TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech returns to Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field for the first time in 2023 when it hosts South Carolina State on Saturday afternoon.
- The Yellow Jackets will open their 111th season at their venerable home stadium — the oldest on-campus football venue in NCAA Division I FBS.
- Georgia Tech is coming off a season-opening 39-34 loss to Louisville in last Friday's Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. Behind four second-quarter touchdowns, the Yellow Jackets raced out to a 28-13 halftime lead, but Louisville stormed back in the second half for the come-from-behind win.
- One of many bright spots for the Yellow Jackets in the season-opening defeat was the play of QB **Haynes King**. In his first game in the White and Gold after transferring to Georgia Tech from Texas A&M, King completed 19-of-32 passes for 313 yards and three touchdowns. His 313 passing yards are tied for 23rd in Georgia Tech single-game history and are the most ever by a Jackets' QB in his Tech debut (no other GT QB has ever thrown for 300 yards in his debut in the White and Gold).
- Georgia Tech's 34 points in last Friday's opener were its most in a game since a 35-17 win over Western Carolina on Sept. 10 of last season and its most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since a 48-40 loss at Virginia on Oct. 23, 2021. The Yellow Jackets' 488 yards of offense were their most in any game since they had 570 in the 2021 defeat at Virginia.
- With a win on Saturday, Georgia Tech would become the 21st program in FBS history with 750 all-time victories.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

1

In last Friday's season opener, Georgia Tech held Louisville to just 1-of-11 on third-down conversion attempts, which was the first time since 2017 that a Georgia Tech opponent converted just one third down (Pitt – 1-of-13 in a 35-17 GT win).

2

Saturday's game is the second all-time between Georgia Tech and South Carolina State. In their only previous meeting, the Yellow Jackets defeated the Bulldogs, 41-10, on Sept. 4, 2010 at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

All five of Georgia Tech's touchdowns in last Friday's season opener were scored by players that were playing in their first game as Yellow Jackets — RB **Trey Cooley** (2 - transfer from Louisville), WR **Chase Lane** (transfer from Texas A&M), TE **Brett Seither** (transfer from Georgia) and WR **Eric Singleton Jr.** (true freshman).

Head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

Georgia Tech scored 28 points in the second quarter of last Friday's season opener versus Louisville. The 28 second-quarter points were Tech's most in any quarter since 2015, its most in a quarter against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since 2014 and tied for the fifth-most in any quarter in program history.

With 313 passing yards in last Friday's season opener, r-So. QB **Haynes King** became the first player in Georgia Tech history to throw for 300 yards or more in his debut as a Yellow Jacket.

750

Georgia Tech's next win will be the 750th in program history. Georgia Tech would become the 21st program in FBS history with 750 all-time victories, and the fourth from the ACC (joining Clemson, Virginia Tech and Pitt).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- even its record at 1-1 on the season;
- give it at least one win in its first two games for the 34th-consecutive season (the Yellow Jackets have not started 0-2 since 1989);
- be the 750th win in Georgia Tech history;
- up it to 2-0 all-time versus South Carolina State;
- snap a nine-game losing streak against opponents from the state of South Carolina.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was officially named the 21st head coach in Tech football history by Institute President Dr. Ángel Cabrera and director of athletics J Batt on Nov. 29, 2022.

Key takes the reins of the program after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named Georgia Tech's interim head coach on Sept. 26 of last season, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his four seasons at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 6 Baylor. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 45, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

• Since NCAA Division I split into two football-playing divisions in 1978, Georgia Tech is 36-2-1 all-time against NCAA Division I FCS (formerly known as Division I-AA) opponents. Ironically, all three blemishes have come against opponents from the state of South Carolina — a 17-14 loss to Furman on Sept. 17, 1983, a 17-17 tie versus Furman on Sept. 13, 1986 and a 27-24 overtime loss to The Citadel on Sept. 14, 2019.

• With a win versus S.C. State on Saturday, Georgia Tech would snap a 10-game overall losing streak against opponents from the state of South Carolina. The Yellow Jackets' last win against a team from its neighbor to the east came on Nov. 15, 2014, when it beat Clemson, 28-6.

• Head coach **Brent Key** became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1 of last season. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher — L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee — 1972; Pepper Rodgers — L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame — 1974; Bill Curry — L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama — 1980; Mac McWhorter — W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford — 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins — L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson — 2019).

• Georgia Tech went 2-3 against ranked opponents in 2022, which marked the first time that the Yellow Jackets beat multiple nationally ranked teams in a season since 2014, when they had three wins over ranked foes.

OFFENSE

• Georgia Tech's offense churned out its best overall performance in nearly two years in last Friday's season opener versus Louisville.

• Georgia Tech's 488 yards of offense were their most in a game since they had 570 in a 48-40 loss at Virginia on Oct. 23, 2021 (a span of 18 games).

• Tech's 34 points against Louisville were its most since a 35-17 win over Western Carolina on Sept. 10 of last season and its most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since the 48-40 defeat at UVA in 2021.

• The Yellow Jackets scored 28 of their 34 points against Louisville during an 11:08 span of the second quarter.

- The Jackets' 28 second-quarter points against Louisville were:
 - the most Georgia Tech has scored in any quarter since it scored a school-record 34 in the first quarter of its 69-6 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 2, 2015;
 - the most they have scored in any quarter against an FBS opponent since they scored 28 in the first quarter of a 56-28 win over Pitt on Oct. 25, 2014.
 - tied for the fifth-most in a single quarter in program history;
 - tied for the third-most in a single quarter against an FBS opponent in program history.

- Tech's four touchdowns in the second quarter against Louisville:
 - are tied for the second-most in a single quarter in program history (5 vs. Alcorn State - 2015);
 - are tied for the most in a single quarter against an FBS opponent;
 - marked only the 15th time in program history that the Jackets scored as many as four touchdowns in a quarter.

• Georgia Tech's 313 passing yards against Louisville were more than it had in all but one game last season (314 at UCF - Sept. 24) and its 175 rushing yards were more than it had in 7-of-12 games last season.

• All five of Georgia Tech's touchdowns in last Friday's season opener were scored by players that were playing in their first game as Yellow Jackets — RB **Trey Cooley** (2 - transfer from Louisville), WR **Chase Lane** (transfer from Texas A&M), TE **Brett Seither** (transfer from Georgia) and WR **Eric Singleton Jr.** (true freshman).

• Georgia Tech's offense is guided by first-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulker**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia.

• Faulker boasts 18 years of experience on college football staffs, including 11 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18) and Southern Miss (2019).

• Twenty-five of the Yellow Jackets' 34 highest completion totals since the beginning of the 2002 season have come in their last 46 games, including last Friday's 19 completions against Louisville, which are tied for Tech's 14th-most in a game since '02.

• Despite the recent success throwing the ball, a dominant ground game remains imperative for the Jackets' success, as Tech has run for at least 200 yards in seven of its last 14 wins.

• However, the most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense has been its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has had an average of just 1.0 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.9 turnovers per game in losses.

QUARTERBACKS

• R-So. **Haynes King**, a graduate transfer from Texas A&M, made a record-breaking debut as a Yellow Jacket last Friday versus Louisville.

• King threw for 313 yards and three touchdowns on 19-of-32 passing in his Georgia Tech debut against Louisville.

- King's 313 passing yards against UL:
 - were the most ever in a Georgia Tech debut;
 - marked the first 300-yard passing performance by a player in his GT debut;
 - are tied for 23rd in Georgia Tech single-game history;
 - marked the 29th 300-yard passing game by an individual in Tech history.

• King's three touchdown passes against Louisville are tied for 17th in Georgia Tech single-game history and were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Jeff Sims threw three TDs at Virginia on Oct. 23, 2021.

• King also ran for a team-high 53 yards on 10 carries against Louisville, giving him 366 yards of total offense.

• Through one game, King ranks among the top 20 nationally in four different statistical categories.

• King threw for 1,579 yards and 10 touchdowns over 10 games (seven starts) at Texas A&M from 2020-22, including 1,220 yards and seven touchdowns in six games (five starts) last season.

• King's top performances as an Aggie included throwing for 253 yards and two touchdowns in a narrow 24-20 loss at No. 1 Alabama and for 279 yards and against Florida last season.

• Georgia Tech has the luxury of having three quarterbacks that have started and won college football games, as King is backed up by r-Fr. **Zach Pyron** and r-Jr. **Zach Gibson**.

• Pyron and Gibson were among the four quarterbacks that saw playing time for the Yellow Jackets during an injury-ravaged 2022 campaign in Tech's QB room.

• Pyron amassed an impressive 692 yards of total offense (565 passing, 127 rushing) and five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in just three games as a true freshman last season. He completed 49-of-82 passes, good for a team-best .598 completion percentage.

• In his collegiate debut at Florida State (Oct. 29), Pyron came off the bench to complete 18-of-28 passes for 198 yards without an interception and account for two touchdowns (one passing, one rushing).

• Pyron made his first-career start in his second-career game at Virginia Tech (Nov. 5) and accounted for 319 yards of offense (253 passing, 66 rushing) and two fourth-quarter touchdowns (one passing, one rushing) to lead the Yellow Jackets back from a 27-16 fourth-quarter deficit to a 28-27 win.

• Trailing 27-16 with less than 10 minutes to go at VT, Pyron engineered two-consecutive touchdown drives of 90 and 73 yards to give Georgia Tech a 28-27 lead. He capped the fourth-quarter scoring drives with a 56-yard touchdown pass with 9:02 to go and what proved to be the game-winning 9-yard touchdown run with 3:30 left on the clock.

• Pyron led Georgia Tech's offense to a season-high 463 yards in the win at VT.

• In recognition of his performance at Virginia Tech, Pyron was named the ACC co-Rookie of the Week, becoming the first Yellow Jacket since 2020 to earn the distinction.

• In his first three full halves of action last season, Pyron led Tech to three of its four-highest single-half yardage totals of the year against FBS competition — 240 in second half vs. Florida State (Oct. 29), 234 in first half vs. Virginia Tech (last Saturday) and 229 in second half vs. VT (the only other half that cracked Tech's top four against FBS opponents last season was its 231-yard output in the second half at UCF on Sept. 24).

• Gibson appeared in six games and made three starts for the Yellow Jackets last season, throwing for 589 yards and a touchdown.

OFFENSE

• Gibson put together his best performance as a Yellow Jacket in Tech's 21-17 win at No. 13/11 North Carolina (Nov. 19), when he completed 13-of-18 passes for 174 yards.

• Gibson .722 completion percentage at UNC was a team high in 2022 and he became one of only six Georgia Tech QBs since 2000 to complete at least 72% of his passes in a game (min. 15 attempts).

RUNNING BACKS

• Four running backs saw action and combined for 178 yards from scrimmage on 33 touches (5.4 yards per touch) in last Friday's season opener versus Louisville.

• r-So. **Jamal Haynes**, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the offseason, showed his versatility as a runner and a pass-catcher in his RB debut, catching five passes for 56 yards and running 11 times for 51 yards against Louisville.

• Haynes' 107 yards from scrimmage were the second-most by a Yellow Jacket in a game since the beginning of last season, behind only Hassan Hall's 161 at Pitt (Oct. 1, 2022).

• Jr. **Trey Cooley**, a transfer from Louisville, led Tech's running backs with 52 rushing yards on just nine carries (5.8 avg.) and two touchdowns against his former team.

• With his two touchdown runs against Louisville, Cooley became the first Georgia Tech running back with multiple TD runs in a game against NCAA Division I FBS competition since current Detroit Lion Jahmyr Gibbs and current Yellow Jackets r-Sr. **Dontae Smith** ran for two apiece in a 56-33 win over Duke on Nov. 28, 2020.

• Smith ran for 18 yards and true Fr. **Evan Dickens** had 1 yard on his first-career carry to round out the efforts of Tech's four running backs in the opener versus Louisville.

• As part of a two-headed monster at running back for the Yellow Jackets last season with current Cleveland Brown Hassan Hall, Smith set career highs with 420 yards on 87 carries in 2022.

• Smith's 1,177 career rushing yards, rank 43rd in Georgia Tech history. Last season, he became the 51st player in program history to reach 1,000 yards in his career.

• With 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns on just 11 carries in Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Western Carolina last season (Sept. 10), Smith was one of only seven NCAA Division I FBS players (and one of four running backs) to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game in 2022.

• Against WCU last season, Smith became the first Georgia Tech running back to run for at least 100 yards and three touchdowns in a game since Synjyn Days ran for 171 yards and three scores in a 49-34 win over No. 8 Mississippi State in the 2014 Orange Bowl (three GT QBs have accomplished the feat during that span — Jeff Sims vs. North Carolina, 2022; Tobias Oliver at Virginia Tech, 2018; and TaQuon Marshall vs. Tennessee, 2017).

• Smith is averaging 5.5 yards per rush for his career (1,177 yards on 215 carries).

• Smith has scored 12 career touchdowns on just 215 carries (one TD every 17.9 carries).

WIDE RECEIVERS

• Georgia Tech entered the season five wide receivers on its roster that had seen action as Yellow Jackets. The young but talented corps had combined for 33 receptions and 368 receiving yards over 45 career games (two starts) coming into this season.

• The Yellow Jackets also welcomed four transfers at wideout who combined for 137 receptions for 1,846 over 96 career games and 32 starts prior to their arrival on The Flats this season.

TIGHT ENDS

• Georgia Tech's tight ends room is led by Sr. **Dylan Leonard**, who is in his fifth season with the Yellow Jackets.

• Leonard, a former walk-on, has caught 27 passes for 231 yards over 29 games and 21 starts as a Yellow Jacket.

• Leonard missed three games due to injury last season (the first two games of last season, plus a late-season game at Virginia Tech), but made eight starts and caught 11 passes for 90 yards (8.2 avg.) in his nine games of action.

• Leonard caught at least one pass in 5-of-7 games to close the 2022 season.

• Sr. **Luke Benson**, who played in 34-of-35 games over three seasons at Syracuse (2019-21), hauled in nine receptions for 85 yards (9.4 avg.) in his first season at Georgia Tech in 2022.

• Benson had a catch for 7 yards in last Friday's season opener versus Louisville.

• Like their wide receivers, the Yellow Jackets' tight ends room was also bolstered by the addition of a veteran transfer in r-Jr. **Brett Seither**, who saw action in 27 games at Georgia over the past four seasons (2019-22).

• In his Georgia Tech debut versus Louisville last Friday, Seither caught a 2-yard touchdown pass. His touchdown reception was the first by a Yellow Jackets tight end since Dylan Deveney caught an 18-yard touchdown pass against Pitt on Dec. 10, 2020.

OFFENSIVE LINE

• One of the most experienced overall positions on Georgia Tech's roster, the offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2023 roster have combined for 152 collegiate games played and 94 starts.

• The Cardinals' 1-for-11 showing on third down marked first time since Sept. 23, 2017 that a Georgia Tech opponent converted on just one third down (Pitt – 1-of-13 in a 35-17 GT win).

• Georgia Tech's defensive third-down conversion percentage of .091 ranked No. 3 nationally and leads the ACC through Week 1.

• The huge turnaround in takeaways last season can be largely attributed to the Yellow Jackets' 11 interceptions last season, which more than tripled its total from all of 2021 (3), when Tech ranked 125th out of 130 NCAA Division I FBS teams in INTs.

• In a stark contrast from last season, Georgia Tech did not have a tackle for loss in last Friday's opener versus Louisville. It marked the first time since a 31-28 loss to Pitt on Oct. 17, 2015 that the Yellow Jackets did not record a TFL.

• A freshman all-American last season, So. DB **Clayton Powell-Lee** picked up right where he left off in 2022 with five tackles, an interception and a pass breakup in last Friday's season opener versus Louisville.

• Powell-Lee's play in the secondary against Louisville was lauded by *Pro Football Focus*, which ranked him as the No. 16 overall defender in the ACC (No. 3 among safeties) and the No. 33 overall defender nationally in Week 1 (78.4 PFF grade).

• Powell-Lee's PFF pass coverage grade vs. Louisville (86.3) topped the ACC and ranked No. 13 nationally among safeties.

• Three different times last season, a Yellow Jacket recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass in the same game. Two of the players to accomplish the feat — Powell-Lee and DB **LaMiles Brooks** — return for Georgia Tech in 2023 (current Cleveland Browns practice squad LB Charlie Thomas also accomplished the feat for the Jackets in 2022).

• Prior to last season, no Yellow Jacket had recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass in the same game since 2017, and the feat had only been accomplished by a Georgia Tech player three times since 2000.

DEFENSE

- Thomas, Brooks and Powell-Lee were among 40 NCAA Division I FBS players with a fumble recovery and an interception in the same game last season. Georgia Tech was the only school with three players on the list and was one of only five that had multiple players accomplish the feat (joining Arkansas, Memphis, South Alabama and Syracuse).

- Powell-Lee recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass in the same game when he did both in the fourth quarter of Georgia Tech's 28-27 come-from-behind win at Virginia Tech (Nov. 5).

- After missing practice for much of the week and not starting in the game due to illness, Powell-Lee's interception on Georgia Tech's 27 yard line with 6:54 to go in the game prevented Virginia Tech from expanding its lead to two scores and set up the Yellow Jackets' go-ahead touchdown drive.

- Two series later, Powell-Lee recovered a fumble forced by Thomas near midfield to thwart VT's final scoring opportunity and seal the Jackets' comeback from an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit.

- Powell-Lee's 14 tackles at Florida State last season (Oct. 29) were the most by an ACC freshman and tied for the most by an ACC defensive back (prev.: Duke's Darius Joiner vs. Northwestern — Sept. 10) in 2022.

- Powell-Lee's 14 tackles at FSU were also the most in a game by a Georgia Tech defensive back since Isaiah Johnson had 14 stops at Pitt in 2014 and the most by a true freshman at Tech since at least 2000.

- Brooks recorded his first-career fumble recovery and returned the second interception of his career 37 yards for a touchdown against Virginia (Oct. 20), all in the first quarter.

- At the time, Brooks was the only NCAA Division I FBS player with as many as nine tackles, a fumble recovery and an interception return for a touchdown in a single game in 2022, although the feat was matched two days later by Duke's Brandon Johnson and again later in the season by Memphis' Xavier Cullens. Brooks remains one of only five ACC players and 15 FBS players since 2000 to accomplish the feat.

- According to *Pro Football Focus*, Brooks was the No. 18-ranked safety nationally and third-ranked safety in the ACC in 2022 with an overall defensive grade of 83.9 (*Grades from 80-89 are considered all-conference level in PFF's grading scale*).

- PFF particularly lauded Brooks for his pass coverage skill, which was graded at 88.5 in 2022, good for 14th nationally and second in the ACC among safeties.

- Another Georgia Tech defender that had a career game last season at Virginia Tech (Nov. 5) was DL **D'Quan Douse**, who recorded seven tackles – including 2.5 sacks – from his defensive tackle position and also turned in two of Georgia Tech's biggest individual plays of the game with a blocked PAT and a forced fumble that the Yellow Jackets' comeback from an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit in the 28-27 win at VT.

- Helping reload the linebacker position for Georgia Tech in 2023, Jr. **Trenilyas Tatum** had a game-high-tying eight tackles and broke up a pass last Friday against Louisville.

- *Pro Football Focus* rated Tatum as the fourth-best linebacker in the ACC and No. 14 overall defender in the conference with a 79.0 defensive grade in Week 1.

- DB r-Jr. **K.J. Wallace** recorded four tackles and two pass breakups in last Friday's season opener against Louisville.

- With Georgia Tech's front struggling to rush the passer against Louisville, Wallace helped pick up the slack, earning a 69.2 pass-rush grade from PFF, which ranked No. 3 in the ACC and No. 26 nationally among safeties.

- r-Sr. DB **Jaylon King** and Jr. DL **Kyle Kennard** both set career highs with their game-high-tying eight tackles in the season opener against Louisville.

- King's eight tackles matched his career high, which he originally set last season at UCF (Sept. 24).

- Kennard's eight stops shattered his previous career high of five, which he accomplished twice (last at Florida State - Oct. 29, 2022).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Georgia Tech finished tied for 10th nationally and ranked second in the ACC with four blocked kicks last season.
- Tech has blocked eight kicks in the last 42 games.
- Prior to blocking eight kicks in the past 42 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.
- Since the beginning of the 2013 season, Georgia Tech has blocked 27 kicks, which is tied for the fifth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

- On Oct. 20 of last season versus Virginia, Georgia Tech blocked two kicks (field goal by DL **Zeke Biggers** and punt by RB **Daylon Gordon**) in a game for the first time since the 2013 Music City Bowl vs. Ole Miss (Dec. 30, 2013) and only the 10th time in school history.

- One of the biggest plays of Georgia Tech's 28-27 win at Virginia Tech on Nov. 5 of last season proved to be DL **D'Quan Douse's** blocked extra-point attempt in the second quarter.
- Georgia Tech Jr. PK **Gavin Stewart** got off to an uncharacteristically slow start this season when he missed both of his field goal attempts in last Friday's season opener versus Louisville (54 and 33 yards).
- Last season, Stewart made 12-for-13 field goal attempts, good for 12th nationally and second in the ACC (.923).
- Stewart became the first Georgia Tech kicker in the past 40 seasons (since at least 1982) to make his first 10 field goal attempts of a campaign.
- He stretched the string of consecutive field goals made to 12 before an errant snap and hold led to his first miss of the season in the next-to-last game of the season at North Carolina (Nov. 19).
- Stewart scored 43 of Georgia Tech's 147 points over the final eight games of the 2022 campaign.
- In the first extensive action of his career as a place kicker, Stewart was named ACC Specialist of the Week following his 4-for-4 performance in Tech's 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt (Oct. 1).

- Stewart's four field goals made against Pitt were the most in a game by a Georgia Tech kicker since Wesley Wells made four, including the overtime game-winner, in a 30-27 win over Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018, and the most by a Yellow Jacket in a regulation game since current Kansas City Chiefs PK Harrison Butker made four in Tech's 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016).

- Stewart is one of only nine players in Georgia Tech history to make as many as four field goals in a game.

- Stewart was not alone in sustaining unusual struggles as a place kicker in Week 1 of this season. Stewart, Arkansas State's Dominic Zvada, South Alabama's Diego Guajardo and TCU's Griffin Kell each missed only one field goal last season. They combined to miss six in Week 1 (two each for Stewart and Zvada, one apiece by Guajardo and Kell). In all, FBS kickers have made 70% of field goals through Week 1 of this season after making 75% of their attempts through Week 1 last season.

- However, Stewart proved to be the weapon that Georgia Tech is accustomed to in the kickoff game against Louisville, with four of his five kickoffs going for touchbacks.

- Since becoming Georgia Tech's primary kickoff specialist in 2021, Stewart has forced touchbacks 62 of his 97 kickoffs (.639). Of his other 35 kickoffs, nine have been fair-caught and only 26 have been returned.

- In only his third season of American football ever, Ireland-native **David Shanahan** picked up right where he left off last season with a 43-yard punting average in last Friday's opener versus Louisville.

- Shanahan ranks 36th nationally and fourth in the ACC with his 43.0-yard punting average through Week 1.

- Shanahan's output against Louisville was nearly identical to his averages from last season, when he ranked fourth in the ACC and 35th nationally in punting at 43.5 yards per punt.

- Through Week 1, Georgia Tech ranks 29th nationally in punt return average (8.0 avg.).

- Tech's national punt return ranking continues to rise after ranking last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns in 2021. Last season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 39th nationally in punt return average (9.33 avg.).

MISCELLANEOUS

• Georgia Tech is one of the nation's most disciplined teams through Week 1, with just two penalties for 20 yards in its opener against Louisville. The Yellow Jackets are tied for fourth nationally (second in the ACC) in fewest penalties and 10th nationally (third in the ACC) in fewest penalty yards.

• Head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

• Of the 12 men that have served as Georgia Tech's head coach for more than one game since Bobby Dodd took the reins in 1945, Key is one of only four that won his first two games at the helm of the Jackets, joining Bud Carson (1967), Chan Gailey (2002) and Paul Johnson (2009).

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when Tech knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1 of last season.

• Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher – L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee – 1972; Pepper Rodgers – L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame – 1974; Bill Curry – L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama – 1980; Mac McWhorter – W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford – 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins – L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson – 2019).

• Georgia Tech's 2023 full-time coaches and analysts have combined to win 105 championships at high school (state), college (division/conference/national) and NFL (division/conference/Super Bowl) levels as players and coaches.

• Last season, Georgia Tech finished sixth nationally and second in the ACC in turnover margin at plus-11 (0.92/gm). The Yellow Jackets ranked 14th nationally and third in the ACC in turnovers forced (24) and 17th nationally and second in the ACC in fewest turnovers lost (13).

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the past three seasons. In their 11 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in nine of 11 games and are plus-20 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 15 of its 24 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-21 overall in turnover margin in those 24 losses.

• According to CBS Sports, Georgia Tech faces the toughest schedule in the ACC in 2023.

• ESPN's FPI (Football Power Index) agrees, ranking Tech's schedule as toughest in the ACC and the 22nd-toughest nationally.
