TOP STORYLINES

- Standing with a 2-0 record for the first time in eight seasons and nationally ranked for the first time in nine years, No. 23 Georgia Tech returns to Atlantic Coast Conference play on Saturday when it visits Syracuse.
- Georgia Tech moved to 2-0 for the first time since 2016 with last Saturday's 35-12 home win over Georgia State. The Yellow Jackets opened the season in Week 0 with a 24-21 triumph over No. 10 Florida State in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic in Dublin, Ireland.
- Coming in at No. 23 in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll, Georgia Tech is nationally ranked for the first time since it was ranked No. 20 in the AP poll on Sept. 20, 2015.
- Tech is in search of its first 2-0 start in ACC play since it won its first two conference games of the 2017 season (35-17 vs. Pitt and 33-7 vs. North Carolina).
- Despite being in their 12th season together in the ACC, Georgia Tech is making only its second visit to Syracuse, and its first with fans in attendance. The Jackets' only previous game at Syracuse was a 37-20 loss in 2020, when the Orange played home games without fans in attendance due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Tech is 4-1 all-time against Syracuse, including 2-1 in ACC matchups. In their most recent meeting, the Jackets defeated the Orange, 31-22, on Nov. 18 of last season in Atlanta.
- Georgia Tech is making its second-longest trip of the 2024 regular season this weekend when it makes the 961-mile journey to Syracuse (Tech traveled 3,921 miles for its season opener against FSU in Dublin). After this weekend, the Yellow Jackets will have completed 79% of their total travel for the entire regular season (9,764 of 12,302 miles).

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech has allowed zero sacks through two games this season. The Yellow Jackets have not surrendered a sack in eight of their last 17 games overall.

Georgia Tech's current three-game winning streak, which dates back to last season's 30-17 win over UCF in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl, is its longest winning streak since it won four-straight games from Oct. 25-Nov. 17, 2018.

Georgia Tech is 5-0 in games against nationally ranked ACC opponents since Brent Key took over as the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach four games into the 2022 season (W, 26-21 at No. 24 Pitt on Oct. 1, 2022; W, 21-17 at No. 13/11 North Carolina on Nov. 20, 2022; W, 23-20 at No. 17 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 7, 2023; W, 46-42 vs. No. 17 North Carolina on Oct. 28, 2023; W, 24-21 vs. No. 10 Florida State, Aug. 24, 2024).

Last Saturday versus Georgia State, King became the 13th player in Georgia Tech history with 3,000 passing yards as a Yellow Jacket and the 15th player in program history with 4,000 yards of total offense as a Jacket. He reached both milestones in his 15th game at Tech.

Georgia Tech WR **Malik Rutherford's** 131 receiving yards last Saturday versus Georgia State are tied for the most by a Yellow Jacket since DeAndre Smelter (now in his second season as a graduate assistant on Georgia Tech's coaching staff after a three-year NFL career with the San Francisco 49ers) had 132 yards against Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014 (former Tech WR Dominick Blaylock also had 131 yards against Bowling Green on Sept. 30, 2023).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- make the Yellow Jackets 3-0 for the first time since 2016;
- stretch its overall winning streak to four games, which would match its longest winning streaks since 2014;
- give Tech a 2-0 record in ACC play for the first time since 2017;
- give it wins in each of the first two ACC games of the season that have been played outside of Atlanta for only the fifth time in 42 seasons in the conference (the Jackets also accomplished the feat in 1985, 1998, 2010 and 2023);
- up it to 5-1 all-time against Syracuse, including 3-1 in ACC matchups;
- even its all-time record at Syracuse's JMA Wireless Dome at 1-1.

- drop it to 2-1 overall and 1-1 in ACC play;
- snap its overall winning streak at three;
- drop it to 4-2 all-time against Syracuse and 0-2 at the JMA Wireless Dome.



GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was officially named the 21st head coach in Tech football history on Nov. 29, 2022.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech is 11-10 in Key's 21 games as the head coach at his alma mater, including a 7-6 mark in his first full season at the helm in 2023. The winning season was Tech's first since 2018 and was capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016.

The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina, which moved Georgia Tech to 4-0 against nationally ranked Atlantic Coast Conference opponents in Key's 21 games as head coach. Tech finished 5-3 overall in ACC play in '23, good for a tie for fourth place in the 14-team conference after being picked to finish 12th in the league's preseason poll.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1996-2000.

Prior to being named Georgia Tech's interim head coach on Sept. 26 of this season, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his four seasons at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

After redshirting as a true freshman, Key was a four-year starter at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 46, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

• Georgia Tech outgained Georgia State, 499-360, and downed the visiting Panthers, 35-12, in the first-ever football meeting between the two Atlanta schools.

• r-Jr. QB **Haynes King** accounted for 302 yards (275 passing, 27 rushing) and three touchdowns (two passing, one rushing).

• r-Jr. WR **Malik Rutherford** set career highs with seven receptions for 131 yards, including a 52-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter.

• So. WR **Eric Singleton Jr.** scored his first touchdown of the season on a 35-yard reverse. It was the first rushing touchdown of his career.

• Sr. TE **Avery Boyd** had a career-high four receptions, including a 22-yard touchdown catch. Previously, Boyd had never caught more than one pass in a game.

• r-Jr. **Jamal Haynes** ran for a game-high 84 yards on 17 carries (4.9 avg.), including a 1-yard touchdown on fourth-and-goal that opened the scoring in the first quarter.

• King also scored on a fourth-and-goal run from 2 yards out late in the second quarter that gave the Yellow Jackets a 14-3 halftime lead.

• r-So. LB **Kyle Efford** set a career high with 13 tackles.

• Sr. LB **Treniyas Tatum** set a career high with 2.5 tackles for loss.

• Jr. DB **Rodney Shelley**, who had never previously recorded a TFL, had 2.0.

• Both teams had first-and-goal on two occasions in the first half. Georgia State managed just three points, with Tech stopping GSU on four-straight plays after the Panthers had first-and-goal from the 1 yard line on their first possession, then holding GSU to a field goal after it had first-and-goal from the 3 in the second quarter. Conversely, the Yellow Jackets came away with 14 points on the fourth-and-goal TD runs by Haynes and King.

• Georgia Tech had only 79 total yards, including just 8 rushing yards, with 3:49 to go in the first half. The Yellow Jackets amassed 420 yards, including 217 on the ground, over the final 33:49 of the game.

• For the eighth time in the last 17 games, and the second time in as many games this season, Georgia Tech did not allow a sack.

• Georgia Tech moved to 40-4-2 all-time against in-state opponents besides archrival Georgia. The Yellow Jackets haven't lost to an in-state opponent besides UGA since a 7-6 loss to Oglethorpe on Sept. 25, 1926. Tech's other three losses to in-state opponents besides UGA came in the 19th century.

GEORGIA TECH-SYRACUSE SERIES HISTORY

• Georgia Tech and Syracuse are meeting on the gridiron for only the sixth time.

• Georgia Tech owns a 4-1 lead in the all-time series.

• The only ACC teams that the Yellow Jackets have faced less than Syracuse are Louisville (three meetings) and conference newcomer Stanford (two meetings).

• Tech and the Orange are squaring off for just the fourth time since Syracuse joined the ACC in 2013. The home team has won each of the first three conference games between the two schools.

• In their two meetings prior to becoming conference-mates, Georgia Tech won a pair of neutral-site matchups against Syracuse — 13-7 in the 2001 Kickoff Classic in Eas Rutherford, N.J. and 51-14 in the 2004 Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando.

• This weekend's matchup marks the first time that Georgia Tech and Syracuse have ever faced off in consecutive seasons. On Nov. 18 of last season, the Yellow Jackets downed the Orange, 31-22, at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field. The win was Tech's sixth of the season, which secured the Jackets bowl eligibility for the first time in five seasons.

• This Saturday's game also marks the first time that Georgia Tech has ever played in front of fans in Syracuse. The 2020 matchup between the Yellow Jackets and Orange was played in an empty Carrier Dome due to Covid-19 restrictions in the state of New York. That game was delayed by nearly 30 minutes right before kickoff in order to confirm Covid-19 test results for a handful of Syracuse student-athletes.

• Last Saturday versus Georgia State, Georgia Tech completed passes to 11 different receivers, which was the most different receivers that have caught a pass for the Yellow Jackets in a game since 11 players had receptions against Virginia on Nov. 9, 2000.

• Last Saturday's 11 different receivers versus Georgia State also marked the third time in the past two seasons that at least 10 different receivers caught a pass in a game for Georgia Tech (10 at Ole Miss - Sept. 16, 2023 and 10 at Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

• After ranking 121st nationally in third-down conversion percentage in 2022 (.306), Tech ranked 39th nationally with a .431 third-down conversion percentage last season (72-for-167) and has a .500 third-down conversion percentage through two games this season (9-for-18).

• Georgia Tech has the luxury of having two quarterbacks that have started and won college football games, as King is backed up by r-So. **Zach Pylon**.

• In this season's opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), Pylon scored Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the season on a 1-yard quarterback draw in the first quarter.

• Pylon's touchdown against Florida State was his first since a 9-yard touchdown run in his first-career start at Virginia Tech on Nov. 5, 2022.

• Pylon amassed an impressive 692 yards of total offense (565 passing, 127 rushing) and five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in just three games (two starts) as a true freshman in 2022.

RUNNING BACKS

• Georgia Tech r-Jr. **Jamal Haynes**, one of the nation's top running backs, has lived up to the billing through two games this season.

• Through two games, Haynes has 159 yards and three touchdowns on just 28 carries (5.7 avg.).

• Last Saturday against Georgia State, Haynes had 84 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries (4.9 avg.).

• In the season opener against No. 10 Florida State, Haynes ran for 75 yards and two touchdowns on just 11 carries, while also catching two passes for 16 yards.

• Haynes' two rushing touchdowns against FSU (1 and 2 yards) were a career high.

• It was also the second two-touchdown game of Haynes' career – he had a rushing and receiving touchdown in last season's win over Syracuse (Nov. 18).

• Haynes, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the 2023 offseason, ran for 1,059 yards in his first season at the position in '23. He became Georgia Tech's first 1,000-yard rusher since QB TaQuon Marshall (1,146 yds.) and RB KirVonte Benson (1,053 yds.) both reached the 1,000-yard plateau in 2017.

• Haynes' 1,059 rushing yards last season were the 15th-most in Georgia Tech single-season history.

• Haynes finished last season ranked in the top 10 in the ACC in four statistical categories.

• Haynes' four 100-yard rushing games last were the most by a Yellow Jacket in a single season since QB Tobias Oliver had four 100-yard rushing games in 2018 and the most by a Tech RB since KirVonte Benson had five 100-yard games in 2017.

• Haynes scored eight touchdowns last season (seven rushing, one receiving), which were the most by a Georgia Tech RB since Dedrick Mills scored 13 in 2016.

• Haynes had a touchdown run in four-consecutive games last season – 4 yards at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 7, 16 yards vs. Boston College on Oct. 21, 4 yards vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28, 43 yards at Virginia on Nov. 4. He became the first Yellow Jacket with a rushing touchdown in four-consecutive games since Jerry Howard ran for touchdowns in four-straight contests from Sept. 29-Oct. 25, 2018 (vs. Bowling Green, at Louisville, vs. Duke, at Virginia Tech).

• **Trey Cooley** made an instant impact last season, his first at Georgia Tech after transferring from Louisville. Cooley totaled 386 yards from scrimmage (274 rushing, 112 receiving) and four touchdowns (three rushing, one receiving) in 10 games in 2023.

• With a total of four touchdowns in the first two games of last season (two on Sept. 1 vs. Louisville, two on Sept. 9 vs. South Carolina State), Cooley became the first Yellow Jacket to score four touchdowns in a two-game span since QBs TaQuon Marshall and Tobias Oliver scored four touchdowns apiece over a two-game span in 2018 against Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville (Oct. 5). Cooley was the first Tech RB to score four touchdowns in a two-game span since 2016, when Dedrick Mills scored one against Clemson (Sept. 22) and three against Miami (Oct. 1).

OFFENSE

- After an injury that caused him to miss six games and limited his effectiveness over the final five games following his return to action last season, r-Sr. **Chase Lane** has picked up right where he left off at the beginning of 2023.

- Lane, who like QB Haynes King, transferred to Georgia Tech from Texas A&M prior to the 2023 season, ranks second on the team with 68 receiving yards and is third on the squad with five receptions through two games this season.

- In the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), Lane caught two passes for 31 yards, both good for second on the team.

- Lane's two catches against FSU included an acrobatic 20-yard reception that was a critical play of the Yellow Jackets' third touchdown drive of the game late in the third quarter.

- Both of Lane's receptions against FSU went for first downs on GT touchdown drives. His first reception of the game, an 11-yarder in the second quarter, also led to a Tech touchdown.

- Last Saturday against Georgia State, Lane caught two passes for 25 yards.

- Last season, Lane caught six passes for 105 yards and a touchdown over the first two games of the campaign, but was injured in the second game of the year versus South Carolina State. He would go on to miss the next six games, then had just one catch for 0 yards over the final five games of the season.

- Sr. **Christian Leary** ranked third on the team with 25 receptions and fourth on the squad with 309 receiving yards last season.

- Leary caught at least once pass in each of the first 11 games of last season before being held without a reception in the regular-season finale versus No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 25) and Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl vs. UCF (Dec. 22).

- After hauling in 10 touchdown receptions from 2020-22 at Duquesne (including nine in 2022), r-Sr. **Abdul Janneh Jr.** caught a touchdown pass in two of his first four games at Georgia Tech last season — a 33-yarder at Wake Forest (Sept. 23) and a 16-yarder against Bowling Green (Sept. 30).

- Janneh's 12 collegiate touchdown receptions are tops among all Yellow Jackets.

TIGHT ENDS

- Sr. **Avery Boyd** has settled into the tight ends room after spending much of his first four seasons as a Yellow Jacket at wide receiver.

- Boyd had a career day last Saturday against Georgia State with four receptions for 27 yards, including a 22-yard touchdown.

- Boyd's four receptions against GSU marked the first time in his collegiate career that he caught more than one pass in a game.

- The 6-foot-3, 240-pound Boyd made the start at tight end in the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24) and made a 14-yard reception deep in Georgia Tech territory to kickstart an 89-yard touchdown drive that gave the Yellow Jackets a 21-14 lead early in the fourth quarter.

- After not having a reception over the first 17 games of his career, Boyd has at least one catch in eight of the last 13 games.

- A trio of tight ends that transferred to Georgia Tech in the offseason — r-Sr. **Jackson Hawes** (Yale), r-Jr. **Josh Beetham** (Michigan) and r-Sr. **Ryland Goede** (Mississippi State) — all made their first catches as Yellow Jackets last Saturday against Georgia State (Goede for 16 yards, Hawes for 10 yards and Beetham for 6 yards).

- While the trio of Hawes, Beetham and Goede did not have catch in the season opener against No. 10 Florida State, all three played a critical role in the run game through their blocking at the point of attack.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Georgia Tech's offensive line has lived up to its billing as one of the nation's best through two games this season.

- Behind the Yellow Jackets' offensive front, Georgia Tech ranks ninth nationally in yards per rush (5.9) and has not allowed a sack through two games this season.

- By not allowing a sack through two games this season, Georgia Tech has not surrendered a sack eight times in the last 17 games.

- Prior to allowing no sacks in eight of the last 17 games, the Yellow Jackets had surrendered a sack in 27-of-28 games.

- Tech's pass blocking in last Saturday's win over Georgia State was especially impressive, as all five starters (RG Keylan Rutledge - 84.2, LG Joe Fusile - 83.9, RT Jordan Williams - 82.8, LT Jordan Brown - 82.7 and C Weston Franklin - 81.3), as well as reserve LT Corey Robinson II (81.2), received pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher from *Pro Football Focus*.

- One of Georgia Tech's most experienced overall positions, the offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2024 roster have combined for 195 collegiate games played and 138 career starts.

- Tech returned four starters and five significant contributors this season from an offensive line that paved the way for the Yellow Jackets to lead the ACC and rank among the top 15 nationally in both rushing offense (203.8 ypg - 12th nationally) and fewest sacks allowed (1.15/gm - 15th nationally) in 2023.

DEFENSE
TEAM

• Georgia Tech's defense is under the tutelage of new defensive coordinator **Tyler Santucci**.

• Through two games under Santucci, Tech's defense is allowing 16.5 points, 325.5 yards and 124.0 rushing yards per game, all down significantly from the Yellow Jackets' averages a year ago.

• In his first game as Tech's defensive coordinator, Santucci's defense limited No. 10 Florida State, which averaged 401.6 yards of total offense per game in 2023, to just 291 yards a 24-21 win over the Seminoles (Aug. 24).

• Georgia Tech's rushing defense, which ranked last in the ACC and 128th out of 130 NCAA Division I FBS teams (221.3 ypg) last season, limited Florida State to just 98 rushing yards on 31 carries (3.2 avg.).

• Even more impressively, after FSU ran for 58 yards on five carries on its first possession of the game (11.6 avg.), Tech surrendered just 40 yards on 26 carries over the rest of the game (1.5 avg.).

• Georgia Tech's eight tackles for loss last Saturday against Georgia State are tied for its second-most in a game since the beginning of last season (15 games).

• Georgia Tech's seven tackles for loss in the season opener against No. 10 Florida State are tied for its fourth-most in a game since the beginning of last season and were its most against a ranked opponent since it had 12 in a win at No. 17 North Carolina on Nov. 19, 2022.

• Last season, Santucci served as the defensive coordinator at Duke, leading the Blue Devils to the top of the ACC in scoring defense (19.0 ppg — 16th nationally). Santucci's Duke defense also ranked among the nation's top 50 in rushing defense, passing defense, total defense, tackles for loss, third-down defense, fourth-down defense and red-zone defense in 2023.

• Last season, Georgia Tech's defense ranked among the top 20 nationally in all three turnover categories — fumble recoveries, interceptions and total takeaways.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets forced as many as five turnovers in a game twice in one season for the first time since 1996 (5 vs. Virginia - Oct. 5, 1996 and 5 vs. UCF - Oct. 26, 1996).

• Georgia Tech was 6-1 last season when it forced multiple turnovers in a game, with the lone loss coming in the regular-season finale against No. 1 Georgia, when the Yellow Jackets had two takeaways, but lost, 31-23.

• As one of the nation's leaders in takeaways (t-9th - 25) last season, Georgia Tech picked up right where it left off in 2022, when it finished tied for seventh nationally with 24 forced turnovers.

• Becoming one of the nation's best teams in forcing turnovers over the past two seasons is particularly noteworthy for Georgia Tech, which finished 102nd nationally with only 13 takeaways in 12 games just four seasons ago (2020).

• Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 2.7 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 1.0 takeaways per game in losses.

• Tech has finished among the top 25 nationally in fumble recoveries four-straight seasons — No. 2 nationally with 12 in 2020, tied for 16th with 10 in 2021, tied for seventh with 13 in 2022, and tied for seventh with 11 in 2023.

• Since 2019, no team in the country has had more fumble recoveries than the Yellow Jackets' 55.

• Georgia Tech's defense turned in perhaps its finest performance of last season in limiting this Saturday's opponent, Syracuse, to 259 yards of total offense in the Yellow Jackets' postseason-clinching 31-22 victory on Nov. 18.

• Syracuse's 259 yards were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech in a game since Alcorn State managed just 146 yards against the Yellow Jackets on Sept. 1, 2018, and were the fewest that Tech has surrendered against an FBS opponent since it limited Virginia Tech to 258 on Nov. 11, 2017.

INDIVIDUAL

• r-So. LB **Kyle Efford** leads NCAA Division I FBS with 23 tackles through two games this season — 10 vs. No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24) and a career-high 13 vs. Georgia State (last Saturday).

• *Pro Football Focus* ranks Efford as the No. 9 linebacker in the nation this season in tackling (68.9 grade), No. 12 in pass coverage (64.9) and No. 16 in overall defensive grade (62.9) (min. 50% of team snaps).

• Last Saturday's 13 tackles against Georgia State surpassed Efford's previous career high of 11, set in last season's win over Syracuse (Nov. 18), when Efford was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week.

• Efford was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for the second time in his career after tallying 10 tackles in this season's opener vs. FSU.

• In all, Efford has recorded double-digit tackles four times in nine games since moving into the starting lineup midway through last season.

• Despite not moving into the starting lineup until midway through last season, Efford led Georgia Tech with 81 tackles in 2023, 12 more than any other player on the squad.

• Efford became the first freshman to lead Georgia Tech in tackles since Darryl Smith tied for the team lead as a freshman in 1999 before going on to a 12-year NFL career with the Jacksonville Jaguars and Baltimore Ravens.

• Efford was the first Tech freshman to lead the team in tackles outright since Richardo Wimbush (91) in 1999.

• r-Jr. DB **Ahmari Harvey** had a big day in Georgia Tech's season-opening win over Florida State (Aug. 24), finishing with a career-high eight tackles from his cornerback position.

• Two of Harvey's eight stops were among the most critical plays of the game. In the first quarter, his open-field tackle on fourth-and-4 forced a turnover on downs and squelched an FSU scoring threat with the Seminoles deep in GT territory. In the second quarter, he took down FSU QB D.J. Uiagalelei in the backfield on third-and-3 for his first-career tackle for loss, forcing the Seminoles to settle for a field goal.

• For the season, Harvey is tied for second on the team with 11 total tackles and leads the squad with nine solo stops.

• Sr. DB **LaMiles Brooks** and Jr. DB **Clayton Powell-Lee** are tied with Harvey for third on the team with 11 tackles apiece from their safety positions.

• Brooks and Powell-Lee are among five Yellow Jackets in the last 23 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same game (Charlie Thomas — Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, Brooks — Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech — Nov. 5, 2022, Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

• Prior to five Tech players recording an interception and a fumble recovery in the last 23 games, only two other Yellow Jackets had accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy — Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling — Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).



DEFENSE

• According to *Pro Football Focus*, Georgia Tech nickel back **Omar Daniels** is the No. 1 safety in the nation against the run this season (min. 50% of team snaps) with an 87.0 rush defense grade .

• Powell-Lee is the nation's No. 15 safety against the run according to PFF with a 68.5 rush defense grade (min. 50% of team snaps).

• r-Sr. DB **Warren Burrell**, has relatively quiet numbers through two games (six tackles, two pass breakups), but that is likely a result of opposing teams not challenging him.

• *Pro Football Focus* ranks Burrell as the No. 8 cornerback in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC (min. 50% of team snaps) this season in both overall defensive grade (75.8) and pass coverage (77.0).

• Another Georgia Tech senior that has perhaps flown under the radar this season in terms of stats (one tackle in two games) but not by *Pro Football Focus* is DL **Makius Scott**. PFF ranks Scott as the No. 3 interior defensive lineman in the nation (min. 50% of team snaps) this season in rush defense (72.0 grade) and No. 7 in overall defensive grade (65.8).

• The Yellow Jackets' other starting defensive tackle, Sr. **Zeek Biggers**, is ranked No. 13 nationally among interior defensive linemen in pass rush grade (58.0) by PFF (min. 50% of team snaps).

• On the edge, three Georgia Tech defensive ends — r-Jr. **Romello Height**, Sr. **Kevin Harris** and Sr. **Joshua Robinson** — are all rated highly by *Pro Football Focus* through two games this season.

• In his first season with the Yellow Jackets, PFF ranks Height No. 4 nationally among edge rushers (min. 50% of team snaps) in rush defense (75.3 grade), No. 5 in pass coverage (63.1), No. 7 in pass rush (69.9) and No. 8 in overall defense (70.1).

• PFF ranks Harris No. 8 nationally among edge rushers (min. 50% of team snaps) in pass coverage (61.7 grade).

• Despite coming off the bench for both games this season, PFF ranks Robinson No. 12 nationally among edge rushers (min. 50% of team snaps) in rush defense (65.6 grade) and No. 13 in overall defense (65.1), thanks in large part to his impressive 78.8 tackling grade, which ranks No. 3 nationally among edge rushers.

• A fifth-year senior from Ruisbroek, Belgium, **Sylvain Yondjouen** enters this season as one of the oldest players in college football at 26 years of age.

• Born on June 21, 1998, Yondjouen is the second-oldest player in the ACC, the fourth-oldest defensive lineman in the nation and the 17th-oldest player in NCAA Division I FBS.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- In the season opener against Florida State (Aug. 24), r-So. PK **Aidan Birr** made a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift Georgia Tech to a 24-21 win over the 10th-ranked Seminoles.

- Birr's game-winning field goal was the first "walk-off" field goal by a Yellow Jacket since current Kansas City Chief and three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker made a 24-yarder as time expired in the Yellow Jackets' 27-24 victory at Virginia Tech on Sept. 20, 2014.

- Birr's game winning field goal was only the fifth "walk-off" field goal in Georgia Tech history, and the longest.

- Birr — an honorable mention freshman all-America selection by *College Football News* — established himself as one of the nation's top place kickers as a redshirt freshman in 2023.

- After missing the entire 2022 campaign due to a knee injury sustained while still in high school in Kennedale, Texas (Kennedale H.S.), Birr made 17-of-19 field goals as a redshirt freshman in 2023, good for a .895 percentage

- Birr's .895 field-goal percentage last season was the second-highest in Georgia Tech single-season history (behind only former teammate Gavin Stewart's .923 in 2022), the highest by a freshman in Tech history, the ninth-best in the nation in 2023 and the third-best among freshmen nationally.

- Birr led Georgia Tech with 88 points last season, which was the sixth-most kicking points in Georgia Tech single-season history and the most ever by a Tech freshman.

- Birr's 17 field goals made tied for the fourth-most in Georgia Tech single-season history and were the most ever by a Tech freshman.

- Birr was also tied for fourth nationally among freshmen in field goals made per game (1.42) in 2023.

- Seven of Birr's 17 field goals last season came from 40 yards or more, which were the most field goals of 40-plus yards by a Yellow Jacket since three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker (Kansas City Chiefs) made eight field goals from 40 yards or more as a senior at Tech in 2016

- In addition to being 17-for-19 on field-goal attempts, Birr was also 37-for-38 on PAT attempts last season (his only miss coming on an errant snap).

- Birr made his collegiate debut in the second half of the Yellow Jackets' second game of the season (South Carolina State - Sept. 9) and has remained as the Jackets' primary place kicker since.

- Sr. P **David Shanahan** is averaging 43.2 yards per punt through two games this season. More impressively, he owns a net punting average of 42.6 yards, as only two of his five punts have been returned for a total of 3 yards.

- Shanahan averaged 42.8 yards per punt last season, which would have ranked 41st nationally but due to the proficiency of Tech's offense, he fell short of the 3.6 attempts needed per game to qualify for the official NCAA and ACC rankings.

- Shanahan, who hails from Castleisland in County Kerry, about three hours southwest of Dublin, is believed to be the first Ireland native ever awarded a full scholarship to play American college football.

- Playing in front of more than 100 family and friends in Tech's season opener versus No. 10 Florida State in Dublin, Ireland (Aug. 24), Shanahan averaged 46.5 yards over two punts and, perhaps more notably, was on the field for the game-winning field goal as Birr's holder.

- Tech's national punt return ranking has been in the top 50 each of the past two seasons — 39th in 2022 (9.33) and 42nd last season (10.08) — after the Jackets finished last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns in 2021.

- Sr. **Christian Leary** ranked fifth in the ACC and 36th nationally with a 22.0-yard kickoff return average last season.

- Georgia Tech has blocked 12 kicks in the last 56 games.

- Prior to blocking 12 kicks in the past 56 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between blocked kicks.

- Since the beginning of the 2013 season, Georgia Tech has blocked 31 kicks, which is tied for the fifth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

- Georgia Tech lived up to its reputation as one of the most effective kick-blocking units in the nation last season with four blocks in 13 games (a PAT, a punt and two field goals).

- The Yellow Jackets tied for No. 3 nationally and led the ACC and with four blocked kicks last season. They were one of only nine NCAA Division I FBS teams that blocked as many as four kicks in 2023.

• As has become commonplace at Georgia Tech, the Yellow Jackets are once again navigating one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2024.

• All 11 of Georgia Tech's NCAA Division I opponents in 2024 appeared in bowl games in 2023. The Yellow Jackets are the only team in the nation with that distinction.

• Tech's 2024 opponents had a combined record of 103-54 in 2023, which gives the Jackets the nation's fourth-toughest schedule in terms of opponents' 2023 winning percentage.

• Facing a daunting schedule is nothing new for Georgia Tech, as its 2021 schedule was the nation's toughest and its 2022 slate ranked sixth, based on opponents' final winning percentage.

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the last three-plus seasons. In their 20 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in 13-of-20 games and are plus-31 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 18 of its 30 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-27 overall in turnover margin in those 30 losses.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were plus-11 in turnover margin in their seven wins and minus-seven in their six defeats.

• One area where Georgia Tech is looking to return to last season's form is in penalties.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were one of the ACC's least-penalized teams last season, ranking third in the conference in fewest penalties per game (5.17) and fourth in fewest penalty yards per game (45.58).

• However, through two games this season, Tech ranks 12th in the ACC in penalties per game (5.5) and 13th in penalty yards per contest (53.5).

• Head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

• Georgia Tech's 11 full-time coaches have combined to win 79 championships at high school (state), college (division/conference/national) and NFL (division/conference/Super Bowl) levels as players and coaches.

• Since the beginning of the 2016 season, Georgia Tech has played games in seven different National Football League stadiums (Mercedes-Benz Stadium - Atlanta, Ford Field - Detroit, TIAA Bank Field - Jacksonville, Hard Rock Stadium - Miami, Lincoln Financial Field - Philadelphia, Acrisure Field - Pittsburgh and Raymond James Stadium - Tampa Bay), which is tied for the fifth-most NFL stadiums that any college football team has played in during that span.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

• For the first time since 2015, Georgia Tech is nationally ranked, coming in at No. 23 in this week's *Associated Press* Top 25 poll.

• Tech is ranked in the AP poll for the 308th time since the poll's inception in 1936 (the poll listed 20 teams from 1936-88, except for from 1961-67, when only 10 teams were ranked; it began ranking 25 teams in 1989).

• The Yellow Jackets are ranked for the first time since they were No. 20 in AP poll on Sept. 20, 2015.

TECH vs. RANKED OPPONENTS

• Georgia Tech is 5-3 against ranked opponents under head coach **Brent Key**, including an ultra-impressive 5-0 record against ranked Atlantic Coast Conference competition, with four of the five wins coming away from home (26-21 at No. 24 Pitt - Oct. 1, 2022; 21-17 at No. 13/11 North Carolina - Nov. 19, 2022; 23-20 at No. 17 Miami (Fla.) - Oct. 7, 2023; 46-42 vs. No. 17 North Carolina - Oct. 28, 2023; 24-21 vs. No. 10 Florida State, Aug. 24, 2024).

• With a pair of wins over nationally ranked teams in each of the last two seasons, the Yellow Jackets have defeated multiple ranked teams in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2008 and 2009. With another win over a ranked team this season, Tech will have claimed victories over multiple ranked teams in three-straight seasons for the first time since 1955-57.

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1, 2022. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher – L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee – 1972; Pepper Rodgers – L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame – 1974; Bill Curry – L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama – 1980; Mac McWhorter – W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford – 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins – L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson – 2019).
