### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech football opens its highly anticipated 2024 season with a mammoth Atlantic Coast Conference matchup versus defending ACC champion and No. 10-ranked Florida State on Saturday in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic at Aviva Stadium in Dublin, Ireland.
- Georgia Tech returns 16 starters from last year's team, which went 7-6 overall, 5-3 in ACC play (good for a tie for fourth place in the 14-team conference standings), earned its first bowl berth since 2018 and its first bowl victory since 2016 with a season-ending 30-17 triumph over UCF in the Gasparilla Bowl.
- The Yellow Jackets' 16 returning starters include eight on offense, led by r-Jr. QB **Haynes King**. A year ago, King put together a historic first season as a Jacket, joining Heisman Trophy winner and eventual No. 2 NFL Draft pick Jayden Daniels as the only Power Five conference players with at least 2,800 passing yards, 25 touchdown passes, 700 rushing yards and touchdown runs in 2023.
- r-Jr. RB **Jamal Haynes** also returns for Tech after becoming Georgia Tech's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2018 with 1,059 yards on the ground last season.
- Georgia Tech also returns four of five starters from an offensive line that helped the Jackets lead the ACC and rank among the top 15 nationally in both rushing offense (203.8 ypg - 12th nationally) and fewest sacks allowed (1.15 pg - 15th nationally).
- Defensively, Tech has a new coordinator in Tyler Santucci. In 2023, Santucci was the defensive coordinator at Duke, which led the ACC in scoring defense (19.0 ppg) and ranked among the nation's top 50 in eight statistical categories, including scoring defense, rushing defense, passing defense, total defense, tackles for loss, third-down defense, fourth-down defense and red-zone defense.

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

**1**  
Georgia Tech P **David Shanahan**, from Castleisland, Co. Kerry, Ireland (about three hours southwest of Dublin), is believed to be the first Irish native ever awarded a full scholarship to play American college football and is playing in an American football game in his home country for the first time.

**2**  
Saturday's game marks the second time that Georgia Tech will open its season with the Aer Lingus College Football Classic at Aviva Stadium. On Sept. 3, 2016, the Yellow Jackets defeated ACC opponent Boston College, 17-14, in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic. Dedrick Mills' 4-yard touchdown run with 35 seconds remaining lifted the Jackets to the victory.

Georgia Tech QB **Haynes King** was one of only two Power Five conference players with at least 2,800 passing yards, 700 rushing yards, 25 touchdown passes and 10 touchdown runs in 2023 (joining Heisman Trophy winner and eventual No. 2 pick in the 2024 NFL Draft Jayden Daniels - LSU).

Georgia Tech is 4-0 in games against nationally ranked ACC opponents since Brent Key took over as the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach four games into the 2022 season (W, 26-21 at No. 24 Pitt on Oct. 1, 2022; W, 21-17 at No. 13/11 North Carolina on Nov. 20, 2022; W, 23-20 at No. 17 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 7, 2023; W, 46-42 vs. No. 17 North Carolina on Oct. 28, 2023).

Georgia Tech travels 3,921 miles from Atlanta to Dublin for this week's game, which is tied with its 2016 Aer Lingus College Football Classic appearance versus Boston College for the second-longest trip in program history. The 3,921-mile journey to Dublin is 569 miles shorter than the 4,490 miles that the Yellow Jackets traveled to Honolulu, Hawai'i for the 1991 Aloha Bowl, where they defeated Stanford, 18-17. However, the 3,921-mile trip to Dublin is nearly four times farther than the Jackets have ever traveled for an ACC game outside of the Aer Lingus College Football Classic. Besides its two conference games in Dublin, Tech's longest trip for an ACC game has been its two conference matchups at Boston College — 1,068 miles separate Atlanta from BC's Chestnut Hill, Mass. campus.

- be its first win in its last four ACC openers, but its 12th win in its last 20 conference openers;
- move it to 20-22 in 42 all-time ACC openers;
- up it to 6-5 when opening the season versus an ACC opponent;
- move it to 2-0 all-time in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic;
- up it to 3-0 all-time when playing outside of the continental United States (2-0 in Dublin; 1-0 in Honolulu, Hawai'i).

**A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...**

- be its fourth-straight season-opening loss and sixth defeat in its last eight season openers;
- be its first loss to a nationally ranked ACC opponent in five matchups under head coach Brent Key;
- drop it to 16-13-1 all-time against Florida State;

**GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY**

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was officially named the 21st head coach in Tech football history on Nov. 29, 2022.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech is 11-10 in Key's 21 games as the head coach at his alma mater, including a 7-6 mark in his first full season at the helm in 2023. The winning season was Tech's first since 2018 and was capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016.

The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina, which moved Georgia Tech to 4-0 against nationally ranked Atlantic Coast Conference opponents in Key's 21 games as head coach. Tech finished 5-3 overall in ACC play in '23, good for a tie for fourth place in the 14-team conference after being picked to finish 12th in the league's preseason poll.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1996-2000.

Prior to being named Georgia Tech's interim head coach on Sept. 26 of this season, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his four seasons at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

After redshirting as a true freshman, Key was a four-year starter at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 46, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

GEORGIA TECH-FLORIDA ST. SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia Tech and Florida State are meeting for the 30th time.
Florida State owns a narrow 15-13-1 edge in the all-time series.

However, Georgia Tech has won two of the last three and four of the last seven games in the series.

Since 2003, the Yellow Jackets have won 4-of-5 regular-season matchups with the Seminoles.

The series has been punctuated by long strings of success for each team. Georgia Tech went 9-0-1 in its first 10 meetings with Florida State from 1903-75 (all 10 games were played in Atlanta).

Saturday's game marks the third time that Georgia Tech and Florida State will meet at a neutral site. FSU won both of the previous neutral-site matchups in the 2012 and 2014 ACC Championship Games in Charlotte, N.C.

A notable tie between the two programs is Georgia Tech assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Chris Weinke. Weinke put together one of the best careers by a quarterback in college football history at Florida State from 1997-2000.

GEORGIA TECH IN IRELAND

For the second time in the last nine seasons, Georgia Tech is opening its season in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic at Aviva Stadium in Dublin, Ireland.

Saturday's game marks only the second time in Georgia Tech's 132-season history that it will play a game on foreign soil.

The Yellow Jackets' first international game also came in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic at Aviva Stadium, when they rallied to defeat Boston College, 17-14, on Sept. 3, 2016.

Trailing 14-7 with under six minutes to play, Tech pulled within four points on a 40-yard field goal by current Kansas City Chiefs place kicker Harrison Butker with 5:57 to go.

True freshman running back Dedrick Mills capped a scored the winning touchdown on a four-yard run with 35 seconds remaining on the clock. On their 11-play, 59-yard game-winning touchdown drive, the Yellow Jackets converted a fourth-and-19 (on a 22-yard pass from QB Justin Thomas to slot back Qua Searcy) and a third-and-10 (on a 26-yard pass from Thomas to WR Ricky Jeune).

Although the Yellow Jackets are crossing the Atlantic Ocean for the second time, it is only tied for the second-longest trip in program history. The longest was 4,490-mile journey to Honolulu, Hawaii for the 1991 Aloha Bowl, where the Jackets defeated Stanford, 18-17. That trip was 569 miles longer than the 3,921-mile trek that Georgia Tech will make for this weekend's game.

However, the 3,921-mile trip to Dublin is nearly four times longer than Georgia Tech has ever traveled for any domestic conference game. The farthest that the Yellow Jackets have ever traveled for a conference game within U.S. borders have been a pair of 1,068-mile trek to Chestnut Hill, Mass. for ACC matchup at Boston College in 2008 and 2020.

• Georgia Tech is 4-3 against ranked opponents under head coach **Brent Key**, including an ultra-impressive 4-0 record against ranked Atlantic Coast Conference competition, with three of the four wins coming on the road (26-21 at No. 24 Pitt - Oct. 1, 2022; 21-17 at No. 13/11 North Carolina - Nov. 19, 2022; 23-20 at No. 17 Miami (Fla.) - Oct. 7, 2023; 46-42 vs. No. 17 North Carolina - Oct. 28, 2023).

• With a pair of wins over nationally ranked teams in each of the last two seasons, the Yellow Jackets have defeated multiple ranked teams in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2008 and 2009.

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1, 2022. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher - L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee - 1972; Pepper Rodgers - L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame - 1974; Bill Curry - L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama - 1980; Mac McWhorter - W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford - 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins - L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson - 2019).

• Tech played the No. 17-ranked team in the *Associated Press* poll three times last season (Sept. 16 at No. 17 Ole Miss, Oct. 7 at No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and Oct. 28 vs. No. 17 North Carolina), which marked only the second time in program history that the Yellow Jackets played three teams in a season with the same AP ranking. In 1959, the Jackets played three teams that were ranked No. 6 in the AP poll — SMU (W, 16-12 on Sept. 26), Clemson (W, 16-6 on Oct. 3) and Georgia (L, 21-14 on Nov. 28).

- Georgia Tech scored at least 21 points in every game last season, marking the first time that it scored 21 points or more in 13-straight games since it hit the mark in 17-straight games from 2014-15 (all 14 games in '14 plus first three contests in '15).

- Georgia Tech scored 30 or more points six times last season after only scoring 30 or more a total of nine times in the previous four seasons (2019-22).

- Tech scored at least 45 points in back-to-back games against No. 17 North Carolina (46 on Oct. 28) and at Virginia (45 on Nov. 4), marking the first time that the Yellow Jackets scored at least 45 points in consecutive games since Sept. 29 and Oct. 5, 2018 vs. Bowling Green (63) and Louisville (66) and the first time the Jackets accomplished the feat in back-to-back ACC games since Oct. 14 and 21, 2000 vs. Wake Forest (52) and Duke (45).

- Georgia Tech rushed for at least 300 yards in consecutive games against No. 17 North Carolina (348 on Oct. 28) and at Virginia (305 on Nov. 4), marking the first time that the Yellow Jackets had at least 300 rushing yards in consecutive games since Oct. 25 and Nov. 3, 2018 at Virginia Tech (465) and North Carolina (461).

- Georgia Tech's 348 rushing yards against No. 17 North Carolina (Oct. 28) were its most since it had 377 yards on the ground against Duke on Nov. 28, 2020.

- Tech had a whopping 246 rushing yards in the fourth quarter of its win over No. 17 North Carolina (Oct. 28). The 246 rushing yards in the final period alone against UNC were more than the Yellow Jackets had in eight of their other 12 games last season.

• The Yellow Jackets' 28 pass completions at No. 17 Ole Miss (Sept. 16) were tied for the fifth-most in a game in school history and were the most since it completed 30 passes against Maryland on Oct. 17, 2002.

• The Jackets' 28 completions at Ole Miss were the fourth-most in school history in a game that they did not throw an interception (also the most since 2002 at Maryland).

• Twice last season, Georgia Tech completed passes to 10 different receivers in a game (Sept. 16 at Ole Miss and Nov. 4 at Virginia).

• After ranking 121st nationally in third-down conversion percentage in 2022 (.306), Tech ranked 39th nationally with a .431 third-down conversion percentage last season (72-for-167).

• Georgia Tech's 11 third-down conversions (11-of-20) at Ole Miss (Sept. 16) tied for the 16th-most in school history and were the Yellow Jackets' most in a game since they had 13 (13-of-18) against Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2017.

• Buoyed by two of its 11 third-down conversions, Georgia Tech put together a 17-play 90-yard drive in the second quarter against Ole Miss, which resulted in a 22-yard field goal. The possession was Tech's longest scoring drive in terms of plays since a 17-play, 74-yard drive that resulted in a 21-yard field goal in a 33-7 win over North Carolina on Sept. 30, 2017.

• The Yellow Jackets held opponents without a sack five times last season (Sept. 9 vs. S.C. State, Sept. 23 at Wake Forest and Oct. 21 vs. Boston College, Oct. 28 against No. 17 North Carolina and Dec. 22 vs. UCF) and has accomplished the feat seven times over its last 23 games. Prior to holding seven of its last 24 opponents without a sack, the Jackets had surrendered at least one sack in 19-straight games, dating back to 2020.

• The most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense is its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has had an average of just 1.1 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 2.0 turnovers per game in losses.

• Georgia Tech's offense is guided by second-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulker**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia (2020-22).

• Faulker boasts 19 years of experience on college football staffs, including 11 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18) and Southern Miss (2019).

• King made a record-breaking debut in the White and Gold, throwing for 313 yards and three touchdowns on 19-of-32 passing in the season opener against Louisville (Sept. 1).

• King's 313 passing yards against Louisville marked the first time that a Georgia Tech player ever threw for 300 yards in his GT debut.

• King also ran for a team-high 53 yards on 10 carries against Louisville, giving him 366 yards of total offense.

- In his Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field debut against South Carolina State (Sept. 9), King completed 21-of-29 passes for 290 yards and four touchdowns.

- King ran for career-high 150 yards vs. Boston College (Oct. 21). His 150 rushing yards were the most by a Tech quarterback since Tobias Oliver ran for 215 yards at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2018.

- Georgia Tech has the luxury of having two quarterbacks that have started and won college football games, as King is backed up by r-So. **Zach Pyron**.

- Pyron amassed an impressive 692 yards of total offense (565 passing, 127 rushing) and five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in just three games as a true freshman in 2022.

- Pyron made his collegiate debut at Florida State on Oct. 29, 2022, coming off the bench to complete 18-of-28 passes for 198 yards without an interception and account for two touchdowns (one passing, one rushing).

- Pyron made his first-career start in his second-career game at Virginia Tech on Nov. 5, 2022 and accounted for 319 yards of offense (253 passing, 66 rushing) and two fourth-quarter touchdowns (one passing, one rushing) to lead the Yellow Jackets back from a 27-16 fourth-quarter deficit to a 28-27 win.

- Trailing 27-16 with less than 10 minutes to go in last season's game at VT, Pyron engineered two-consecutive touchdown drives of 90 and 73 yards to give Georgia Tech a 28-27 lead. He capped the fourth-quarter scoring drives with a 56-yard touchdown pass with 9:02 to go and what proved to be the game-winning 9-yard touchdown run with 3:30 left on the clock.

- Pyron led Georgia Tech's offense to a season-high 463 yards in the 2022 win at VT.

- In his first three full halves of action in 2022, Pyron led Tech to three of its four-highest single-half yardage totals of the season against FBS competition — 240 in second half vs. Florida State (Oct. 29), 234 in first half vs. Virginia Tech (Nov. 5) and 229 in second half vs. VT (the only other half that cracked Tech's top four against FBS opponents in 2022 was its 231-yard output in the second half at UCF on Sept. 24).

**RUNNING BACKS**

- Georgia Tech returns one of the nation's top running backs in r-Jr. **Jamal Haynes**.

- Haynes, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the 2023 offseason, earned third-team all-ACC recognition at RB in his first season at the position. He was also an honorable mention all-ACC selection as an all-purpose performer.

- Haynes ran for 1,059 yards in 2023, becoming Georgia Tech's first 1,000-yard rusher since QB TaQuon Marshall (1,146 yds.) and RB KirVonte Benson (1,053 yds.) both reached the 1,000-yard plateau in 2017.

- Haynes' 1,059 rushing yards last season were the 15th-most in Georgia Tech single-season history.

- Haynes totaled 1,257 all-purpose yards last season (1,059 rushing, 151 receiving, 47 kickoff return).

- Haynes finished last season ranked in the top 10 in the ACC in four statistical categories.

- Haynes closed the season with the best performance of his career, rushing for a career-high 128 yards on just 18 carries (7.1 avg.) en route to being named MVP of the Yellow Jackets' 30-17 win over UCF in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bow (Dec. 22).

- In all, Haynes rushed for 100 yards in a game four times last season (113 vs. South Carolina State on Sept. 9, 119 at Virginia on Nov. 4, 104 at Clemson on Nov. 11 and 128 vs. UCF). His four 100-yard rushing games were the most by a Yellow Jacket in a single-season since QB Tobias Oliver had four 100-yard rushing games in 2018 and the most by a Tech RB since KirVonte Benson had five 100-yard games in 2017.

- Haynes has scored eight touchdowns last season (seven rushing, one receiving), which were the most by a Georgia Tech RB since Dedrick Mills scored 13 in 2016.

- Haynes had a touchdown run in four-consecutive games last season — 4 yards at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 7, 16 yards vs. Boston College on Oct. 21, 4 yards vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28, 43 yards at Virginia on Nov. 4. He became the first Yellow Jacket with a rushing touchdown in four-consecutive games since Jerry Howard ran for touchdowns in four-straight contests from Sept. 29-Oct. 25, 2018 (vs. Bowling Green, at Louisville, vs. Duke, at Virginia Tech).

- **Trey Cooley** made an instant impact last season, his first at Georgia Tech after transferring from Louisville. Cooley totaled 386 yards from scrimmage (274 rushing, 112 receiving) and four touchdowns (three rushing, one receiving) in 10 games last season.

- With a total of four touchdowns in his first two games of the season (two on Sept. 1 vs. Louisville, two on Sept. 9 vs. South Carolina State), Cooley became the first Yellow Jacket to score four touchdowns in a two-game span since quarterbacks TaQuon Marshall and Tobias Oliver scored four touchdowns apiece over a two-game span in 2018 against Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville (Oct. 5).

- Cooley was the first Tech running back to score four touchdowns in a two-game span since 2016, when Dedrick Mills scored one against Clemson (Sept. 22) and three against Miami (Oct. 1).

- Cooley needs just 17 rushing yards to reach the 1,000-yard rushing plateau for his collegiate career, which includes two seasons at Louisville (2021-22).

- Rutherford was the only player on the team that caught at least once pass in all 13 games last season.

- Sr. **Christian Leary** ranked third on the team with 25 receptions and fourth on the squad with 309 receiving yards last season.

- Leary caught at least once pass in each of the first 11 games of the season before being held without a reception in the regular-season finale versus No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 25) and Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl vs. UCF (Dec. 22).

- After hauling in 10 touchdown receptions from 2020-22 at Duquesne (including nine in 2022), r-Sr. **Abdul Janneh Jr.** caught a touchdown pass in two of his first four games at Georgia Tech last season — a 33-yarder at Wake Forest (Sept. 23) and a 16-yarder against Bowling Green (Sept. 30).

- Janneh's 12 collegiate touchdown receptions are tops among all Yellow Jackets.

**TIGHT ENDS**

- Sr. **Avery Boyd** has settled in the tight ends room after spending much of his first four seasons as a Yellow Jacket at wide receiver.

- The 6-foot-3, 240-pound Boyd is listed atop the depth chart at tight end for Georgia Tech, alongside r-Sr. **Jackson Hawes**, a transfer from Yale.

- After not catching a pass over the first 17 games of his collegiate career, Boyd broke out over his 18th- and 19th-career games last season with his first two receptions — a 14-yard touchdown at Ole Miss (Sept. 16) and a career-long 31-yard catch at Wake Forest (Sept. 23).

- Boyd hauled in his second touchdown of the season and his career with a 19-yard TD catch versus Boston College (Oct. 21).

- In all, Boyd has at least one reception in six of the last 11 games after not hauling in a pass over the first 17 games of his career.

- Hawes recorded 35 receptions for 371 yards and six touchdowns over four seasons at Yale, including nine catches for 97 yards and a score in 2023.

- Hawes is one of three transfers that are new to Georgia Tech's tight ends room in 2024. He is joined by r-Jr. **Josh Beetham** (Michigan) and r-Sr. **Ryland Goede** (Mississippi State).

- r-Sr. **Brett Seither**, who saw action in 27 games at Georgia from 2019-22, caught four touchdown passes in 12 games in his first season as a Yellow Jacket in 2023.

- Four of Seither's seven total receptions last season were touchdowns. His four TD receptions were tied for third in the ACC and 25th nationally among tight ends in 2023.

- Seither had his best game as a Yellow Jacket against No. 17 North Carolina (Oct. 28), hauling in two receptions — both touchdowns — for 40 yards.

- Seither's 35-yard touchdown catch on a fourth-and-two play in the second quarter against UNC was the second-longest reception of the season by a Georgia Tech TE (behind only Luke Benson's 38-yard reception at Wake Forest on Sept. 23).

- Seither's 5-yard touchdown catch on third-and-goal with 4:28 to go in the game proved to be the game-winner in the Yellow Jackets' 46-42 win over the 17th-ranked Tar Heels.

- In his Georgia Tech debut versus Louisville (Sept. 1), Seither caught a 2-yard touchdown pass. His touchdown reception was the first by a Tech tight end since Dylan Deveney caught an 18-yard touchdown pass against Pitt on Dec. 10, 2020.

- Seither hauled in his second touchdown in as many receptions as a Yellow Jacket with an 8-yard TD catch against S.C. State (Sept. 9).

- Seither's only non-touchdown catches of the season were on a 16-yard reception at No. 17 Ole Miss (Sept. 16), a 7-yard catch at Virginia (Nov. 4) and a 28-yard reception versus No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 25).

- Following the Ole Miss game, Seither went four games without a reception before the two-touchdown day versus UNC.

- Seither became the first Georgia Tech tight end with multiple touchdowns in a season since Jonh Paul Foschi caught two touchdown passes in 2003 and the first Tech TE with multiple TD catches in a game since at least 2000.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

• Georgia Tech returns four starters and five significant contributors from an offensive line that paved the way for the Yellow Jackets to lead the ACC and rank among the top 15 nationally in both rushing offense (203.8 ypg - 12th nationally) and fewest sacks allowed (1.15/gm - 15th nationally) in 2023.

• Georgia Tech's offensive line surrendered just 15 sacks as a unit last season and was one of the nation's most improved offensive fronts in terms of sacks allowed.

• Georgia Tech surrendered one sack or less in 9-of-13 games last season, including six times in the last eight contests.

• The Yellow Jackets held opponents without a sack five times last season (Sept. 9 vs. S.C. State, Sept. 23 at Wake Forest and Oct. 21 vs. Boston College, Oct. 28 against No. 17 North Carolina and in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl vs. UCF on Dec. 22) and has not surrendered a sack seven times in its last 24 games overall.

• Prior to holding seven of its last 24 opponents without a sack, the Jackets had surrendered at least one sack in 19-straight games, dating back to 2020.

• In addition to not allowing a sack vs. No. 17 North Carolina (Oct. 28), Georgia Tech's offensive front paved the way for the Yellow Jackets to rush for 348 yards, its highest single-game rushing total since they had 377 yards on the ground against Duke on Nov. 28, 2020.

• A whopping 246 of Tech's 348 rushing yards against UNC came in the fourth quarter. The 246 rushing yards in the final period alone were more than the Yellow Jackets recorded in five of their previous seven full games this season (they only had more total rushing yards against South Carolina State (268 - Sept. 9) and Boston College (248 - Oct. 21)).

• Georgia Tech's offensive front followed up the 348-yard rushing performance against UNC by paving the way for the Yellow Jackets to rush for 305 yards and five touchdowns at Virginia (Nov. 4).

• Tech's back-to-back 300-yard rushing games at UNC and UVA marked the first time that the Yellow Jackets had at least 300 rushing yards in consecutive games since Oct. 25 and Nov. 3, 2018 at Virginia Tech (465) and North Carolina (461).

• Tech's five touchdown runs at UVA marked only the second time since the beginning of the 2019 season that the Yellow Jackets scored five or more rushing touchdowns in a game (prev. 5 vs. Western Carolina, 2022).

• One of Georgia Tech's most experienced overall positions, the offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2024 roster have combined for 179 collegiate games played and 128 career starts.

• r-Jr. LG **Joe Fusile** — an honorable mention all-ACC selection alongside Sr. RT **Jordan Williams** last season — was Georgia Tech's top run blocker (66.8 grade) and top lineman in overall offensive grade (69.2) and ranked seventh among ACC guards in both categories in 2023 according to *Pro Football Focus*.

• Sr. C **Weston Franklin** the Yellow Jackets' No. 2-rated pass blocker (71.3 grade) and run blocker (65.4), and ranked second among Tech's offensive lineman in overall offensive grade (68.2) in 2023, according to PFF.

**DEFENSE**

**TEAM**

- Georgia Tech's defense is under the tutelage of new defensive coordinator **Tyler Santucci**.
- Last season, Santucci served as the defensive coordinator at Duke, leading the Blue Devils to the top of the ACC in scoring defense (19.0 ppg — 16th nationally). Santucci's Duke defense also ranked among the nation's top 50 in rushing defense, passing defense, total defense, tackles for loss, third-down defense, fourth-down defense and red-zone defense in 2023.
- Last season, Georgia Tech's defense ranked among the top 20 nationally in all three turnover categories — fumble recoveries, interceptions and total takeaways.

- The Yellow Jackets forced a whopping 10 turnovers during a three-game stretch from Sept. 23-Oct. 7, thanks to five takeaways apiece at Wake Forest (Sept. 23) and Miami (Fla.) (Oct. 7).
- Tech's 10 takeaways in that three-game stretch marked the second time in two seasons that it forced 10 turnovers over a three-game span. The Jackets also forced a total of 10 turnovers vs. Virginia (4 - Oct. 20), at Florida State (2 - Oct. 29) and at Virginia Tech (4 - Nov. 5) in 2022.
- Prior to accomplishing the feat twice in the past two seasons, Georgia Tech had not forced 10 turnovers in a three-game stretch since 2014, when it totaled 11 takeaways at Pitt (6 - Oct. 25), vs. Virginia (2 - Nov. 1) and at NC State (3 - Nov. 8).
- The Yellow Jackets forced 10 turnovers in three games just eight times since 2000 (2023, 2022, 2014, 2009, 2008 - twice, 2005 and 2002).
- Georgia Tech's five takeaways against Wake Forest and Miami marked only the eighth and ninth times since 2000 that the Yellow Jackets have forced as many as five turnovers in a single game.
- Prior to last season, Tech had not forced as many as five turnovers in a game since it also forced five turnovers in a 56-33 win over Duke in 2020 (Nov. 28) and hadn't done it in a road game since it forced six in a 56-28 win at Pitt in 2014 (Oct. 25).
- The Yellow Jackets forced as many as five turnovers in a game twice in one season for the first time since 1996 (5 vs. Virginia - Oct. 5, 1996 and 5 vs. UCF - Oct. 26, 1996).
- Georgia Tech was 6-1 last season when it forced multiple turnovers in a game, with the lone loss coming in the regular-season finale against No. 1 Georgia, when the Yellow Jackets had two takeaways, but lost, 31-23.
- As one of the nation's leaders in takeaways (t-9th - 25) last season, Georgia Tech is picking up right where it left off in 2022, when it finished tied for seventh nationally with 24 forced turnovers.
- Becoming one of the nation's best teams in forcing turnovers over the past two seasons is particularly noteworthy for Georgia Tech, which finished 102nd nationally with only 13 takeaways in 12 games just four seasons ago (2020).

- Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 2.9 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 1.0 takeaways per game in losses.
- Tech has finished among the top 25 nationally in fumble recoveries four-straight seasons — No. 2 nationally with 12 in 2020, tied for 16th with 10 in 2021, tied for seventh with 13 in 2022, and tied for seventh with 11 in 2023.
- Since 2019, no team in the country has had more fumble recoveries than the Yellow Jackets' 55.

- Georgia Tech's defense turned in perhaps its finest performance of last season in limiting Syracuse to 259 yards of total offense in thee Yellow Jackets' postseason-clinching 31-22 victory on Nov. 18.
- Syracuse's 259 yards were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech in a game since Alcorn State managed just 146 yards against the Yellow Jackets on Sept. 1, 2018, and were the fewest that Tech has surrendered against an FBS opponent since it limited Virginia Tech to 258 on Nov. 11, 2017.
- Georgia Tech not only forced five turnovers, but held No. 17 Miami (Fla.) to its second-lowest point total (20) of the season in its 23-20 win over the Hurricanes on Oct. 7 of last season.
- Georgia Tech had eight sacks last season at Wake Forest (Sept. 23), which was tied for the fifth-most in Tech history.

- Despite not moving into the starting lineup until midway through the season, r-So. LB **Kyle Efford** led Georgia Tech with 81 tackles in 2023, 12 more than any other player on the squad.
- Efford became the first freshman to lead Georgia Tech in tackles since Darryl Smith tied for the team lead as a freshman in 1999 before going on to a 12-year NFL career with the Jacksonville Jaguars and Baltimore Ravens.
- Efford was the first Tech freshman to lead the team in tackles outright since Richardo Wimbush (91) in 1999.
- Efford led Georgia Tech with an all-conference level 80.8 tackling grade from *Pro Football Focus* last season (min. 300 defensive snaps). Thanks to his tackling prowess, his 72.3 run defense grade ranked third on the squad in '23.
- Two returning Georgia Tech defensive backs — r-Jr. **Ahmari Harvey** and Jr. **Clayton Powell-Lee** — own the top 2023 PFF grades among the Yellow Jackets' returners this season.
- Harvey's 74.3 overall PFF grade in 2023 is tops among Tech's returners this season, as is his 75.9 pass coverage grade.
- Powell-Lee came in just behind Harvey with a 74.2 overall PFF grade in 2023, which included a team-best 76.4 run defense grade.
- Sr. DB **LaMiles Brooks** matched a career high with nine tackles three times in the last 11 games of last season — Sept. 16 at No. 17/19 Ole Miss, Sept. 30 vs. Bowling Green and Oct. 28 vs. No. 17 North Carolina (prev.: vs. Virginia — Oct. 20, 2022).
- Powell-Lee and Brooks are among five Yellow Jackets in the last 21 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same game (Charlie Thomas — Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, Brooks — Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech — Nov. 5, 2022, Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).
- Prior to five Tech players recording an interception and a fumble recovery in the last 21 games, only two other Yellow Jackets had accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy — Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling — Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).
- A fifth-year senior from Ruisbroek, Belgium, **Sylvain Yondjoeun** enters this season as one of the oldest players in college football at 26 years of age.
- Born on June 21, 1998, Yondjoeun is the second-oldest player in the ACC, the fourth-oldest defensive lineman in the nation and the 17th-oldest player in NCAA Division I FBS.

• PK **Aidan Birr** — an honorable mention freshman all-America selection by *College Football News* — established himself as one of the nation's top place kickers as a redshirt freshman in 2023.

• Birr, who missed the entire 2022 campaign after sustaining a knee injury while still in high school in Kennedale, Texas (Kennedale H.S.), made 17-of-19 field goals as a redshirt freshman in 2023, good for a .895 percentage

• Birr's .895 field-goal percentage was the second-highest in Georgia Tech single-season history (behind only former teammate Gavin Stewart's .923 in 2022), the highest by a freshman in Tech history, the ninth-best in the nation in 2023 and the third-best among freshmen nationally last season.

• Birr led Georgia Tech with 88 points last season, which were the sixth-most kicking points in Georgia Tech single-season history and the most ever by a Tech freshman.

• Birr's 17 field goals made tied for the fourth-most in Georgia Tech single-season history and were the most ever by a Tech freshman.

• Birr was also tied for fourth nationally among freshmen in field goals made per game (1.42) in 2023.

• Seven of Birr's 17 field goals last season came from 40 yards or more, which were the most field goals of 40-plus yards by a Yellow Jacket since three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker (Kansas City Chiefs) made eight field goals from 40 yards or more as a senior at Tech in 2016

• In addition to being 17-for-19 on field-goal attempts, Birr was also 37-for-38 on PAT attempts this season (his only miss coming on an errant snap).

• Birr made his collegiate debut in the second half of the Yellow Jackets' second game of the season (South Carolina State - Sept. 9) and has remained as the Jackets' primary place kicker since.

• Birr was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goal attempts in Georgia Tech's 30-16 win at Wake Forest (Sept. 30), connecting from 25, 27 and 48.

• Birr's 48-yard field goal in the second quarter against Wake Forest was the longest by a Yellow Jacket since Wesley Wells' 48-yarder vs. Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018.

• Much like his 48-yarder at Wake Forest, Birr made a crucial 40-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against No. 17 North Carolina (Oct. 28) to pull Tech within four points at halftime (28-24) of its eventual 46-42 victory.

• Birr capped his spectacular redshirt-freshman season by going 3-for-3 with 36-, 29- and 38-yard field goals in the Yellow Jackets' 30-17 win over UCF in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl (Dec. 22).

• The Yellow Jackets averaged 11.08 yards per punt return last season, which was good for fourth in the ACC and 42nd nationally.

• Tech's national punt return ranking has been in the top 50 each of the past two seasons after the Jackets finished last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns in 2021. In 2022, the Yellow Jackets ranked 39th nationally in punt return average (9.33 avg.).

• Sr. **Christian Leary** ranked fifth in the ACC and 36th nationally with a 22.0-yard kickoff return average last season.

• Sr. P **David Shanahan** — a native of Ireland — averaged 42.8 yards per punt last season, which would have ranked 41st nationally but due to the proficiency of Tech's offense, he fell short of the 3.6 attempts needed per game to qualify for the official NCAA and ACC rankings.

• 10 of Shanahan's 45 punts traveled 50-plus yards (22.2%), 14 pinned the opponent inside the 20-yard line (31.1%) and 17 were fair caught (37.8%) last season.

• Shanahan, who hails from Castleisland in County Kerry, about three hours southwest of Dublin, is believed to be the first Ireland native ever awarded a full scholarship to play American college football.

• Georgia Tech lived up to its reputation as one of the most effective kick-blocking units in the nation last season with four blocks in 13 games (a PAT, a punt and two field goals).

• The Yellow Jackets tied for No. 2 nationally and led the ACC and with four blocked kicks last season. They were one of only nine NCAA Division I FBS teams that blocked as many as four kicks in 2023.

• Facing a daunting schedule is nothing new for Georgia Tech, as its 2021 schedule was the nation's toughest and its 2022 slate ranked sixth, based on opponents' final winning percentage.

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the last three-plus seasons. In their 18 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in 13-of-18 games and are plus-31 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 18 of its 30 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-27 overall in turnover margin in those 30 losses.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were plus-11 in turnover margin in their seven wins and minus-seven in their six defeats.

• Georgia Tech was one of the ACC's least-penalized teams last season, ranking third in the conference in fewest penalties per game (5.17) and fourth in fewest penalty yards per game (45.58).

• The Yellow Jackets rank 21st in FBS history in all-time wins.
