TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech baseball heads on the road for its penultimate ACC series against No. 10 Duke on May 12-14.
- Georgia Tech looks to close the season on a hot streak as one of only 16 teams nationally with 10+ top-50 RPI wins, having currently won seven of its last nine games.
- Tech's remaining schedule features No. 21 Virginia and Mercer as it winds down the season.
- Tech took a convincing series win against Pitt, holding the Panthers to just nine runs total, while scoring 26 runs of its own.
- Tech got five-inning, one-run starts out of both **Luke Schmolke** and **Aeden Finateri**, who has been one of Tech's top reliever and made his first start of the season.
- Alongside Orelud Two-Way Player of the Year candidate **Jackson Finley**, Tech's staff allowed just nine total runs to Pitt last weekend.
- Tech has been red-hot at the plate of late, now having three hitters in the top 10 in ACC play, including the ACC leader, **Stephen Reid** (.418). **Kristian Campbell** is sixth at (.378) and **Jake DeLeo** is 10th (.365).
- Overall, Tech (.328) has a whopping EIGHT .300 hitters in the lineup: Campbell (.382), **Angelo Dispigna** (.381), DeLeo (.378), Reid (.371), **Jadyn Jackson** (.331), **Drew Compton** (.321), **Jackson Finley** (.317), and **John Giesler** (.315).
- Reid was named both ACC and National Player of the Week for his performance against Pitt. He launched four home runs and hit .643 overall to drive in 10 runs on the weekend.
- He was the second Yellow Jacket this season to tie the program record with three homers in a single game.
- DeLeo also tied a program record on Sunday against Pitt, hitting three doubles in the game.

- With three straight top-10 classes and the first coming of junior eligibility this season, the mix of youth and experience will make for an anticipated season.

- Georgia Tech has already had to tap into its young group of studs due to injury. **Brant Baughcum**, **Nico Senese** and **Demitri Diamant** have all gotten starts on the left side of the infield.

- Catcher **Tyler Minnick** continues to platoon the catcher position with veteran returner **Jack Rubenstein**.

- Tech is also 46-26 (.539) in games decided by two runs or less since 2019.

IT STARTS AT HOME...

- "It Starts at Home" has been the offseason motto for Georgia Tech, putting an emphasis on getting victories at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium after going 26-11 in 2019.

- Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .755 percent of its games at home (990-321-1).

- In 30 home games this season, Tech is 23-7 and is hitting a blistering .357 with 86 doubles, 10 triples and 63 home runs.

- Tech was excellent at home in 2022, recording a 22-9 record at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium.

- Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full seasons -- 2017 and 2021.

- In 2022, Tech hit a gaudy .349 at home.

OFFENSE

• Georgia Tech baseball will look to revamp its offense after losing its top five hitters to the MLB Draft last season.

• Tech's offense last year was one for the ages as it topped the charts in multiple categories.

• Tech's runs per game were its most since 2001 and its batting average was its highest since 2005.

• Tech's slugging and home run totals were both the third bests in program history.

• Despite losing the majority of its top hitters, the Jackets will still return power and experience at the plate.

• Through 48 games, Tech's offense hasn't exactly been lacking.

• Through just 48 games and 11 series, Tech has hit .328 with 214 extra-base hits as multiple players stepped up for the offense.

• Tech also set the program record for most triples in a single game on Feb. 17 vs. Miami (Ohio) with four.

• Tech then tied the program record for most doubles in a single game on March 14 vs. No. 18 Auburn with eight -- hitting six in the third inning alone.

• Tech hit five home runs in a single inning on Sunday against Gardner-Webb (second inning). While there isn't a program record listed for most HR in a single inning, it is believed to be one of the most.

• Tech has tied multiple individual offensive records as well with both **Jackson Finley** (vs. Long Island) and **Stephen Reid** (vs. Pitt) hitting three home runs in a single game. Also against Pitt, **Jake DeLeo** tied the program record with three doubles in a game.

INFELDERS

• Georgia Tech started the year thinking some of their veterans would hold down the fort, but early season injuries have thrust freshman into starting positions.

• Up the middle was supposed to be **Jadyn Jackson** and **Kristian Campbell**.

• Recruited as a top-10 shortstop out of the state of Georgia, Jackson was a constant in the Tech dugout before getting his chance to start against Virginia last season.

• He started the final 28 games of the season and made his name on terrific plays at the shortstop position.

• Jackson's defensive prowess last year has earned him a spot in the starting lineup at shortstop, making a circus SportsCenter top-10 play at UVA to save the game.

• Jackson suffered a pregame injury on Feb. 25 and was out until March 11 when he returned in a blowout win, going 2-for-2 against Notre Dame.

• Jackson was inserted into the starting lineup against Louisville (March 17-19) and he hit .364 against the No. 2 Cardinals, getting four hits and four RBI for Tech.

• So far in 37 games played and 36 starts, Jackson has hit a gaudy .331 with 43 hits, eight doubles and 18 RBI, having by far the best season of his career.

• In back-to-back ACC series (against then-No. 2 Louisville and Clemson), Jackson went a combined 8-for-23 (.347).

• Jackson continued to be clutch against Auburn on April 11, getting three hits (two doubles), including the leadoff double in the bottom of the 10th.

• Jackson is coming off a weekend where he hit 8-for-12 with four RBI and two doubles.

• Rated as the No. 5 shortstop and No. 10 player overall in the state of Georgia out of high school, Campbell redshirted last season and will vie for a starting job in the middle infield.

• Having a terrific fall, Campbell was listed as the breakout player to watch by *D1Baseball*.

• Unfortunately, Campbell went 1-for-1 in his first collegiate game on Feb. 17 but suffered an injury and had to work his way back into the lineup.

• Campbell returned against Notre Dame (March 10-11), playing left field and the designated hitter spot. On the weekend, he went 1-for-8 as he starts to find his footing again.

• Campbell then returned to his Opening Day position of second base against Wofford (March 21).

• Against Georgia State, Campbell hit an RBI single that turned into a three-run inside-the-park home run in the top of the ninth with two outs to give Tech a one-run lead.

• He continued his lights-out week with an 8-for-10 showing against Boston College (March 31-April 2). He was retired just twice all weekend - once on a groundout, once on a strikeout - drawing four walks and getting plunked once as well.

• He hit his first career home run against Georgia Southern on April 4, part of a two-hit day.

• He raised his average another 10 points when he recorded six more hits against then-No. 13 North Carolina, including a combined five hits in the doubleheader finale.

• He added to his on-base percentage against Auburn on April 11 by going 1-for-2 officially with a career-high three walks.

• His average is now up to a gaudy .382 on the season, leading the team, as he has 52 hits, 13 doubles, a triple, and three home runs for 22 RBI, reaching base at a .497 clip.

OFFENSE

- Campbell's average currently ranks seventh in the ACC and 68th nationally.

- In Game 3 at Virginia Tech (April 16), Campbell extended his hitting streak to 20 games, becoming the 14th Yellow Jacket in program history and first since Kel Johnson in 2016 to accomplish the feat.

- His streak ended at 21-straight to finish tied for 11th all-time.

- Only Florida State's Jamie Ferrer has held a 20-game hitting streak in the ACC this season (non-active).

- With both starting middle infielders out due to injury at times this season, **Nicholas Romano** has been an important piece to step up, hitting .246 in 36 games and 31 starts.

- Romano was once again deadly at the plate on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, hitting the go-ahead three-run home run in the fifth.

- Romano has been generally terrific in his play at second base, making more than his fair share of highlight plays at the position defensively.

- Romano, however, committed two uncharacteristic consequential errors against No. 2 Louisville on Friday night -- one that would've started a double play in the seventh inning and one that would've been the first out in the eighth.

- Both errors led to two unearned runs in what would become a walkoff win for the Cardinals.

- Georgia Tech's middle infield has already proved to be stronger defensively than a year ago, already more than last year, turning 46 through 48 games to rank 7th in the country and tops in the ACC.

- Last season, Tech turned just 28 total double plays in 60 games.

- Filling in at shortstop occasionally has been two-way player **Demetri Diamant**, a highly rated prospect in his first season on The Flats.

- He was flawless in his first start on Feb. 25, but committed two errors on Feb. 26 as he gets his feet under him -- his only two of the season so far.

- Late in the Sunday Pitt game, Diamant pinch hit and wacked a two-RBI double to the fence to increase Tech's lead.

- As for the corners, Georgia Tech was going to look to steady veterans in **Drew Compton** at third and **John Giesler** at first.

- Rated as the No. 16 third baseman in the country by *D1Baseball*, Compton will look to bounce back from a "down" year.

- Compton hit .231 opening weekend with a double and two triples on Friday (tying his triple total from all of last year).

- Unfortunately, Compton suffered a hamstring injury on the double on Feb. 19 and was out a considerable amount of time.

- Missing Feb. 21's game against Georgia Southern, Compton had his team-long streak of 71-consecutive games started end.

- He pinch hit for the first action of the season since the injury on Sunday against UGA, going 0-for-2 but drawing a bases-loaded walk for an RBI.

- He then got his first start back at third on Tuesday against Lipscomb.

- He was back to full form against Notre Dame (March 10-11), amassing four hits, three RBI and two doubles in the series.

- He also made a highlight worthy diving snag on Friday night against Notre Dame with bases loaded and two outs to keep the game close.

- He followed that up with a three-hit performance in the 12-inning battle with No. 18 Auburn on Tuesday, driving in a game-high four runs.

- Compton continued to work back, finally hitting his first home run of the season Saturday, March 25 against Clemson (his birthday). He went 2-for-4 with five RBI, also mashing a triple against the Tigers.

- He continued to help his average in the 14-inning game against Georgia State on Tuesday, finishing 4-for-6 with a double and a walk.

- Compton was hugely important to Tech's Friday night win over then-No. 13 Boston College, driving in four runs on two hits in the 5-4 win.

- He then walloped what would've been a double before he suffered another hamstring injury on Saturday, April 1's game at BC. He is once again day-to-day.

- Although not 100 percent, Compton returned to the starting lineup on Sunday, May 23 at then-No. 17 Miami in the first of the doubleheader.

- He continued to climb back when he hit a grand slam on Tuesday against Mercer to break the 0-0 stalemate.

- Compton then hit 6-for-12 against Gardner-Webb to raise his average to .320, driving in five RBI on two doubles and two home runs.

- He looked back to form against Pitt, making a diving snag at third and knocking in three RBI on Friday and going 2-for-3 on Sunday.

- Compton started all 60 games at third base last year and hit .275 for 14 home runs and 58 RBI -- a down year for him.

- Compton is a career .293 hitter with 34 home runs and 141 RBI.

- Compton's ability at the plate was evident from the very get-go when he became just the third Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his very first collegiate plate appearance.

- Teammate **Nicholas Romano** joined the list in 2022, when he pinch hit and launched a homer himself.

- Compton really showed his potential in the 2021 NCAA Tournament, mashing four home runs in the Nashville Regional.

- Compton was the first Yellow Jacket to have four or more home runs in a NCAA Tournament since Matt Wieters had five in 2006 (three in Regionals, one in Super, one in the College World Series).

- In Compton's stead has been true freshman **Nico Senese**, who went 2-for-3 on Feb. 26 vs. Tennessee Tech in his first start and helped convert a double play as well.

- In 11 starts, Senese is now hitting just under that at .295 with two doubles and three RBI, including a clutch insurance run against Notre Dame on Friday night.

- He made his first start since March 14 at Auburn on April 7 vs. then-No. 13 North Carolina and went 2-for-4 with an RBI for Tech.

- **Brant Baughcum** has also logged two starts at third.

- Giesler has been a mainstay leader in the dugout for Tech and will look to get his first consistent action in the starting lineup this season at first.

- Giesler led Tech's offense Opening Weekend, hitting .556 (5-for-9) with two doubles, a triple and five RBI to slug 1.000 and reach base at a .714 clip with only one strikeout.

- Giesler has also started four games at third with the injury to Compton.

- After being the odd man out with the return of Compton and full-time addition of Jackson Finley at first, Giesler had been limited to sporadic appearances.

- He got his first start since March 5 on April 2 at then-No. 13 Boston College, going 3-for-4 with two home runs and a walk.



OFFENSE

• Since April 2, Giesler has made five starts with a hit in all by one game, tallying 21 hits and 15 RBI in the stretch.

• In the last 10 games (where Tech is 7-3), Giesler has hit .375 for 15 hits, five doubles, a triple and four home runs, recording 15 RBI.

• He was a bright spot for Tech against then-No. 17 Miami on April 21-23, finishing the series with five hits, two doubles and two home runs for six RBI.

• In 38 games played total, he's hitting .315 with 39 hits, 12 doubles, a triple and six home runs.

• In 22 games last season, Giesler took advantage, hitting .323 for 10 hits, one double and a home run for eight RBI. He reached base at a .450 clip.

• First base is a loaded position for Georgia Tech, also featuring **Jackson Finley**, **Angelo Dispigna** and **Carsten Sabathia** on the depth chart.

• Known as #CatcherU, Georgia Tech once again has two dependable catchers behind the dish for the 2023 campaign.

• Veteran backstop **Jack Rubenstein** enters his sixth year of college baseball after four years at Emory and in his second year at Georgia Tech in graduate school.

• Rubenstein was named to the Buster Posey National Catcher of the Year watch list on April 3.

• Rubenstein ignited Tech in the back-and-forth Friday night affair against Notre Dame, launching a solo home run in the seventh inning to start a four-run inning for the Jackets.

• After a cold slump, Rubenstein has hit better in his last six games, hitting .292 with three extra-base knocks.

• On the season, Rubenstein is hitting .289 for 43 hits, eight doubles, three triples and five home runs for 25 RBI.

• Rubenstein will often get spelled by true freshman **Tyler Minnick**, a mid-year enrollee from Mount Paran Christian in Marietta.

• A blue-chip recruit, Minnick was rated as a top-35 catcher nationally and the No. 2 catcher in the state of Georgia for the 2023 class before reclassifying.

• Minnick has hit .265 in just 22 games, but has shown exceptional promise, considering he should still be in high school.

• Thus far at Tech, his young career includes a clutch three-run homer at Georgia Southern on Feb. 21 to bring the Jackets within one run as well as a home run at Virginia Tech on April 16.

OUTFIELDERS

• Georgia Tech will debut a new-look outfield when compared to last year's opening day lineup.

• The lone returner will be veteran **Jake DeLeo**, who shifts over and will play centerfield.

• DeLeo blasted into 2023 by earning National Player of the Week honors after just the first weekend of play.

• In Opening Weekend, DeLeo hit .417 with five hits, a

double and a team-best three home runs (two on Sunday) against Miami (Ohio).

• He accounted for 12 of Tech's 36 runs as he drove in six and crossed the plate six times himself.

• DeLeo was again lauded by the conference when he earned ACC Player of the Week for his performance against Clemson.

• DeLeo hit .500 for the weekend against the Tigers with six hits, three doubles and two home runs for three RBI. He slugged 1.250 with a .600 on-base percentage, striking out just once compared to three walks.

• Adding in Wofford (March 21) that week, DeLeo hit .444 with three home runs and seven total extra-base hits.

• Overall through 48 games, he's been one of the best hitters in the nation, hitting .378 with a whopping 79 hits – 20 doubles and 13 home runs – for 45 RBI. He's slugging .670 with a red-hot .446 on-base percentage.

• DeLeo is atop the ACC charts in plenty of categories, while also ranking 12th in doubles nationally:

• He's only failed to register a hit in six games this season - Game 2 of the Saturday doubleheader against Notre Dame on March 11, the series finale against Clemson (March 26), Game 1 against then-No. 13 Boston College (March 31), April 18 vs. Georgia State, April 21 at No. 17 Miami and April 28 vs. Gardner-Webb).

• He had five hits in the 12-inning battle with then-No. 18 Auburn (March 14), including two doubles.

• DeLeo continued to dominate Auburn in the second meeting on April 11 where he walloped a two-run homer in the second inning to give Tech a 4-1 lead.

• DeLeo was red-hot against Pitt in a pivotal series, recording six hits, including a program-record-tying three doubles in the Sunday rubber match.

• DeLeo suffered an oblique injury last year and was limited to just 30 games.

• Despite limitation, DeLeo still hit .386 for 22 hits, two home runs and 19 RBI, scoring 19 times as well.

• In 2021, DeLeo became the first Yellow Jacket since Wade Bailey in 2017 to record five hits when he went a perfect 5-for-5 in the rubber match at then-No. 12 Virginia Tech.

• Starting the final 51 games of the season in right field was slugger **Stephen Reid**.

• Through 48 games, Reid has continued his power hitting, currently at .371 with 72 hits, 12 doubles, two triples and 13 home runs.

- After a icy 1-for-20 stretch from March 3-10, Reid finally started to get the bat rolling on March 11 in the doubleheader against Notre Dame, going 5-for-8 with a double, homer and four RBI to close the series.
- He followed that up with four hits and two doubles in the 12-inning battle against then-No. 18 Auburn and a combined 4-for-10 against then-No. 2 Louisville with a home run.
- Reid continued to raise his batting average after a 3-for-5 outing against Wofford (March 21).
- Reid was responsible for the game-tying run in the Friday night comeback over Clemson, driving a two-out single to the outfield before **Parker Brosius** pinch ran. **Angelo Dispigna** then hit a double on the next at-bat to tie the game.
- In his last 10 games, Reid has hit .500 with an on-base percentage of .547 and 1.000 slugging, recording 24 hits, four doubles, a triple and six home runs.
- Reid earned National Player of the Week and ACC Player of the Week honors after hitting .643 with nine hits and four home runs for 10 RBI against Pitt.
- He became the second Yellow Jacket this season to tie the program record with three home runs belted on Sunday vs. Pitt.
- Reid rocketed out to the conference's hitting leader in ACC games, mashing .418. In 24 ACC games, Reid has 38 hits, eight doubles, a triple and seven home runs for 25 RBI with an .514 on-base percentage.
- Reid was red-hot last year, hitting .333 for 72 hits, eight doubles and 16 home runs for 63 RBI.
- Reid's power at the plate was on full display against Kennesaw State last season, hitting two home runs, one a grand slam, for six RBI.
- Reid also smashed two homers out against Mercer last year, including the go-ahead two-run bomb in the fourth.
- Entering the outfield rotation will be Mercer transfer **Angelo Dispigna**.
- In his first weekend of action for Georgia Tech, Dispigna hit .333 with three hits and two doubles.
- Dispigna had his second-straight multi-hit game at Georgia Southern on Feb. 21, going 2-for-5.
- He earned National Player of the Week honors (Feb. 27) for his performance against Tennessee Tech, hitting one home run a game, including a mammoth grand slam on Friday to push the lead from three to seven.
- He hit the go-ahead two-RBI single against Georgia on March 5 to give Tech an important 4-1 win.
- Dispigna continued to be clutch on Friday night against Clemson when he both drove in the tying run with two outs in the ninth and walked off the Tigers with an RBI double in the 11th.
- He hit his seventh home run of the season on Tuesday against Georgia Southern to put Tech out in front for good.

- After going 0-fer in Game 1 against then-No. 13 North Carolina, he combined for five hits, a double and a homer for two RBI in the doubleheader finale.
- He remained hot against Auburn on April 11, blasting two-run home run in the first inning to give Tech a 2-1 lead.

- **Nicholas Romano**, as well as two-way athletes **Jackson Finley** and freshman **Riley Stanford** are all capable of tremendous power.
- Also a possible option is freshman **Carsten Sabathia**.
- A first-baseman by trade, Sabathia stands as an intimidating presence in the box at 6-4, 240 pounds with a lot of power in his young bat.
- Sabathia recorded his first collegiate hit and home run on Saturday against Georgia, driving in three runs.
- He is the son of MLB great C.C. Sabathia.
- Finley has played the designated hitter and first baseman role to work his way into the order and has been sensational.
- In 45 games and 44 starts, Finley has been a machine at the plate.
- He's currently hitting .317 with 53 hits, 15 doubles and a team-high 17 home runs for 59 RBI. He's No. 6 in the ACC slugging .713 with a .396 on-base percentage, also drawing 19 walks.

- He had his second multi-homer game on Tuesday against Georgia Southern, launching two for five RBI as part of a 4-for-4 day.
- His second home run of the day went 461 feet with an exit velocity of 116 mph, according to TrackMan.
- Finley exited the series finale against then-No. 13 North Carolina while pitching with a bicep strain. He was day-to-day.
- Despite the injury and with three days rest, Finley felt good enough to hit on Tuesday, April 11 against Auburn and came through as the hero, launching the walkoff grand slam with two outs in the bottom of the 10th.
- He now has two grand slams on the season.
- Finley becomes the fourth Yellow Jacket on the team with a career walkoff hit, joining **Jadyn Jackson** (2020), **Drew Compton** (2022) and **Angelo Dispigna** (vs. Clemson, 2023).

PITCHING

• Georgia Tech has stockpiled depth in its pitching staff thanks to two-straight classes flush with power arms.

• Despite being younger, Tech returns **Josiah Siegel**, **Dalton Smith**, **Cody Carwile**, **Camron Hill**, **Logan McGuire**, **Aeden Finateri**, **Joseph Mannelly**, and **Dawson Brown**.

• It also regains the full services of **Ben King** and **Jackson Finley**.

• Early on, Georgia Tech has shown flashes of improvement on the mound.

• Despite some inflated ERA's due to blowout wins and stretching arms out, Tech currently sports a 6.63 ERA as a staff.

• Starters thus far have been a little bit up and down and have an 7.96 ERA.

• Where the Jackets have been more dominant is in their bullpen, which holds a 5.83 ERA.

• The biggest story has been injuries to key pitchers for Georgia Tech, including all three of the weekend rotation.

• In days between appearances, Tech pitchers have missed a combined 124 days from games and practices due to nagging injuries.

STARTERS

• Georgia Tech's starting lineup for the first two weeks has been **Dawson Brown** on Friday, **Logan McGuire** on Saturday and **Jackson Finley** on Sunday.

• In a blustering night of 40 degree temps and 20 mph winds, Brown struggled in his first start, going just 2.2 innings and allowing five runs, walking an uncharacteristic five batters while striking out six.

• And while it isn't expected to be a long start by design, potentially only one inning of work, it is exciting progress for the stud arm that has been sorely missed at times from the rotation.

• Finley continued the dominance on Sunday and went another 5.0 innings, allowing just one run on just two hits, walking none and striking out three.

• Brown was one of Tech's main closer last season, finishing with a team-high five saves, despite a 8.77 ERA.

• Brown turned in his best performance as a Yellow Jacket on Feb. 24 against Tennessee Tech, striking out 12 in 6.0 innings of work. His three runs allowed came on home runs.

• Brown had to exit what was shaping up to be his best start against Clemson after 4.0 innings of two-hit scoreless work due to injury.

• Brown then missed the series against Boston College due to precaution around the injury before returning against then-No. 13 North Carolina.

• Brown exited the UNC game after giving up six runs on four hits in 3.2 innings as he continues to deal with the injury.

• In 2021, Brown featured a 2-0 record and 4.40 ERA, but has yet to be a full-time starter for the Jackets.

• Dawson is son of Georgia Tech Hall of Famer and six-time all-star and two-time ERA title winner Kevin Brown. Kevin helped the Marlins to the 1995 World Series before signing the first \$100 million contract with the LA Dodgers in 1998.

• McGuire responded and was outstanding, going 5.0 innings on Saturday and punching out six and walking none, while allowing just two runs on four hits (both solo homers).

• McGuire exited Saturday's game against Tennessee Tech (Feb. 25) after just 1.1 innings due to injury.

• He made a spot start on Tuesday against Georgia Southern and went 1.0 inning (predetermined) and allowed a solo home run with two strikeouts.

• McGuire made his first start since Feb. 25 on April 4 against Georgia Southern, going a predetermined 1.0 innings (23 pitches) and surrendering a solo home run after back-to-back strikeouts.

• McGuire continued his trek back with a 2.0-inning start against Auburn on April 11, allowing just one run on four hits, striking out four and walking none in 37 pitches.

• Another strong freshman for Tech last year was McGuire, who snagged a 4-2 record despite a 7.02 ERA.

• McGuire is known for his pounding the zone, finishing with a 36:4 strikeout-to-walk ratio last season.

• McGuire made four starts last season, highest of any returning arms.

• Finley returns to the mound after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery two seasons ago.

• He wound up pitching four innings late but has not seen consistent action since his freshman season.

• Finley's start on Sunday against Miami (Ohio) was the second of his career at Georgia Tech.

• Finley had five unearned runs cross against him thanks to three infield errors in the first four frames against Tennessee Tech.

• Finley turned in a terrific and much-needed performance on Sunday against Georgia, going 4.0 innings and holding UGA to just two hits and one run, while striking out four.

• That allowed Tech to work to its strongest bullpen arms in **Ben King** and **Terry Busse** to get the win.

• Finley's brother, Leighton, is now a freshman right-handed pitcher at Georgia.

• Finley was once again tremendous in the series-clinching game against Notre Dame (March 11 - Game 1). He pitched 4.2 innings with just one run on three hits and two strikeouts.

• Finley had his first bad outing against No. 2 Louisville on March 19, allowing five runs on eight hits in 4.0 innings.

• Until Louisville, Finley hadn't allowed more than one earned run and more than six hits.

• Finley looked back to form for one of his best starts in ACC play when he went 5.0 innings against then-No. 13 Boston College, holding the Eagles to three runs on five hits in 5.0 innings in the eventual 3-1 pitching duel loss.

• Finley exited after 1.2 innings on April 7 against then-No. 13 North Carolina due to a bicep strain. He remains day-to-day, missing his usual Sunday start at Virginia Tech (April 16).

• He returned on the mound in the first game of the Sunday doubleheader at No. 17 Miami (Fla.), but struggled with his command, walking four and allowing three runs on three hits in 2.0 innings.

• Finley got his second win of the season when he went 5.0 innings against Gardner-Webb, his first five-inning start since April 1 vs. Boston College.

• Finley battled through his start against Pitt, getting touched for seven hits in 3.1 innings, but only allowing one earned run (two total) in the 87-pitch outing.

• Georgia Tech's other spot starters have been **Luke Schmolke**, **Josiah Siegel** and **Dalton Smith**.

• True freshman righty Schmolke turned in by far the best performance of his young career against No. 2 Louisville on Saturday, March 18 to propel Tech to a win.

• Schmolke went 4.2 innings and allowed just one earned run on eight hits, punching out five as well.

• Schmolke continued to be the hot arm when he went a career-long 5.0 innings in his second-straight ACC start on Saturday against Clemson. He worked around six hits and three runs to punch out five and get his third win of the season.

• Schmolke continues to be one of the top freshman arms, going 5.0 innings against then-No. 13 Boston College on Friday night (March 31), and allowing just one run on two hits.

• Schmolke finally faltered in the ACC against then-No. 13 North Carolina on April 7, unable to command the strike zone with six walks and five earned runs in 3.0 innings.

• Schmolke returned to form, however, giving Tech 5.0 innings on Friday night at No. 17 Miami (Fla.), surrendering just four runs (three earned) on seven hits with six strikeouts.

• Schmolke had unconventional terrific start on Friday against Pitt. It started disastrously with a leadoff home run and three-straight walks. But Schmolke buckled down and wound up getting out of the inning and going a full five innings with just two hits and the one run allowed to get the win.

PITCHING

- In his seven starts in the ACC, Schmolke has worked to an exceptional 3-3 record and 5.59 ERA as a true freshman.

- Schmolke was the No. 6-ranked right-hander out of North Carolina and a top-60 arm nationally, throwing mid-90s with a complete arsenal.

RELIEVERS

- Where the Jackets have been more dominant is in their bullpen, which holds a 5.83 ERA.

- Strong out of the bullpen early has been senior LHP **Joseph Mannelly**, RHP **Jackson Vaughan**, LHP **Cody Carwile**, RHP **Ben King**, LHP **Dalton Smith** and RHP **Terry Busse**.

- Mannelly currently has a 7.62 ERA, a 1-0 record and one save in 13.0 innings of work, having allowed 16 hits and 11 runs with 19 strikeouts.

- Mannelly has gotten tagged with one bad outing so far with two runs surrendered in 0.1 innings against No. 18 Auburn on March 14.

- Mannelly appeared twice over the weekend against No. 2 Louisville. In just 1.1 innings on Friday, March 17, he turned in 1.1 innings of no-hit work with just one unearned run against him.

- On Sunday against the Cards, he worked just 0.1 innings, with two hits and two runs against him -- both runs scored after he was relieved by freshman **Logan Bogue** in his first career outing.

- Mannelly has had only one truly down outing, having five runs cross against him in 0.2 innings against Virginia Tech (April 15).

- Mannelly has been a leader of the pitching staff for years, but has dealt with nagging injuries that have kept him from contributing fully.

- Vaughan transfers in after two years at the University of Pacific.

- Through 21 appearances, he's worked to a 1-0 record and 5.71 ERA in 34.2 innings of work.

- He had his strongest outing in the White and Gold on Friday at Georgia when he went 3.2 innings of one-hit ball, striking out three to give Tech chances at the plate.

- He was once again strong at settling the waters in the extra-inning loss to No. 18 Auburn, pitching 1.1 innings of two-hit scoreless work to get Tech to its closer.

- He then kept the game close on Sunday vs. No. 2 Louisville, allowing just a solo home run in 2.0 innings with two strikeouts.

- Vaughan was once again dominant when he turned in 2.1 no-hit innings against Clemson (March 24).

- Coming in twice last week, he allowed just one earned run with four strikeouts in 2.0 innings of work against Georgia Southern (April 4) and one unearned run in 1.2 innings against then-No. 13 North Carolina (April 7).

- Prior to Tech, Vaughan sported a team-leading 3.27 ERA in 2022, striking out 32 in 33 innings.

- Vaughan's story is a miracle, overcoming Stage 4 liver cancer as a child and surviving two liver transplants.

- Vaughan is the only NCAA student-athlete to ever play after having a liver transplant.

- King returns from Tommy John Surgery and has been sensational in relief, currently sporting a terrific 3.03 ERA with a 5-0 record in 38.2 innings of work and 21 appearances.

- He's currently holding hitters to a .193 batting average with a blistering 48:10 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

- All of his runs allowed have come in five appearances (four in the third inning of his first career start at then-No. 18 Auburn on March 14; two in relief against Clemson on March 24; two in relief at then-No. 13 Boston College on March 31; one in relief vs. Auburn on April 11; three in relief against Miami on April 23).

- King got the win against Georgia on Sunday, March 5, throwing 3.0 innings of two-hit, no-walk baseball with three strikeouts.

- King appeared in all three games last weekend against No. 2 Louisville, pitching two outs on Friday night, one out Saturday and one out Sunday without a run across.

- King was again terrific in the series finale against then-No. 13 North Carolina, pitching 2.1 no-hit innings in relief with two strikeouts to get his third win of the season.

- King got his second start of the season against Georgia State on April 18, going 2.0 innings of three strikeout ball.

- King got his fourth victory of the season when pitched 2.2 innings against Gardner-Webb on April 28.

- King made two appearances against Pitt (May 5, May 7), going 4.2 combined innings with seven strikeouts, earning the win on Sunday with 2.2 innings of work.

- King is a decorated student-athlete who also serves as President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Board and has been the ACC's representative at NCAA meetings two-straight years.

- Busse has been sensational transferring in from John A. Logan Junior College, where he made 22 appearances out of the bullpen to help them win a regional.

- Busse has emerged as one of the toughest closers in the nation through 17 appearances, already ranking 35th in the nation and fourth in the ACC with seven saves thus far.

- He currently sports a 2.16 ERA in relief with a more than a near 3:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Including his two starts, his overall ERA is 4.67.

- His first appearance as a Yellow Jacket came to close out the ninth on Opening Day against Miami (Ohio) where he allowed just one hit and punched out three for the save.

- He made his second appearance of the year on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern when he pitched two innings to close, allowing two hits and no runs with two strikeouts for the save.

- He earned his third save in as many appearances with a strong six-out save on Saturday against Tennessee Tech, not allowing a single hit and striking out three in 22 pitches.

- He turned in two key innings to get to Busse on Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern, allowing two hits with three K's.

- He was as dominant as ever on March 1 against Kennesaw State, coming in to close a one-run game in the ninth. He needed just 14 pitches to strikeout all three batters he faced to secure Tech's victory.

- He got his fifth save of the season on Sunday against Georgia at Coolray Field when he pitched six outs, five of which were strikeouts, to hold the 4-1 win for Tech.

- Busse then turned in his fourth six-out save for his sixth of the season against Notre Dame on Friday night (March 10), fanning four.

- He allowed his first hit on March 14 at No. 18 Auburn since Feb. 21 at Georgia Southern.

- Against then-No. 18 Auburn, Busse pitched two innings scoreless with three strikeouts in a tie game, but Tech was unable to put up a run to give him the win.

- His first runs crossed against him on March 17 against No. 2 Louisville, pitching 1.2 innings of two-hit, two unearned runs (one earned), with three strikeouts.

- He also walked an uncharacteristic four batters in temperatures south of 40 degrees that night.

- He then looked back to form when he pitched 2.0 no-hit innings in extras on Friday night against Clemson, striking out four and earning his first win of the season.

- He earned his seventh save with 1.0 innings of one-hit work against then-No. 13 Boston College on Friday, March 31.

- Despite not entering in a save situation (8-4 lead), Busse was nonetheless important with six outs of no-hit baseball to close out the win against then-No. 13 UNC on April 7.

- Busse struggled on April 11 against Auburn, having only his second blown save of his career, allowing three runs on two hits in 1.2 innings. He surrendered just his second home run of the season.

- Looking for answers against Virginia Tech without its three weekend starters, Tech had Busse make his first Division I start on April 16.

- Busse went 3.0 innings and allowed four runs on six hits with three strikeouts.

- Busse again started on Sunday, April 23 at No. 17 Miami, allowing four runs on four hits in 3.1 innings.

- Busse returned to the bullpen on May 7 vs. Pitt and turned in 2.0 innings of one-run work in the 15-3 blowout.

- In 2022 with John A. Logan, Busse earned two saves in 27.1 innings, striking out 44 batters to the tune of an ERA of 3.29.

- Also proving himself as the Jackets' top fireman, **Aeden Finateri** has appeared 20 times and worked to 49.1 innings in relief while sporting a 3.83 ERA.

PITCHING

- He's allowed 51 hits, 21 earned runs and struck out 43 hitters compared to 13 walks (five of which came in one outing).
- Needing to come in the first inning of Feb. 21's game at Georgia Southern, Finateri worked 3.0 innings to settle the game, allowing just one unearned run.
- He was once again needed after McGuire's injury, going a season-long 4.2 innings, allowing just three hits, one run and no walks while striking out four.
- His last appearance came on March 1 where he pitched the fourth inning of a one-run game against Kennesaw State.
- He allowed two hits, but none scored, as he struck out two before forcing a groundout.
- His two bad appearances came against Georgia on Saturday (March 4) when he entered in the third, allowing four runs on five hits in 1.2 innings, and in the second of the doubleheader against Notre Dame (March 11) when he gave up two on three hits in 1.1.
- He rebounded greatly on April 1 against then-No. 13 Boston College when he pitched 3.0 innings of three-hit, scoreless baseball to close the Saturday 3-1 loss, keeping the game in reach for the Jackets.
- He was once again dominant in relief at No. 17 Miami on Friday night, retiring all nine batters he faced with two strikeouts to keep the deficit 4-2 for the Jackets.
- He earned his second career save on April 25 vs. Mercer, pitching 3.0 innings of one-run ball to close the 6-3 win.
- He earned his third career save five days later with 3.1 innings of three-hit, one-run ball against Gardner-Webb.
- He made his first start since his freshman season on May 6 vs. Pitt, going 5.0 innings of five-hit, one-run work with six strikeouts and no walks. The run against him scored on a should've-been double play to end the inning with the runner on second scoring on the non-error misplay.
- Tech's top returning ERA leader is Siegel, who finished with a 3.97 ERA, 2-0 record and .266 opponents batting average.
- Siegel turned in a Herculean effort in last year's Knoxville Regional, pitching career long 6.1 innings and 98 pitches in relief and allowing just three hits and one run against Campbell, saving the bullpen for the showdown against No. 1 Tennessee.
- Siegel has struggled thus far in 2023, through 17.2 innings and 10 appearances, currently at a 12.23 ERA.
- Siegel had his best appearance of the season against then-No. 13 North Carolina (April 7) when he turned in a season-long 4.0 innings of relief in the first game of the doubleheader, striking out three and allowing just two runs on four hits to save the bullpen for the finale.
- He was strong yet again on April 11 vs. Auburn when he pitched a 1-2-3 top of the 10th to allow Tech to walk off the Tigers in the bottom half.
- Smith finished last season with a 2-0 record and 4.35 ERA despite just eight appearances due to injury and will look to be a bigger presence in the bullpen in 2023.
- Smith has also struggled as one of the veterans this season, having his ERA balloon to as high as 13.20 this season.
- Smith looked as good as he has all season on Thursday night against then-No. 13 North Carolina, pitching 3.0 innings in relief and surrendering just one run on three hits with a career-high seven strikeouts.
- Smith has turned in scoreless outings in three of his last four, covering 6.2 innings combined (Miami, Gardner-Webb, Pitt).
- Hill finished last season with a 6.57 ERA in 18 appearances and one start last season, earning one save in his freshman campaign.
- Was named a New England League All-Star after being the Martha's Vineyard Sharks' closer, sporting a 0.52 ERA with a 16.41 strikeouts per 9 inning.
- Hill pitched the eighth against Miami (Ohio) on Feb. 18 and suffered an oblique injury that caused him to miss significant time.
- Hill made his triumphant return to the mound on Saturday, March 18 against No. 2 Louisville, slamming the door shut with a no-hit ninth.
- He then made his second career start on March 21 against Wofford, getting roughed up a bit for four runs in 2.0 innings on six hits.
- In another start on March 28 at Georgia State, Hill once again struggled, giving up two runs in 1.1 innings before being relieved.
- Hill redeemed himself against Georgia State on April 18 when he got his first career winning decision, punching out three in 2.0 innings in relief.
- Schmolke was the No. 6-ranked right-hander out of North Carolina and a top-60 arm nationally, throwing mid-90s with a complete arsenal.
- Schmolke had by far his most impressive performance on Saturday in Game 1 of the doubleheader against Notre Dame (March 11).
- He worked to his second victory, going a career-long 4.1 innings and allowed just one run on three hits, fanning five and walking just two before being turned loose on the weekend starting rotation.
- Samol joins Tech as the top-ranked lefty from the state of Ohio and a top-35 arm nationally, standing a whopping 6-7 on the mound.
- Samol has looked increasingly better in his last two appearances: Clemson (March 2) and Georgia State (March 28).
- He worked a clean two innings against the Tigers before working a two-hit 1.2 innings in extra-innings against the Panthers.
- Another terrific frosh arm has been true freshman two-way player **Demetri Diamant**.
- Diamant has made just seven appearances, working sporadic appearances in the field and at the plate prior to his debut on the mound on March 11 in the second game of the doubleheader against Notre Dame.
- After giving up two runs on two hits in 1.0 innings in his collegiate debut, Diamant proceeded to pitch four-straight scoreless appearances, including an outstanding 2.1 innings in extra inning at Georgia State (March 28) - he entered in the 10th with runners on first and second and two outs to get a swinging strike out.
- He's been scored against two of his last three outings, his last being three runs on four hits in no outs against Georgia State on April 18.
- Diamant was the No. 4 overall recruit out of the state of Nevada, while also being the No. 9 third baseman in the county, according to *Perfect Game*.
- He helped lead Bishop Gorman High School to the 2021 Southern League Championship and 2022 Mountain League Championship.

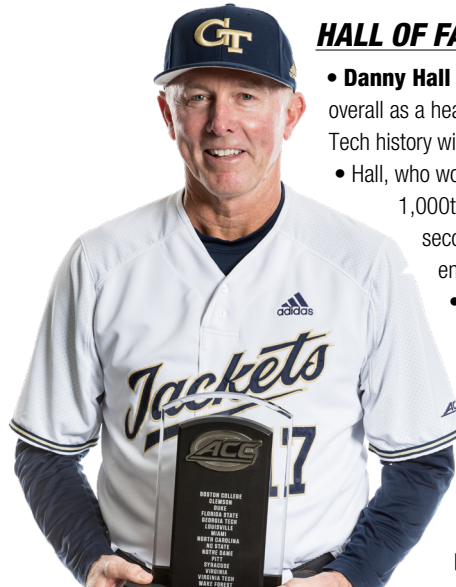

- **Danny Hall** is in his 30th season at Georgia Tech and his 34th overall as a head coach in 2022. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,168 wins.
- Hall, who won his 1,300th career game on April 25, 2021 and his 1,000th win at Georgia Tech on March 20, 2018, stands second among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2022 season.
- In 2019, Hall earned his fourth ACC Coach of the Year honor.
- In his career – both as an assistant and head coach – Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.
- Hall has led Tech to the NCAA Tournament on 22 occasions and guided the Jackets to the NCAA College World Series in 1994, 2002 and 2006 -- the program's only three berths.
