Tech Faces Marquette in Fort Myers Tip-Off

Looking to rebound from its first loss of the season against Utah, Georgia Tech returns to the court at 6 p.m. Wednesday to face Marquette of the Big East Conference, a game that will determine third place in the Rocket Mortgage Fort Myers Tip-Off.

Tech is in the Beach Division of the Fort Myers Tip-Off with the Utes, Marquette and Mississippi State. The Yellow Jackets dropped a 68-64 decision to the Utes Monday night, while the Golden Eagles fell, 58-55, to the Bulldogs. Mississippi State and Utah will play for the championship at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday.

Before Monday's loss, Tech put together its first 3-0 start since the 2015-16 season with wins over Clayton State (93-63) and Northern Illinois (68-50) sandwiched around a last-second 59-57 victory at cross-town foe Georgia State.

Marquette came to Fort Myers with a 3-1 mark, defeating Radford (79-69), Central Michigan (97-73) and Long Island University (95-58) along with a 75-70 loss at Purdue.

The game will be televised nationally on FS1. Radio coverage is on the Georgia Tech Sports Network by Legends Sports and flagship station 680 the Fan (680 AM/93.7 FM), as well as on satellite radio.

under head coach Josh Pastner, looking to replace the scoring punch of **Michael Devoe** and **Jordan Usher**, who combined to average more than 32 points per game.

Among the eight key letterwinners returning are two starters from the 2021-22 squad, both seniors in 6-3 point guard **Kyle Sturdivant** (7.6 ppg, 2.3 apg) and 6-11 center **Rodney Howard** (6.5 ppg, 5.1 rpg), as well as the backup point guard, 6-1 junior **Deivon Smith** (5.7 ppg, 2.0 apg) and a rising trio of sophomore perimeter players in 6-6 **Dallan "Deebo" Coleman** (6.2 ppg), 6-6 **Miles Kelly** (4.5 ppg) and 6-7 **Jalon Moore** (2.8 ppg). Junior 6-2 guard **Tristan Maxwell** and 6-8 junior forward **Jordan Meka** return to provide additional depth.

Pastner and his staff have augmented the eight returnees with a pair of transfers in 6-2 guard **Lance Terry** (14.3 ppg at Gardner-Webb) and 6-7 forward **Ja'von Franklin** (12.2 ppg, 7.8 rpg at South Alabama), and over the summer signed a pair of international players - 6-8 forward **Freds Pauls Bagatskis** from Latvia and 7-foot center **Cyril Martynov** of Canada.

Tech finished off the 2021-22 season with an 84-74 loss to Louisville in the first round of the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. Tech (12-20 overall, 5-15 ACC) finished in 14th place in the ACC regular season standings, one year after winning the fourth conference title in program history.

Series vs. Fort Myers Tip-Off Teams

- **Utah** - Georgia Tech and Utah had never faced off in men's basketball before Monday night's 68-64 win for the Utes. The Utes were the third Pac-12 opponent the Yellow Jackets have faced under head coach Josh Pastner. Tech lost to UCLA in China to begin the 2017-18 season, and lost to Southern California last December in the Jerry Colangelo Classic in Phoenix, Ariz.

- **Marquette** - Tech is 3-4 against Marquette, having lost the last three meetings in the series, including a 72-70 decision most recently in the 2014 Orlando Classic. The teams played home-and-away in 1976 and 1977, the year the Golden Eagles won the NCAA Championship under Al McGuire. The teams have met four times in early-season tournaments.

- **Mississippi State** - The teams have not met since 1975, and Tech leads the series 16-13. The first seven meetings took place when the teams were members of the old Southern Conference, with the Bulldogs winning five of the seven. The next 18 occurred when both teams were members of the Southeastern Conference, with the Yellow Jackets winning 11 of those. The Yellow Jackets have won three of the four meetings since exiting the SEC.

Last Time Out

Georgia Tech forced 19 turnovers and turned them into 24 points, but the Yellow Jackets shot the ball poorly early and in the game's final minutes, dropping a 68-64 decision to Utah in the opening round of the Rocket Mortgage Fort Myers Tip-Off.

The Yellow Jackets missed their first eight shots from the floor and 15 of their first 17 to fall behind 23-4, but rallied behind guard Deivon Smith, who led Tech with 15 points and had four assists, and forward Ja'von Franklin, who had 11 points and eight rebounds. Deebo Coleman also reached double figures with 11 points.

Despite shooting just 30 percent from the floor, Tech whittled its deficit down to eight (36-28) by the halftime break. The Jackets erased the rest of the Utah lead in the first eight minutes of the second half, outscoring the Utes 17-4 over that stretch, including an 11-0 run that put Tech ahead 45-42 with 11:58 remaining. Miles Kelly scored eight of his nine points in the game during the run.

The teams traded baskets for the next four minutes and Tech still led 57-54 at the 7:22 media timeout. But the Jackets made just one of eight shots from the floor after that. Rolie Worster hit a three from straight on to tie the game at 57 with 5:48 left, and Lazar Stefanovic drove for a layup to give Utah the

lead for good at the 4:55 mark.

Tech remained within striking distance and had one chance to tie or take the lead in the closing seconds. Down 66-64, Smith drove the lane and put up an off-balance shot that would not go down, and the Utes' Gabe Madsen iced the game with a pair of free throws with just 1.7 seconds on the clock.

The Jackets turned the ball over a season-low five times, but finished the game making just 34.8 percent of their field goals and just 5-of-23 three-point attempts. Tech had 18 offensive rebounds, but converted them into only nine points, and struggled from the free throw line, making just 11 of 20 attempts.

Takeaways from the Utah Game

- Tech has started the same lineup for each of the first four games – four guards around center Rodney Howard.
- Tech has utilized a nine-player rotation in each of its first three games. All nine scored points against Clayton State and Northern Illinois, while eight registered in the scoring column at Georgia State. Seven tallied against Utah.
- Tech shot season-low from the floor (34.8 pct.), from three-point range (21.7 pct.) and from the foul line (55 pct.).
- After getting to the free throw line 51 times in its first two games, Tech has attempted just 33 foul shots in the last two.
- Tech committed just five turnovers against Utah, which matched a low for the Yellow Jackets under Josh Pastner (5 vs. Notre Dame on Feb. 1, 2020). The Jackets are No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 nationally in fewest turnovers committed.
- Tech forced 19 Utah turnovers and have a plus-21 (5.3 per game) advantage in turnovers through four games. The Jackets lead the ACC and rank 44th nationally in turnover margin

- Tech's 13 steals were a season high and its most since swiping 13 against Florida State last Jan. 26.
- Tech has limited its first four foes to 16-of-76 shooting from three-point range (21.1 percent). The Jackets lead the ACC and rank fourth nationally in three-point defense.

- Miles Kelly has made a three-point field goal in 10 consecutive games dating back to last Feb. 21 at Syracuse. He went 0-1 at Pittsburgh the game before that. Over the 10-game stretch he is 19-for-45 (42.2 percent). He is, however, just 2-for-14 in his last two games.

- Kelly has hit 27-of-65 (41.5 pct.) from three-point range over Tech's last 17 games dating back to Jan. 23 vs. Clayton State. He was 5-for-30 over the Jackets' first 17 games of last season.

- Kelly failed to reach double figures for the first time in six games (he had 9 points vs. Utah). Kelly had averaged 14.6 points in his last five games dating back to last season's regular-season finale against Boston College.

- Deivon Smith has reached double-figure points for the three times in four games and is now averaging in double figures for the season (10.8 ppg). His 15 points against Utah were a team-high.

- Smith has 10 assists in his last two games and leads the Yellow Jackets with 13 in four games. He also has 15 rebounds in the last two games and is tied for the team lead this season at 6.5 per game.

- Ja'von Franklin has scored 25 points, taken 19 rebounds, blocked six shots and dished five assists in Tech's last two games. He had 10/7/4/2 in Tech's first two games.

- Franklin also reached double figures in points for the 23rd time in his career, first as a Yellow Jacket.

- Deebo Coleman has reached double figures in three straight games (13.0 ppg).

General Storylines

- **108th season** - Georgia Tech is playing its 108th season of basketball in 2022-23, having compiled an all-time on-court record of 1,425-1,287 (22 wins and one loss from the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons were vacated by the NCAA Committee on Infractions).

- **Tech in the ACC** - Tech is playing its 44th season as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, having won the conference championship in 1985, 1990, 1993 and 2021. Prior to that, Tech competed in the Metro Conference for three seasons from 1975-78, was an independent from 1964-75, and was a member of the Southeastern Conference for 32 years from 1932-64, winning one title in 1938.

- Tech has played six seasons under head coach Josh Pastner, who has built the Tech program based on a "get old and stay old" philosophy, elevating the talent level incrementally through ever-improving high school recruiting and attracting transfers who went to high school in the Atlanta area.

- Georgia Tech has been projected to finish last in the ACC standings by a vote of the conference's official media panel before the season. Last season, Tech was projected to finish 10th and wound up 14th, the first time under Pastner that the Yellow Jackets finished below projections. In the prior three seasons, the Jackets surpassed expectations, having been picked to finish 13th, 12th and ninth, respectively, before eventually finishing 10th, fifth and fourth in the regular season.

- Tech lost its top two scorers in seniors **Michael Devoe** and **Jordan Usher**, but returns eight of the next 10 players. Tech's returning scholarship players combined to start 100 games in 2021-22, and logged 53.8 percent of the minutes played.

- Four seniors, all rotation players, completed their Tech careers in 2021-22 and graduated in May. **Michael Devoe** (G League camp) and **Jordan Usher** (Turkey) are pursuing professional careers. **Khalid Moore** (Fordham) and **Bubba Parham** (Samford) elected to enter the transfer portal and pursue graduate transfer opportunities for their final season of eligibility.

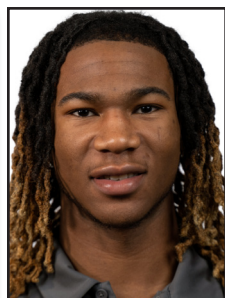
