### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech baseball looks to keep momentum during its road swing, heading for its second ACC series, at No. 20 North Carolina on March 22-24.
- The Jackets and Tar Heels have squared off 155 times previously since 1901, ranking as the fifth most-common opponent in Tech's history. Tech holds a 83-72 advantage.
- Tech is riding a nine-game win streak after sweeping then-No. 13 NC State last weekend and winning in dramatic fashion at Ga. State – good for sixth-longest active win streak in the country and second-longest in the ACC.
- Georgia Tech's bats has been elite in both patience and power. Tech is one of just four teams in the country only ACC team to rank top-15 in both walks and home runs.
- Leading Tech's offense has been **Payton Green**, who's hitting .380 with 14 extra-base hits, 20 RBI and 17 walks.
- In total, seven Yellow Jackets are hitting .300 on an offense that ranks 23rd nationally (.321).
- Behind Green is **Drew Burress** (.372), **Carson Kerce** (.368), **Trey Yunger** (.367), **Parker Brosius** (.345), **Cam Jones** (.338) and **Mike Becchetti** (.301).
- Burress and Ellis combined for ninth-inning heroics on Tuesday as Burress tied the game on an RBI double before Ellis homered to give Tech a two-run lead.
- Burress continues to run a strong campaign for Freshman of the Year, currently leading all freshmen nationally in five statistical categories and all ACC freshmen in eight categories.
- Tech's pitching has been much improved this season, working eight scoreless innings last night and only allowing two earned runs and one walk.
- Tech's starting pitchers are averaging a 4.21 ERA, 8-2 record and nearly 3:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- **Aeden Finateri** (3.60) and **Logan McGuire** (3.79) both sport sub-4.00 ERA through a combined nine starts.

**IT STARTS AT HOME...**

• "It Starts at Home" has been the offseason motto for Georgia Tech, putting an emphasis on getting victories at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium after going 26-11 in 2019.

• Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .755 percent of its games at home (1,024-333-1).

• In 30 home games last season, Tech was 23-7 and hit a blistering .357 with 86 doubles, 10 triples and 63 home runs.

• Tech was excellent at home in 2022, recording a 22-9 record at Mac Nease Baseball Park at Russ Chandler Stadium.

• Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full season – 2017 and 2021.

• In 2022, Tech hit a gaudy .349 at home.

• As Tech looked to revamp its roster, it gained more OPS points than any Power 5 team through the portal this off-season (min. 5 transfers).

• Part of the season-opening onslaught was seven home runs for Tech, the most in a single game for the first time since 2009.

### INFIELDERS

• The veteran on the team and the lone returning position player from the end of last season, **John Giesler** will be looked after a terrific junior campaign.

• Giesler started the season at third base and looked good at the plate, finishing with three hits on Opening Weekend - two doubles and a triple.

• Giesler is hitting .280 on the season with seven hits - none of which have been singles (five doubles, one triple and one home run).

• Giesler is the second-best returning ACC hitter in conference games by OPS behind Wake Forest's Nick Kurtz.

• Last season, Giesler hit .333 in 47 games and 41 starts, recording 52 hits, 13 doubles, two triples and eight home runs, also driving in 37 runs. He reached base at a .422 clip in 2023.

• Playing first base Opening Weekend was transfer **Cam Jones** from Georgia State.

• Jones showed why he was a two-way star in the Sun Belt against Ga. Southern (Feb. 20), going 2-for-5 at the plate and getting the win on the mound, pitching the final 3.2 innings scoreless and striking out a career-high eight batters.

• On the season, Jones is hitting .338 with 25 hits, six doubles and two home runs.

• Entering North Carolina, Jones is riding a 17-game hitting streak.

• He also leads the ACC and is eighth nationally in stolen bases with 14.

• Jones was the 2022 John Olerud Award runner up who was named first-team all-Sun Belt three times with the Panthers.

• For his career in Panthersville, Jones hit .341 with 75 RBI and 106 runs and finished second in program history with 50 career stolen bases.

• On the opposite corner, one of the leading contenders for third base has been true freshman **Ryan Jaros**.

• Jaros started two games last weekend against Georgia (March 2-3) and has a .333 average in his limited action. On Sunday at Coolray Field, He went 2-for-4 with a double and two RBI.

• Jaros was an all-state New Jersey high school third baseman, displaying terrific defensive skill with a solid offensive package.

## OFFENSE

- He finished his prep career with 100 career hits in 213 at-bats (three seasons due to Covid-19) and was rated the top third baseman in New Jersey and No. 4 third baseman overall by *Perfect Game*.
- The latest contender to hold down the hot corner has been freshman **Carson Kerce**.
- Kerce went 8-for-11 (.727) against Youngstown State in three starts, rocketing a double with six RBI.
- In 15 games and nine starts this season, Kerce is hitting .368 with 11 RBI.
- Kerce hit his first two collegiate home runs last weekend against then-No. 13 NC State.
- Kerce, a Marietta, Ga. and Pope High School product, was rated as the No. 11 shortstop and No. 37 overall prospect by *Perfect Game*.
- Kerce helped lead Pope to a state championship in Truist Park in 2022 and was named Cobb County Player of the Year, Region Player of the Year, first-team all-county and first-team all-region in 2023.
- Up the middle, Tech will look to a completely new grouping acquired in the offseason.
- Transfer **Mike Becchetti** will likely hold down second base, coming off a career at Fairfield that featured multiple all-conference selections.
- Becchetti has been tremendous both defensively and offensively as a Yellow Jacket.
- Becchetti is currently hitting .304 with 21 hits, three doubles and five home runs for 21 RBI.
- Becchetti hit .357 in four games against Youngstown State (March 8-10), recording five hits, a double and a homer for eight RBI.
- Becchetti hit two home runs in the Saturday game against Cornell.
- Becchetti hit the go-ahead two-out, two-run double in the eighth inning to give Tech the win over Georgia Southern on Tuesday night (Feb. 20).
- Becchetti led the MAAC in fielding percentage as a plus defender and has been graded highly on toughness and his ability to turn double plays.
- In 2023, Becchetti was first-team all-conference and named second team all-region in the northeast, batting .329 with 73 hits, 66 runs scored, 13 home runs and 54 RBI.
- In 2023, Becchetti had a career-high 20-game hitting streak — good for second-longest in Fairfield history.
- Transfer **Payton Green** brings 110 career starts with him at shortstop from NC State.
- Green was sensational in his first weekend on The Flats, earning ACC Player of the Week honors (Feb. 19).
- Green hit a gaudy .636 with seven hits and three home runs for seven RBI to win the award.

- In addition to slugging 1.455, he also drew four walks and failed to strike out for a .733 on-base percentage.
- His first eight plate appearances included six hits and two walks.
- Green continues to be atop the team leaderboard, leading Tech with a .380 batting average, 27 hits, seven doubles, a triple and six home runs for 20 RBI.
- Green has only struck out 11 times and drawn 17 walks for a .495 on-base percentage.
- In four games against Youngstown State (March 8-10), Green hit .615 with eight hits, four doubles and one home run for four RBI.
- Against his former team last weekend, then-ranked No. 13 NC State, Green hit .462 with six hits, two doubles and a homer to drive in five runs, striking out just once.
- In 2023 at NC State, he batted .274 with 57 hits, 12 doubles, 10 homers and 45 RBI while also leading the Wolfpack with nine stolen bases.
- Known as #CatcherU, Georgia Tech once again has two dependable catchers behind the dish for the 2023 campaign.
- Adding in the offseason as a grad transfer, **Matthew Ellis** looks to be the Opening Day starter behind the dish.
- Ellis started the season well, hitting .357 with five hits and three doubles over Opening Weekend.
- Since Opening Weekend, he has been up and down to be hitting .296 on the season with 21 hits, six doubles and four home runs.
- He's hit home runs in back-to-back games entering North Carolina, including the two-run, go-ahead homer in the top of the ninth at Georgia State on Tuesday (March 19) to give Tech the win.
- Ellis hit .462 against Youngstown State (March 8-10), recording six hits, a double and a home run for 10 RBI in four games.
- He hit his first home run as a Yellow Jacket to spark a four-run inning on Sunday vs. Georgia at Coolray Field (March 3).
- Ellis was limited due to injury in his last season at Indiana, but in 2022, the backstop tied Kyle Schwarber's home run record with 18.
- Ellis' long history of home-run power and on-base percentage makes him a deadly contender in the middle of Tech's revamped lineup.
- Another option behind the dish for Tech is blue-chip recruit **Tyler Minnick**, who appeared in 27 games and made 24 starts last season.
- Minnick hit .263 for the year, recording 21 hits, six doubles and two home runs, driving in 14 runs.
- Minnick was rated a top-35 catcher nationally and the No. 2 catcher in the state of Georgia for the 2023 class before reclassifying and enrolling mid-year at Tech.

- Minnick has also made two appearances at first base this season.
- Also getting a chance Opening Weekend is true freshman **Vahn Lackey**.

- Lackey made his first appearance on Opening Day, in a pinch-hit situation, and drove his first collegiate hit out of the park to become the fifth Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his first career plate appearance.

- Lackey then hit his second home run in just his fourth collegiate at-bat against Cornell on Feb. 25.
- Lackey got his first career start against Georgia State (Feb. 27), drawing two walks, throwing out one would-be base thief and back-picking another runner off first.

### OUTFIELDERS

- For the second year in a row, Georgia Tech will debut a completely new-look outfield when compared to last year's opening day lineup.
- The lone familiar face in the outfield will be **Parker Brosius**, who returns for his sophomore season at Tech.
- After a somewhat dormant Opening Weekend performance, Brosius was red-hot on Tuesday night against Georgia Southern (Feb. 20), going 2-for-3 with a key RBI in the eighth inning to cap a four-run, come-from-behind effort and give Tech a 7-4 lead.
- Brosius continued to be red-hot at the plate last weekend against Cornell, recording three hits and drawing six walks (four in one game) in the three-game series.
- His eye continued to be good against Georgia State (Feb. 27), only having one official at-bat, drawing two walks, getting hit once and scoring all three times.
- Brosius hit first career home run to tie the game 1-1 at Georgia (March 2).
- Brosius was lights-out against Youngstown State (March 8-10), hitting .667 with 10 hits and three doubles to drive home 10 runs.
- Brosius ranks seventh in the ACC in walks drawn (20) and fourth in on-base percentage (.530).
- Brosius is also seventh in the ACC in toughest-to-strikeout, averaging 9.7 at-bats per strikeout.
- Brosius is now fifth on the team, hitting .345 with a .530 on-base percentage and a perfect 8-for-8 in stolen bases.
- Brosius was a breakout star in the Northwoods League this summer, hitting .292 with a .446 on-base percentage and a gaudy 42 stolen bases.
- He has tremendous speed and great bat-to-ball skill who can play all three positions in the outfield, but will more than likely wind up in left field.

**OFFENSE**

• In very limited action in 2023, Brosius hit .182 with two hits in 11 at-bats over 30 appearances (often as a pinch runner).

• Also looking to contribute early with be true freshman **Drew Burress**, who is the top prospect to arrive on The Flats and has already been named a preseason freshman all-American by *ProspectsLive*.

• Burress became the first Georgia Tech true freshman to bat leadoff on Opening Day since Kyle Wren led off 2011.

• Burress showed no freshman slump in his collegiate debut, hitting .429 with three doubles and three home runs, slugging 1.286 on Opening Weekend.

• Despite having just one hit on Tuesday against Georgia Southern, he drove in two runs to pull Tech within one in the seventh and drove in the team's first run in the game on a sac fly, just missing a home run.

• Burress then had two doubles, including the go-ahead bases-clearing double in the eighth inning on Friday night against Cornell (Feb. 23).

• He followed that up with two home runs in the first inning against Cornell on Saturday (Feb. 24).

• Burress etched his name in history on Tuesday vs. Georgia State, hitting a school-record four home runs.

• Burress becomes the 14th player and third freshman in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat since 2012.

• Only two players in all of last season hit four home runs: Mississippi's Calvin Harris and Texas State's Chase Mora.

• Burress is creating a terrific campaign for ACC Player of the Year, not just ACC Freshman of the Year, currently leading the conference in three statistical categories and Top-5 in seven.

• Also a threat in the outfield and at the plate is transfer **Trey Yunger**.

• Yunger began the season in left field and was Tech's third-best hitter Opening Weekend, hitting .417 with five hits, six RBI and an inside-the-park home run.

• Yunger's inside-the-park home run was the first by a Yellow Jacket since Austin Wilhite in 2018.

• Yunger then hit 2-for-4 with the game-tying RBI in the eighth inning on Tuesday at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20).

• Yunger sustained an minor upper-body injury after one at-bat against Cornell (Feb. 23) and was day-to-day until returning against Georgia (March 1-3).

• In his first weekend of ACC play against then-No. 13 NC State, Yunger hit .417 for five hits and two home runs for five RBI.

• Through 17 games as a Yellow Jacket, he ranks fourth on the team with a .367 average with 22 hits and three home runs for 14 RBI.

• Against Youngstown State (March 8-10), Yunger was moved to leadoff and hit .538 for seven hits, 10 runs and five walks, striking out just once.

• Yunger brings 178 games and 157 starts of experience from three years at Wofford.

• For his career, he totaled a .329 average with 196 hits, four home runs, 114 RBI, 142 runs scored and 65 stolen bases.

• In 2023, Yunger hit .360 in 58 starts with 81 hits, four homers, 49 RBI and 26 steals.

• Also competing for the outfield or designated hitter spot is transfer **Bobby Zmarzlak**.

• Zmarzlak came alive against Cornell, recording six hits with three doubles and a home run to drive in six runs overall.

• After a brief slump, Zmarzlak caught fire against Mercer (March 12), going 3-for-3 with a home run for three RBI.

• On the season, Zmarzlak is hitting .277 for 13 hits, three doubles and three home runs for 16 RBI.

• Easily the biggest moment of the season for Tech came when Zmarzlak blasted a go-ahead three-run homer in the eighth to clinch the series over then-No. 13 NC State.  
• At Maryland in 2022, Zmarzlak launched 15 home runs but had strikeout issues. In 2023, the production dipped slightly but the strikeout rate was cut in half.

• In the Maryland single-season record book, Zmarzlak ranks No. 7 in runs (64), No. 14 in home runs (15), No. 17 in at-bats (234) and No. 20 in hit-by-pitch (20).

**PITCHING/DEFENSE**

• After struggling last year on the mound, Tech brought in new pitching coach **Matt Taylor** as its pitching coach and **Jason Richman** as director of pitching to lead this season.

• Taylor joins the Yellow Jackets after earning an opportunity to be the minor league pitching coordinator for the Atlanta Braves following three years as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at nearby Georgia State.

• In three seasons at Georgia State, Taylor's time in downtown Atlanta culminated in 2022 when he helped coach the Panthers to their first 30-win season in seven years as his staff had a 5.21 ERA (4.67 ERA in Sun Belt Conference play), a program-record 505 strikeouts and 17 saves – good for second-most in program history.

• Richman joins the Yellow Jackets after a three-year stint as the pitching coach at USC Aiken. He helped the Pacers to an 11-year improvement in 2022, reaching the PBC Tournament semifinals after a 20-10 conference season. He tutored multiple all-conference and all-region selections.

• Prior to USC Aiken, Richman was the player development coach at his alma mater, Georgia Southern for three seasons. As a player in Statesboro, Richman was tabbed the 2014 Southern Conference Most Outstanding Player and was the Tom Walter/Pete Frates College Baseball Inspiration Award Winner.

• Despite a lackluster performance last season, one of the biggest storylines in 2023 was the injuries to key pitchers for Georgia Tech, including all three of the weekend rotation.

• In days between appearances, Tech pitchers have missed a combined 140 days from games and practices due to nagging injuries.

• Now with three of those four back and healthy (Finley drafted), Tech is looking for deeper starts and more consistent performances from its arms.

• Thus far, Georgia Tech's starters have fit the bill, each holding a sub-5 ERA - **Camron Hill** (3.72), **Aeden Finateri** (2.45), **Logan McGuire** (4.50) and **Carson Ballard** (1.38).

• Tech is right in the middle of the pack in the ACC with a 4.68 ERA through 20 games, ranking sixth.

• Tech is also sporting a healthy 2.28:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio, which ranks eighth in the ACC.

• Tech also averages 10.2 strikeouts per nine inning, ranking fifth in the ACC and 40th nationally.

• In the first 15 games, Georgia Tech pitching showed it was vastly improved in advanced analytics compared to a season ago.

**STARTERS**

• Georgia Tech's starting lineup for Opening Weekend was **Terry Busse** on Friday, **Aeden Finateri** on Saturday and transfer **Mason Patel** on Sunday.

• Busse earned the Friday night role after being one of the nation's top closers a season ago.

• Unfortunately, Busse had a tough-luck, six-run first inning and has since been moved back to the bullpen.

• In his first relief appearance of the season, Busse was terrific tossing a clean inning in a one-run game.

• Busse was a midseason All-American, but as injuries continued to plague the Jackets, was forced into the starting rotation, which affected his numbers.

• Busse finished 2023 with nine saves, ranking tied for sixth all-time in Georgia Tech single-season history and was the most since Matthew Gorst (2016).

• Finateri got the Saturday start after being one of Tech's top competitors on the mound last season and finishing with the second-best ERA.

• He was sensational in his first start of 2024, carving up Radford's hitters to the tune of 6.0 innings and a career-high eight strikeouts. He allowed just one run and one walk.

• His second start was even better as he carved up a career-high 10 batters -- including six-straight at one point - to put up a scoreless 5.0 innings.

• Once again, Finateri was outstanding in a pitchers duel against Georgia on March 2. He turned in his second quality start of the season, allowing just one run in 6.0 innings.

• Finateri had his "worst" start of the season against Youngstown State (March 9), but still battled to get his third win, surrendering four runs on five hits.

• Through five starts, Finateri has a 3.60 ERA with a 29:7 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

• His 4.14:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks eighth in the ACC.

• Finateri sported a 4.64 ERA over 23 appearances and four starts in 2023, striking out 56 hitters in 50.2 innings.

• As a lower slot righty with a 88-91 mph sinker, Finateri has been dangerous no matter what his role has been.

• Patel took on the Friday start against then-No. 13 NC State and kept the game manageable, allowing just two runs in the first four innings before passing the baton to **Tate McKee**.

• Patel joined Tech after a terrific three seasons at Georgia State, where he recorded a 3.47 career ERA with 60 strikeouts in 59.2 innings and a .247 average against.

• Patel's 2023 season was cut short after just 15.2 innings and three starts due to a season-ending injury.

• Patel had two sun-aided "hits" foil his first start at Georgia Tech as three runs crossed against him in the first three innings.

• In total, three hits went against both Radford and Georgia Tech pitchers on Sunday due to getting lost in the sun.

• Patel got his first win as a Yellow Jacket on Friday in relief, pitching the final 4.1 innings and allowing just two runs on two hits against Youngstown State (March 8).

• If healthy, Tech's weapon this season is depth in that multiple pitchers should make cases for starting, whether on weekends or in midweeks.

• Other starters in contention include **Logan McGuire** and true freshman **Tate McKee**.

• Tuesday's starter at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20), McGuire had a shaky three-run first inning, but managed to settle in and shut out the Eagles his next three innings, striking out a career-high seven batters.

• McGuire returned to the mound for the first time in 2024 against Georgia Southern, getting his first start since April 11, 2023.

• McGuire moved to the Sunday spot against Georgia, in his first start since Feb. 20.

• McGuire turned in his best career start against UGA, going 5.0 innings and surrendering just two runs (in the fifth), punching out a career-high nine batters and walking none.

• McGuire finally got his first win of the season, despite having good starts the whole season, going 5.0 innings against Youngstown State (March 10) and allowing just one two-run homer.

• McGuire's first ACC start of the season was fantastic, going 5.0 innings of two-hit, one-run ball, striking out five to improve to 2-0 on the year.

• McGuire was very promising to start in 2023, but was shut down and limited to just four starts on the season due to injury.

## PITCHING/DEFENSE

- McGuire was one of Tech's top pitchers going into the season, but nagging injuries limited his action to the tune of just four starts between Feb. 18 and April 11 before getting shut down the rest of the year.

- Redshirt freshman RHP **Carson Ballard** got his first career start on Tuesday vs. Georgia State (Feb. 27), where he went 5.0 innings of three-hit, six-strikeout ball, walking none, for his first win.

- His debut came in relief against Radford (Feb. 18), where he pitched 4.0 innings hitless in less than 50 pitches, walking none and striking out two to get his first career save.

- His third start against Northeastern (March 6), broke the zero ERA as he allowed two earned runs in 4.0 innings. He also issued his first two walks of the season.

- His fourth start was his best as he mowed down Mercer hitters on March 12, going 7.0 shutout innings of four-hit work in just 71 pitches.

- Despite struggling some on the overall line, Ballard was once again strong on Tuesday at Georgia State (March 19), allowing two earned runs (four overall) in 4.0 innings, striking out five and walking one.

- Through four starts, Ballard sports an incredible 1.50 ERA in 24.0 innings of work.

### RELIEVERS

- Where the Jackets had some success last season was its bullpen, but fatigue set in as it had to cover so many innings due to short starts.

- **Ben King** returns as the veteran stopper of the group after a sensational second season.

- King was once again reliable as he was first out of the bullpen on Friday night, setting the game for 2.0 innings scoreless after six scored in the first against Tech.

- King had two runs cross against him in the third inning before getting relieved.

- King had an inherited run go against him after 0.2 innings on Tuesday at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20) as Tech mixed and matched matchups.

- King pitched 2.2 innings against Cornell (Feb. 25) and worked 2.2 innings of work, striking out five without an earned run against him.

- In his first year back from elbow surgery, King led the Jackets with a 3.73 ERA, 55 strikeouts and 6-2 record on the year.

- In just his relief appearances alone, he recorded a 2.72 ERA with a 6-1 record.

- One of Tech's top relievers thus far as been two-way transfer **Cam Jones** from Georgia State.

- A John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year runner-up and three-time first-team all-Sun Belt selection, Jones has impressed on the mound through his first seven appearances, sporting a 3.00 ERA, three saves and 1-0 record.

- He struck out a career-high eight batters on Tuesday night at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20) to get his first win of the season.

- Jones got his second save of the season on March 15 against then-No. 13 NC State, pitching a shutdown ninth in 15 pitches to secure the Friday night win for Tech.

- He got his third save of the season on a 1-2-3 ninth at his former school, Georgia State on Tuesday.

- He currently has an 15:6 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

- McKee has been one of the top freshman arms, working up to 96 in the fall with solid command.

- McKee looked terrific in his first action of his college career, pitching 2.1 innings of work and allowing just one hit.

- McKee's second appearance saw him work six pitches and four strikes for three outs on Feb. 24 vs. Cornell.

- He then tossed two more hitless innings against Georgia State (Feb. 27), striking out four.

- With a four-game set against Youngstown State (March 8-10), McKee got a chance to make his first career start.

- McKee was sensational, getting the win in the seven-inning game with 4.0 innings of two-hit, seven-strikeout work, issuing just one walk.

- McKee then anchored the Friday night game against then-No. 13 NC State, pitching 2.0 innings, allowing just one run on two hits to get his second win of the season.

- Through six appearances, McKee has a 1.46 ERA in 12.1 innings of work with 16 strikeouts, six walks and just six hits.

- McKee was a top-35 right-handed pitcher in the country, according to *Perfect Game* after being a four-year letterwinner at Mount Paran, playing both shortstop and pitcher.

- Another relief arm that Tech will rely on will be transfer **Brett Thomas**.

- In four outings, Thomas has worked 6.2 innings and had two earned runs go against him.

- He looked his best on Saturday retiring all six batters he faced to close the thrilling 8-7 victory against then-No. 13 NC State to get his first win of the season.

- Thomas is finally healthy after battling several injuries at South Carolina and sat mid-90s with nasty breaking pitches.

- Thomas made just six appearances in 2023 for the Gamecocks due to injury.

- A true freshman to watch will be **Michal Kovala** out of the Czech Republic.

- Kovala pitched in the World Baseball Classic for his home country and was the top European prospect, according to *Perfect Game*.

- Kovala pitched four scoreless to close with a narrow 7-4 lead in a win-or-go-home WBC game against Germany, ending the game by inducing a ground-ball double play from former Big Leaguer Bruce Maxwell.

- His first high-leverage spot came on Friday night against then-No. 13 NC State, where he pitched a strong 2.1 innings and allowed just two hits and a two-out error allowed two unearned runs to go against him.

- Tech will also look to enjoy the services of a healthy **Dawson Brown** this season.

- A veteran arm, Brown had been hampered by nagging injuries all season in 2023, making only 12 appearances after beginning the first seven weeks of the season as the Friday night starter.

- Fully healthy, Brown looked terrific in his first action of the season, striking out the side in his inning of work Opening Weekend against Radford.

- In six appearances out of the pen, Brown has a 5.40 ERA with 13 strikeouts and four walks in 6.2 innings.

- He looked as good as he has all season on Tuesday at Georgia State, keeping it a one-run game in his two innings of work, striking out three, walking none and surrendering just one hit.

- Moving into the bullpen after two starts has been LHP **Camron Hill**.

- Hill was the Cape Cod Pitcher of the Year in 2023, taking a big jump forward from a spring season that saw his ERA at 7.98.

- Hill worked a quick and efficient 2.0 innings of hitless baseball on Sunday vs. Radford, striking out three.

- Hill's first start of the season came on Friday night against Cornell (Feb. 23), where after a shaky first inning that featured two walks, one hit and a run, he settled in to pitch three more hitless innings and struck out a career-high seven batters.

- Hill was unable to go 5.0 innings against Youngstown State (March 8), going 3.2 innings with three runs on eight hits going against him.

- Hill's first two appearances back out of the bullpen have shown spurts of what he's capable of.

- In 2.0 innings against NC State in the pivotal Saturday game, he got through one inning clean before it began raining hard during his second inning where two runs scored.

- In a dry atmosphere on Tuesday at Georgia State (March 19), he was terrific, tossing a hitless eighth before Tech scored three in the ninth to win the game and give Hill the decision.

- Other top arms out of the pen have been redshirt freshmen **Caden Gaudette** and **Riley Stanford**.

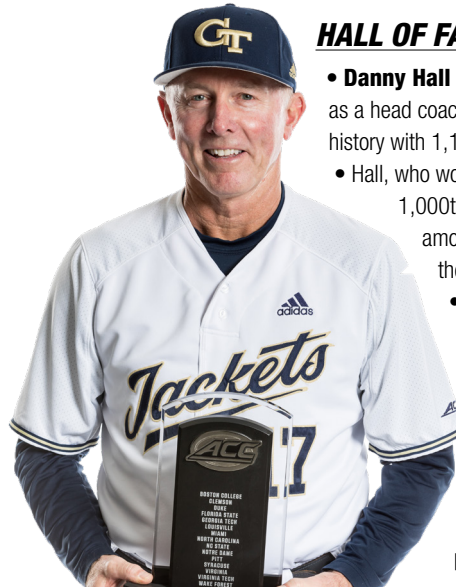

## HALL OF FAME COACH



• **Danny Hall** is in his 31st season at Georgia Tech and his 37th overall as a head coach in 2024. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,186 wins.

• Hall, who won his 1,300th career game on April 25, 2021 and his 1,000th win at Georgia Tech on March 20, 2018, stands first among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2024 season.

• Prior to the 2024 season, Hall was named to the ABCA Hall of Fame.

• In his career – both as an assistant and head coach – Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.

• Hall has led Tech to the NCAA Tournament on 22 occasions and guided the Jackets to the NCAA College World Series in 1994, 2002 and 2006 -- the program's only three berths.
