### OPENING TIP

► It's a much shorter trip for the West Georgia Wolves in game three as the Wolves trek 55 miles to McCamish Pavilion to take on Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets on Thursday night.

► The Wolves are coming off of a 700-plus-mile plane trip to Chicago last weekend where they fell to Loyola Chicago in the first ever meeting between the two schools.

► UWG is still searching for its first win at the Division I level after falling in games one and two of their inaugural season as members of the Atlantic Sun Conference.

► When the Wolves pull through for their first Division I win, it will also get head coach Joanna Reitz to a nice even 30 career wins as a head coach.

► Four Wolves scored in double-figures in Chicago on Saturday night, led by 12 from Zuriyah Davis and 11 each from K'Nari Holliday, Destiny Jones, and Becca Ledford.

► West Georgia was improved at the free throw line on Saturday, shooting 63.6 percent including a 9-of-10 mark from the charity stripe in the final quarter.

► Georgia Tech's average starter height of 6-0 compared to UWG's 5-6 will likely cause matchup issues for the Wolves. Meanwhile, Georgia Tech has yet to allow over 50 points in a game this season, and is averaging nearly 80 a game on offense.

# HEAD COACH

# JOANNA REITZ

**THIRD YEAR AT UWG // RECORD: 29-31**

Joanna Reitz, a seasoned coach with experience in Division I play, was announced as the University of West Georgia's 12th head women's basketball coach in program history prior to the 2022-23 season. Reitz comes to UWG following a distinguished career as an assistant coach, spending nearly 15 years in the southeast, including stops at GSC rival Shorter and Division I Mercer, before landing at her most recent position at Division I Utah in 2017.

Reitz's second season in Carrollton, saw the Wolves' go 16-13 overall, a three-win improvement, and finish .500 in league play, also an improvement from the year prior. Two individuals garnered great success in year two, led by Zuriyah Davis who became UWG's first All-GSC selection in seven seasons and finished third in the conference in points per game as a junior. Sophomore center K'Nari Holliday finished the season as an NCAA Statistical Champion in Field Goal Percentage under Reitz in 2024, shooting 61.7 percent from the field, becoming the third player in UWG history to earn the honor of NCAA Statistical Champion.

In her first season at the helm of the UWG program, Reitz and the Wolves saw solid improvement, winning the most games since the 2019-20 season with 13 victories. The Wolves ended the regular season 6-2 and returned to the Gulf South Conference Tournament for the first time since 2020 and earned the league's sixth seed, despite being picked 11th in the GSC Preseason Poll.

Individually, Reitz's team produced the GSC Freshman of the Week eight times with Aliyah Washington earning the honors seven times throughout the season, while Katelyn Dunning earned it once. Washington's seven Freshman of the Week selections, under Reitz's leadership, led her to become West Georgia's first GSC Freshman of the Year since 1991. Under Reitz, Senior Forward Peace Okeke recorded eight double-doubles during the season, the most by a single UWG player since the 2016-17 season.

Off the court, Reitz helped improve the team's GPA from 3.11 to 3.47. Reitz and her team also contributed over 80 hours of community service.

In her career, Reitz has coached a total of 20 players who went on to play professional women's basketball, with recent University of West Georgia alum Jada Powell becoming her first former player at UWG to join the professional ranks.

Reitz ventured to the "City of Dreams" after spending five seasons at Utah following previous coaching stints at USC-Aiken (assistant coach – 2015-17), Mercer (assistant coach – 2013-15), Shorter (assistant coach – 2011-13) and as the Director of Recruiting Operations at Florida State (2010-11). She spent three additional seasons with the Seminoles as a graduate assistant from 2007-2010.

While at Utah, Reitz had significant responsibilities in the area of player development, recruiting, scouting, and game planning. In addition, she was an academic liaison for the Utes and played a role in booster, campus, and community relations. As a recruiter, she helped recruit and sign back-to-back top-25 recruiting classes in 2019 and 2020. In her time at Utah, Reitz recruited two Pac-12 Freshmen of the Year, six Gatorade Players of the Year, and six All-Conference selections. In her final season in Salt Lake City, she guided the Utes to a pair of upsets in the Pac-12 conference tournament as Utah made their first-ever appearance in the Pac-12 Championship game.

At USC-Aiken, she was involved with all aspects of the program, helping the Pacers to improve by four wins in 2016-17, going from six Peach Belt Conference wins in the 2015-16 season to 10 conference wins in 2016-17. Reitz also recruited and signed Kwajelin Farrar, the 2017 PBC Freshman of the Year.

Prior to her stint in Aiken, Reitz was an assistant coach at Mercer University in Macon, where she recruited three of the most successful players in the Bears' history. She recruited and signed three players who were named as the SoCon Player of the Year for four consecutive years. That includes Kahila Lawrence, who was the 2015 Southern Conference Freshman of the Year, then was named the Southern Conference Player of the Year in 2016, 2017, and 2018. In 2018, she became the highest draft pick in SoCon women's basketball history as the 24th overall pick in the WNBA draft.

Before Mercer, Reitz spent two seasons on the bench as an assistant coach at a Gulf South Conference member institution, helping the Shorter Hawks to a 28-7 record in 2011-12. She helped guide the Hawks to transition from NAIA Division I to NCAA Division II, and as defensive coordinator in 2011-12, Shorter was the top defensive team in NAIA Division I, allowing just 31.6 percent shooting on the year. She also recruited Taylor Adams to Rome and Adams eventually became a First Team All-GSC performer and a WBCA All-American.

Following a successful playing career at Covenant College, Reitz became a graduate assistant at Florida State, where she helped with recruiting, camps, player care, and scout team oversight for the back-to-back ACC Regular Season Champions, making a trip to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2010. In 2010-11, she was elevated to the Director of Recruiting Operations, handling recruiting coordination, game scheduling, camp direction, and booster/alumni liaison.

She played college hoops at Covenant College from 2002-06 where she was a four-year starter, three-time team captain, and three-time all-academic selection. She was named to the All-Conference team in 2006. She was a 1,000-point scorer at Covenant, finishing her career with 1,557 points, which is ninth all-time as of 2022. She made 146 three-pointers in her career and is eighth all-time at Covenant with 584 field goals made.

Reitz graduated with a degree in natural science in 2006 and went on to receive master's degrees in physical education and business administration from Florida State.

**Fourth Quarter**

While West Georgia is 0-2 on the year, the Wolves have finished each game strong, outscoring the two opponents 40-26 in the final 10 minutes. In the opener against Gardner-Webb, West Georgia outscored the Bulldogs 19-12, nearly erasing their deficit and completing a comeback before eventually falling by four. Against Loyola Chicago, the Wolves outscored the Ramblers by another seven-point margin, 21-14, but it was too little too late in a 16-point, road loss.

**Bec's Career-Best**

Two games into the 2024-25 season, and junior Becca Ledford has bested her career-high in scoring both games. Against GWU, Ledford came off the bench in the first half, and got herself eight points and buried two big threes in the first quarter. Then last Saturday in Chicago, Ledford went 3-of-6 from the field including a 3-of-5 mark from three-point land and finished with a new career-high of 11. Ledford's career-high heading into her junior season was seven which she hit twice in her freshman year including her collegiate debut against Rollins in 2022.

**Road Warriors**

Thursday is the final leg of three consecutive road games to open the 2024-25 season, which is expected as the new kid on the block in Division I. In total, UWG will play seven of its eleven non-conference games on the road, and only two of the home games, Florida A&M and South Carolina State, are against Division I opponents. Next week, West Georgia comes home for the first time this season, hosting Florida A&M for the first of three straight home games. The Wolves then make December visits to UNC Wilmington, Western Carolina, Alabama State, and Vanderbilt.

**A Brand New Era**

Year three of the Joanna Reitz era of University of West Georgia women's basketball begins a brand new era for the program as the University is in its first year of NCAA Division I and the Atlantic Sun Conference. West Georgia competed in the Gulf South Conference and Division II since 1983 and won five conference titles and reached five NCAA Tournaments in their Division II tenure. UWG now embarks on a new journey against a new conference and a new set of challenge.

**Something to Prove**

It's no surprise that as the league's newest member, the Wolves didn't gain much traction in the ASUN Pre-season Coaches Poll, giving the Wolves something to prove in their first year in the conference and Division I. The Wolves were picked ahead of one team in the Media Poll, however, coming in ahead of Queens.

**Halfway to a Thousand**

Senior guard Zuriyah Davis is 21 points away from hitting the 500 career points mark at UWG. The Sugar Hill native scored 458 points as a junior, which ranked 22nd-most all-time in UWG single-season history, and currently averages 10.5 points per game this season. She enters Saturday's contest with 479 points in a UWG uniform. Davis has over 1,300 points in her collegiate career between her time at Emmanuel, East Georgia State, and West Georgia.

**Wolves in the ASUN**

West Georgia has a few players near the top in some statistical categories. Junior K'Nari Holliday averages 8.0 rebounds per game which is third in the league. Sydne Tolbert is third in the league in steals at 3.0 and second in assist-to-turnover at 7.0. Becca Ledford's .556 (5-of-9) three-point percentage is fourth in the league.

**Statistical Champion History**

K'Nari Holliday finished last season as the nation's leader in Field Goal Percentage, shooting 61.7 percent from the field to earn Statistical Champion honors. It was just the third time that a UWG player has won an NCAA Statistical Champion, joining Lisa Blackmon-Phillips and Lisa McGhee in that exclusive club. Blackmon-Phillips was a two-time statistical champion, leading the country in three-pointers made per game in 1988 and 1989 while McGhee led the country in free throw percentage in 1985.
