TOP STORYLINES

- The Yellow Jackets are 17-4 this season, the best 21game start to a season in nine years (since 2016) and tied for the best since starting 18-3 in 2013.
- The Yellow Jackets are coming off a series victory over Pitt in which they outscored the Panthers 31-14.
- Last win gave head coach Danny Hall sole possession of 10th place on the all-time NCAA DI win list with 1,428, passing Cliff Gustafson. That makes Georgia Tech the only program in Division I with two coaches on the list, also Jim Morris (5th - 1,594 - coached at Tech from 1982-93)
- Tech is led by reigning National Freshman of the Year, Drew Burress, who was just named ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career. He leads all of Division I with a .822 career slugging percentage - .095 above 2nd place the same as the distance between 2nd and 34th on the list.
- The Houston Co. product became the fastest Yellow Jacket in program history to reach 30 career home runs - doing so in just 73 games, a full 20 games faster than the previous record holder. Kevin Parada
- His 12 doubles lead the ACC this season (4th in the nation) and is 2nd among Power 4 players - Colby Shelton (13 - UF)
- The pitching staff boasts 10.4 strikeouts-per-game this season – over a full K-per-game better than last season (9.2) - Tech has not averaged double-digit K's since the COVID shortened 2020 season (10.9) and hasn't done it over a complete season this century.
- The bullpen success has been spearheaded by Mason Patel who became the first Yellow Jacket this century to win each of his first six appearances. He allowed his first run of the year after 22.2 scoreless innings - the best start to a

season by any Yellow Jacket this century.

- Patel leads the nation with six victories. He is 3rd in Division I in WHIP (0.57), 5th in ERA (0.39) and 8th in hits allowed per nine innings (3.52).
- Tech leads the nation with 66 doubles.
- GT is the only team in the country with three players in the national Top-10 for doubles – **Drew Burress** (12 - 4th), **Kyle Lodise** (11 - 9th) and **Kent Schmidt** (11-9th) – their 34 combined doubles is more than 129 DI teams (41.1 %).
- Freshman Alex Hernandez made his first-career start on the mound on Tuesday. The 6th position he has started in this season - second base (9 games), left field (7 games), designated hitter (two games), first base (1 game) right field (1 game) and pitcher (1 game).
- Hernandez is second among Division I freshman with 7 home runs and 31 RBI.
- He is the only player in Division I to record a save, at least seven home runs and 30+ RBI this season.
- GT's .332 batting average is 2nd in the ACC and 7th in DI.
- Tech's .561 team slugging percentage is 2nd in the conference and 12th in the nation.
- The Jackets are 2nd in the ACC and the nation with 20 SAC flies this season, led by Hernandez and Schmidt (4 each).
- Parker Brosius has stolen 13 out of 13 bags this season, the 6th-most among the Power 4 without being caught.
- The Jackets are 2nd in the ACC and 14th in the nation with 234 hits this year.
- Tech is outscoring their opponents 20-8 in the 7th, 8th and 9th innings over the last eight games.
- GT leads the all-time series with ND, 13-12 (1-5 Away)

- The Cardiac Jackets wasted no time returning for 2025, winning opening day by one run, 3-2, after scoring the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eighth after an infield grounder from **Nathan Waugh** gave just enough time for **Drew Burress** to come sliding home from third, despite a 5-man infield from ODU.
- In the 2nd game, Tech fell behind, 3-0 before recording an out, only for the bullpen to come in and pitch 9.0 innings of scoreless ball, striking out a season high 16 and only allowing three base hits. The bullpen kept the game, 3-0, until the bottom of the ninth, when Tech exploded for seven runs, the most scored in a ninth inning in a decade of GT baseball.
- That 7-run 9th inning began with a 5-pitch walk by **Nathan Waugh** before **Vahn Lackey** delivered his 2nd hit of the game to
 put runners at 1st and 2nd. **Alex Hernandez** drew a walk on 4
 pitches to load the bases for **Tyler Neises** who connected on an
 0-1 pitch, driving it into left for a single and cutting the deficit to
 one run, 3-2. **Will Baker** reached on an error when his sacrifice
 bunt was mishandled by the ODU pitcher, loading the bases
 for **Kyle Lodise** who took his second walk of the day to score
 Hernandez and tie the game. The very next batter was **Drew Burress** and he made no mistake, smashing a 1-0 pitch over the
 wall in right for the walk-off opposite field walk-off grand slam.
- The Jackets began ACC play with a pair of ninth-inning rallys to take two of three at Virginia Tech. On Friday, GT had been trailing, 2-3, since the fifth inning but **Carson Kerce** and **Kyle Lodise** led off the inning with walks before being brought home off

singles from **Kent Schmidt** and **Alex Hernandez**, before **Patel** slammed the door in the bottom of the inning to earn the 4-3 win.

- In the series finale, Tech entered the 9th tied, 6-6 and had not scored since the 3rd. John Giesler led off the inning with a four-pitch walk, followed by a 5-pitch walk from Parker Brosius. It was freshman Caleb Daniel who came through in the clutch, launching a ground-rule double to put GT ahead, 7-6. Carson Kerce would drive home Brosius on a SAC fly to add the insurance run before the combination of Brett Barfield and Cooper McMullen shut down the VT bats for the victory and the 1st career save for McMullen.
- This year, GT has come from behind in 10 of its 16 wins.

IT STARTS AT HOME...

- Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .752 percent of its games at home (1,043-336-1).
- In 31 home games in 2024, Tech has hit .339 with 75 doubles, five triples and 61 home runs for 279 RBI.
- Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full seasons 2017 and 2021.
- So far in 2025, the Jackets are 13-3 with a .344 average. 54 doubles, two triples and 25 HR for 145 RBI.

DANNY HALL - A LIVING LEGEND

- ABCA Hall of Famer Danny Hall joined the Top-10 winningest Division I coaches in history on March 15, when Tech defeated Pitt, 11-1 (7) - his 1,427th win.
- He became the 11th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 1,400 career win mark on April 14 when Tech defeated then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, 11-7.
- In addition to his career-win milestone, Coach Hall also reached the 1,200 wins at Georgia Tech after defeating No. 9 Duke on May 12, 2024.
- He currently has 1,428 career wins the 2nd most among active NCAA head coaches after South Carolina hired Paul Mainieri (1,522 career wins) this season.
- Hall is 16 wins away from tying Chuck Hartman (1,444 at High Point/Virginia Tech 1959-2006) for the 9th most in Division I history.
- He passed Cliff Gustafson on Tuesday. Tech replaced Texas as the only program in Division I with 2 coaches in the all-time top-10 - Jim Morris coached at GT from 1982-93.

Returning Starters

- Georgia Tech baseball returns four bats from the starting lineup of the 2024 Athens Regional Final: Drew Burress, John Giesler, Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackey.
- 2024 National Freshman of the Year (D1 Baseball/Perfect Game) and National Freshman Hitter of the Year (NCBWA) Drew Burress returns for his sophomore season after delivering one of the greatest freshman seasons in college baseball history last year.
- Burress led Georgia Tech in a myriad of categories last year, including average (.381), home runs (25) and RBI (67), becoming the 12th Yellow Jacket to win Tech's triple crown.
- He set the Georgia Tech record for most assists by an outfielder, gunning down 10 base-runners from center field while also setting the program record with four home runs in a single game, against Georgia State (Feb. 27, 2024).
- His .821 slugging percentage from last season gives him the highest career slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats in White & Gold. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) 1979).

- Other GT returning starters include: John Giesler, Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackey...
- **Giesler** playing in his sixth season Led the team with 17 doubles last season. He played three games in COVID shortened 2020 season and redshirted 2021 season. Now in his 6th season on campus, playing in his 4th and final season of eligibility.
- **Brosius** corner outfielder capable of being an everyday center fielder on rosters that don't contain Drew Burress. Started 33 games last season and appeared in 46. His .442 OBP in 2024 was second highest on the team behind Burress.
- Lackey Made 26 starts behind the plate, taking over the starting catcher responsibilities halfway through the season. Caught six runners attempting to steal last year. Lauded for his pitch framing and defensive ability. Coaches have been very impressed with his offensive improvement and defensive versatility expect him to play multiple positions on days when he is not catching.
- **Lackey** made his first appearance on Opening Day 2024, in a pinch-hit situation, and drove his first collegiate hit out of the park to become the fifth Yellow Jacket since 2015 to homer in his first career plate appearance.

• So far in 2025, the Georgia Tech offense remains in a familiar spot, at the top of the ACC and in the Top 25 of a myriad of offensive categories across Division I.

- In 2023, Tech also set the program record for most triples in a single game on Feb. 17 vs. Miami (Ohio) with four.
- Tech also tied the program record for most doubles in a single game on March 14 vs. No. 18 Auburn with eight hitting six in the third inning alone.
- Tech looked true to form in again being one of the top powerhouse offenses in the ACC on Opening Weekend last year, setting the school record for runs scored on Opening Day (21).
- Part of the season-opening onslaught was seven home runs for Tech, the most in a single game since 2009.

FRESH BATS

- Kent Schmidt: Sophomore 1B. Started 56 games for Georgia Southern last year. Led the team in doubles (16) and walks (40).
- Nathan Waugh: Graduate Catcher/DH. 98 career games played at Cornell the last three seasons. Holds Cornell record with a 42-game on-base streak (which ended at 50 games) dating back to the 2023 season after reaching base in all 38 of Cornell's games last season.
- The seven freshmen will be looking to break into the GT lineup this year and continue the great legacy of success at the dish.
- Five of the freshmen hitters come from the state of Georgia with the only two exceptions being Drew Rogers (Tempe, Ariz) and Will Baker (Upper Coomera, Queensland, Australia).

- **Drew Burress** maintained the hot streak that earned him ACC Player of the Week yesterday, going 2-for-3 with four RBI (tying his season high) and four runs scored (a new season high).
- He has now scored 10 runs over his last three games, the most over a three-game stretch in his illustrious career in White & Gold.
- Burress has now recorded multiple hits in four straight games, going 10-for-16 with 10 RBI and 11 runs scored with a 2.075 OPS, two home runs, six doubles and two stolen bases.
- He scored the first run of the day today, his 100th as a Yellow Jacket in this, his 79th career game. His career RBI total sits at 97 following tonight.
- The Houston County, Ga. native has now reached base in a career-best 39 consecutive games dating back to April 28 of last season and extends his hitting streak to five games.
- His recent efforts bring his on-base percentage to a teamhigh .505 this season.
- Alex Hernandez maintained his spot atop the team RBI leaderboard, driving in three runs with a 3-for-5 night at the plate. He also started the game at pitcher, tossing the first 3.0 innings allowing only one hit, a two-run homer after allowing a walk, his only two base runners allowed.
- **Hernandez** came out in the green, allowing two earned runs but driving in three himself at the plate. He allowed one hit but made up for it with three of his own in a very impressive display.
- The Cumming, Ga. native has 10 RBI over his last three games, bringing his season total to a team-high 31 the first freshman in the Power 4 conferences to break 30 RBI this season
- He has reached base safely in 20 of his 21 games played as a Yellow Jacket while starting in six different positions: second base (9 games), left field (7 games), designated hitter (two games), first base (1 game), pitcher (1 game) and right field (1 game). He would stay in today's game as the DH after leaving the mound to start the 4th.
- **Kent Schmidt** has now driven in at least one RBI in 14 of his last 16 games after going 1-for-3 with three RBI and a double.

- He extends his career-best on-base streak to 29 games and his career-best hitting-streak to 15.

- GT won its ACC home opener for the fourth year in a row.
- Drew Burress connected for his team-leading 7th home run

- Burress has hit home runs in back-to-back games for the second time this season and the fifth time in his career.
- The home run drove in two, himself and **Kyle Lodise. Burress** would add two more RBI off a double in the seventh inning for a 4 RBI game, his second 4+ RBI game of the season and sixth of his career.

- This game marked Tech's fourth run-rule victory of the season and first of ACC play.
- The Jackets connected for six doubles, the most in an ACC game since April 23, 2023 at Miami and the first time doing so at home since March 25, 2023 vs. Clemson.
- Sophomore **Drew Burress** went 3-for-5 with two doubles, three runs scored and an RBI.
- He matched his season high for runs scored, also doing so against West Georgia (Feb. 26). It was the eighth time in his career that he has scored at least three.
- Burress hit multiple doubles for the first time this season and the third time in his career. Today marked his 12th-career multi-extrabase hit game as a Yellow Jacket.

- His three runs scored today matched the season high he also set against West Georgia (Feb. 26).
- Shortstop Kyle Lodise became the first player in the ACC to

reach 10 doubles on the season to extend his team-best hitting streak to 13 games.

- He scored two runs and has scored multiple runs in seven of 20 games this season (35 % of games played at Division Llevel)
- Alex Hernandez reached base in four of his five at bats, going 2-for-3 with an RBI, two walks and scoring a run. He saw his on-base streak end at 17 games last time out, the longest on-base streak by any Yellow Jacket to begin a career in at least the last decade.
- Carson Kerce, drew a pair of walks and came around to score once. He has reached base safely in 10 straight games, scoring 11 runs over that stretch.
- Tyler Neises has now reached base safely in a careerbest 12 games in a row after drawing a walk-off walk with the bases loaded in the 7th inning, his 9th RBI of the season.
- **Will Baker** recorded his first-career RBI today off a SAC fly in the 7th, coming in as a pinch hitter.

Sunday Highlights - The Bats - GT 10 - Pitt 12

- The Jackets connected for four home runs today, the most in an ACC game this season and the most since hitting six against Clemson last year (May 3, 2024).
- Alex Hernandez delivered a career performance, going 2-for-4 with two home runs and six RBI tied with **Drew Burress** (May 3, 2024 at Clemson) and **Derek Dietrich** (March 7, 2008 vs. Virginia Tech) for the most RBI in a single ACC game by a GT freshman since **Luke Murton** (7 RBI vs. Clemson in the ACC Tournament May 28, 2006). Those four, along with **Matt Wieters** (6 RBI March 6th, 2005 vs. Duke) are the only Yellow Jacket freshman to drive in six or more RBI in an ACC game this century.
- **Hernandez** secured his first-career multi-HR performance today,
- He has now hit 7 HR for the year, tying him with Louisville's Tague Davis for the most by a Fr. in the ACC.
- He has reached base safely in 19 of his 20 games played as a Yellow Jacket.
- **Drew Burress** went 3-for-4 with two doubles, a home run, three runs scored and an RBI.
- This was his eighth home run of the season and 33rd of his career, joining Mark Fowler (1986-87) and Rick Lockwood (1980-83) on the all-time home run leaderboard as he creeps closer to the Top 20 (36).
- It was his second consecutive three-hit game, the first time he has accomplished that as a Yellow Jacket.
- He matched his season high for runs scored, also doing so yesterday and against West Georgia (Feb. 26). It was the ninth time in his career that he has scored at least three.
- Burress hit multiple doubles for the second straight game and the fourth time in his career. Today marked his 13th-career multi-extra-base hit game as a Yellow Jacket and his second-career 3+ multi-extra-base hit game after breaking the Georgia Tech record with four home runs vs. Georgia State last season (Feb. 27, 2024).
- The Houston County, Ga. native has now reached base in a career-best 38 consecutive games dating back to April 28 of last season.
- He finishes the series going 8-for-13 with five doubles and two home runs for a 2.129 OPS.
- **Kent Schmidt** has now driven in at least one RBI in 13 of his last 15 games after getting the scoring started with an RBI single in the first inning.

And head coach Hall has said he believes this to be the year that Tech fans witness "the fruits of their labor" as the pitching staff looks to prove people wrong in 2025.
- A whopping 21 new arms are joining the staff for the 2025 season, featuring a solid mix of 14 freshmen and seven transfers.

- Sam Swygert: Grad Transfer RHP from The Citadel. Pitched in 18 games and made 12 starts last season, pitching a team-high 67.1 innings with a 5.75 ERA.

Spinning From The Start

- The Georgia Tech pitching staff got off to a historically strong start in 2025 - holding its opponents to fewer than five runs in each of its first six games for the first time since 2002.
- The pitching staff allowed nine runs over the course of the series, a 10-run improvement after averaging 19 runs allowed over the previous three opening series sweeps (14 RA in 2024, 24 RA in 2023 and 19 RA in 2022).
- The Jacket pitchers struck out 40 in the opening weekend against Old Dominion tied with 2022 for the most strikeouts through the first three games this century.
- Last week, the Jackets allowed only three hits in back-to-back games against Georgia State (March 11) and Pitt (March 14) the first time Tech has allowed 3 or fewer hits in back-to-back games since a doubleheader against Duke in 2012 (March 31st 3 hits in game one / 2 hits in game two) those games featured a complete game shutout from Buck Farmer and 4.1 innings from Luke Bard both future major leaguers.

No PATEL-ing How Long This Will Last

- Senior RHP Mason Patel is simply put, the most effective pitcher in the ACC so far in 2025.
- The senior Georgia State transfer from two seasons ago leads the nation with six victories and leads the ACC with a 0.39 ERA and a 0.57 WHIP.
- He is one of only three pitchers in Division I to have surrendered only 1 run with 20+ innings pitched - also Ryan Bilka (Richmond) and Braeden Sloan (TCU).
- He became the first Yellow Jacket pitcher this century to win each of his first six starts.
- He was awarded ACC Co-Pitcher of the week on Feb. 24 after dominating both Marshall and Georgia Southern to the tune of 8.1 innings with a 0.00 ERA, 11 strikeouts and a 2-0 record while only allowing four base runners.
- Patel becomes the first GT pitcher to earn pitcher of the week since Andy Archer (March 29, 2021).
- Patel's award-winning week got started on Wednesday, when he came out of the bullpen to start the third inning in Tech's road opener at Georgia Southern. Patel was perfect through 5.1 innings, retiring the first 16 batters he faced in order to quiet the Georgia Southern bats and allow for Tech to take the game, 5-3. He struck out a career-best nine batters in that appearance, which also goes down as his longest outing in White & Gold Patel's longest since pitching 6.0 innings in a start against Brown for Georgia State back in 2023, all in only 50 pitches.
- He followed that with another gem of an outing on Sunday against Marshall, entering the game with runners on second and third and nobody out in the fifth inning, working around a hit-by-pitch to keep the Thundering Herd off the board with yet another scoreless inning. He would pitch two more scoreless to earn the victory, leaving after the 7th inning with the Jackets in front, 10-3.
- Patel's efforts bolstered a resurgent GT bullpen in 2025.
 The Tech bullpen has struck out 54 batter while holding opponents to a .180 average the best numbers by a Tech bullpen through seven games since at least the turn of the century.
- In his third appearance of the season, Patel entered in the sixth inning retiring the first batter he saw to get Tech into the 7th inning and earning the win and improving to 3-0 becoming the first Yellow Jacket pitcher to be 3-0 after only nine games since Xzavion Curry in 2018.
- Patel was first out of the bullpen vs. KSU, working a pair of flyouts to get Tech out of the second inning before striking out two around a couple of hits in the third and adding another K in the fourth around a two-out walk for 2.2 scoreless innings





- He would get credit for the win, improving to 4-0 on the season and becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the win in each of his first four appearances since Mark Pope in 2011.
- **Patel** came out of the bullpen in the 5th inning of the series opener at VT and continued his unconscious season, pitching 4.2 innings without allowing a hit.
- Patel allowed only three base runners (one walk, one HBP, one ROE) and retiring 7 straight during the middle innings.
- He would get credit for the win, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn a win in each of his first five appearances since Kyle Bakker in 2002.
- Patel slammed the door yet again in Tech's last game (vs. GSU) pitching the final 3.0 innings and allowing only one base runner to secure his sixth victory in as many appearances, still without allowing a run.
- He came in to pitch the final three innings of last Saturday's win against Pitt, earning his first save of the season. He gave up his first run of the year in the seventh inning, bringing his scoreless streak to an end at 22.2 innings to begin the year the best by any Tech pitcher this century.
- He became the only GT pitcher in the 21st century to earn a part of the decision in a each of his first seven appearances (six wins, one save).

MIDWEEK Highlights - The Arms - GT 11 - GWU 4

- Alex Hernandez made his first collegiate start. He would face the minimum through the first two innings before giving up a leadoff walk in the third, followed by the games only home run.
- He only needed 39 pitches to get through his three innings of work. It was his longest outing of the season after throwing 1.2 innings on opening weekend (Feb. 16 vs. ODU) on his way to the save.
- **Hernandez** becomes the third Tech pitcher to make his first collegiate start this year, joining R-Soph. Riley Stanford and freshman Connor Chicoli. Tech is 3-0 when its pitcher is making his first-career start.
- Ryan Johnson was first out of the bullpen, completely shutting down the Gardner-Webb bats with 2.0 IP and four strikeouts while only surrendering one hit.
- He keeps his ERA at 0.00 for the season (4.0 IP), making his third appearance of the season and first since Feb. 26 (vs. West Georgia).
- He has struck out at least one batter in each of his three appearances, flexing a K/9 rate of 15.75.
- Johnson would get the win, the first of his college career.
- Freshman **Cole Royer** made his sixth appearance of the year out of the bullpen, pitching a scoreless sixth inning with a pair of strikeouts to bring his K/9 to 12.71
- Freshman **Joshua Evans** was next out, recording his first-career strikeout as his only out of the game.
- Redshirt freshman **Jake Lankie** was very impressive, recording four of his five outs via punchout – his first career Ks – and getting Tech out of a sticky situation in the 7th inning with the lead still comfortably intact.
- He finished the game with 1.2 IP and 4 Ks while only allowing 1 hit before striking out the next three batters he faced.

 Redshirt sophomore Carson Ballard brought the game to a close with a shutdown ninth inning, retiring the side in order and adding a strikeout for his ninth of the season.

Friday Highlights - The Arms - GT 10 - Pitt 1

- The Jackets allowed only three hits for the second straight game, the fewest allowed over a nine-inning ACC game since May 5, 2023 (vs. Pitt).
- This game marked the first time Tech has allowed three or fewer hits in back-to-back games since a doubleheader against Duke in 2012 (March 31st 3 hits in game one / 2 hits in game two) those games featured a complete game shutout from Buck Farmer and 4.1 innings from Luke Bard both future major leaguers.
- The bullpen allowed only one hit over 3.0 innings (3.0 hits/9) it is the sixth time this season the bullpen has allowed three or fewer hits-per-nine innings.
- RHP Tate McKee delivered his best outing as a Yellow Jacket, pitching a season-long 6.0 innings, allowing only four base runners (two hits, two walks) while striking out six and allowing only one run.
- It was his fifth-consecutive Friday start as Tech improves to 5-0 on Fridays in 2025.
- McKee got the win to improve to 3-0 on the season, dropping his ERA to 2.49 in the process. He leads the Yellow Jackets with 32 strikeouts this year 11.47 K/9.
- RHP Caden Spivey was first out of the bullpen, going 2.0
 innings and allowing only one hit while striking out two. He
 has delivered back-to-back scoreless outings for the first
 time as a Yellow Jacket.
- RHP Cole Royer shut the door in the ninth inning, collecting two of his three outs via strikeout to bring his season K/9 number to 11.74.
- He has also thrown back-to-back scoreless outings after doing so in his first two collegiate appearances earlier this year.

Saturday Highlights - The Arms - GT 11 - Pitt 1 (7)

- RHP Brady Jones secured his second win of the season, pitching 4.0 innings of scoreless baseball, working out of jams with courageous pitches and finishing with 4.0 IP, 5 hits, 3 Ks, 3 BBs and 0 runs allowed.
- It was his second outing of the season without allowing an earned run after giving up one unearned in his previous win, vs. Western Michigan (March 1).
- The performance brings his season ERA to 3.94, joining Tate McKee (2.49), Mason Patel (0.39) and Sam Swygert (3.88) on the list of Jacket pitchers with an ERA under 4.00 and at least 10 innings pitched.
- Mason Patel came in to pitch the final three innings, earning his first save of the season. He gave up his first run of the year in the seventh inning, bringing his scoreless streak to an end at 22.2 innings to begin the year — the best by any Tech pitcher this century.
- Patel is the only GT pitcher in the 21st century to win each of his first six appearances and becomes the first to earn a part of the decision in a each of his first seven appearances (six wins, one save).
- His era rises to 0.39 after today's result, still the best in the ACC among pitchers with at least one inning-per-teamgame.
- Patel still leads the NCAA for the fewest runs allowed this season (1).

Jim Poole Number - John Giesler

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, senior infielder John Giesler becomes the third Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023 and Ben King last season.

"I am excited that John Giesler will wear number 21 this year," Head Coach Danny Hall said. "Jim Poole was part of an era in Georgia Tech Baseball that established us as a national power. Jim's prowess on the mound and in the classroom set the bar high for future Yellow Jacket players and teams. John exemplifies those same character traits of excellence on the field and in the classroom. As a two-time Captain he is the ultimate "Tech Man" to honor Jim's legacy."

Giesler, a sixth-year senior from Marietta, Ga. (Walton HS) will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. Giesler is a five-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time academic all-district honoree and earned Academic All-America (3rd Team) in 2023. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in real estate development.

On the diamond, Giesler is entering his second season as team captain. He is a career .308 hitter for the Yellow Jackets and set career highs in doubles (17), home runs (10) and RBI (43) last season while delivering a .990 fielding percentage in 41 games in the corner infield. He will be a key piece of the Jackets' offense again in 2025 as Tech strives for its 36th NCAA Regional berth and fifth in Giesler's career in White and Gold.

"Simply put, this is the greatest honor I have ever been given," Giesler said. "From knowing Jim and knowing who he was as a person, I don't feel deserving but I am incredibly honored. I will do everything I can this year to wear this number with respect and honor him and his family the best I can."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to

graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease, with an estimated 30,000 people living with ALS in the United States at any given time. Primarily affecting people between the ages of 40 and 70, ALS is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. There is no known cure.

2025 ACC TOURNAMENT

Beginning this spring with the 2025 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, North Carolina, all 16 teams in the ACC will compete in a single-elimination championship. The championship will remain six days as it has in previous years, running from Tuesday, May 20, through Sunday, May 25, 2025, from Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

"There's once again tremendous excitement surrounding ACC Baseball and today's announcement will bring an improved championship experience for our student-athletes, coaches, and fans alike," stated ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips Ph.D. "Nationally, the ACC is once again well-represented in the preseason polls and award lists. After what we know will be a highly competitive regular season, we look forward to showcasing all 16 baseball teams in Durham this May."

Since 2006, the ACC Baseball Championship has been played in a pool play or round-robin style format. The tournament last expanded its field size in 2017, moving from 10 to 12 teams.

Under the new format, the top four seeds in the championship will be based off the performance in the regular season and will receive a double-bye into the quarterfinal round, which is scheduled to be held on Thursday and Friday. Seeds five through eight will earn a bye into Wednesday's second round. Seeds 9-16 will begin play with four first round games on Tuesday.



LET'S BRAG ABOUT BURRESS

"Burress is as big a star as you'll find in college baseball, the reigning D1Baseball Freshman of the Year and a 2024 first-team All-American after hitting .381/.512/.821 with 25 homers. He's a no-brainer first-team preseason All-American as a sophomore, and our preseason pick for ACC Player of the Year.

D1Baseball

- In 2024, Drew Burress established himself as one of the best hitters in college baseball and one of the most exciting prospects to watch leading up to the 2026 draft. If he can continue his historic run through the ranks of NCAA Baseball, every MLB front office will be begging for Burress to become the next face of the franchise.
- Burress hit 25 home runs last season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well.

- Burress can claim to have an unofficial piece of the GT home run record since he hit a home run against Georgia that would ultimately not be recorded officially after the game was ended due to rain.
- Last year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.
- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field.

- This season, Burress has placed an emphasis on showing off his base running. After stealing 8 bags on 10 attempts last year, Burress feels that his speed isn't getting enough attention & looks to amend that in 2025.
- He became the fastest Yellow Jacket in program history to reach 30 career home runs doing so in just 73 games, a full 20 games faster than the previous record holder, Kevin Parada and faster than legendary Tech sluggers such as Jason Varitek, Mark Teixeira and Nomar Garciaparra
