TOP STORYLINES

• Georgia Tech baseball has been ranked as high as No. 21 in Perfect Game's Top-25 Poll - marking the 5th straight week that Tech has been in the Top 25.

• Tech is off to its best start in 14 years (since 2011).

• The Jackets lead the ACC with 14 wins this year- one shy of last season's total.

· Tech owns one of the most potent offenses in the Power 4, leading the nation's top four conferences in doubles (110) and among the Top 5 in batting average (2nd - .322), hits (2nd - 446), runs/game (3rd - 9.0), slugging percentage (4th - .542) and one-base percentage (5th - .426).

· Georgia Tech is averaging 2.68 doubles per game this season, the most in the nation - the program record for doubles/game is 2.51, set in the 1987 season.

• The program record for doubles in a season is 164, set in 1994, headed into this series, the Jackets are on pace for 150 doubles - accounting for only one guaranteed postseason game in the ACC tournament.

 Tech pitching has struck out 9.9 per-nine-innings this season, the program record for a full season is 10.00 set back in 1998.

• The Jacket arms have only allowed 8.4 hits-per-nine this season - the fewest since 1994 - Head Coach Danny Hall's first season on The Flats.

• Tech is Top 20 across Division I in the following statistical categories: Doubles (1st- 110), SAC flies (1st - 33), Avg. (9th - .322), hits (11th - 446), slugging % (10th - .542), runs/game (15th - 9.0) and on-base % (19th - .426).

· Four Yellow Jackets were named Midseason All-Americans: Drew Burress (1stTeam / D1 Baseball & Perfect Game), Mason Patel (1st Team / D1 Baseball & Perfect Game), Kyle Lodise (2nd Team / Perfect Game) and Alex Hernandez (Freshman All-American / Perfect Game). • The Yellow Jackets have been featured on multiple midseason award watch lists: Drew Burress (Golden Spikes Award), Alex Hernandez (John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year), Mason Patel (National Pitcher of the Year & NCBWA Stopper of the Year) and Kyle Lodise (Brooks Wallace Award)

• Burress leads the Power 4 and is fourth overall with 19 doubles this year, two shy of getting into the Top 20 for doubles in a season over program history.

• Tech is the only program in the nation to have three players with 15 or more doubles: Burress (Power 4 leader - 19), Lodise (17) and Carson Kerce (15) and one of only three programs to have more than one (also High Point, Murray State, Penn, Richmond and Western Ky. - each with two).

· Lodise and Burress lead the ACC with 32 extra-base hits each, as one of the most potent 1-2 hitters in the country. The next closest player in the conference sits at 27 XBH.

· Earlier this month, Burress passed college baseball hall of famer Mark Teixeira, among others, on the GT alltime home run leaderboard. He is currently 17th, tied with Anthony Maisano (1989-90). He is five home runs shy of the Top 10 and 20 away from the program record (Jason Varitek - 57)

• Lodise leads the ACC with a .793 slugging % this season (10th best in Division I)

 Burress leads Division I in career slugging % (.768) by a margin of .036. He is 12thamong all of NCAA college baseball, including DII and DIII.

 The Tech bullpen has pitched 11.0 straight scoreless innings, the 2nd longest stretch of the year (22.0 from Feb. 28-March 8). Six pitchers have contributed to the current streak, including three freshmen.

• The 2024 freshman class was rated No. 2 in the nation and features three players ranked in PG's National top-100: Drew Rogers (No. 23 prospect / No. 3 Catcher), Connor Shouse (No. 83 prospect / No. 22 SS) and Alex Hernandez (No. 96 prospect / No. 8 3B).

• This class also contains one draft pick from the 2024 MLB draft who chose to come to GT instead (Cole Royer – drafted in the 20th round (601st overall) by the New York Yankees).

• The Cardiac Jackets wasted no time returning for 2025, winning opening day by one run, 3-2, after scoring the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eighth after an infield grounder from **Nathan Waugh** gave just enough time for **Drew Burress** to come sliding home from third, despite a 5-man infield from ODU.

• In the 2nd game, Tech fell behind, 3-0 before recording an out, only for the bullpen to come in and pitch 9.0 innings of scoreless ball, striking out a season high 16 and only allowing three base hits. The bullpen kept the game, 3-0, until the bottom of the ninth, when Tech exploded for seven runs, the most scored in a ninth inning in a decade of GT baseball.

• That 7-run 9th inning began with a 5-pitch walk by **Nathan Waugh** before **Vahn Lackey** delivered his 2nd hit of the game to put runners at 1st and 2nd. **Alex Hernandez** drew a walk on 4 pitches to load the bases for **Tyler Neises** who connected on an 0-1 pitch, driving it into left for a single and cutting the deficit to one run, 3-2. **Will Baker** reached on an error when his sacrifice bunt was mishandled by the ODU pitcher, loading the bases for **Kyle Lodise** who took his second walk of the day to score Hernandez and tie the game. The very next batter was **Drew Burress** and he made no mistake, smashing a 1-0 pitch over the wall in right for the walk-off opposite field walk-off grand slam.

• The Jackets began ACC play with a pair of ninth-inning rallys to take two of three at Virginia Tech. On Friday, GT had been trailing, 2-3, since the fifth inning but **Carson Kerce** and **Kyle Lodise** led off the inning with walks before being brought home off

singles from **Kent Schmidt** and **Alex Hernandez**, before **Patel** slammed the door in the bottom of the inning to earn the 4-3 win.

 In the series finale, Tech entered the 9th tied, 6-6 and had not scored since the 3rd. John Giesler led off the inning with a four-pitch walk, followed by a 5-pitch walk from Parker Brosius. It was freshman Caleb Daniel who came through in the clutch, launching a ground-rule double to put GT ahead, 7-6. Carson Kerce would drive home Brosius on a SAC fly to add the insurance run before the combination of Brett Barfield and Cooper McMullen shut down the VT bats for the victory and the 1st career save for McMullen.

IT STARTS AT HOME ...

• Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .752 percent of its games at home (1,048-336-1).

• In 31 home games in 2024, Tech has hit .339 with 75 doubles, five triples and 61 home runs for 279 RBI.

• Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full seasons – 2017 and 2021.

• So far in 2025, the Jackets are 19-6 with a .349 average. 78 doubles, four triples and 40 HR for 235 RBI.

DANNY HALL - A LIVING LEGEND

• ABCA Hall of Famer **Danny Hall** joined the Top-10 winningest Division I coaches in history on March 15, when Tech defeated Pitt, 11-1 (7) - his 1,427th win.

• He became the 11th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 1,400 career win mark on April 14 when Tech defeated then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, 11-7.

 In addition to his career-win milestone, Coach Hall also reached the 1,200 wins at Georgia Tech after defeating No. 9 Duke on May 12, 2024.

• He currently has 1,440 career wins – the 2nd most among active NCAA head coaches after South Carolina hired Paul Mainieri (1,528 career wins) this season.

• Tech replaced Texas as the only program in Division I with 2 coaches in the all-time top-10 - Jim Morris coached at GT from 1982-93.

Returning Starters

• Georgia Tech baseball returns four bats from the starting lineup of the 2024 Athens Regional Final: Drew Burress, John Giesler, Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackey.

 2024 National Freshman of the Year (D1 Baseball/Perfect Game) and National Freshman Hitter of the Year (NCBWA) Drew Burress returns for his sophomore season after delivering one of the greatest freshman seasons in college baseball history last year.

• Burress led Georgia Tech in a myriad of categories last year, including average (.381), home runs (25) and RBI (67), becoming the 12th Yellow Jacket to win Tech's triple crown.

 He set the Georgia Tech record for most assists by an outfielder, gunning down 10 base-runners from center field while also setting the program record with four home runs in a single game, against Georgia State (Feb. 27, 2024).

 His .821 slugging percentage from last season gives him the highest career slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats in White & Gold. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) – 1979).

 This was the third time all season Tech has not recorded an extra base hit. Caleb Daniel seemed poised for at least a single when he laced a pitch headed into the gap in right-center, only for it to bounce off the umpire's backside, directly into the glove of the Auburn 2nd basemen, resulting in a 4-3 putout.

• This was the first shutout loss of the season and the first 1-0 defeat since April 28, 2017 – eight seasons ago vs. UIC.

• Sophomore Carson Kerce was the only Yellow Jacket to reach base multiple times, recording a single and a walk. He has reached base multiple times in 25 of Tech's 41 games this season (61 % of games).

• Sophomore Vahn Lackey was hit by a pitch in the ninth inning, putting the tying run in scoring position and him, the would-be go ahead run) on base. It was his team-leading 8th HBP of the season.

• Sophomore Drew Burress hit a single for Tech's other base hit, tying Kyle Lodise for the team-lead with 55 hits each.

Spinning From The Start

• The Georgia Tech pitching staff got off to a historically strong start in 2025 - holding its opponents to fewer than five runs in each of its first six games for the first time since 2002.

• The pitching staff allowed nine runs over the course of the series, a 10-run improvement after averaging 19 runs allowed over the previous three opening series sweeps (14 RA in 2024, 24 RA in 2023 and 19 RA in 2022).

• The Jacket pitchers struck out 40 in the opening weekend against Old Dominion – tied with 2022 for the most strikeouts through the first three games this century.

 In March, the Jackets allowed only three hits in backto-back games against Georgia State (March 11) and Pitt (March 14) - the first time Tech has allowed 3 or fewer hits in back-to-back games since a doubleheader against Duke in 2012 (March 31st – 3 hits in game one / 2 hits in game two) – those games featured a complete game shutout from Buck Farmer and 4.1 innings from Luke Bard – both future major leaguers.

No PATEL-ing How Long This Will Last

• Senior RHP Mason Patel is simply put, the most effective pitcher in the ACC so far in 2025.

- The senior Georgia State transfer from two seasons ago leads the nation with six victories and leads the ACC with a 0.39 ERA and a 0.57 WHIP.
- He is one of only three pitchers in Division I to have surrendered only 1 run with 20+ innings pitched - also Ryan Bilka (Richmond) and Braeden Sloan (TCU).
- He became the first Yellow Jacket pitcher this century to win each of his first six starts.
- He was awarded ACC Co-Pitcher of the week on Feb. 24 after dominating both Marshall and Georgia Southern to the tune of 8.1 innings with a 0.00 ERA, 11 strikeouts and a 2-0 record while only allowing four base runners.
- Patel becomes the first GT pitcher to earn pitcher of the week since Andy Archer (March 29, 2021).

 Patel's award-winning week got started on Wednesday, when he came out of the bullpen to start the third inning in Tech's road opener at Georgia Southern. Patel was perfect through 5.1 innings, retiring the first 16 batters he faced in order to quiet the Georgia Southern bats and allow for Tech to take the game, 5-3. He struck out a career-best nine batters in that appearance, which also goes down as his longest outing in White & Gold – Patel's longest since pitching 6.0 innings in a start against Brown for Georgia State back in 2023, all in only 50 pitches.

• He followed that with another gem of an outing on Sunday against Marshall, entering the game with runners on second and third and nobody out in the fifth inning, working around a hit-by-pitch to keep the Thundering Herd off the board with yet another scoreless inning. He would pitch two more scoreless to earn the victory, leaving after the 7th inning with the Jackets in front, 10-3.

• Patel's efforts bolstered a resurgent GT bullpen in 2025. The Tech bullpen has struck out 54 batter while holding opponents to a .180 average – the best numbers by a Tech bullpen through seven games since at least the turn of the century.

 In his third appearance of the season, Patel entered in the sixth inning - retiring the first batter he saw to get Tech into the 7th inning and earning the win and improving to 3-0 – becoming the first Yellow Jacket pitcher to be 3-0 after only nine games since Xzavion Curry in 2018.

 Patel was first out of the bullpen vs. KSU, working a pair of flyouts to get Tech out of the second inning before striking out two around a couple of hits in the third and adding another K in the fourth around a two-out walk for 2.2 scoreless innings

• He would get credit for the win, improving to 4-0 on the

season and becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the win in each of his first four appearances since Mark Pope in 2011.

• **Patel** came out of the bullpen in the 5th inning of the series opener at VT and continued his unconscious season, pitching 4.2 innings without allowing a hit.

• Patel allowed only three base runners (one walk, one HBP, one ROE) and retiring 7 straight during the middle innings.

• He would get credit for the win, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn a win in each of his first five appearances since Kyle Bakker in 2002.

• Patel slammed the door yet again in Tech's last game (vs. GSU) pitching the final 3.0 innings and allowing only one base runner to secure his sixth victory in as many appearances, still without allowing a run.

 He came in to pitch the final three innings of the Saturday win against Pitt, earning his first save of the season. He gave up his first run of the year in the seventh inning, bringing his scoreless streak to an end at 22.2 innings to begin the year – the best by any Tech pitcher this century.

• Last weekend, Patel came out on Saturday once again, pitching a career-best 6.2 innings - the longest outing of any Yellow Jacket this season – while striking out seven and throwing only 73 pitches.

 He entered the game at Notre Dame (March 22) in the third inning, coming in with the bases loaded, one out and a two-run lead (5-3). He proceeded to get a three-pitch strikeout before inducing an inning ending groundout to escape the jam and set the tone for what would be yet another dominant outing.

• He gave up one earned run on a solo homer, just his second earned run allowed over 29.2 innings of work.

• He is the only GT pitcher in the 21st century to earn a part of the decision in a each of his first eight appearances (seven wins, one save).

 Patel took the reins for the final four innings on Friday vs. Clemson, allowing a pair of home runs for a total of three earned runs allowed while striking out four.

• He got saddled with the tough-luck loss, dropping his season record to 7-1 with a save over nine appearances.

• Patel showed why he was a consensus midseason 1st Team All-American, pitching the final 4.1 innings on Friday with five strikeouts and only one run allowed, off a SAC fly following a leadoff triple in which the Tech fielder missed a diving catch to allow for extra bases.

• **Patel** earned the win, his NCAA leading eighth win of the season, improving to 8-1 with a save.

• He would collect a pair of saves over two appearances in GT's sweep over Cal (April 11 & 13).

• In his first appearance, on Friday, he pitched the final 3.1 innings to collect his second save of the season while recording his 40th K of the season, his first 40 K season in college.

• He followed that with a pitching clinic on Sunday, needing only 13 pitches to collect the final six outs of the game and his second save of the weekend.

• So far this year, **Patel** has set career highs in innings (44.1), strikeouts (40), wins (8) and saves (3).

• He would get tagged with the loss, his first in White & Gold, dropping his record to 4-1 on the year.

• Junior Brett Barfield did well to get the Jackets out of a jam in the second, coming in with the bases loaded and two outs, getting his man to fly out and keep the deficit at just one run.

• R-Soph. Carson Ballard posted yet another strong and lengthy outing out of the pen, pitching 3.0 innings with only three hits allowed and a strikeout.

• He brings his ERA down to 4.88 for the season, the lowest since his first appearance of the year

• Junior Kayden Campbell came out for the first two outs of the sixth inning (0.2 innings). He has recorded at least one strikeout in each of his 13 appearances and leads all GT pitchers with 10+ IP with 13.88 K/9 this season.

• The Yellow Jacket bullpen has pitched 11.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second longest scoreless stretch of the season (22.0 scoreless from Feb. 28-March 8).

Friday Highlights - The Arms - GT 8 - Cal 5

• Sophomore Tate McKee pitched a career-high 7.0 innings, striking out four and allowing only two earned runs. He would be charged with the tough-luck loss, the first GT pitcher to suffer a loss all season (combined 11-1 record over 38 games).

• This was his 10th straight Friday night start, the Jackets are 8-2 in McKee starts this season.

• This was the longest outing by any Tech pitcher this season, surpassing the 6.2 innings in relief from Patel back on March 22nd at Notre Dame.

• McKee has allowed two or fewer earned runs in six of his 10 starts this season, something he only accomplished three times last season.

• Junior Brett Barfield secured the final three outs in the eighth inning, his fourth straight ACC outing without allowing an earned run.

Saturday Highlights - The Arms - GT 15 - Cal 5 (8)

• Junior Brady Jones made his 10th straight Saturday start, pitching 5.0 innings and striking out four while allowing seven hits and five runs.

• Junior Kayden Campbell pitched 1.2 innings out of the pen, recording a pair of strikeouts around two hits and an earned run. He has thrown 11.0 innings this season with 17 Ks for a 13.91 K/9 rate.

• Freshman Jackson Blakely pitched the bottom of the eighth, collecting the final three outs in his collegiate debut – missed all of last season and the first half of 2025 recovering from Tommy John surgery.

Sunday Highlights - The Arms - GT 4 - Cal 3

• Junior Caden Spivey made his third consecutive Sunday start, pitching the first two innings and taking his first loss of the season, falling to 2-1.

• Freshman Jake Lankie entered the game in the fourth inning, pitching a career-high 2.2 innings and retiring eight straight before allowing his one and only base runner on a hit-by-pitch.

• Freshman Connor Shouse made his collegiate debut on the mound, pitching the final two innings, striking out two and allowing only one man on base, via walk.

• The combination of Lankie and Shouse pitched the final 4.2 scoreless innings of the game, allowing only two baserunners (a walk and a HBP) while striking out five between them.

Jim Poole Number - John Giesler

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, senior infielder John Giesler becomes the third Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023 and Ben King last season.

"I am excited that John Giesler will wear number 21 this year," Head Coach Danny Hall said. "Jim Poole was part of an era in Georgia Tech Baseball that established us as a national power. Jim's prowess on the mound and in the classroom set the bar high for future Yellow Jacket players and teams. John exemplifies those same character traits of excellence on the field and in the classroom. As a two-time Captain he is the ultimate "Tech Man" to honor Jim's legacy."

Giesler, a sixth-year senior from Marietta, Ga. (Walton HS) will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. Giesler is a five-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time academic all-district honoree and earned Academic All-America (3rd Team) in 2023. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in real estate development.

On the diamond, Giesler is entering his second season as team captain. He is a career .308 hitter for the Yellow Jackets and set career highs in doubles (17), home runs (10) and RBI (43) last season while delivering a .990 fielding percentage in 41 games in the corner infield. He will be a key piece of the Jackets' offense again in 2025 as Tech strives for its 36th NCAA Regional berth and fifth in Giesler's career in White and Gold.

"Simply put, this is the greatest honor I have ever been given," Giesler said. "From knowing Jim and knowing who he was as a person, I don't feel deserving but I am incredibly honored. I will do everything I can this year to wear this number with respect and honor him and his family the best I can."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease, with an estimated 30,000 people living with ALS in the United States at any given time. Primarily affecting people between the ages of 40 and 70, ALS is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. There is no known cure.

2025 ACC TOURNAMENT

Beginning this spring with the 2025 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, North Carolina, all 16 teams in the ACC will compete in a single-elimination championship. The championship will remain six days as it has in previous years, running from Tuesday, May 20, through Sunday, May 25, 2025, from Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

"There's once again tremendous excitement surrounding ACC Baseball and today's announcement will bring an improved championship experience for our studentathletes, coaches, and fans alike," stated ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips Ph.D. "Nationally, the ACC is once again well-represented in the preseason polls and award lists. After what we know will be a highly competitive regular season, we look forward to showcasing all 16 baseball teams in Durham this May."

Since 2006, the ACC Baseball Championship has been played in a pool play or round-robin style format. The tournament last expanded its field size in 2017, moving from 10 to 12 teams.

Under the new format, the top four seeds in the championship will be based off the performance in the regular season and will receive a double-bye into the quarterfinal round, which is scheduled to be held on Thursday and Friday. Seeds five through eight will earn a bye into Wednesday's second round. Seeds 9-16 will begin play with four first round games on Tuesday.

He's a no-brainer first-team preseason All-American as a sophomore, and our preseason pick for ACC Player of the Year.

• In 2024, Drew Burress established himself as one of the best hitters in college baseball and one of the most exciting prospects to watch leading up to the 2026 draft. If he can continue his historic run through the ranks of NCAA Baseball, every MLB front office will be begging for Burress to become the next face of the franchise.

• Burress hit 25 home runs last season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well.



• Danny Hall is in his 32nd season at Georgia Tech and his 38th overall as a head coach in 2025. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,214 wins.

• Hall, who won his 1,400th career game on April 14, 2024 and his 1,200th win at Georgia Tech on May 12, 2024, stands second among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2025 season.

- Prior to the 2024 season, Hall was named to the ABCA Hall of Fame.
 - In his career both as an assistant and head coach - Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.


