STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech plays its final game of 2023 and opens Atlantic Coast Conference play at No. 22 Florida State on Friday. The Yellow Jackets and Seminoles have an early tip of 2 p.m. on ACC Network Extra. Shawn Davison and Melissa Bruner will have the call.
- Georgia Tech looks to extend its winning streak to five-straight on Friday after cruising past USC Upstate on Dec. 20 to close out non-conference play before the holiday break. The Yellow Jackets distributed their offense with four finishing in double-figures paced by 14 points from Rusne Augustinaite. Tonie Morgan just missed a double-double with 13 points and eight rebounds. After shooting 50.0 percent in the first half, Tech held its largest halftime lead of the season at intermission.
- The Yellow Jackets will look to snap a three-game skid to Florida State on Friday and pick up its first win against the Seminoles since Jan. 13, 2022. The Seminoles snapped a five-game skid against the Jackets in Feb. 2022 and have taken the last two in Tallahassee. Last season, FSU captured an 80-66 decision in the Tucker Center. Kara Dunn logged 16 points in the loss, along with Kayla Blackshear who chipped in 10 points. Tonie Morgan finished with 11 rebounds, eight points and five assists.
- Through Tech's first 12 games of the season, Tonie Morgan has posted double-figure scoring totals in 11 outings. She was held to single-digits for the first time this season against Mercer, finishing with nine points. Meanwhile, Kayla Blackshear has recorded nine games in double-figures to date. The dynamic duo are both averaging over 13 points per game with Morgan leading Tech with a 14.4 points per game average. Combined, Blackshear and Morgan have scored 331 points on the season, accounting for 37 percent of Tech's offense.
- Freshman Rusne Augustinaite has opened her collegiate career in style. The Lithuanian has finished eight games in double-figures, highlighted by a career-high 30 points against Florida. She has led Tech from three-point distance in eight outings (tying for the team-high at Rice and against Mercer). She is currently shooting 40.5 percent from three-point distance with a team-best 30 made three-pointers. She is fourth in the ACC in 3-point field goals made.
- Rusne Augustinaite is one of only 10 players in the ACC to own a game with 30 points or more this season. The individual high in the ACC is 39 points from teammate Kara Dunn, which she scored against Georgia State. Additionally, Augustinaite is one of only two freshmen in the league to own a 30-point game, the other being freshman guard Hannah Hidalgo from Notre Dame.
- Georgia Tech is one of only two teams in the league with multiple players recording 30-plus point games - the other being Virginia Tech. Sophomore Kara Dunn owns the single-season high in the ACC, having dropped a remarkable 39 points against Georgia State, earning her ACC Player of the Week.
- In August, the Yellow Jackets took a 10-day foreign tour to Croatia and Spain, playing three games while abroad (Tech went 3-0). During the tour, Tech visited Split and Dubrovnik (Croatia) and Barcelona. It was a mini-homecoming for Tech's three Spanish players.

REBOUNDING GAME

Averaging 42.1 rebounds per game, Georgia Tech has out-rebounded nine of its 12 opponents entering ACC play on Friday. Tech's largest rebounding advantage was against cross-town rival, Georgia State, which it out-rebounded, 56-29. It's rebounding low total was 34 boards against Kennesaw State.

Tech has out-rebounded its last two opponents - USC Upstate and Georgia - 90-74. Tonie Morgan has led the Jackets in rebounding a team-high six times this season, followed by Kayla Blackshear four times.

In the ACC, Georgia Tech ranks seventh in rebounding offense and two players - Tonie Morgan and Kayla Blackshear - rank individually in the top 20 in rebounding in the ACC.

LIKE MOTHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

The Dunn family likes playing at Georgia. In Tech's win at Georgia on Dec. 16, sophomore Kara Dunn posted 21 points to mark her third game this season with 20 points or more, and her fourth-straight game in double-figures.

Her mother, Stephanie Dunn, formerly Wheeler, was a four-year letterwinner at Georgia (1992-95). Wearing No. 24, she was a member of the 1995 team that reached the Final Four under coach Andy Landers. She finished her career having played in 88 games.

FLIRTING WITH A TRIPLE DOUBLE

Tonie Morgan has flirted with a triple-double multiple times in her career, most recently with 12 rebounds, 11 points and eight assists at Georgia. In the season-opener against Coastal Carolina, Morgan dropped 20 points, seven rebounds and seven assists. She nearly grabbed it again against Georgia State with 10 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.

The last Yellow Jacket to record a triple-double dates back to Milli Martinez against Morris Brown on Feb. 23, 2022. She posted 12 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in the game.

DUNN'S OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Against Georgia State, sophomore Kara Dunn went off for a career-high 39 points in the win, marking the highest ACC individual scoring total this season. Dunn was 14-for-18 from the field, including 4-of-5 from three-point range and 7-of-9 from the free throw line, to earn ACC Player of the Week honors.

In the win, Dunn set career-highs in points, field goals, three-pointers, free throws, and free throw attempts.

Her 39 points marked the fourth-highest individual scoring total in Georgia Tech women's basketball program history and the most by a Yellow Jacket since 1999 when Niesha Butler dropped 40 points against Florida State (Jan. 2, 1999). Dunn was four points away from matching the program record of 43 points set by Marielle Walker in 1987.

GOING FOR THREE

Georgia Tech as a team saw impressive contribution from three-point distance against Georgia State, hitting a season-high 10 three-pointers. Tech reached its season-high with five different Jackets connecting from long distance, paced by four three-pointers from Kara Dunn.

The 10 three-pointers marked the most since Tech hit 11 against Furman two seasons ago on Dec. 12, 2021.

In the Nell Fortner era at Georgia Tech, Tech teams have hit 10 or more three-pointers in a game six times: 2023-24 (once), 2021-22 (once), 2020-21 (twice), 2019-20 (twice) - with a high of 12 hit twice her first season against ETSU and at Georgia.

LENDING A HAND

Georgia Tech ranks fifth in the ACC in assists on the season, averaging 17.08 per game. The Yellow Jackets dished out a season-high of 26 assists against Georgia State. The Jackets have dished out 20 or more assists in a game four times this season. Notre Dame leads the ACC in assists with a 19.30 average.

Tonie Morgan leads the Yellow Jackets in assists with 66 on the year, good enough to rank fourth in the ACC in assists per game.

NOGUERO'S DOUBLE TROUBLE

Sophomore Inés Noguero recorded her first collegiate double-double against Mercer, posting 10 points and a career-high 12 rebounds. Noguero led the Jackets on the glass for her first time with her 12 defensive rebounds. She finished the game with six assists and a steal.

Noguero flirted with a double-double against New Mexico in the Cancun Challenge, finishing with 13 points and nine rebounds. She currently ranks fifth on the team in scoring, averaging 7.6 points and is third in rebounding at 5.5 rebounds per game.

SEEING DOUBLE

For the second time this season, two Yellow Jackets finished with 20 points or more in a game at Nebraska. Kara Dunn led the way with 22 points, while Tonie Morgan added 20 points to the scoreboard. In the season-opener, Morgan and Kayla Blackshear both recorded 20-plus points.

Dunn finished with 22 points, hitting nine field goals, including three triples. It marked her third game with 20-plus points in her collegiate campaign - and first this season.

AUGUSTINAITE FOR 30

Freshman Rusne Augustinaite dropped a career-high 30 points in the ACC/SEC Challenge against Florida. Augustinaite went 10-for-20 from the field, including a 6-for-10 showing from three-point range.

Augustinaite then-became the first Yellow Jacket to score 30 points in a game since Lotta-Maj Lahtinen had 30 against NC State on Dec. 31, 2020. She is the first freshman to score 30-plus points since Elizabeth Balogun did so twice in 2018-19. Balogun scored 30 points versus Seton Hall (12/20/18) before dropping 35 at North Carolina (1/31/19).

BLACKSHEAR COMING OUT STRONG

After averaging 7.5 points per game last season (2022-23), Kayla Blackshear has come out to start the 2023-24 season with a strong offensive game. She is currently third on the team in scoring, averaging 13.2 points per game, having scored in double-figures in nine games and leading the Jackets in scoring in six outings.

In the ACC, Blackshear ranks 18th overall in scoring. Hannah Hidalgo of Notre Dame leads the league in scoring, averaging 23.80 points per game.

Blackshear's 48.8 percent shooting efficiency places her ninth in the ACC. Amari Robinson (Clemson) leads the ACC at 59.0 percent.

TONIE, TONIE, TONIE

Alongside Kayla Blackshear, Tonie Morgan has dropped double-figure scoring totals in 11 games on the season. Currently averaging 14.4 points per game, Morgan leads the team in scoring and is 11th in the ACC overall.

Morgan is currently leads the in rebounding, averaging 7.3 rebounds per game, which places her for 10th in rebounding in the ACC. In defensive rebounds, Morgan is fourth in the ACC. Morgan is the only true guard ranked in the top 10 in the ACC in rebounding. Alyssa Ustby (UNC) is listed as a G/F and ranks fifth.

Morgan also leads Georgia Tech in assists with 66 on the season for a 5.50 assists per game average. She ranks fourth in the ACC in assists (Georgia Amooore, VT, leads the league in assists with 85 for an 7.73 average).

CANCUN CHALLENGE

Georgia Tech spent the Thanksgiving holiday in Cancun, Mexico, making a return trip to the Cancun Challenge. The Yellow Jackets made their third appearance in the holiday tournament, having taken part in 2015-16 and 2018-19. Tech is 4-2 when competing in the tournament, having posted a 1-1 record this year.

This season, Tech dropped its opening game to Creighton, but rebounded with a win over New Mexico. Previously, Tech faced Northern Iowa and High Point in 2015-16, splitting the games, and swept George Washington and Idaho State in 2018-19. Tonie Morgan was named to the All-Tournament Team after scoring in double-figures in both games and recording a double-double against New Mexico.

MORE FOR THE MONEY

Georgia Tech has recorded 10 games this season with at least three players finishing in double-figure scoring numbers. The Jackets got the season rolling with three or more

players in double-figures in the first four games of the season. Tech broke the streak against Creighton in the Cancun Challenge, being held to two players in double-figures. The only other time Tech was held to two players in double-figures was against Florida in the ACC/SEC Challenge.

Kayla Blackshear has led Tech offensively in six outings, while Tonie Morgan led the way against Furman and has scored in double-figures in 11 outings. Also contributing double-figures in her first four games was freshman Rusne Augustinaite, putting on a strong showing to start her collegiate career.

HOMETOWN SHOWDOWN

D'Asia Thomas-Harris had quite the showing at Rice, playing in front of her hometown crowd as the freshman grew up not 30 minutes from Houston. Thomas-Harris recorded her first career double-double behind 12 points and 13 points, setting a personal-best this season in rebounding. She came up clutch in the second half, leading the Jackets with eight rebounds in the final two periods. She was the first Yellow Jacket to post a double-double this season.

Thomas-Harris continued her success against Kennesaw State, recording her second-straight double-figure scoring outing with a season-high 15 points.

COMEBACK WIN

Tech trailed by as many as 17 points in the third quarter at Rice, but stormed back in the final 12 minutes to come away with a 78-75 victory over the Owls. The Jackets dominated the second half, 47-30, and shot 51.7 percent paced by Kayla Blackshear and Tonie Morgan with 12 and 10 points, respectively, in the final two periods. In the second half, Tech converted 12-of-17 free throw attempts, while Rice went to the line for the first and only time in the second half with 1:10 remaining in the game, hitting both attempts. After not hitting a three-pointer in the first half, Tech was 5-for-6 from long distance in the second half, including a perfect 3-for-3 in the fourth quarter. In the win, five Yellow Jackets finished in double-figure scoring totals, while D'Asia Thomas-Harris recorded the first double-double of the season.

OFFENSIVE DOMINATION

Between Tech's first four games, the Yellow Jackets put up some commanding offensive numbers. Combined as a team, the Jackets averaged 82.3 points per game in the first four games of the season with three or more players posting double-figures in all games, and seeing offensive contributions from eight, 10, six and 10 players, respectively. In the win over Furman, the Jackets scored 91 points, marking only the second time in the Nell Fortner era (since 2019) Tech has scored 90-plus points in a game. The first was a 92-84 overtime win against Clemson on Feb. 13, 2022. Tech broke the streak against Creighton, having only two players finish in double-figures.

Since Tech's win over Furman, the Jackets scored 94 points against Georgia State to mark a scoring high during the Nell Fortner era, and the third time a team of hers scored 90 points or more in a game.

CAREER NIGHTS

In Tech's season-opener against Coastal Carolina, Kayla Blackshear and Tonie Morgan combined to score 44 points, both recording career-highs in scoring.

Blackshear logged a game-high 24 points, while Morgan chipped in 20. Blackshear saw her 24 come from nine field goals and 6-of-7 free throws. Morgan tallied her 20 points on eight field goals, including a three-pointer, and three free throws. The sophomore also led the Jackets in rebounding (7) and assists (7) on the day.

GAME READY

Against Coastal Carolina, Tech's six newcomers all saw game action, giving them floor experience heading into the season. Leading the way off the bench was freshman Rusne Augustinaite who hit a game-high four three-pointers to finish with 14 points.

D'Asia Thomas-Harris also saw valuable playing time, logging seven minutes and producing solid numbers. Thomas-Harris finished with eight points, six coming in the final quarter in which she played three minutes, pulled down five rebounds and recorded a steal.

Fifth-year transfer Sydney Johnson saw nearly 15 minutes of game action and dished out five assists and two rebounds. Freshman Ariadna Termis came off the bench for eight minutes of action and posted one rebound and an assist.

STRONG FROM THE FLOOR

Tech topped its season-best shooting percentage from last season in just its season-opener, shooting 51.6 percent (33-64) from the field against Coastal Carolina. Last season, Tech's best shooting percentage was 50.8 percent (31-61) against Clemson (1/26/23).

Against the Chanticleers, four Yellow Jackets finished in double-figure scoring numbers led by 20-plus point performances from Kayla Blackshear (24) and Tonie Morgan (20).

The Jackets recorded its second-straight game shooting 50 percent or higher against Furman, connecting on 52.1 percent from the field. The third outing shooting over 50.0 percent came against Kennesaw State when Tech shot a season-high 58.0 percent from the field.

FINAL TUNEUP

Georgia Tech welcomed Georgia College on Nov. 2 for its final preseason tuneup in McCamish Pavilion. The Yellow Jackets took the exhibition win, 93-56, behind four different Jackets in double-figure scoring totals. Tonie Morgan led the way with 20 points,

2024 SIGNING CLASS

On National Signing Day, head coach Nell Fortner announced the addition of four Atlanta locals to the 2024-25 roster. All four were named to the Atlanta Tipoff Club Girls High School Preseason Watch List. The signing class has been ranked No. 19 by ESPN. The signing class included:

Danie Carnegie (5-9, G, Conyers, Ga.) - A four-star recruit by ESPN HoopGurlz, Carnegie is the third-highest ranked recruit in Georgia. She has earned multiple state and regional accolades, including first team 6A all-State by the AJC.

Gabbie Grooms (5-9, G, Sharpsburg, Ga.) -The 2023 AJC 2A Player of the Year, Grooms was tabbed Class A Private All-State second team honors in 2022. She has scored over 1,000-career points at Landmark Christian. Her mother, Lady Hardmon, played basketball at Georgia (1989-92) before going on to play eight seasons in the WNBA.

Tianna Thompson (5-10, G, Mableton, Ga.) - Thompson helped lead The Galloway School to a 2023 state runner-up finish, and has earned AJC Class A Private All-State first- and second-team honors in 2022 and 2021. She has scored over 1,000-career points and is a four-star recruit by Prospects Nation, and is the top-ranked recruit in Georgia. Her father, Rich, ran track and field at Georgia Tech (1988-91) and was inducted into the GT Sports Hall of Fame in 2001.

Chazadi "Chit Chat" Wright (5-4, G, Decatur, Ga.) - A two-time all-State honoree by the AJC, Wright earned first-team 3A all-State in 2023 and first-team Class A Private all-State in 2022. She has also earned Region 7 Class 3A Region Player of the Year honors and has amassed over 1,000-career points at Wesleyan.

50 SEASONS

The 2023-24 season marks the 50th season of Georgia Tech women's basketball. Tech's first varsity female sports team, women's basketball started in 1974-75 and has amassed 766 wins since. In 50 seasons, Georgia Tech has made 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, eight WNIT appearances, and seven GAIW State Tournaments. The Yellow Jackets made their first postseason appearance in school history in 1992 and won the NWIT in Amarillo, Texas. The win also marked the first NWIT title for an ACC school.

Tech made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1992-93. The Jackets didn't return for 10 years, making its next trip in 2003, but then participated in every Big Dance from 2007-2012. In 2012, Tech made its first-ever run to the Sweet 16. The Jackets would return to the Sweet 16 in 2021 with Nell Fortner at the helm.

MORGAN'S INAUGURAL SEASON

Tonie Morgan put together quite the freshman season last year, leading Georgia Tech in assists with 114 and finishing second on the team in scoring, averaging 9.8 points per game. She returns as the team's leading scorer. After an impressive freshman season, Morgan earned ACC All-Freshman Team honors and collected two ACC Rookie of the Week honors.

In the ACC, Morgan was one of only four freshmen to own a double-double last season, and was one of only three to own multiple double-doubles. Additionally, she was one of only four players overall in the league to own a double-double on points and assists. Morgan flirted with a triple-double on multiple occasions last season.

Finishing with 114 assists, Morgan ranks fourth in the Georgia Tech record book in the freshman class. Nina Bärin ranks third with 117 assists as a freshman in 1999-00. Carmen Davis holds the freshman record at GT with 173 assists during the 1989-90 season.

BLACKSHEAR ON THE BOARDS

Kayla Blackshear led Georgia Tech in rebounding last season, pulling down 6.4 rebounds per game on average. The junior finished the season with five games securing double-figure rebounding totals. Blackshear was one of three Yellow Jackets last season to record a game with double-figure rebounds, joined by teammate Tonie Morgan who recorded three. Morgan, the team's second leading rebounder last season, recorded the team's season-high, having pulled down 15 rebounds against Syracuse.

WHAT'S DUNN DONE

Kara Dunn also put together a strong freshman season last year, finishing with nine games in double-figure scoring, including four with 15-plus points. She set a career-high in scoring with 21 points against Wake Forest in her second-straight game with 20-plus points. She was one of only three Yellow Jackets to score 20 or more points.

Dunn finished the season averaging 7.6 points per game, shot 42.9 percent from the floor and 73.5 percent from the free throw line. She returns as the team's second leading scorer behind Tonie Morgan. Dunn appeared in 28 games and earned the start in 14.

ACC/SEC CHALLENGE

The 2023-24 season will mark the start of the ACC/SEC Challenge. In the inaugural matchups, Georgia Tech drew Florida and will host the Gators on Nov. 29 at 5 p.m. in McCamish Pavilion. Despite their relatively close proximity, the ACC/SEC Challenge matchup between Georgia Tech and Florida will be only the second meeting in series history and the first in 37 years. In the only previous matchup, the Yellow Jackets downed the Gators, 82-72, on Dec. 5, 1986 in Atlanta.

HITTING THE PORTAL

Georgia Tech hit the transfer portal over the summer and welcomed two transfers to The Flats for their fifth seasons of eligibility. Joining the 2023-24 roster are Sydney Johnson (Powder Springs, Ga.) and Caitlyn Wilson (Cordova, Tenn.).

Johnson played four seasons at Boston University becoming the first Terrier in program history to be named first team all-Patriot League multiple times. Johnson finished her career at BU ranked 11th in program history with 1,255 career points, eighth with 330 career assists, ninth with 483 career field goals made and ninth with a 12.0 points per game average. In four seasons, she started 97 of her 105 career games played, was twice tabbed all-Patriot League first team (2022, 2023) and once to second team (2021). In 2023, Johnson was named to the all-Patriot League defensive team and tournament team after leading the Terriers with 107 assists and 55 steals, while ranking second with 12.8 ppg her final season. She was first named to the all-Patriot League tournament team in 2022.

Wilson played three seasons at Cincinnati, appearing in 77 games for the Bearcats and starting 42. She averaged 7.8 points and 1.8 rebounds, while shooting 32.6 percent from the field and 32.9 percent from three-point distance. Wilson hit at least 50 three-pointers each season to finish sixth in the Cincinnati record book in three-pointers made with 163. Wilson played her freshman season at Chipola Junior College in Marianna, Fla. She started 18-of-27 games and averaged 13.6 points, 3.4 made three-pointers, 3.2 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game to earn all-Panhandle Conference First Team honors.

GOING DANCING

Under the direction of head coach Nell Fortner, Georgia Tech made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2021 and 2022, marking the first time Tech has made consecutive appearances since six-straight from 2007-12.

Tech reached the Sweet 16 for just the second time in program history in 2021. Tech's appearance in 2022 marked the 11th in the Big Dance.

HOME SWEET HOME

All time, the Yellow Jackets are 415-230 (.620) when playing at home. The Jackets have won the last 10-consecutive home openers dating back to the 2012-13 season (including this season). Last season, Tech defeated Georgia State in its home opener, 60-42. Under the direction of Fortner, the Jackets are 5-0 in home openers dating back to her first season in 2019-20.

HEAD COACH NELL FORTNER

5th Season • Texas '82

Nell Fortner was named the sixth head coach of Georgia Tech women's basketball on April 9, 2019. One of the most successful coaches in women's basketball history, Fortner has compiled a 385-238 (.615) record as a head coach at the collegiate, professional and international levels. She has led teams to Big Ten (Purdue – 1997) and Southeastern Conference (Auburn – 2009) championships and, perhaps most notably, coached the United States national team to three international titles from 1997-2000, including the gold medal at the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney, Australia. Fortner is the winningest coach in the history of the USA women's basketball national team, having compiled a 101-14 (.878) record. In addition to the 2000 Olympics championship, she also led the team to the gold medal at the 1998 World Championship in Berlin, Germany and the 1998 William Jones Cup in Taipei, Taiwan. At the collegiate level, Fortner has 13 seasons of experience as a head coach – one at Purdue (1996-97), eight at Auburn (2004-12) and four at Georgia Tech (2019-22) – and has compiled a 242-168 (.585) overall record in the college ranks.
