Georgia Tech baseball continues its season-long nine	

TV/Stream Play-by-Play/Analyst

- Georgia Tech baseball continues its season-long nine game homestand this week, renewing an in-state rivalry that has not been played since 1988.
- Headlining the returners is 2024 National Freshman
 of the Year and No. 1 sophomore in college baseball
 (Perfect Game), **Drew Burress**. Burress has been
 dubbed a preseason 1st team all-American by multiple
 outlets for 2025 & is currently Division I's active leader
 in slugging percentage (.807).
- The Houston Co. product leads Georgia Tech in home runs (3) and RBI (13) this season. His 13 RBI ranks 17th in Division I and 4th in the ACC. He is currently on pace for 74 RBI this season, an improvement over his already stellar 67 from last year.
- Freshman **Alex Hernandez** is the only underclassmen in Division I with a save and multiple HRs this season (FR 1 SV, 2 HR). He is 1 of only 3 players in DI and 2 in P4 who can say that— also Bryce Calloway, New Orleans (SR 1 SV, 4 HR) & Ethan Hedges, USC (JR 2 SV, 3 HR)
- Head Coach Danny Hall owns the 11th most wins all-time and 2nd most among active NCAA head coaches after South Carolina hired Paul Mainieri (1,513) out of retirement this season.
- The pitching staff has been the highlight of the season, boasting 11.3 strikeouts-per-game this season a more

than 2 Ks-per-game improvement over last season (9.2) – Tech has not averaged double-digit strikeouts from the pitching staff since the COVID shortened 2020 season (10.9) and hasn't done it over a complete season this century.

- The Tech bullpen has struck out 61 batters the most through 8 games since at least the turn of the century.
- That early bullpen success has been spearheaded by Mason Patel who was just named ACC Co-Pitcher of the Week - Tech's first ACC Pitcher of the Week since Andy Archer in 2021.
- The Knoxville, Tenn native is one of 14 Power 4 pitchers (5 in the ACC) who haven't allowed a run while pitching more than 8 innings this season.
- Offensively, GT is 3rd in the nation with 25 doubles as a team led by four each from Kyle Lodise, Kent Schmidt and Carson Kerce.
- Tech is one of eight programs in DI with three players at 4+ doubles this year and one of only 3 P4 programs
- •Lodise is on a considerable hot-streak, reaching base at least three times in each of his last five games and slashing .500 avg. / .640 obp / .889 slug % over that time all team-highs.
- **Parker Brosius** leads the team with 5 stolen bases, the 2nd most in the ACC and 24th across Division I.

- The Cardiac Jackets wasted no time returning for 2025, winning opening day by one run, 3-2, after scoring the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eighth after an infield grounder from **Nathan Waugh** gave just enough time for **Drew Burress** to come sliding home from third, despite a five-man infield from ODU.
- In the 2nd game, Tech fell behind, 3-0 before recording an out, only for the bullpen to come in and pitch 9.0 innings of scoreless ball, striking out a season high 16 and only allowing three base hits. The outstanding effort from the bullpen kept the game, 3-0, until the bottom of the ninth, when Tech exploded for seven runs, the most scored in a ninth inning in a decade of GT baseball.
- That 7 run 9th inning began with a 5-pitch walk drawn by

Nathan Waugh before Vahn Lackey delivered his 2nd hit of the game to put runners at 1st and 2nd. Alex Hernandez drew a walk on 4 pitches to load the bases for Tyler Neises who connected on an 0-1 pitch, driving it into left field for a single and cutting the deficit to one run, 3-2. Will Baker reached on an error when his sacrifice bunt was mishandled by the ODU pitcher, loading the bases for Kyle Lodise who accepted his second walk of the day to bring home Hernandez from third and tie the game. The very next batter was Drew Burress and he made no mistake, smashing a 1-0 pitch over the wall in

right field for the walk-off opposite field grand slam.

- In 31 home games in 2024, Tech has hit .339 with 75 doubles, five triples and 61 home runs for 279 RBI.
- In 30 home games last season, Tech was 23-7 and hit a blistering .357 with 86 doubles, 10 triples and 63 home runs.
- Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full season 2017 and 2021.

CHASE FOR THE TOP 10

- ABCA Hall of Famer Danny Hall became the 11th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 1,400 career win mark on April 14 when Tech defeated then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, 11-7.
- In addition to his career-win milestone, Coach Hall also reached the 1,200 wins at Georgia Tech after defeating No. 9 Duke on May 12.
- He currently has 1,411 career wins the 2nd most among active NCAA head coaches after South Carolina hired Paul Mainieri (1,505 career wins) this season.
- Hall is 16 wins shy of Cliff Gustafson (1,427 at Texas 1967-1996) and 33 away from tying Chuck Hartman (1,444 at High Point/Virginia Tech 1959-2006).
- When Hall passes Gustafson, 17 wins from now, Georgia Tech will replace Texas as the only program in Division I with two coaches in the all-time top-10 for career victories
 Jim Morris coached at GT from 1982-93.

OFFENSE

Returning Starters

- Georgia Tech baseball returns four bats from the starting lineup of the 2024 Athens Regional Final: Drew Burress, John Giesler, Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackey.
- 2024 National Freshman of the Year (D1 Baseball/Perfect Game) and National Freshman Hitter of the Year (NCBWA) Drew Burress returns for his sophomore season after delivering one of the greatest freshman seasons in college baseball history last year.
- Burress led Georgia Tech in a myriad of categories last year, including average (.381), home runs (25) and RBI (67), becoming the 12th Yellow Jacket to win Tech's triple crown.
- He set the Georgia Tech record for most assists by an outfielder, gunning down 10 base-runners from center field while also setting the program record with four home runs in a single game, against Georgia State (Feb. 27, 2024).
- His .821 slugging percentage from last season gives him the highest career slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats in White & Gold. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) 1979).

- \bullet Other GT returning starters include: John Giesler, Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackey...
- **Giesler** playing in his sixth season Led the team with 17 doubles last season. He played three games in COVID shortened 2020 season and redshirted 2021 season. Now in his 6th season on campus, playing in his 4th and final season of eligibility.
- **Brosius** corner outfielder capable of being an everyday center fielder on rosters that don't contain Drew Burress. Started 33 games last season and appeared in 46. His .442 OBP in 2024 was second highest on the team behind Burress.
- Lackey Made 26 starts behind the plate, taking over the starting catcher responsibilities halfway through the season. Caught six runners attempting to steal last year. Lauded for his pitch framing and defensive ability. Coaches have been very impressed with his offensive improvement and defensive versatility expect him to play multiple positions on days when he is not catching.
- Lackey made his first appearance on Opening Day 2024, in a pinch-hit situation, and drove his first collegiate hit out of the park to become the fifth Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his first career plate appearance.

- Part of the season-opening onslaught was seven home runs for Tech, the most in a single game for the first time since 2009.

FRESH BATS

- Nathan Waugh: Graduate Catcher/DH. 98 career games played at Cornell the last three seasons. Holds Cornell record with a 42-game on-base streak (currently active) dating back to the 2023 season after reaching base in all 38 of Cornell's games last season.
- The seven freshmen will be looking to break into the GT lineup this year and continue the great legacy of success at the dish.
- Five of the freshmen hitters come from the state of Georgia with the only two exceptions being Drew Rogers (Tempe, Ariz) and Will Baker (Upper Coomera, Queensland, Australia).
- Six of the seven freshman hitters are ranked in the Top 300 nationally according to Perfect Game

MIDWEEK Highlights - The Bats - GT 5 - GASO 3

- Kyle Lodise and Drew Burress launched back-toback home runs in the third inning. It was the first time Tech has hit multiple home runs in a game this year and the first case of back-to-back Tech jacks since May 12th of last season when Payton Green and Cam Jones did so against Duke.
- It was the first Division I home run for **Lodise**, who transferred into GT.
- He would come around to score twice for his first multirun game in White & Gold.
- For Burress he launched his second of the year and 27th as a Yellow Jacket. He leads all active players in the NCAA (all divisions with 200+ ABs) with an .807 career slugging percentage. He is the only active player in Division I to slug over .750 for his career.
- Georgia Southern transfer Kent Schmidt made a triumphant return to Statesboro, hitting a pair of doubles, including an RBI double to drive in Lodise for the insurance run in the 7th.
- It was Schmidt's second multi-double game of his

college career. Schmidt has now hit doubles in consecutive games for the fifth time in his career.

- Similarly, Carson Kerce has now doubled in consecutive games for this first time in his career after lacing one to left field tonight.
- Two freshman bats secured their first-career RBI: Drew Rogers opened the GT scoring with an RBI single - his first college hit and RBI. While Alex Hernandez drove in the eventual gamewinning run in the top of the third with an RBI groundout.

Friday Highlights - The Bats - GT 12 - Marshall 1 (7)

- Freshman two-way player Alex Hernandez recorded his first collegiate home run – a grand slam to left center to break open the game, 8-0, in just the second inning.
- He became the first Yellow Jacket to hit a grand slam as his first GT home run since Angelo Dispigna in 2023 and the first to do so for his first collegiate home run since Chandler Simpson did so as a junior back in 2022.
- He also made a SAC fly to finish the day 2-for-3 with five RBI - the most RBI by a freshman Yellow Jacket since Burress drove in six twice last season (vs. Georgia State (Feb. 27, 2024) and at Clemson (May 3rd, 2024).
- It was his first multi-RBI game as a Yellow Jacket after recording the first of his career, last game, at Georgia Southern.
- Drew Burress connected for his third homer of the season, and 28th of his career, in the first inning. It was the 7th time he has launched a 1st inning HR in college.
- He added three more RBI to his tally today, giving him a teamleading nine RBI on the season and 76 over his career.
- Burress has hit at least one home run against every opponent Tech has played this season.
- Sophomore Vahn Lackey maintained his hot bat, going 2-for-3 with a home run and three RBI. It was his first HR of the season and fifth of his career.
- The three RBI from Lackey tied a career high he set twice in his freshman season: vs. Kennesaw St. (April 23, 2024) and in the Regional Final of last season's NCAA tournament against UGA (June 2, 2024).
- Sophomore Kent Schmidt went 2-for-3 with a walk and two runs scored.
- Junior Kyle Lodise reached base with a pair of walks and came around to score on Burress' first inning blast.

Saturday Highlights - The Bats - GT 2 - Marshall 4

- Junior shortstop Kyle Lodise enjoyed a 3-for-4 day at the plate, working in a walk and scoring a run. His third straight game reaching base at least three times and his first-career three-hit game at the Division I level
- Freshman Caleb Daniel made his second-career start at second base, collecting his first collegiate hit with a double in the sixth he came around to score to put Tech in front, 2-1 at the time.
- Daniel went 2-for-4 with a run scored and was one of the runners left stranded in scoring position during the late innings.
- Junior right fielder Parker Brosius went 2-for-4 with an RBI, driving home Daniel for the go-ahead run in the sixth. Brosius has strung together back-to-back mutli-hit games for the first time since doing so for all four games of the series against Youngstown State last year (March 8-10).

- Lodise leads the team with a .564 on-base percentage this season and finished the series slashing .533 avg. / .650 OBP / .800 Slug. over the four games.
- The Brunswick, Ga. native has reached base in a careerbest 20 straight games dating back to his time at Augusta.
- Drew Burress enjoyed another two-hit day, leading the team with three RBI thanks to a two-RBI double in the fifth and an RBI single in the third.

Mason Patel - ACC Co-Pitcher of the Week

- Senior RHP Mason Patel was awarded ACC Co-Pitcher of the week on Feb. 24 after dominating both Marshall and Georgia Southern to the tune of 8.1 innings with a 0.00 ERA, 11 strikeouts and a 2-0 record while only allowing four baserunners.
- Patel becomes the first GT pitcher to earn pitcher of the week since Andy Archer (March 29, 2021).
- Patel's week go started on Wednesday, when he came out of the bullpen to start the third inning in Tech's road opener at Georgia Southern. Patel was perfect through 5.1 innings, retiring the first 16 batters he faced in order to quiet the Georgia Southern bats and allow for Tech to take the game, 5-3. He struck out a career-best nine batters in that appearance, which also goes down as his longest outing in White & Gold Patel's longest since pitching 6.0 innings in a start against Brown for Georgia State back in 2023.
- He followed that with another gem of an outing on Sunday against Marshall, entering the game with runners on second and third and nobody out in the fifth inning, working around a hit-by-pitch to keep the Thundering Herd off the board with yet another scoreless inning. He would pitch two more scoreless to earn the victory, leaving after the 7th inning with the Jackets in front, 10-3.
- Patel's efforts have bolstered a resurgent GT bullpen in 2025. The Tech bullpen has struck out 54 batter while holding opponents to a .180 average – the best numbers by a Tech bullpen through seven games since at least the turn of the century. The bullpen ERA stands at 2.50 – the lowest through seven games since 2020 (2.43).

Midweek Highlights - The Arms - GT 5 - GASO 3

- Freshman RHP **Connor Chicoli** made his first collegiate start, pitching 2.0 innings in a no-decision.
- Senior **Mason Patel** took over to start the third, retiring the next 16 Georgia Southern batters he faced before leaving the game in the eighth inning after giving up his only hit of the day.
- Patel set a new career high with nine strikeouts.
- This was **Patel's** longest outing as a Jacket and longest since pitching 6.0 innings in a start against Brown for Georgia





State in 2023

- Patel becomes the fourth Yellow Jacket pitcher to maintain a 0.00 ERA through 3+ innings, joining **Tate McKee** (5.0 IP), **Caden Spivey** (3.0 IP) and **Jaylen Paden** (3.0 IP).
- Redshirt sophomore **Caden Gaudette** got the Jackets into the ninth with a solid 0.2 innings out of the pen. He became the first GT pitcher to make his second appearance of the season.
- Senior Jaylen Paden joined Gaudette on the two-timers list, entering the game for the bottom of the ninth against his former team. Paden had to work around a pair of base runners but struck out the side for his first save as a Yellow Jacket and second as a college pitcher.
- The GT bullpen had gone 9.1 innings without allowing a run.

Friday Highlights - The Arms - GT 12 - Marshall 1 (7)

- Sophomore RHP Tate McKee made his second consecutive Friday start, finishing with 5.0 IP, allowing just three hits and one earned run while striking out six to collect his first win of the season.
- **McKee** becomes the first GT starter to earn the victory this season after he was pulled from a 1-1 tie last weekend.
- It was McKee's fifth victory in White & Gold as he improves his season numbers to 10.0 IP with a 0.90 ERA and nine strikeouts.
- Senior RHP **Sam Swygert** was first out of the bullpen to start the sixth inning, getting through the Marshall batters in order while picking up his third K in White & Gold.
- Junior LHP Kayden Campbell ended the game in the seventh, allowing one hit but working through the others unscathed, collecting his second strikeout of the season in the process.

Saturday Highlights - The Arms - GT 2 - Marshall 4

- Sophomore RHP Riley Stanford made his second career start, pitching the first three innings without allowing a run before exiting the game after allowing three in the top of the fourth.
- He has pitched at least 4.0 innings in both of his starts after never going further than 2.0 innings at any point last season.
- Senior Mason Patel made his case for ACC pitcher of the week with yet another stellar performance out of the bullpen. He threw 3.0 innings, allowing only two baserunners (one hit and

Jim Poole Number - John Giesler

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, senior infielder John Giesler becomes the third Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023 and Ben King last season.

"I am excited that John Giesler will wear number 21 this year," Head Coach Danny Hall said. "Jim Poole was part of an era in Georgia Tech Baseball that established us as a national power. Jim's prowess on the mound and in the classroom set the bar high for future Yellow Jacket players and teams. John exemplifies those same character traits of excellence on the field and in the classroom. As a two-time Captain he is the ultimate "Tech Man" to honor Jim's legacy."

Giesler, a sixth-year senior from Marietta, Ga. (Walton HS) will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. Giesler is a five-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time academic all-district honoree and earned Academic All-America (3rd Team) in 2023. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in real estate development.

On the diamond, Giesler is entering his second season as team captain. He is a career .308 hitter for the Yellow Jackets and set career highs in doubles (17), home runs (10) and RBI (43) last season while delivering a .990 fielding percentage in 41 games in the corner infield. He will be a key piece of the Jackets' offense again in 2025 as Tech strives for its 36th NCAA Regional berth and fifth in Giesler's career in White and Gold.

"Simply put, this is the greatest honor I have ever been given," Giesler said. "From knowing Jim and knowing who he was as a person, I don't feel deserving but I am incredibly honored. I will do everything I can this year to wear this number with respect and honor him and his family the best I can."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to

graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease, with an estimated 30,000 people living with ALS in the United States at any given time. Primarily affecting people between the ages of 40 and 70, ALS is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. There is no known cure.

2025 ACC TOURNAMENT

Beginning this spring with the 2025 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, North Carolina, all 16 teams in the ACC will compete in a single-elimination championship. The championship will remain six days as it has in previous years, running from Tuesday, May 20, through Sunday, May 25, 2025, from Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

"There's once again tremendous excitement surrounding ACC Baseball and today's announcement will bring an improved championship experience for our student-athletes, coaches, and fans alike," stated ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips Ph.D. "Nationally, the ACC is once again well-represented in the preseason polls and award lists. After what we know will be a highly competitive regular season, we look forward to showcasing all 16 baseball teams in Durham this May."

Since 2006, the ACC Baseball Championship has been played in a pool play or round-robin style format. The tournament last expanded its field size in 2017, moving from 10 to 12 teams.

Under the new format, the top four seeds in the championship will be based off the performance in the regular season and will receive a double-bye into the quarterfinal round, which is scheduled to be held on Thursday and Friday. Seeds five through eight will earn a bye into Wednesday's second round. Seeds 9-16 will begin play with four first round games on Tuesday.



LET'S BRAG ABOUT BURRESS

"Burress is as big a star as you'll find in college baseball, the reigning D1Baseball Freshman of the Year and a 2024 first-team All-American after hitting .381/.512/.821 with 25 homers. He's a no-brainer first-team preseason All-American as a sophomore, and our preseason pick for ACC Player of the Year.

D1Baseball

- In 2024, Drew Burress established himself as one of the best hitters in college baseball and one of the most exciting prospects to watch leading up to the 2026 draft. If he can continue his historic run through the ranks of NCAA Baseball, every MLB front office will be begging for Burress to become the next face of the franchise.
- Burress hit 25 home runs last season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well.

- Burress can claim to have an unofficial piece of the GT home run record since he hit a home run against Georgia that would ultimately not be recorded officially after the game was ended due to rain.
- Last year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.
- His .821 career slugging percentage is the highest among active division I players and the highest of any Georgia Tech player in program history current record belongs to Tom Angley (.763 from 1925-27)

- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field.
- This season, Burress has placed an emphasis on showing off his base running. After stealing eight bags on 10 attempts last year, Burress feels that his speed isn't getting enough attention & looks to amend that in 2025.






