### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech travels to Athens, Ga. for the 118th edition of Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate versus archrival and No. 6-ranked Georgia on Friday night.
- This year's matchup marks only the second time in the 118-game history of the Georgia Tech-Georgia rivalry — which dates back to 1893 — that the teams will square off on a Friday. The previous Friday matchup came on Nov. 25, 1994 in Athens.
- While Georgia has won 18 of the last 21 matchups in the rivalry, the Yellow Jackets' most recent success in the series has come in Athens, where Tech has won twice in its last four trips and three times in its last seven visits.
- The Yellow Jackets are facing their third top-10 opponent of the season. Tech is 2-0 in its previous two matchups against top-10 teams — a 24-21 win over then-No. 10-ranked Florida State in the season opener in Dublin, Ireland on Aug. 24 and a 28-23 triumph over then-No. 4 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 9. The Jackets are one of only 12 unranked teams that have beaten a top-10 opponent this season, and the only unranked squad that has done it twice.
- With a win on Friday, this season's Yellow Jackets would become only the second team in Georgia Tech history with three wins over top-10 opponents in one season. The 1959 Jackets defeated No. 6 SMU (16-12), No. 6 Clemson (16-6) and No. 8 Tennessee (14-7) in three-consecutive weeks — Sept. 26, Oct. 3 and Oct. 10, 1959.
- With seven regular-season victories (its most since 2017), Georgia Tech has clinched back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2013 and 2014.

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

# 2-0

Georgia Tech is 2-0 this season against top-10 opponents — a season-opening 24-21 win over then-No. 10 Florida State on Aug. 24 in Dublin, Ireland and a 28-23 victory over then-No. 4 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 9. The Yellow Jackets are one of only 12 unranked teams that have beaten a top-10 opponent this season, and the only unranked team that has done it twice. Tech is also only the ninth team in ACC history to knock off two top-10 opponents in the same regular season (Clemson - 1981, Florida State - 1993, Florida State - 1999, Florida State - 2000, Miami - 2004, Virginia Tech - 2004, Maryland - 2007, Florida State - 2013 and Georgia Tech - 2024).

Georgia Tech is tied for second nationally in fewest sacks allowed this season (5 - .45/game). Army West Point leads the nation in fewest sacks allowed (4 - .40/game), but has attempted 264 fewer passes than the Yellow Jackets (Army - 78 pass attempts, GT - 342).

The Yellow Jackets are one of only four ACC teams that rank in the top 50 nationally in both total defense (41st - 340.5 ypg) and total offense (46th - 414.7 ypg), joining the top three teams in the conference standings — No. 8/7 Miami and No. 9 SMU and No. 12 Clemson.

QB **Haynes King** ranks No. 4 nationally (and leads the ACC) with a .725 completion percentage (139-of-194).

# 16

Georgia Tech went 5-0 in games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field this season, becoming the 16th Tech team to finish unbeaten and untied at Bobby Dodd since the stadium opened as Grant Field in 1913. This season's Jackets were the first Tech team since 1999 and only the third since 1966 (1990 and '99) to be unbeaten and untied at Bobby Dodd.

# 118

Friday's game is the 118th edition of the Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate rivalry between Georgia Tech and Georgia. The series began in 1893 and has been played every year since except 1894-96, 1901, 1908, 1917-24 and 2020. It is the 14th-oldest and tied for the 19th most-played series in NCAA Division I FBS. It is also the sixth-oldest and tied for the 11th most-played in-state rivalry in FBS.

# 265/322

Fr. QB Aaron Philo's 265 passing yards in last Thursday's 30-29 win over NC State were the most by a true freshman at Georgia Tech since Jeff Sims threw for 277 on Sept. 12, 2020 at Florida State. Philo's 322 yards of total offense were the most by a true freshman at Tech since Sims had 326 against UCF on Sept. 19, 2020.

**A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...**

- give it a final regular-season record of 8-4, which would be its best regular-season mark since it also went 8-4 in 2016;
- be its third win of the season over a top-10 opponent, which would match the school record originally set in 1959;
- also break the ACC record for most wins over top-10 opponents in a single regular season;
- up it to 3-2 against nationally ranked teams this season;
- be its first win over archrival Georgia since 2016, snapping a six-game losing streak in the series;
- up it to 42-71-5 all-time against Georgia;
- be its third win in its last five games at UGA's Sanford Stadium.

- give it a final regular-season record of 7-5, which would be its best regular-season mark since it also went 7-5 in 2018;
- be its seventh-straight loss to archrival Georgia;

**GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY**

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was officially named the 21st head coach in Tech football history on Nov. 29, 2022.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech is 11-10 in Key's 21 games as the head coach at his alma mater, including a 7-6 mark in his first full season at the helm in 2023. The winning season was Tech's first since 2018 and was capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016.

The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina, which moved Georgia Tech to 4-0 against nationally ranked Atlantic Coast Conference opponents in Key's 21 games as head coach. Tech finished 5-3 overall in ACC play in '23, good for a tie for fourth place in the 14-team conference after being picked to finish 12th in the league's preseason poll.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1996-2000.

Prior to being named Georgia Tech's interim head coach on Sept. 26 of this season, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his four seasons at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

After redshirting as a true freshman, Key was a four-year starter at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 46, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

**NOTING TECH'S WIN OVER NC STATE**

• True Fr. QB **Aaron Philo** engineered a seven-play, 75-yard drive that spanned 1:08 and was capped by his 18-yard touchdown run that lifted Georgia Tech to a 30-29 come-from-behind victory over NC State last Thursday at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field.

• The heart-stopping triumph clinched back-to-back winning seasons for Tech (7-4, 5-3 ACC) for the first time in a decade (2013-14) and its first perfect record at Bobby Dodd Stadium in a quarter century (1999).

• Georgia Tech led 23-14 with just over four minutes to go in the ballgame, but NC State scored two touchdowns in a 2:37 span to take a 29-23 lead with 90 seconds remaining.

• Philo was responsible for all 75 yards on the game-winning drive, completing 4-of-4 passes for 33 yards and running three times for 42 yards and the go-ahead score.

• Despite Philo's heroics on the game-winning drive, victory was not assured for the Jackets until NC State kicker Collin Smith's 58-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left as time ran out.

• After Georgia Tech took a 16-7 lead into the fourth quarter, the team combined for 36 points in the final period (22 for NC State, 14 for Tech).

• Tech intercepted NC State Fr. QB C.J. Bailey three times, which was a season high for the Yellow Jackets in both interceptions (prev.: 1 - twice) and total takeaways (prev.: 2 - Oct. 12 at North Carolina). The Jackets' three interceptions surpassed their season total (2) going into the game.

• r-So. LB **E.J. Lightsey** returned his first collegiate interception 21 yards for a touchdown, while r-Jr. DL **Romello Height** returned his first collegiate INT 16 yards to the 3 yard line, setting up a 3-yard touchdown run by QB Haynes King one play later.

• The Yellow Jackets' other INT by Sr. LB **Trenilyas Tatum** was also the first of his career.

• Philo's 265 passing yards, 57 rushing yards and 322 yards of total offense were all career highs.

• Philo's 265 passing yards were the most by a Georgia Tech true freshman since Jeff Sims threw for 277 on Sept. 12, 2020 at Florida State and the third-most by a Tech true freshman since 2000.

• Philo's 322 yards of total offense were the most by a true freshman at Tech since Sims had 326 against UCF on Sept. 19, 2020 and the third-most by a Tech true freshman since 2000.

• Philo's 19 completions are tied for the fourth-most by a Georgia Tech true freshman since 2000.

• So. WR **Eric Singleton, Jr.** had five receptions for 106 yards. It was Singleton's second 100-yard receiving game of the season (prev.: 102 vs. VMI - Sept. 14) and third of his career.

• r-So. PK **Aidan Birr's** three made field goals (44, 41 and 45 yards) were a season high (prev.: 2 at North Carolina - Oct. 12 and at Virginia Tech - Oct. 26) and matched a career high (3 - three times last season).

• Birr became the first Yellow Jacket to make three 40-yard field goals in a game since Scott Blair vs. Duke on Nov. 20, 2010.

**CLEAN, OLD-FASHIONED HATE**

• Georgia Tech and Georgia are meeting for the 118th edition of their "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate" rivalry.

• The series dates back to 1893, Georgia Tech's second season of football. Tech won the first meeting, 28-6, in Athens.

• After a three-year break in the series from 1894-96, the teams have met annually since 1897 with the exception of 1901, 1908, an eight-year gap from 1917-24 and 2020.

• In 2020, Georgia Tech and Georgia did not play for the first time since 1924. The Southeastern Conference's decision to play only conference games due to the Covid-19 pandemic snapped a string of 96-consecutive annual meetings between the in-state rivals.

• The Georgia Tech-Georgia series is one of major college football's oldest and most-played rivalries. Only 13 NCAA Division I FBS rivalries began before Georgia Tech and Georgia played for the first time in 1893 and only 18 FBS rivalries have been played more often than "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate."

• Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate is also the sixth-oldest and tied for the 11th-most-played in-state rivalry in FBS.

The Jackets suffered their only defeat to a ranked ACC opponent under Key in their 31-19 loss at Louisville on Sept. 21.

• With a pair of wins over nationally ranked teams in each of the last three seasons, the Yellow Jackets have defeated multiple ranked teams in three-consecutive seasons for the first time since 1955-57.

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1, 2022. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher - L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee - 1972; Pepper Rodgers - L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame - 1974; Bill Curry - L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama - 1980; Mac McWhorter - W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford - 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins - L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson - 2019).

**TECH vs. TOP-10 OPPONENTS**

• For only the second time in program history, Georgia Tech has two regular-season wins over top-10 opponents this season — Aug. 24 vs. No. 10 Florida State (24-21 in Dublin, Ireland) and Nov. 9 vs. No. 4 Miami (28-23 at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field).

• With a win over No. 6 Georgia on Friday night, Georgia Tech would match the school record for wins over top-10 opponents. The 1959 Yellow Jackets defeated No. 6 SMU (16-12), No. 6 Clemson (16-6) and No. 8 Tennessee (14-7) in three-consecutive weeks — Sept. 26, Oct. 3 and Oct. 10, 1959.

• Tech has already tied the ACC record for most regular-season wins over top-10 opponents. They are the only the ninth team in ACC history to knock off two top-10 opponents in the same regular season (joining Clemson - 1981, Florida State - 1993, Florida State - 1999, Florida State - 2000, Miami - 2004, Virginia Tech - 2004, Maryland - 2007, Florida State - 2013).

• The Yellow Jackets are one of 12 unranked teams to defeat a top-10 opponent in 2024, and the only team to do it twice.

• Tech has been ranked in the AP poll 308 times since the poll's inception in 1936 (the poll listed 20 teams from 1936-88, except for from 1961-67, when only 10 teams were ranked; it began ranking 25 teams in 1989).

• The Yellow Jackets have received a vote in each of the last two week's AP polls, coming in at 38th overall with one point on Nov. 18 and tied for 34th overall with two points this week.

• The Yellow Jackets are 36-for-41 in the red zone this season, with 29 touchdowns and seven field goals. The Jackets rank fourth in the ACC and 44th nationally in red-zone offense (.878).

• Tech's .637 completion percentage (218-of-342) ranks 43rd nationally. Prior to QB **Haynes King** missing two games due to injury (Oct. 19 vs. Notre Dame and Oct. 26 at Virginia Tech), the Yellow Jackets had a .706 completion percentage (144-of-204), which led the ACC, ranked 10th nationally and was on pace to shatter the single-season school record of .652 (208-of-319), set in 1999.

• Georgia Tech has rushed for at least 245 yards in a game three times this season — 245 vs. Duke (Oct. 5), 371 at North Carolina (Oct. 12) and 271 vs. No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9).

• Tech's three games with at least 245 rushing yards are tied for the second-most in the ACC (Clemson - 4) and 20th nationally this season.

• Tech's 371 rushing yards against North Carolina were its most in a game since it ran for 377 yards against Duke on Nov. 28, 2020.

• The Yellow Jackets' 271 rushing yards against Miami are the most that the Hurricanes — which came into the game allowing just 95.2 yards per game on the ground, good for eighth nationally — have allowed this season (prev.: 206 vs. Virginia Tech - Sept. 27).

• With four 200-yard rushing games this season (225 vs. Georgia State on Aug. 31 245 vs. Duke, 371 vs. UNC and 271 vs. Miami), Georgia Tech has rushed for at least 200 yards in 10 of its last 18 games (dating back to Oct. 21, 2023 vs. Boston College).

• A dominant ground game has been a predictor of Georgia Tech's success in recent seasons, as Tech has run for at least 200 yards in 16 of its last 28 wins.

• The Yellow Jackets' five touchdown runs at UNC were tied for their most TD runs in a game over their previous 74 contests (dating back to Oct. 13, 2018). During that 74-game span, the Jackets also rushed for five TDs in wins over Western Carolina (Sept. 10, 2022) and Virginia (Nov. 4, 2023).

• On Sept. 14 vs. VMI, Georgia Tech set season highs in nearly every other offensive category, including points (59), passing yards (382) and total yards (572).

• Tech's 59 points against VMI were its most in a game since a 66-31 win over Louisville on Oct. 5, 2018.

• The Yellow Jackets' 30 first downs vs. VMI were tied for the ninth-most in program history and the most since the Jackets had a program-record 35 at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2018.

• Georgia Tech's 382 passing yards vs. VMI were the sixth-most in program history and were the most since the Yellow Jackets had a program-record 486 versus Virginia on Nov. 10, 2001.

• Tech's 38 first-half points against VMI were tied for the 10th-most points in any half in program history and were the most since the Jackets scored 48 points in the first half vs. Alcorn State on Sept. 3, 2015.

• The Yellow Jackets' five touchdowns in the first half vs. VMI were tied for the 10th-most in a half in program history and were the Jackets' most since they scored five TDs in the second half vs. Louisville on Oct. 9, 2020.

• Georgia Tech's 363 yards of total offense in the first half against VMI were the 11th-most in any half in program history and were the Yellow Jackets' most since they had 364 yards in the second half vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2017.

• On Aug. 31 vs. Georgia State, Georgia Tech had a relatively slow start on offense. The Yellow Jackets had just 79 total yards, including only 8 rushing yards, with 3:49 to go in the first half. However, the Jackets went on to amass 420 yards, including 217 on the ground, over the final 33:49 of the game and finished with 499 yards of total offense.

• On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Georgia Tech was also relatively contained offensively through the first three-and-a-half quarters, as it had just 247 yards of offense with 8:39 to go in the game. However, the Yellow Jackets exploded for 131 yards in a 6:08 span late in the final period, scoring two touchdowns and cutting their deficit from 31-14 to 31-28.

• Georgia Tech has scored 30 or more points eight times since the beginning of the 2023 season, after only scoring 30 or more a total of nine times in the previous four seasons combined (2019-22).

• Georgia Tech has completed at least 21 passes in 7-of-11 games this season (25 vs. Georgia State - Aug. 31; 29 at Syracuse - Sept. 7; 23 vs. VMI - Sept. 14, 21 at Louisville - Sept. 21, 23 vs. Duke - Oct. 5 22 vs. NC State - Nov. 21 and 21 at Virginia Tech - Oct. 26), which all rank among the Yellow Jackets' top-20 single-game completions totals over the last 22 seasons.

• Tech's 29 completions at Syracuse were tied for the fourth-most in program history and were the Yellow Jackets' most in a game since they completed 30 vs. Maryland on Oct. 17, 2002.

**OFFENSE**

- Georgia Tech completed passes to 12 different receivers vs. VMI (Sept. 14), which tied a school record originally set on Dec. 5, 1981 vs. Georgia.
- Georgia Tech's 12 different players with a reception vs. VMI not only matched the school record, but also marked the second time this season that at least 11 different Yellow Jackets have had a reception in a game (11 vs. Georgia State - Aug. 31) and the fourth time in 20 games since the beginning of last season that at least 10 different players have caught passes in a game for Tech (10 at Ole Miss - Sept. 16, 2023 and 10 at Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).
- Prior to having at least 10 different players with a reception four times over the last two seasons, the feat had only been accomplished 16 times in the 130 previous seasons of Georgia Tech football.

- The most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense is its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has averaged just 0.9 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.9 turnovers per game in losses.
- In its 31-19 loss at No. 19/20 Louisville (Sept. 21), Georgia Tech had its streak of 17-straight games scoring at least 21 points snapped. The 17-game string of consecutive 21-point games was Tech's longest since it scored at least 21 in 17 games in a row from 2014-15 (all 14 games in '14 plus first three contests in '15).
- When Georgia Tech was limited to just six points on two field goals at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26), it marked the only time in **Brent Key's** 32 games as head coach that the Yellow Jackets haven't score a touchdown in a game. Prior to Oct. 26, the last time the Jackets didn't find the end zone in a game was in a 42-0 loss to Ole Miss on Sept 17, 2022.
- Georgia Tech's offense is guided by second-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulker**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia (2020-22).
- Faulker boasts 19 years of experience on college football staffs, including 13 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18), Southern Miss (2019) and Georgia Tech (2023-pres.).
- In Faulkner's first season at the helm of Georgia Tech's offense in 2023, the Yellow Jackets ranked among the nation's leaders in rushing offense (12th - 203.8 ypg), fewest sacks allowed (15th - 1.15/gm) and fewest fumbles lost (15th - 4).

**QUARTERBACKS**

- **r-Jr. Haynes King** has added to his resume as one of college football's top signal-callers this season.
- Despite missing two games due to injury (Oct. 19 vs. No. 12/11 Notre Dame and Oct. 26 at Virginia Tech) and being limited in his ability to pass in his return to the lineup vs. No. 4 Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 9) and NC State (Nov. 21), King continues to rank among the top 30 nationally in three official statistical categories this season.

- Most notably, King has completed 72.5% of his passes this season (145-of-200) with nine touchdowns and just one interception.
- King's .725 completion percentage ranks fourth nationally and leads the ACC.
- If King's .725 completion percentage were to stand up through the season, it would shatter the single-season school record of .666, set by Joe Hamilton in 1999 (203-of-305), when he finished second in voting for the Heisman Trophy.
- King has connected on at least better than 70% of his passes in 6-of-9 games this season — 82.8% vs. Georgia State (24-of-29 - Aug. 31), 74.4% at Syracuse (29-of-39 - Sept. 7), 77.3% vs. VMI (17-of-22 - Sept. 14), 74.2% vs. Duke (23-of-31 - Oct. 5) and 100% vs. No. 4 Miami (6-of-6 - Nov. 9) and NC State (3-of-3 - Nov. 21).
- King has completed 100% of his passes in two games since returning to the lineup against No. 4 Miami on Nov. 9. His last incomplete pass came on the first play of the fourth quarter at North Carolina on Oct. 12 (his next-to-lass pass attempt of the game).
- King's .828 completion percentage vs. Georgia State is the second-highest in Georgia Tech history (min. 20 attempts).

- King is one of only two players in Georgia Tech history that has completed at least 80% of his passes in a game with at least 20 attempts, a feat that he has now accomplished twice.

- King's 29 completions at Syracuse (Sept. 7) tied for the third-most in Georgia Tech single-game history and tied for the second-most without an interception in the school's all-time annals. - King completed 17-of-22 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns in just one half of action vs. VMI (Sept. 14). He did not see action in the second half after helping stake the Yellow Jackets to a 38-0 halftime lead.
- King has accounted for more than 300 yards of total offense three times this season — 302 on Aug. 31 vs. Georgia State (275 passing, 27 rushing), 333 on Sept. 7 at Syracuse (266 passing, 67 rushing) and 370 on Sept. 21 at Louisville (312 passing, 58 rushing).

• Georgia Tech r-Jr. **Jamal Haynes**, one of the nation's top running backs, has rushed for 717 yards and nine touchdowns in 11 games this season.

• In the first two games of last month, Haynes rushed for a whopping 298 yards on just 38 carries (7.8 avg.) over two games — 128 vs. Duke (Oct. 5) and a career-high 170 at North Carolina (Oct. 12).

• Haynes' career-best 170 rushing yards against UNC came on just 19 carries (8.9 avg.).

• Haynes capped the 170-yard performance at UNC with one of the Yellow Jackets' signature plays of the season to date, a 68-yard touchdown run with 16 seconds remaining that broke a 34-34 tie and lifted Tech to a 41-34 victory.

• The week before his career-best performance against UNC, Haynes had matched his previous career high with 128 rushing yards against Duke (Oct. 5).

• Haynes totaled 140 yards from scrimmage against Duke with his 128 rushing yards and 12 yards on three receptions.

• Haynes also scored the winning points for Georgia Tech against Duke, as his 3-yard touchdown reception — his first receiving TD of the season and second of his career — gave the Yellow Jackets' a 17-14 lead with 10:40 to go in the game and proved to be the winning points in the Jackets' 24-14 victory.

• With his back-to-back 100-yard rushing games against Duke and UNC, Haynes has gone over the century mark on the ground twice this season and six times in his career.

• Haynes is just two 100-yard rushing games shy of cracking into Georgia Tech's all-time top 10 for 100-yard rushing games in a career.

• Haynes was well on his way to a third 100-yard game against No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9), rushing for 83 yards on just three carries, including a 65-yard gain and a 16-yard touchdown on the opening drive of the game. However, he was forced to leave the game due to injury after the first play of the Yellow Jackets' second possession.

• Haynes has averaged more than 6.5 yards per rush four times this season — 27.7 vs. Miami, 8.9 at UNC, 6.8 vs. Florida State (Aug. 24) and 6.7 vs. Duke.

• In the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24), Haynes ran for 75 yards and two touchdowns on just 11 carries, while also catching two passes for 16 yards.

• Haynes had 84 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries (4.9 avg.) against Georgia State (Aug. 31).

• Haynes has scored at least one touchdown in 8-of-10 games this season and 15-of-23 games since the beginning of last season.

• Haynes' 1,776 career rushing yards rank 22nd in Georgia Tech history.

• Haynes, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the 2023 offseason, ran for 1,059 yards in his first season at the position in '23. He became Georgia Tech's first 1,000-yard rusher since QB TaQuon Marshall (1,146 yds.) and RB KirVonte Benson (1,053 yds.) both reached the 1,000-yard plateau in 2017.

• Haynes' 1,059 rushing yards last season were the 15th-most in Georgia Tech single-season history.

• Haynes' four 100-yard rushing games last were the most by a Yellow Jacket in a single season since QB Tobias Oliver had four 100-yard rushing games in 2018 and the most by a Tech RB since KirVonte Benson had five 100-yard games in 2017.

• A quartet of running backs — So. **Chad Alexander**, true Fr. **Anthony Carrie** and **Trelain Maddox** and Sr. **Trey Cooley** — have shown the depth of Tech's running backs room behind Haynes.

• Alexander, a walk-on who played in nine games on special teams as a true freshman last season, did not have a carry in 2023.

• In eight games this season, Alexander has averaged 5.3 yards per carry (248 yards on 47 attempts).

• Alexander rushed for 120 yards over the first two games of last month — 59 vs. Duke (Oct. 5) and 61 at North Carolina (Oct. 12).

• Alexander's 61 rushing yards at UNC included his first-career touchdown on a 2-yard run.



**OFFENSE**

- Making Alexander's career-high 61 rushing yards and first-career TD at UNC even more special was the fact that it came just four days after the former walk-on was put on scholarship on Tuesday, Oct. 8.

- Alexander opened the season by rushing for 41 yards on seven carries (5.9 avg.) against Florida State (Aug. 24).

- Carrie has rushed for 120 yards on just 25 carries (4.8 avg.) and a touchdown over six games as a true freshman.

- In the most extensive action of his young career, Carrie ran for 33 yards on a season-high eight carries at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26).

- Carrie's career-high 41 rushing yards came on just four attempts in his collegiate debut vs. Georgia State (Aug. 31).

- Carrie has averaged at least 9 yards per rush twice in five games this season — 10.3 vs. Georgia State and 9.3 vs. VMI (37 yards on four carries — Sept. 14).

- The depth of Georgia Tech's running backs room became even more apparent when Maddox made his collegiate debut vs. VMI (Sept. 14). Just a year removed from a serious knee injury sustained as a senior at nearby Parkview H.S., Maddox ran nine times for a game-high 53 yards and his first collegiate TD (3 yards) vs. VMI.

- Maddox has run for 67 yards and a score in two games as a true freshman.

- Cooley, who was injured on the Yellow Jackets' first kickoff return of the season vs. Florida State (Aug. 24) and subsequently missed the next eight games, returned to action and provided Tech with six carries for 26 valuable yards (4.3 avg.) and caught a 4-yard pass against No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9).

- Rutherford ranks 15th in Georgia Tech history with 1,416 career receiving yards.

- Rutherford needs just 223 yards to crack into Tech's all-time top 10 for career receiving yards.

- From Aug. 31-Oct. 5, Rutherford was on a torrid stretch with at least seven receptions in 4-of-5 games (seven vs. Georgia State, Syracuse and Louisville, eight vs. Duke). He is the only Yellow Jacket to have seven or more receptions four times in a five-game stretch since at least 2000.

- After hauling in seven receptions three times in the previous four games, Rutherford set a new career high with eight catches vs. Duke (Oct. 5).

- Rutherford had 113 receiving yards at No. 19/20 Louisville (Sept. 21), good for the second 100-yard receiving game of his career and season. It was also the second-highest yardage total of his career, behind only his 131 yards vs. Georgia State (Aug. 31).

- Rutherford's 131 receiving yards against Georgia State (Aug. 31) are tied for the most by a Yellow Jacket since DeAndre Smelter — currently a graduate assistant coach at Tech — had 132 receiving yards against Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014. (Former Yellow Jacket Dominick Blaylock also had 131 receiving yards against Bowling Green on Sept. 30 of last season).

- Rutherford had 50 yards on four receptions, including a 35-yard touchdown, in just one half of action against VMI (Sept. 14). He did not play in the second half after helping stake the Yellow Jackets to a 38-0 halftime lead.

- Rutherford led all players with a game-high 66 receiving yards on a game-high-tying four receptions in Tech's season-opening win over No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24).

- Two of Rutherford's receptions against FSU had a huge impact on the game. The first was a 42-yard gain on Tech's first possession of the game, which set up a 1-yard touchdown run by QB Zach Pyron three plays later. The second was a 15-yard catch over the middle on third-and-12 that kept the Yellow Jackets' final touchdown drive alive late in the third quarter.

- So. WR **Eric Singleton, Jr.** leads Georgia Tech with 668 receiving yards and ranks second on the team behind Rutherford with 48 receptions on the season.

- Singleton's two touchdown receptions are tied for third on the team.

- Georgia Tech also utilizes Singleton's blazing speed in the run game, as he ranks fifth on the team with 117 rushing yards on just 18 carries, good for a team-high 6.5-yard average (min. three carries).

• On Sept. 21 at Louisville, Singleton surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards in the second-fewest games in Georgia Tech history.

• Singleton reached the 1,000-yard plateau in his 17th game as a Yellow Jacket. Only College and Pro Football Hall of Famer Calvin Johnson eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark in fewer games as a Yellow Jacket.

• Singleton has led Tech in receiving yards five times this season, including in three of the last four contests — 59 yds. vs. No. 12/11 Notre Dame (Oct. 19), 90 yds. at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26) and 106 yds. vs. NC State (Nov. 21).

• Singleton posted his second 100-yard receiving game of the season and third of his career when he caught five passes for a season-best 106 yards in last Thursday's 30-29 win over NC State.

• Although he was limited to just two catches for 14 yards in Georgia Tech's win over No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9), Singleton made one of the Yellow Jackets' biggest plays of the season when he caught an 11-yard pass from QB **Haynes King** on third-and-8 with a minute-and-a-half to go in the game. Singleton's first down — and subsequent decision to fall to the ground at the 4-yard line rather than score — allowed the Jackets to kneel out the remaining time in their 28-23 win over the previously unbeaten Hurricanes.

• Singleton caught his second touchdown of the season vs. Duke (Oct. 5), a 9-yard reception midway through the fourth quarter that capped the scoring in the Yellow Jackets' 24-14 win.

• Singleton had five catches for 88 yards against No. 19/20 Louisville (Sept. 21).

• Against VMI (Sept. 14), Singleton caught five passes for 102 yards, including a 14-yard touchdown, in just one half of action. He did not play in the second half after helping stake the Yellow Jackets to a 38-0 halftime lead.

• Singleton's breakout performance this season came at Syracuse (Sept. 7), when he 86 yards on five receptions, nearly doubling his total receptions through the first two games of the season (6) and more than doubling his yardage output from the first two contests (62).

• Despite his relatively slow start to the season as a pass-catcher, Singleton impacted each of the first two games as a ball-carrier, with a 10-yard run in the season-opener at Florida State (Aug. 24) and a 35-yard touchdown run against Georgia State (Aug. 31).

• The touchdown run against GSU was Singleton's first TD of the season and the first rushing score of his career.

• Singleton pulled off one of the biggest plays of the season-opening win against Florida State when he had a 12-yard gain on a screen pass on the Yellow Jackets' final offensive play of the game. One play after Singleton Jr.'s 12-yard pickup, PK **Aidan Birr** made a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift Tech to the 24-21 victory.

• Singleton led Georgia Tech with 48 receptions, 714 receiving yards and six touchdown catches as a true freshman last season.

• Singleton's 59.5 receiving yards per game and six touchdown receptions last season both ranked second among all true freshmen nationally.

• With touchdown catches in each of Georgia Tech's first five games of last season — 5 yds. vs. Louisville (Sept. 1), 40 yds. vs. S.C. State (Sept. 9), 15 yds. at Ole Miss (Sept. 16), 31 yds. at Wake Forest (Sept. 23) and 53 yds. vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 30) — Singleton became the first Yellow Jacket ever with a touchdown reception in each of the first five games of his career.

• Singleton also became the first Yellow Jacket with a touchdown reception in five-consecutive games since Kelly Campbell caught touchdown passes in six-straight games in 2000 (Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina-Nov. 18 vs. Maryland).

• After an injury that caused him to miss six games and limited his effectiveness over the final five games following his return to action last season, r-Sr. **Chase Lane** picked up this season right where he left off at the beginning of 2023.

• Lane, who like QB **Haynes King**, transferred to Georgia Tech from Texas A&M prior to the 2023 season, has caught 16 passes for 186 yards and a team-high-tying three touchdown receptions through 11 games this season.

• Thirteen of Lane's 16 receptions and 159 of his 186 receiving yards came in the Yellow Jackets' first five games of the season.

• Lane has been held to three catches for 27 yards over the last six games, but two of the three catches have been touchdowns — a 6-yarder vs. No. 12/11 Notre Dame on Oct. 19 and a 15-yarder vs. No. 4 Miami on Nov. 9).

• Despite the relatively slow last six games, Lane's 186 receiving yards and 15 receptions both still rank fifth on the team this season (third among wideouts).

• Against VMI (Sept. 14), Lane had a season-high 54 receiving yards in just one half of action. He did not play in the second half after helping stake the Yellow Jackets to a 38-0 halftime lead.

• On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Lane caught a 4-yard touchdown pass, which was his first touchdown since a 48-yard TD catch in last season's opener versus Louisville (Sept. 1, 2023).

• Last season, Lane caught six passes for 105 yards and a touchdown over the first two games of the campaign, but was injured in the second game of the year versus South Carolina State. He would go on to miss the next six games, then had just one catch for 0 yards over the final five games of the season.

**TIGHT ENDS**

• Five Georgia Tech tight ends have combined for 43 catches for 549 yards and two touchdowns this season.

• Leading the way is Sr. **Avery Boyd**, who has settled into the tight ends room after spending much of his first four seasons as a Yellow Jacket at wide receiver.

• Boyd leads Georgia Tech's tight ends with 292 receiving yards on 22 receptions (both good for third on the team) and two touchdowns (t-third).

• Prior to catching multiple passes in 6-of-11 games this season (four vs. Georgia State, four at Syracuse, two vs. VMI, two at North Carolina, three at Virginia Tech, four vs. NC State), Boyd had never had more than one reception in a game in his collegiate career.

• After not having a reception over the first 17 games of his career, Boyd has at least one catch in 15 of the last 22 contests.

• The 6-foot-3, 240-pound Boyd got the start at tight end in the season opener against No. 10 Florida State (Aug. 24) and made a 14-yard reception deep in Georgia Tech territory to kickstart an 89-yard touchdown drive that gave the Yellow Jackets a 21-14 lead early in the fourth quarter.

• Boyd scored his first touchdown of the season on a 22-yard reception vs. Georgia State (Aug. 31).

**OFFENSE**

- Boyd's second TD of the season and fourth of his career came on a 33-yard catch against VMI.
- Boyd hauled in his third-, fourth- and fifth-longest receptions of the season over the last four games — a 25-yarder vs. No. 12/11 Notre Dame (Oct. 19), a 24-yarder at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26) and a 23-yarder vs. NC State (Nov. 21). Only his 33-yard TD vs. VMI and a 28-yard catch at Louisville (Sept. 21) have been longer.
- A trio of tight ends that transferred to Georgia Tech in the offseason — r-Sr. **Jackson Hawes** (Yale), r-Sr. **Ryland Goede** (Mississippi State) and r-Jr. **Josh Beetham** (Michigan) — have combined for 18 catches for 214 yards this season, led by Hawes' 11 catches for 142 yards.
- In addition to becoming a part of the passing game, Hawes, Beetham and Goede have all played a critical role in the run game through their blocking at the point of attack.
- Hawes has accepted an invitation to play in the 2025 Senior Bowl. He is the first Yellow Jacket to receive a Senior Bowl invite since Billy Martin in 1964.
- With Hawes, Goede and Beetham all out due to injuries at North Carolina (Oct. 12), true Fr. **Luke Harpring** saw the first significant action of his career and responded with two receptions for a team-high 36 yards.
- Harpring has caught three passes for 43 yards on the season.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

- One of Georgia Tech's most experienced overall positions, the offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2024 roster have combined for 278 collegiate games played and 180 career starts.

- Most notably, Sr. **Jordan Williams** is the first five-year starter in Georgia Tech football history, as he has been in the Yellow Jackets' starting lineup since he arrived as a true freshman in 2020.
- On Oct. 26 at Virginia Tech, Williams made his 49th-career start, setting a new Georgia Tech record for most starts by an offensive lineman (breaking the previous record of 48, which was held by current Georgia Tech Sports Network radio analyst Andrew Gardner).
- On Nov. 9 vs. No. 4 Miami (Fla.), Williams became only the third player to ever make 50 starts at Georgia Tech.
- Assuming he makes the start on Friday at No. 6 Georgia, Williams will match Georgia Tech's all-time record with his 52nd-career start.

- Most notably, Georgia Tech has allowed five sacks this season and is tied for second nationally with 0.45 sacks allowed per game.
- Tech is one of only two NCAA Division I FBS teams that has surrendered as few as four sacks this season.

- Prior to allowing its first sack of the season on Oct. 5 versus Duke, the Yellow Jackets had gone six-consecutive games overall without surrendering a sack, dating back to last year's season-ending win over UCF in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl.
- The string of six-straight games without a sack allowed, doubled Georgia Tech's previous record for consecutive games with no sacks allowed since sacks became an official NCAA statistic in 2000.

- Dating back to the final two games of the 2022 season, Georgia Tech has not surrendered a sack in 13 of its last 26 games.
- Prior to allowing not allowing a sack in 13 of their last 26 games, the Yellow Jackets had surrendered a sack in 27-of-28 games.
- Tech's pass blocking was especially impressive in its win over Georgia State (Aug. 31), as all five starters (RG **Keylan Rutledge** - 84.2, LG **Joe Fusile** - 83.9, RT **Jordan Williams** - 82.8, LT **Jordan Brown** - 82.7 and C **Weston Franklin** - 81.3), as well as reserve LT **Corey Robinson II** (81.2), received pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher from *Pro Football Focus*.
- On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Rutledge (86.6) and Robinson (85.2) once again received pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher from PFF.
- Against VMI (Sept. 14), Robinson (84.9) and Rutledge (84.0) once again led the Yellow Jackets in pass-blocking grades from PFF. They were among five Jackets that had pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher in the romp over VMI, joining Franklin (81.5), Williams (81.5) and reserve RG **Brandon Best** (80.3).
- Against Duke (Oct. 5), four of the Yellow Jackets' five starters had pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher — Robinson (87.5), Rutledge (86.1), Fusile (86.1), Williams (81.3). Franklin just missed the 80 threshold with a grade of 79.0.

- Against North Carolina (Oct. 12), three of the Yellow Jackets' five starters had pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher — Fusile (83.6), Williams (82.2) and Franklin (81.5). Robinson just missed the 80 threshold with a grade of 79.3.
- The Yellow Jackets once again had 3-of-5 starting linemen earn pass-blocking grades of 80 or better against No. 12/11 Notre Dame (Oct. 19) — Rutledge (86.6), Robinson (81.6) and Williams (81.1).
- Franklin (82.1) was the only starter with a pass-blocking grade of 80 or higher at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26), but Robinson was right on the cusp with a 79.3.
- Rutledge (87.5) and Robinson (83.5) both had pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher in the Yellow Jackets' 28-23 win over previously unbeaten and No. 4-ranked Miami (Nov. 9).
- Three Tech starters had pass-blocking grades of 80 or higher in last Thursday's 30-29 win over NC State — Robinson (85.9), Fusile (84.5) and Franklin (80.7).
- Robinson has earned a pass-blocking grade of 80 or better in 8-of-11 games this season, as he was the only Yellow Jacket with a pass-blocking grade of 80-plus in the season opener against Florida State (81.9).
- For the season, Robinson has PFF's second-highest pass-blocking grade among all offensive linemen nationally (92.0), and the highest among Power Four conference players (min. 50% of pass-block snaps).
- Robinson is one of only two Power 4 tackles with a pass-blocking grade of 90 or higher (Texas' Kelvin Banks Jr. - 90.5).
- Georgia Tech has rushed for at least 245 yards in a game three times this season — 245 vs. Duke (Oct. 5), 371 at North Carolina (Oct. 12) and 271 vs. No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9).
- Tech's three games with at least 245 rushing yards are tied for the second-most in the ACC and 20th nationally this season.
- Tech's 371 rushing yards against North Carolina were its most in a game since it ran for 377 yards against Duke on Nov. 28, 2020.
- The Yellow Jackets' 271 rushing yards against Miami are the most that the Hurricanes — which came into the game allowing just 95.2 yards per game on the ground, good for eighth nationally — have allowed this season (prev.: 206 vs. Virginia Tech - Sept. 27).
- With four 200-yard rushing games this season (225 vs. Georgia State on Aug. 31 245 vs. Duke, 371 vs. UNC and 271 vs. Miami), Georgia Tech has rushed for at least 200 yards in 10 of its last 18 games (dating back to Oct. 21, 2023 vs. Boston College).
- Williams was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after helping Tech rush for 271 yards (including providing key blocks on both of the Jackets' touchdown runs) and not allowing a sack in the 28-23 win over Miami (Nov. 9).
- Rutledge was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after helping pave the way for Tech to rush for 371 yards and not allow a sack in the Jackets' win over UNC (Oct. 12).
- Tech returned four starters and five significant contributors this season from an offensive line that paved the way for the Yellow Jackets to lead the ACC and rank among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg - 12th nationally) and fewest sacks allowed (1.15/gm - 15th) in 2023.

• Through 11 games under the tutelage of first-year defensive coordinator **Tyler Santucci**, Georgia Tech's defense is allowing 22.5 points, 340.5 total yards and 121.3 rushing yards per game, all down significantly from the Yellow Jackets' averages a year ago, while the Jackets' 5.8 tackles for loss per game are more than one per game better than they averaged 2023.

• When Georgia Tech held three-straight opponents to less than 100 rushing yards — Sept. 14 vs. VMI (12), Sept. 21 at Louisville (57) and Oct. 5 vs. Duke (74) — it marked the first time that Tech allowed less than 100 rushing yards in three-straight games since Oct. 19-Nov. 2, 2013 (Syracuse – 75 yds., at Virginia – 68, Pitt – minus-5).

• Prior to this season, Tech had surrendered at least 100 rushing yards in 33-consecutive games, dating back to allowing 68 yards on the ground in a 45-22 win over North Carolina on Sept. 25, 2021.

• In the Jackets' previous game at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26), Georgia Tech limited the Hokies to just 233 yards of offense, which was:

- 124 yards below VT's season average going into the game;
- the fewest that Georgia Tech has allowed to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent in a decade, dating back to holding Clemson to 190 yards in a 28-6 win on Nov. 15, 2014;
- the fewest that Georgia Tech has allowed away from home since it held USC to 205 in the 2012 Sun Bowl (a 21-7 GT win);
- the fewest that Georgia Tech has allowed in a true road game since they surrendered just 198 yards in a 34-9 win at Virginia on Oct. 24, 2009.

• The Yellow Jackets also held Virginia Tech — the ACC's top rushing team going in to the game at 209.3 yards per contest — to just 99 yards on the ground.

• Virginia Tech RB Bhayshul Tuten, who was the nation's leading rusher with 871 yards going into the game, managed just 79 yards against Georgia Tech.

• Georgia Tech not only limited Duke (Oct. 5) to just 74 yards on the ground (46.6 yards less than it was averaging coming in), but also held the Blue Devils to 279 total yards (88.2 yards less than their 367.2-yard average) and 14 points (14.8 points less than their 28.8-point average).

• Georgia Tech's defense was dominant across the board in the Yellow Jackets 59-7 win over VMI (Sept. 14), limiting the Keydets to 104 total yards (2.2 yards per play), including just 28 rushing yards (0.4 avg.) and five total first downs.

• VMI's five first downs were tied for the second-fewest that Georgia Tech has ever surrendered in a game and the fewest since Miami (Fla.) had five first downs against the Yellow Jackets on Sept. 26, 1964.

• Four of VMI's five first downs came on their lone scoring drive of the game in the fourth quarter. The Keydets combined for just one first down on their other 12 possessions.

• VMI's seven points were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech since a 41-0 win over Alcorn State in the 2018 season opener (Sept. 1, 2018).

• Georgia Tech's 12 tackles for loss against VMI were the most in a game for the Yellow Jackets since they had 12 in a 21-17 win over No. 13 North Carolina on Nov. 19, 2022.

• Tech has had six or more TFL in 5-of-10 games this season - 7 vs. Florida State (Aug. 24), 8 vs. Georgia State (Aug. 31), 12 vs. VMI (Sept 14), 6 vs. Notre Dame (Oct. 19) and 11 at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26).

• In his first game as Tech's defensive coordinator, Santucci's defense limited No. 10 Florida State, which averaged 401.6 yards of total offense per game in 2023, to just 291 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 24-21 win over the Seminoles (Aug. 24).

• Georgia Tech's rushing defense limited Florida State to just 98 rushing yards on 31 carries (3.2 avg.).

• Even more impressively, after FSU ran for 58 yards on five carries on its first possession of the game (11.6 avg.), Tech surrendered just 40 yards on 26 carries over the rest of the game (1.5 avg.).

• Perhaps the lone defensive area where Georgia Tech strives to return to its form from recent seasons is in turnover creation.

• The Yellow Jackets uncharacteristically rank 117th out of 133 NCAA Division I FBS teams this season with just 10 takeaways through 11 games (five fumble recoveries and five interceptions).

• Last Thursday versus NC State, Georgia Tech season highs for takeaways (3) and interceptions (3).

• The Jackets' three interceptions against NC State surpassed their season total for INTs going into the game (2).

• Tech has only forced multiple turnovers one other time this season, when it recovered a pair of fumbles in a 41-34 win at North Carolina (Oct. 12).

• Tech has been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for each of the last two seasons — tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.

• Georgia Tech's 60 fumble recoveries since the beginning of the 2019 season are the second-most in the nation during that span.

• Despite missing two games due to injury (Oct. 19 vs. No. 12/11 Notre Dame and Oct. 26 at Virginia Tech), r-So. LB **Kyle Efford** remains the Yellow Jackets' leading tackler with 61 total tackles this season, six more than anyone else on the squad.

• Efford ranks among the top 20 in the ACC with 6.8 tackles per game.

• Efford was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for the second time in his career after tallying 10 tackles in this season's opener vs. Florida State (Aug. 24).

• Efford's 13 tackles against Georgia State (Aug. 31) surpassed his previous career high of 11, set in last season's win over Syracuse (Nov. 18), when Efford was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week for the first time in his career.

• In all, Efford has recorded double-digit tackles five times in 16 games he's played since moving into the starting lineup midway through last season.

• Despite not moving into the starting lineup until midway through last season, Efford led Georgia Tech with 81 tackles in 2023, 12 more than any other player on the squad.

• Efford became the first freshman to lead Georgia Tech in tackles since Darryl Smith tied for the team lead as a freshman in 1999 before going on to a 12-year NFL career with the Jacksonville Jaguars and Baltimore Ravens.

• Efford was the first Tech freshman to lead the team in tackles outright since Richardo Wimbush (91) in 1999.

• Leading the way for Georgia Tech's much improved defensive front, which is averaging 1.2 tackles per loss more in 2024 (5.8) than it did in 2023 (4.6), is a corps of defensive linemen that have combined for 24 TFL.

• In his first season with the Yellow Jackets after transferring to Tech from USC, DE **Romello Height** leads the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and is tied for the team lead with 2.5 sacks.

• Height made perhaps the biggest defensive play of the season for the Yellow Jackets against No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9), when he forced a fumble on his sack of QB Cam Ward with less than two minutes to go. The loose ball was recovered by DT **Jordan van den Berg** to all but seal the Jackets' 28-23 victory over the previously unbeaten Hurricanes.

• Height had his first collegiate interception against NC State (Nov. 21), which he returned 16 yards to the 3, setting up a 3-yard touchdown run on the very next play by QB **Haynes King**.

• van den Berg has perhaps flown under the radar this season in terms of stats (16 tackles, 4.0 TFL in 11 games) but he caught the attention *Pro Football Focus*.

• PFF ranks van den Berg as the No. 1 interior defensive lineman in the ACC and No. 8 overall interior DL in the nation against the run (89.4 grade).

• PFF also tabs van den Berg as the No. 6 interior DL in the ACC and No. 30 at the position nationally in overall defensive grading (78.9).

• Perhaps another Tech DT who has flown under the radar stats-wise but rates with PFF is Sr. **Thomas Gore**. In his first season with the Yellow Jackets after transferring to Tech from Miami (Fla.), Gore is rated as the No. 11 interior DL in overall defensive grade (76.5) by PFF.

• Gore had a season-high 2.0 TFL last Thursday vs. NC State.

• A fifth-year senior from Ruisbroek, Belgium, **Sylvain Yondjouen** entered this season as one of the oldest players in college football at 26 years of age.

• Born on June 21, 1998, Yondjouen is the second-oldest player in the ACC, the fourth-oldest defensive lineman in the nation and the 17th-oldest player in NCAA Division I FBS.

• Yondjouen sustained a season-ending knee injury in last season's opener against Louisville (Sept. 1). He medically redshirted to return to Georgia Tech for a sixth season in 2024.

• Now over a year removed from the knee injury, Yondjouen is beginning to return to form with 2.5 sacks and 6.0 tackles for loss on the season, which includes 2.5 sacks and 5.5 TFL over the past eight games.

• Yondjouen is tied with Height for the team lead with 2.5 sacks, while his six TFL are good for second on the squad, 0.5 behind Height.

• Yondjouen also leads the team with seven QB hurries and is tied for the team lead with four pass breakups.

• Sr. DT **Zeek Biggers** has accepted an invitation to play in the 2025 East-West Shrine Bowl.

• Sr. LB **Treniyas Tatum** has already set a career high for tackles for loss in a single season with 5.5 through 11 games this season (prev.: 4.0 in 2023).

• Jr. DBs **Clayton Powell-Lee** and **Rodney Shelley** rank No. 3 and No. 7 in the ACC and No. 8 and No. 31 nationally in slot pass coverage, allowing just one reception every 19.8 and 13.4 coverage snaps in the slot, respectively.

• Shelley ranks fourth on the team with 5.0 tackles for loss this season after not recording a TFL in his first two collegiate campaigns.

• Shelley's career-high 3.0 TFL at Virginia Tech (Oct. 26) are the most by Yellow Jacket in a game this season (prev.: 2.5 by Tatum vs. Georgia State - Aug. 31).

• Shelley is also tied for the team lead with four pass breakups.

• Another DB, r-So. **Syed Gibbs**, is tied for fifth on the team with 4.0 TFL.





**DEFENSE**

• r-Jr. DB **Omar Daniels** had perhaps the finest performance of his collegiate career against No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9), recording a career-high eight tackles (prev.: 5 at Syracuse – Sept. 7), including a tackle for loss. He also had a pass break-up in the Yellow Jackets' win over the previously unbeaten Hurricanes.

• r-Jr. DB **Ahmari Harvey** ranks second on the team with 55 tackles from his cornerback position.

• Harvey is the only Yellow Jacket with an interception, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble this season.

• Harvey recorded his first fumble recovery of the season and second of his career at North Carolina (Oct. 12).

• Harvey's interception vs. Duke (Oct. 5) not only sealed the Yellow Jackets' 24-14 win over the Blue Devils, but was also the Jackets' first INT of the season.

• Harvey's forced fumble vs. VMI was his first of the season and second of his career (his previous FF sealed Tech's 46-42 win over No. 17 North Carolina on Oct. 28 of last season).

• Harvey had a big day in Georgia Tech's season-opening win over Florida State (Aug. 24), finishing with a career-high eight tackles from his cornerback position.

• Two of Harvey's eight stops were among the most critical plays of the game. In the first quarter, his open-field tackle on fourth-and-4 forced a turnover on downs and squelched an FSU scoring threat with the Seminoles deep in GT territory. In the second quarter, he took down FSU QB D.J. Uiagalelei in the backfield on third-and-3 for his first-career tackle for loss, forcing the Seminoles to settle for a field goal.

• r-Sr. DB **Warren Burrell**, has relatively quiet numbers in nine games (24 tackles, one interception and a team-high-tying four pass breakups), but that is likely a result of opposing teams not challenging him.

• *Pro Football Focus* ranks Burrell as the No. 3 cornerback in the ACC and tied for the 26th-best CB in the nation this season with a 82.6 pass coverage grade.

• Burrell notched his first interception as a Yellow Jacket against No. 12/11 Notre Dame (Oct. 19), when he picked off a pass in the end zone and returned it 27 yards.

• Powell-Lee and Sr. DB **LaMiles Brooks** are among five Yellow Jackets in the last 32 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same game (Charlie Thomas – Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, Brooks – Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech – Nov. 5, 2022, Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

• Prior to five Tech players recording an interception and a fumble recovery in the last 31 games, only two other Yellow Jackets had accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy – Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling – Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

• As it has been since **Brent Key** took over as head coach in 2022, Georgia Tech is one of the nation's most prolific kick-blocking teams once again in 2024.

• Tech has blocked five kicks (four field goals and a punt) in 11 games this season, which is tied for third-most in the nation.

• 6-foot-6, 320-pound Sr. DL **Zeek Biggers** has recorded two of Georgia Tech's five blocked kicks this season, with blocked field goals at Syracuse (Sept. 7) and Virginia Tech (Oct. 26).

• Biggers two blocked kicks this season give him four for his career. He previously blocked field goals vs. Virginia (Oct. 20, 2022) and at Ole Miss (Sept. 16, 2023).

• Biggers field-goal block at VT was Georgia Tech's 12th blocked kick in 30 games since Oct. 1, 2022 (Key's first game as the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach). The Yellow Jackets' 12 blocks are the second-most in the nation during that span.

• On Sept. 7 at Syracuse, Georgia Tech matched a school record with two blocked kicks (a blocked field goal by Biggers in the first quarter and a blocked punt by Fr. DL **Amontrae Bradford** in the second quarter).

• It was the 11th time in program history that Georgia Tech blocked two kicks in a game and the second time in Key's first 24 games as the Yellow Jackets' head coach. The Jackets also blocked two kicks versus Virginia on Oct. 20, 2022. In that game, Tech also blocked a field goal and a punt, and the blocked field goal was by Biggers.

• In addition to Biggers' FG blocks vs. Syracuse and VT and Bradford's blocked punt at Syracuse, r-So. DB **Syeed Gibbs** (Sept. 21 at Louisville) and Jr. DB **Rodney Shelley** (Oct. 12 at North Carolina) have also blocked field goals for the Yellow Jackets this season.

• Tech has finished among the top 10 nationally in blocked kicks each of the last two seasons (t-10th in 2022 - four; t-third in 2023 - four).

• Since the beginning of the 2013 season, Georgia Tech has blocked 36 kicks, which are tied for the most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• In Georgia Tech's 30-29 win over NC State (Nov. 21), Birr made 44-, 41- and 45-yard field goals. His three FG were a season high and equaled a career high that he matched three times as a redshirt freshman in 2023.

• Birr's three 40-yard field goals against NC State were the most by a Yellow Jacket in a single game since Scott Blair made 41-, 43- and 44-yarders in a 30-20 win over Duke on Nov. 20, 2010.

• In this year's season opener against Florida State (Aug. 24), Birr made a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift Georgia Tech to a 24-21 win over the 10th-ranked Seminoles.

- Birr — an honorable mention freshman all-America selection by *College Football News* — established himself as one of the nation's top place kickers as a redshirt freshman in 2023.

- After missing the entire 2022 campaign due to a knee injury sustained while still in high school in Kennedale, Texas (Kennedale H.S.), Birr made 17-of-19 field goals as a redshirt freshman in 2023, good for a .895 percentage

- Birr's .895 field-goal percentage last season was the second-highest in Georgia Tech single-season history (behind only former teammate Gavin Stewart's .923 in 2022), the highest by a freshman in Tech history, the ninth-best in the nation in 2023 and the third-best among freshmen nationally.

- Birr's 17 field goals made 88 total points last season were also the most ever by a Tech freshman.

- Seven of Birr's 17 field goals last season came from 40 yards or more, which were the most field goals of 40-plus yards by a Yellow Jacket since three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker (Kansas City Chiefs) made eight field goals from 40 yards or more as a senior at Tech in 2016

- Sr. P **David Shanahan** is averaging 43.5 yards per punt this season, which ranks 32nd nationally.

- Thirteen of Shanahan's 45 punts (28.9%) this season have been downed inside the 20 and 8-of-45 (17.8%) have traveled 50 yards or more.

- Shanahan, who has been Georgia Tech's starting punter since his first game with the program in 2021, ranks second in Tech history in punts (224) and punting yards (9,588) and third in punting average (42.8).

- Shanahan, who hails from Castleisland in County Kerry, about three hours southwest of Dublin, is believed to be the first Ireland native ever awarded a full scholarship to play American college football.

- Playing in front of more than 100 family and friends in Tech's season opener versus No. 10 Florida State in Dublin, Ireland (Aug. 24), Shanahan averaged 46.5 yards over two punts and, perhaps more notably, was on the field for the game-winning field goal as Birr's holder.

- In addition to blocking a field goal, Shelley also contributes on special teams as the Yellow Jackets' primary punt returner. He ranks 38th nationally with a 6.7-yard punt return average.



MISCELLANEOUS

• Georgia Tech is one of only four ACC teams that rank in the top 50 nationally in both total defense (41st - 340.5 ypg) and total offense (46th - 414.7 ypg), joining the top three teams in the conference standings — No. 8/7 Miami and No. 9 SMU and No. 12 Clemson.

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the last four-plus seasons. In their 25 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in 18-of-25 games and are plus-38 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 21 of its 33 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-31 overall in turnover margin in those 33 losses.

• This season, Georgia Tech is plus-7 in turnover margin in its seven wins and minus-4 in its four defeats.

• Last season, the Yellow Jackets were plus-11 in turnover margin in their seven wins and minus-seven in their six defeats.

• While Georgia Tech has only forced 10 turnovers this season, it has made the most of those takeaways. The Yellow Jackets have scored following six of their 10 takeaways this season, good for a total of 38 points off turnovers (five touchdowns and one field goal).

• The half or game has ended on three of Georgia Tech's four remaining possessions following takeaways. The only time that Tech either didn't score or run out the half/game following a turnover is when it missed a field goal following a fumble recovery at North Carolina (Oct. 12).

• One of those times that the Yellow Jackets ended a half following a takeaway was after DL **Romello Height's** strip-sack of Miami QB Cam Ward that was recovered by DL **Jordan van den Berg** with 1:36 remaining in Tech's 28-23 win over No. 4 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 9. The Jackets passed up an opportunity to score following the biggest takeaway of the season in lieu of kneeling out the clock inside the Miami 10 to seal the victory.

• As has become commonplace at Georgia Tech, the Yellow Jackets are once again navigating one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2024.

• In particular, the Yellow Jackets' November schedule, which included Tech's third and fourth top-15 opponents of the season — No. 4 Miami (Nov. 9) and No. 6 Georgia (Nov. 29) — is the nation's hardest slate in the month of November.
