#### **TOP STORYLINES**

- The Jackets are 23-6 for the first time in 14 seasons (2011) and are ranked in Perfect Game (No. 22) and D1 Baseball (No. 25) for the second week in a row first time since 2022.
- Tech has won eight of their first 12 ACC games, the best start to a conference season since 2013.
- GT lost its first ACC series of the season over the weekend, dropping two of three to No. 3 Clemson despite outscoring the Tigers 28-15. The Jackets achieved that run differential after an 18-2 (7) victory in the 2nd game, the largest against Clemson since a 22-4 beat down on April 16, 2006.
- That 18-2 victory featured a 10-run fourth inning with four home runs the most runs scored in a single inning of an ACC game since hanging 12 runs on Duke back in 2018.
- The Jacket bats stayed hot in the midweek, going off for a season-high 21 runs in a 21-5 (7 innings) victory over Mercer, the most runs Tech has ever scored against Mercer in a series that spans over 177 games since 1897.
- Head Coach Danny Hall is one of the Top 10 winningest coaches in Division I history 1,434 wins 2nd most among active coaches behind only South Carolina's Paul Mainieri
- Georgia Tech has replaced Texas as the only program in Division I with two head coaches in the Top 10 for career wins – also Jim Morris (5th – 1,594 – at Tech from 1982-93)
- Tech is led by reigning National Freshman of the Year, **Drew Burress**. He leads all of DI with a .804 career slugging %. the only player in Division I with a career slug & above .735.
- The Houston Co. product became the fastest Jacket in program history to reach 30 career home runs doing so in just 73 games, a full 20 games faster than the previous record holder, 1st round draft pick, Kevin Parada

- GT leads the nation in doubles (89) and doubles per game (3.07) the program record is 2.51, set in the 1987 season.
- The Tech offense has been the best in the ACC this year, leading the conference in batting average (.338), OBP (.441), slugging % (.582), hits (334), runs (292) and doubles (89).
- Drew Burress leads all Power 4 players with 16 doubles (2nd overall). The Jackets are the only team in Division I with 4 players at 11+ doubles, led by Burress (16) along with Kyle Lodise (15), Carson Kerce (12) & Kent Schmidt (11) with freshman Caleb Daniel knocking on the door, with 10.
- **Kyle Lodise** is sixth in the nation and tied for 2nd among Power 4 players (behind only Burress) with 15 doubles.
- **Lodise** is the only player in the nation to be ranked in the Top 20 in both doubles (6th 15) and home runs (14th 12)
- The pitching staff is boasting 10.95 K/nine innings nearly a 2 K/9 improvement to last year (9.2) & the 10th best rate in the nation. Tech has never average more than 10.00 K/9 over a full season in program history record 10.00 in '98.
- That early bullpen success has been led by Mason Patel who became the first Jacket pitcher this century to win each of his first six appearances in a season (7-1 currently)
- Patel leads the nation with seven wins and is 2nd in 0.68 WHIP, 6th in hits/9 (4.54) and 12th in ERA (1.60).
- Freshman **Alex Hernandez** is the only undergraduate Power 4 player with a save and 8+ home runs this season.
- He leads all Power 4 freshman in RBI (39) and is 2nd among freshman in HR (9).
- Tech is 1st in the nation in doubles (89), 3rd in avg. (.338), 6th in OPS (1.027), 5th in hits (334) & 6th in runs (292).

- The Cardiac Jackets wasted no time returning for 2025, winning opening day by one run, 3-2, after scoring the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eighth after an infield grounder from **Nathan Waugh** gave just enough time for **Drew Burress** to come sliding home from third, despite a 5-man infield from ODU.
- In the 2nd game, Tech fell behind, 3-0 before recording an out, only for the bullpen to come in and pitch 9.0 innings of scoreless ball, striking out a season high 16 and only allowing three base hits. The bullpen kept the game, 3-0, until the bottom of the ninth, when Tech exploded for seven runs, the most scored in a ninth inning in a decade of GT baseball.
- That 7-run 9th inning began with a 5-pitch walk by **Nathan Waugh** before **Vahn Lackey** delivered his 2nd hit of the game to
  put runners at 1st and 2nd. **Alex Hernandez** drew a walk on 4
  pitches to load the bases for **Tyler Neises** who connected on an
  0-1 pitch, driving it into left for a single and cutting the deficit to
  one run, 3-2. **Will Baker** reached on an error when his sacrifice
  bunt was mishandled by the ODU pitcher, loading the bases
  for **Kyle Lodise** who took his second walk of the day to score
  Hernandez and tie the game. The very next batter was **Drew Burress** and he made no mistake, smashing a 1-0 pitch over the
  wall in right for the walk-off opposite field walk-off grand slam.
- The Jackets began ACC play with a pair of ninth-inning rallys to take two of three at Virginia Tech. On Friday, GT had been trailing, 2-3, since the fifth inning but **Carson Kerce** and **Kyle Lodise** led off the inning with walks before being brought home off

singles from **Kent Schmidt** and **Alex Hernandez**, before **Patel** slammed the door in the bottom of the inning to earn the 4-3 win.

- In the series finale, Tech entered the 9th tied, 6-6 and had not scored since the 3rd. John Giesler led off the inning with a four-pitch walk, followed by a 5-pitch walk from Parker Brosius. It was freshman Caleb Daniel who came through in the clutch, launching a ground-rule double to put GT ahead, 7-6. Carson Kerce would drive home Brosius on a SAC fly to add the insurance run before the combination of Brett Barfield and Cooper McMullen shut down the VT bats for the victory and the 1st career save for McMullen.
- This year, GT has come from behind in 10 of its 23 wins.

#### IT STARTS AT HOME...

- Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .752 percent of its games at home (1,045-335-1).
- In 31 home games in 2024, Tech has hit .339 with 75 doubles, five triples and 61 home runs for 279 RBI.
- Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full seasons 2017 and 2021.
- So far in 2025, the Jackets are 16-5 with a .350 average. 70 doubles, three triples and 35 HR for 200 RBI.

#### DANNY HALL - A LIVING LEGEND

- ABCA Hall of Famer Danny Hall joined the Top-10 winningest Division I coaches in history on March 15, when Tech defeated Pitt, 11-1 (7) - his 1,427th win.
- He became the 11th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 1,400 career win mark on April 14 when Tech defeated then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, 11-7.
- In addition to his career-win milestone, Coach Hall also reached the 1,200 wins at Georgia Tech after defeating No. 9 Duke on May 12, 2024.
- He currently has 1,432 career wins the 2nd most among active NCAA head coaches after South Carolina hired Paul Mainieri (1,522 career wins) this season.
- Hall is 10 wins away from tying Chuck Hartman (1,444 at High Point/Virginia Tech 1959-2006) for the 9th most in Division I history.
- Tech replaced Texas as the only program in Division I with 2 coaches in the all-time top-10 - Jim Morris coached at GT from 1982-93.

#### **Returning Starters**

- Georgia Tech baseball returns four bats from the starting lineup of the 2024 Athens Regional Final: Drew Burress, John Giesler, Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackey.
- 2024 National Freshman of the Year (D1 Baseball/Perfect Game) and National Freshman Hitter of the Year (NCBWA) Drew Burress returns for his sophomore season after delivering one of the greatest freshman seasons in college baseball history last year.
- Burress led Georgia Tech in a myriad of categories last year, including average (.381), home runs (25) and RBI (67), becoming the 12th Yellow Jacket to win Tech's triple crown.
- He set the Georgia Tech record for most assists by an outfielder, gunning down 10 base-runners from center field while also setting the program record with four home runs in a single game, against Georgia State (Feb. 27, 2024).
- His .821 slugging percentage from last season gives him the highest career slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats in White & Gold. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) 1979).

- Tech looked true to form in again being one of the top powerhouse offenses in the ACC on Opening Weekend last year, setting the school record for runs scored on Opening Day (21).

#### MIDWEEK Highlights - The Bats - GT 21 - Mercer 5

- The Jackets scored 21 runs against Mercer, the most ever achieved against the in-state rival in series history – a 177 game series that dates back to 1897.
- In its last three games, Georgia Tech has had innings with 10 runs (vs. #3 Clemson), nine runs (6th inning today) and 8 runs (1st inning today).
- Tech is 6-0 against in-state opponents this season and have won 10-straight regular season games against programs from Georgia, dating back to last season.
- This was the eighth run-rule win of the season, one shy of last season's total.
- Junior shortstop **Kyle Lodise** extended his career-best on-base streak to 42 games, going 2-for-4 with three RBI and two runs scored.
- He recorded a double and a triple in the first inning, giving him multiple extra-base hits in two of his last three games and four of his last eight.
- His MLB draft stock continues to rise as he now had 10 hits, 14 RBI and 11 runs over his last five games and leads the team with 15 multi-hit games this season (29 games played).
- Freshman **Will Baker** enjoyed a career day at the dish, coming in as a pinch hitter for Lodise in the sixth inning and going 2-for-2 with an RBI single and a bases clearing 3-RBI double to finish with a career-best 4 RBI, the most on the team tonight.
- It was his second-career multi-RBI game after driving in two in the second game of the series at Notre Dame last month, giving him RBI in five of his last eight appearances.
- Both of his base knocks came against left-handed pitchers after entering the game 0-for-6 against lefties this season.
- Sophomore **Drew Burress** connected for his 35th career home run and 10th of the season. The homer made it a 15-3 ballgame and ties him with Eric McQueen (1996-99) and Matt Wieters (2005-07) for the 24th most home runs in Georgia Tech baseball history. His next homer will put him in a seven-way tie for 18th on the program leaderboard.
- **Burress** recorded three RBI to bring his season tally to 37, two shy of **Alex Hernandez** for the most on the team.

- The Houston County man extends his on-base streak to an absurd 47 games dating back to last season.
- Freshman Caleb Daniel laced a pair of doubles (his second multi-double game in his last four appearances) while coming around to score four times. He has now scored 18 runs over his last nine games.
- **Daniel** secured his first-career 4-for-4 night. It was his second four-hit performance after doing so in the series opener at Notre Dame (March 21).
- Junior **Parker Brosius** set a new career-high with four runs scored today. He went 2-for-3 with a double, a walk and a hit-by-pitch, coming around to score each time.
- Sophomore **Vahn Lackey** launched his second home run of the season and 6th of his career, a solo shot in the fourth inning. It was his 37th hit of the season, more than double his offensive output as a freshman last season (18 hits).
- Sophomore **Carson Kerce** extended his career-long on-base streak to 20 games, going 2-for-3 with two walks, two RBI and two runs scored.
- That brings his RBI total to 23 on the season, two-shy of his output from last year despite playing in 21 fewer games.
- Freshman **Connor Shouse** made his first start of the season, drawing a walk and getting hit by a pitch before coming around to score twice for his first-career multi-run day.
- Sophomore Nathanael Coupet came in as a pinch-hitter in the sixth, lacing a line drive base hit for his first-career hit and his first-career RBI.

#### Friday Highlights - The Bats - GT 7 - Clemson 9

- Freshman **Caleb Daniel** extend his hitting streak to seven games (tied for the longest of his young career) with a pair of doubles, his first multi-double game in college.
- The Cartersville native drove in two runs, with a double in the fifth inning. He would come around to score from second base on a SAC fly from **Hernandez** in the next at-bat, when the Clemson outfielder mistakenly thought he had caught the final out of the inning. By the time he realized his blunder, **Daniel** was already screaming around third base, beating the eventual throw to the plate for his second run of the game.
- **Daniel** has now scored multiple runs in each of his last six games and has scored a run in every game of his current seven game hitting streak (17 in total).
- Sophomore **Carson Kerce** extended his career-long on-base streak to 17 games with a 2-for-3 performance, driving in two runs and adding his 11th double of the year more than twice his output from his freshman season (5).
- Kerce now leads the Jackets with 13 RBI in ACC play, three shy of his ACC season total from last year despite playing in just over a third of the games (16 RBI in 29 ACC games).
- This was his seventh multi-RBI game of the season, putting him in fourth on the team leaderboard behind **Lodise** (9), **Hernandez** (8) and **Burress** (8).
- Junior shortstop **Kyle Lodise** extended his career-best onbase streak to 39 games, dating back to his time at Augusta University.
- He did so with panache, connecting on the second pitch he saw for yet another leadoff home run, his 10th HR of the season and the second straight ACC series in which he has led off the team with a dinger (also Friday, March 21 at Notre Dame).
- Lodise joins Drew Burress (14 in 2024), Kevin Parada (10 in 2022 1st round pick), Kyle McCann (12 in 2019 4th round pick), Joey Bart (11 in 2017 1st round pick) and Zane Evans (10 in 2013 4th round pick) as the only Yellow Jackets to reach double-digit HRs in 26 games in the BBCOR era (since 2011).
- Sophomore Drew Burress has now reached base in a career-best 44 consecutive games dating back to April 28 of last season.

- Over his last eight games, Hernandez has hit three home runs and a triple for 17 RBI and 13 runs scored while drawing 11 walks. The Cumming, Ga. native has reached base in 25 of 26 games in college.
- Sophomore **Vahn Lackey** extended his on-base streak to 31 games with a leadoff single in the sixth inning. That streak dates back to last season and is the longest of his career. He would come around to score off a SAC fly from Kerce, tying the game at 6-6.

- Junior shortstop Kyle Lodise extended his career-best on-base streak to 41 games, dating back to his time at Augusta University.
- His MLB draft stock continues to rise as he finished the day with two home runs, both in game one, to finish with three dingers in the series. Over 12 ACC games this season, **Lodise** has hit eight home runs and is slugging 1 000
- He has hit a team-high 12 home runs this season while also reaching base at a .596 clip when leading off an inning (28-of-47).
- His six RBI in the opening game tied **Alex Hernandez** for the most in a game by a Yellow Jacket this season.
- Sophomore **Drew Burress** hit three doubles and a home run today, giving him 16 2Bs and nine homers on the season.
- It was his 34th career HR, passing Mark Fowler (1986-87) and Rick Lockwood (1980-83) on the all-time home run leaderboard as he creeps closer to the Top 20 in program history (36).

- Sam Swygert: Grad Transfer RHP from The Citadel. Pitched in 18 games and made 12 starts last season, pitching a team-high 67.1 innings with a 5.75 ERA.
- Caden Spivey: Junior RHP from Notre Dame. Made 15 appearances with three starts and 27.2 innings of work while going 1-1 with an 8.46 ERA

#### Spinning From The Start

- The Georgia Tech pitching staff got off to a historically strong start in 2025 - holding its opponents to fewer than five runs in each of its first six games for the first time since 2002.
- The pitching staff allowed nine runs over the course of the series, a 10-run improvement after averaging 19 runs allowed over the previous three opening series sweeps (14 RA in 2024, 24 RA in 2023 and 19 RA in 2022).
- The Jacket pitchers struck out 40 in the opening weekend against Old Dominion tied with 2022 for the most strikeouts through the first three games this century.
- In March, the Jackets allowed only three hits in back-to-back games against Georgia State (March 11) and Pitt (March 14) the first time Tech has allowed 3 or fewer hits in back-to-back games since a doubleheader against Duke in 2012 (March 31st 3 hits in game one / 2 hits in game two) those games featured a complete game shutout from Buck Farmer and 4.1 innings from Luke Bard both future major leaguers.

#### No PATEL-ing How Long This Will Last

- Senior RHP Mason Patel is simply put, the most effective pitcher in the ACC so far in 2025.
- The senior Georgia State transfer from two seasons ago leads the nation with six victories and leads the ACC with a 0.39 ERA and a 0.57 WHIP.
- He is one of only three pitchers in Division I to have surrendered only 1 run with 20+ innings pitched - also Ryan Bilka (Richmond) and Braeden Sloan (TCU).
- He became the first Yellow Jacket pitcher this century to win each of his first six starts.
- He was awarded ACC Co-Pitcher of the week on Feb. 24 after dominating both Marshall and Georgia Southern to the tune of 8.1 innings with a 0.00 ERA, 11 strikeouts and a 2-0 record while only allowing four base runners.
- Patel becomes the first GT pitcher to earn pitcher of the week since Andy Archer (March 29, 2021).
- Patel's award-winning week got started on Wednesday, when he came out of the bullpen to start the third inning in Tech's road opener at Georgia Southern. Patel was perfect through 5.1 innings, retiring the first 16 batters he faced in order to quiet the Georgia Southern bats and allow for Tech to take the game, 5-3. He struck out a career-best nine batters in that appearance, which also goes down as his longest outing in White & Gold Patel's longest since pitching 6.0 innings in a start against Brown for Georgia State back in 2023, all in only 50 pitches.
- He followed that with another gem of an outing on Sunday against Marshall, entering the game with runners on second and third and nobody out in the fifth inning, working around a hit-by-pitch to keep the Thundering Herd off the board with yet another scoreless inning. He would pitch two more scoreless to earn the victory, leaving after the 7th inning with the Jackets in front. 10-3.
- Patel's efforts bolstered a resurgent GT bullpen in 2025.
   The Tech bullpen has struck out 54 batter while holding opponents to a .180 average the best numbers by a Tech bullpen through seven games since at least the turn of the century.
- In his third appearance of the season, Patel entered in the sixth inning retiring the first batter he saw to get Tech into the 7th inning and earning the win and improving to 3-0 becoming the first Yellow Jacket pitcher to be 3-0 after only nine games since Xzavion Curry in 2018.
- Patel was first out of the bullpen vs. KSU, working a pair of flyouts to get Tech out of the second inning before striking out two around a couple of hits in the third and adding another K in the fourth around a two-out walk for 2.2 scoreless innings



- He would get credit for the win, improving to 4-0 on the season and becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the win in each of his first four appearances since Mark Pope in 2011.
- Patel came out of the bullpen in the 5th inning of the series opener at VT and continued his unconscious season, pitching 4.2 innings without allowing a hit.
- Patel allowed only three base runners (one walk, one HBP, one ROE) and retiring 7 straight during the middle innings.
- He would get credit for the win, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn a win in each of his first five appearances since Kyle Bakker in 2002.
- Patel slammed the door yet again in Tech's last game (vs. GSU) pitching the final 3.0 innings and allowing only one base runner to secure his sixth victory in as many appearances, still without allowing a run.
- He came in to pitch the final three innings of the Saturday win against Pitt, earning his first save of the season. He gave up his first run of the year in the seventh inning, bringing his scoreless streak to an end at 22.2 innings to begin the year — the best by any Tech pitcher this century.
- Last weekend, Patel came out on Saturday once again, pitching a career-best 6.2 innings - the longest outing of any Yellow Jacket this season — while striking out seven and throwing only 73 pitches.
- He entered the game at Notre Dame (March 22) in the third inning, coming in with the bases loaded, one out and a two-run lead (5-3).    Clemson, allowing a pair of home runs for a total of three earned runs allowed while striking out four.

- Senior Sam Swygert made his second start of the season, pitching 3.0 innings, tied for his season long and allowing only one base runner off a single in the top of the first.
- **Swygert** struck out two and threw only 43 pitches to pick up his first victory in White & Gold after transferring in from The Citadel over the summer.

#### Jim Poole Number - John Giesler

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, senior infielder John Giesler becomes the third Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023 and Ben King last season.

"I am excited that John Giesler will wear number 21 this year," Head Coach Danny Hall said. "Jim Poole was part of an era in Georgia Tech Baseball that established us as a national power. Jim's prowess on the mound and in the classroom set the bar high for future Yellow Jacket players and teams. John exemplifies those same character traits of excellence on the field and in the classroom. As a two-time Captain he is the ultimate "Tech Man" to honor Jim's legacy."

Giesler, a sixth-year senior from Marietta, Ga. (Walton HS) will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. Giesler is a five-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time academic all-district honoree and earned Academic All-America (3rd Team) in 2023. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in real estate development.

On the diamond, Giesler is entering his second season as team captain. He is a career .308 hitter for the Yellow Jackets and set career highs in doubles (17), home runs (10) and RBI (43) last season while delivering a .990 fielding percentage in 41 games in the corner infield. He will be a key piece of the Jackets' offense again in 2025 as Tech strives for its 36th NCAA Regional berth and fifth in Giesler's career in White and Gold.

"Simply put, this is the greatest honor I have ever been given," Giesler said. "From knowing Jim and knowing who he was as a person, I don't feel deserving but I am incredibly honored. I will do everything I can this year to wear this number with respect and honor him and his family the best I can."

#### ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to

graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease, with an estimated 30,000 people living with ALS in the United States at any given time. Primarily affecting people between the ages of 40 and 70, ALS is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. There is no known cure.

## **2025 ACC TOURNAMENT**

Beginning this spring with the 2025 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, North Carolina, all 16 teams in the ACC will compete in a single-elimination championship. The championship will remain six days as it has in previous years, running from Tuesday, May 20, through Sunday, May 25, 2025, from Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

"There's once again tremendous excitement surrounding ACC Baseball and today's announcement will bring an improved championship experience for our student-athletes, coaches, and fans alike," stated ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips Ph.D. "Nationally, the ACC is once again well-represented in the preseason polls and award lists. After what we know will be a highly competitive regular season, we look forward to showcasing all 16 baseball teams in Durham this May."

Since 2006, the ACC Baseball Championship has been played in a pool play or round-robin style format. The tournament last expanded its field size in 2017, moving from 10 to 12 teams.

Under the new format, the top four seeds in the championship will be based off the performance in the regular season and will receive a double-bye into the quarterfinal round, which is scheduled to be held on Thursday and Friday. Seeds five through eight will earn a bye into Wednesday's second round. Seeds 9-16 will begin play with four first round games on Tuesday.

#### LET'S BRAG ABOUT BURRESS

"Burress is as big a star as you'll find in college baseball, the reigning D1Baseball Freshman of the Year and a 2024 first-team All-American after hitting .381/.512/.821 with 25 homers. He's a no-brainer first-team preseason All-American as a sophomore, and our preseason pick for ACC Player of the Year.

#### D1Baseball

- In 2024, Drew Burress established himself as one of the best hitters in college baseball and one of the most exciting prospects to watch leading up to the 2026 draft. If he can continue his historic run through the ranks of NCAA Baseball, every MLB front office will be begging for Burress to become the next face of the franchise.
- Burress hit 25 home runs last season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well.

- Burress can claim to have an unofficial piece of the GT home run record since he hit a home run against Georgia that would ultimately not be recorded officially after the game was ended due to rain.
- Last year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.
- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field.

"He has thunderous bat speed and does a nice job creating leverage in his swing, and shows off plus power, especially to the pull side."
