## FSU HEADS TO DUBLIN FOR FIRST INTERNATIONAL GAME

## NOTES TO KNOW

- » Florida State will play the first international game in program history when it faces Georgia Tech in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic at Aviva Stadium in Dublin, Ireland, on Saturday.
- » The game matches the earliest in program history for the Seminoles. FSU also played on August 24, 2002, in the Eddie Robinson Classic vs. Iowa State at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City.
- » Florida State, the defending ACC champions, topped the 2024 ACC preseason poll voted on by media at ACC Kickoff. FSU's 16 ACC championships and 10 undefeated ACC seasons since joining the league in 1992 are both tops in the conference in that span.
- » Florida State is 23-4 over the past two seasons. The team's 23 total wins and 85.2 winning percentage since the start of the 2022 season are the best in the ACC and 4th among all programs in the country.
- » The Seminoles, who won 10 games in 2022 and 13 games in 2023, are the only team in the ACC and one of just 12 nationally to reach double-digit wins in 2022 and 2023.
- » Florida State has won 12 consecutive conference games, the 3rd-longest active conference win streak in the nation. FSU ranks 5th in the country in active home (9) and road (7) win streaks as well.
- » Florida State returns 73 players from last year's ACC championship team, a total that includes nine All-ACC honorees, two All-Americans, two national award semifinalists and the ACC Championship Game MVP.
- » FSU returns all 11 on-field coaches from last season, the second time in Mike Norvell's FSU tenure his coaching staff remained intact across multiple seasons. Eight of Norvell's 10 assistant coaches have been with the program since his first season in 2020.
- » Florida State added transfer DJ Uiagalelei and two freshmen signal-callers to a quarterback room that includes Brock Glenn, who became the first quarterback to make his first collegiate start in a P5 conference championship game when he led FSU to a victory over No. 14 Louisville.
- » Uiagalelei has played in 48 games and boasts a 30-10 record as a starting quarterback. He has passed for 8,319 yards and 57 touchdowns while adding 1,132 yards and 21 touchdowns on the ground.
- » ACC Championship Game MVP Lawrence Toafili leads a deep running back room that includes All-American transfer Jaylin Lucas and Alabama transfer Roydell Williams. Toafili rushed for a career-high 118 yards and the go-ahead touchdown in last season's ACC Championship Game.
- » Florida State's offensive line boasts 345 collegiate games played with 210 starts. The group includes returning first-team All-ACC offensive tackle Darius Washington, all-conference center Maurice Smith and starting tackle Jeremiah Byers from last year's group that blocked for the ACC's highest-scoring offense for the second straight year.
- » FSU returns all-conference defensive backs Shyheim Brown and Fentrell Cypress II along with lineup regulars Azareye'h Thomas and Conrad Hussey from last season's defense that led the country in opponent completion percentage (48.3), pass breakups (80), passes defended (90) and passes defended per game (6.43).
- » The Seminoles return one of the best special teams duos in the country in 2024 with Ray Guy finalist Alex Mastromanno and Lou Groza Award semifinalist Ryan Fitzgerald. Both players enter their fifth season as FSU specialists.

FSU head coach Mike Norvell will hold his weekly press conference on Mondays during the season. PHOTO MUST BE IN COLOR AND PROVIDE A CLEAR VIEW OF YOUR FACE. Requests for the home opener should be made at least two weeks prior to the first game. XOS VIDEO SERVICES

The Florida State Public Relations Office has partnered with XOS Digital in order to provide over-the-air television stations with instantaneous access to video content. - » 8th coach to win both in 38 seasons since Bryant was established in 1986 and 2nd in last 20 years
- » ACC & AFCA Region I Coach of the Year
- » Finalist for Eddie Robinson & George Munger Coach of the Year awards
- » Led FSU to 16th ACC title and 5th ACC Championship Game victory with 16-6 win over No. 14 Louisville

**NOLES RETURN TO COLLEGE GAMEDAY FOR AER LINGUS CLASSIC**

- » Florida State opens the season in Dublin, Ireland against Georgia Tech in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic.
- » The Aer Lingus College Football Classic will be *College GameDay's* first show from outside of the country. Florida State was part of the inaugural *College GameDay* road show when it traveled to Notre Dame on Nov. 13, 1993 for the "Game of the Century".
- » FSU won its only other *GameDay* matchup against Georgia Tech, a 34-7 win in 1998.
- » The Seminoles and Yellow Jackets have met 27 times prior, most recently in 2022, a 41-16 FSU win in Tallahassee. FSU is 2-0 in neutral-site games vs. Georgia Tech, wins in Charlotte for the ACC Championship in 2012 and 2014.
- » Saturday's game will be FSU's first outside the United States and matches Florida State's earliest game in program history (Iowa State, 2002).
- » Florida State is 9-1 all-time in neutral-site openers and 19-12 in ACC openers. The only season-opening ACC game at a neutral site for Florida State was a 70-26 win over Duke in Orlando in 1995.
- » The Seminoles are No. 10 in the AP and Coaches polls to open the season. FSU is 13-6 all-time when ranked No. 10 in the AP poll, with three consecutive wins, most recently against Michigan in the 2016 Orange Bowl.

**LAST TIME OUT VS. GEORGIA TECH**

- » Florida State and Georgia Tech last played in 2022, a 41-16 FSU win in Doak Campbell Stadium. QB Jordan Travis threw for a then-career high 396 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions, the third-most yards for an FSU QB against the Yellow Jackets.
- » Receiver Johnny Wilson caught three passes for 111 yards and a touchdown.
- » Among the returning players, running back Lawrance Toafili had 70 rushing yards and a touchdown and caught five passes for 84 yards and a touchdown; Ja'Khi Douglas caught four passes for 63 yards and a touchdown; and kicker Ryan Fitzgerald was 2-for-2 on field goals and connected on all five PATs.
- » The win was FSU's first of 19 consecutive victories spanning the 2022 and 2023 seasons, the 2nd-longest winning streak in FSU history and 3rd-longest in ACC history.

**ACTIVE STREAKS**

- » FSU has been ranked in the AP Top 10 for 17 consecutive weeks, the 4th-longest top-10 streak in the nation. The current streak of top-10 appearances is tied for the 6th longest in program history.
- » Florida State has won 12 consecutive games vs. ACC opponents, the 3rd-longest active streak in the country, behind Michigan (25) and Washington (16).
- » FSU is 5th nationally with a nine-game active home win streak and 5th with a seven-game road win streak.

**QUARTERBACKS**

- » Florida State added three signal-callers to its quarterbacks room after ACC Player of the Year Jordan Travis completed his eligibility, bringing in true freshmen Luke Kromenhoek and Trevor Jackson as well as fifth-year transfer DJ Uiagalelei.
- » That trio joins redshirt freshman Brock Glenn, who started FSU's ACC Championship Game victory and the Orange Bowl, redshirt sophomore Dylan McNamara and redshirt freshman Michael Grant under the watch of quarterbacks coach Tony Tokarz.
- » Uiagalelei, rated as the No. 1 pocket passer in the Class of 2020 out of St. John Bosco High School, brings 48 games of collegiate experience and a 30-10 record as a starting quarterback to Tallahassee. Uiagalelei has passed for 8,319 yards and 57 touchdowns while adding 1,132 yards and 21 touchdowns on the ground during the first four years of his collegiate career.
- » As a true freshman at Clemson, Uiagalelei broke the record for most passing yards by a Notre Dame opponent after totaling 439 yards on 29 completions at the 4th-ranked Fighting Irish. He left the Tigers ranked in the top-10 in program history for career completions, passing touchdowns, quarterback rushing touchdowns, passing yards and wins as a starting quarterback.
- » Uiagalelei is one of three active players nationally with at least 9,000 passing yards and 1,100 rushing yards.
- » Glenn became the first player to make his first collegiate start in a P5 conference championship game in records dating back 20 seasons when he led Florida State to a victory over No. 14 Louisville to secure the Seminoles' 16th ACC championship and a berth in the Orange Bowl. In the Orange Bowl, he connected on a 55-yard completion to set up an FSU field goal.
- » Glenn finished the season with 19 completions for 229 yards and added 22 rushing yards and one touchdown.

**RUNNING BACKS**

- » ACC Championship Game MVP Lawrance Toafili leads the FSU running backs group in 2024. Toafili, who rushed for a career-high 118 yards and scored the go-ahead touchdown in last season's ACC Championship Game, is FSU's leading returner in rushing yards and all-purpose yards.
- » Among Toafili's 118 rushing yards in the conference championship game was a 73-yard run, the 2nd-longest rush in ACC Championship Game history, in the third quarter to set up the game's only touchdown after Louisville had tied the game.
- » In addition to Toafili, Florida State returns Caziah Holmes and Samuel Singleton Jr. and added transfers Jaylin Lucas and Roydell Williams along with true freshmen Kam Davis and Micahi Danzy.

- » Holmes played in all 14 games last season and started the Orange Bowl. He rushed 29 times for 185 yards and two touchdowns and added five receptions for 58 yards and two touchdowns. The Titusville native had his first multi-score game with one rushing and one receiving touchdown in the 58-13 win vs. North Alabama.
- » Singleton made his collegiate debut with 52 yards on six carries vs. North Alabama and also recorded two rushes in the Orange Bowl.
- » Lucas played his first two seasons at Indiana and impacted the Hoosiers in the offensive backfield and as one of the country's most explosive kickoff returners. His 2,052 all-purpose yards include an IU-record three kickoff return touchdowns.
- » Lucas was the first true freshman to be named Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year when he earned that honor, along with first-team All-America and first-team all-conference accolades, for his performance in 2022. In 2023, he was again an All-Big Ten selection while averaging 92.3 all-purpose yards per game. His 2023 total included a career-high 10 catches at Louisville, the most by an IU running back since 2012.
- » Williams totaled 1,165 rushing yards during his time at Alabama. He appeared in all 14 games last season with starts in the SEC Championship Game and CFP Semifinal at the Rose Bowl. His season total of 560 rushing yards included a career-high 129 yards in the Crimson Tide's win at South Florida.

**RECEIVERS/TIGHT ENDS**

- » FSU returns nine players who made at least one reception in 2023. The group collectively made 86 receptions for 1,195 yards and five touchdowns.
- » Tight end Kyle Morlock was named FSU's Offensive Newcomer of the Year in his first season after a two-time All-American career at Division II Shorter College. The Blairsville, Georgia, native caught 19 passes for 255 yards, and his 63-yard reception at Pitt, part of a season-high four catches, was the longest catch by an FSU tight end since 2019.
- » Ja'Khi Douglas returned from a fall camp injury to play the final 10 games of the season and caught 14 passes for 243 yards. He recorded a career-best six catches for a career-high 115 yards in the 24-7 win at Pitt with all-conference receivers Keon Coleman and Johnny Wilson unavailable due to injury.
- » Kentron Poitier played in 11 games last season and recorded career-bests in the Orange Bowl with four catches and 84 yards, including a career-long 55-yard reception that set up a field goal.
- » Darion Williamson appeared in 12 games with two starts in 2023, catching nine passes for 127 yards and scoring his first collegiate touchdown in the 66-13 win vs. Southern Miss.
- » Sophomores Destyn Hill and Hykeem Williams combined for 11 catches for 167 yards and one touchdown in their freshman campaigns.
- » Malik Benson enters his first spring at FSU after transferring in from Alabama. The former No. 1 JuCo prospect in the country played all 14 games for the Crimson Tide with six starts in 2023, catching 13 passes for 162 yards and one touchdown.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

- » Florida State returns two all-conference offensive linemen, including first-team tackle Darius Washington, from last year's group that blocked for the best scoring offense in the ACC.
- » The Seminoles also return all-conference center Maurice Smith and starter Jeremiah Byers from last year's squad.
- » Byers, Smith and Washington are three of the four offensive linemen nationally that could make at least one start for the sixth straight season in 2024.
- » Washington started at center against Southern Miss and Boston College and started at left tackle seven times in 2023. For his career, he has 23 starts at left tackle, 11 at right tackle and 3 at center.
- » Including transfer linemen TJ Ferguson (Alabama), Richie Leonard IV (Florida) and Jacob Rizy (Harvard), Florida State has a roster with 345 games played and 210 collegiate starts from its offensive line group heading into the Georgia Tech game.

**DEFENSIVE LINE**

- » Florida State returns All-ACC defensive tackle Joshua Farmer and all-conference defensive end Patrick Payton, along with Byron Turner Jr., and Daniel Lyons, and has added transfers Tomiwa Durojaiye, Marvin Jones Jr., Grady Kelly and Sione Lolohea.
- » Farmer earned second-team all-conference honors after recording 32 tackles, including 7.0 for loss with 5.0 sacks, two quarterback hurries, two pass breakups and one forced fumble. He started all 13 games he played and produced the highest in rivalry matchups as he made a career-high five tackles, including his career-best 1.5 tackles for loss, in the 31-24 win at Clemson and matched that career-high tackles total in a 24-15 win at Florida.
- » Farmer is on the watch lists for the Outland Trophy (nation's best interior lineman) and the Nagurski Trophy (best defensive player) to begin the season.
- » Payton backed up his 2022 ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year season with an all-conference performance in 2023, recording 44 tackles, including a team-high 14.5 for loss with 7.0 sacks, 10 pass breakups, seven quarterback hurries and two forced fumbles. Payton's pass breakups total was the highest by an ACC defensive lineman since 2016 and tied for 4th overall in the ACC in 2023, while his TFLs total ranked 6th in the conference.

- » Payton tied his single-game career-high with seven tackles, 2.0 for loss with 1.0 sack, two quarterback hurries and one pass breakup in the ACC Championship Game victory over No. 14 Louisville.
- » Turner and Lyons, who both made their first collegiate starts in the Orange Bowl, combined for 42 tackles, 2.0 for loss with 1.0 sack, and four quarterback hurries. They both recorded career-high tackle totals of six and four, respectively, in FSU's 41-16 win at Wake Forest.
- » Jones appeared in 25 games during his two seasons at Georgia, including 13 games during the Bulldogs' 2022 national championship season, and started the 2023 SEC Championship Game.
- » Lolohea brings 40 games of experience from his four years at Oregon State. The Tonga native earned second-team All-Pac-12 honors in 2023 after starting all 13 games and making 47 tackles, 8.5 for loss with 1.5 sacks, seven quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. His total included a career-high 10 tackles in a win vs. No. 18 UCLA.
- » Durojaiye played all 13 games last season at West Virginia and recorded 23 tackles, 6.0 for loss with 3.5 sacks, and one quarterback hurry. His sacks total was 2nd on the team.
- » Kelly started 22 of 26 games played in three seasons at Colorado State. For his career, he has totaled 79 tackles, 9.0 for loss with 2.5 sacks, two pass breakups, one fumble recovery and one blocked kick. He was a second-team all-conference selection in 2023.

**LINEBACKERS**

- » Florida State's linebacker corps is led by redshirt senior DJ Lundy, who enters the 2024 season with 183 career tackles, including 16.5 for loss with 5.0 sacks, eight pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.
- » One of three All-ACC linebackers for the Noles in 2023, Lundy recorded 54 tackles, 6.0 for loss with 2.0 sacks, one interception, four pass breakups and two quarterback hurries. He made a season-high seven tackles, 1.0 for loss, in FSU's 27-20 victory vs. Miami.
- » Last season at Boston College, Lundy became the first Seminole since 1959 - and the only player in the country in 2023 - with an interception and a rushing touchdown in the same game, accomplishing the feat in a span of three snaps.
- » In 2022, Lundy was the sixth player since 2000 with a rushing and receiving touchdown and at least 40 tackles in a season.
- » Lundy has 183 tackles and 16.5 tackles for loss in his career and enters 2024 as FSU's career tackles leader.
- » The Seminoles also return sophomores Justin Cryer, Omar Graham Jr., and Blake Nichelson. The trio combined to make 52 tackles, 2.0 for loss, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry in 2023.
- » Cam Riley appeared in 46 games with 10 starts at Auburn before transferring to FSU. He had 121 tackles, 8.0 for loss and 2.5 sacks for the Tigers, including a career-high 16 tackles in the 2022 season opener vs. Mercer.
- » Alabama transfer Shawn Murphy joins the linebackers after appearing in 18 games over his two seasons with the Crimson Tide. Murphy was a consensus four-star recruit in the Class of 2022 and ranked as the No. 1 inside linebacker in America by ESPN.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS**

- » Florida State's defensive backfield returns all-conference performers Shyheim Brown and Fentrell Cypress II along with lineup regulars Azareye'h Thomas and Conrad Hussey from the nation's best pass defense.
- » Brown started all 14 games at safety and was named third-team All-ACC after recording 53 tackles, including 2.0 sacks, one interception, one fumble recovery, four pass breakups and two quarterback hurries. The Lake City native made a career-high eight tackles in the 31-24 victory at Clemson and matched that total again in FSU's 24-15 win at Florida.
- » Brown is on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List, given to the nation's top defensive back.
- » Cypress started all 14 games at cornerback and registered 40 tackles, 1.5 for loss, eight pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. His pass breakups total ranked 10th in the ACC and included multiple-PBU games in the 38-20 win vs. No. 16 Duke and FSU's 41-3 win vs. Syracuse.
- » Thomas tied with Payton for 4th in the ACC with 10 pass breakups and earned his first collegiate start in the Orange Bowl. Hussey, FSU's Devaughn Darling Defensive Freshman of the Year, also made his first collegiate start in the Orange Bowl and had a career-best seven tackles against No. 6 Georgia.
- » Transfers Davonte Brown and Earl Little Jr. join true freshmen Cai Bates and Charles Lester III as newcomers to the defensive backs group. Brown has played in 47 games with 31 starts and has 19 pass breakups with three career interceptions, and Little comes to Tallahassee after playing in 11 games at Alabama. Lester and Bates were both consensus four-star and top-20 cornerback prospects in the Class of 2024 ranked No. 3 and No. 8, respectively, at their position in the 247Sports Composite.

**SPECIALISTS**

- » For the fifth consecutive season, kicker Ryan Fitzgerald and punter Alex Mastromanno highlight Florida State's special teams unit.
- » A semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2023, Fitzgerald begins 2024 on the watch list for the award given to the nation's best placekicker.
- » Fitzgerald was remarkably consistent in 2023, scoring a career-high 115 points by going 19-of-21 on field goals and 58-of-58 in PAT attempts. He led the conference in PATs, total kicks made and total points scored.
- » His 90.5 field-goal percentage was 7th best in the nation and the 3rd-highest for a season in program history. He enters the Georgia Tech game with 299 career points, 9th in FSU history.
- » Mastromanno, a second-team All-American and second-team All-ACC selection in 2023, averaged 45.5 yards per punt last season to rank 2nd in the ACC and 15th nationally while also helping FSU rank 3rd in the country with a net punting average of 43.28 yards per punt.
- » A finalist for the Ray Guy Award last season, Mastromanno is on the preseason watch list for the award given to the nation's top punter.

**COACHING STAFF**

- » **Mike Norvell** enters his fifth season as Florida State's head coach - and ninth season overall as a head coach - as the defending ACC Coach of the Year, the third Coach of the Year award for FSU, joining **Bobby Bowden** in 1993 and 1997.
- » Norvell was also named the Dodd Trophy and Bear Bryant Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson and George Munger Coach of the Year awards.
- » All 10 members of Florida State's coaching staff return in 2024. Eight of the 10 full-time assistant coaches have been with Norvell since his first season at Florida State in 2020.
- » Associate head coach and defensive tackles coach **Odell Haggins** is the longest-tenured assistant coach at the same school in the country, entering his 31st season in 2024. An All-American defensive tackle for the Seminoles, his coaching career began at his alma mater in 1994 following three years as an NFL player.

**BREAK THE ROCK**

- » After each FSU win, and during various points of the offseason (end of spring and fall camp, after summer workouts), a player or coach is selected to break a rock with the opponent's logo. The rock is signed by each player and coach. Breaking the rock symbolizes the completion of a team objective.

### FIELD DEDICATED TO BOBBY BOWDEN

In a special ceremony prior to the Florida game on November 20, 2004, the home of Florida State football took on a meaning even more special when Bobby Bowden Field was dedicated. Now, with numerous additions to enhance the gameday experience, Seminole fans are treated to one of college football's greatest venues.

### 200 & 300

Bowden's 200th career victory came on Oct. 27, 1990, as FSU routed LSU, 42-3, in Tallahassee. In 2007, Bowden won his 300th game at FSU on the field that bears his name with a 24-16 win over Maryland. Bowden's final win on Bobby Bowden Field came two years later, on November 21, 2009 in a 29-26 win over the Terrapins.

### ALL-TIME HOME RECORD

Florida State boasts a 320-104-4 all-time record at Doak Campbell Stadium with a winning percentage of 75.2. Overall, the Noles are 328-108-4 (.750) as the home team, which includes three seasons – 1947-49 – when they played their home games at Centennial Field. FSU was 8-4 at the downtown Tallahassee site, including 8-0 in coach Don Veller's first two seasons.

### OSCEOLA & RENEGADE

One of the best traditions in college football unfolds right before kickoff as Osceola charges down the field atop Renegade - an Appaloosa horse - and plants a flaming spear at midfield. The tradition was born on Sept. 16, 1978 against Oklahoma State. Since then, six different Renegades and 16 different riders have made the ride and planted the spear at midfield.
