STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech returns for its fourth season under head coach Nell Fortner in 2022-23, looking to carry momentum from a successful 2021-22 season. In just three seasons at Georgia Tech, Fortner has compiled a 58-31 mark with the Jackets. As a collegiate head coach, Fortner boasts a 220-148 (.598) record.
- The Yellow Jackets capped last season making its 11th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, earning the No. 9 seed. Tech made consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the Yellow Jackets made six-straight appearances from 2007-2012.
- Tech finished the 2021-22 season with a 21-11 overall record and 11-7 Atlantic Coast Conference mark. The Jackets earned the No. 6 seed in the ACC Tournament and faced Wake Forest in the second round, gutting out a 45-40 win despite playing without first-team all-conference performer Lorela Cubaj for nearly three quarters. The win pushed Tech into the quarterfinals for the 33rd time in program history.
- Georgia Tech returns two starters from last year's squad - center Nerea Hermosa and guard/forward Eyllia Love. Two of the top four scorers from last year's team, Hermosa and Love combined to average 10.5 points per game and account for 34.6 percent of the team's offense. Hermosa also returns as the team's leading rebounder, having finished second on the team last season, securing 5.6 rebounds per game on average.
- Georgia Tech will look to replace all-American starters Lorela Cubaj and Lotta-Maj Lahtinen, the team's leading rebounder and scorer from last season, respectively. The pair combined to average 10.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game. Cubaj, an honorable mention all-American last season, was the Georgia College Player of the Year for the second straight year and was selected No. 18 overall in the WNBA Draft.
- Georgia Tech picked up fifth-year transfers Bianca Jackson (Montgomery, Ala./Florida State) and Cameron Swartz (Marietta, Ga./Boston College). Jackson helped FSU to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances. Last season, she finished third on the team in scoring, averaging 6.7 points per game. In two years at FSU, Jackson appeared in 45 games, averaged 9.8 points and 2.8 assists per game, while shooting 35.7 percent from the floor and 82.2 percent from the free throw line.
- The ACC's Most Improved Player last year, Swartz played three seasons at Boston College and averaged 16.1 points per game last season to rank sixth in the league. In three years at Boston College, Swartz appeared in 82 games, starting 71, averaged 12.9 points, 28.4 minutes, 4.2 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game. She shot 39.1 percent from the field and 79.1 percent from the charity stripe.
- In addition to its two transfers, Georgia Tech welcomed four freshmen newcomers to the roster - Raeven Boswell (G, 5-11, Austin, Texas), Kara Dunn (G, 5-11, Dallas, Ga.), Tonie Morgan (G., 5-9, Tallahassee, Fla.) and Inés Noguero (G, 5-9, Gijón, Spain).

ACC PREDICTIONS

Georgia Tech was picked to finish eighth in the preseason Atlantic Coast Conference poll, as picked by the Blue Ribbon Panel. The Yellow Jackets finished sixth in the league last season and advanced to their second consecutive NCAA Tournament.

However, Tech lost three of its starters to graduation and eligibility, including its leading rebounder (Lorela Cubaj - 11.1 rpg) and scorer (Lotta-Maj Lahtinen - 10.9 ppg). Cubaj, who averaged a double-double behind 10.0 ppg, led the ACC in rebounding. Cubaj finished ninth in the nation in rebounds and 16th in rebounds per game.

ANN MEYERS DRYSDALE WATCH LIST

Georgia Tech fifth-year transfer, Cameron Swartz was one of 20 shooting guards named to the watch list. The reigning ACC Most Improved Player, Swartz transferred to Georgia Tech for her fifth year of eligibility after leading Boston College in scoring last season, averaging 16.1 points per game. The local native ranked sixth overall in the ACC in scoring and earned an all-ACC first team nod.

Swartz was one of five players from the ACC on the list, joining Celeste Taylor (Duke), Hailey Van Lith (Louisville), Jakia Brown-Turner (NC State), and Ashley Owusu (Virginia Tech).

HITTING THE PORTAL

Georgia Tech hit the transfer portal over the summer and welcomed two transfers to The Flats for their fifth seasons of eligibility. Joining the 2022-23 roster are Bianca Jackson (Florida State) and Cameron Swartz (Marietta, Ga.)

Jackson - A native of Montgomery, Ala., Jackson played the last two seasons at Florida State, helping the Seminoles to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. At FSU, she appeared in 45 contests, starting 26 and averaged 9.8 points per game in two years. Last season, she finished third on the team in scoring, posting 6.7 ppg, switching to a shooting guard. Her first season with the Seminoles, Jackson averaged a team-best 14.1 ppg as a redshirt-junior. She played her first two seasons at South Carolina (2017-19) before transferring to Florida State. Jackson played in 57 games in two seasons, helping the Gamecocks reach the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 in 2019. She was named SEC All-Freshman Team in 2017-18.

Swartz - A three-year starter at Boston College (2019-22), Swartz averaged 12.9 points per game over her career as an Eagle. She played in 82 games, starting 71. Swartz started all 33 games her senior season, earned all-ACC first team recognition and was named ACC Most Improved Player. She averaged a team-high 16.1 points per game, led the team in three-pointers (60) and three-point percentage (35.5 percent). Swartz led the ACC in scoring in conference play and finished sixth overall. Last season, she increased her scoring average by 6.5 points, rebounding by 1.2, field goal percentage by plus-four percent and 3-point field goal percentage by over 10 percent from her junior season. Swartz played her freshman season at Colorado, taking the floor in seven games.

Also arriving from the transfer portal, Kayla Blackshear was a mid-year transfer from Alabama, joining the team in January. Blackshear appeared in the Crimson Tide's first three games of the 2021-22 season, averaging 10.2 minutes per game off the bench. Blackshear contributed 5.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per game in the first three games.

APPROACHING A MILESTONE

Georgia Tech's Nerea Hermosa is closing in on a prestigious career milestone, the 1,000 career points club. Currently, Hermosa owns 752 career points in three seasons, needing just 248 points to become the 34th player in Georgia Tech women's basketball history to hit 1,000 career points.

Last season, the Yellow Jackets lauded two players into the club -

GOING DANCING

Under the direction of head coach Nell Fortner, Georgia Tech has made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2021 and 2022, marking the first time Tech has made consecutive appearances since six-straight from 2007-12.

Tech reached the Sweet 16 for just the second time in program history in 2021. Last season's appearance marked the 11th in the Big Dance. The Jackets fell to Kansas in the first round, traveling to Palo Alto, Calif., for the contest.

ACC WINS

Nell Fortner has guided Georgia Tech to three-straight seasons of double-digit ACC wins, marking the first time in program history for such a feat.

Prior to Fortner's arrival, Georgia Tech had posted double-digit ACC wins just once, going 12-4 in 2011-12. Tech's outright third-place finish in 2021 marked the best overall finish in program history as the Jackets tied for third in 2012.

WHAT RETURNS

Georgia Tech returns two of its top three scorers from last season, and 41.2 percent of its scoring overall. Nerea Hermosa comes back as the team's leading returning scorer after averaging 10.6 points per game as a junior. Eyllia Love scored one point less than Hermosa and averaged 10.5 ppg to rank third overall on the team. Tech had four players last season average 10.0 points per game or higher, led by Lotta-Maj Lahtinen at 10.9 ppg.

On the glass, Georgia Tech has big shoes to fill after losing its leading rebounder in Lorela Cubaj (11.1 rebounds per game). The Jackets return 34.8 percent of its rebounding this season, paced by Hermosa who averaged 5.6 rpg last season. Hermosa was the team's second leading rebounder after Cubaj as the Jackets have lost two of its top three rebounders (Digna Strautmene - 5.3 rpg).

WHAT'S NEW?

The Yellow Jackets will look quite a bit different this season, welcoming seven newcomers (three transfers plus four freshmen).

HEAD COACH NELL FORTNER

4th Season • Texas '82

Nell Fortner was named the sixth head coach of Georgia Tech women's basketball on April 9, 2019. One of the most successful coaches in women's basketball history, Fortner has compiled a 363-218 (.625) record as a head coach at the collegiate, professional and international levels. She has led teams to Big Ten (Purdue – 1997) and Southeastern Conference (Auburn – 2009) championships and, perhaps most notably, coached the United States national team to three international titles from 1997-2000, including the gold medal at the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney, Australia. Fortner is the winningest coach in the history of the USA women's basketball national team, having compiled a 101-14 (.878) record. In addition to the 2000 Olympics championship, she also led the team to the gold medal at the 1998 World Championship in Berlin, Germany and the 1998 William Jones Cup in Taipei, Taiwan. At the collegiate level, Fortner has 12 seasons of experience as a head coach – one at Purdue (1996-97), eight at Auburn (2004-12) and three at Georgia Tech (2019-22) – and has compiled a 220-148 (.598) overall record in the college ranks.
