GAME INFO

ACC COASTAL CHAMPIONS

- North Carolina is the final winner of the ACC Coastal Division with the ACC removing divisions heading into next season. The Tar Heels are a perfect 6-0 in conference play and 9-1 overall. This marks the fourth time since 1980 that UNC has started a season 9-1 (2022, '15, 1997, '80).
- UNC is 6-0 on the road for the first time in school history. It is the only school in the country with six road wins, and the six consecutive road wins is the second-longest active streak in the nation.

TAR HEELS AND JACKETS

- North Carolina and Georgia Tech are meeting for the 57th time, and the Yellow Jackets hold a 31-22-3 lead in the series.
- This will be the first game played between the two ACC Coastal Division rivals in Chapel Hill since 2018.
- They did not play in 2020 after the schedule was reconfigured due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The two squads had met every season between 1980-2019.
- UNC is 13-11-2 all-time at home against GT.
- The series dates back to 1915 when the Jackets started a streak of four-straight victories that year with a 23-3 win in Atlanta.
- UNC's first win came on the road in 1929 by a margin of 18-7.

LAST TIME OUT

- Carolina went to Winston-Salem and earned their sixth road win of the season over Wake Forest, 36-34, to clinch the ACC Coastal. Drake Maye threw for 448 yards and three TDs, while running for 71 yards and a TD.
- Georgia Tech fell to Miami in Atlanta, 35-14, to drop to 4-6 on the season.

BROWN VS. GEORGIA TECH

- North Carolina head coach Mack Brown owns a 7-4-1 record against Georgia Tech.
- Brown is 6-2 over his last eight meetings with the Yellow Jackets that spans the 1992-97 and 2019 and 2021 seasons.
- Saturday will be Brown's first game against Georgia Tech at home since returning to UNC in 2019.

CAROLINA IN THE POLLS

- Carolina is ranked No. 13 in the Associated Press poll this week. The Tar Heels sit at No. 11 in the Amway Coaches Poll.

UP NEXT

- Carolina closes out the regular season at home against NC State on Friday, Nov. 25. Kickoff on ABC is scheduled for 3:30 p.m.

• The University of North Carolina football program has launched the Bill Koman Game Plan for Success to provide football student-athletes the skill set to thrive on and off the field, while providing resources to understand and effectively navigate potential name, image and likeness opportunities that may arise in the future.

• The Koman Game Plan for Success, which was created thanks to a generous gift from Jim and Jennifer Koman in honor of Jim's father Bill, follows the motto of the football program; attending Carolina is not a four-year decision, it's a 40-year decision. It provides training and support for football student-athletes throughout their time at Carolina and into their post-graduate lives. Programming centers on preparing student-athletes for their college career and beyond through academic assessment, study and learning skills preparation, leadership development, community involvement and career opportunities.

CHRIS SMITH FIELD AT KENAN STADIUM

• The Eddie and Jo Allison Smith Foundation made a transformational gift in 2020 to support the Carolina football program with resources to build on its recent success and secure future excellence. The field at Kenan Stadium is now Chris Smith Field, recognizing the Smith Family and their son Chris, a 1987 graduate of Carolina.

• The family foundation is headed by longtime Carolina leader and benefactor Eddie Smith Jr. '65 of Greenville, North Carolina, and was cofounded with his late wife Jo Allison Smith. Their gift will support staffing needs, fund facility improvements and help build an endowment to cover future operating costs.

CAROLINA ALL-AMERICANS

• The Carolina football program has developed 73 student-athletes, who combined to earn 90 All-America honors. Of those 90 honors, 20 were earned under Mack Brown's guidance. Of note, current cornerbacks coach Dre Bly garnered three first-team honors, two of which came with Brown at the helm.

KENAN FOOTBALL CENTER CONSTRUCTION

• The Kenan Football Center is getting an update with the addition of a new state-of-the-art training room and player's lounge. The 7,100-square-foot training room will have all the normal amenities along with an Alter G Treadmill and Hydrotherapy Room with hot and cold plunge pools and an underwater treadmill. The Player's Lounge will contain a sleep room with sleep pods, a recovery room with zero gravity and massage chairs, a study lounge, barber shop and an audio/video editing suite for NIL opportunities. The Player's Lounge will connect to an outdoor courtyard that will sit on top of the new training room. The patio

will have covered space for dining, grills and fire pits, a half-court basketball area and much more.

CAROLINA AND THE NFL DRAFT

• The Carolina football program has produced 257 NFL Draft picks. Of those selections, the Tar Heels have produced 24 first-round selections, the most of any school in the state of North Carolina, ahead of NC State (18), Duke (6) and Wake Forest (5).

FAMILY AFFAIR

• The UNC football lettermen have taken to calling themselves the Carolina Football Family, and nowhere is that more evident than this year's roster. The 2022 Tar Heels have eight players who are sons of former Tar Heels, who all played for Mack Brown. In addition, cornerbacks coach Dre Bly is the uncle of freshman wide receiver Josh Downs.

• As for the second generation Tar Heels, **Jefferson Boaz's** father Jay Boaz played for Coach Brown at UNC from 1991-94.

Christopher Holliday is the son of Tar Heel great and current Associate Athletic Director for Football **Corey Holliday** (1990-93). **Caleb and Kellan Hood** are the sons of Errol Hood, who was recruited by Brown and played at UNC from 1998-2001. **Drake Maye** is the son of Mark Maye, who played for the Tar Heels from 1983-88, and the brother of Luke, a former Carolina basketball great from 2015-19. **Deems May** is the son of Deems May, who played with the Tar Heels from 1987-91, **Jeffrey Saturday** is the son of Jeff Saturday, who played at Carolina from 1994-97; and **Will Crowley** is the son of Pat Crowley, who spent his time at UNC from 1986-89.

• **Thomas Flynn** is the son of Keith Flynn, who played football at Carolina and is a 1983 grad.

• UNC currently has eight former players on staff that played for Coach Brown during his first stint in Chapel Hill. Six of the eight went on to play in the NFL. **Tommy Thigpen** (Co-DC/ILB) and **Dre Bly** (CB) serve as assistant coaches, while **Natrone Means** joined the staff in 2021 as an offensive analyst. **Corey Holliday** serves as the Associate Athletic Director for Football, **Rick Steinbacher** is a Senior Associate A.D., who is the football sport administrator, and **Kevin Donnalley** who takes over as the Director of the Koman Game Plan for Success. In addition, **Dwight Hollier** is the department's Senior Associate A.D. for Student-Athlete Health, Well-Being and Program Outreach, while **Clint Gwaltney** is the Senior Associate A.D. for Event Management.

• In addition, Tar Heel great **Da'Norris Searcy** joined the staff to serve as the Director of Football Student-Athlete Development.

MACK FACTS

ACTIVE CAREER WINS LEADER

With 274 career victories, Mack Brown ranks second among active coaches. He trails Nick Saban at Alabama (277) and is followed by Brian Kelly at LSU (271), Kirk Ferentz at Iowa (196) and Willie Fritz at Tulane (193). Brown's 274 wins rank eighth on the NCAA all-time list for coaches with at least 10 years at an FBS institution. He has won 158 games at Texas, 99 at UNC, 11 at Tulane and six at Appalachian State.

ONE OF FIVE WITH A TITLE

Mack Brown is one of only five active head coaches who has won a National Championship. Brown, who won the title with Texas following the 2005 season, is accompanied by Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Nick Saban (Alabama), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson).

BROWN BECOMES UNC'S WINS LEADER

Mack Brown took over as the Tar Heels' all-time wins leader after the 20-17 victory over Duke on Oct 26, 2019. Brown surpassed Dick Crum, who posted 72 victories from 1978-87.

10-WIN SEASONS

Mack Brown has led his teams to 12 seasons of 10 or more victories during his career. He led UNC to three 10-win campaigns in his first stint with the program before guiding Texas to nine consecutive seasons of 10 wins or more. Brown posted his first 10-win season in 1993 and the Tar Heels went on to post 10 wins in 1996 and '97.

BROWN IN THE POLLS

Mack Brown-led teams have finished ranked in the final Top 25 polls 17 times during his coaching career. He led Texas to 12 Top-25 finishes and UNC to five. Of the 17 occasions, Brown's teams have finished in the Top 10 nine times, including six Top-5 finishes.

BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

Mack Brown has produced 140 NFL Draft picks, including 26 first-round selections and 19 second-round picks. During his first stint at UNC, Brown guided 64 players who would go on to be drafted, including nine first-rounders and 10 second-rounders. Of note, Brown's 1996 Carolina roster saw 22 players go on to have their names called at the NFL Draft.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

The Tar Heels have been deadly in the red zone this season. Carolina has scored on 43-of-47 possessions (91.5%) in the scoring area that didn't end in kneel downs, with 37 of those instances resulting in touchdowns (78.7%). That 78.7% clip ranks fifth nationally and fourth in the Power 5. On drives that Drake Maye has finished that didn't end in a kneel down, the Heels have scored TDs on 37-of-44 possessions (84.1%), which would lead the nation. In red zone trips, Maye has gone 42-of-63 for 352 yards and 22 TDs, to go along with five rushing TDs.

FOCUSED ON 4TH DOWN

UNC has been one of the most effective offenses on fourth down in the nation in 2022. The Heels have converted 16-of-23 fourth downs (69.6%). The 16 conversions include four TDs, nine that led to TDs, and one that ended a game. Drake Maye has gone 8-of-12 for 132 yards and four TDs on fourth down. He's also produced three rushing conversions, totaling 43 yards. Meanwhile, the Carolina defense has only allowed 12-of-24 fourth-down conversions (50%).

600+/700+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE

• North Carolina has eclipsed the 600-yard mark seven times since the start of the 2019 season. The most recent occurrence came on Aug. 27 when UNC posted 608 yards against Florida A&M.

• The Tar Heels reached 700-plus yards twice during the 2020 season. Carolina had 742 yards against Wake Forest and set a program record with 778 yards at Miami.

500+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE

• North Carolina has recorded 500-plus yards of total offense 23 times in 46 games dating back to the start of the 2019 season, including five of the 10 games in 2022. Carolina's offense recorded 500-plus yards five times in 2021, eight times in 2020 and five times in 2019.

400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE

• North Carolina has notched 400-plus yards of total offense 37 times in 48 games dating back to the start of the 2019 season, including nine of the 10 games in 2022. Carolina's offense recorded 400-plus yards 10 times during both the 2019 and 2020 seasons and eight times in 2021.

30+ POINTS IN 32 OF LAST 48 GAMES

• North Carolina's offense has scored 30 or more points in 32 of the last 48 games dating back to the start of the 2019 season. The Tar Heels have reached 30-plus points in nine of 10 games in 2022.

40-OR-MORE POINTS SINCE 2019

• North Carolina has scored 40 or more points 18 times since the start of the 2019 season. The Tar Heels have reached 40-plus points in four games in 2022. UNC scored 40 or more points six times in 2020 and three times in 2021.

50-POINT GAMES SINCE 2019

• Carolina has scored 50 or more points in 11 games since the start of the 2019 season. UNC scored 56 points in the 2022 season opener against Florida A&M and 63 the following week at App State.

OFFENSE CONTINUES TO SHINE

• Carolina has posted three of the top five total offense performances in program history since head coach Mack Brown and offensive coordinator Phil Longo arrived in Chapel Hill in 2019.

• The 2022 version of Carolina's offense is currently putting up 505.5 yards per game, the second highest average in program history.

• The Tar Heels set the school record in 2020 with 556.6 yards per game behind an offense that featured five future NFL play makers: QB Sam Howell, running backs Michael Carter and Javonte Williams, and wide receivers Dyami Brown and Dazz Newsome.

EXPLOSIVE PLAY OFFENSE

- In 2021, Carolina led the ACC with eight plays of 60 or more yards, 13 plays of 50+ yards, 22 plays of 40+ yards and 42 plays of 30+ yards.
- Between 2019 and 2021 under the direction of offensive coordinator Phil Longo, UNC's offense led the ACC in plays of 20+ yards (257), 30+ yards (124), 40+ yards (66) and 50+ yards (38).
- Carolina ranks in the top-2 in the ACC thus far in 2022 in all aforementioned long scrimmage play categories.

THE MARVELOUS MR. MAYE

- Drake Maye leads the nation in passing touchdowns (34), total offense (399.6), ranks second in passing yards per game (341.2) and third in passing efficiency (178.9).
- The redshirt freshman is tied for first nationally with 39 total touchdowns (34 pass, 5 rush) and 236 points accounted for in 2022.
- Maye leads the ACC in all five categories.

MAYE ON FOURTH DOWN

- Maye is 8 of 12 passing for 132 yards and four touchdowns on fourth down this season. He also has three conversions on the ground for 43 yards.

MAYE IN THE RED ZONE

- Maye's 22 touchdown passes in the red zone are tied for first in the Power 5 with USC's Caleb Williams. He has also added five rushing scores in the red zone for 27 total TDs.

MAYE'S MASTERCLASS

- Drake Maye has been responsible for 39 touchdowns (34 pass, 5 rush) in 10 games this season, the fewest games ever by a Tar Heel to account for 39 TDs in a season.
- Maye has posted five games with 5 or more TDs responsible for in the first 10 starts of his

career. That figure is already the UNC all-time record and is the only player to do it in one season.

- Maye has produced five games with 350 pass yards and three pass TDs. The rest of the ACC has three combined.
- Out of Maye's 34 TD passes, nine have come with the game tied and 14 have come when the Heels were trailing.
- Maye has gone 139-of-195 (71.3%) for 1,975 yards and 23 TDs when UNC was tied or trailing this season.
- Maye leads the nation in second-half comeback victories with six.
- Maye has gone 51-of-75 for 834 yards and seven TDs when tied or trailing in the second half. His 92.0 QBR ranks fourth nationally.

A LIST OF ONE

- In the past 15 years, Drake Maye is the only QB to have three-straight games with 3 TDs, 0 INT, 70% completions, 250 passing yards and 50 rushing yards.
- The only QBs to do it in back-to-back games are Bo Nix, Jalen Hurts, JT Barrett, Marcus Mariota, Robert Griffin III and Joe Webb.
- Maye is the only ACC player in the last 25 years with four-straight games with at least 300 passing yards and 50 rushing yards. He did it against Virginia Tech, Miami, Duke and Pitt, and was seven passing yards away from doing it for a fifth-straight game against UVA. Maye accomplished the feat again at Wake Forest.

DUAL THREAT

- Drake Maye is currently averaging 341.2 passing yards per game and leads UNC in rushing with 584 yards (58.4 ypg). The last two QBs who averaged over 300 passing yards per game, while leading their team in rushing were Patrick Mahomes in 2016 and Johnny Manziel in 2013.

PFF GRADES MAYE NO. 1

- Drake Maye is currently the highest graded quarterback in the country according to Pro Football Focus (PFF) with a 92.5 mark.
- According to PFF, his 32 big-time throws are 10 more than any other Power 5 quarterback, while his 417 rushing yards after contact are the 2nd-most among Power 5 QBs.

CAROLINA RECORDS

- Maye's 3,412 passing yards are the most in the first 10 games of a UNC single season. The previous high was Sam Howell's 3,129 yards in 2020.
- Equaled the UNC freshman record with 5 TD passes against FAMU, Notre Dame and Pitt.
- His 34 completions against Pitt are the most ever by a Tar Heel freshman QB and the highest figure by a UNC signal caller since Nathan Elliott had 34 at Syracuse in 2018.. The previous rookie record was 33 by Sam Howell in 2019.
- Maye is the second UNC QB to ever have 380 passing yards and 70 rushing yards in a game. The other was Marquise Williams who went for



390 passing yards and 73 yards on the ground versus Georgia Tech in 2014.

- There have been nine games when a QB threw for 300 and ran for 70 in program history. Maye has four of them in 2022 (App State, Virginia Tech, Duke, WF). Sam Howell did it three times in 2021 (Georgia State, Virginia, Notre Dame) and Marquise Williams twice (the aforementioned GT game and Notre Dame in 2014).

MAYE'S FIRST TWO GAMES

- Drake Maye is one of only four QBs over the last 15 years to post nine TD passes and 0 INTs in their first two career starts.
- The others are Cole McDonald (Hawaii, 2018), Nic Shimonek (Texas Tech, 2017) and David Johnson (Tulsa, 2008).
- Maye's 9 TD passes were the most through a team's first 2 games by any ACC player since 2000.
 - The only ACC player in the last 15 years with more TD responsible for through 2 games than Maye's 10 was Lamar Jackson in 2016 with 13.
- Maye's nine TD passes were the most ever by a UNC QB in the first two games of a season.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

- The Maye family is starting to stake claim as the first family of Carolina Athletics.
- Drake Maye's father, Mark started 22 games at quarterback from 1986-87.
- Brother, Luke, was a star basketball player at UNC from 2016-19 that famously hit the game-winning jump shot with 0.3 seconds left to topple Kentucky in the 2017 NCAA Elite 8.
- Additionally, brother, Cole, won an NCAA baseball title at Florida, while Mom, Aimee, attended UNC and brother, Beau, is currently enrolled at the university and will play basketball for the Tar Heels in 2022-23.

COACH BROWN ADDED TO WATCH LISTS

- Mack Brown has guided the Tar Heels to the top of the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division and as a result has been included on the watch list for the Dodd Trophy and the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach Of the Year Award.

JD & AG

- Josh Downs and Antoine Green have become a lethal wide receiver combination in 2022.
- Downs leads the ACC and is tied for third nationally with 11 receiving touchdowns despite playing two less games than the other chart toppers.
 - Downs 74 receptions lead the ACC and are tied for third among Power 5 receivers despite playing two less games than the other pass catchers.
 - Downs tops the conference with five games of 100 or more receiving yards, while his 166 yards at Virginia is the second highest single-game total this season.
 - Downs 15 catches at Virginia is the most in the ACC in a game in 2022.
 - Downs set the ACC record for most receptions in a three-game span with 37 over the last three games, passing Ervin Phillips of Syracuse, who had 36 over three in 2017.
 - Green's 180 yards against Pitt is the top single-game total in the ACC this fall, and he ranks third with three games of 100+ receiving yards.
 - Green's six receiving TDs are tied for fifth in the ACC.
 - Green leads the ACC and is tied for second nationally with five catches of 50 or more yards and his 22.6 yards per reception lead the nation among receivers with at least 30 catches.

10+ CATCHES BY 2 PLAYERS IN SAME GAME

- Josh Downs and Antoine Green became the first pair of receivers in North Carolina program history to have 10 or more catches in the same game against Pitt on Oct. 29.
 - Downs had 11 catches for 102 yards and two touchdowns, while Green had 10 receptions for 180 yards and two TDs.
 - They are also the first set of UNC receivers to notch 100 yards in back-to-back games.
 - Downs had 126 yards, while Green added 112 yards at Duke on Oct. 15.

JOSH "TOUCH" DOWNS

- Downs has 21 touchdowns over his last 22 games going back to the Orange Bowl at the end of the 2020 campaign.
 - His 22 career receiving touchdowns rank second in program history. He needs just three more TDs to tie Quinshad Davis' school record of 25.

- In 2021, Downs registered at least eight catches and a TD in eight-straight games. That was the longest streak since Fresno State's Davante Adams did it in nine-straight games in 2013.
 - Downs' streak of eight-straight games with a receiving TD was tied for the third longest stretch in ACC history.
 - Clemson's DeAndre Hopkins set the record with 10 in a row in 2012 that broke the mark of nine that was set by Virginia's Herman Moore in 1990. Wake Forest's Sage Surratt (2018-19) and NC State's Bryan Underwood (2012) also put together eight-game streaks in the last decade.

TALENTED TIGHT END TRIO

- Carolina is blessed with an outstanding tight end room in 2022 and are led by the threesome of John Copenhaver, Kamari Morales and Bryson Nesbit.
 - The trio have combined for 56 receptions, 806 receiving yards and seven receiving TDs.
 - Nesbit has 23 catches for 342 yards and three TDs, while Morales has 22 catches, 267 yards and four touchdowns. Copenhaver averages 17.9 yards on 11 catches for 197 yards.

MORALES SETS UNC TIGHT END TD RECORD

- Kamari Morales has scored more touchdowns than any other Carolina tight end in program history. He set the record with his 10th career TD at Duke on Oct. 15.

FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

- Omarion Hampton's seven total TDS (six rush, one rec) are the most among all freshman running backs in the ACC.
 - WRs Gavin Blackwell and Kobe Paysour have combined to catches 35 passes for 391 yards and four TDs. Paysour has 21 catches for 220 yards and three TDs, while Blackwell has made 14 catches for 171 yards and a score.
 - DB Will Hardy has 16 tackles and joins Cedric Gray as the only two players on the team with an interception, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble.

JUST CALL HIM "AWESOME" RICHARDS

- UNC left tackle Asim Richards leads all ACC tackles with 472 snaps this fall and has only allowed one sack this season.
 - Richards and Syracuse's Dakota Davis are the only two ACC tackles that have played 300+ snaps and only allowed one sack in 2022.

GRAD TRANSFERS

- North Carolina added three graduate transfers that have made immediate impacts during the 2022 season.
- OL Corey Gaynor played in 38 career games at Miami, starting 28 along the interior offensive line. He had a string of 27 consecutive starts snapped after suffering a season-ending injury in the third game of the 2021 season. He has started every game at center in 2022.
- OL Spencer Rolland joined the Tar Heels this summer after graduating from Harvard with a degree in mechanical engineering and a minor in astrophysics. He started 20 games on the offensive line at Harvard. He has started seven games at right tackle for the Tar Heels.
- JACK Noah Taylor played in 44 career games at Virginia, making 31 starts. Taylor posted 170 tackles, 13.5 sacks, 30 TFL, two forced fumbles, three INTs and 13 PBU over the last three seasons in 35 games.
- Taylor started the first eight games before suffering a season-ending injury in the Pitt game. He played a key role in making the game-saving stop at the goal line on App State's two-point attempt that secured a 63-61 UNC win. He contributed 3.5 sacks and 6.0 TFL in 2022.

FIND A WAY

- UNC's defense is giving up 31.3 ppg over all games this season, but they've tightened up during conference play. The Heels are only allowing 25.8 ppg in league play.
- Carolina has given up just 55 points in the second half during ACC play (9.2 ppg), which ranks second in the conference behind FSU (9.1 ppg). They're even better when they get to the fourth quarter, when they've only allowed 24 points in the six league games or 4 ppg in that quarter.

GRAY LEADING THE WAY

- Junior linebacker Cedric Gray tops the ACC and ranks second in the FBS with 10.8 tackles per game, while his 108 total tackles are the most by a player in the Power 5 conferences.
- His career-high 16 tackles at Virginia is tied for the most in the ACC this season. Ryan Smenda Jr. of Wake Forest and Charlie Thomas of Georgia Tech also have 16 stops in a game.
- Gray has five games this season with 13 or more tackles, leads Carolina with 7.5 TFL and also has four breakups, three hurries, two interceptions, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and a sack to his credit in 2022.

ROAD WINS

- After not picking up a road win in 2021, Carolina is a perfect 6-0 on the road this fall. The Tar Heels have won back-to-back road games three times this year. First it was non-conference games against App State and Georgia State, later it was conference games against Miami and Duke and now, it was Virginia and Wake Forest.
- UNC is 6-0 in true road games for the first time in program history.
- The six consecutive road wins is the second-longest active streak in the nation, trailing Georgia's streak of 10.
- The current six-game winning streak is the longest on the road for UNC since winning nine in a row between 2014-16.

VICTORY BELL REMAINS IN CHAPEL HILL

- Carolina became bowl eligible for the fourth-year in a row under head coach Mack Brown with the 38-35 win at Duke.
- The Tar Heels have won four-straight games over Duke, the longest streak since winning eight in a row from 2004-11.
- Brown has won 12 in a row over the Blue Devils and is 12-2 all-time against Duke.

HEELS WIN FOURTH STRAIGHT OVER 'CANES

- Carolina put together its longest drive of the year that consumed 8:21 of the fourth quarter over 18 plays and 81 yards that culminated with a 19-yard FG from Noah Burnette.
- The Tar Heels gave up seven points in the second half, a week removed from shutting out Virginia Tech in the second half.
- Carolina surrendered only 41 rushing yards to Miami, the fewest since Virginia ran for 24 yards in 2021.
- Caleb Hood started at running back for the second-straight game and had a career-high 13 carries for a game-high 74 yards. The Tar Heels outgained Miami on the ground, 161-41.
- Power Echols recorded a career-high 14 tackles to top his previous best 11 stops earlier this season against Notre Dame.
- Cedric Gray also notched double figures in tackles with 13 stops, his fourth game with 10 or more tackles this season. He also forced his second fumble of his career in the fourth quarter.

UNC SCHEDULE NOTES

Florida A&M: Carolina opens a season at home against a non-conference opponent for the first time since welcoming Cal to Kenan Stadium for the 2017 season. This will be the first meeting between the two schools.

Appalachian State: This is the third time these two in-state rivals have faced off, however, 2022 marks the first game ever played in Boone, N.C. Carolina won 56-6 in 1940, while the Mountaineers picked up a 34-31 win in 2019 in the series.

Georgia State: The Tar Heels are visiting the Panthers as the second game of a home-and-home series. Carolina won 59-17 in Chapel Hill last year in the first meeting between the two programs.

Notre Dame: The Tar Heels and Fighting Irish go head-to-head for the third year in a row. Notre Dame won last fall at home, 44-34, and 31-17 in Chapel Hill in 2020.

Virginia Tech: This is the 19th straight year that Carolina and Virginia Tech will face each other as league opponents. The Tar Heels won 56-45 the last time the Hokies visited Chapel Hill in 2020.

Miami: Carolina has won the last three meetings with the Hurricanes, including a 62-26 victory at Miami in 2020.

Duke: Mack Brown has won 11 straight games against the Blue Devils. The streak includes games from 1990-97 and has continued with victories since his return to Carolina in 2019, 2020 and 2021.

Pitt: The Panthers visit Kenan Stadium for the first time since 2018. UNC has won all six meetings at home against Pitt.

Virginia: The Tar Heels earned their first win against the Cavaliers since 2016 with a 59-39 victory last fall in Chapel Hill. The 2022 game will mark the 127th edition of the South's Oldest Rivalry.

Wake Forest: Carolina and Wake will play a conference game in Winston-Salem for the first time since 2012. The 2019 game was a non-conference matchup. This season also marks the first time the two have played in four-straight seasons since 2001-04.

Georgia Tech: Similar to Pitt, the Yellow Jackets will play in Chapel Hill for the first time since 2018. Nov. 19 will be the latest date in the calendar these two rivals will have ever faced each other. The previous latest date was Nov. 17, 2007.

NC State: The Carolina-State game remains on Thanksgiving weekend. The Tar Heels won 48-21 in the last meeting at Kenan Stadium in 2020.

• DeAndre Boykins became the first Tar Heel to have an interception and a sack in the same game since Jeremiah Gemmel at Pitt in 2021.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM WIN OVER THE HOKIES

- Carolina gave up only 273 yards to Virginia Tech, the fewest since Georgia State gained 271 in the second game of the 2021 season.
- The 273 yards was also the fewest surrendered to an ACC opponent since holding Syracuse to 202 yards in the 2020 opener.
- Drake Maye completed nine passes of 20 yards or longer (including five of at least 25 yards). By comparison, Virginia Tech completed just one pass longer than 14 yards.
- Maye outgained the Hokies, 436 to 273, in total offense.
- Maye led UNC in rushing with 73 yards. He's the first UNC quarterback to lead the team in rushing yards in consecutive games since Marquise Williams in 2014 against Virginia Tech and Notre Dame.
- Josh Downs made eight catches for a season-high 120 yards.
- Ten different Tar Heels caught passes.

UNC-APP STATE SUPERLATIVES

- The 124 combined points were the most ever scored in both a UNC and App State game.
- The 63 points were the most scored by UNC in a single game since 2017 against Western Carolina.
- Filling in for the injured Josh Downs, redshirt freshman Kobe Paysour earned his first career start at wide receiver and notched game highs with eight receptions and 98 yards and scored his first career touchdown.
- Sophomore J.J. Jones recorded a career-high four receptions and 69 yards, and also scored his first career touchdown.
- Sophomore Caleb Hood led the Tar Heels with a career-high 87 rushing yards, had one reception for 22 yards and had a game-high 109 all-purpose yards.
- Hood's 71-yard rush in the fourth quarter was the longest by a Tar Heel since Dazz Newsome had an 84-yard touchdown run at Duke in 2018.
- True freshman RBs Omarion Hampton and George Pettaway each found the end zone against App State and have combined for seven rushing TDs in three games this season.
- Cedric Gray set a new career high with 14 tackles and had his third career interception.

FOURTH QUARTER FIREWORKS

- 10 total TDs were scored in the fourth quarter between Carolina and App State.
- 62 total points scored, the most in a 4th quarter in FBS history.
- 5 TDs scored in final 3 minutes.

CAROLINA ROLLS OVER RATTLETS

- In the first ever meeting between Carolina and Florida A&M on the football field, the Tar Heels rolled up 608 yards of total offense in a

56-24 season-opening victory in week zero of the college football season.

- Drake Maye earned his first career start at QB and responded by completing 29 of 37 attempts for a career-high 294 yards and five touchdowns. He also added a career-high 55 rushing yards on four carries.
- Eleven Tar Heels made their first ever starts at Carolina. Notable performances included 10 tackles and two TFL for linebacker Power Echols, 36 yards and a TD for wide receiver Gavin Blackwell and four tackles from sophomore DeAndre Boykins.

SHARING THE WORK LOAD

- For just the fourth time since 1972, Carolina saw four players rush for 50 yards in the Florida A&M game.
- Omarion Hampton (101), Elijah Green (69), Drake Maye (55) and George Pettaway (51) all notched more than 50 yards on the ground.
- The other three occurrences came in 1972 vs. Clemson, 1982 vs. Army and 2012 vs. Idaho.

1K X 1K

- North Carolina, Alabama, Kentucky and Ohio State were the only four Power 5 programs to have a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver in 2021.
- Josh Downs set a school record with 1,355 receiving yards, while Ty Chandler had 1,092 rushing yards in his only season in Chapel Hill.

1K RECEIVERS

- North Carolina has had four 1,000-yard receivers over the last three seasons, which is tied for the second most nationally. Dyami Brown did it two times in 2019 and '20, while Dazz Newsome reached the mark in 2019. Josh Downs eclipsed 1,000 yards in 2021.

DOWNSHATTERS UNC RECEIVING RECORDS

- Josh Downs enjoyed a record-setting season during his 2021 sophomore campaign. He shattered UNC program records with 101 receptions and 1,335 receiving yards last fall.
- Downs became just the fourth player in ACC history to notch 100 receptions in a single season.

GROUND GAME

- North Carolina led the ACC in rushing yards in both 2020 and 2021.
- North Carolina's rushing attack has produced four 1,000-yard performances over the last three seasons. If you include Sam Howell, who rushed for over 1,000 yards prior to sack



yardage, Carolina's five 1,000-yard rushers are the most nationally over the last three seasons.

- Grad transfer running back Ty Chandler earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 by rushing for a team-high 1,092 yards. He ranked fourth in the ACC with 84.0 rushing yards per game and third with 13 rushing touchdowns.
- Michael Carter (1,245) and Javonte Williams (1,140) both went over 1,000 yards during Carolina's record-setting offense in 2020.
- Carter went for 1,003 rushing yards in 2019.

CLOSE CALLS

- Since the return of Mack Brown to take over the UNC program in 2019, Carolina owns a 30-18 overall record.
- So far in 2022, Carolina has won six games that were decided by seven points or less, including five by three points or less.
- 11 of the 18 losses have been by seven points or less with three setbacks coming in overtime.
- The first two losses in 2020 came by a mere three points at FSU and at Virginia.
- Nine of Carolina's 13 games in 2019 were decided by seven points or fewer. That was the most by any team in the AP Poll era going back to 1936.
- UNC lost 43-41 in six overtimes at Virginia Tech in the longest game in ACC history.
- The Tar Heels also lost twice in overtime on the road at Pitt, 34-27 (2019) and 30-23 (2021).

KIERNAN'S DUBLIN BEGINNINGS

- Senior punter Ben Kiernan played his high school football at Raleigh's Wakefield High School, but he didn't arrive in the U.S. until he was 15. Kiernan spent the first decade and a half of his life in Dublin, Ireland, where he played rugby and soccer. Seeking more opportunities and better colleges, Kiernan's parents decided to move to the Raleigh area. After moving just two weeks prior to the start of the 8th grade, Kiernan's father Mike had a chance encounter with the football coach at Food Lion and he told him to have Ben try out for football, where he would punt a football for the first time.
 - Kiernan's twin older brothers, Tom and Jack, played rugby at NC State.
 - Kiernan's 13-year-old sister Freya is in a lifetime battle with cerebral palsy. The Kiernan's adopted Freya, who was born in China, when she was nine months old.
 - Kiernan has been Carolina's starting punter for every game since the 2019 season began.

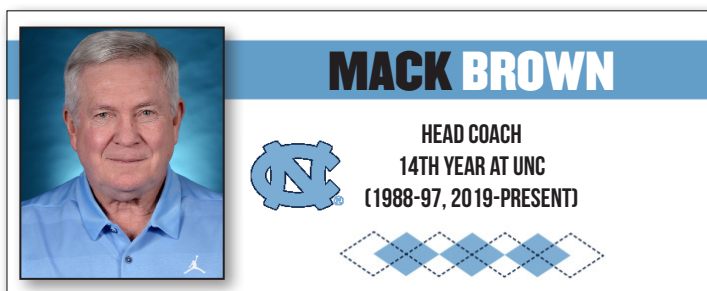

HEAD COACH MACK BROWN



Mack Brown, whose charismatic style and disciplined approach propelled the University of North Carolina to the top five and the University of Texas to the 2005 BCS National Championship, began his second stint as head coach in Chapel Hill on Nov. 27, 2018 with the goal of leading another Carolina resurgence.

A 43-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Brown has served as a head coach for 32 seasons with stops at Texas (1998-2013), North Carolina (1988-97, 2019-20), Tulane (1985-87), and Appalachian State (1983). Over his 32 seasons, Brown has posted a record of 259-132-1 (.662). Those 259 career victories rank seventh on the FBS all-time list and are the most among active coaches. The 2005 Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year and the 2008 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year, Brown is one of a handful of coaches in college football history to lead two separate programs to top-five national finishes.

Brown continued a remarkable turnaround in year two of his return to Carolina, leading the Tar Heels from two wins in 2018 to the Orange Bowl in 2020. Carolina, which went 8-4, spent much of the season ranked in the Top 25, finishing the regular season at No. 13 in the College Football Playoff rankings and ending the year ranked 18th in the AP Poll and 17th in the Coaches Poll. This marked just the second time since Brown's departure in 1997 that Carolina finished a season in the Top 25. Under his guidance, Carolina produced four All-Americans, 13 All-ACC selections, a Top-15 recruiting class and averaged a 3.0 GPA over the spring and fall semesters.

In his first season back at the helm at North Carolina in 2019, Brown led the Tar Heels to a winning season and a resounding victory in the Military Bowl. The seven wins were two more than UNC had won in its previous two seasons combined (5) and the Heels won a bowl game for the first time since 2013. Carolina played close games seemingly all season. Its nine games decided by seven points or less were the most since 1936 and the Tar Heels' six losses came by a total of just 26 points. Brown's '19 UNC squad produced two NFL Draft picks, five NFL free-agent signees, 11 All-ACC honors and freshman QB Sam Howell was named ACC Offensive Rookie and Rookie of the Year before earning Freshman All-America honors.

MACK BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

- Dating back to 1986 when he was the head coach at Tulane, Mack Brown had a player selected in 28 straight NFL Drafts prior to 2014. In fact, Brown has had a player selected in the NFL Draft in 30 of his 32 drafts as a head coach.
- Mack Brown has coached 20 players (16 Texas/four UNC) who have been drafted in the first round in his past 19 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached a first-round selection in 12 of his last 20 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached 78 NFL Draft picks over his last 19 years.
- Of those 78 NFL Draft picks, 60 picks were chosen in the first four rounds.
- In 32 drafts as a head coach at North Carolina (1988-97, 2019-20), Texas (1998-2013), Tulane (1985-87) and Appalachian State (1983), Mack Brown has seen 115 of his former players selected in the NFL Draft.

Prior to returning to Carolina, Brown served as both a college football studio analyst and color analyst for ESPN.

At the completion of his Texas tenure in 2013, Brown was one of just four active coaches to reach the 200-victory plateau. He was also one of only two coaches nationally to lead his teams to 21 bowls in 22 seasons, and the only one to have 23 winning seasons in the previous 24 years. His 225 wins from 1990 to 2013, which combined the last eight years of his first stint at UNC and his entire Texas tenure, were the most of any coach in the country.

As a result, Brown was inducted into the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in December of 2018. He is the sixth Tar Heel to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame and the second coach, joining innovator Carl Grey Snavely, who was inducted in 1965. In addition to the College Football Hall of Fame, Brown is also a member of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame, the Longhorn Hall of Honor, the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame and the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame.

Brown has also succeeded in preparing his student-athletes for the next level. In the 31 NFL Drafts during Brown's time as a head coach, the NFL has picked 110 of his student-athletes, and at least one was selected in 28 straight drafts. He had 20 players selected in the first round of the draft from 1998 to 2013, and three members of his 1997 Carolina squad were picked in the first round of the 1998 NFL Draft, which tied for the most of any collegiate program.

With all of the success on the field, the primary emphasis has remained the same with Brown's squads -- maintaining a high level of achievement in the classroom and in the community. Eighty percent of his players at North Carolina received their degrees and he increased the pace at Texas, while more than a third of his players at UT regularly

earned 3.0 grade point averages and achieved spots on the Big 12 Commissioner's and Athletics Director's Honor Rolls.

Brown's first stint as head coach of the Tar Heels came from 1988-97. He led Carolina to a record of 69-46-1 (.599), which included three 10-win seasons, six consecutive bowl games, a Top-Five finish, a Top-10 finish and two Top-20 finishes.

At UNC, Brown recruited and coached several of the finest players in school history. From his 1997 squad alone, DE Greg Ellis (No. 8, Dallas Cowboys), LB Brian Simmons (No. 17, Cincinnati Bengals) and DT Vonnie Holliday (No. 19, Green Bay Packers) were selected among the first 19 picks in the 1998 NFL Draft.

Along with that trio of first-rounders, Brown also helped develop several other Tar Heel standouts. CB Dré Bly, who is currently Carolina's DBs coach, was a three-time All-American who recorded an ACC-record 20 interceptions during his career and played 11 seasons in the NFL. Corey Holliday, who currently serves as UNC's Associate A.D. for Football Administration, finished his career as the leading receiver in Carolina history, was a CFA/Hitachi Scholar-Athlete, and is a former member of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Dwight Hollier, who currently serves as UNC's Senior Associate A.D. for Student-Athlete Health, Well-Being & Program Outreach, made more than 500 tackles during his Carolina career and also

played in the NFL. RB Natrone Means, who rushed for more than 1,000 yards in his final two seasons at UNC, went on to lead the San Diego Chargers to Super Bowl XXIX and the Jacksonville Jaguars to the 1996 AFC title game.

QBs Jason Stanicek and Mike Thomas combined to rewrite Carolina's passing and total offense records. DT Marcus Jones, a consensus first-team All-American, earned ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1995. CB Thomas Smith came to UNC in 1989 as a walk-on from a small high school in North Carolina and departed as a first-round pick of the AFC Champion Buffalo Bills. RB Leon Johnson, one of the premier all-purpose offensive threats in ACC history, played eight seasons in the NFL. TE Freddie Jones, a second-round draft choice of the San Diego Chargers in 1997, was one of the NFL's top pass-catching tight ends and played eight seasons in the NFL.

During his first 10 seasons at Carolina, the Tar Heels featured a Lombardi Award finalist, a two-time Thorpe Award finalist, a Butkus Award finalist and semifinalist, 16 All-Americans, 34 first-team All-ACC selections, an ACC Defensive Player of the Year and an ACC Rookie of the Year. Brown also helped his players with professional aspirations as 38 of his Tar Heels heard their names called in the NFL Draft, including 16 in the first three rounds. In addition to the three first-rounders in 1998, Marcus Jones (Tampa Bay Buccaneers '96) and Thomas Smith (Buffalo Bills '93) were first-round selections; Freddie Jones (San Diego Chargers '97), Rick Terry (New York Jets '97), Bucky Brooks (Buffalo Bills '94) and Natrone Means (San Diego Chargers '93) were second-round picks; and James Hamilton (Jacksonville Jaguars '97), William Henderson (Green Bay Packers '95), Jimmy Hitchcock (New England Patriots '95), Rondell Jones (Denver Broncos '93), Brian Bollinger (San Francisco 49ers '92), Kevin Donnalley (Houston Texans '91) and Darrell Hamilton (Denver Broncos '89) were chosen in the third round.

Carolina 56, Florida A&M 24 Aug. 27 • Kenan Stadium Chapel Hill

CHAPEL HILL, N.C.—Drake Maye threw four of his five touchdown passes in the first half in his first collegiate start and North Carolina beat undermanned Florida A&M 56-24 to open the season Saturday night.

Six different North Carolina players scored touchdowns, with Josh Downs making two touchdown catches.

Florida A&M arrived with a roster reduced by nearly two dozen players because of unresolved eligibility issues. The list of those absent included linebacker Isaiah Land, who led the Football Championship Subdivision in sacks last year.

The game nearly didn't happen.

Maye, a redshirt freshman and younger brother of former Tar Heels basketball standout Luke Maye and son of ex-North Carolina quarterback Mark Maye, completed 29 of 37 passes for 294 yards — some coming in a light rain.

The young quarterback had a couple notable achievements. He's the first North Carolina player to throw five touchdowns in a season opener and the first to connect for five touchdowns in a first career start.

North Carolina running back Omarion Hampton scored on touchdown runs of 2 and 25 yards in his debut. He finished with 101 rushing yards on 14 carries.

Florida A&M quarterback Jeremy Moussa, a graduate transfer from Vanderbilt, threw for two touchdowns. He completed 28 of 38 passes for 279 yards with an interception.

The Rattlers were within 21-14 until Downs' 2-yard touchdown catch with 5 seconds left in the first half.

Earlier, Maye connected with Kamari Morales for a 19-yard touchdown pass for the game's first points. It came one play after Maye dodged defenders on the way to a 42-yard run.

The Rattlers responded by driving 75 yards in eight plays and scoring on Moussa's 17-yard pass to AJ Davis.

On the ensuing possession, Maye hooked up with Bryson Nesbit for a 23-yard touchdown. His next scoring play came on a fourth-and-4 pass to Gavin Blackwell.

BOONE, N.C.—Redshirt freshman Drake Maye continued his torrid start to the season, throwing for 352 yards and combining for five touchdowns as North Carolina outlasted Appalachian State 63-61 on Saturday despite surrendering 40 points in the fourth quarter.

Maye has thrown a school-record nine touchdown passes in two career starts. He also ran for a score against the Mountaineers.

Chase Brice threw for 376 yards and six touchdowns for Appalachian State (0-1).

The two teams combined for 62 points and 504 yards — in the fourth quarter.

With the game tied at 49, Maye lofted a ball over the middle to D.J. Jones for a 42-yard touchdown pass on an all-out blitz by the Mountaineers to give North Carolina (2-0) the lead with 2:50 left in the game.

App State responded with Brice throwing his fifth TD pass of the game, a 28-yard strike to Deshaun Davis with 31 seconds left. The Mountaineers went for the 2-point conversion — and the apparent win — but Brice's pass sailed just over Davis' head.

It seemed the game would end there, but UNC's Bryson Nesbit returned the ensuing outside kick for a 43-yard touchdown — a mistake that gave the Mountaineers 31 seconds to try to score again. Sure enough, Brice found Kaedin Robinson for a 26-yard TD strike with 9 seconds left to cut the lead to 63-61.

The Mountaineers went for 2 but Brice was stopped short of the end zone.

The Tar Heels fell behind 21-7 before rattling off 34 straight points and silence a record crowd of 40,168 at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Maye threw three TD passes in the first half, including a 10-yard TD strike to Nesbit to give the Tar Heels a 28-21 lead with 1 second left.

Maye made it 28 straight unanswered points for UNC with a 12-yard touchdown run to start the second half after tiptoeing the sideline.

UNC pushed its lead to 41-21 after two Noah Burnette field goals entering the fourth quarter before the Mountaineers battled back with six touchdowns.

It was the most points ever scored in a UNC game since the school started football in 1888.

ATLANTA—Drake Maye passed for two touchdowns, Omarion Hampton ran for a pair of scores and North Carolina escaped another upset bid from a Sun Belt Conference team Saturday, rallying for a 35-28 victory over Georgia State after squandering an 18-point lead.

The Tar Heels (3-0) were coming off a wild 63-61 victory at Appalachian State despite giving up a staggering 40 points in the fourth quarter.

The ACC school hit the road again to face Georgia State (0-2), which was hosting a Power 5 team in Atlanta for the first time in the 13-year history of its program.

The Panthers ripped off 25 straight points to grab a 28-21 lead late in the third quarter.

But Hampton broke a 58-yard touchdown run right down the middle of field to tie the game before the end of the third.

He won it on a 2-yard scoring plunge with 10:42 remaining, ensuring the Tar Heels escaped another close call and moved to 3-0 for the first time since 2011.

Hampton finished with 110 yards rushing on 16 carries.

North Carolina appeared headed for a more comfortable win after the previous week's craziness, building a 21-3 lead midway through the second quarter.

Maye threw a 55-yard touchdown pass to Kamari Morales and a 28-yarder to Kobe Paysour.

But Grainger led a Georgia State comeback. He threw a 6-yard TD pass to Kris Byrd, a 49-yarder to Robert Lewis, and another to Lewis covering 29 yards to cap a 10-play, 98-yard drive that put the Panthers up 28-21 late in the third quarter — their first lead of the game.

But North Carolina's offense finally got going again, sparked by Hampton's long run.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C.—Drew Pyne threw three touchdown passes and Notre Dame finally clicked on offense in a 45-32 victory over North Carolina on Saturday.

Audric Estime rushed for two touchdowns and 134 yards and Chris Tyree ran for 80 yards and a score for the Fighting Irish (2-2). Pyne completed 24 of 34 passes for 289 yards.

The outcome resulted in the first road win under first-year coach Marcus Freeman.

The Tar Heels (3-1) were denied their first 4-0 start to a season since 1997.

North Carolina quarterback Drake Maye threw five touchdown passes, two going to Josh Downs in the first half and two more — covering 144 yards — to Antoine Green in the second half. Maye was 17-for-32 for 301 yards.

Pyne threw second-quarter touchdown passes of 10 yards to Michael Mayer and 30 yards to Lorenzo Styles. The Irish led 24-14 at halftime after Blake Grupe's 40-yard field goal with 23 seconds left. Notre Dame held a 301-161 edge in total yards in the first half.

The Irish went 75 yards in six plays to open the second half and extended the margin to 31-14 on Pyne's 29-yard pass play to Logan Diggs, who was alone along the sideline and jogged into the end zone.

North Carolina fumbled on its first second-half snap when Maye dropped the ball in pass formation, giving the Irish the ball at the Tar Heels' 15. One play after a fourth-down defensive pass interference penalty followed by an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on Tar Heels coach Mack Brown, Notre Dame converted on Estime's 1-yard lunge.

The Tar Heels took the first gamble of the game on the opening possession and it paid off with Maye's fourth-and-goal pass of 4 yards to Downs. Maye threw for 39 yards and rushed for 33 on the opening drive. Downs had been out since he suffered a lower-body injury in the Aug. 27 opener.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C.—Drake Maye threw for three touchdowns and ran for two more to continue his strong start to the season and North Carolina opened up Atlantic Coast Conference play with a 41-10 victory over Virginia Tech on Saturday.

Maye, a redshirt freshman, was able to consistently throw downfield, with 13 of his 26 completions going for at least 15 yards. He finished with 363 yards, going 26 of 36.

Josh Downs led UNC (4-1, 1-0 ACC) with eight catches and 120 yards, and tight end Bryson Nesbit added 98 receiving yards on four receptions.

Grant Wells completed 16 of 26 passes for 139 yards and ran for a touchdown, but the Hokies (2-3, 1-1) struggled overall against a Tar Heel defense that turned in its best performance of the season.

Linebacker Cedric Gray picked off Wells in the second quarter, which set up a 16-yard touchdown pass by Maye to Antoine Green one play later to give UNC a 21-3 lead, and the Hokies never got closer than 11 points.

The Tar Heels gave up nearly 500 yards per game in their first four contests, but UNC limited the number of big gainers by Virginia Tech. Wells never got in an extended rhythm, as the Hokies finished with only 273 yards.

MIAMI GARDENS, FLA.—Drake Maye passed for 309 yards and two touchdowns, one of them a 74-yarder to J.J. Jones, and North Carolina overcame a stellar performance by Tyler Van Dyke to beat Miami 27-24 on Saturday.

Josh Downs had a receiving touchdown and Omarion Hampton ran for another score for North Carolina (5-1, 2-0 Atlantic Coast Conference).

Van Dyke completed 42 of 57 passes for 496 yards — the second-most in Miami history, behind Stephen Morris' 566 in 2012 — and three touchdowns for Miami (2-3, 0-1).

Key'Shawn Smith, Henry Parrish and Colbie Young had the touchdown receptions for the Hurricanes, who scored 10 points in the final 28 seconds of the first half to get within 21-17. Will Mallory had eight catches for 115 yards for Miami.

It ended up as Miami's third straight loss. It didn't lack for late-game drama.

Down 27-24, Miami initially appeared to recover an on-side kick with about 2 minutes left; Al Blades Jr. dove along the sideline to knock the ball inbounds and the Hurricanes seemed poised to take over. The play was overturned by replay, which saw that Blades had stepped out of bounds and therefore couldn't touch the ball.

North Carolina punted the ball back to Miami with 1:14 left, but Van Dyke was picked off with 8 seconds remaining.

Caleb Hood rushed for 74 yards on 13 carries for the Tar Heels, who have won four straight over Miami for the first time. Jones' way-too-easy score capped a game-opening 95-yard drive, and Hampton's score finished off a 99-yard drive that was bolstered by a 52-yard pass from Maye to Antoine Green.

But they never led, and for the first time in 15 years, Miami has gone three consecutive games without ever holding the lead. It happened at the end of that 2007 season, starting with the 48-0 debacle against Virginia that was Miami's final game in the Orange Bowl.

Miami struggled to run the ball — 41 yards on 23 carries — but not converting on three key chances was even worse.

The Hurricanes had first-and-goal from the North Carolina 2 in the second quarter, got one yard on three carries and then saw Van Dyke's fourth-down heave fall incomplete. In the third quarter, after intercepting Maye for the second time the Hurricanes' drive stalled near midfield after going for it on fourth down. And in the fourth quarter, Jaylan Knighton got enough yards to convert on fourth-and-1 at the North Carolina 26 — but fumbled the ball away.

The Heels went 81 yards in 17 plays, and Noah Burnette's chip-shot field goal put North Carolina up 27-17 with 4:10 remaining.

Van Dyke found Young from 16 yards out to get Miami a field goal with 2:20 left.

DURHAM, N.C.—Drake Maye connected with Antoine Green on the right side of the end zone for an 8-yard score with 16 seconds left to lift North Carolina past rival Duke 38-35 on Saturday night.

Maye's throw capped a nine-play, 74-yard drive for a touchdown that stood on the slimmest of margins. Replays showed Green's left foot land barely inside the sideline — with only a sliver of grass detectable between Green's foot and the white paint — before officials declared after a review that the touchdown call would stand for the Tar Heels (6-1, 3-0 Atlantic Coast Conference).

Duke (4-3, 1-2) drove to midfield in the desperate seconds for a possible tying field goal, but UNC's Noah Taylor batted Riley Leonard's pass skyward for teammate Will Hardy to make a clinching diving interception with 2 seconds left.

That sent UNC fans into wild cheers with a still-unbeaten record in Atlantic Coast Conference play as the Coastal Division leaders, not to mention the chance to keep the Victory Bell that goes to the winner of the longstanding rivalry for a fourth straight year.

Maye threw for 380 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Tar Heels, while Josh Downs had nine catches for 126 yards that included a couple of spectacular grabs.

Leonard threw for 245 yards and a touchdown to go with a 74-yard scoring keeper to lead the Blue Devils. Jordan Waters ran for 91 yards and two scores, including his own highlight-reel moment with a 38-yard cutback run past multiple UNC defenders for a score and a 35-31 lead with 10:12 left.

Yet this one ended like each of the three since Mack Brown returned for a second stint leading the UNC program: with the Tar Heels jubilantly clanging the Victory Bell again on their way off the field.

CHAPEL HILL — Drake Maye threw for five touchdowns and Antoine Green had a career night with 180 yards receiving as No. 21 North Carolina overcame a 10-point deficit in the second half to defeat Pittsburgh 42-24 on Saturday.

UNC (7-1, 4-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) is 4-0 in league play for the first time since going 8-0 in 2015. Green, a fifth-year senior, hauled in a pair of touchdowns and set career highs in yards receiving and receptions (10).

The loss was Pitt's second straight, and the Panthers (4-4, 1-3 ACC) are 1-3 in their last four games after starting 3-1.

UNC went down 24-14 early in the third quarter on the third touchdown of the night by Pitt running back Israel Abanikanda before scoring 28 unanswered points.

The Tar Heels took their first lead on a 2-yard run by Elijah Green less than a minute into the fourth. On the ensuing Pitt drive, Abanikanda lost a fumble at midfield and the Tar Heels capitalized with a 25-yard touchdown reception by Josh Downs a few plays later to take a two-score lead they didn't relinquish.

Pitt wideout Jared Wayne had a career-best 161 yards receiving as the Panthers relied on big pass plays to power their strong start. But after going up by 10 on its first drive of the second half, Pitt gained only 60 yards on its final four possessions.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA.—Drake Maye threw for two touchdowns and ran for another and No. 17 North Carolina outscored Virginia 21-7 after halftime to rally for a 31-28 victory Saturday.

Elijah Green scored twice and Josh Downs caught 15 passes, including a touchdown, for the Tar Heels (8-1, 5-0 Atlantic Coast Conference, No. 17 CFP), now 5-0 in league play for the first time since 2015, when they qualified for their lone appearance in the ACC championship.

The Cavaliers (3-6, 1-5), playing without three starting wide receivers, lost for the fifth time in six games and need to win their final three games to qualify for a bowl game.

Virginia started fast, getting a touchdown on its opening drive for the first time this season and led 14-10 at halftime. But Maye led the Tar Heels downfield in just 2:55 to start the third quarter, Green finishing the drive with a 4-yard run. Virginia answered with a 75-yard touchdown drive of its own to retake the lead, but Maye found Downs from 19 yards before the quarter was over and hit Green with a 22-yard pass in the flat with 13:19 left.

Brennan Armstrong pulled Virginia within a field goal with his second scoring run with 3:24 left on a drive that covered 71 yards in just 59 seconds, but Virginia was offside on the ensuing onside kick, giving UNC the ball at the Cavaliers 23. One more completion to a diving Downs converting a third-and-2 allowed the Tar Heels to run out the clock.

Maye finished 26 for 37 for 293 yards and ran for 74 yards. Downs' catches went for 166 yards, giving him 23 catches for 369 yards and three TDs in the last two years against Virginia.

Xavier Brown and Ronnie Walker ran for Virginia scores.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (AP) — No. 15 North Carolina didn't squander its first chance to clinch a trip to the Atlantic Coast Conference championship game.

Noah Burnette kicked a 33-yard field goal with 2:12 left and UNC's defense came up with key fourth-quarter stops to beat Wake Forest 36-34 on Saturday night, a win that claimed the league's Coastal Division title.

The Tar Heels (9-1, 6-0) earned it with a road win in a marquee matchup of star quarterbacks Drake Maye of UNC and Sam Hartman of Wake Forest. And while the offenses had the edge all night, the Tar Heels' defense pitched in at critical moments to keep them unbeaten in league play.

As a result, the Tar Heels' locker-room celebration included ACC associate commissioner for football Michael Strickland coming in to present the team with the trophy for winning the Coastal. It even made its way to star receiver Josh Downs at one point as he talked with reporters afterward near the locker-room tunnel.

The game-turning play came with the Tar Heels facing a one-point deficit and Wake Forest's offense pushing across midfield. But Cam'Ron Kelly jumped in front of Hartman's throw over the middle for an interception to set up the drive for Burnette's go-ahead kick.

Then, the Tar Heels pressured Hartman into a fourth-down incomplection with 64 seconds left — a moment that had Tar Heels players skipping around the sideline in anticipation. The Tar Heels killed the rest of the clock to seal the program's second trip to the ACC title game and first since 2015 — this one coming with Brown in his second tenure with the school.

Maye threw for 448 yards and three touchdowns, each going to Downs who continued his tear of late. Downs finished with 11 grabs for 154 yards, with all three of his scores coming before halftime.

Hartman threw for 320 yards and four touchdowns for Wake Forest (6-4, 2-4). Donavon Greene had two of those scores, including a 60-yarder late in the third quarter for a 34-33 lead.
