OPENING DRIVE

ORANGE HOST YELLOW JACKETS IN ACC OPENER

- Syracuse begins conference play against Georgia Tech in the JMA Wireless Dome.
- The game will air on ACC Network, with Chris Cotter (PxP), Mark Herzlich (analyst) and Coley Harvey (reporter) on the call.
- The Orange will honor recent Pro and College Football Hall of Fame inductee Dwight Freeney during a halftime jersey retirement ceremony.

ORANGE IN ACC OPENERS

- Syracuse begins its 12th year as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- The Orange will open conference play at home for the third-straight year and eighth time in the past 11 seasons since joining the league in 2013. Syracuse is 3-5 when opening ACC play in the JMA Wireless Dome.

MCCORD MAKES IMPRESSIVE DEBUT

- QB Kyle McCord's Syracuse debut in the season opener was a memorable one.
- \bullet McCord was 27-for-39 for 354 yards and four touchdowns.
- He posted career highs in completions (27), attempts (39), passing yards (354) and touchdown passes (4), including his tenure at Ohio State.
- McCord's 354 yards through the air ranks second among ACC quarterbacks this season behind Miami's Cameron Wards, who notched 385 against Florida.
- The touchdowns mark was one shy of tying the program's single-game record. Three players in 'Cuse history have notched five in a game, most recently Eric Dungey (2018).

WELCOME BACK OG

- TE **Oronde Gadsden II** returned to the field in the season opener for the first time since the second game of the 2023 campaign. Gadsden missed the final 11 games of last season due to injury.
- Gadsden caught seven passes for 108 yards and a touchdown against the Bobcats. It marked the fifth 100+ yards receiving performance of his career.
- With his performance, Gadsden now has 75 receptions as a tight end, which ranks third on Syracuse's all-time leader list.

DISRUPTIVE DIGGS

- DL Fadil Diggs led Syracuse's charge behind the Ohio line of scrimmage in Syracuse's season opener.
- Diggs recorded four TFLs, which tie for the highest single-game total in the FBS through week
 one of the season. The total also ties for the sixth-highest single-game total in program history.
- Overall, eight different players were involved in tackles for loss, including LB Marlowe Wax, who had two TFLs.

GAME #2 MATCHUP: GEORGIA TECH

SERIES HISTORY

- Syracuse and Georgia Tech will meet for the second-straight year and sixth time overall.
- The Yellow Jackets have won four of the five previous contests between the two teams. The Orange's win in the series came in the JMA Wireless Dome in 2020.
- Georgia Tech is one of the teams the Orange have faced the least since joining the ACC, with Saturday's game marking the third conference matchup between the squads. Syracuse has played Miami just once and taken on Virginia twice.
- The first two meetings between the squads were played at neutral sites. The first took place in the 2001 Kickoff Classic in Giants Stadium. The second was a showdown in the 2004 Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando.

LAST TIME VS. GEORGIA TECH

- Syracuse scored 19 unanswered points in the second half but it wasn't enough in a 31-22 setback at Georgia Tech last season.
- RB LeQuint Allen Jr. rushed for 120 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries.
- TE Dan Villari rushed for 81 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. He also completed all 14 of his passes for 59 yards.
- QB Haynes King was 16-for-20 for 138 yards and two touchdowns through the air to go along with 82 yards and a touchdown on the ground.

SYRACUSE-GEORGIA TECH CONNECTIONS

- Georgia Tech head coach Brent Keys served as the tight ends/running backs coach at Western Carolina when Syracuse head coach Fran Brown played there in 2004.
- 'Cuse head coach **Fran Brown** was the defensive backs coach at Georgia in 2022 when Georgia Tech offensive coordinator Brett Faulkner was a quality control coach for the Bulldogs.
- Orange linebackers coach Robert Wright was a

- senior analyst at Duke in 2022 when Georgia Tech defensive line coach Jess Simpson served as the associate head coach.
- Syracuse director of football performance Chad Smith served as a strength and conditioning coach at Georgia Tech in 2022-23.
- Syracuse has six players from Georgia QB Jakhari Williams (Macon), TE Jamie Tremble (John's Creek), LB Derek McDonald (Atlanta), QB Carlos Del Rio-Wilson (Atlanta), DL KingJoseph Edwards (Hoschton), and RB Marcus Washington Jr. (Grovetown).
- Georgia Tech doesn't have any players from New York.
- Syracuse DB Alijah Clark and Georgia Tech LB Austin Dean were teammates at Rutgers in 2021.
- Orange DL Braylen Ingraham was teammates with Georgia Tech WR Christian Leary and DL Kevin Harris at Alabama.
- 'Cuse QB Carlos Del Rio-Wilson was teammates with Georgia Tech LB Myles Forristall and DB/LS Kace Adams at Cartersville High School (Georgia).
- Syracuse LB Derek McDonald attended the Marist School (Georgia) as did Georgia Tech TE Luke Harpring.
- 'Cuse WR Nick Armentano, WR Kyle Acker and OL Ted Olsen attended IMG Academy (Florida), as did Georgia Tech RB Evan Dickens and OL Tana Alo-Tupuola.
- Syracuse WR Jackson Meeks (2021-23), WR Zeed Haynes (2023), DB Marcus Washington Jr. (2022) and OL Joshua Miller (2023) and Georgia Tech LB E.J. Lightsey (2022-23) and TE Brett Seither (2019-22) all attended Georgia together.
- Orange DL Fadil Diggs was teammates with Yellow Jackets' WR Chase Lane and QB Haynes King from 2020-22. 'Cuse defensive coordinator Elijah Robinson, defensive back coach Joe Schaefer and edge coach Nick Williams and Georgia Tech defensive coordinator Tyler Santucci coached for the Aggies during that time.

- Georgia Tech enters Saturday's game with a 2-0 record. The Yellow Jackets opened the season with a 24-21 upset of then No. 10 Florida State in Dublin, Ireland.
- · Head coach Brent Key is in his second full year at the helm of the Georgia Tech program. He took over as interim head coach at his alma mater with eight games remaining in the 2022 season. Last season, he guided Georgia Tech to a 7-6 record, including a win against UCF in the Gasparilla Bowl. Key previously served as Georgia Tech's assistant head coach/offensive line coach/ run game coordinator for three-plus seasons.
- QB Haynes King makes the Georgia Tech offense go. He is tied for third in the ACC in points responsible for (18) and leads the ACC and is 10th nationally in completion percentage (.778).
- RB Jamal Haynes has three rushing touchdowns through the first two games, which rank first in the ACC and second in the nation. He is averaging 79.5 yards per game on the ground.
- LB Kyle Efford ranks third in the ACC and 14th in the nation in total tackles, averaging 11.5 per
- The Yellow Jackets' offensive line has not allowed a sack this season.

GAME NOTES: TEAM

A WIN WOULD ...

- Improve head coach Fran Brown's record to 2-0.
- Mark the Orange's second-straight win in their ACC opener.
- Give Syracuse its 756th all-time victory (includes 11 wins from 2004-06 that were vacated by the NCAA). The Orange currently rank 21st on the FBS ledger of winningest programs. Syracuse is one of 34 FBS schools to have accumulated 700+ wins.

NEXT PHASE OF LALLY ATHLETICS COMPLEX UNDERWAY

- The momentum continues for the renovation of the home of the Orange - the John A. Lally Athletics Complex. Construction has begun on a new Football Operations Center and the "One Team" Olympic Sports Center.
- The Football Operations Center will provide significant upgrades to the student-athlete experience and help them meet their performance goals. The facility will feature increased sports medicine space and student-athlete recovery rooms, a new and expanded team cafeteria and nutrition space, as well as a new locker room, position meeting rooms and coaches' offices, among other amenities.
- The "One Team" Olympic Sports Center will feature an expanded sports medicine center, studentathlete lounge and recovery space, and a cafeteria and dining center.

NEW LOOK DOME

- The next step in building upon a first-rate fan experience at the JMA Wireless Dome is here. Fans had their first chance to sit in the new chairback seating that was installed during the summer throughout the entire venue at the season opener.
- In September 2020, the first phase of renovations to the JMA Dome were completed. The \$118 million transformation of the Dome, funded entirely by the University and private philanthropy, included a new fixed roof, the largest vertically hung scoreboard in college sports, the installation of air conditioning and state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- Syracuse's win against Ohio marked Syracuse's fifth-straight against non-conference foes.
- The Orange completed a perfect regular-season record (4-0) outside league play last season for the first time since joining The BIG EAST in 1991.
- Since joining the ACC in 2013, the Orange are 30-16 in non-conference, regular-season games, including a 14-3 mark since 2021.

ORANGE IN THE COMMUNITY

- The football squad earned the 2024 'Cuse Cares Award for community service. The award goes to the Syracuse team that completes the most community service hours during the academic year.
- RB LeQuint Allen was recognized as an ACC Top 6 for Service honoree last season. He participated in more than 10 school readings with elementary students and worked with the Syracuse City School District's Building Men Program. Allen also volunteered with Syracuse PAL, serving more than 100 children from the Syracuse community.

FREENEY OFFICIALLY ENSHRINED IN CANTON

- Legendary pass rusher Dwight Freeney was officially enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton in early August.
- Freeney, who is 18th in NFL history with 125.5
 career sacks, spent 11 seasons (2002-12) with the
 Indianapolis Colts. He also played for the San Diego
 Chargers (2013-14), Arizona Cardinals (2015),
 Atlanta Falcons (2016), Seattle Seahawks (2017)
 and Detroit Lions (2017) during his career.
- At Syracuse, Freeney was just as dominant as he was in the pros. The Bloomfield, Connecticut native racked up 34 career sacks from 1998-2001 and set the Orange single-game record by sacking Virginia Tech's Michael Vick 4.5 times in 2000.
- Freeney joins Jim Brown, Larry Csonka, Al Davis, Marvin Harrison, Floyd Little, John Mackey, Art Monk and Jim Ringo as Orange alums in the Hall of Fame.
- Syracuse's nine members gives the sixth-most members of any school, and also is third in the ACC behind Miami (10) and Pittsburgh (10). Notre Dame and USC have the most selections all-time with 14 each.

ORANGE BOAST NO. 9 TRANSFER CLASS

- Syracuse found unprecedented success in the transfer portal in 2024.
- On3 ranks the Orange's transfer recruiting class No. 9 in the nation.
- It marks the highest-ranked transfer recruiting class in program history. The Orange also saw
 Fran Brown bring in the highest-rated freshman recruiting class to Syracuse since the advent of recruiting services.

ORANGE ADOPT DART

- Syracuse has adopted head coach Fran Brown's DART mentality. The acronym stands for detailed, accountable, relentless and tough.

- Syracuse has two father-son combinations on its 2024 roster.
- Offensive coordinator Jeff Nixon's son, Will, is a redshirt junior running back for the Orange.
- Co-offensive coordinator and tight ends coach Michael Johnson's son, Michael Johnson Jr., is in his first season with the Orange. He is a redshirt senior quarterback.

NEW FACES

- Syracuse has 59 new players on this year's roster.
- The Orange are one of 12 FBS schools to have 59 or more newcomes on their rosters for 2024. It is the highest total in the ACC.
- The 59 newcomers tie for the fifth-highest total among Power 4 schools.

GAME NOTES: OFFENSE

WELCOME ABOARD

- QB Kyle McCord made his Syracuse debut in the season opener against Ohio.
- McCord, who transferred to Syracuse from Ohio State last spring, finished the day with 354 yards, completing 27-of-39 passes.
- His 354 yards are 10th on the NCAA single-game leader list through week one of the season.

PENA RETURNS

- WR Trebor Pena showed in the season opener what a weapon the Orange were missing from their arsenal last season when he played in just one game due to injury.
- Pena posted career highs in receptions (6), receiving yards (78) and touchdowns (3) against Ohio.
- His three touchdowns lead the ACC and rank third in the nation.

ALL-PURPOSE ALLEN

- RB LeQuint Allen Jr. recorded 122 all-purpose yards in the season opener against Ohio (98 rushing and 24 receiving)
- Allen increased his career receptions total to 59, which tie for seventh in program history for catches by a running back. He's five receptions from moving into the top-three.
- Allen was fifth in the ACC in all-purpose yards (1,365) a year ago and earned All-ACC Second Team accolades as a running back and honorable mention honors as an all-purpose player.

MAKING THE MOST OF MCCORD

- QB Kyle McCord ranks as one of the most accurate and efficient passers in the nation.
- He ranks fifth among active FBS quarterbacks in career passing efficiency. He has completed 297-of-445 attempts for a passing efficiency of 163.64.
- That figure ranks second among ACC signal callers.
 NC State QB Grayson McCall, who transferred from Coastal Carolina, has the highest passing efficiency among active quarterbacks of 177.41.

NEW LOOK OFFENSIVE LINE

- Syracuse's offensive line has a combined 95 starts.
 The group includes Enrique Cruz (18) and Mark
 Petry (12). J'Onre Reed made his 14th career start
 at the FBS level in the season after transferring
 from Hutchinson Community College prior to the
 2023 season, while Jakob Bradford (12) started
 the first nine games of last season as well as the
 bowl game. Additonally, Joe Cruz has three career
 starts, all of which came in 2023.
- David Wohlabaugh Jr. (3) started the first two games of 2023 after transferring from Kentucky. He missed the remainder of the season due to injury.
- The group helped the Orange record a schoolrecord 677 yards of total offense in the season opener, including 271 yards on the ground.
 Syracuse allowed just one sack.
- Redshirt juniors Savion Washington and Da'Metrius Weatherspoon join the group this season. GAME NOTES: OFFENSE

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- Eight different players caught at least one pass in Syracuse's victory against Ohio.
- Several players recorded career highs in the win against the Bobcats, including WR Jackson Meeks, who made a diving catch on a 35-yard pass for the longest reception of his career.
- In addition, WR **Zeed Haynes** posted career bests in receptions (4) and receiving yards (70).

ALLEN JOINS RARE COMPANY

- RB LeQuint Allen Jr. became the 13th player in program history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season in 2023.
- He finished the season with 1,064 yards on 245 carries.
- It marked the 20th 1,000-yard rushing season in program history and the third-straight season 'Cuse had a back reach the 1,000 yard. It's the fourth time in program history that Syracuse has seen a player reach 1,000 yards in three-straight seasons.

1,000 YARD RECEIVER

- TE Oronde Gadsden II surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards last season. He reached the milestone in the season opener against Colgate.
- He now ranks second on Syracuse's leader list for receiving yards by a tight end with 1,144. In addition, his 75 catches are third among 'Cuse tight ends. Gadsden moved to tight end prior to the 2022 season.
- Overall, Gadsden ranks 27th on Syracuse's all-time receiving leader list with 1,168 yards.

HATCHER ENJOYS BREAKOUT SEASON

- WR Umari Hatcher recorded career highs in catches, receiving yards and touchdowns in 2023 when he started 11 of the 13 games that he
- Hatcher was Syracuse's second-leading receiver a year ago, tallying 482 yards and three touchdowns on 32 receptions
- He recorded his first 100-yard receiving day in last year's season opener against Colgate when he had four catches for 105 yards.
- Hatcher was one of three Orange with three touchdown receptions last season.

NEW FACES

- The 'Cuse offensive staff features many new faces in 2024.
- OC Jeff Nixon returns to the collegiate level after spending the last five years coaching in the NFL, most recently for the New York Giants in 2023. A 27-year coaching veteran, Nixon will also mentor the 'Cuse running backs.
- WR coach Ross Douglas, who will serve as the Orange passing game coordinator, also comes to Syracuse from the NFL. He spent three seasons in New England in various roles after a brief stint at Richmond and three years on Rutgers' staff.
- OL coach Dale Williams is a veteran offensive line coach with more than 25 years of experience. He joins the Orange from Louisville, where he most recently served as the Cardinals' senior quality control coach, helping UofL make its first trip to the ACC title game. Prior to that, Williams spent six seasons at Purdue as the offensive line coach.
- Two members of the offensive staff return from last season. Michael Johnson, who is in third season with the Orange, will serve as the co-offensive coordinator and tight ends coach.
 Nunzio Campanile enters his second season on The Hill and will mentor the 'Cuse quarterbacks and serve as the offensive associate head coach.

GILL MAKES AN IMPACT

- WR Darrell Gill Jr. will look to increase his role this season after playing in all 13 games during his rookie campaign in 2023.
- He was the only true freshman to appear in every game for the Orange last season.
- Gill recorded seven catches for 60 yards last season.
- His first career reception was a memorable one as he scored his first collegiate touchdown on an 18yard pass in the season opener against Colgate.
- Gill also returned 12 kickoffis for 262 yards (21.8 avg.).
- He finished the year ranked 10th in the ACC in combined kick return yards (262).

GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

BEHIND THE LINE

- The Syracuse defense had 10.0 tackles for loss in the season opener.
- It was the first time the Orange defense had reached double-digits in the category since Sept. 30 of last season against Clemson (13.0)
- DL Fadil Diggs (4.0) led the way, tying for the sixthmost in a single game in program history, followed by LB Marlowe Wax (2.0). In total, eight different players had at least 0.5 tackles for loss.
- The 10 tackles for loss rank 13th in the nation and fourth in the ACC.
- The Orange also posted four sacks against the Bobcats. That total ranks 18th nationally and fifth in the league.

WAX ON, WAX OFF

- LB **Marlowe Wax** emerged as a leader on Syracuse's defense.
- He has led the Orange in tackles the past two seasons, posting a career-high 110 in 2023.
- Against Ohio, his forced fumble moved him into sole possession of second in career forced fumbles at Syracuse (9), where he trails just Hall of Fame defensive end Dwight Freeney (14).
- Against Purdue in 2023, he became the first member of the Orange to force two fumbles and record an interception in a game since Dave Rebar in 1994 against Rutgers.
- He is on the Bednarik, Maxwell and Lott IMPACT Trophy watch lists.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- LB Marlowe Wax is placing his name among the all-time greats of Syracuse football.
- In addition to his rise on the forced fumbles list,
 Wax has now recorded 38.5 career tackles for loss,
 which ties for fourth all-time at Syracuse.
- With six stops against Ohio, Wax now has 302 tackles. He is tied for 13th for tackles by a linebacker at Syracuse.

TRENDING UP

- Since the start of the 2021 season, the Orange have held their opponents to less than 400 yards 26 times. Only Clemson (32) and NC State (28) have done it more times among ACC teams.
- In 2023, Syracuse held eight of its 13 opponents to less than 400 yards of total offense.
- In 2022, Syracuse allowed 328.6 yards per game, which was its lowest total since the 2010 season (301.5 ypg.).

BARRON MAKING HIS MARK

- DB Justin Barron picked up where he left off last season with nine tackles in the season opener against Ohio.
- He recorded a career-high 90 tackles in 2023, which ranked second on the team.
- Barron posted a career-high 13 tackles at North Carolina, marking his first double-digit tackle performance of his career.
- In addition, he tied for the lead in pass breakups (7) and was second in forced fumbles (3).
- With his performance against Ohio, Barron moved up to 14th on Syracuse's career leader list for tackles by a defensive back (210).

TURNOVER TALE

- 'Cuse has won the takeaway battle in 36 of its last 77 games (16 of the remaining 41 were even).
- Syracuse has ranked in the top-15 in turnover margin in three of the last seven seasons.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, Syracuse's 128 takeaways rank 10th among FBS schools.

SEEING RED

- While Ohio made its way to the red zone five times in the season opener, they scored just one touchdown.
- Syracuse held the Bobcats to three field goal attempts, two of which Ohio drove inside the 10yard line, and had a fourth-down stand inside the red zone.

NEW LOOK STAFF

- Syracuse has an entirely new staff coach on the defensive side of the ball.
- Elijah Robinson serves as the Syracuse assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. He comes to 'Cuse from Texas A&M, where he served as the interim head coach for the final two games of the regular season as well as the Texas Bowl. Robinson was the co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach for the Aggies for two seasons.
- Robert Wright joins the 'Cuse staff as the codefensive coordinator and linebackers coach. He spent last season as the defensive coordinator at Buffalo. Wright was named an American Football Coaches Association 35-under-35 winner for 2024.
- DB coach Joe Schaefer comes to the Orange after a two-year stint at Texas A&M. He started his tenure in College Station ahead of the 2022 season, and spent last year coaching the outside linebackers.
- Nick Williams, who has had prior stops at Colorado, Texas A&M and Georgia, will coach the edge for Syracuse this season. Williams spent last season coaching Colorado's defensive unit. Prior to his time with the Buffaloes, Williams was a defensive analyst at Texas A&M for two years.

FASTEST MAN IN JERSEY

- RB Malachi James made his debut as Syracuse's kickoff returner in the season opener.
- He returned three kickoffs for a combined 70
- James ranks 27th in the nation and fourth in the ACC in kickoff returns, averaging 23.3 per return. In addition, he is 30th nationally and sixth in the conference in combined kick returns (70 yards).
- James came to 'Cuse this spring after setting the New Jersey 100-meter dash record on the track (10.1 seconds).

STONEHOUSE MAKES AN IMPACT

- P Jack Stonehouse continued to help the Orange win the field position battle with his performance against Ohio.
- He punted three times for an average of 48.7 yards per punt. He pinned the Bobcats inside the 20 once and had one punt travel 52 yards.
- Last season, Stonehouse averaged 44.6 yards per punt, which ranked third in the ACC and 21st in the nation. Nineteen of his punts went 50+ yards, including a season-long 64-yard punt against Pittsburgh.
- Stonehouse's average of 44.6 yards fell just shy of the single-season school record of 44.78 set by Nolan Cooney in 2020.
- Opponents returned just 20 of Stonehouse's 62 punts last season. He pinned the opposition inside the 20-yard line 18 times.

DENABURG OFF TO HOT START

- K Brady Denaburg connected on his only field goal attempt in the season opener, a 26-yard attempt in the second quarter. He was also was 5-for-5 on extra-point attempts, giving him eight points on the day.
- · Last season, Denaburg averaged 5.1 points per game.
- He had a successful debut as Syracuse's place kicker, making all eight extra-point attempts, connecting on a 25-yard field goal, and recording 10 touchbacks on 11 kickoffs in the season opener.
- Denaburg's eight extra points against Colgate tied for fifth on Syracuse's single-game record list.
- He connected on 10 of his 16 field goal attempts and was 36-for-37 on PATs.

POINT DF NO RETURN

- · Syracuse allowed just two kickoff returns last season when the kickoff took place from the 35vard line.
- It wasn't until game 10 that Pittsburgh returned a Brady Denaburg kickoff 20 yards.
- · Overall, 'Cuse allowed four kickoff returns in 2023, which was the least among FBS teams.
- Syracuse ranked second in the ACC in kick return defense (18.75 ypr.).

PINNING DOWN THE OPPOSITION

- K Brady Denaburg recorded six touchbacks on seven kickoffs against Ohio. That performance continued a trend that began last season.
- In 2023, Denaburg kicked off 62 times and had 56 touchbacks which was good for 90.3 percent.

FREENEY JERSEY RETIREMENT SET FOR SEPT. 7

- Dwight Freeney, a member of the College and Pro Football Hall of Fame, will have his jersey retired during the Georgia Tech game on Sept. 7.
- Freeney finished his career ranked second in program history with 34 sacks and was third in BIG EAST history. He posted over 50 tackles for loss in his career and was an All-American in 2001 after setting the program's single-season sacks record (17.5), earning BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year.
- He later went on to be drafted 11th overall by the Indianapolis Colts, where he totaled the 18th-most sacks in NFL history during his 16-year career. He was enshrined in Canton earlier this month, giving Syracuse the sixth-most Pro Football Hall of Fame honorees of any school.

OUR HOUSE- THE LOUD HOUSE



- Built between April 1979 and September 1980, the JMA Wiress Dome was the fifth-largest stadium of its kind in the U.S. at the time and the first in the Northeast. The building covers 7.7 acres and has 527,320 square feet of floor space. It is 570 feet long and 497 feet wide, and the top of the Dome is 165 feet above the playing surface.
- In May 2018, the University Board of Trustees authorized a \$118 million investment for new stadium improvements. Renovations began in March of 2020 with the installation of a new fixed roof. Additional upgrades include a centerhung scoreboard, state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems, improved accessibility and added Wi-Fi capabilities. Air conditioning, new accessible restrooms and new concessions space were also added.
- The new roof features over 3,000 tons of steel fixed to the structure and the center-hung scoreboard is the second-largest center-hung indoor system in the United States.
- Construction continues on the installation of upgraded chairback seating and the introduction of new premium offerings throughout the venue.

Syracuse picked up a win against Vanderbilt in Paul Pasqualoni's head coaching debut. The Orange trailed, 10-3, in the second quarter but rallied to take a 13-10 lead at the half. Syracuse scored 21-straight points in the third quarter to pull away for a 37-10 victory. Marvin Graves completed 12 of his 19 passes for 250 yards and two tocuhdowns in the win.



FRAN BROWN

Head Coach • First Season • Career Record: 1-0 (1.000)

The nation's top recruiter, a member of the 2022 College Football National Championship coaching staff and a New Jersey native, is the new leader of Orange Football. Director of Athletics John Wildhack named Fran Brown the 31st head coach of Syracuse University Football in November 2023.



Brown joined the University of Georgia in early 2022 where he was part of the coaching staff that led the undefeated Bulldogs to victory in the 2022 College Football National Championship. Under the leadership of the defensive coaching staff, the Georgia defense finished the season ranked among the nation's leaders in rushing defense, scoring defense, red zone defense and total defense. The defense also finished the season with two first team All-Americans and finalists for awards, including the Butkus Award, the Rotary Lombardi Award, the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.

According to 247Sports, Brown is the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for the 2024 recruiting class and has played a critical role in attracting top talent to Georgia. This designation follows his recruitment of two five-star prospects, both of whom are ranked No. 1 in their respective positions. Brown brings with him deep ties to New Jersey and the Northeast, which will allow him immediate recruiting success for the Orange.

"Fran is an outstanding coach, recruiter and person, and exactly who we need to take Syracuse Football to the next level," says Wildhack. "Fran has clearly articulated a vision for the future of our football program, and he is a powerhouse recruiter with deep ties to the geographies from where we need to draw consistently. Fran has had tremendous success recruiting to a variety of programs—in the South, Southwest and Northeast, and I have no doubt he will bring that track record here to Syracuse. I am looking forward to welcoming Fran and his family to the Orange community. The future is bright for our football program."

A former student-athlete, Brown played football at Western Carolina University, where he was named a team captain and earned First Team All-SoCon selection at cornerback for the Catamounts. He went on to play two seasons in the NFL with the Cincinnati Bengals. Chancellor Kent Syverud says Brown's experience as a college and professional football player combined with his coaching prowess positions him well to support Syracuse University's student-athletes' success both on and off the field.

"What impressed me most during my conversation with Fran is his deep commitment to our student-athletes," says Chancellor Syverud. "He knows how to win and how to recruit. But most importantly, he is passionate about mentoring and guiding student-athletes in all aspects of their lives. Fran is the kind of coach who is going to demand excellence from his student-athletes and coaching staff in everything they do—on the field, in the classroom and in our community."

Brown's extensive resume includes stops at Rutgers University (2020-21), Temple University (2011-16, 2019), Baylor University (2017-18) and Paul VI High School (2010). During his career, Brown has worked with some of the top coaches in the country, including Georgia's Kirby Smart and University of Nebraska's Matt Rhule. Both Kirby and Rhule offered high praise for Brown.

"Fran is excellent," says Smart. "No ego, he's trustworthy, smart and he's worked really hard during his two seasons here to earn an opportunity like this. He has built great relationships in our building, our players love him and we couldn't be more excited for him, Teara and their family."

"Fran Brown will be a tremendous leader for the Syracuse program," says Rhule. "His commitment to improving the lives of the players he coaches will only be matched by his passion for coaching on the field. Syracuse will recruit elite talent, retain and develop those players, and produce a team that everyone can be proud of."

Prior to joining the Georgia staff, Brown was defensive backs coach at Rutgers for two seasons under Head Coach Greg Schiano. In his first year with the program, his secondary helped create 19 turnovers in 2020, 10 more than the previous season and the most since 2012 for the Scarlet Knights. Schiano offered congratulations to Brown upon the news of his hiring.

"I am proud of Fran and thrilled for him to have this opportunity," says Schiano. "Syracuse University is getting both a dynamic coach and a great addition to their community. I'm elated for Fran and his whole family."

Before Rutgers, Brown was co-defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach at Temple. While there, the defensive unit was nationally ranked in red zone defense, sacks, defensive touchdowns, tackles-for-loss and fumbles recovered. At Temple, Brown recruited or coached five players who went on to play in the NFL, including three draft picks: Harrison Hand (fifth round, Minnesota Vikings), Shaun Bradley (sixth round, Philadelphia Eagles) and Chapelle Russell (seventh round, Tampa Bay).

Brown has also recruited and worked with future NFL players, such as Sean Chandler, P.J. Walker, Hasson Reddick, Jullian Taylor, Sharif Finch, Jacob Martin and Raquell Armstead.

At Baylor, Brown served as the assistant head coach/defensive backs coach. While in Waco, he helped turn the program around from a 1-11 season in 2017 to a 7-6 mark the following year, which culminated in a Texas Bowl victory.

Brown grew up in Camden, New Jersey, and earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice at Western Carolina University. Brown and his wife, Teara, have two sons, Fran Jr. and Brayden, and a daughter, Ivy Ann.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – The Syracuse football team topped Ohio, 38-22, on Saturday evening at the JMA Wireless Dome to open the program's 2024 season and the Fran Brown era. The Orange have won 10 of their last 11 season openers, with two of those wins coming against the Bobcats (2021, 2024).

On the defensive end, Syracuse recorded four sacks, including two from Fadil Diggs, 10 tackles for loss, one interception, and forced one fumble. The Orange did not allow a passing touchdown.

Quarterback Kyle McCord was huge in his 'Cuse debut, throwing for career a high 354 yards and another careerbest four touchdowns. The touchdown mark was one shy of tying the program's single-game record. Three players in SU history have notched five in a game, most recently Eric Dungey (2018).

Trebor Pena accounted for three scores, two in the air and one on the ground, his first non-special teams points with the Orange. He was second on the squad with 78 yards
