TOP STORYLINES

- Two of the top teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division standings square off on Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium when Georgia Tech hosts Duke.
- Following last Saturday's 26-21 victory at 24th-ranked and defending ACC champion Pitt, Georgia Tech (2-3, 1-1 ACC) enters Saturday's game just a half-game behind Duke (4-1, 1-0 ACC) and North Carolina atop the Coastal Division standings.
- Duke is Georgia Tech's longest continuous football rival, as the Yellow Jackets and Blue Devils have squared off on the gridiron every season since 1933. However, Saturday's game will end the programs' 90-year run of annual matchups, as the ACC's new football scheduling model, which goes into effect next season, keeps Tech and Duke off each others' schedules until 2025.

Both teams' head coaches are getting their first taste of the GT-Duke rivalry as the leaders of their respective programs. Georgia Tech interim head coach **Brent Key** won his debut at the helm of his alma mater last Saturday at Pitt, while Duke's Mike Elko has won 4-of-5 games in his first season leading the Blue Devils.

Three Yellow Jackets earned ACC Player of the Week honors for their performances in last Saturday's win at Pitt — Running Back of the Week **Hassan Hall** (157 rushing yards), Linebacker of the Week **Charlie Thomas** (seven tackles, fumble recovery and interception in just one half) and Specialist of the Week **Gavin Stewart** (14 points on 6-of-6 kicking, including four field goals).

Saturday is Georgia Tech's annual homecoming game. The Yellow Jackets are 53-18-1 all-time in homecoming contests since the Institute began celebrating homecoming in 1949.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

1

LB **Ayinde Eley** is the first NCAA Division I FBS player since at least 2000 with as many as 56 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, three sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries through his team's first five games of the season.

2

LB **Charlie Thomas** is the only NCAA Division I FBS player this season and one of only four FBS players since 2000 with as many as 45 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, a sack, two interceptions, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery through his team's first five games of the season.

3

Three Yellow Jackets earned ACC Player of the Week honors for their performances in last Saturday's win at Pitt — Running Back of the Week **Hassan Hall** (157 rushing yards), Linebacker of the Week **Charlie Thomas** (seven tackles, fumble recovery and interception in just one half) and Specialist of the Week **Gavin Stewart** (14 points on 6-of-6 kicking, including four field goals). It marked the first time since 2020 and only the third time since 2000 that three Jackets have been named ACC Players of the Week in the same week.

3

Jeff Sims is in his third season as Georgia Tech's starting quarterback. He is the first Tech signal-caller to start three-straight season openers since Justin Thomas from 2014-16.

4

Georgia Tech's offense has only turned the ball over four times through five games this season, which marks only the third time since 2000 that the Yellow Jackets have had four turnovers or less through five games (2007, 2014 and 2022).

5

Brent Key is the fifth Georgia Tech alum to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

Georgia Tech's defense has racked up 38 tackles for loss through five games, which is its most through five contests since it totaled 42 TFL over the first five games of the 2008 campaign. The Yellow Jackets are on pace for 91 tackles for loss during the regular season, which would be their second-most in any regular season since 2000 (Tech had 111 TFL during the '07 regular season).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- even its record to 3-3 on the season;
- move it to 2-1 in ACC play and keep it a half-game out of first place in the ACC's Coastal Division standings (behind only the winner of Saturday's North Carolina-Miami matchup);
- give it consecutive wins for the first time since back-to-back wins over Miami and Virginia on Nov. 10 and 17, 2018;
- up it to 53-35-1 all-time versus Duke;
- be its third-straight win over Duke, which would be the Yellow Jackets' longest winning streak in the series since it won 10-straight games over the Blue Devils from 2004-13;
- up it to 54-18-1 all-time in Tech homecoming games;
- be its first homecoming win since 2017, snapping a string of three-straight homecoming defeats (2018, 2019 and 2021 — there was no homecoming game in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic);
- make **Brent Key** only the third Tech head coach in the last 55 years to win his first two games at the helm of the Yellow Jackets.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 2-4 on the season;
- drop it to 1-2 in ACC play and one-and-a-half games behind Duke in the Coastal Division standings;
- snap a two-game winning streak against Duke;
- be its sixth loss in its last eight matchups against Duke;
- prevent it from winning consecutive games for the first time since 2018;
- be its fourth-straight homecoming defeat, which would be the longest homecoming losing streak in Tech history.

GEORGIA TECH INTERIM HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was named the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022.

Prior to being named interim head coach, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his first three seasons back at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, a pair of all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch. The Yellow Jackets averaged 169 yards per game on the ground in '21, with running back Jahmyr Gibbs rushing for 746 yards en route to all-America honors and tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game). With a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle, two more true freshmen (QB Jeff Sims and Gibbs) were the leading rushers in the Yellow Jackets' No. 4-ranked ACC rushing offense.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

As a four-year starting right guard at Georgia Tech from 1997-2000, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the Atlantic Coast Conference in rushing three times. During Key's junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg).

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He is tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 6 Baylor. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

While making 44 starts at right guard for the Yellow Jackets from 1997-2000, Key was part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. He was voted a team captain and named all-ACC as a senior in 2000.

Key earned a bachelor's degree in management from GT in 2001.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 42, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, are parents to a daughter, Harper.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN AT PITT

• **Hassan Hall** ran for 157 yards. **Gavin Stewart** kicked four field goals and **Ayinde Eley** and **Charlie Thomas** headlined an outstanding defensive effort to lead Georgia Tech to a 26-21 win over No. 24 Pitt last Saturday at Acrisure Stadium.

• The win was Georgia Tech's first win over a nationally ranked opponent since a 45-22 victory over No. 21/20 North Carolina on Sept. 25, 2021, snapping a streak of four-straight losses to ranked teams.

• The win was Georgia Tech's first road win over a nationally ranked opponent since a 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016, snapping a streak of six-straight road losses to ranked teams.

• The win snapped Georgia Tech's nine-game losing streak against NCAA Division I FBS opponents, dating back to a 31-27 victory at Duke on Oct. 9, 2021.

• Georgia Tech forced three turnovers in the span of four Pitt possessions in the second half, and converted all three to points (two FG and one TD – 13 total points).

• Georgia Tech's three takeaways were its most in a game since it had three at Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 6 of last season.

• Georgia Tech's eight passes defended (seven breakups, one interception) doubled its previous season high (four at UCF – Sept. 24). Prior to the UCF game, Georgia Tech had a total of five passes defended through the first three games of this season.

• Georgia Tech's defense recorded 12 quarterback hurries. Coming into the game, Georgia Tech had been credited with two quarterback hurries this season.

• Georgia Tech rushed for 232 yards, its second-highest rushing output of the season (243 vs. Western Carolina – Sept. 10) and its most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since it ran for 270 yards last season at Virginia (Oct. 23, 2021).

• Georgia Tech's 232 rushing yards were 133 more than Pitt was allowing on average this season coming into Saturday's game (98.5 rushing yards per game) and the most surrendered by Pitt since Boston College ran for 264 yards against the Panthers on Nov. 30, 2019.

• So. PK **Gavin Stewart** made a career-high four field goals from 37, 33, 40 and 30 yards (prev.: 2 at NC State – Dec. 5, 2020). Prior to last Saturday, his two FGM at NC State in 2020 were the only FGM of his career.

• Stewart's four field goals made were the most in a game by a Georgia Tech kicker since Wesley Wells made four, including the overtime game-winner, in a 30-27 win over Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018, and the most by a Yellow Jacket in a regulation game since current Kansas City Chiefs PK Harrison Butker made four in Tech's 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016).

• Sr. LB **Charlie Thomas**, who did not play until the second half due to a targeting penalty at UCF on Sept. 24, became only the third Georgia Tech player since 2000 with a fumble recovery and an interception in the same game (prev.: Quayshawn Nealy vs. Syracuse – 2013 and vs. NC State – 2014; and Bruce Jordan-Swilling vs. Virginia – 2017).

• r-Sr. LB **Ayinde Eley** registered 14 tackles, marking the fourth time in five games this season that he has recorded double-digit tackles.

• r-Sr. RB **Hassan Hall** rushed for 157 yards on 20 carries (7.8 yards per carry). The 157 rushing yards surpassed his season total going into last Saturday's game (103 yards over four games) and was the second-highest total of his five-year collegiate career (behind only his 162 yards last season vs. Virginia while playing for Louisville).

• Hall became the first player to carry the ball at least 20 times and average at least 7.8 yards per rush against Pitt since West Virginia's Steve Slaton ran for 215 yards on 23 carries (9.3 avg.) against the Panthers in 2006.

• Interim head coach **Brent Key** became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher – L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee – 1972; Pepper Rodgers – L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame – 1974; Bill Curry – L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama – 1980; Mac McWhorter – W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford – 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins – L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson – 2019).

GEORGIA TECH-DUKE SERIES HISTORY

• Saturday's game is the 90th all-time between Georgia Tech and Duke.

• The Yellow Jackets and Blue Devils first met on the grid-iron in 1933 and have played every year since.

• Georgia Tech holds a commanding 53-35-1 advantage in the all-time series.

• Duke is Tech's third-most common opponent all-time.

• When Tech didn't play Georgia in 2020 for the first time since 1925 due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Yellow Jackets' series versus Duke became their longest current continuous series.

• Saturday's game will end Georgia Tech's and Duke's 90-year run of annual matchups, as the ACC's new football scheduling model, which goes into effect next season, keeps Tech and Duke off each others' schedules until 2025.

• Georgia Tech is 25-7 overall against Duke since 1990. However, after the Yellow Jackets came out on top 18 times in a 19-year stretch from 1995-2013, the Blue Devils have won five of the last eight games in the series.

• Tech has won the last two meetings (56-33 in 2020 and 31-27 last season), giving it consecutive wins over Duke for the first time since 2012-13.

• The Yellow Jackets have been especially dominant against the Blue Devils in Atlanta, as the Jackets are 30-14-1 all-time against the Devils at home and have won 11 of the last 13 matchups at Bobby Dodd Stadium, dating back to 1996.

• The Georgia Tech-Duke series is not exactly known for down-to-the-wire finishes. Of the 61 meetings since 1961, only 11 have been decided by seven points or less. Since 2000, the only GT-Duke games decided by less than seven points were Duke's 31-25 win at Bobby Dodd Stadium in 2014, Georgia Tech's 38-35 home win in 2016 and last year's 31-27 barn-burner at Duke.

NOTING LAST SEASON'S WIN AT DUKE

• Adonias Sanders hauled in a 36-yard touchdown pass from **Jeff Sims** with 51 seconds to go to lift Georgia Tech to a heart-stopping 31-27 triumph over Duke on Oct. 9, 2021 at soggy Wallace Wade Stadium.

• Trailing 27-24 and with no timeouts, Georgia Tech started its game-winning touchdown drive on its own 12 yard line with just 1:42 to go in the game. The Yellow Jackets needed just 51 seconds to march 88 yards in six plays for the winning touchdown.

• Facing third-and-6 from the Duke 36 yard line, Sims threw into the end zone for Sanders, who made an over-the-shoulder catch in tight coverage for the go-ahead score.

• The game-winning touchdown pass from Sims to Sanders marked the first time since a 17-14 win over Boston College in the 2016 season opener in Dublin, Ireland that Tech scored a go-ahead, game-winning touchdown with less than a minute to go in regulation.

• The Yellow Jackets jumped out to a 14-0 lead just 8:07 into the game and led 24-17 going into the fourth quarter, but Duke stormed back to take a 27-24 lead on a 22-yard field goal with 5:06 remaining.

• The win was Georgia Tech's first at Duke since 2013, snapping a three-game losing streak for the Yellow Jackets at Wallace Wade Stadium.

• LB **Ayinde Eley** was named ACC Linebacker of the Week after recording a then-career-high 14 tackles, including 1.5 for loss.



HOMECOMING AT GEORGIA TECH

• Saturday marks Georgia Tech's 73rd homecoming game. The Institute began celebrating homecoming in 1949.

• Georgia Tech is an impressive 53-18-1 all-time in homecoming contests.

• For only the second time in program history, Georgia Tech has lost three-straight homecoming games (2018, 2019 and 2021 — there was no homecoming game in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic). The Yellow Jackets also lost three-straight homecoming games from 1980-82. Tech has never lost four homecoming games in a row.

• Despite the three-consecutive defeats, the Yellow Jackets have won five of the last eight, eight of the last 12 and 20 of their last 25 homecoming games.

• Duke is Georgia Tech's homecoming opponent for the 24th time, making the Blue Devils the Yellow Jackets' most common homecoming opponent. Tulane (7) has been the Yellow Jackets' second-most-common homecoming opponent.

OFFENSE

• The continued transformation of Georgia Tech's offense from an option scheme to a pro-style spread attack received a boost this offseason with the hire of four new assistant coaches on the offensive side of the ball, highlighted by offensive coordinator **Chip Long**.

• A 16-year Division I coaching veteran, including 14 at the major-conference level, Long has helped lead teams to 13 bowl games over the past 16 seasons. He has five years of experience as offensive coordinator, including ultra-successful stints at Memphis (2016) and Notre Dame (2017-19).

• Among all currently active offensive coordinators, Long was the sixth-highest-rated OC in the nation during his four-year stint with Memphis and ND, according to analytics produced by *SportsSource Analytics/Coaches By The Numbers*. Among current offensive coordinators, Long is one of only four OCs to receive a five-star rating from *Coaches By The Numbers* from 2016-19, joining Oklahoma's Bill Bedenbaugh, Ohio State's Kevin Wilson and Penn State's Mike Yurcich.

• Through five games with Long at the helm of the Yellow Jackets' offense, Georgia Tech is tied for 17th nationally and third in the ACC with just four turnovers (0.8 per game).

• Tech also ranks in the top 25 nationally in fewest fumbles lost (2 - 21st) and fewest passes intercepted (2 - 21st).

• The Yellow Jackets' ball protection marks quite the turnaround from just two seasons ago, when they ranked 125th out of 127 teams nationally with 25 turnovers (2.5 per game) in 2020. The Jackets improved to 44th nationally with 15 turnovers last season (1.25 per game).

• Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has had an average of 1.2 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.8 turnovers per game in losses.

• Last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt, Tech put on a dominant display on the ground, rushing for 232 yards against the Panthers' vaunted defense.

• The Yellow Jackets' 232 rushing yards against Pitt was their second-highest rushing output of the season (243 vs. Western Carolina – Sept. 10) and their most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since it ran for 270 yards last season at Virginia (Oct. 23, 2021).

• Tech's 232 rushing yards last Saturday were 133 more than Pitt was allowing on average this season going into the game (98.5 rushing yards per game) and the most surrendered by Pitt in any game since Boston College ran for 264 yards against the Panthers on Nov. 30, 2019.

• Despite moving to a pro-style offense in 2019, a dominant ground game remains imperative for the Jackets' success, as Tech has run for at least 230 yards in five of its last 10 wins.

• The Yellow Jackets' offense broke out for 452 yards of total offense at UCF (Sept. 24), their highest yardage total in a single game since they had 570 yards in a 48-40 loss at Virginia on Oct. 23 of last season.

• Georgia Tech's 452 total yards against UCF were 180 more than the Knights had previously allowed on average this season. UCF's 271.3 yards allowed per game ranked 19th nationally going into the game.

• Tech's 314 passing yards against UCF were 192 more than the Knights had previously allowed on average this season. UCF's 121.7 passing yards allowed per game ranked seventh nationally going into the game.

• Georgia Tech has totaled at least 400 yards of offense in 12-of-26 games dating back to the beginning of the 2020 season. Prior to the beginning of the 2020 season, the Jackets had gone 16 games without compiling 400 yards of total offense (dating back to Nov. 3, 2018).

• Georgia Tech's 21 pass completions against UCF were its eighth-most in a game in the last 20 years.

• Twenty of the Yellow Jackets' 26 highest completion totals since the beginning of the 2002 season have come in their last 36 games.

• Sims is the first Georgia Tech signal-caller to start three-straight season openers since Justin Thomas (2014-16).

• In 2020, Sims became the first true freshman to start the season at quarterback for Georgia Tech since Reggie Ball in 2003.

• In just 22 collegiate games (he was limited to 10 games in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic and seven last season due to injury), Sims has accounted for 5,246 yards of total offense (4,190 passing, 1,056 rushing) and 39 touchdowns (28 passing, 11 rushing).

• Sims also ranks eighth in Georgia Tech history in passing yards, seventh in touchdown passes, seventh in completions (335) and fifth in completion percentage (.570).

• Sims turned in perhaps the finest performances of his career last season at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, when he returned from an injury sustained in the season opener versus Northern Illinois and came off the bench to lead Georgia Tech to a 45-22 victory over No. 20/21 North Carolina (Sept. 25).

RUNNING BACKS

• For the second-straight season, Georgia Tech is deploying a three-headed monster at running back in r-Jr. **Dontae Smith**, r-Jr. **Dylan McDuffie** and Sr. **Hassan Hall**.

• Through five games this season, the trio has combined for 496 rushing yards and four touchdowns while splitting 99 carries (44 carries for 260 yards for Hall, 33 carries for 191 yards and three touchdowns for Smith, 22 carries for 45 yards for McDuffie).

• The trio has also combined to catch 20 passes out of the backfield through five games (nine receptions for Hall, six for Smith and five for McDuffie).

• Hall was the hot hand last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt, rushing for 157 yards on 20 carries (7.8 yards per carry), en route to being named the ACC Running Back of the Week.

• Hall's 157 rushing yards at Pitt surpassed his season total going into game (103 yards over four games).

• In his first season with the Yellow Jackets after transferring from Louisville, Hall's 157 yards against Pitt was the second-highest rushing total of his five-year collegiate career (behind only his 162 yards last season vs. Virginia while playing for UL).

• Hall's 157 yards against Pitt were the most rushing yards by any player against the Panthers since Boston College's (and current Green Bay Packer) A.J. Dillon ran for 162 yards against Pitt in 2019.

• Hall became the first player to carry the ball at least 20 times and average at least 7.8 yards per rush against Pitt since West Virginia's Steve Slaton ran for 215 yards on 23 carries (9.3 avg.) against the Panthers in 2006.

• Hall is one of only 11 NCAA Division I FBS players and two ACC players this season to average at least 7.8 yards per carry in a game while carrying the ball at least 20 times. He is the only player to accomplish the feat against a nationally ranked opponent.

• Over the past two games (Sept. 24 at UCF, last Saturday at Pitt), Hall has accounted for 328 all-purpose yards.

• Hall's 164 all-purpose yards at UCF (54 rushing, 40 receiving, 70 kickoff return) and 161 all-purpose yards at Pitt (157 rushing, 4 receiving) are easily the two highest all-purpose yardage totals by a Yellow Jacket this season (prev.: 107 by **Nate McCollum** vs. Western Carolina – Sept. 10).

• An Atlanta native, Hall returned home after amassing 3,843 all-purpose yards (1,299 rushing, 175 receiving, 2,369 kickoff return) and 13 touchdowns (11 rushing, two kickoff return) in his four seasons at Louisville.

OFFENSE

- Hall earned second-team all-ACC honors as an all-purpose back and third-team recognition as a return specialist as a sophomore in 2019, when he rushed for 501 yards and five touchdowns, caught 12 passes for 99 yards and averaged 30.5 yards per kickoff return (good for third nationally).
- Smith turned in the best performance of his career when he exploded for 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns on just 11 carries in Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Western Carolina (Sept. 10).
- The 100-yard rushing game was the first of Smith's career and his 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns were both career highs (prev.: 82 rushing yards vs. Kennesaw State on Sept. 11, 2021 and two rushing touchdowns vs. Duke on Nov. 28, 2020).
- Smith is one of only five NCAA Division I FBS players (and one of three running backs) to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game this season.

- Against WCU, Smith became the first Georgia Tech running back to run for at least 100 yards and three touchdowns in a game since Synjyn Days ran for 171 yards and three scores in a 49-34 win over No. 8 Mississippi State in the 2014 Orange Bowl (three GT QBs have accomplished the feat during that span — **Jeff Sims** vs. North Carolina, 2022; Tobias Oliver at Virginia Tech, 2018; and TaQuon Marshall vs. Tennessee, 2017).
- Smith is averaging a gaudy 6.0 yards per rush for his career (930 yards on 154 carries).
- Smith has scored 10 career touchdowns on just 154 carries (one TD every 15.4 carries).
- Smith and Hall ranks at the high end of above-average runners nationally, according to *Pro Football Focus*, which has given them grades of 77.0 and 76.8, respectively, as rushers through five games this season. (*Grades from 68-78 are considered above average in PFF's grading scale*)
- PFF also ranks Hall and Smith as firmly above average as overall offensive players, with Georgia Tech's top two overall offensive grades at 75.0 (Hall) and 71.8 (Smith).
- McDuffie's 2-yard touchdown run against Western Carolina (Sept. 10) was his first as a Yellow Jacket.
- McDuffie came to Georgia Tech after rushing for 1,049 yards last season at Buffalo, en route to third-team all-Mid-American Conference honors.
- McDuffie is used to being a part of a three-man rotation at RB, as he was one of three backs to rush for at least 400 yards for the Bulls in 2021.
- McDuffie averaged 5.2 yards per carry over his four seasons at Buffalo (2018-21), including three seasons with at least 5.0 yards per carry (5.0 in 2018, 6.5 in 2019, 5.1 in 2021).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech's wide receivers corps is led by sixth-year senior **Malachi Carter**.
- Carter tops Georgia Tech's roster with 52 career games. He needs to play in just three more games this season to break Tech's all-time record for games played in a career of 54, which is currently shared by Jamal Golden (2011-15), Jemea Thomas (2009, '11-13), T.J. Barnes (2009-12) and Rod Sweeting (2009-12).
- Carter also ranks 18th in Georgia Tech history with 1,228 career receiving yards.
- On Sept. 17 against Ole Miss, Carter became the first Yellow Jacket to move into Tech's all-time top 20 in receiving yards since Ricky Jeune, who ranks 13th in school history with 1,492 receiving yards from 2015-17.

- Last season, Carter led Georgia Tech in receiving yards (489) and receptions (37) and ranked second on the team in yards per reception (13.2 - min. 10 receptions).
- This season, Carter's 158 receiving yards rank second on the team and his nine receptions are tied for second on the squad.
- Carter's 59-yard touchdown catch at UCF (Sept. 24) was the longest reception of his career (prev.: 54 at NC State – Nov. 21, 2019).
- So, WR **Nate McCollum** leads Georgia Tech in receptions (21) and receiving yards (182) through five games this season.
- McCollum needed just four games to eclipse his career totals for receptions and receiving yards coming into this season (15 receptions for 123 yards over 18 career games from 2020-21).
- McCollum matched a career high with six receptions at UCF (Sept. 24), equaling the career-best six catches that he had in the season opener against No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5).
- Against Western Carolina (Sept. 10), McCollum set a career high with 47 rushing yards (prev.: 7 vs. Duke – Nov. 28, 2020), highlighted by his first-career rushing touchdown, which came from 40 yards out on a reverse.
- McCollum's 69.8 pass offense grade from *Pro Football Focus* leads Georgia Tech's wideouts and ranks second on the team (behind only TE **Dylan Leonard**). (*Grades from 68-78 are considered above average in PFF's grading scale*)

- r-Sr. WR **E.J. Jenkins** is tied for second on the team with nine receptions and ranks third on the squad with 142 receiving yards this season.
- Jenkins' 54 receiving yards were a career high at the NCAA Division I FBS level (prev.: 34 vs. Clemson – Sept. 5).
- Jenkins' one-handed 33-yard reception at Pitt, which helped lead to a field goal on Georgia Tech's opening possession, was his longest catch in two seasons at the NCAA Division I FBS level (2021 at South Carolina, 2022 at Georgia Tech). His previous long FBS reception was a 30-yarder for South Carolina vs. Clemson on Nov. 27, 2021. His previous long at Georgia Tech was a 16-yard touchdown vs. Clemson on Sept. 5 of this season.
- Jenkins' 21-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was his second of the season (prev.: 13 yards vs. Clemson – Sept. 5) and his third at the FBS level (he had a 16-yard touchdown vs. Troy while playing for South Carolina on Oct. 2, 2020).

TIGHT ENDS

- Georgia Tech's tight ends room is led by **Dylan Leonard**, who is in his fourth season with the Yellow Jackets.
- Leonard, a former walk-on, has caught 20 passes for 175 yards over 31 games and 14 starts as a Yellow Jacket.
- Leonard set career highs for receiving yards in three-consecutive games to close last season, with three catches for 21 yards vs. Boston College (Nov. 13), two catches for 28 yards at No. 6 Notre Dame (Nov. 20) and two catches for 43 yards against No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 27).
- Leonard missed the Yellow Jackets' first two games of the season due to injury but made his season debut as a reserve against No. 20/17 Ole Miss (Sept. 17), then made his first start of the season the next week at UCF (Sept. 24).
- In limited action this season, Leonard has caught five passes for 43 yards (8.6 avg.).
- Leonard matched a career high with three receptions last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt (prev.: 3 vs. Boston College - Nov. 13, 2021).
- Leonard's 70.0 pass offense grade from *Pro Football Focus* is the highest on the team (all positions). (*Grades from 68-78 are considered above average in PFF's grading scale*)
- The Jackets' tight ends were bolstered in the offseason by the arrival of **Luke Benson**, who played in 34-of-35 games over the past three seasons at Syracuse and caught 19 passes for 261 yards and five touchdowns with the Orange.
- Through five games as a Yellow Jacket, Benson has hauled in five receptions for 47 yards (9.4 avg.).
- Benson earned third-team freshman all-America honors from *Pro Football Focus* after catching eight passes for 176 yards and three touchdowns as a true freshman in 2019.

• Tech has also ranked among the nation's leaders in total turnovers gained (18 - No. 25 nationally in 2020) and defensive touchdowns (2 - tied for 25th nationally in 2021) over the past two seasons.

• Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 3.1 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 0.9 takeaways per game in losses.

• Last Saturday against No. 24 Pitt, Georgia Tech had three takeaways (two fumble recoveries and an interception), all during a span of five Pitt possessions in the second half. The three takeaways were Tech's most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent this season.

• The Yellow Jackets converted all three takeaways against Pitt into scores (two field goals and a touchdown) to turn a 7-6 halftime deficit into a 19-7 fourth quarter lead.

• Georgia Tech limited Pitt, which entered the game averaging 36 points and 419 yards per game, to just seven points and 244 yards through the first 56 minutes of the game (Pitt put together inconsequential touchdown drives of 99 and 68 yards in the final four minutes of the contest).

• The previous week against UCF (Sept. 24), Georgia Tech's defense limited UCF's high-powered offense to just 333 yards, which was 198 yards fewer than the Knights were previously averaging this season. UCF's 532.3 yards per game ranked sixth nationally going into the game.

• UCF's 4.6 yards per play was its lowest yards-per-play average in any game under head coach Guz Malzahn, who took the helm at UCF prior to the 2021 season.

• Playing on just four days' rest following its season opener against No. 4 Clemson on Labor Day night, Tech allowed Western Carolina to score touchdowns on each of its first two possessions, but rallied to keep WCU out of the end zone for the final 50:37 of the Yellow Jackets' 35-17 win (Sept. 10).

• Tech only allowed Western Carolina to cross midfield three times in its final 11 possessions. The Catamounts only got inside the Yellow Jackets' 35 yard line once during those final 11 possessions.

• Tech's defense forced four turnovers, a turnover on downs and three punts while surrendering only a fourth-quarter field goal over WCU's final 11 possessions.

DEFENSE

• The Jackets' four takeaways against WCU were their most in a game since they forced five turnovers in a 56-33 win over Duke on Nov. 28, 2020 and marked only the third time since 2015 that they have recorded at least four takeaways in a game.

• Georgia Tech's three interceptions against WCU were its most in a game since it had three in a 38-28 win at North Carolina on Nov. 3, 2018.

• Georgia Tech's defense turned in a solid performance in the season opener against No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5), especially for the first two-and-a-half quarters of the game.

• Tech's defense forced five punts (including four three-and-outs) and a turnover on the Clemson's first eight possessions. The Tigers averaged just 18.5 yards per possession over those first eight series.

• The Yellow Jackets also limited Clemson to just four plays of 20 or more yards and none longer than 29 yards. Over the last six games of last season, Tech opponents averaged 7.2 offensive plays of 20-plus yards and 3.3 plays of 30-plus yards per contest.

• For the first month of last season, Georgia Tech's defense was one of the top units in the country statistically, as it ranked in the top 35 nationally in seven different statistical categories through four games.

• However, the Yellow Jackets' defense went through perhaps the most challenging stretch in all of college football over the last nine games of last season, highlighted by facing five teams that finished ranked among the top 30 nationally in total offense — No. 11 North Carolina, No. 2 Pitt, No. 31 Duke, No. 5 Virginia, No. 28 Miami (Fla.) and No. 26 Georgia.

• Additionally, during that same stretch, the Jackets faced four quarterbacks that ranked among the 20 nationally and five QBs that ranked among the top 40 nationally in passing efficiency — No. 4 Stetson Bennett (Jr. - Georgia), No. 8 Kenny Pickett (Sr. - Pitt), No. 13 Tyler Van Dyke (So. - Miami), No. 17 Brennan Armstrong (Jr. - Virginia), No. 18 Sam Howell (Jr. - North Carolina) and No. 37 Jack Coan (Sr. - Notre Dame).

• Georgia Tech's defensive struggles in the second half of last season can be attributed in large part to explosive plays.

Oct. 30 vs. Virginia Tech

• Against Virginia Tech, nearly half of the yards that Georgia Tech allowed (232-of-491) came on just six plays. On VT's other 72 snaps, Georgia Tech surrendered just 3.6 yards per play (259 total yards) while keeping the Hokies out of the end zone over the final three quarters of the game.

Nov. 6 at Miami (Fla.)

• Against Miami, the Hurricanes gained 356 of their 563 yards in just 13 plays. The Yellow Jackets allowed just 3.3 yards per play on Miami's other 63 snaps (207 total yards).

Nov. 13 vs. Boston College

• Against Boston College, the Eagles gained 322 of their 505 yards on just 12 plays. BC averaged just 3.8 yards per play on its other 48 snaps (183 total yards).

Nov. 20 at Notre Dame

• For the fourth-straight week, explosive plays were Tech's downfall on defense at No. 6 Notre Dame, as the Fighting Irish gained 371 of their 514 yards on just 13 plays. ND averaged just 3.1 yards per play on its other 46 snaps.

INDIVIDUAL

• Sixth-year Sr. LB **Ayinde Eley** is putting together a historic campaign through five games this season.

• Eley has compiled 56 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, three sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries through five games this season.

• Eley ranks among the nation's top 10 in five different individual statistical categories.

• Perhaps most remarkably, Eley is the first NCAA Division I FBS player since at least 2000 with as many as 56 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, three sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries through his team's first five games of the season. • For the ninth time in his 16 games as a Yellow Jacket and the fifth time in five games this season, Eley led Georgia Tech in tackles with 14 last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt.

• In the Yellow Jackets' season opener against No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5), Eley had a game-high 11 tackles and forced and recovered a fumble to thwart a Clemson scoring opportunity in the first quarter, making him one of only five student-athletes in all of NCAA Division I FBS that has registered at least 11 tackles, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in a single game this season.

• A graduate transfer from Maryland, Eley made an impressive debut in White and Gold last season, as he ranked second on team, fifth in ACC and 48th nationally with 90 total tackles (8.2 per game) in first season at Georgia Tech.

• Eley was one of only 10 ACC student-athletes to record at least 14 tackles in a game last season and one of only three players that accomplished the feat twice.

• Eley, who made 11 starts over three seasons at Maryland, was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection as a sophomore in 2019 after recording 79 tackles, four tackles for loss, a half-sack, two fumble recoveries, an interception and five passes defended in 11 games (nine starts).

• Eley was one of only three Power Five conference players to record at least 75 tackles, four TFL, two fumble recoveries and five passes defended in 2019, joining Miami's Shaq Quarterman and Utah's Terrell Burgess.

• Sr. LB **Charlie Thomas** has also had a historic start to the 2022 season, especially considering he has played the equivalent of less than 15 quarters through five games due to being disqualified from the season opener vs. No. 4 Clemson (Sept. 5) due to a third-quarter targeting penalty, then being forced to sit out the first half of the Yellow Jackets' game against Western Carolina (Sept. 10) as a result of the penalty, being disqualified once again due to a targeting call early in the fourth quarter at UCF (Sept. 24) and sitting out the first half of last Saturday's game at No. 24 Pitt.

• In less than 15 quarters of play this season, Thomas has racked up 38 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, a sack, an interception and a forced fumble.

• Last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt, Georgia Tech limited Pitt to just 105 total yards and forced three turnovers in the Panthers' first five second-half possessions with Thomas on the field, which helped the Yellow Jackets turn a 7-6 halftime deficit into a commanding 19-7 lead early in the fourth quarter.

• At UCF (Sept. 24), the Knights scored just 16 points through 49 minutes with Thomas on the field, but scored 11 points in the final 11 minutes of the game after Thomas was disqualified due to a targeting call.

• Clemson, who scored just 14 points in 39 minutes prior to Thomas' disqualification in the season opener (Sept. 5), scored 27 points in 21 minutes after Thomas left the game.

• Thomas was a force to be reckoned with throughout the 2021 season, particularly in Georgia Tech's 45-22 win over No. 21/20 North Carolina (Sept. 25).

• In last season's romp over No. 21/20 UNC and its potent offense at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, Thomas recorded 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles, en route to being named ACC co-Linebacker of the Week.

• Thomas was one of only three student-athletes from a Power Five conference and five NCAA Division I FBS players overall with 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles in a game in 2021.

• Thomas' 2.5 sacks/4.5 TFL/eight total tackles performance last season against UNC was also only the 11th by an ACC player since 2000.

• With four career interceptions, Thomas is one of only four Georgia Tech linebackers with as many as four INT since 2000, joining Brant Mitchell (4 - 2015-18), Quayshawn Nealy (8 - 2011-14) and Philip Wheeler (4 - 2005-07).

• Georgia Tech has received the much-anticipated services of a healthy **Keion White** this season, as the r-Sr. DL is ranked second in the ACC and 21st nationally with four sacks this season (0.8/gm).

• White, who was limited to just four games and four total tackles due to an injury last season, tied for 10th in NCAA Division I FBS with 19 tackles for loss at Old Dominion in 2019.

• White had 2.0 sacks in his first extensive playing time with the Yellow Jackets in the season opener against Clemson (Sept. 5). He became one of only three Yellow Jackets to record two or more sacks in a game since the beginning of last season (Thomas — 2.5 and **Kyle Kennard** — 2.0 vs. North Carolina, 9/25/2021 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium).

• White represented Georgia Tech on *The Athletic's* Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks List" this season due to the 6-5, 286-pounder's ability to run at 21 miles per hour and bench press 225 pounds 38 times, along with a 32-inch vertical jump.

• True Fr. **Clayton Powell-Lee** recorded the first fumble recovery of his collegiate career last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt.

• r-Jr. DB **Jaylon King** recorded the first forced fumble of his collegiate career last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt.

• So. DB **LaMiles Brooks** recorded the first interception of his collegiate career at UCF (Sept. 24).

• King recorded the first interception of his collegiate career against No. 20/17 Ole Miss (Sept. 17).

• r-Jr. DBs **Derrick Allen** and **Myles Sims** both recorded the first interceptions of their collegiate careers against Western Carolina (Sept. 10).

• Seven defensive players that have played at least 125 snaps for Georgia Tech this season have above average defensive grades for the season from *Pro Football Focus* — DB **LaMiles Brooks** (82.5), DL **D'Quan Douse** (72.0), LB **Charlie Thomas** (74.3), DL **Keion White** (73.7), LB **Ayinde Eley** (71.0), DL **Sylvain Yondjouen** (71.0) and DB **Miles Sims** (69.2). (Grades from 68-78 are considered above average in PFF's grading scale)

SPECIAL TEAMS

• After ranking 10th in the ACC and 68th nationally in kick-off returns and last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns last season, Georgia Tech is off to an encouraging start in the return game in 2022.

• Through five games, Tech leads the ACC and ranks ninth nationally in punt returns (17.0 avg.) and is seventh in the ACC and 32nd nationally in kickoff returns (23.5 avg.).

• Individually, Sr. **Hassan Hall** ranks fourth in the ACC in kickoff return average (27.4 avg.).

• So. **Nate McCollum's** 17.0-yard punt return average would lead the ACC in punt return average (17.0 avg.) and rank eighth nationally if he met the minimum number of returns to be included in the official NCAA and ACC rankings (1.2 returns per game are needed for NCAA and 1.0 for ACC; McCollum currently averages 0.8 returns per game).

• After having never played in an American football game prior to the season opener, So. P **David Shanahan** averaged a solid 41.5 yards per punt over 61 attempts as a true freshman in 2021.

• Through five games as a sophomore (and just 17 games of American football games in his life), Shanahan has taken his game to the next level, as he ranks third in the ACC and 25th nationally in punting at 44.6 yards per punt this season.

• Of Shanahan's 28 punts this season, eight have traveled 50 or more yards and six have been downed inside the opponent's 20 yard line.

• Shanahan averaged a whopping 52.7 yards per punt in his debut against Northern Illinois last season (Sept. 4, 2021), which is tied for the seventh-best single-game punting average in Georgia Tech history.

• In the first extensive action of his career as a place kicker, Georgia Tech So. PK **Gavin Stewart** was named ACC Specialist of the Week following his performance last Saturday at No. 24 Pitt.

• Stewart, who had only attempted four field goals in his career going into last week's game (2-for-4), made a career-high four field goals from 37, 33, 40 and 30 yards (prev.: 2 at NC State – Dec. 5, 2020). He accounted for 14 total points (including two PAT) in the 26-21 win over Pitt.

• Stewart's four field goals made against Pitt were the most in a game by a Georgia Tech kicker since Wesley Wells made four, including the overtime game-winner, in a 30-27 win over Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018, and the most by a Yellow Jacket in a regulation game since current Kansas City Chiefs PK Harrison Butker made four in Tech's 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016).

• Stewart became only the ninth player in Georgia Tech history to make as many as four field goals in a game.

• Stewart has picked up right where he left off in 2021 by forcing touchbacks on 11 of his 16 kickoffs in three games this season (he's missed games vs. Ole Miss and UCF due to injury).

• Last season, Stewart put 36 of his 52 kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks last season, while nine others were fair-caught and only seven were returned.

• r-Fr. PK **Jude Kelley's** 45-yard field goal against Clemson (Sept. 5) was a career long, surpassing his 32-yard game-winner against Florida State as a true freshman in 2020, and the longest by a Georgia Tech kicker since Wesley Wells' 48-yarder vs. Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018.

• Kelley is an astounding 5-for-5 for his career on onside kick attempts, including 3-for-3 last season.

• On the strength of three outstanding fourth-quarter kickoffs in Georgia Tech's 48-40 loss at Virginia last season (Oct. 23, 2021) – including two successful onside kicks in the final 80 seconds of the game – Kelley was named the ACC Specialist of the Week.

• Kelley perfectly executed a pair of onside kicks – one with 1:16 remaining in the game and one with 20 seconds to go – that helped the Yellow Jackets nearly erase a 21-point deficit in the final four minutes of their 48-40 defeat at UVA.

• Thanks in large part to the successful onside kicks, which were recovered by **Malachi Carter** and Juanyeh Thomas, respectively, Tech was able to rally from a 48-27 deficit with 3:50 remaining in the game to cut it 48-40 and had the ball at the UVA 31 yard line as time expired.

• Earlier in the fourth quarter at Virginia, Kelley also executed a perfectly placed sky kick that pinned UVA at its own 4 yard line.

• Kelley and the Yellow Jackets also pulled off a perfectly executed onside kick in the fourth quarter of its upset bid at No. 6 Clemson (Sept. 18). With the Yellow Jackets trailing 14-6 with 1:19 to go in the ballgame, Kelley's onside kick was recovered by Carter to give the Jackets possession with an opportunity to tie the game (Tech drove 51 yards in 1:04 after recovering the onside kick, but its potential game-tying drive stalled at the 1 yard line with 15 seconds left on the clock).

• As a team, Georgia Tech has had six successful onside kicks in its last 24 games. The Yellow Jackets also recovered two onside kicks by Kelley in 2020 against Notre Dame (Oct. 31) and Boston College (Oct. 24), as well as one by former GT PK Brenton King in the 2019 season finale versus Georgia (Nov. 30).

• Georgia Tech has blocked five kicks in the last 34 games.

• Prior to blocking five kicks in the past 34 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 24 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the ninth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

MISCELLANEOUS

• Interim head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when Tech knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, last Saturday.

• Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher – L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee – 1972; Pepper Rodgers – L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame – 1974; Bill Curry – L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama – 1980; Mac McWhorter – W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford – 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins – L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson – 2019).

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the past two seasons. In their eight wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in seven of eight games and are plus-16 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 14 of its 18 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-20 overall in turnover margin in those 18 losses.

• Through five games this season, Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC and ninth nationally in turnover margin at plus-seven (1.40/gm). The Yellow Jackets are 15th nationally in takeaways (11) and 17th nationally in fewest giveaways (4).

• Georgia Tech fields one of the nation's youngest teams in 2022, as 79.4% of its roster is comprised of underclassmen, which is the highest percentage among Power Five conference teams and the second-highest overall in NCAA Division I FBS (credit: University of Colorado).
