TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech steps out of Atlantic Coast Conference play on Saturday when it hosts VMI at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field.
- Georgia Tech (2-1, 1-1 ACC) is looking to rebound from its first defeat of the season, a 31-28 loss last Saturday at Syracuse.
- The Yellow Jackets, which trailed 31-14 with less than six minutes to play against Syracuse, scored two touchdowns in a 2:37 span to pull within three points at 31-28 with 2:31 to go in the ballgame, but the Orange picked up two first downs on its final possession to run out the clock and fend off the Yellow Jackets' comeback bid.
- With its two longest road trips of the season already under its belt (a combined 9,764 miles of travel to Dublin, Ireland for the season opener versus Florida State and last Saturday's contest at Syracuse), Georgia Tech returns home to face former conference-mate VMI.
- Tech and VMI are squaring off on the gridiron for the 16th time overall but the first time in 36 years.
- The Georgia Tech-VMI series dates back 110 years, with the first meeting between the two schools coming on Oct. 24, 1914 (a 28-7 Tech win).
- Despite Tech and VMI both being members of the Southern Conference for six of their matchups from 1923-28, all 15 meetings between the Jackets and Keydets have been played at what is now known as Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field.
- The Jackets and Keydets last faced each other on Nov. 5, 1988, a 34-7 Tech win.
- Georgia Tech's lone loss in the 15-game series history was a 14-13 defeat on Nov. 11, 1950.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

0

Georgia Tech has allowed zero sacks through three games this season. Despite being one of only three NCAA Division I FBS teams that has played three games this season, the Yellow Jackets are one of only 15 squads that has not surrendered a sack (the other 14 have only played two games).

2

Georgia Tech matched a single-game school record with two blocked kicks last Saturday at Syracuse (a field goal and a punt). It was the 11th time in program history that Tech has blocked two kicks in a game and the first since the Yellow Jackets also blocked a field goal and a punt versus Virginia on Oct. 20, 2022.

Georgia Tech QB **Haynes King** was one of only two Power Five conference players with at least 2,800 passing yards, 700 rushing yards, 25 touchdown passes and 10 touchdown runs in 2023 (joining Heisman Trophy winner and eventual No. 2 pick in the 2024 NFL Draft Jayden Daniels - LSU).

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was officially named the 21st head coach in Tech football history on Nov. 29, 2022.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech is 11-10 in Key's 21 games as the head coach at his alma mater, including a 7-6 mark in his first full season at the helm in 2023. The winning season was Tech's first since 2018 and was capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016.

The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina, which moved Georgia Tech to 4-0 against nationally ranked Atlantic Coast Conference opponents in Key's 21 games as head coach. Tech finished 5-3 overall in ACC play in '23, good for a tie for fourth place in the 14-team conference after being picked to finish 12th in the league's preseason poll.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1996-2000.

Prior to being named Georgia Tech's interim head coach on Sept. 26 of this season, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his four seasons at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jerrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

After redshirting as a true freshman, Key was a four-year starter at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 46, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

GEORGIA TECH-VMI SERIES HISTORY

• Georgia Tech and VMI are meeting for the 16th time in a series that dates back 110 years.

• The Yellow Jackets lead the all-time series, 14-1.

• All 15 matchups have been played at what is now known as Georgia Tech's Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field.

• Tech and VMI first met on the gridiron on Oct. 24, 1914, a 28-7 Tech win.

• The teams met six-straight years from 1923-28 as members of the Southern Conference.

• Georgia Tech left the SoCon to help form the SEC in 1932 and the Yellow Jackets and VMI went 18 years without playing each other until they met for four matchups in a six-year span from 1946-51.

• Another 22-year gap between matchups ensued until Tech and VMI resumed their series with meetings in 1973 and 1975.

• After 11 years, the Jackets and Keydets squared off twice in a three-year span with matchups in 1986 and 1988.

• The series resumes on Saturday for the first time in 36 years.

• Tech's 14 wins in the series have come by an average score of 25-4.

• VMI edged the Yellow Jackets, 14-13, in 1950 for its lone win in the series.

• VMI has never scored more than 14 points in any of its 15 games against Georgia Tech. The Jackets have shut out the Keydets six times and surrendered less than 10 points in 13 of the previous 15 matchups.

TECH vs. RANKED OPPONENTS

• Georgia Tech is 5-3 against ranked opponents under head coach **Brent Key**, including an ultra-impressive 5-0 record against ranked Atlantic Coast Conference competition, with four of the five wins coming away from home (26-21 at No. 24 Pitt - Oct. 1, 2022; 21-17 at No. 13/11 North Carolina - Nov. 19, 2022; 23-20 at No. 17 Miami (Fla.) - Oct. 7, 2023; 46-42 vs. No. 17 North Carolina - Oct. 28, 2023; 24-21 vs. No. 10 Florida State, Aug. 24, 2024).

• With a pair of wins over nationally ranked teams in each of the last two seasons, the Yellow Jackets have defeated multiple ranked teams in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2008 and 2009. With another win over a ranked team this season, Tech will have claimed victories over multiple ranked teams in three-straight seasons for the first time since 1955-57.

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1, 2022. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher - L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee - 1972; Pepper Rodgers - L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame - 1974; Bill Curry - L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama - 1980; Mac McWhorter - W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford - 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins - L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson - 2019).

• Georgia Tech's offense also ranks among the top 40 nationally in yards per play, yards per rush and yards per pass attempt.

• Georgia Tech is averaging 6.7 yards per play through three games, which ranks 29th nationally this season.

• In 2023, only eight teams averaged better than 6.7 yards per play for the season.

• The Yellow Jackets are averaging 5.6 yards per rush through three games, which ranks 26th nationally this season.

• In 2023, only three teams averaged better than 5.6 yards per rush for the season.

• The Jackets are averaging 8.0 yards per pass attempt through three games, which ranks 40th nationally this season.

• In 2023, only 30 teams averaged better than 8.0 yards per pass attempt for the season.

• Last Saturday at Syracuse, Georgia Tech was relatively contained offensively through the first three-and-a-half quarters, as it had just 247 yards of offense with 8:39 to go in the game. However, the Yellow Jackets exploded for 131 yards in a 6:08 span late in the final period, scoring two touchdowns and cutting their deficit from 31-14 to 31-28.

• The Jackets' 378-yard output at Syracuse turned out to be their second-highest yardage total of the young season (behind only their 499 yards vs. Georgia State on Aug. 31).

• Against Georgia State, Georgia Tech also had a relatively slow start on offense, and had just 79 total yards, including only 8 rushing yards, with 3:49 to go in the first half. However, the Yellow Jackets went on to amass 420 yards, including 217 on the ground, over the final 33:49 of the game and finished with 499 yards of total offense.

• Georgia Tech has not surrendered a sack through three games this season.

• Despite being one of only three NCAA Division I FBS teams that has played three games this season, the Yellow Jackets are one of only 15 squads that has not surrendered a sack (the other 14 have only played two games).

• With no sacks allowed through three games, Georgia Tech has gone three-straight games in the same season without surrendering a sack for the first time since 2014, when it did not allow any sacks in three-consecutive games at Pitt (Oct. 25), vs. Virginia (Nov. 1) and at NC State (Nov. 8).

• During that three-game stretch without allowing a sack in 2014, Georgia Tech had 33 total pass attempts. During its current three-game stretch, Tech has had 86 pass attempts.

• Dating back to the final two games of the 2022 season, Georgia Tech has not surrendered a sack in nine of its last 18 games.

• Prior to allowing not allowing a sack in nine of their last 18 games, the Yellow Jackets had surrendered a sack in 27-of-28 games.

• Georgia Tech has scored at least 21 points in 16-straight games dating back to the beginning of the 2023 season. The current string of consecutive 21-point games is Tech's longest since it scored at least 21 in 17 games in a row from 2014-15 (all 14 games in '14 plus first three contests in '15).

• Georgia Tech scored 30 or more points seven times since the beginning of last season after only scoring 30 or more a total of nine times in the previous four seasons combined (2019-22).

• A dominant ground game has been a predictor of Georgia Tech's success in recent seasons, as Tech has run for at least 200 yards in 13 of its last 23 wins, including 225 yards on the ground in its 35-12 win over Georgia State on Aug. 31.

• Georgia Tech completed 25 passes in its win over Georgia State, which is tied for its fourth-most completions in a game over the last 22 seasons.

• Against Georgia State, Georgia Tech completed passes to 11 different receivers, which was the most different receivers that have caught a pass for the Yellow Jackets in a game since 11 players had receptions against Virginia on Nov. 9, 2000.

• Georgia Tech's 11 different receivers versus Georgia State also marked the third time in the past two seasons that at least 10 different receivers caught a pass in a game for Georgia Tech (10 at Ole Miss - Sept. 16, 2023 and 10 at Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

• After ranking 121st nationally in third-down conversion percentage in 2022 (.306), Tech ranked 39th nationally with a .431 third-down conversion percentage last season (72-for-167) and is currently ranked 31st nationally with a .516 third-down conversion percentage through three games this season (16-for-31).

• The Yellow Jackets have not converted half of their third downs in a season since 2014, when they led the nation with a .579 third-down conversion percentage (99-of-171).

• The most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense is its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has averaged just 1.1 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.9 turnovers per game in losses.

• Georgia Tech's offense is guided by second-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulker**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia (2020-22).

• Faulker boasts 19 years of experience on college football staffs, including 13 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18), Southern Miss (2019) and Georgia Tech (2023-pres.).

• In Faulkner's first season at the helm of Georgia Tech's offense in 2023, the Yellow Jackets ranked among the nation's leaders in rushing offense (12th - 203.8 ypg), fewest sacks allowed (15th - 1.15/gm) and fewest fumbles lost (15th - 4).

QUARTERBACKS

• Through three games this season, r-Jr. **Haynes King** has added to his resume as one of college football's top signal-callers.

• Most notably, King has completed 76.2% of his passes this season (64-of-84) with three touchdowns and just one interception.

• King's .762 completion percentage ranks seventh nationally this season.

• If King's .762 completion percentage were to stand up through the season, it would shatter the single-season school record of .666, set by Joe Hamilton in 1999 (203-of-305), when he finished second in voting for the Heisman Trophy.

• King completed 24-of-29 passes against Georgia State (Aug. 31), good for a .828 completion percentage, which is the second-highest in Georgia Tech history (min. 20 attempts).

• King is one of only two players in Georgia Tech history that has completed at least 80% of his passes in a game with at least 20 attempts, a feat that he has now accomplished twice.

- Last Saturday at Syracuse, King had 333 yards of total offense (266 passing, 67 rushing) and was responsible for three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing). The 333 yards of total offense were his most since he accounted for 377 in a 46-42 win over No. 17 North Carolina on Oct. 28 of last season.

- The previous week versus Georgia State (Aug. 31), King accounted for 302 yards of total offense (275 passing, 27 rushing) and three touchdowns (two passing, one rushing).

• King made a record-breaking debut in the White and Gold, throwing for 313 yards and three touchdowns on 19-of-32 passing in last season's opener against Louisville (Sept. 1).

• King's 313 passing yards last season against Louisville marked the first time that a Georgia Tech player ever threw for 300 yards in his GT debut.

• King ran for career-high 150 yards last season vs. Boston College (Oct. 21). His 150 rushing yards were the most by a Tech quarterback since Tobias Oliver ran for 215 yards at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2018.

• Georgia Tech has the luxury of having two quarterbacks that have started and won college football games, as King is backed up by r-So. **Zach Pyron**.

• In this season's opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), Pyron scored Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the season on a 1-yard quarterback draw in the first quarter.

• Pyron's touchdown against Florida State was his first since a 9-yard touchdown run in his first-career start at Virginia Tech on Nov. 5, 2022.

• Pyron amassed an impressive 692 yards of total offense (565 passing, 127 rushing) and five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in just three games (two starts) as a true freshman in 2022.

• Georgia Tech r-Jr. **Jamal Haynes**, one of the nation's top running backs, has lived up to the billing through three games this season.

• Through three games, Haynes has 194 rushing yards and four touchdowns on just 39 carries (5.0 avg.).

• Haynes' four rushing touchdowns this season lead the ACC and are tied for fifth nationally.

• Haynes had 84 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries (4.9 avg.) against Georgia State (Aug. 31).

• In the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), Haynes ran for 75 yards and two touchdowns on just 11 carries, while also catching two passes for 16 yards.

• Haynes' two rushing touchdowns against FSU (1 and 2 yards) were a career high.

• It was also the second two-touchdown game of Haynes' career – he had a rushing and receiving touchdown in last season's win over Syracuse (Nov. 18).

• Haynes' four 100-yard rushing games last were the most by a Yellow Jacket in a single season since QB Tobias Oliver had four 100-yard rushing games in 2018 and the most by a Tech RB since KirVonte Benson had five 100-yard games in 2017.

• Haynes scored eight touchdowns last season (seven rushing, one receiving), which were the most by a Georgia Tech RB since Dedrick Mills scored 13 in 2016.

• Haynes had a touchdown run in four-consecutive games last season – 4 yards at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 7, 16 yards vs. Boston College on Oct. 21, 4 yards vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28, 43 yards at Virginia on Nov. 4. He became the first Yellow Jacket with a rushing touchdown in four-consecutive games since Jerry Howard ran for touchdowns in four-straight contests from Sept. 29-Oct. 25, 2018 (vs. Bowling Green, at Louisville, vs. Duke, at Virginia Tech).

• **Trey Cooley** made an instant impact last season, his first at Georgia Tech after transferring from Louisville. Cooley totaled 386 yards from scrimmage (274 rushing, 112 receiving) and four touchdowns (three rushing, one receiving) in 10 games in 2023.

• Cooley, who does not have a carry after sustaining an injury during Georgia Tech's first kickoff return of the season against Florida State (Aug. 24), needs just 17 rushing yards to reach the 1,000-yard rushing plateau for his collegiate career, which includes two seasons at Louisville (2021-22).

• Last Saturday at Syracuse, Rutherford had seven receptions, matching the career high that he set just one week prior versus Georgia State.

• With his 35 receiving yards against Syracuse, Rutherford also became just the 25th player in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 career receiving yards as a Yellow Jacket.

• Rutherford led all players with a game-high 66 receiving yards on a game-high-tying four receptions in Tech's season-opening win over No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24).

• Two of Rutherford's receptions against FSU had a huge impact on the game. The first was a 42-yard gain on Tech's first possession of the game, which set up a 1-yard touchdown run by QB Zach Pyron three plays later. The second was a 15-yard catch over the middle on third-and-12 that kept the Yellow Jackets' final touchdown drive alive late in the third quarter.

• Last season, Rutherford ranked second on the team with 46 receptions and 502 receiving yards. His four touchdown catches were tied for second on the squad and he was the only player on the team that caught at least once pass in all 13 games last season.

• So. **Eric Singleton Jr.** had a breakout performance with 86 yards on five receptions last Saturday at Syracuse.

• Singleton led all Georgia Tech players with 48 receptions, 714 receiving yards and six touchdown catches as a true freshman last season.

• Singleton, who has been pinpointed by opposing secondaries throughout this season, has caught 11 passes for 148 yards on the campaign, both of which rank second on the team behind only Rutherford.

• Despite the relatively slow start as a pass-catcher, Singleton impacted each of the first two games of the season as a ball-carrier, with a 10-yard run in the season-opener at Florida State (Aug. 24) and a 35-yard touchdown run against Georgia State (Aug. 31).

• The touchdown run against GSU was his first TD of the season and the first rushing score of his career.

• Singleton pulled off one of the biggest plays of the season-opening win against Florida State when he had a 12-yard gain on a screen pass on the Yellow Jackets' final offensive play of the game. One play after Singleton Jr.'s 12-yard pickup, PK **Aidan Birr** made a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift Tech to the 24-21 victory.

• With touchdown catches in each of Georgia Tech's first five games of last season — 5 yds. vs. Louisville (Sept. 1), 40 yds. vs. S.C. State (Sept. 9), 15 yds. at Ole Miss (Sept. 16), 31 yds. at Wake Forest (Sept. 23) and 53 yds. vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 30) — Singleton became the first Yellow Jacket ever with a touchdown reception in each of the first five games of his career.

• Singleton also became the first Yellow Jacket with a touchdown reception in five-consecutive games since Kelly Campbell caught touchdown passes in six-straight games in 2000 (Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina-Nov. 18 vs. Maryland).

• After an injury that caused him to miss six games and limited his effectiveness over the final five games following his return to action last season, r-Sr. **Chase Lane** has picked up right where he left off at the beginning of 2023.

• Lane, who like QB Haynes King, transferred to Georgia Tech from Texas A&M prior to the 2023 season, has caught seven passes for 83 yards and a touchdown through three games this season.

• Last Saturday at Syracuse, Lane caught a 4-yard touchdown pass, which was his first touchdown since a 48-yard TD catch in last season's opener versus Louisville (Sept. 1, 2023).

• In the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), Lane caught two passes for 31 yards, both good for second on the team.

• Lane's two catches against FSU included an acrobatic 20-yard reception that was a critical play of the Yellow Jackets' third touchdown drive of the game late in the third quarter.

• Both of Lane's receptions against FSU went for first downs on GT touchdown drives. His first reception of the game, an 11-yarder in the second quarter, also led to a Tech touchdown.

• Last season, Lane caught six passes for 105 yards and a touchdown over the first two games of the campaign, but was injured in the second game of the year versus South Carolina State. He would go on to miss the next six games, then had just one catch for 0 yards over the final five games of the season.

• Sr. **Christian Leary** ranked third on the team with 25 receptions and fourth on the squad with 309 receiving yards last season.

• Leary caught at least once pass in each of the first 11 games of last season before being held without a reception in the regular-season finale versus No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 25) and Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl vs. UCF (Dec. 22).

• After hauling in 10 touchdown receptions from 2020-22 at Duquesne (including nine in 2022), r-Sr. **Abdul Janneh Jr.** caught a touchdown pass in two of his first four games at Georgia Tech last season — a 33-yarder at Wake Forest (Sept. 23) and a 16-yarder against Bowling Green (Sept. 30).

• Janneh's 12 collegiate touchdown receptions are tops among all Yellow Jackets.

TIGHT ENDS

• Sr. **Avery Boyd** has settled into the tight ends room after spending much of his first four seasons as a Yellow Jacket at wide receiver.

• Boyd had a career day last Saturday at Syracuse, with a career-high 56 receiving yards on a career-high-tying four receptions.

• The previous week against Georgia State (Aug. 31), Boyd also had four receptions for 27 yards, including a 22-yard touchdown.

• Prior to catching four passes in each of the last two games, Boyd had never had more than one reception in a game in his collegiate career.

• The 6-foot-3, 240-pound Boyd made the start at tight end in the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24) and made a 14-yard reception deep in Georgia Tech territory to kickstart an 89-yard touchdown drive that gave the Yellow Jackets a 21-14 lead early in the fourth quarter.

• After not having a reception over the first 17 games of his career, Boyd has at least one catch in nine of the last 14 games.

• A trio of tight ends that transferred to Georgia Tech in the offseason — r-Sr. **Jackson Hawes** (Yale), r-Jr. **Josh Beetham** (Michigan) and r-Sr. **Ryland Goede** (Mississippi State) — have combined for five catches for 45 yards over the last two games.

• In addition to becoming a part of the passing game over the past two weeks, Hawes, Beetham and Goede have all played a critical role in the run game through their blocking at the point of attack.

OFFENSIVE LINE

• Georgia Tech's offensive line has lived up to its billing as one of the nation's best through three games this season.

• Most notably, Georgia Tech's offensive front has not surrendered a sack through three games in 2024.

• Despite being one of only three NCAA Division I FBS teams that has played three games this season, the Yellow Jackets are one of only 15 squads that has not surrendered a sack (the other 14 have only played two games).

• With no sacks allowed through three games, Georgia Tech has gone three-straight games in the same season without surrendering a sack for the first time since 2014, when it did not allow any sacks in three-consecutive games at Pitt (Oct. 25), vs. Virginia (Nov. 1) and at NC State (Nov. 8).

• During that three-game stretch without allowing a sack in 2014, Georgia Tech had 33 total pass attempts. During its current three-game stretch, Tech has had 86 pass attempts.

• Overall, Georgia Tech has not surrendered a sack nine times in the last 18 games.

• Prior to allowing no sacks in nine of the last 18 games, the Yellow Jackets had surrendered a sack in 27-of-28 games.

• Tech's pass blocking was especially impressive in its win over Georgia State (Aug. 31), as all five starters (RG **Keylan Rutledge** - 84.2, LG **Joe Fusile** - 83.9, RT **Jordan Williams** - 82.8, LT **Jordan Brown** - 82.7 and C **Weston Franklin** - 81.3), as well as reserve LT **Corey Robinson II** (81.2), received pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher from *Pro Football Focus*.

• Last Saturday at Syracuse, Rutledge (86.6) and Robinson (85.2) once again received pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher from PFF.

• Robinson has earned a pass-blocking grade of 80 or better in all three games this season, as he was the only Yellow Jacket with a pass-blocking grade of 80-plus in the season opener against Florida State (81.9).

• In the run game, the Yellow Jackets' offensive front has paved the way for Tech to average 5.6 yards per rush this season, which ranks 26th nationally.

OFFENSE

• One of Georgia Tech's most experienced overall positions, the offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2024 roster have combined for 205 collegiate games played and 143 career starts.

• Tech returned four starters and five significant contributors this season from an offensive line that paved the way for the Yellow Jackets to lead the ACC and rank among the top 15 nationally in both rushing offense (203.8 ypg - 12th nationally) and fewest sacks allowed (1.15/gm - 15th nationally) in 2023.

DEFENSE

TEAM

• Georgia Tech's defense is under the tutelage of new defensive coordinator **Tyler Santucci**.

• Through two games under Santucci, Tech's defense is allowing 21.3 points, 388.7 yards and 127.3 rushing yards per game, all down significantly from the Yellow Jackets' averages a year ago.

• In his first game as Tech's defensive coordinator, Santucci's defense limited No. 10 Florida State, which averaged 401.6 yards of total offense per game in 2023, to just 291 yards a 24-21 win over the Seminoles (Aug. 24).

• Georgia Tech's rushing defense, which ranked last in the ACC and 128th out of 130 NCAA Division I FBS teams (221.3 ypg) last season, limited Florida State to just 98 rushing yards on 31 carries (3.2 avg.).

• Even more impressively, after FSU ran for 58 yards on five carries on its first possession of the game (11.6 avg.), Tech surrendered just 40 yards on 26 carries over the rest of the game (1.5 avg.).

• Georgia Tech's eight tackles for loss against Georgia State (Aug. 31) are tied for its second-most in a game since the beginning of last season (16 games).

• Georgia Tech's seven tackles for loss in the season opener against No. 10 Florida State are tied for its fourth-most in a game since the beginning of last season and were its most against a ranked opponent since it had 12 in a win at No. 17 North Carolina on Nov. 19, 2022.

• Last season, Santucci served as the defensive coordinator at Duke, leading the Blue Devils to the top of the ACC in scoring defense (19.0 ppg — 16th nationally). Santucci's Duke defense also ranked among the nation's top 50 in rushing defense, passing defense, total defense, tackles for loss, third-down defense, fourth-down defense and red-zone defense in 2023.

• Last season, Georgia Tech's defense ranked among the top 20 nationally in all three turnover categories — fumble recoveries, interceptions and total takeaways.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets forced as many as five turnovers in a game twice in one season for the first time since 1996 (5 vs. Virginia - Oct. 5, 1996 and 5 vs. UCF - Oct. 26, 1996).

• Georgia Tech was 6-1 last season when it forced multiple turnovers in a game, with the lone loss coming in the regular-season finale against No. 1 Georgia, when the Yellow Jackets had two takeaways, but lost, 31-23.

• As one of the nation's leaders in takeaways (t-9th - 25) last season, Georgia Tech picked up right where it left off in 2022, when it finished tied for seventh nationally with 24 forced turnovers.

• Becoming one of the nation's best teams in forcing turnovers over the past two seasons is particularly noteworthy for Georgia Tech, which finished 102nd nationally with only 13 takeaways in 12 games just four seasons ago (2020).

• Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 2.7 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 0.97 takeaways per game in losses.

• Tech has finished among the top 25 nationally in fumble recoveries four-straight seasons — No. 2 nationally with 12 in 2020, tied for 16th with 10 in 2021, tied for seventh with 13 in 2022, and tied for seventh with 11 in 2023.

• Since 2019, no team in the country has had more fumble recoveries than the Yellow Jackets' 56.

• r-So. LB **Kyle Efford** is tied for second in NCAA Division I FBS with 29 tackles through three games this season — 10 vs. No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), a career-high 13 vs. Georgia State (Aug. 31) and six last Saturday at Syracuse.

• Efford's 13 tackles against Georgia State (Aug. 31) surpassed his previous career high of 11, set in last season's win over Syracuse (Nov. 18), when Efford was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week.

• Efford was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for the second time in his career after tallying 10 tackles in this season's opener vs. FSU.

• In all, Efford has recorded double-digit tackles four times in 10 games since moving into the starting lineup midway through last season.

• Despite not moving into the starting lineup until midway through last season, Efford led Georgia Tech with 81 tackles in 2023, 12 more than any other player on the squad.



DEFENSE

• Efford became the first freshman to lead Georgia Tech in tackles since Darryl Smith tied for the team lead as a freshman in 1999 before going on to a 12-year NFL career with the Jacksonville Jaguars and Baltimore Ravens.

• Efford was the first Tech freshman to lead the team in tackles outright since Richardo Wimbush (91) in 1999.

• With a team-high 2.5 tackles for loss through three games, Sr. LB **Trenilyas Tatum** is already just 1.5 shy of his career high for TFL in a single season (4.0 in 2023). He's already matched the second-highest single-season total of his career (2.5 in 2022).

• r-Jr. DB **Ahmari Harvey** had a big day in Georgia Tech's season-opening win over Florida State (Aug. 24), finishing with a career-high eight tackles from his cornerback position.

• Two of Harvey's eight stops were among the most critical plays of the game. In the first quarter, his open-field tackle on fourth-and-4 forced a turnover on downs and squelched an FSU scoring threat with the Seminoles deep in GT territory. In the second quarter, he took down FSU QB D.J. Uiagalelei in the backfield on third-and-3 for his first-career tackle for loss, forcing the Seminoles to settle for a field goal.

• For the season, Harvey is tied for second on the team with 19 total tackles and leads the squad with nine solo stops.

• Jr. DB **Clayton Powell-Lee** and Sr. DB **LaMiles Brooks** have combined for 27 tackles (14 for Powell-Lee, 13 for Brooks), 2.5 tackles for loss (2.0 for Brooks, 0.5 for Powell-Lee) and two pass breakups (one apiece) this season.

• Brooks and Powell-Lee are among five Yellow Jackets in the last 24 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same game (Charlie Thomas – Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, Brooks – Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech – Nov. 5, 2022, Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

• Prior to five Tech players recording an interception and a fumble recovery in the last 24 games, only two other Yellow Jackets had accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy – Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling – Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).

• r-Sr. DB **Warren Burrell**, has relatively quiet numbers through three games (11 tackles, three pass breakups), but that is likely a result of opposing teams not challenging him.

• *Pro Football Focus* ranks Burrell as the No. 5 cornerback in the ACC this season with a 79.7 pass coverage grade.

• Last Saturday at Syracuse, So. DB **Taye Seymore's** led Georgia Tech with a career-high 10 tackles, shattering his previous career high of two (vs. Georgia – Nov. 25, 2023).

• Another Georgia Tech defender that has perhaps flown under the radar this season in terms of stats (three tackles, 1.5 TFL in three games) but not by *Pro Football Focus* is DL **Jordan van den Berg**. PFF ranks Van den Berg as the No. 29 interior defensive lineman in the nation this season in overall defense (79.2 grade) and No. 35 in rushing defense (78.8).

• A fifth-year senior from Ruisbroek, Belgium, **Sylvain Yondjouen** enters this season as one of the oldest players in college football at 26 years of age.

• Born on June 21, 1998, Yondjouen is the second-oldest player in the ACC, the fourth-oldest defensive lineman in the nation and the 17th-oldest player in NCAA Division I FBS.

• Last Saturday versus Syracuse, Georgia Tech matched a school record with two blocked kicks (a blocked field goal by Sr. DL **Zeek Biggers** in the first quarter and a blocked punt by Fr. DL **Amontrae Bradford** in the second quarter).

• It was the 11th time in program history that Georgia Tech has blocked two kicks in a game and the second time in **Brent Key's** 24 games as the Yellow Jackets' head coach. The Jackets also blocked two kicks versus Virginia on Oct. 20, 2022. In that game, Tech also blocked a field goal and a punt, and the blocked field goal was by Biggers.

• Georgia Tech's nine blocked kicks since Oct. 1, 2022 (Key's first game as the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach) are the most in the nation during that span.

• Biggers' blocked kick last Saturday at Syracuse was the third of his career. He previously blocked field goals vs. Virginia on Oct. 20, 2022 and at Ole Miss on Sept. 16, 2023).

• In the season opener against Florida State (Aug. 24), r-So. PK **Aidan Birr** made a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift Georgia Tech to a 24-21 win over the 10th-ranked Seminoles.

• Birr's game-winning field goal was the first "walk-off" field goal by a Yellow Jacket since current Kansas City Chief and three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker made a 24-yarder as time expired in the Yellow Jackets' 27-24 victory at Virginia Tech on Sept. 20, 2014.

• Birr's game winning field goal was only the fifth "walk-off" field goal in Georgia Tech history, and the longest.

• Birr — an honorable mention freshman all-America selection by *College Football News* — established himself as one of the nation's top place kickers as a redshirt freshman in 2023.

• After missing the entire 2022 campaign due to a knee injury sustained while still in high school in Kennedale, Texas (Kennedale H.S.), Birr made 17-of-19 field goals as a redshirt freshman in 2023, good for a .895 percentage

• Birr's .895 field-goal percentage last season was the second-highest in Georgia Tech single-season history (behind only former teammate Gavin Stewart's .923 in 2022), the highest by a freshman in Tech history, the ninth-best in the nation in 2023 and the third-best among freshmen nationally.

• Birr led Georgia Tech with 88 points last season, which was the sixth-most kicking points in Georgia Tech single-season history and the most ever by a Tech freshman.

• Birr's 17 field goals made tied for the fourth-most in Georgia Tech single-season history and were the most ever by a Tech freshman.

• Birr was also tied for fourth nationally among freshmen in field goals made per game (1.42) in 2023.

• Seven of Birr's 17 field goals last season came from 40 yards or more, which were the most field goals of 40-plus yards by a Yellow Jacket since three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker (Kansas City Chiefs) made eight field goals from 40 yards or more as a senior at Tech in 2016

• In addition to being 17-for-19 on field-goal attempts, Birr was also 37-for-38 on PAT attempts last season (his only miss coming on an errant snap).

• Birr made his collegiate debut in the second half of the Yellow Jackets' second game of the season (South Carolina State - Sept. 9) and has remained as the Jackets' primary place kicker since.

• Sr. P **David Shanahan** is averaging 45.4 yards per punt through three games this season. More impressively, he owns a net punting average of 42.9 yards, as only three of his nine punts have been returned for a total of 3 yards.

• Three of Shanahan's nine punts have been downed inside the 20.

• Shanahan averaged 42.8 yards per punt last season, which would have ranked 41st nationally but due to the proficiency of Tech's offense, he fell short of the 3.6 attempts needed per game to qualify for the official NCAA and ACC rankings.

• Shanahan, who hails from Castleisland in County Kerry, about three hours southwest of Dublin, is believed to be the first Ireland native ever awarded a full scholarship to play American college football.

• Playing in front of more than 100 family and friends in Tech's season opener versus No. 10 Florida State in Dublin, Ireland (Aug. 24), Shanahan averaged 46.5 yards over two punts and, perhaps more notably, was on the field for the game-winning field goal as Birr's holder.

• Tech's national punt return ranking has finished in the top 50 each of the past two seasons — 39th in 2022 (9.33) and 42nd last season (10.08) — after the Jackets finished last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns in 2021.

• Sr. **Christian Leary** ranked fifth in the ACC and 36th nationally with a 22.0-yard kickoff return average last season.

• As has become commonplace at Georgia Tech, the Yellow Jackets are once again navigating one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2024.

• All 11 of Georgia Tech's NCAA Division I opponents in 2024 appeared in bowl games in 2023. The Yellow Jackets are the only team in the nation with that distinction.

• Tech's 2024 opponents had a combined record of 103-54 in 2023, which gives the Jackets the nation's fourth-toughest schedule in terms of opponents' 2023 winning percentage.

• Facing a daunting schedule is nothing new for Georgia Tech, as its 2021 schedule was the nation's toughest and its 2022 slate ranked sixth, based on opponents' final winning percentage.

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the last three-plus seasons. In their 20 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in 13-of-20 games and are plus-31 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 18 of its 30 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-27 overall in turnover margin in those 30 losses.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were plus-11 in turnover margin in their seven wins and minus-seven in their six defeats.

• One area where Georgia Tech is looking to return to last season's form is in penalties.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were one of the ACC's least-penalized teams last season, ranking third in the conference in fewest penalties per game (5.17) and fourth in fewest penalty yards per game (45.58).

• However, through three games this season, Tech ranks eighth in the ACC in penalties (4.67) and penalty yards (40.7) per game.

• Head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

• Georgia Tech's 11 full-time coaches have combined to win 79 championships at high school (state), college (division/conference/national) and NFL (division/conference/Super Bowl) levels as players and coaches.
