### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech football looks to move to 5-2 on the season when it visits longtime Atlantic Coast Conference rival North Carolina on Saturday.
- Georgia Tech (4-2, 2-2 ACC) is off to its best six-game start since 2017. With a win, the Yellow Jackets would have their best record through seven games since it was 5-2 in 2014, en route to an appearance in the ACC Championship Game, an Orange Bowl win over Mississippi State, an 11-3 overall record No. 8/7 final national ranking.
- The Jackets are squaring off with North Carolina (3-3, 0-2 ACC) for the 59th time overall and the 44th time in the last 45 seasons. Since 1980, the only year that Tech and UNC did not meet on the gridiron was the Covid-19-affected season of 2020.
- Tech leads the all-time series, 33-22-3, including wins in each of the last three matchups, when the unranked Yellow Jackets have knocked off the 21st-, 13th- and 17th-ranked Tar Heels, respectively.
- The Yellow Jackets have also come away with wins in their last two trips to UNC's Kenan Stadium, with a 21-17 victory over the No. 13/11-ranked Tar Heels in 2022 and a 38-28 triumph in 2018. Tech has not lost at North Carolina since 2016.
- Georgia Tech QB **Haynes King** leads the ACC and ranks No. 3 nationally in completion percentage (.740). King has thrown eight touchdowns this season versus just one interception through six games.
- Under first-year defensive coordinator **Tyler Santucci**, Tech's defense is the most-improved unit in the nation against the run this season, allowing just 87.5 rushing yards per game, 133.8 yards per game less than it surrendered last season (221.3).

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

# 1

Georgia Tech is the No. 1-most improved rushing defense in the country this season. After allowing 221.3 rushing yards per game last season, which was worst in the ACC and 128th among 130 NCAA Division I FBS teams, the Yellow Jackets are allowing just 87.5 yards on the ground this season, which is tops in the ACC and ranks 11th nationally. The 133.8-yards-per-game improvement is the best in the nation.

# 3

The Yellow Jackets have held each of their last three opponents to less than 100 rushing yards, which marks the first time since Oct. 19-Nov. 2, 2013 that the Jackets have held three-straight opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground.

# 3

Georgia Tech ranks among the nation's top 45 in both total defense (32nd) and total offense (42nd) this season. The Yellow Jackets are one of only three ACC teams that are in the top 45 nationally in both categories, joining Louisville and Miami (Fl.).

# 3

Tech has won each of its last three meetings with North Carolina, knocking off a nationally ranked Tar Heels team in each matchup — a 45-22 win over No. 21/20 Carolina on Sept. 25, 2021, a 21-17 victory at No. 13/11 UNC on Nov. 20, 2022 and a 46-42 triumph over the 17th-ranked Tar Heels on Oct. 28 of last season.

QB **Haynes King** ranks No. 3 nationally (and leads the ACC) with a .740 completion percentage (125-of-169).

# 7

WR **Malik Rutherford** has caught at least seven passes in four of the last five games (7 vs. Georgia State on Aug. 31, 7 at Syracuse on Sept. 7, 7 at Louisville on Sept. 21 and 8 last Saturday at Duke). He is the first Yellow Jacket since at least 2000 to have seven or more receptions four times in a five-game stretch.

# 5-2

With a win over North Carolina, Georgia Tech would move to 5-2 on the season, which would be its best start since it also opened 5-2 in 2014.

# 10

Georgia Tech has blocked 10 kicks in 27 games since **Brent Key** took over as the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach in 2022. Since Oct. 1, 2022 (Key's first game at the helm of the Jackets), Tech's 10 blocked kicks are tied with Notre Dame for the most in the nation.

**A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...**

- move the Yellow Jackets to 5-2 overall on the season, which would be their best start since they began 5-2 in 2014;
- up its ACC record at 3-2;
- be its first true road win of the season (1-2);

- up it to 34-22-3 all-time versus the Tar Heels.

**GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY**

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was officially named the 21st head coach in Tech football history on Nov. 29, 2022.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech is 11-10 in Key's 21 games as the head coach at his alma mater, including a 7-6 mark in his first full season at the helm in 2023. The winning season was Tech's first since 2018 and was capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016.

The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina, which moved Georgia Tech to 4-0 against nationally ranked Atlantic Coast Conference opponents in Key's 21 games as head coach. Tech finished 5-3 overall in ACC play in '23, good for a tie for fourth place in the 14-team conference after being picked to finish 12th in the league's preseason poll.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1996-2000.

Prior to being named Georgia Tech's interim head coach on Sept. 26 of this season, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his four seasons at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jerrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

After redshirting as a true freshman, Key was a four-year starter at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 46, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

**NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER DUKE**

- Georgia Tech outgained Duke, 412-279, in a 24-14 win over the visiting Blue Devils.
- The Yellow Jackets handed Duke (5-1, 1-1 ACC) its first loss of the season.
- Georgia Tech's 412-279 yardage edge included a whopping 245-74 advantage on the ground.
- The Yellow Jackets' 245 rushing yards were a season high (prev.: 225 vs. Georgia State - Aug. 31).
- Tech had nearly a 2-to-1 edge in time of possession, holding the ball for 39:27 to Duke's 20:33.
- Georgia Tech trailed 14-10 going into the fourth quarter but scored on back-to-back touchdown drives of 85 and 70 yards to earn the comeback win.

- The Yellow Jackets dominated the fourth quarter in the come-from-behind victory, as they held the ball for 11:04, had a 121-46 yardage advantage and outscored the Blue Devils, 14-0.

- Tech won for first that when trailing after three quarters since it came back from a 35-24 deficit going into the fourth quarter of last season's 46-42 win over No. 17 North Carolina (Oct. 28, 2023).

- r-Jr. RB **Jamal Haynes** matched a career-high with 128 rushing yards (his first 100-yard game of the season). He also caught three passes for 12 yards, including a 3-yard go-ahead touchdown reception that gave the Yellow Jackets a 17-14 lead early in the third quarter.

- r-Jr. QB **Haynes King** finished 23-of-31 through the air for 167 yards and a season-high-tying two touchdown passes. Both of his touchdown passes came in the fourth quarter - the 3-yard go-ahead throw to Haynes early in the quarter and a 9-yard toss to WR **Eric Singleton, Jr.** that extended the lead to 24-14 midway through the period.

- r-Jr. WR **Malik Rutherford** had a career-high eight receptions for 76 yards.

- Defensively, Duke's 74 rushing yards marked the third-straight game that Georgia Tech allowed less than 100 on the ground.

- r-Jr. DB Ahmari Harvey led the Jackets defensively with a team-high seven tackles and the Yellow Jackets' first interception of the season, which sealed the victory late in the fourth quarter.

- Tech moved to 11-1 in games that have immediately followed a defeat under head coach **Brent Key**.

**GEORGIA TECH-UNC SERIES HISTORY**

- In a series that began in 1915, Georgia Tech and North Carolina are meeting for the 59th time on the gridiron.
- Georgia Tech leads the all-time series between the long-time rivals, 33-22-3.
- Georgia Tech is looking to even its all-time record at UNC, as it enters Saturday's game with a 12-13-3 record in Chapel Hill.
- The Yellow Jackets have won the last three meetings with the Tar Heels, knocking off a nationally ranked UNC squad in each matchup — a 45-22 win over No. 21/20 North Carolina on Sept. 25, 2021, a 21-17 victory at No. 13/11 UNC on Nov. 20, 2022 and a 46-42 triumph over the 17th-ranked Tar Heels on Oct. 28 of last season.

- The GT-UNC series is one that has been punctuated by streaks over the past three decades. Since 1992, the series has gone like this: UNC wins 5-of-6, GT wins 14-of-16 (including six-straight from 1998-2003 and five-straight from 2009-13), UNC wins three-straight, GT wins 5-of-6 dating back to 2017 (which includes the Jackets' current three-game winning streak).

- North Carolina is Georgia Tech's fifth-most-common all-time opponent.

- Georgia Tech has a special connection to North Carolina, in athletics director **J Batt**. Batt is a UNC alumnus and was a goalkeeper for the Tar Heels' men's soccer team that won the 2001 national title.

**TECH vs. RANKED OPPONENTS**

- Georgia Tech is 5-4 against ranked opponents under head coach **Brent Key**.
- The Yellow Jackets are an ultra-impressive 5-1 against ranked Atlantic Coast Conference competition under Key, with four of the five wins coming away from home (26-21 at No. 24 Pitt - Oct. 1, 2022; 21-17 at No. 13/11 North Carolina - Nov. 19, 2022; 23-20 at No. 17 Miami (Fla.) - Oct. 7, 2023; 46-42 vs. No. 17 North Carolina - Oct. 28, 2023; 24-21 vs. No. 10 Florida State, Aug. 24, 2024). The Jackets suffered their first defeat to a ranked ACC opponent under Key in their 31-19 loss at Louisville on Sept. 21.

- With a pair of wins over nationally ranked teams in each of the last two seasons, the Yellow Jackets have defeated multiple ranked teams in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2008 and 2009. With another win over a ranked team this season, Tech will have claimed victories over multiple ranked teams in three-straight seasons for the first time since 1955-57.

- Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1, 2022. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher - L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee - 1972; Pepper Rodgers - L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame - 1974; Bill Curry - L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama - 1980; Mac McWhorter - W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford - 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins - L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson - 2019).

• Dating back to the final two games of the 2022 season, Georgia Tech has not surrendered a sack in 11 of its last 21 games.

• Prior to allowing not allowing a sack in 11 of their last 21 games, the Yellow Jackets had surrendered a sack in 27-of-28 games.

• Tech's .729 completion percentage (132-of-181) leads the ACC, ranks third nationally and is on pace to shatter the single-season school record of .652 (208-of-319), set in 1999.

• After finishing 93rd nationally and ninth in the ACC with 21 turnovers lost last season, Georgia Tech is tied for fourth nationally and leads the ACC with just two turnovers lost through six games this season.

• In addition to ranking fifth nationally in fewest turnovers lost, the Yellow Jackets also rank in the top 10 nationally in fewest interceptions thrown (1 - 1-fourth) and fewest fumbles lost (1 - 1-sixth).

• The Yellow Jackets are a near perfect 20-for-21 in the red zone this season, with 17 touchdowns and three field goals. The Jackets lead the ACC and rank 13th nationally in red-zone offense (.952).

• Last Saturday vs. Duke, Georgia Tech rushed for a season-high 245 yards, its most in a game since it had 284 yards on the ground in last season's 30-17 win over UCF in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl (Dec. 22, 2023).

• With 245 rushing yards last Saturday against Duke and 225 on Aug. 31 vs. Georgia State, Tech has rushed for at least 200 yards in eight of its last 13 games (dating back to Oct. 21, 2023 vs. Boston College).

• A dominant ground game has been a predictor of Georgia Tech's success in recent seasons, as Tech has run for at least 200 yards in 14 of its last 25 wins.

• Georgia Tech is one of only three NCAA Division I FBS teams this season with three players that have at least four rushing touchdowns, and the only team with multiple quarterbacks that have rushed for at least four TDs.

• On Sept. 14 vs. VMI, Georgia Tech set season highs in nearly every other offensive category, including points (59), passing yards (382) and total yards (572).

• Tech's 59 points against VMI were its most in a game since a 66-31 win over Louisville on Oct. 5, 2018.

• The Yellow Jackets' 30 first downs vs. VMI were tied for the ninth-most in program history and the most since the Jackets had a program-record 35 at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2018.

• Georgia Tech's 382 passing yards vs. VMI were the sixth-most in program history and were the most since the Yellow Jackets had a program-record 486 versus Virginia on Nov. 10, 2001.

• Tech's 38 first-half points against VMI were tied for the 10th-most points in any half in program history and were the most since the Jackets scored 48 points in the first half vs. Alcorn State on Sept. 3, 2015.

**OFFENSE**

- The Yellow Jackets' five touchdowns in the first half vs. VMI were tied for the 10th-most in a half in program history and were the Jackets' most since they scored five TDs in the second half vs. Louisville on Oct. 9, 2020.

- Georgia Tech's 363 yards of total offense in the first half against VMI were the 11th-most in any half in program history and were the Yellow Jackets' most since they had 364 yards in the second half vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2017.

- On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Georgia Tech was relatively contained offensively through the first three-and-a-half quarters, as it had just 247 yards of offense with 8:39 to go in the game. However, the Yellow Jackets exploded for 131 yards in a 6:08 span late in the final period, scoring two touchdowns and cutting their deficit from 31-14 to 31-28.

- On Aug. 31 vs. Georgia State, Georgia Tech also had a relatively slow start on offense. The Yellow Jackets had just 79 total yards, including only 8 rushing yards, with 3:49 to go in the first half. However, the Jackets went on to amass 420 yards, including 217 on the ground, over the final 33:49 of the game and finished with 499 yards of total offense.

- In its 31-19 loss at No. 19/20 Louisville (Sept. 21), Georgia Tech had its streak of 17-straight games scoring at least 21 points snapped. The 17-game string of consecutive 21-point games was Tech's longest since it scored at least 21 in 17 games in a row from 2014-15 (all 14 games in '14 plus first three contests in '15).

- Georgia Tech has scored 30 or more points eight times since the beginning of last season, after only scoring 30 or more a total of nine times in the previous four seasons combined (2019-22).

- Georgia Tech has completed at least 21 passes in each of its last five games (25 vs. Georgia State - Aug. 31; 29 at Syracuse - Sept. 7; 23 vs. VMI - Sept. 14, 21 at Louisville - Sept. 21 and 23 vs. Duke - last Saturday), which all rank among the Yellow Jackets' top 20 single-game completions totals over the last 22 seasons.

- Tech's 29 completions at Syracuse were tied for the fourth-most in program history and were the Yellow Jackets' most in a game since they completed 30 vs. Maryland on Oct. 17, 2002.

- Georgia Tech completed passes to 12 different receivers vs. VMI (Sept. 14), which tied a school record originally set on Dec. 5, 1981 vs. Georgia.

- Georgia Tech's 12 different players with a reception vs. VMI not only matched the school record, but also marked the second time this season that at least 11 different Yellow Jackets have had a reception in a game (11 vs. Georgia State - Aug. 31) and the fourth time in 19 games since the beginning of last season that at least 10 different players have caught passes in a game for Tech (10 at Ole Miss - Sept. 16, 2023 and 10 at Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

- Prior to having at least 10 different players with a reception four times over the last two seasons, the feat had only been accomplished 16 times in the 130 previous seasons of Georgia Tech football.

- The most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense is its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has averaged just 0.95 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.9 turnovers per game in losses.

- Georgia Tech's offense is guided by second-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulker**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia (2020-22).

- Faulker boasts 19 years of experience on college football staffs, including 13 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18), Southern Miss (2019) and Georgia Tech (2023-pres.).

- In Faulkner's first season at the helm of Georgia Tech's offense in 2023, the Yellow Jackets ranked among the nation's leaders in rushing offense (12th - 203.8 ypg), fewest sacks allowed (15th - 1.15/gm) and fewest fumbles lost (15th - 4).

- Most notably, King has completed 74.0% of his passes this season (125-of-169) with eight touchdowns and just one interception.

- King's .740 completion percentage ranks third nationally and leads the ACC this season.

- If King's .740 completion percentage were to stand up through the season, it would shatter the single-season school record of .666, set by Joe Hamilton in 1999 (203-of-305), when he finished second in voting for the Heisman Trophy.

- King has connected on at least better than 70% of his passes in 4-of-6 games this season — 82.8% vs. Georgia State (24-of-29 - Aug. 31), 74.4% at Syracuse (29-of-39 - Sept. 7), 77.3% vs. VMI (17-of-22 - Sept. 14) and 74.2% vs. Duke (23-of-31 - last Saturday).

- King's .828 completion percentage vs. Georgia State is the second-highest in Georgia Tech history (min. 20 attempts).

- King is one of only two players in Georgia Tech history that has completed at least 80% of his passes in a game with at least 20 attempts, a feat that he has now accomplished twice.

• King made a record-breaking debut in the White and Gold, throwing for 313 yards and three touchdowns on 19-of-32 passing in last season's opener against Louisville (Sept. 1).

• King's 313 passing yards last season against Louisville marked the first time that a Georgia Tech player ever threw for 300 yards in his GT debut.

• King ran for career-high 150 yards last season vs. Boston College (Oct. 21). His 150 rushing yards were the most by a Tech quarterback since Tobias Oliver ran for 215 yards at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2018.

• Pyron's 24-yard touchdown pass against VMI was the fourth TD pass of Pyron's career and his first since Nov. 12, 2022 vs. Miami (Fla.).

• Pyron amassed an impressive 692 yards of total offense (565 passing, 127 rushing) and five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in just three games (two starts) as a true freshman in 2022.

**RUNNING BACKS**

• Georgia Tech r-Jr. **Jamal Haynes**, one of the nation's top running backs, has rushed for 366 yards and five touchdowns in six games this season.

• Haynes' five rushing touchdowns are good for a tie for fifth in the ACC and 34th nationally.

• Haynes also ranks t-fifth in the ACC and t-30th nationally with six total touchdowns, which includes last Saturday's 3-yard touchdown reception vs. Duke.

• Haynes had a breakout performance last Saturday vs. Duke, rushing for a career-high-tying 128 yards and amassing 140 total yards from scrimmage and a touchdown in the Yellow Jackets' 24-14 win.

• Haynes' 3-yard touchdown reception in last Saturday's game vs. Duke — his first receiving TD of the season and second of his career — gave the Yellow Jackets' a 17-14 lead with 10:40 to go in the game and proved to be the winning points in the Jackets' 24-14 victory.

• Haynes' 128 rushing yards vs. Duke matched his career high set in last season's 30-17 win over UCF in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl (Dec. 22, 2023).

• The 100-yard rushing game was Haynes' first of the season and fifth of his career.

• Haynes' 6.7 yards per rush vs. Duke was his highest average of the season, behind only his 6.8 avg. in the season opener vs. Florida State (Aug. 24).

• In the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), Haynes ran for 75 yards and two touchdowns on just 11 carries, while also catching two passes for 16 yards.

• Haynes' two rushing touchdowns against FSU (1 and 2 yards) were a career high.

• It was also the second two-touchdown game of Haynes' career — he had a rushing and receiving touchdown in last season's win over Syracuse (Nov. 18, 2023).

- Haynes had 84 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries (4.9 avg.) against Georgia State (Aug. 31).
- Haynes has scored at least one touchdown in 5-of-6 games this season and 12-of-19 games since the beginning of last season.

• Haynes, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the 2023 offseason, ran for 1,059 yards in his first season at the position in '23. He became Georgia Tech's first 1,000-yard rusher since QB TaQuon Marshall (1,146 yds.) and RB KirVonte Benson (1,053 yds.) both reached the 1,000-yard plateau in 2017.

• Haynes' 1,059 rushing yards last season were the 15th-most in Georgia Tech single-season history.

• Haynes finished last season ranked in the top 10 in the ACC in four statistical categories.

• Haynes' four 100-yard rushing games last were the most by a Yellow Jacket in a single season since QB Tobias Oliver had four 100-yard rushing games in 2018 and the most by a Tech RB since KirVonte Benson had five 100-yard games in 2017.

• Haynes scored eight touchdowns last season (seven rushing, one receiving), which were the most by a Georgia Tech RB since Dedrick Mills scored 13 in 2016.

• Haynes had a touchdown run in four-consecutive games last season – 4 yards at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 7, 16 yards vs. Boston College on Oct. 21, 4 yards vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28, 43 yards at Virginia on Nov. 4. He became the first Yellow Jacket with a rushing touchdown in four-consecutive games since Jerry Howard ran for touchdowns in four-straight contests from Sept. 29-Oct. 25, 2018 (vs. Bowling Green, at Louisville, vs. Duke, at Virginia Tech).

• After Sr. RB **Trey Cooley** was injured in the season opener vs. Florida State (Aug. 24), three young running backs — So. **Chad Alexander** and true Fr. **Anthony Carrie** and **Trelain Maddox** have shown the depth of Tech's running backs room behind Haynes.

• Alexander, a walk-on who played in nine games on special teams as a true freshman last season, did not have a carry in 2023.

• In four games this season, Alexander has averaged 5.4 yards per carry (141 yards on 26 attempts).

• Alexander ran for a career-high 59 yards on just 10 carries in last Saturday's 24-14 win over Duke, surpassing his previous career high of 41 yards, set in the season-opener vs. Florida State (Aug. 24).

• Carrie has rushed for 83 yards on just 13 carries (6.4 avg.) and a touchdown over three games as a true freshman.

• The depth of Georgia Tech's running backs room became even more apparent when Maddox made his collegiate debut vs. VMI (Sept. 14). • Rutherford is tied for first in the ACC and 15th nationally in receptions (37) and ranks third in the ACC and 25th nationally in receiving yards (474) this season.

• Rutherford is threatening to become only the third Yellow Jacket to ever lead the ACC in receptions, joining Calvin Johnson (5.43/gm - 2006) and Harvey Middleton (5.8/gm - 1996), and receiving yards, joining Johnson (85.9/gm - 2006) and Middleton (73.1/gm - 1996).

• Rutherford has moved into 18th place in Georgia Tech history with 1,263 career receiving yards. He needs 376 yards to crack into the school's all-time top 10.

• Rutherford had 113 receiving yards at No. 19/20 Louisville (Sept. 21), good for the second 100-yard receiving game of his career and season. It was also the second-highest yardage total of his career, behind only his 131 yards vs. Georgia State (Aug. 31).

**OFFENSE**

- Rutherford's 131 receiving yards against GSU are tied for the most by a Yellow Jacket since DeAndre Smelter — currently a graduate assistant coach at Tech — had 132 receiving yards against Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014. (Former Yellow Jacket Dominick Blaylock also had 131 receiving yards against Bowling Green on Sept. 30 of last season).

- Rutherford had 50 yards on four receptions, including a 35-yard touchdown, in just one half of action against VMI (Sept. 14). He did not play in the second half after helping stake the Yellow Jackets to a 38-0 halftime lead.

- Rutherford led all players with a game-high 66 receiving yards on a game-high-tying four receptions in Tech's season-opening win over No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24).

- Two of Rutherford's receptions against FSU had a huge impact on the game. The first was a 42-yard gain on Tech's first possession of the game, which set up a 1-yard touchdown run by QB Zach Pyron three plays later. The second was a 15-yard catch over the middle on third-and-12 that kept the Yellow Jackets' final touchdown drive alive late in the third quarter.

- Rutherford has caught at least one pass in 22-straight games, dating back to Nov. 12, 2022 vs. Miami (Fla.). His 22-consecutive games with a catch is the ninth-longest streak in Georgia Tech history.

- Singleton caught his second touchdown of the season last Saturday vs. Duke, a 9-yard reception midway through the fourth quarter that capped the scoring in the Yellow Jackets' 24-14 win.

- Singleton had five catches for 88 yards against No. 19/20 Louisville (Sept. 21).

- Against VMI (Sept. 14), Singleton caught five passes for 102 yards, including a 14-yard touchdown, in just one half of action. He did not play in the second half after helping stake the Yellow Jackets to a 38-0 halftime lead.

- Singleton had a breakout performance with 86 yards on five receptions at Syracuse (Sept. 7).

- Despite his relatively slow start to the season as a pass-catcher, Singleton impacted each of the first two games as a ball-carrier, with a 10-yard run in the season-opener at Florida State (Aug. 24) and a 35-yard touchdown run against Georgia State (Aug. 31).

- The touchdown run against GSU was his first TD of the season and the first rushing score of his career.

- With touchdown catches in each of Georgia Tech's first five games of last season — 5 yds. vs. Louisville (Sept. 1), 40 yds. vs. S.C. State (Sept. 9), 15 yds. at Ole Miss (Sept. 16), 31 yds. at Wake Forest (Sept. 23) and 53 yds. vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 30) — Singleton became the first Yellow Jacket ever with a touchdown reception in each of the first five games of his career.

- Singleton also became the first Yellow Jacket with a touchdown reception in five-consecutive games since Kelly Campbell caught touchdown passes in six-straight games in 2000 (Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina-Nov. 18 vs. Maryland).

- After an injury that caused him to miss six games and limited his effectiveness over the final five games following his return to action last season, r-Sr. **Chase Lane** has picked up right where he left off at the beginning of 2023.

- Lane, who like QB Haynes King, transferred to Georgia Tech from Texas A&M prior to the 2023 season, has caught 13 passes for 159 yards and a touchdown through six games this season.

- Lane's 13 receptions and 159 receiving yards rank fourth on the team this season (third among wideouts).

- Against VMI (Sept. 14), Lane had a season-high 54 receiving yards in just one half of action. He did not play in the second half after helping stake the Yellow Jackets to a 38-0 halftime lead.

- On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Lane caught a 4-yard touchdown pass, which was his first touchdown since a 48-yard TD catch in last season's opener versus Louisville (Sept. 1, 2023).

- Last season, Lane caught six passes for 105 yards and a touchdown over the first two games of the campaign, but was injured in the second game of the year versus South Carolina State. He would go on to miss the next six games, then had just one catch for 0 yards over the final five games of the season.

**TIGHT ENDS**

- Sr. **Avery Boyd** has settled into the tight ends room after spending much of his first four seasons as a Yellow Jacket at wide receiver.

- Boyd leads Georgia Tech's tight ends with 12 receptions (fifth on the team) for 161 yards (third) and two touchdowns (t-first) this season.

- 120 of Boyd's 161 receiving yards this season came in a three-game stretch — a career-high 56 yards at Syracuse (Sept. 7), 36 yards in just one half of action vs. VMI (Sept. 14) and 28 yards at Louisville (Sept. 21).

- Prior to catching multiple passes in 3-of-6 games this season (4 vs. GSU, 4 at Syracuse, 2 vs. VMI), Boyd had never had more than one reception in a game in his collegiate career.

- The 6-foot-3, 240-pound Boyd made the start at tight end in the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24) and made a 14-yard reception deep in Georgia Tech territory to kickstart an 89-yard touchdown drive that gave the Yellow Jackets a 21-14 lead early in the fourth quarter.

**OFFENSE**

- After not having a reception over the first 17 games of his career, Boyd has at least one catch in 11 of the last 17 contests.
- A trio of tight ends that transferred to Georgia Tech in the offseason — r-Sr. **Jackson Hawes** (Yale), r-Jr. **Josh Beetham** (Michigan) and r-Sr. **Ryland Goede** (Mississippi State) — have combined for 10 catches for 110 yards this season, led by Hawes' six catches for 77 yards.
- In addition to becoming a part of the passing game over their first six games as Yellow Jackets, Hawes, Beetham and Goede have all played a critical role in the run game through their blocking at the point of attack.
- Goede joined Hawes as the only Yellow Jacket tight end to catch multiple passes in a game this season with his two receptions for 11 yards last Saturday vs. Duke.
- Hawes has had multiple receptions in a game twice this season — two for 13 yards at Syracuse (Sept. 7) and two for 41 yards at No. 19/20 Louisville (Sept. 21).

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

- One of Georgia Tech's most experienced overall positions, the offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2024 roster have combined for 235 collegiate games played and 158 career starts.

- Most notably, Georgia Tech has allowed just one sack this season and ranks No. 2 nationally with 0.17 sacks allowed per game.

- Tech is one of only three NCAA Division I FBS teams — and the only one from a Power Four conference — that has surrendered one sack or less this season.

- Prior to allowing its first sack of the season last Saturday versus Duke, the Yellow Jackets had gone six-consecutive games overall without surrendering a sack, dating back to last year's season-ending win over UCF in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl.
- The string of six-straight games without a sack allowed, doubled Georgia Tech's previous record for consecutive games with no sacks allowed since sacks became an official NCAA statistic in 2000.

- Dating back to the final two games of the 2022 season, Georgia Tech has not surrendered a sack in 11 of its last 21 games.
- Prior to allowing not allowing a sack in 11 of their last 21 games, the Yellow Jackets had surrendered a sack in 27-of-28 games.
- Tech's pass blocking was especially impressive in its win over Georgia State (Aug. 31), as all five starters (RG **Keylan Rutledge** - 84.2, LG **Joe Fusile** - 83.9, RT **Jordan Williams** - 82.8, LT **Jordan Brown** - 82.7 and C **Weston Franklin** - 81.3), as well as reserve LT **Corey Robinson II** (81.2), received pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher from *Pro Football Focus*.

- On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Rutledge (86.6) and Robinson (85.2) once again received pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher from PFF.
- Against VMI (Sept. 14), Robinson (84.9) and Rutledge (84.0) once again led the Yellow Jackets in pass-blocking grades from PFF. They were among five Jackets that had pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher in the romp over VMI, joining Franklin (81.5), Williams (81.5) and reserve RG **Brandon Best** (80.3).

- Last Saturday vs. Duke, four of the Yellow Jackets' five starters had pass blocking grades of 80 or higher — Robinson (87.5), Rutledge (86.1), Fusile (86.1), Williams (81.3). Franklin just missed the 80 threshold with a grade of 79.0.

- Robinson has earned a pass-blocking grade of 80 or better in 5-of-6 games this season, as he was the only Yellow Jacket with a pass-blocking grade of 80-plus in the season opener against Florida State (81.9).

- In the run game, the Yellow Jackets are averaging 4.8 yards per rush, which ranks 39th nationally this season.

• Georgia Tech's defense is under the tutelage of new defensive coordinator **Tyler Santucci**.

• Through six games under Santucci, Tech's defense is allowing 19.3 points, 312.5 total yards and 87.5 rushing yards per game, all down significantly from the Yellow Jackets' averages a year ago, while the Jackets' 5.8 tackles for loss per game are up over 2023.

• Tech's rushing defense is tops in the ACC and 11th nationally, just one year removed from finishing last in the ACC and 128th out of 130 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

• Georgia Tech has held each of its last three opponents — VMI (12), Louisville (57) and Duke (74) — to less than 100 rushing yards, which marks the first time since Oct. 19-Nov. 2, 2013 that Tech has allowed less than 100 rushing yards in three-straight games (Syracuse – 75 yds., at Virginia – 68, Pitt – minus-5).

• The Yellow Jackets have surrendered less than 100 yards on the ground in 4-of-6 games total this season (98 vs. Florida State in addition to the last three games). The four games allowing less than 100 rushing yards are the most for Georgia Tech in any season since it held 6-of-14 opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground in 2013.

• Prior to allowing less than 100 rushing yards in three of the first five games of this season, Tech had surrendered at least 100 rushing yards in 33-consecutive games, dating back to allowing just 68 yards on the ground in a 45-22 win over North Carolina on Sept. 25, 2021.

• Last Saturday vs. Duke, Georgia Tech not only limited the Blue Devils to just 74 yards on the ground (46.6 yards less than they were averaging coming in), but also held them to 279 total yards (88.2 yards less than their 367.2-yard average) and 14 points (14.8 points less than their 28.8-point average).

• Georgia Tech's defense was dominant across the board in the Yellow Jackets 59-7 win over VMI (Sept. 14), limiting the Keydets to 104 total yards (2.2 yards per play), including just 28 rushing yards (0.4 avg.) and five total first downs.

• VMI's five first downs were tied for the second-fewest that Georgia Tech has ever surrendered in a game and the fewest since Miami (Fla.) had five first downs against the Yellow Jackets on Sept. 26, 1964.

• Four of VMI's five first downs came on their lone scoring drive of the game in the fourth quarter. The Keydets combined for just one first down on their other 12 possessions.

• VMI's seven points were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech since a 41-0 win over Alcorn State in the 2018 season opener (Sept. 1, 2018).

• Georgia Tech's 12 tackles for loss against VMI were the most in a game for the Yellow Jackets since they had 12 in a 21-17 win over No. 13 North Carolina on Nov. 19, 2022.

• Tech has had seven or more TFL in three of its four games this season - 7 vs. Florida State (Aug. 24), 8 vs. Georgia State (Aug. 31) and 12 vs. VMI (Sept 14).

• In his first game as Tech's defensive coordinator, Santucci's defense limited No. 10 Florida State, which averaged 401.6 yards of total offense per game in 2023, to just 291 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 24-21 win over the Seminoles (Aug. 24).

• Georgia Tech's rushing defense limited Florida State to just 98 rushing yards on 31 carries (3.2 avg.).

• Even more impressively, after FSU ran for 58 yards on five carries on its first possession of the game (11.6 avg.), Tech surrendered just 40 yards on 26 carries over the rest of the game (1.5 avg.).

• Perhaps the lone defensive area where Georgia Tech strives to return to its form from recent seasons is in turnover creation.

• The Yellow Jackets uncharacteristically rank 121st out of 133 NCAA Division I FBS teams this season with just three takeaways through six games (two fumble recoveries and an interception).

• Tech has been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for each of the last two seasons — tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.

• Since 2019, no team in the country has had more fumble recoveries than the Yellow Jackets' 57.

• Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 2.5 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 0.9 takeaways per game in losses.

**INDIVIDUAL**

• Despite seeing limited action in last Saturday's 59-7 rout over VMI, r-So. LB **Kyle Efford** is tied for 54th in NCAA Division I FBS and ninth in the ACC with 42 tackles through six games this season.

• Efford was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for the second time in his career after tallying 10 tackles in this season's opener vs. Florida State (Aug. 24).

• Efford's 13 tackles against Georgia State (Aug. 31) surpassed his previous career high of 11, set in last season's win over Syracuse (Nov. 18), when Efford was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week for the first time in his career.

• In all, Efford has recorded double-digit tackles four times in 13 games since moving into the starting lineup midway through last season.

• Despite not moving into the starting lineup until midway through last season, Efford led Georgia Tech with 81 tackles in 2023, 12 more than any other player on the squad.

• Efford became the first freshman to lead Georgia Tech in tackles since Darryl Smith tied for the team lead as a freshman in 1999 before going on to a 12-year NFL career with the Jacksonville Jaguars and Baltimore Ravens.

• Efford was the first Tech freshman to lead the team in tackles outright since Richardo Wimbush (91) in 1999.

• Sr. LB **Treniyas Tatum** has already set a career high for tackles for loss in a single season with 4.5 through five games. (prev.: 4.0 in 2023).

**DEFENSE**

- r-Jr. DB **Ahmari Harvey** ranks second on the team with 30 tackles from his cornerback position. He also leads the team with an interception and a forced fumble.

- Harvey's interception last Saturday vs. Duke not only sealed the Yellow Jackets' 24-14 win over the Blue Devils, but was also the Jackets' first INT of the season.

- Harvey's forced fumble vs. VMI was his first of the season and second of his career (his previous FF sealed Tech's 46-42 win over No. 17 North Carolina on Oct. 28 of last season).

- Harvey had a big day in Georgia Tech's season-opening win over Florida State (Aug. 24), finishing with a career-high eight tackles from his cornerback position.

- Two of Harvey's eight stops were among the most critical plays of the game. In the first quarter, his open-field tackle on fourth-and-4 forced a turnover on downs and squelched an FSU scoring threat with the Seminoles deep in GT territory. In the second quarter, he took down FSU QB D.J. Uiagalelei in the backfield on third-and-3 for his first-career tackle for loss, forcing the Seminoles to settle for a field goal.

- Jr. DB **Clayton Powell-Lee** and Sr. DB **LaMiles Brooks** have combined for 34 tackles (20 for Powell-Lee, 14 for Brooks), 2.5 tackles for loss (2.0 for Brooks, 0.5 for Powell-Lee) and two pass breakups (one apiece) this season, despite Brooks seeing limited playing time over the past four games due to injury, including being held out of action altogether against VMI (Sept. 14).

- Brooks and Powell-Lee are among five Yellow Jackets in the last 27 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same game (Charlie Thomas – Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, Brooks – Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech – Nov. 5, 2022, Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

- Prior to five Tech players recording an interception and a fumble recovery in the last 26 games, only two other Yellow Jackets had accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy – Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling – Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).

- Getting the majority of the snaps with Brooks recovering from injury over the past four games, So. DB **Taye Seymore** has totaled 23 tackles against Syracuse (10), VMI (4), Louisville (4) and Duke (5) and now ranks third on the team with 26 total stops.

- Seymore led Georgia Tech with a career-high 10 tackles at Syracuse (Sept. 7), shattering his previous career high of two (vs. Georgia – Nov. 25, 2023).

- r-Sr. DB **Warren Burrell**, has relatively quiet numbers through six games (16 tackles, three pass breakups), but that is likely a result of opposing teams not challenging him.

- *Pro Football Focus* ranks Burrell as the No. 6 cornerback in the ACC this season with a 78.4 pass coverage grade.

- Another Georgia Tech defender that has perhaps flown under the radar this season in terms of stats (10 tackles, 4.0 TFL in six games) but not by *Pro Football Focus* is DL **Jordan van den Berg**. PFF ranks Van den Berg as the No. 2 interior defensive lineman in the ACC and No. 10 interior DL in the nation this season in overall defense (85.1 grade) and the No. 9 interior lineman in the nation and top interior DL in the ACC against the run (89.1).

- Making his first start as a Yellow Jacket last week, van den Berg racked up a sack and two TFL in Tech's 24-14 win over Duke.

- A fifth-year senior from Ruisbroek, Belgium, **Sylvain Yondjoen** enters this season as one of the oldest players in college football at 26 years of age.

- Born on June 21, 1998, Yondjoen is the second-oldest player in the ACC, the fourth-oldest defensive lineman in the nation and the 17th-oldest player in NCAA Division I FBS.

• Tech has finished among the top 10 nationally in blocked kicks each of the last two seasons (t-10th in 2022 - four; t-third in 2023 - four).

• On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Georgia Tech matched a school record with two blocked kicks (a blocked field goal by Sr. DL **Zeek Biggers** in the first quarter and a blocked punt by Fr. DL **Amontrae Bradford** in the second quarter).

• It was the 11th time in program history that Georgia Tech blocked two kicks in a game and the second time in **Brent Key's** first 24 games as the Yellow Jackets' head coach. • Despite having played in just 18 games as a Yellow Jacket, r-so. PK **Aidan Birr** already ranks 12th in Georgia Tech history with 125 career points by kicking. He needs just 13 points to move into the program's all-time top 10.

• In this year's season opener against Florida State (Aug. 24), Birr made a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift Georgia Tech to a 24-21 win over the 10th-ranked Seminoles.

• Birr's game-winning field goal was the first "walk-off" field goal by a Yellow Jacket since current Kansas City Chief and three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker made a 24-yarder as time expired in the Yellow Jackets' 27-24 victory at Virginia Tech on Sept. 20, 2014.

• Birr — an honorable mention freshman all-America selection by *College Football News* — established himself as one of the nation's top place kickers as a redshirt freshman in 2023.

• After missing the entire 2022 campaign due to a knee injury sustained while still in high school in Kennedale, Texas (Kennedale H.S.), Birr made 17-of-19 field goals as a redshirt freshman in 2023, good for a .895 percentage

• Birr's .895 field-goal percentage last season was the second-highest in Georgia Tech single-season history (behind only former teammate Gavin Stewart's .923 in 2022), the highest by a freshman in Tech history, the ninth-best in the nation in 2023 and the third-best among freshmen nationally.

• Birr's 17 field goals made 88 total points last season were also the most ever by a Tech freshman.

• Seven of Birr's 17 field goals last season came from 40 yards or more, which were the most field goals of 40-plus yards by a Yellow Jacket since three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker (Kansas City Chiefs) made eight field goals from 40 yards or more as a senior at Tech in 2016

• Sr. P **David Shanahan** is averaging 44.3 yards per punt through six games this season. His 44.3-yard average would rank 27th nationally and sixth in the ACC this season if he had enough attempts to qualify for the official NCAA statistical rankings (min. 3.6 punts per game - Shanahan is averaging 3.2).

• Nine of Shanahan's 19 punts (47.4%) this season have been downed inside the 20 and 5-of-19 (26.3%) have traveled 50 yards or more.

• Shanahan, who has been Georgia Tech's starting punter since his first game with the program in 2021, ranks among Tech's all-time leaders in punts (fourth - 198), punt yards (third - 8,473) and punting average (third - 42.79).

• As has become commonplace at Georgia Tech, the Yellow Jackets are once again navigating one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2024.

• All 11 of Georgia Tech's NCAA Division I opponents in 2024 appeared in bowl games in 2023. The Yellow Jackets are the only team in the nation with that distinction.

• Tech's 2024 opponents had a combined record of 103-54 in 2023, which gives the Jackets the nation's fourth-toughest schedule in terms of opponents' 2023 winning percentage.

• Facing a daunting schedule is nothing new for Georgia Tech, as its 2021 schedule was the nation's toughest and its 2022 slate ranked sixth, based on opponents' final winning percentage.

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the last three-plus seasons. In their 22 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in 15-of-22 games and are plus-33 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 19 of its 31 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-28 overall in turnover margin in those 31 losses.

• This season, Georgia Tech is plus-2 in turnover margin in its four wins and minus-1 in its two defeats.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were plus-11 in turnover margin in their seven wins and minus-seven in their six defeats.

• One area where Georgia Tech is looking to return to last season's form is in penalties.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were one of the ACC's least-penalized teams last season, ranking third in the conference in fewest penalties per game (5.17) and fourth in fewest penalty yards per game (45.58).

• However, through six games this season, Tech ranks sixth in the ACC in penalties per game (5.17) and penalty yards per game (43.0).

• Head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

• Georgia Tech's 11 full-time coaches have combined to win 79 championships at high school (state), college (division/conference/national) and NFL (division/conference/Super Bowl) levels as players and coaches.
