TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech baseball continues its homestand as it begins Atlantic Coast Conference play against Notre Dame on March 10-12.
- Tech and the Fighting Irish will face off in its biennial tradition, having won four of the last six games against them. The series is tied at 11-11, dating back to 1924.
- Georgia Tech has looked just as potent at the plate as in years' past, hitting .299 through 13 games for 57 extra-base hits and 24 home runs.
- Five Jackets are hitting .300 or better, led by two-way talent **Jackson Finley** (.471) and **Jake DeLeo** (.423).
- Also hitting .300 are **Jack Rubenstein** (.415), **Angelo Dispigna** (.367) and **Nico Senese** (.333).
- Finley became the fourth Yellow Jacket through three weeks of the 2023 season to be crowned a National Player of the Week after hitting four home runs and pitching four innings in the 4-1 win over Georgia on Sunday.
- On Sunday, **Ben King** received the win, pitching a flawless 3.0 innings with just two hits, no walks and three strikeouts.
- Through 10.1 innings, King has a 2-0 record, 0.00 ERA, and 13:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- Terry Busse** also came in for a six-out save, striking out five, earning his fifth save on the season, which ties for tops in the country.
- In five appearances and 8.0 innings, Busse has allowed just three hits and worked to a 16:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- Also impressing out of Tech's bullpen has been **Joseph Mannelly** (1.59 ERA), **Jackson Vaughan** (2.53), **Aeden Finateri** (3.95).
- Tech's rotation for its ACC lid-lifter will be the same on with **Dawson Brown** and Finley serving as bookends. Saturday's starter is to-be-determined.

• Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .755 percent of its games at home (990-321-1).

• Tech was excellent at home in 2022, recording a 22-9 record at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium.

• Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full seasons – 2017 and 2021.

• In 2022, Tech hit a gaudy .349 at home.

• Through just 13 games and three series, Tech hit .299 with 57 extra-base hits as multiple players stepped up for the offense.

• Tech also set the program record for most triples in a single game on Feb. 17 vs. Miami (Ohio) with four.

INFELDERS

• Georgia Tech started the year thinking some of their veterans would hold down the fort, but early season injuries have thrust freshman into starting positions.

• Up the middle was supposed to be **Jadyn Jackson** and **Kristian Campbell**.

• Recruited as a top-10 shortstop out of the state of Georgia, Jackson was a constant in the Tech dugout before getting his chance to start against Virginia last season.

• He started the final 28 games of the season and made his name on terrific plays at the shortstop position.

• Jackson's defensive prowess last year has earned him a spot in the starting lineup at shortstop, making a circus SportsCenter top-10 play at UVA to save the game.

• Jackson suffered a pregame injury on Feb. 25 and does not currently have a timeline to return.

• Rated as the No. 5 shortstop and No. 10 player overall in the state of Georgia out of high school, Campbell redshirted last season and will vie for a starting job in the middle infield.

• Having a terrific fall, Campbell was listed as the breakout player to watch by *D1Baseball*.

• Unfortunately, Campbell went 1-for-1 in his first collegiate game on Feb. 17 but suffered an injury and is working his way back.

• With both starting middle infielders out due to injury, **Nicholas Romano** has been an important piece to step up, hitting .256 through 13 games.

• Romano was once again deadly at the plate on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, hitting the go-ahead three-run home run in the fifth.

• Georgia Tech's middle infield has already proved to be stronger defensively than a year ago, already recording 57 percent of last year's double play total (16) through 12 games, ranking third in the nation and topping the ACC.

• Last season, Tech turned just 28 double plays in 60 games.

• Filling in at shortstop has been **Demetri Diamant**, a highly rated prospect in his first season on The Flats.

• He was flawless in his first start on Feb. 25, put committed two errors on Feb. 26 as he gets his feet under him.

• While continuing to find his footing at the plate, the young shortstop played error-free baseball in two games this week to gain his confidence back in the field.

• As for the corners, Georgia Tech was going to look to steady veterans in **Drew Compton** at third and **John Giesler** at first.

• Rated as the No. 16 third baseman in the country by D1Baseball, Compton will look to bounce back from a "down" year.

• Compton hit .231 opening weekend with a double and two triples on Friday (tying his triple total from all of last year).

• Unfortunately, Compton suffered a hamstring injury on the double on Feb. 19 and continues to be day-to-day.

• He pinch hit for the first action of the season since the injury on Sunday against UGA, going 0-for-2 but drawing a bases-loaded walk for an RBI.

• He then got his first start back at third on Tuesday against Lipscomb.

• Missing Feb. 21's game against Georgia Southern, Compton had his team-long steak of 71-consecutive games started end.

• Compton started all 60 games at third base last year and hit .275 for 14 home runs and 58 RBI -- a down year for him.

• Compton is a career .288 hitter with 30 home runs.

• Compton's ability at the plate was evident from the very get-go when he became just the third Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his very first collegiate plate appearance.

• Compton really showed his potential in the 2021 NCAA Tournament, mashing four home runs in the Nashville Regional.

• Compton was the first Yellow Jacket to have four or more home runs in a NCAA Tournament since Matt Wieters had five in 2006 (three in Regionals, one in Super, one in the College World Series).

• In Compton's stead has been **Nico Senese**, who went 2-for-3 on Feb. 26 vs. Tennessee Tech in his first start and helped convert a double play as well.

• Senese has most recently been Tech's starting shortstop where he has performed admirably.

• In five starts, Senese has hit .381 with two doubles and an RBI.

• **Brant Baughcum** has also logged two starts at third.

• Giesler has been a mainstay leader in the dugout for Tech and will look to get his first consistent action in the starting lineup this season at first.

• Giesler led Tech's offense Opening Weekend, hitting 556 (5-for-9) with two doubles, a triple and five RBI to slug 1.000 and reach base at a .714 clip with only one strikeout.

• Through 13 games, he's cooled off some hitting .214 with nine hits.

• Giesler has also started three games at third with the injury to Compton.

• In 22 games last season, Giesler took advantage, hitting .323 for 10 hits, one double and a home run for eight RBI. He reached base at a .450 clip.

• First base is a loaded position for Georgia Tech, also featuring **Jackson Finley**, **Angelo Dispigna** and **Carsten Sabathia** on the depth chart.

OUTFIELDERS

• Georgia Tech will debut a new-look outfield when compared to last year's opening day lineup.

• The lone returner will be veteran **Jake DeLeo**, who shifts over and will play centerfield.

• DeLeo blasted into 2023 by earning National Player of the Week honors after just the first weekend of play.

• DeLeo hit .417 with five hits, a double and a team-best three home runs (two on Sunday) against Miami (Ohio).

• He accounted for 12 of Tech's 36 runs as he drove in six and crossed the plate six times himself.

• Through 13 games, he's hit .423 for 22 hits, five doubles, five home runs and 18 RBI. He's slugging .808 with a .500 on-base percentage.

• DeLeo suffered an oblique injury last year and was limited to just 30 games.

• Despite limitation, DeLeo still hit .386 for 22 hits, two home runs and 19 RBI, scoring 19 times as well.

• DeLeo entered in a big spot against then-No. 7 Louisville in the 2022 ACC Tournament, crushing a double to clear the bases and secure the win for Tech.

• In 2021, DeLeo became the first Yellow Jacket since Wade Bailey in 2017 to record five hits when he went a perfect 5-for-5 in the rubber match at then-No. 12 Virginia Tech.

• Starting the final 51 games of the season in right field was slugger **Stephen Reid**.

• Through 13 games, Reid has continued his power hitting, currently at .250 with 13 hits, a triple and four home runs.

• Reid was red-hot last year, hitting .333 for 72 hits, eight doubles and 16 home runs for 63 RBI.

• Reid's power at the plate was on full display against Kennesaw State last season, hitting two home runs, one a grand slam, for six RBI.

• Reid also smashed two homers out against Mercer last year, including the go-ahead two-run bomb in the fourth.

• Entering the outfield rotation will be Mercer transfer **Angelo Dispigna**.

• In his first weekend of action for Georgia Tech, Dispigna hit .333 with three hits and two doubles.

• Dispigna had his second-straight multi-hit game at Georgia Southern on Tuesday, going 2-for-5.

• He earned National Player of the Week honors (Feb. 27) for his performance against Tennessee Tech, hitting one home run a game, including a mammoth grand slam on Friday to push the lead from three to seven.

• Through 13 games, he's hit .364 for 16 hits, five doubles and four home runs.

• He hit the go-ahead two-RBI single against Georgia on March 5 to give Tech an important 4-1 win.

• At Mercer, Dispigna hit .252 with 14 doubles and 10 home runs last season.

• In his fifth year of college baseball, Dispigna is among the active leaders in the nation in nine statistics.

• Dispigna owns almost 20 more total bases than the second-place Noah Ledford at Georgia Southern.

• Georgia Tech's designated hitter spot in the lineup may be one of the hottest competitions on the team and in the ACC.

• **Nicholas Romano**, who hit .292 last year could be a candidate, as well as two-way athletes **Jackson Finley** and freshman **Riley Stanford** -- all capable of tremendous power.

• Also a possible option is freshman **Carsten Sabathia**.

• A first-baseman by trade, Sabathia stands as an intimidating presence in the box at 6-4, 240 pounds with a lot of power in his young bat.

• Sabathia recorded his first collegiate hit and home run on Saturday against Georgia, driving in three runs.

• He is the son of MLB great C.C. Sabathia.

• Finley has played the designated hitter role to work his way into the order and has been sensational.

• In 11 games and 10 starts, Finley has been a machine at the plate.

• He's currently leading the team at .471 with 16 hits, three doubles and team-leading six home runs for 17 RBI. He's slugging a gaudy 1.088 with a .561 on-base percentage, also drawing five walks and getting hit twice.

• Against Long Island on Feb. 28, Finley homered twice in the first inning and three times on the game, becoming the 13th Yellow Jacket to tie the school record.

PITCHING

- Georgia Tech has stockpiled depth in its pitching staff thanks to two-straight classes flush with power arms.

- Despite being younger, Tech returns **Josiah Siegel**, **Dalton Smith**, **Cody Carwile**, **Camron Hill**, **Logan McGuire**, **Aeden Finateri**, **Joseph Mannelly**, and **Dawson Brown**.

- It also regains the full services of **Ben King** and **Jackson Finley**.

- Early on, Georgia Tech has looked more impressive on the mound.

- Despite some inflated ERA's due to blowout wins and stretching arms out, Tech currently sports a 6.34 ERA as a staff.

- Starters thus far have been a little bit up and down and have an 9.08 ERA.

- Where the Jackets have been dominant is in their bullpen, which holds a 4.66 ERA.

- And if you take out the three highest ERA's, the ERA plummets to 2.92 ERA for the remaining eight arms.

STARTERS

- Georgia Tech's starting lineup for the first two weeks has been **Dawson Brown** on Friday, **Logan McGuire** on Saturday and **Jackson Finley** on Sunday.

- In a blustering night of 40 degree temps and 20 mph winds, Brown struggled in his first start, going just 2.2 innings and allowing five runs, walking an uncharacteristic five batters while striking out six.

- McGuire responded and was outstanding, going 5.0 innings on Saturday and punching out six and walking none, while allowing just two runs on four hits (both solo homers).

- Finley continued the dominance on Sunday and went another 5.0 innings, allowing just one run on just two hits, walking none and striking out three.

- Tech will look to find a consistent core of starting pitchers after looking to 11 different arms overall to start on the mound in 2022.

- Brown was one of Tech's main closer last season, finishing with a team-high five saves, despite a 8.77 ERA.

- Brown turned in his best performance as a Yellow Jacket on Feb. 24 against Tennessee Tech, striking out 12 in 6.0 innings of work. His three runs allowed came on home runs.

- Brown now sports a 14.25 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranks 35th nationally and seventh in the nation.

- In 2021, Brown featured a 2-0 record and 4.40 ERA, but has yet to be a full-time starter for the Jackets.

- Dawson is son of Georgia Tech Hall of Famer and six-time all-star and two-time ERA title winner Kevin Brown. Kevin helped the Marlins to the 1995 World Series before signing the first \$100 million contract with the LA Dodgers in 1998.

- Another strong freshman for Tech last year was McGuire, who snagged a 4-2 record despite a 7.02 ERA.

- McGuire is known for his pounding the zone, finishing with a 36:4 strikeout-to-walk ratio last season.

- McGuire made four starts last season, highest of any returning arms.

- McGuire exited Saturday's game against Tennessee Tech after just 1.1 innings due to injury. He remains week to week.

- Finley returns to the mound after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery two seasons ago.

- He wound up pitching four innings late but has not seen consistent action since his freshman season.

- Finley's start on Sunday against Miami (Ohio) was the second of his career at Georgia Tech.

- Finley had five unearned runs cross against him thanks to three infield errors in the first four frames against Tennessee Tech.

- Finley turned in a terrific and much-needed performance on Sunday against Georgia, going 4.0 innings and holding UGA to just two hits and one run, while striking out four.

- That allowed Tech to work to its strongest bullpen arms in **Ben King** and **Terry Busse** to get the win.

- Finley's brother, Leighton, is now a freshman right-handed pitcher at Georgia.

- Georgia Tech's other spot starters have been **Luke Schmolke**, **Josiah Siegel** and **Dalton Smith**.

RELIEVERS

- Where the Jackets have been dominant is in their bullpen, which holds a 4.81 ERA.

- And if you take out the three highest ERA's, the ERA plummets to 2.81 ERA for the remaining eight arms.

- Strong out of the bullpen early has been senior LHP **Joseph Mannelly**, RHP **Jackson Vaughan**, LHP **Cody Carwile**, RHP **Ben King**, LHP **Dalton Smith** and RHP **Terry Busse**.

- Mannelly currently has a 1.59 ERA and one save in 5.2 innings of work, having allowed just six hits with seven strikeouts.

- Mannelly has been a leader of the pitching staff for years, but has dealt with nagging injuries that have kept him from contributing fully.

- Vaughan transfers in after two years at the University of Pacific.

- Through six appearances, he's worked to a 1-0 record and 2.53 ERA in 10.2 innings of work.

- He had his strongest outing in the White and Gold on Friday at Georgia when he went 3.2 innings of one-hit ball, striking out three to give Tech chances at the plate.

- Prior to Tech, Vaughan sported a team-leading 3.27 ERA in 2022, striking out 32 in 33 innings.

- Vaughan's story is a miracle, overcoming Stage 4 liver cancer as a child and surviving two liver transplants.

- He is the only NCAA student-athlete to ever play after having a liver transplant.

- Carwile returns after sporting a 7.36 ERA last season in his frosh campaign, holding opponents to a .286 average.

- Carwile was terrific in his first action on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, picking up his first win of the season.

- In 2.0 innings, he allowed no hits and struck out four as part of a nine-inning bullpen effort that allowed no earned runs and struck out 13.

- He then turned in another hitless inning against Tennessee Tech.

- He then surrendered three runs in two innings against Long Island, walking two as well.

- King returns from Tommy John Surgery and has been sensational in relief, currently sporting a 0.00 ERA with a 2-0 record in 10.1 innings of work.

- He's currently holding hitters to a .121 batting average with a 13:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

- King got the win against Georgia on Sunday, throwing 3.0 innings of two-hit, no-walk baseball with three strikeouts.

- King is a decorated student-athlete who also serves as President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Board and has been the ACC's representative at NCAA meetings two-straight years.

- Busse has been sensational transferring in from John A. Logan Junior College, where he made 22 appearances out of the bullpen to help them win a regional.

- Busse has emerged as one of the toughest closers in the nation through five appearances, already tying the national lead with five saves thus far.

- He's currently tied with Oklahoma State All-American closer Nolan McLean.

- He currently sports a 0.00 ERA with a 16:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

- His first appearance as a Yellow Jacket came to close out the ninth on Opening Day against Miami (Ohio) where he allowed just one hit and punched out three for the save.

- He made his second appearance of the year on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern when he pitched two innings to close, allowing two hits and no runs with two strikeouts for the save.

- He earned his third save in as many appearances with a strong six-out save on Saturday against Tennessee Tech, not allowing a single hit and striking out three in 22 pitches.

- He turned in two key innings to get to Busse on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, allowing two hits with three K's.

PITCHING

- He was as dominant as ever on March 1 against Kennesaw State, coming in to close a one-run game in the ninth. He needed just 14 pitches to strikeout all three batters he faced to secure Tech's victory.
- He got his fifth save of the season on Sunday at Georgia when he pitched six outs, five of which were strikeouts, to hold the 4-1 win for Tech.
- In 2022 with John A. Logan, Busse earned two saves in 27.1 innings, striking out 44 batters to the tune of an ERA of 3.29.
- Also proving himself as the Jackets' top fireman, **Aeden Finateri** has appeared six times and worked to 13.2 innings in relief while sporting a 3.95 ERA.
- He's allowed 16 hits, six earned runs and struck out 15 hitters compared to just three walks.
- Needing to come in the first inning of Feb. 21's game at Georgia Southern, Finateri worked 3.0 innings to settle the game, allowing just one unearned run.
- He was once again needed after McGuire's injury, going a season-long 4.2 innings, allowing just three hits, one run and no walks while striking out four.
- His last appearance came on March 1 where he pitched the fourth inning of a one-run game against Kennesaw State.
- He allowed two hits, but none scored, as he struck out two before forcing a groundout.
- His lone bad appearance came against Georgia on Saturday when he entered in the third, allowing four runs on five hits in 1.2 innings.
- Tech's top returning ERA leader is Siegel, who finished with a 3.97 ERA, 2-0 record and .266 opponents batting average.
- Siegel turned in a Herculean effort in last year's Knoxville Regional, pitching career long 6.1 innings and 98 pitches in relief and allowing just three hits and one run against Campbell, saving the bullpen for the showdown against No. 1 Tennessee.
- Smith finished last season with a 2-0 record and 4.35 ERA despite just eight appearances due to injury and will look to be a bigger presence in the bullpen in 2023.
- Hill finished last season with a 6.57 ERA in 18 appearances and one start last season, earning one save in his freshman campaign.
- Was named a New England League All-Star after being the Martha's Vineyard Sharks' closer, sporting a 0.52 ERA with a 16.41 strikeouts per 9 inning.
- Hill pitched the eighth against Miami (Ohio) on Feb. 18 and suffered a non-elbow injury that he's been rehabbing since. He is week to week on returning.
- Schmolke, who is competing for a midweek starting position, was the No. 6-ranked right-hander out of North Carolina and a top-60 arm nationally, throwing mid-90s with a complete arsenal.
- Samol joins Tech as the top-ranked lefty from the state of Ohio and a top-35 arm nationally, standing a whopping 6-7 on the mound.

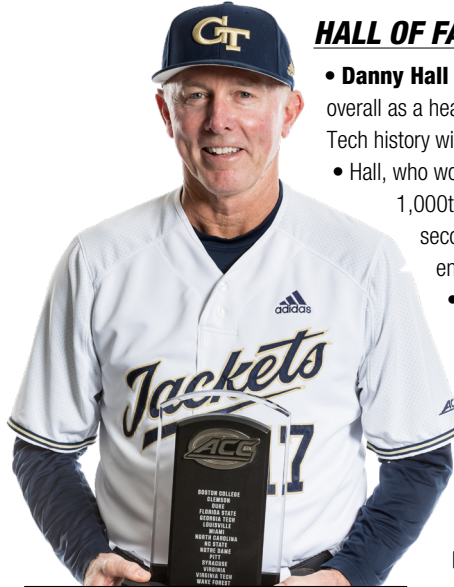

- **Danny Hall** is in his 30th season at Georgia Tech and his 34th overall as a head coach in 2022. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,151 wins.
- Hall, who won his 1,300th career game on April 25, 2021 and his 1,000th win at Georgia Tech on March 20, 2018, stands second among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2022 season.
- In 2019, Hall earned his fourth ACC Coach of the Year honor.
- In his career – both as an assistant and head coach – Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.
- Hall has led Tech to the NCAA Tournament on 22 occasions and guided the Jackets to the NCAA College World Series in 1994, 2002 and 2006 -- the program's only three berths.
