs, leadership development and a variety of partnerships including one with Google to assist students with developing their digital skills for career readiness. This summer, UCF joined the Alliance of Hispanic Serving Research Universities, which aims to double the number of Hispanic doctoral students and increase the number of Hispanic faculty by 20%. Last year, UCF earned the prestigious Seal of Excelencia from Excelencia in Education, a reflection of the university's commitment to accelerating Hispanic student success, and Hispanic Outlook magazine ranked UCF among the top schools for awarding bachelor's and master's degrees to Hispanic students.

Carlos Bohorquez, who handles play by play, has been the Spanish radio play-by-play voice for the NFL Tampa Bay Buccaneers since 2018. Bohorquez has additional experience calling soccer matches in his native Venezuela and here in the United States. He also has worked on numerous shows on Univision and

currently serves as the producer for Todo Tampa Bay.

Sergio Ruiz Torres, the color analyst, is the Spanish play-by-play voice of MLS Orlando City SC. Ruiz is in his eighth season at the helm on Acci3n 97.9FM/810AM. A former sports anchor for Univisi3n Orlando, the native of Venezuela also serves as a producer and reporter for Telemundo Orlando and previously broadcast World Cup qualifying, Copa America and Copa Libertadores matches.

"We are excited to add Spanish broadcasts for all UCF football home games this season," says Marc Daniels, UCF director of broadcasting and radio play-by-play voice of the Knights. "As Knight Nation continues to grow across the area and beyond, we feel this allows us to serve the demand of that growing fan base. We are thrilled to add Carlos and Sergio to our broadcast team of talent. They bring tremendous experience and passion and look forward to the new season."

The Spanish broadcast streams will be available for all seven UCF home games at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

UCF PICKED THIRD IN AAC PRESEASON FOOTBALL POLL

UCF is picked third in the 2022 American Athletic Conference football preseason media poll.

The Knights (225 points, 7 first-place votes) finished behind only Houston (243 points, 7 first-place votes) and defending champion Cincinnati (242 points, 10 first-place votes).

UCF was picked to win the AAC in 2018, 2019 and 2020--accomplishing that feat in 2018. The Knight also won AAC crowns in 2013, 2014 (shared with Cincinnati and Memphis) and 2017 when other league members were predicted first in the preseason.

BOWLS, BCS AND NEW YEAR'S SIX

- The Knights appeared in their sixth straight bowl game in 2021, extending the program record for most consecutive bowl game appearances. UCF played in the Cure Bowl in 2016, the Peach Bowl in 2017, the Fiesta Bowl in 2018, the Gasparilla Bowl in 2019, and the Boca Raton Bowl in 2020.
- The 2021 Gasparilla Bowl marked UCF's ninth bowl appearance in the last 10 seasons and the Knights' 13th in the past 17 years.
- Since the 2013 season, UCF has appeared in three BCS/New Year's Six bowl games and won two (2014 Fiesta Bowl, 2018 Peach Bowl).
- The Knights are one of only 17 FBS programs in the nation to appear in three such games during that span and one of only 12 teams to win two games during that time.
- UCF is the only current non-"Power 5" team to appear on either list.

BIG 12 CONFERENCE

- The University of Central Florida accepted an invitation to join the Big 12 Conference, as announced by Big 12 commissioner Bob Bowlsby, UCF director of athletics Terry Mohajir, and UCF President Alex Cartwright on Friday, Sept. 10, 2021.
- The Knights athletics program has now moved from Division III, Division II, the FCS level, the FBS level that included time in the MAC, Conference USA, the AAC, and now to the Big 12 Conference.
- Mohajir: *"This is a landmark day for anyone ever associated with UCF or UCF Athletics. As we anticipate a future move to the Big 12 Conference, we first owe a vote of thanks to all those at UCF who have gone before us. UCF SELLS OUT SEASON TICKET ALLOTMENT AGAIN IN 2022

UCF sold out its allotment of home football season tickets in 2022 for the third time in four years (also in 2019 and 2021). Meanwhile, the Knights are coming off a handful of their highest season attendance averages in school history:

--Both in 2007 (the year FBC Mortgage Stadium opened—then known as Bright House Networks Stadium) and again in 2018 (when UCF finished 8-0 at home) the Knights averaged a season-record 44,018 spectators for each game in a facility that officially seats 44,206.

--In 2019 UCF again was unbeaten at home (at 6-0) while averaging 43,788 fans per game (third-highest season average).

--Then in Gus Malzahn's first season at UCF in 2021, the Knights did not lose any of their seven home games while averaging 40,427 fans per contest (fifth-highest mark all-time).

--UCF's first two home games in 2022 averaged 44,111, just less than 100 below capacity.

--The single-game high-water mark in 2018 came when 47,795 fans viewed UCF's victory over 19th-ranked Cincinnati on a weekend when ESPN Game Day came to UCF for the first time. That number is the second-highest single-game figure for Spectrum Stadium (48,453 fans watched the 2009 home game against Miami).

Since it opened in 2007 the Knights' home stadium has added a premium chair-back seating and club area, the Carl Black and Gold Cabana, on the east side of the field and a similar Stadium Club on the west side, also including chair-back seats and premium amenities. The Carl Black and Gold Cabana area expanded in 2019 with the addition of approximately 900 more gold chair-back seats. Other major premium additions were field cabanas in the south end zone in 2017 and then in the north end zone in 2018—and loge cabanas on the south side in 2018 and north side for 2019.

Gus Malzahn's first season as UCF head football coach in 2021 featured six wins in the Knights' final seven games, an overall 9-4 mark capped by a postseason bowl invitation (10th straight for teams coached by Malzahn and sixth straight for UCF), a 29-17 Gasparilla Bowl triumph over Florida, a perfect 7-0 home record—and an eye-opening response to a parade of injuries to key personnel.

Malzahn's Knights began the season by recording the largest comeback victory in UCF history in a 36-31 weather-delayed triumph over Boise State. His first team in Orlando prospered by pulling out three other wins by four-point margins and playing six games overall decided by a touchdown or less—with two UCF defeats coming by a combined 11 points.

The Knights had to survive the early-season loss of their starting quarterback (Dillon Gabriel—he missed the last 10 games) as well as lengthy sideline stints for their best defensive player (tackle Kalia Davis—he missed the last eight games), their top running back (Isaiah Bowser—he missed five games) and their most dangerous receiver (Jaylon Robinson—he missed six games). They finished the campaign by running for 288 yards in the bowl triumph over Florida in front of 63,669 fans in Tampa.

One of three finalists for the Steve Spurrier Award presented by the Football Writers Association of America to the best head coach in his first year at a school, Malzahn saw long snapper Alex Ward win third-team All-America honors from Phil Steele, while defensive end Big Kat Bryant was a first-team All-American Athletic Conference pick by three different selectors. Pro Football Network named Bryant the AAC Newcomer of the Year and the league's Defensive Lineman of the Year.

Eight other UCF players received at least one first- or second-team All-AAC honor—linebacker Tatum Bethune, receivers Ryan O'Keefe and Brandon Johnson, offensive linemen Lokahi Paulele, Cole Schneider and Marcus Tatum, and defensive backs Quadric Bullard and Divaad Wilson.

UCF in 2021 ranked seventh nationally in team pass efficiency defense (after ranking 104th in that NCAA statistical category the previous year), while also showing dramatic improvement in several other statistical categories:

--An upgrade of 86 slots in passing yards allowed compared to 2020, while permitting 89.1 fewer passing yards in 2021

--An improvement of 70 slots in total defense, while allowing 122.5 fewer yards per game compared to the previous season

Malzahn and his staff then capped their first season by building the highest-rated recruiting class in UCF history (rated 38th overall by 247Sports, including both high school players and transfers).

Malzahn, who led Auburn to the Bowl Championship Series National Championship Game following the 2013 season in the first of eight straight years his Tigers qualified for bowl games, was named the

ninth head football coach at UCF on Feb. 15, 2021. He begins his second season with the Knights in 2022.

In eight years as head football coach at Auburn, Malzahn also led the Tigers to a Southeastern Conference Championship, two SEC West Division titles and six New Year's Day bowl selections to go with those eight postseason appearances.

Malzahn, now 86-42 (.672) in 10 seasons overall as a head coach, has helped teams to seven conference championship game appearances in his 16 seasons as a collegiate coach, including winning a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012. In the final Associated Press rankings his Auburn teams finished second (2013), 10th (2017), 22nd (2014) and 24th (2016).

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach-of-the-Year honors that season after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history. He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and top-ranked Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship Game win over fifth-ranked Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

The 34-28 victory over top-rated Alabama in 2013 came on a memorable 100-yard return of a Tide missed field goal on the final play of the game. Malzahn's Tiger squads also defeated seventh-ranked Texas A&M in 2013, seventh-rated Ole Miss in 2014, second-ranked Georgia and top-rated Alabama in 2017 and fifth-ranked Alabama in 2019.

After his eight seasons at Auburn, Malzahn qualified as the second-longest tenured head coach at one school in the SEC. He is one of only 10 active FBS head coaches to take a team to a national championship game. During his time with the Tigers, Auburn was one of only three SEC schools to play in multiple SEC Championships games and play for a national championship.

Malzahn has produced 15 1,000-yard rushers in 16 seasons as a college coach, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 (despite missing significant time with injuries) and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 and 2010 (both Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas). Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.



During Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, the Tigers had the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 228.6 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) came under Malzahn's leadership. Auburn became just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards (also Texas A&M in 2012).

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing TDs in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense versus Missouri in the 2013 SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Mason, the 2013 SEC Player of the Year, ranked third in the nation with 23 TDs, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. He set Auburn single-season records for rushing yards and all-purpose yards (2,374) and was second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards versus fifth-rated Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

In Malzahn's eight seasons at Auburn 32 players were selected in the National Football League Draft, highlighted by four first-round picks—including Derrick Brown (No. 7) and Noah Igbinoghene (No. 30) in 2020. Malzahn's other first-round picks were Greg Robinson (No. 2 overall) and Dee Ford (No. 23) in 2014. In the last two drafts combined (2020 and 2021), 12 Auburn players were drafted, most for the Tigers in a two-year span in the common draft era.

Malzahn coached 14 All-Americans as head coach at Auburn, including consensus selections center Reese Dismukes (2014) and defensive lineman Derrick Brown (2019). Brown won the Lott IMPACT Trophy in 2019, while Dismukes was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center.

The Tigers faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, facing 38 ranked opponents, including 21 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1- and No. 2-ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four College Football Playoff semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn and his coaching proved highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive top-10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in Auburn history. Six of his eight recruiting classes rated in the top 11 nationally.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012 when he led the program to a 9-3 regular-season mark and the Sun Belt Conference title. In that role he worked hand in hand with current UCF vice president and director of athletics Terry Mohajir who was named the Red Wolves' vice chancellor and director of athletics in the middle of that 2012 season and remained in that role until coming to UCF in early 2021.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957. Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records while leading the SEC and finishing in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. Malzahn coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 TDs, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the number-one overall selection in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell awards.

During two seasons (2007-08) as assistant head coach and co-offensive coordinator at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records. The 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally, averaging 47.2 points per game. Malzahn in 2006 spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state

PRODUCTIVE OFFENSES

Gus Malzahn was responsible for two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history: Auburn in 2013 (7,018 yards of total offense and Auburn in 2010 (6,989 yards of total offense).

50-POINT GAMES

Since the year 2000, in the eight years Malzahn was at Auburn, the Tigers posted 25 50-point games. In the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers recorded three 50-point games in a season four times with Malzahn as head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019)

MALZAHN AT HOME

Malzahn now holds a record of 58-13 (.816) at home as a collegiate head coach. He was 5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State, at Auburn went 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018, 6-1 in 2019 and 4-1 in 2020, finished 2021 with UCF 7-0 and is 1-1 this year. He started his tenure at Auburn with 13 consecutive home victories.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Gus Malzahn earned multiple national coach of the year awards in 2013, including the Eddie Robinson Award, the Bobby Bowden Award, and the Bear Bryant Award, as well as national coach of the year honors from Home Depot, the Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, and USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame. After one year as defensive coordinator in 1991 he spent four years (1992-95) as head coach at Hughes (Arkansas) High School, five years in 1996-2000 as head coach at Shiloh (Arkansas) High School and five years (2001-05) as head coach at Springdale (Arkansas) High School.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Arkansas, and played football at Arkansas (wide receiver in 1984-85) and Henderson State (receiver and punter in 1988-89), earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson State in 1990. As a player he helped the Razorbacks to the 1984 Liberty Bowl and the 1985 Holiday Bowl (a win over Arizona State).

Malzahn and his wife Kristi (Otwell) are parents of two daughters, Kylie (Collin) Peek and Kenzie (Charl) Stander.
