TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech baseball enters postseason mode when it travels to Charlotte, N.C. to play Florida State and Virginia in Pool D on May 21-22 at Truist Field.
- Tech is coming off a thrilling 11-10 win over No. 10 Florida State on the road, taking just one game of the series.
- Tech's trip to FSU marked the fourth Top-15 RPI/Top-10 KPI road trip the Jackets have taken in ACC play, more than any other team in the conference.
- Despite dropping its final series, Tech finished the year with six ACC series victories, more than any ACC team except division champs Clemson (8) and North Carolina (7).
- Including its neighbors, only Kentucky, Tennessee (8), Texas A&M and Arkansas (7) had more in the SEC as well.
- Tech currently holds 14 wins against Quad 1 and 2 teams to rank Top 25 in the country, as well as holds the No. 29 strength of schedule overall as well.
- Freshman phenom **Drew Burress** continued his terrific season, garnering ACC Freshman of the Year honors after hitting a team-best .379 average, .803 slugging and .508 on-base percentage with 75 hits, 22 homers and 62 RBI.
- Burress is the sixth Yellow Jacket to win the award, joining Matt Wieters ('05), Micah Owings ('03), Mark Teixeira ('99), Nomar Garciaparra ('92) and Jason Varitek ('91).
- Also garnering All-ACC honors was shortstop **Payton Green** and catcher **Matthew Ellis**, who were both named second team.
- The Jackets have continued their hot streak at the plate, hitting .313 and reaching base at a .428 clip.
- Tech played both its pool opponents in the regular season, taking 2-of-3 from Virginia in Charlottesville, while taking the series finale at FSU.

INFELDERS

• The veteran on the team and the lone returning position player from the end of last season, **John Giesler** will be looked after a terrific junior campaign.

• Giesler started the season at third base and looked good at the plate, finishing with three hits on Opening Weekend - two doubles and a triple.

• Giesler returned to the lineup against Boston College after not having played due to injury since Feb. 25 against Cornell.

• As he's looked to regain his footing after missing a chunk of the season, Giesler showed signs at Pitt, hitting his second home run of the season in the crucial rubber match.

• Giesler was once again looking his old self on Tuesday against Georgia Southern (April 10), mashing a go-ahead three-run homer in the sixth to give Tech the win.

• Giesler continues to provide the key hit when Tech needs it, mashing a go-ahead, three-run homer in the sixth to clinch the series against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech.

• He went 2-for-3 with the walk-off run rule of Kennesaw State on April 23.

• Giesler continued his red hot hitting against Miami (Fla.) launching two home runs in the Sunday rout to clinch the series.

• In the last 10 games, Giesler has hit .356 for 16 hits, seven doubles and two homers for 12 RBI.

• Giesler is the second-best returning ACC hitter in conference games by OPS behind Wake Forest's Nick Kurtz.

• Last season, Giesler hit .333 in 47 games and 41 starts, recording 52 hits, 13 doubles, two triples and eight home runs, also driving in 37 runs. He reached base at a .422 clip in 2023.

OFFENSE

- Playing first base Opening Weekend was transfer **Cam Jones** from Georgia State.
- Jones showed why he was a two-way star in the Sun Belt against Ga. Southern (Feb. 20), going 2-for-5 at the plate and getting the win on the mound, pitching the final 3.2 innings scoreless and striking out a career-high eight batters.
- He went 3-for-4 with two RBI on the road at Auburn on April 16.
- Jones was also on fire at then-No. 10 Virginia, recording two hits in each of the three games, including a mammoth grand slam in Game 1.
- Jones was sensational, putting on one of the top two-way performances of the year on Saturday vs. Miami (Fla.), pitching a 9.0 inning complete game, while also hitting 4-for-5 at the plate with two doubles.
- On the season, Jones is hitting .322 with 65 hits, 13 doubles and four home runs.
- In 30 games against the ACC, Jones is hitting .327 with 37 hits, six doubles and two home runs for 19 RBI.
- Jones has been terrific in his last 10 games, hitting .282 for 11 hits, two doubles and a home run for seven RBI.
- Jones had a 18-game hitting streak snapped at then-No. 20 North Carolina, and has hit in 40 of the last 42.
- Jones had his 31-game reached base streak broken on Friday against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech.
- He's also third in the ACC and 26th nationally with 27 stolen bases.
- He was named the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Week after Miami (Fla.) as well as named to the Olerud Award watch list.
- Jones was the 2022 John Olerud Award runner up who was named first-team all-Sun Belt three times with the Panthers.
- For his career in Panthersville, Jones hit .341 with 75 RBI and 106 runs and finished second in program history with 50 career stolen bases.
- On the opposite corner, one of the leading contenders for third base has been true freshman **Ryan Jaros**.
- Jaros started two games against Georgia (March 2-3) and has a .333 average in his limited action. On Sunday at Coolray Field, He went 2-for-4 with a double and two RBI.
- He hit his first home run on Sunday against Boston College - a two-run shot.
- Jaros had his biggest hit of the season on Tuesday against Presbyterian, smacking an RBI single up the middle with two outs to keep the ninth-inning rally alive.
- Jaros has continued to take advantage of his chances, getting the start on Sunday at Pitt (April 7) and going 3-for-4 with two doubles.
- In 25 games and 11 starts, Jaros is hitting a hot .343 with 12 hits, four doubles and a home run.
- Perhaps even more impressive is that he's hit .368 in 10 ACC games, going 7-for-19 with three doubles and a homer.
- Jaros was an all-state New Jersey high school third baseman, displaying terrific defensive skill with a solid offensive package.
- He finished his prep career with 100 career hits in 213 at-bats (three seasons due to Covid-19) and was rated the top third baseman in New Jersey and No. 4 third baseman overall by *Perfect Game*.
- With the injury to Giesler, **Carson Kerce** has come on the scene to be an ultra-important member of the Jackets' infield, starting 18 games at third and the last two at second.
- Kerce went 8-for-11 (.727) against Youngstown State in three starts, rocketing a double with six RBI.
- In 45 games and 32 starts this season, Kerce is hitting .281 with 25 RBI.
- In 29 games against ACC competition, the true freshman is hitting .250 with 21 hits, three doubles and two homers.
- Kerce hit his first two collegiate home runs against then-No. 13 NC State.
- In a weekend where Tech was held relatively quiet offensively at then-No. 20 UNC, Kerce was an outlier, recording four hits and three RBI to raise his average 15 points to a team-best .383.
- Kerce had a pinch-hit two-run double in the fifth on Sunday against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, pulling the Jackets within one run en route to completing the comeback and taking the series.
- Kerce's diving snag at third with bases loaded and two outs on Sunday against then-No. 10 Virginia made SportsCenter's Top 10 as the No. 10 play
- Kerce, a Marietta, Ga. and Pope High School product, was rated as the No. 11 shortstop and No. 37 overall prospect by Perfect Game.
- Kerce helped lead Pope to a state championship in Truist Park in 2022 and was named Cobb County Player of the Year, Region Player of the Year, first-team all-county and first-team all-region in 2023.
- Up the middle, Tech will look to a completely new grouping acquired in the offseason.
- Transfer **Mike Becchetti** will likely hold down second base, coming off a career at Fairfield that featured multiple all-conference selections.
- Becchetti is once again hitting well, hitting .306 with 49 hits, seven doubles and eight home runs for 35 RBI.
- Becchetti hit the go-ahead two-out, two-run double in the eighth inning to give Tech the win over Georgia Southern on Tuesday night (Feb. 20).
- Becchetti had struggled in ACC play, recording just three hits entering then-No. 10 Virginia, but had four hits against the Cavaliers to ignite his swing.
- Becchetti then launched his seventh home run of the season against Kennesaw State on April 23.
- Perhaps the highlight of the season for Becchetti game in Game 2 against then-No. 4 Clemson when he hit a two-out, two-run homer in the top of the ninth to push Tech out front for the eventual win.
- In his last 10 games, Becchetti has led the team, hitting .317 with 13 hits, two doubles, a home run for a .364 on-base percentage.
- Becchetti led the MAAC in fielding percentage as a plus defender and has been graded highly on toughness and his ability to turn double plays.
- In 2023, Becchetti was first-team all-conference and named second team all-region in the northeast, batting .329 with 73 hits, 66 runs scored, 13 home runs and 54 RBI.
- In 2023, Becchetti had a career-high 20-game hitting streak — good for second-longest in Fairfield history.
- Transfer **Payton Green** brings 110 career starts with him at shortstop from NC State.
- Green is currently hitting .326 for 59 hits, 14 doubles, two triples and 12 home runs for 42 RBI.
- In his last 10 games, Green has hit .333 with 12 hits, two doubles and four home runs for 10 RBI.
- Green was sensational in his first weekend on The Flats, earning ACC Player of the Week honors (Feb. 19).
- Green hit a gaudy .636 with seven hits and three home runs for seven RBI to win the award.
- In addition to slugging 1.455, he also drew four walks and failed to strike out for a .733 on-base percentage.
- His first eight plate appearances included six hits and two walks.
- In four games against Youngstown State (March 8-10), Green hit .615 with eight hits, four doubles and one home run for four RBI.
- Against his former team last weekend, then-ranked No. 13 NC State, Green hit .462 with six hits, two doubles and a homer to drive in five runs, striking out just once.
- Against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, Green hit .500 with four hits and three RBI, drawing three walks as well to reach base at a .667 clip.
- Green turned in another strong weekend at then-No. 10 Virginia, hitting .375 for six hits, two doubles and five RBI.
- In 2023 at NC State, he batted .274 with 57 hits, 12 doubles, 10 homers and 45 RBI while also leading the Wolfpack with nine stolen bases.
- Known as #CatcherU, Georgia Tech once again has two dependable catchers behind the dish for the 2023 campaign.

OFFENSE

• Adding in the offseason as a grad transfer, **Matthew Ellis** looks to be the Opening Day starter behind the dish.

• Ellis has been one of the hottest hitters in the ACC lately, hitting .316 on the season with 61 hits, 11 doubles and 16 home runs.

• In his last 10 games, Ellis has slowed, hitting .275 with four home runs and seven RBI, reaching base at a .408 clip.

• In the month of April, Ellis hit .403 with 25 hits, five doubles and eight home runs for a whopping 30 RBI.

• He currently had a 16-game hitting streak and 30-game reached base streak snapped against Miami (Fla.)

• He hit home runs in back-to-back games entering North Carolina, including the two-run, go-ahead homer in the top of the ninth at Georgia State on Tuesday (March 19) to give Tech the win.

• Ellis hit .462 against Youngstown State (March 8-10), recording six hits, a double and a home run for 10 RBI in four games.

• He hit his first home run as a Yellow Jacket to spark a four-run inning on Sunday vs. Georgia at Coolray Field (March 3).

• Ellis breathed life into the Georgia Tech dugout on Tuesday against Presbyterian (April 2), hitting a leadoff home run in the ninth to ignite a three-run rally to force extras before hitting a leadoff double in the 10th, which proved to be the winning run.

• Ellis was once again electric at Pitt, hitting .538 for seven hits, two doubles and two home runs in the three-game series, slugging 1.725.

• Ellis hit by far the furthest home run this season by a Yellow Jacket when his Sunday Pitt blast traveled a ridiculous 484 feet, according to TrackMan data.

• Ellis remained hot against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, hitting .444, including two home runs (including a grand slam) for seven RBI, slugging 1.111.

• He remained hot to mash his second grand slam of the season at Auburn on April 16.

• Ellis earned ACC Player of the Week honors after his performance at then-No. 10 Virginia, when he hit .500 with six hits, one home run and seven RBI.

• Against the Cavs, Ellis struck out just once and walked five times for a .647 on-base percentage.

• Ellis was limited due to injury in his last season at Indiana, but in 2022, the backstop tied Kyle Schwarber's home run record with 18.

• Also getting a chance Opening Weekend is true freshman **Vahn Lackey**.

• Lackey made his first appearance on Opening Day, in a pinch-hit situation, and drove his first collegiate hit out of the park to become the fifth Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his first career plate appearance.

• Lackey then hit his second home run in just his fourth collegiate at-bat against Cornell on Feb. 25.

• Lackey got his first career start against Georgia State (Feb. 27), drawing two walks, throwing out one would-be base thief and back-picking another runner off first.

• Lackey threw out two base thieves against then-No. 10 Virginia.

• Lackey's third home run of his career game in a clutch moment in Game 2 against then-No. 4 Clemson as he belted a solo shot in the top of the ninth to give Tech a two-run lead after Mike Becchetti had hit the go-ahead homer.

OUTFIELDERS

• For the second year in a row, Georgia Tech will debut a completely new-look outfield when compared to last year's opening day lineup.

• The lone familiar face in the outfield will be **Parker Brosius**, who returns for his sophomore season at Tech.

• After a somewhat dormant Opening Weekend performance, Brosius was red-hot on Tuesday night against Georgia Southern (Feb. 20), going 2-for-3 with a key RBI in the eighth inning to cap a four-run, come-from-behind effort and give Tech a 7-4 lead.

• Brosius continued to be red-hot at the plate last weekend against Cornell, recording three hits and drawing six walks (four in one game) in the three-game series.

• Brosius hit first career home run to tie the game 1-1 at Georgia (March 2).

• Brosius was lights-out against Youngstown State (March 8-10), hitting .667 with 10 hits and three doubles to drive home 10 runs.

• He hit his first-career walkoff on April 2 against Presbyterian when he laid down a perfect two-out bunt single to drive in the winning run.

• Brosius broke then-No. 16 Virginia Tech's back in the eighth inning on Sunday when his slash bunt through the 6-hole drove in a much-needed insurance run en route to the series clinch.

• Brosius is now seventh on the team, hitting .302 and is also a perfect 9-for-9 in stolen bases.

• Brosius was a breakout star in the Northwoods League this summer, hitting .292 with a .446 on-base percentage and a gaudy 42 stolen bases.

• In very limited action in 2023, Brosius hit .182 with two hits in 11 at-bats over 30 appearances (often as a pinch runner).

• Also looking to contribute early with be true freshman **Drew Burress**, who is the top prospect to arrive on The Flats and has already been named a preseason freshman all-American by *ProspectsLive*.

• Burress became the first Georgia Tech true freshman to bat leadoff on Opening Day since Kyle Wren led off 2011.

• Burress showed no freshman slump in his collegiate debut, hitting .429 on Opening Weekend with three doubles and three home runs, slugging 1.286.

• Despite only hitting seven home runs in ACC play, Burress has still shown his prowess at the plate, hitting .370 overall with 30 hits, four doubles for 20 RBI.

• Burress etched his name in history on Feb. 27 vs. Georgia State, hitting a school-record four home runs (only swinging four times on the night as a whole).

- Many media outlets have touted him as the favorite or runner-up in the preseason to win ACC Freshman of the Year and have doubled down in the midseason awards by *Perfect Game* and *D1Baseball*.

- Also a threat in the outfield and at the plate is transfer **Trey Yunger**.

- Yunger began the season in left field and was Tech's third-best hitter Opening Weekend, hitting .417 with five hits, six RBI and an inside-the-park home run.

- Yunger's inside-the-park home run was the first by a Yellow Jacket since Austin Wilhite in 2018.

- Yunger then hit 2-for-4 with the game-tying RBI in the eighth inning on Tuesday at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20).

- Yunger sustained a minor upper-body injury after one at-bat against Cornell (Feb. 23) and was day-to-day until returning against Georgia (March 1-3).

- Against Youngstown State (March 8-10), Yunger was moved to leadoff and hit .538 for seven hits, 10 runs and five walks, striking out just once.

- In his first weekend of ACC play against then-No. 13 NC State, Yunger hit .417 for five hits and two home runs for five RBI.

- At Pitt (April 5-7), Yunger was terrific, hitting .429 for six hits, a double and a home run, striking out just twice in 14 at-bats.

- Through 49 games as a Yellow Jacket, he has been Tech's most consistent hitter with a .345 average with 60 hits and five home runs for 29 RBI.

- He's also tied for second on the team, going 12-for-13 in stolen bases.

- In 30 games against the ACC, Yunger is second on the team, hitting .341 for 44 hits, six doubles and four home runs for 19 RBI.

- Yunger brings 178 games and 157 starts of experience from three years at Wofford.

- For his career, he totaled a .329 average with 196 hits, four home runs, 114 RBI, 142 runs scored and 65 stolen bases.

- In 2023, Yunger hit .360 in 58 starts with 81 hits, four homers, 49 RBI and 26 steals.

- Also competing for the outfield or designated hitter spot is transfer **Bobby Zmarzlak**.

- On the season, Zmarzlak is hitting .290 for 31 hits, nine double and three home runs for 29 RBI.

- In 24 ACC games, Zmarzlak has hit .311 for 19 hits, five doubles and a home run for 14 RBI.

- Easily the biggest moment of the season for Tech came when Zmarzlak blasted a go-ahead three-run homer in the eighth to clinch the series over then-No. 13 NC State.

- In two games against then-No. 10 Virginia, Zmarzlak had four hits and a double for four RBI.

- Zmarzlak was lights out against No. 9 Duke, hitting .500 with two doubles.

- At Maryland in 2022, Zmarzlak launched 15 home runs but had strikeout issues. In 2023, the production dipped slightly but the strikeout rate was cut in half.

- In the Maryland single-season record book, Zmarzlak ranks No. 7 in runs (64), No. 14 in home runs (15), No. 17 in at-bats (234) and No. 20 in hit-by-pitch (20).

PITCHING/DEFENSE

- After struggling last year on the mound, Tech brought in new pitching coach **Matt Taylor** as its pitching coach and **Jason Richman** as director of pitching to lead this season.

- Taylor joins the Yellow Jackets after earning an opportunity to be the minor league pitching coordinator for the Atlanta Braves following three years as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at nearby Georgia State.

- In three seasons at Georgia State, Taylor's time in downtown Atlanta culminated in 2022 when he helped coach the Panthers to their first 30-win season in seven years as his staff had a 5.21 ERA (4.67 ERA in Sun Belt Conference play), a program-record 505 strikeouts and 17 saves – good for second-most in program history.

- Richman joins the Yellow Jackets after a three-year stint as the pitching coach at USC Aiken. He helped the Pacers to an 11-year improvement in 2022, reaching the PBC Tournament semifinals after a 20-10 conference season. He tutored multiple all-conference and all-region selections.

- Prior to USC Aiken, Richman was the player development coach at his alma mater, Georgia Southern for three seasons. As a player in Statesboro, Richman was tabbed the 2014 Southern Conference Most Outstanding Player and was the Tom Walter/Pete Frates College Baseball Inspiration Award Winner.

- Despite a lackluster performance last season, one of the biggest storylines in 2023 was the injuries to key pitchers for Georgia Tech, including all three of the weekend rotation.

- In days between appearances, Tech pitchers have missed a combined 140 days from games and practices due to nagging injuries.

- Now with three of those four back and healthy (Finley drafted), Tech is looking for deeper starts and more consistent performances from its arms.

- Thus far, Georgia Tech's starters have been led by **Cam Jones** (6.06 ERA in starts), **Aeden Finateri** (6.12 ERA) and **Tate McKee** (8.14 ERA).

- Tech also averages 9.5 strikeouts per nine inning, ranking fifth in the ACC.

- As with the offense, few teams were as good as Tech was pitching and defending in the month of April.

- Busse earned the Friday night role after being one of the nation's top closers a season ago.

- Unfortunately, Busse had a tough-luck, six-run first inning and has since been moved back to the bullpen.

- In his first relief appearance of the season, Busse was terrific tossing a clean inning in a one-run game.

- Busse was a midseason All-American, but as injuries continued to plague the Jackets, was forced into the starting rotation, which affected his numbers.

- Busse finished 2023 with nine saves, ranking tied for sixth all-time in Georgia Tech single-season history and was the most since Matthew Gorst (2016).

- Finateri got the Saturday start after being one of Tech's top competitors on the mound last season and finishing with the second-best ERA.

- He was sensational in his first start of 2024, carving up Radford's hitters to the tune of 6.0 innings and a career-high eight strikeouts. He allowed just one run and one walk.

- His second start was even better as he carved up a career-high 10 batters -- including six-straight at one point -- to put up a scoreless 5.0 innings.

- Once again, Finateri was outstanding in a pitchers duel against Georgia on March 2. He turned in his second quality start of the season, allowing just one run in 6.0 innings.

- Against Youngstown State (March 9), but still battled to get his third win, surrendering four runs on five hits.

- Finateri had his toughest start against then-No. 20 North Carolina (March 23), allowing three earned runs in 3.2 innings before Tech turned to the bullpen.

- Finateri looked back to form against Boston College, going 5.0 inning and surrendering just a solo home run on two hits, striking out six, despite not getting a decision.

- Finateri was moved up to the Friday starter at Pitt and was terrific, going 5.2 innings with three runs scattered across seven hits for his fourth win of the season.

- Finateri was once again fantastic at then-No. 10 Virginia, working a career-long 6.2 innings, allowing just one earned run, no walks and striking out eight.

- Despite the no decision last outing, Finateri went toe-to-toe with Miami's Gage Ziehl, going a career-long 7.0 innings and allowing just three runs on six hits with five strikeouts (no walks).

- Finateri had his toughest start of the season when seven scored against him in just two innings at then-No. 4 Clemson.

- Finateri kept Georgia Tech in the game against No. 10 Florida State, allowing five runs on five hits in 5.0 innings, exiting the game with the score 5-2.

- Through 14 starts, Finateri has a 6.12 ERA with a 3.95:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranking fourth in the ACC

- Finateri also ranks top-10 in strikeouts per nine (9.98 - 9th).

- Finateri sported a 4.64 ERA over 23 appearances and four starts in 2023, striking out 56 hitters in 50.2 innings.

- As a lower slot righty with a 88-91 mph sinker, Finateri has been dangerous no matter what his role has been.

- Patel took on the Friday start against then-No. 13 NC State and kept the game manageable, allowing just two runs in the first four innings before passing the baton to **Tate McKee**.

- Patel joined Tech after a terrific three seasons at Georgia State, where he recorded a 3.47 career ERA with 60 strikeouts in 59.2 innings and a .247 average against.

- Patel's 2023 season was cut short after just 15.2 innings and three starts due to a season-ending injury.

- Patel had two sun-aided "hits" foil his first start at Georgia Tech as three runs crossed against him in the first three innings.

- In total, three hits went against both Radford and Georgia Tech pitchers on Sunday due to getting lost in the sun.

- Patel got his first win as a Yellow Jacket on Friday in relief, pitching the final 4.1 innings and allowing just two runs on two hits against Youngstown State (March 8).

- Patel was terrific in relief on Sunday at then-No. 10 Virginia, pitching the final 2.2 innings and surrendering just one run on two hits to give Tech the series.

- Patel got his second win of the season in an outstanding final two innings of relief against then-No. 4 Clemson, when he allowing just one hit and struck out three to hold on to the comeback win.

- If healthy, Tech's weapon this season is depth in that multiple pitchers should make cases for starting, whether on weekends or in midweeks.

- Other starters in contention to start the year included **Logan McGuire** and true freshman **Tate McKee**.

PITCHING/DEFENSE

- Tuesday's starter at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20), McGuire had a shaky three-run first inning, but managed to settle in and shut out the Eagles his next three innings, striking out a career-high seven batters.
- McGuire returned to the mound for the first time in 2024 against Georgia Southern, getting his first start since April 11, 2023.
- McGuire moved to the Sunday spot against Georgia, in his first start since Feb. 20.
- McGuire turned in his best career start against UGA, going 5.0 innings and surrendering just two runs (in the fifth), punching out a career-high nine batters and walking none.
- McGuire finally got his first win of the season, despite having good starts the whole season, going 5.0 innings against Youngstown State (March 10) and allowing just one two-run homer.
- McGuire's first ACC start of the season was fantastic, going 5.0 innings of two-hit, one-run ball, striking out five to improve to 2-0 on the year.
- McGuire struggled against then-No. 20 North Carolina, allowing five runs on five hits in 3.0 innings.
- McGuire returned to start on Wednesday against Ga. Southern (April 10), going 2.0 scoreless innings with two strikeouts in the staff day.
- McGuire struggled in his last out at Auburn (April 16), allowing seven runs on five hits in 0.2 innings.
- McGuire re-emerged from the bullpen on May 17 at No. 10 Florida State, tossing 3.1 shutout innings in relief.
- McGuire was very promising to start in 2023, but was shut down and limited to just four starts on the season due to injury.
- McGuire was one of Tech's top pitchers going into the season, but nagging injuries limited his action to the tune of just four starts between Feb. 18 and April 11 before getting shut down the rest of the year.
- McKee made a spot start earlier in the season on the second of a doubleheader, going four scoreless innings in the seven-inning blowout, striking out seven and allowing just two hits.
- McKee was then electric in his first ACC start at Pitt (April 7), allowing just one hit (a solo homer) in five innings, while striking out a career-high nine batters.
- McKee pitched in the Sunday slugfest at then-No. 10 Virginia where a combined 29 runs were scored.
- McKee allowed six runs on five hits in the outing but battled to get to 2.1 innings to set up **Ben King's** middle relief.
- McKee had one of his best starts on Sunday against Miami, going 5.0 innings and punching out nine while surrendering just one hit (a solo home run).
- McKee struggled against then-No. 4 Clemson, giving up six runs on six hits in 3.1 innings for his fourth loss of the season.
- McKee continued his up and down freshman campaign and was electric on Sunday against then-No. 9 Duke, going a career-long 6.1 innings (102 pitches), with just three runs on four hits allowed, two of those in the seventh after he'd come out.
- He also tied his season high with nine strikeouts against the Blue Devils.
- In just his six starts, McKee has a 3-1 record, 7.24 ERA and 39 strikeouts.
- Redshirt freshman RHP **Carson Ballard** got his first career start on Tuesday vs. Georgia State (Feb. 27), where he went 5.0 innings of three-hit, six-strikeout ball, walking none, for his first win.
- His debut came in relief against Radford (Feb. 18), where he pitched 4.0 innings hitless in less than 50 pitches, walking none and striking out two to get his first career save.
- His third start against Northeastern (March 6), broke the zero ERA as he allowed two earned runs in 4.0 innings. He also issued his first two walks of the season.
- His fourth start was his best as he mowed down Mercer hitters on March 12, going 7.0 shutout innings of four-hit work in just 71 pitches.
- Despite struggling some on the overall line, Ballard was once again strong on Tuesday at Georgia State (March 19), allowing two earned runs (four overall) in 4.0 innings, striking out five and walking one.
- Ballard had back-to-back rough starts against Boston College (March 28) and Presbyterian (April 2), going just 1.1 innings in each.
- He closed in the Friday night victory against then-No. 10 Virginia, pitching 1.0 scoreless.
- He pitched 3.0 innings of one-run baseball against then-No. 4 Clemson (Game 1), allowing just four runs while striking out three
- Through six starts and 11 relief appearances, Ballard sports an impressive 3.48 ERA in 33.2 innings of work.
- Making his first start of the season at Pitt, **Cam Jones** performed admirably, going a season-long 4.1 innings and allowing just two runs in the pitchers duel.
- Jones was once again sensational against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, throwing a 7.0-inning complete-game shutout on Saturday, striking out six and walking none.
- Jones' complete-game shutout was Tech's first since 2021.
- Jones would once again shine on Saturday against Miami, going the distance for a second time his season, allowing just four runs and six hits in 9.0 (111 pitches)innings. He also struck out seven and walked none.
- For his effort, he was named John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Week (hitting 4-for-5 the same day) and was officially named to the Olerud Award watch list.
- Jones struggled against then-No. 4 Clemson as well in Game 2, surrendering a season-high five runs on two hits in 4.0 innings of work
- In seven starts, Jones has a 2-1 record and a 6.06 ERA with 21 strikeouts.

RELIEVERS

• Where the Jackets had some success last season was its bullpen, but fatigue set in as it had to cover so many innings due to short starts.

• **Ben King** returns as the veteran stopper of the group after a sensational second season.

• King was once again reliable as he was first out of the bullpen on Friday night, setting the game for 2.0 innings scoreless after six scored in the first against Tech.

• King had two runs cross against him in the third inning before getting relieved.

• King had an inherited run go against him after 0.2 innings on Tuesday at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20) as Tech mixed and matched matchups.

• King pitched 2.2 innings against Cornell (Feb. 25) and worked 2.2 innings of work, striking out five without an earned run against him.

• After a rough start to the season, King has looked much more to form, not allowing a single run in his last four appearances.

• King earned his first career save on April 10 vs. Georgia Southern, pitching 2.0 innings with two runs allowed on tough-luck homer to finish the game.

• King earned his second win of the season, pitching a career-long 4.0 innings on Sunday at then-No. 10 Virginia.

• In his first year back from elbow surgery, King led the Jackets with a 3.73 ERA, 55 strikeouts and 6-2 record on the year.

• In just his relief appearances alone, he recorded a 2.72 ERA with a 6-1 record.

• King has been a total student-athlete for Georgia Tech, leading the Student-Athlete Advisory Board at Tech, graduating undergrad with a 4.0 in pre-med, and earning the ACC's postgraduate scholarship.

• King will begin medical school at Emory in midtown Atlanta after baseball.

• One of Tech's top relievers to start the season was two-way transfer **Cam Jones** from Georgia State.

• A John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year runner-up and three-time first-team all-Sun Belt selection, Jones has impressed on the mound through his first eight appearances, sporting a 5.40 ERA, three saves and 1-1 record -- half of his runs allowed coming on March 30 against Boston College.

• He struck out a career-high eight batters on Tuesday night at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20) to get his first win of the season.

PITCHING/DEFENSE

- Jones got his second save of the season on March 15 against then-No. 13 NC State, pitching a shutdown ninth in 15 pitches to secure the Friday night win for Tech.
- He got his third save of the season on a 1-2-3 ninth at his former school, Georgia State on March 19.
- Jones made his first start of the season at Pitt (April 6) and performed admirably, going a season-long 4.1 innings and allowing just two runs in the pitchers duel.
- McKee has been one of the top freshman arms, working up to 96 in the fall with solid command.
- Before transitioning to the weekend rotation, McKee was a top bullpen arm.
- McKee looked terrific in his first action of his college career, pitching 2.1 innings of work and allowing just one hit.
- McKee's second appearance saw him work six pitches and four strikes for three outs on Feb. 24 vs. Cornell.
- He then tossed two more hitless innings against Georgia State (Feb. 27), striking out four.
- With a four-game set against Youngstown State (March 8-10), McKee got a chance to make his first career start.
- McKee was sensational, getting the win in the seven-inning game with 4.0 innings of two-hit, seven-strikeout work, issuing just one walk.
- McKee then anchored the Friday night game against then-No. 13 NC State, pitching 2.0 innings, allowing just one run on two hits to get his second win of the season.
- McKee had his first tough-luck outing at then-No. 20 North Carolina, surrendering four runs on five hits in 2.2 innings, despite five strikeouts.
- McKee was electric in his first ACC start at Pitt (April 7), allowing just one hit (a solo homer) in five innings, while striking out a career-high nine batters.
- Through 14 appearances and seven starts, McKee has a 6.86 ERA in 40.2 innings of work with 56 strikeouts, 24 walks and just 38 hits (20 of which in three outings).
- McKee was a top-35 right-handed pitcher in the country, according to *Perfect Game* after being a four-year letterwinner at Mount Paran, playing both shortstop and pitcher.
- Another relief arm that Tech will rely on will be transfer **Brett Thomas**.
- In 22 outings, Thomas has worked 27.1 innings and had just 16 earned runs go against him.
- He looked his best retiring all six batters he faced to close the thrilling 8-7 victory against then-No. 13 NC State (March 16) to get his first win of the season.
- Thomas earned his second win of the season of the season on Wednesday vs. Georgia Southern, striking out the side in the lone inning of work.
- Thomas earned his third win against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech on April 14 when he tossed 2.2 innings of three-hit, shutout work.
- Thomas took the extra-innings loss on Saturday at then-No. 10 Virginia, but was terrific, pitching a season-long 4.1 innings of three-hit, one run ball while striking out five.
- Thomas has struggled in each of his two appearances since Virginia, allowing a run and three walks in 0.1 innings against Miami (April 26) and two runs on two hits with one walk at then-No. 4 Clemson (May 3).
- Thomas appeared twice against No. 10 Florida State, tossing a shutout inning on Thursday before getting his fourth win in 1.1 innings in Game 3.
- Thomas is finally healthy after battling several injuries at South Carolina and sat mid-90s with nasty breaking pitches.
- Thomas made just six appearances in 2023 for the Gamecocks due to injury.
- A true freshman to watch will be **Michal Kovala** out of the Czech Republic.
- Kovala pitched in the World Baseball Classic for his home country and was the top European prospect, according to *Perfect Game*.
- Kovala pitched four scoreless to close with a narrow 7-4 lead in a win-or-go-home WBC game against Germany, ending the game by inducing a ground-ball double play from former Big Leaguer Bruce Maxwell.
- His first high-leverage spot came on Friday night against then-No. 13 NC State, where he pitched a strong 2.1 innings and allowed just two hits and a two-out error allowed two unearned runs to go against him.
- Through 13 appearances, Kovala has been one of Tech's most reliable arms, working a 3.31 ERA with six earned runs in 16.1 innings of work.
- Tech will also look to enjoy the services of a healthy **Dawson Brown** this season.
- A veteran arm, Brown had been hampered by nagging injuries all season in 2023, making only 12 appearances after beginning the first seven weeks of the season as the Friday night starter.
- Brown had one of his best appearances of his career when he carved up Presbyterian on Tuesday for his first win of the season, retiring all nine batters he faced to close the game and striking out seven.
- Brown continued his dominance at Pitt, closing twice to help Tech take the series.
- On Friday at Pitt, Brown closed the three-run game with 1.1 hitless innings to get his first save of the season.
- Then on Sunday, Brown appeared again, allowing just one run on three hits with three strikeouts over 2.0 innings to secure the 7-4 win.
- Brown earned his second save of the season on Sunday against then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, throwing 2.1 innings of shutout work (one hit) to slam the door on the Hokies.
- Brown once again worked a win and a save out of then-No. 9 Duke, pitching 2.0 hitless on Friday night for the win before locking up the Blue Devils with 1.1 scoreless to close the 8-6 victory for his third save of the season.
- Moving into the bullpen after two starts has been LHP **Camron Hill**.
- Hill was the Cape Cod Pitcher of the Year in 2023, taking a big jump forward from a spring season that saw his ERA at 7.98.
- Hill worked a quick and efficient 2.0 innings of hitless baseball on Sunday vs. Radford, striking out three.
- Hill's first start of the season came on Friday night against Cornell (Feb. 23), where after a shaky first inning that featured two walks, one hit and a run, he settled in to pitch three more hitless innings and struck out a career-high seven batters.
- Hill was unable to go 5.0 innings against Youngstown State (March 8), going 3.2 innings with three runs on eight hits going against him.
- Hill's first two appearances back out of the bullpen have shown spurts of what he's capable of.
- In 2.0 innings against NC State in the pivotal Saturday game, he got through one inning clean before it began raining hard during his second inning where two runs scored.
- In a dry atmosphere at Georgia State (March 19), he was terrific, tossing a hitless eighth before Tech scored three in the ninth to win the game and give Hill the decision.
- After not pitching for 11 days, Hill returned against Kennesaw State (April 23) in his third start of the year and was sensational.
- He set career highs in length (5.0 innings) and strikeouts (eight), allowing just a solo home run and two hits total, also issuing just one walk.
- He once again showed promise on Tuesday against Auburn, but had three runs cross against him in the fourth hamper his final line.

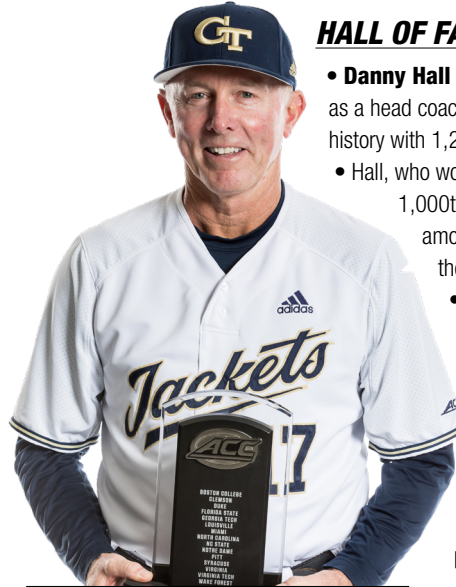

• Hall, who won his 1,300th career game on April 25, 2021 and his 1,000th win at Georgia Tech on March 20, 2018, stands first among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2024 season.

• Prior to the 2024 season, Hall was named to the ABCA Hall of Fame.
