##### HOOPIN' FOR HOPE

- Clemson hosts its annual "pink" game for cancer awareness. The Tigers are donning new uniforms, which are gray with pink numbers and trim.

##### THREE-POINT THREATS

- As a team, Clemson is shooting .355 from behind the arc, which ranks 33rd nationally. The Tigers are averaging 7.5 made three pointers per game, also on pace to set a season record.
- **Clemson has made 179 three-pointers this season, which is the 4th-most in school history.**

- In Clemson's game against NC State, the Tigers made 15 three pointers which set a new program record for most three pointers in a game, and has hit **ten or more three-pointers six times** this season.
- The Tigers currently have five players who are shooting 36% or higher from three (Kohn, McQueen, T. Miller, Moore, Cluse)
- **Hannah Kohn** is 9th in school history in 3-pointers made in a season (64)

##### TAKE CARE

- Clemson has a **1.04 assist to turnover ratio**, its best mark in at least 15 seasons. Clemson turns the ball over on 18.5% of its possessions, the fewest in the past 15 seasons.

##### HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- Clemson has increased its average attendance by 99% over the 2023-24 season.
- Clemson is averaging 2,351 fans per game and 32,924 total fans, compared to last season's average of 1191 fans per game and 19,055 total fans.
- Clemson's game against Presbyterian had 6,589 fans in attendance - the second highest attended home game in program history.
- Clemson's win over Cal is Clemson's first home win against a ranked opponent since beating no. 23 Florida State in 2023.
- The Tigers just notched their first overtime win since January 4, 2021 (86-77 vs Syracuse)

- In Clemson's game in Littlejohn Coliseum against NC Central, the Tigers recorded their largest win since 1998 (91-33).

### HISTORIC COMEBACK

- Clemson's comeback victory against Miami (16 points) is the Tigers' second largest comeback since 2013-14 (vs. Pitt, 17 points, 72-57).
- In the Tiger victory, Raven Thompson tied her season high with 17 points and set a new season high with 11 rebounds, notching her first double-double as a Tiger.
- After entering the game in the third quarter with a 16-point deficit, senior Madi Ott entered the game, never left, and went a team-leading +19 as the Tigers recorded a three-point victory.
- The win was Clemson's first against Miami since beating the Canes in the ACC tournament on 3/4/2020 (71-56)

### TOUGH SCHEDULE TIGERS

- The Tigers were scheduled to play 13 regular season games against teams that played in the NCAA tournament last season.
- The 13 games that Clemson is scheduled against last season's tournament teams the third most such games in the nation this season.
- The Tigers have played six nationally ranked opponents so far this season and have played 14 teams in the NET top 100.
- In addition to the 13 games the Tigers can play against NCAA tournament teams, an additional eight games are scheduled against teams that played in either the WBIT or WNIT last season.

### NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

- Following Clemson's performance in January, the Tigers were named the USBWA National Team of the Week.
- With a 69-58 win over the no. 20 California Golden Bears, Clemson notched its first victory over a ranked team in nearly two years.
- The Tigers also picked up their first overtime win since 2021 with a 65-61 thriller against the Stanford Cardinal.
- Cal and Stanford entered last week as two of the top ten three-point shooting teams in the nation, but the Tiger defense held both west coast schools to a combined 23% from outside.
- With the wins, the Tigers achieved a 3-1 record to start ACC play for the first time since 2020-21.

### LOYAL RETURNS HOME & GIVES BACK

- After four years away from home, Loyal McQueen returns to her home state where she was the Gatorade Player of the Year at Wilson High School to finish her collegiate career.
- In Clemson's game against Notre Dame, McQueen logged her 1,000th career point
- McQueen logged the first double-double of her career in Clemson's 65-59 win at Wake Forest (17 points, 10 assists)
- After returning to play for Clemson, McQueen hosted a basketball camp in her hometown that was free for kids ages 6-13. In addition to learning how to play basketball, McQueen provided all attendees with school supplies for the upcoming school year.
- During the offseason, McQueen returned to Florence where she donated \$500 to the South Florence, West Florence, and Wilson High School girls basketball teams.

### MIA MOORE DOES IT ALL

- Mia Moore is Clemson's second leading scorer with 10.9 points per game, is second on the team in rebounding (5.7 rpg) leads the team in steals (1.5 spg), and is one of the leading shooters on the team (.403/.392).
- Scored a season-high 23 points in Clemson's game against NC State
- In Clemson's game against Virginia, Moore scored 20 points - her second highest total of the season, and she recorded a new career high in made three pointer
- Standing at just 5'6", Moore averaged almost nine rebounds per game and notched 13 double-doubles.
- Moore ranked fifth in the AAC for most rebounds per game.
- Once recorded a quadruple double in high school (15 points, 11 assists, 10 steals, 10 rebounds).

### BIG TIME TESSA

- Miller had a career year for a 26-win Belmont team last season, averaging 14.4 points, 6.2 boards, and 3.2 assists per game en route to being an all-conference selection.
- Miller notched her first double-double of this season with 15 points and 11 boards against Kennesaw State
- She logged another double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds - including her 1,000th career point - in Clemson's win against Radford
- Her third double-double of the season came at Florida State where she tallied 13 points and 13 rebounds
- In the season-opening game against Jackson State, Miller scored a team-high of 17 points on an ultra-efficient 7-8 from the floor and 3-3 from the free-throw line.
