TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech baseball looks to continue their hot start to the 2023 campaign when they a pair of midweek matchups in Long Island and Kennesaw State on Feb. 28-March 1, respectively.
- While the Yellow Jackets and Owls have squared off 33 times, Tech has never faced Long Island before.
- Georgia Tech split its matchup with KSU last season, taking games at each others' respective venue.
- Georgia Tech has looked just as potent at the plate as in year's past, hitting .324 through seven games for 35 extra-base hits and 15 home runs.
- Five Jackets are hitting .300 or better, led by two-way talent **Jackson Finley** (.500) and **Jack Rubenstein** (.476).
- Also hitting .300 are **Jake DeLeo** (.400), **Angelo Dispigna** (.385), and **Nicholas Romano** (.333).
- Dispigna joined Friday night starter **Dawson Brown** as a pair of National Players of the Week, giving Tech three so far this year.
- Dispigna hit .412 last week and blasted three home runs, including a back-breaking home run to put the game out of reach on Friday against Tennessee Tech.
- Brown punched out a career 12 batters in a career-long 6.0 innings on Friday to get his first decision of the season.
- Overall, Tech's pitching staff recorded 18 strikeouts on Friday against TTU, one shy of tying the school record.
- Dalton Smith** will get the start on Tuesday against Long Island. He's made one appearance this season, going a clean inning of work with a strikeout.
- Smith has made seven starts in his four-year career on The Flats. In 37 total appearances, he has a 7-2 record with a 5.02 ERA.

• Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .755 percent of its games at home (988-321-1).

• Tech was excellent at home in 2022, recording a 22-9 record at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium.

• Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full seasons – 2017 and 2021.

• In 2022, Tech hit a gaudy .349 at home.

• **Stephen Reid** returns in right field after hitting .333 for 16 home runs and 63 RBI last season.

• **Drew Compton** started all 60 games at third base last year and hit .275 for 14 home runs and 58 RBI -- a down year for him.

• **Jadyn Jackson** was red-hot at the plate in the fall after hitting .252 last year. Jackson entered late to shore up the middle infield defensively, starting the final 28 games.

• **Jake DeLeo** will look to have his first fully healthy year in a while after being limited to just 30 games last season. Despite limited action, he hit .286 for 19 RBI and two home runs.

• **John Giesler** stands to be a front-runner to be in the starting lineup at first base after hitting .323 in 22 games last season.

• **Jack Rubenstein** will be Tech's veteran catcher after Kevin Parada was drafted 11th overall by the New York Mets.

• Rubenstein mashed .333 for 15 hits in 27 games and 10 starts last season.

• Transfer **Angelo Dispigna** will play in the outfield for Tech after hitting .266 with 14 doubles and a team-high 15 home runs for Mercer last season.

• Through just seven games and two series, Tech hit .324 with 35 extra-base hits as multiple players stepped up for the offense.

• Tech also set the program record for most triples in a single game on Feb. 17 vs. Miami (Ohio) with four.

INFELDERS

• Georgia Tech baseball will look for its middle infield to be just as potent offensively (losing the NCAA-leader Chandler Simpson) and be as dynamic defensively in 2023.

• Up to the task will **Jadyn Jackson** and **Kristian Campbell**.

• Recruited as a top-10 shortstop out of the state of Georgia, Jackson was a constant in the Tech dugout before getting his chance to start against Virginia last season.

• He started the final 28 games of the season and made his name on terrific plays at the shortstop position.

• Jackson's defensive prowess last year has earned him a spot in the starting lineup at shortstop, making a circus SportsCenter top-10 play at UVA to save the game.

• Jackson suffered a pregame injury on Feb. 25 and does not have a timeline to return.

• Rated as the No. 5 shortstop and No. 10 player overall in the state of Georgia out of high school, Campbell redshirted last season and will vie for a starting job in the middle infield.

• Having a terrific fall, Campbell was listed as the breakout player to watch by *D1Baseball*.

• Campbell went 1-for-1 in his first collegiate game on Feb. 17 but suffered an injury and is considered day-to-day.

• With both starting middle infielders out due to injury, **Nicholas Romano** has been an important piece to step up, hitting .333 through seven games.

• Romano was once again deadly at the plate on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, hitting the go-ahead three-run home run in the fifth.

• Georgia Tech's middle infield has already proved to be stronger defensively than a year ago, already recording 32 percent of last year's double play total (9) through seven games, ranking fifth in the nation and topping the ACC.

• Last season, Tech turned just 28 double plays in 60 games.

• Filling in at shortstop has been **Demetri Diamant**, a highly rated prospect in his first season on The Flats.

• He was flawless in his first start on Feb. 25, put committed two errors on Feb. 26 as he gets his feet under him.

• As for the corners, Georgia Tech will look to steady veterans in **Drew Compton** at third and **John Giesler** at first.

• Rated as the No. 16 third baseman in the country by D1Baseball, Compton will look to bounce back from a "down" year.

• Compton hit .231 opening weekend with a double and two triples on Friday (tying his triple total from all of last year).

• Compton suffered a hamstring injury on the double on Sunday and is day-to-day.

OFFENSE

- Missing Feb. 21's game against Georgia Southern, Compton had his team-long streak of 71-consecutive games started end.
- Compton started all 60 games at third base last year and hit .275 for 14 home runs and 58 RBI -- a down year for him.
- Compton is a career .288 hitter with 30 home runs.
- Compton's ability at the plate was evident from the very get-go when he became just the third Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his very first collegiate plate appearance.
- In his stead has been **Nico Senese**, who went 2-for-3 on Feb. 26 vs. Tennessee Tech in his first start and helped convert a double play as well.
- **Brant Baughcum** has also logged two starts at third.
- Teammate **Nicholas Romano** joined the list in 2022, when he pinch hit and launched a homer himself.

- Compton really showed his potential in the 2021 NCAA Tournament, mashing four home runs in the Nashville Regional.
- Compton was the first Yellow Jacket to have four or more home runs in a NCAA Tournament since Matt Wieters had five in 2006 (three in Regionals, one in Super, one in the College World Series).

- Giesler has been a mainstay leader in the dugout for Tech and will look to get his first consistent action in the starting lineup this season at first.
- Giesler led Tech's offense Opening Weekend, hitting 556 (5-for-9) with two doubles, a triple and five RBI to slug 1.000 and reach base at a .714 clip with only one strikeout.
- Through seven games, he's hitting .280 with seven hits.
- In 22 games last season, Giesler took advantage, hitting .323 for 10 hits, one double and a home run for eight RBI. He reached base at a .450 clip.
- First base is a loaded position for Georgia Tech, also featuring **Jackson Finley**, **Angelo Dispigna** and **Carsten Sabathia** on the depth chart.

OUTFIELDERS

- Georgia Tech will debut a new-look outfield when compared to last year's opening day lineup.
- The lone returner will be veteran **Jake DeLeo**, who shifts over and will play centerfield.

- DeLeo blasted into 2023 by earning National Player of the Week honors after just the first weekend of play.
- DeLeo hit .417 with five hits, a double and a team-best three home runs (two on Sunday) against Miami (Ohio).
- He accounted for 12 of Tech's 36 runs as he drove in six and crossed the plate six times himself.
- Through seven games, he's hit .400 for 12 hits, three doubles, four home runs and 11 RBI. He's slugging .900 with a .457 on-base percentage.
- DeLeo suffered an oblique injury last year and was limited to just 30 games.
- Despite limitation, DeLeo still hit .386 for 22 hits, two home runs and 19 RBI, scoring 19 times as well.
- DeLeo entered in a big spot against then-No. 7 Louisville in the 2022 ACC Tournament, crushing a double to clear the bases and secure the win for Tech.

• In 2021, DeLeo became the first Yellow Jacket since Wade Bailey in 2017 to record five hits when he went a perfect 5-for-5 in the rubber match at then-No. 12 Virginia Tech.

- Starting the final 51 games of the season in right field was slugger **Stephen Reid**.
- Through seven games, Reid has continued his power hitting, currently at .286 with eight hits, a triple and three home runs.
- Reid was red-hot last year, hitting .333 for 72 hits, eight doubles and 16 home runs for 63 RBI.
- Reid's power at the plate was on full display against Kennesaw State last season, hitting two home runs, one a grand slam, for six RBI.

• Reid also smashed two homers out against Mercer last year, including the go-ahead two-run bomb in the fourth.

- Entering the outfield rotation will be Mercer transfer **Angelo Dispigna**.
- In his first weekend of action for Georgia Tech, Dispigna hit .333 with three hits and two doubles.
- Dispigna had his second-straight multi-hit game at Georgia Southern on Tuesday, going 2-for-5.
- He earned National Player of the Week honors (Feb. 27) for his performance against Tennessee Tech, hitting one home run a game, including a mammoth grand slam on Friday to push the lead from three to seven.
- At Mercer, Dispigna hit .266 with 14 doubles and a team-high 15 home runs last season.

• Georgia Tech's designated hitter spot in the lineup may be one of the hottest competitions on the team and in the ACC.

- **Nicholas Romano**, who hit .292 could be a candidate, as well as two-way athletes **Jackson Finley** and freshman **Riley Stanford** -- all capable of tremendous power.

- Also a possible option is freshman **Carsten Sabathia**.
- A first-baseman by trade, Sabathia stands as an intimidating presence in the box at 6-4, 240 pounds with a lot of power in his young bat.
- He is the son of MLB great C.C. Sabathia.
- Finley has played the designated hitter role to work his way into the order and has been sensational.
- In five games played and four starts at DH, Finley leads the team with a .500 average, eight hits, two doubles and two home runs for seven RBI.

PITCHING

- Georgia Tech has stockpiled depth in its pitching staff thanks to two-straight classes flush with power arms.

- Despite being younger, Tech returns **Josiah Siegel**, **Dalton Smith**, **Cody Carwile**, **Camron Hill**, **Logan McGuire**, **Aeden Finateri**, **Joseph Mannelly**, and **Dawson Brown**.

- It also regains the full services of **Ben King** and **Jackson Finley**.

- Georgia Tech's starting lineup for the first two weeks has been Brown on Friday, McGuire on Saturday and Finley on Sunday.

- In a blustering night of 40 degree temps and 20 mph winds, Brown struggled in his first start, going just 2.2 innings and allowing five runs, walking an uncharacteristic five batters while striking out six.

- McGuire responded and was outstanding, going 5.0 innings on Saturday and punching out six and walking none, while allowing just two runs on four hits (both solo homers).

- Finley continued the dominance on Sunday and went another 5.0 innings, allowing just one run on just two hits, walking none and striking out three.

- Tech will look to find a consistent core of starting pitchers after looking to 11 different arms overall to start on the mound in 2022.

- Thus far in 2023, its strength night in and night out has been its bullpen, working to a 4.15 ERA in 39.0 innings with four saves and four wins through seven games.

- Tech's top returning ERA leader is Siegel, who finished with a 3.97 ERA, 2-0 record and .266 opponents batting average.

- Siegel turned in a Herculean effort in last year's Knoxville Regional, pitching career long 6.1 innings and 98 pitches in relief and allowing just three hits and one run against Campbell, saving the bullpen for the showdown against No. 1 Tennessee.

- Smith finished last season with a 2-0 record and 4.35 ERA despite just eight appearances due to injury and will look to be a bigger presence in the bullpen in 2023.

- Brown was one of Tech's main closer last season, finishing with a team-high five saves, despite a 8.77 ERA.

- Brown turned in his best performance as a Yellow Jacket on Feb. 24 against Tennessee Tech, striking out 12 in 6.0 innings of work. His three runs allowed came on home runs.

- Brown now sports a 18.69 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranks fifth nationally and second in the nation.

- In 2021, Brown featured a 2-0 record and 4.40 ERA, but has yet to be a full-time starter for the Jackets.

- Dawson is son of Georgia Tech Hall of Famer and six-time all-star and two-time ERA title winner Kevin Brown. Kevin helped the Marlins to the 1995 World Series before signing the first \$100 million contract with the LA Dodgers in 1998.

- Carwile returns after sporting a 5.68 ERA last season in his frosh campaign, holding opponents to a .231 average.

- Carwile was terrific in his first action on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, picking up his first win of the season.

- In 2.0 innings, he allowed no hits and struck out four as part of a nine-inning bullpen effort that allowed no earned runs and struck out 13.

- He then turned in another hitless inning against Tennessee Tech.

- Another strong freshman for Tech last year was McGuire, who snagged a 4-2 record despite a 7.02 ERA.

- McGuire is known for his pounding the zone, finishing with a 36:4 strikeout-to-walk ratio last season.

- McGuire made four starts last season, highest of any returning arms.

- McGuire exited Saturday's game against Tennessee Tech after just 1.1 innings due to injury. He remains week to week.

- Finley returns to the mound after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery two seasons ago.

- He wound up pitching four innings late but has not seen consistent action since his freshman season.

- Finley's start on Sunday against Miami (Ohio) was the second of his career at Georgia Tech.

- Finley had five unearned runs cross against him thanks to three infield errors in the first four frames against Tennessee Tech.

- Hill finished last season with a 6.57 ERA in 18 appearances and one start last season, earning one save in his freshman campaign.

- Was named a New England League All-Star after being the Martha's Vineyard Sharks' closer, sporting a 0.52 ERA with a 16.41 strikeouts per 9 inning.

- Newcomers to watch will be freshmen **Riley Stanford**, **Luke Schmolke**, **Noah Samol**, and transfers **Terry Busse** and **Jackson Vaughan**.

- Stanford enters as the No. 9-ranked outfielder nationally in the class of 2022, throwing in the upper-90s on the mound as a two-way player.

- Schmolke, who is competing for a midweek starting position, was the No. 6-ranked right-hander out of North Carolina and a top-60 arm nationally, throwing mid-90s with a complete arsenal.

- Samol joins Tech as the top-ranked lefty from the state of Ohio and a top-35 arm nationally, standing a whopping 6-7 on the mound.

- Busse transferred to The Flats from John A. Logan junior college, where he made 22 appearances out of the bullpen to help them win a regional.

- In 2022, Busse earned two saves in 27.1 innings, striking out 44 batters to the tune of an ERA of 3.29.

- Busse has emerged as one of the toughest closers in the nation through four games, already tying the national lead with two saves thus far.

- His first appearance as a Yellow Jacket came to close out the ninth on Opening Day against Miami (Ohio) where he allowed just one hit and punched out three for the save.

- He made his second appearance of the year on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern when he pitched two innings to close, allowing two hits and no runs with two strikeouts for the save.

- He earned his third save in as many appearances with a strong six-out save on Saturday against Tennessee Tech, not allowing a single hit and striking out three in 22 pitches.

- Also having a strong year in the back-end of the bullpen is senior LHP **Joseph Mannelly**, who currently has a 0.00 ERA and one save in 2.2 innings of work, having allowed just two hits with three strikeouts.

- He turned in two key innings to get to Busse on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, allowing two hits with three K's.

- Also proving himself as the Jackets' top fireman, **Aeden Finateri** has appeared three times and worked to 10.0 innings in relief while sporting a 1.80 ERA.

- He's allowed nine hits two earned runs and struck out 10 hitters.

- Needing to come in the first inning of Feb. 21's game at Georgia Southern, Finateri worked 3.0 innings to settle the game, allowing just one unearned run.

- He was once again needed after McGuire's injury, going a season-long 4.2 innings, allowing just three hits, one run and no walks while striking out four.

- Vaughan joined the Jackets after two years at the University of Pacific.

- Vaughan sported a team-leading 3.27 ERA in 2022, striking out 32 in 33 innings.

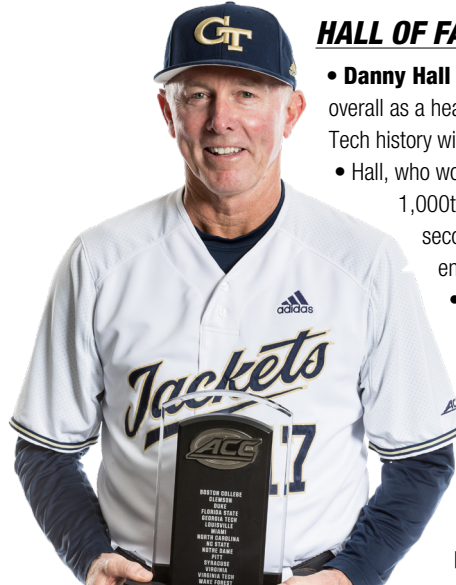

- **Danny Hall** is in his 30th season at Georgia Tech and his 34th overall as a head coach in 2022. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,147 wins.
- Hall, who won his 1,300th career game on April 25, 2021 and his 1,000th win at Georgia Tech on March 20, 2018, stands second among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2022 season.
- In 2019, Hall earned his fourth ACC Coach of the Year honor.
- In his career – both as an assistant and head coach – Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.
- Hall has led Tech to the NCAA Tournament on 22 occasions and guided the Jackets to the NCAA College World Series in 1994, 2002 and 2006 -- the program's only three berths.
