TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech owns its best record in 15 years (since 2010), coming off a series win over No. 19 Louisville thanks to a doubleheader sweep on Sunday, May 11th (6-0 & 2-1).
- Tech pitching allowed just two hits in the doubleheader thanks to a
 complete game one-hitter from Brady Jones in game 1 and six no-hit
 innings in game two from Jaylen Paden before Mason Patel pitched
 the final three innings for his 5th save of the year.
- This was the third time Tech has held an opponent to just two combined hits over back-to-back games this season (also vs. Pitt March 14 & 15) and vs. Western Carolina (May 3 & 4th). Tech pitching has not accomplished that three times in a single season since at least the turn of the century.
- The 6-0 win in game one marked the second shutout of the season and first ACC shutout since April 10, 2022 (10-0 vs. No. 13 Florida State). It is also the first time Tech has recorded multiple shutouts in a season since 2022.
- Georgia Tech, once again, leads the ACC in conference wins, with 17.
 The Jackets are 3rd in the standings, trailing Florida State (15-8) and NC State (16-9) on win percentage.
- GT has won 17 ACC games for the first time since 2021 and secured a winning record in conference for the season.
- The Jackets finish the regular season with a 26-9 record at home (.743 winning %) the best home record since 2010 (31-6).
- The series win improved the Jackets' record last week to 8-1 over its last nine games after a season-long six-game win streak.
- Tech owns one of the most potent offenses in the Power 4, among the Top 5 in doubles (2nd 133) batting average (3rd .317), hits (3rd 549), OBP (4th .421), Slug (4th .538) and runs/game (5th 8.5).
- Georgia Tech is averaging 2.56 doubles per game this season, the most in the Power 4 – the program record for doubles/game is 2.51, set in the 1987 season.
- \bullet The Jacket arms have only allowed 8.49 H/9 this season the fewest since 1994 Danny Hall's first season on The Flats.
- The GT bullpen owns a 4.13 ERA, the lowest in 11 years (2014).
 Tech is Ton 20 across Division Lin the following statistical categories
- \bullet Tech is Top 20 across Division I in the following statistical categories: SAC flies (1st 38), Doubles (3rd 133), batting average (13th .317), slugging % (11th .538), hits (15th 549), runs (18th 444) and on-base % (20th .421).
- GT leads the ACC in doubles (133), doubles per game (2.56), hits

- (549), runs (444) and slugging % (.538)
- Tech is the only ACC team and one of only 4 Power 4 teams (14 in all of DI) to have three players with at least 52 RBI this season: Alex Hernandez (55), Drew Burress (54) and Kyle Lodise (53).
- Hernandez leads all Power 4 freshman with 55 RBI this season tied for 5th among Division I first years.
- Burress leads the ACC and is tied for third among Power 4 players with 20 doubles this year, one shy of getting into the Top 20 for doubles in a season over program history.
- Tech is the only Power 4 program in the nation to have 3 players with 16+ doubles: Burress (20), Lodise (19) & Carson Kerce (17).
- GT is one of only two teams across Division I (also Arizona State) with 7 players at 11 or more 2B: Burress (20), Lodise (19), Kerce (17), Daniel (15), Schmidt (14), Lackey (12) & Hernandez (11).
- Lodise and Burress lead the ACC with 36 extra base hits each, showing why they are one of the most potent 1-2 combos in the country. Only one other player in the ACC has over 30 HBHs this season, Kyle's cousin, Alex Lodise (34 at FSU).
- Burress became the 17th Yellow Jacket in the 40-home run club, launching his 39th and 40th career long balls against Western Carolina – his first multi-homer game of 2025. He is two home runs shy of Georgia Tech's Top 10 for HR in a career and 17 away from the program record (Jason Varitek – 57).
- Burress is the only DI underclassmen with 40 career home runs.
- Burress leads DI in career slugging % (.743) by a margin of .013. He is 18th among all of NCAA college baseball, including DII and DIII.
- Senior Mason Patel leads the Power 4 with 10 wins this year, becoming the first double-digit winner at GT since Mark Pope and Buck Farmer won 11 games in the 2011 season (14 years ago).
- Patel is one on only 4 pitchers across DI with double-digit wins and the only pitcher with at least eight wins and five saves.
- Defensively, Tech is 2nd in the ACC in stolen-base % against, holding opponents to just a 61.7% success rate. Mostly due to Vahn Lackey who has caught 40% of runners since the start of April (8-for-20).
- Brady Jones is the reigning ACC Pitcher of the Week, after pitching a complete game on-hitter on Sunday, May 11 – the first one-hit shutout by a Tech pitcher since 2011 and the first to do so against a ranked opponent since at least the turn of the century.
- Tech leads the all-time series with Duke, 104-44

- . The Cardiac Jackets wasted no time returning for 2025, winning opening day by one run, 3-2, after scoring the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eighth after an infield grounder from Nathan Waugh gave just enough time for Drew Burress to come sliding home from third, despite a 5-man infield from ODU.
- . In the 2nd game, Tech fell behind, 3-0 before recording an out, only for the bullpen to come in and pitch 9.0 innings of scoreless ball, striking out a season high 16 and only allowing three base hits. The bullpen kept the game, 3-0, until the bottom of the ninth, when Tech exploded for seven runs, the most scored in a ninth inning in a decade of GT baseball.
- That 7-run 9th inning began with a 5-pitch walk by Nathan Waugh before Vahn Lackey delivered his 2nd hit of the game to put runners at 1st and 2nd. Alex Hernandez drew a walk on 4 pitches to load the bases for Tyler Neises who connected on an 0-1 pitch, driving it into left for a single and cutting the deficit to one run, 3-2. Will Baker reached on an error when his sacrifice bunt was mishandled by the ODU pitcher, loading the bases for Kyle Lodise who took his second walk of the day to score Hernandez and tie the game. The very next batter was **Drew** Burress and he made no mistake, smashing a 1-0 pitch over the wall in right for the walk-off opposite field walk-off grand slam.
- The Jackets began ACC play with a pair of ninth-inning rallys to take two of three at Virginia Tech. On Friday, GT had been trailing, 2-3, since the fifth inning but Carson Kerce and Kyle Lodise led off the inning with walks before being brought home off singles from Kent Schmidt and Alex Hernandez, before Patel slammed the door in the bottom of the inning to earn the 4-3
- In the series finale, Tech entered the 9th tied, 6-6 and had not scored since the 3rd. John Giesler led off the inning with a four-pitch walk, followed by a 5-pitch walk from Parker Brosius. It was freshman Caleb Daniel who came through in the clutch, launching a ground-rule double to put GT ahead, 7-6. Carson Kerce would drive home Brosius on a SAC fly to add the insurance run before the combination of Brett Barfield

and Cooper McMullen shut down the VT bats for the victory and the 1st career save for McMullen.

- In the final game of April, the Jackets were on a season-long seven game losing skid, headed into the bottom of the ninth, down 4-6, facing the first 8-game losing streak since 1986. **Drew Burress** saved the day. launching a two-run game-tying home run after Kyle Lodise drew a walk to get on base. Once the game entered the 10th inning, Mason Patel put a zero on the board, allowing for Kent Schmidt, playing in his first series since missing 20 games with an injury, to launch a walk-off solo home run with two outs, to give Tech a 7-6 victory.
- Tech claimed its 5th one-run victory at Mercer, thanks to Connor Chicoli's best start of his young career. The freshman allowed only two runs over 7.2 innings, the longest of any starter this season, allowing Tech to enter the 9th inning with a 4-2 lead. Fellow freshman Alex Hernandez slammed the door, thanks to a pair of excellent defensive plays at SS from Kyle Lodise to secure GT's 6th win in a row.
- The sixth one-run win also required an incredible pitching performance, this time, by senior Jaylen Paden. He threw 6.0 no-hit innings in the second game of a doubleheader against No. 19 Louisville, his longest outing of the year and first time he's carried a no-hit bid through six innings in his collegiate career. Mason Patel pitched the final 3.0 innings, allowing the only hit of the day on a solo home run as the Jackets won a 2-1 game thanks to a pair of RBI from Kyle Lodise.

DANNY HALL - A LIVING LEGEND

- ABCA Hall of Famer **Danny Hall** joined the Top-10 winningest Division I coaches in history on March 15, when Tech defeated Pitt, 11-1 (7) - his 1,427th win.
- In addition to his career-win milestone, Coach Hall also reached the 1,200 wins at Georgia Tech after defeating No. 9 Duke on May 12, 2024.
- He currently has 1,446 career wins the 2nd most among active NCAA head coaches after South Carolina hired Paul Mainieri (1,531 career wins) this season.
- He passed Chuck Hartman (1,444 at High Point/Virginia Tech 1959-2006) for the 9th most wins in Division I
- Tech replaced Texas as the only program in Division I with two coaches in the all-time top-10 - Jim Morris coached at GT from 1982-93.
- On May 11, 2025 Georgia Tech formally retired Danny Hall's No. 17 - joining Joining Mark Teixeira (23), Jason Varitek (33) and Jim Luck (44) on the right field wall.

Returning Starters

- Georgia Tech baseball returns four bats from the starting lineup of the 2024 Athens Regional Final: Drew Burress, John Giesler, Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackey.
- 2024 National Freshman of the Year (D1 Baseball/Perfect Game) and National Freshman Hitter of the Year (NCBWA) Drew Burress returns for his sophomore season after delivering one of the greatest freshman seasons in college baseball history last year.
- Burress led Georgia Tech in a myriad of categories last year, including average (.381), home runs (25) and RBI (67), becoming the 12th Yellow Jacket to win Tech's triple crown.
- He set the Georgia Tech record for most assists by an outfielder, gunning down 10 base-runners from center field while also setting the program record with four home runs in a single game, against Georgia State (Feb. 27, 2024).
- His .821 slugging percentage from last season gives him the highest career slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats in White & Gold. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) 1979).

Wednesday Highlights - The Bats - GT 4 - Mercer 3

- GT hit two home runs today, marking the third straight game with multiple home runs the longest streak of the season.
- Freshman Will Baker hit another home run, connecting for a two-run shot in the second inning. It was his 6th homer of the year, his third in the past six games and second in as many games, marking the first time he has hit home runs in consecutive games.
- The Australian posted his sixth multi-RBI game of the season. It was the first time he has driven in multiple runs in consecutive games as a Yellow Jacket.
- Baker leads the team with three home runs over the current six-game winning streak, tied with Drew Burress.
- Freshman Drew Rogers extended his on-base streak to a career-best seven games with a no-doubt solo home run in the fifth inning.
- It was his fourth long ball of the season and first since Feb. 28, extending his hitting streak to three games, one shy of his career long
- Tech freshmen have accounted for 30 HRs this season led by 11 from Hernandez. GT had 32 homers from freshmen last year, headlined by a freshman record 25 off the bat of Burress.
- Sophomore Carson Kerce came around to score twice,

- giving him 43 runs for the year and marking his 12th multi-run game of the year.
- Burress reached base for the 10th game in a row and 48th time out of 49 games this year after drawing a walk.
- Freshman Caleb Daniel extended his on-base streak to 15 games, the longest active streak on the team. He went 2-for-4 with a double, extending his hitting streak to a career-best eight games.
- He was thrown out trying to score from third on a ground ball, bringing his runs scored streak to a halt at seven games. It was the second time he has scored runs in seven straight games this season after also doing so back in March.
- Kyle Lodise made his mark on the defensive end, playing a part in both of GT's double plays and flashing the leather for each of the final two outs.

- GT hit three home runs, marking the 11th time the team has combined for 3+ long balls this season and fourth in the last seven games.
- Freshman Alex Hernandez accounted for three RBI in the first four innings of the game, driving in Tech's first run with a would-be productive out turned reached-on-error in the first before connecting for a two-run home run in the fourth.
- It was his 11th home run of the season, the most among GT freshmen and tied for the third-most homers by a Power 4 freshman this season.
- It was his sixth game of the season with at least three RBI, tied with Kyle Lodise for the second most on the tea, behind Drew Burress (nine).
- Freshman Will Baker stayed hot at the plate, connecting for a threerun blast in the five-run fourth inning. It was his 5th homer of the year and fourth in the last four weeks.
- The Australian posted his fifth multi-RBI game of the season and third game with at least three runs driven in, the 5th-most on the team.
- Baker leads the team with a .500 batting average over the current five-game winning streak.
- Tech freshmen have accounted for 28 HRs this season led by 11 from Hernandez. GT had 32 homers from freshmen last year, headlined by 25 off the bat of Burress.
- Sophomore Carson Kerce showed his power once again, launching a solo home run to give Tech the lead, 3-2, in the bottom of the third.
- It was his fourth home run of the season and third in his last seven games. He was the last GT starter to hit a home run this season, doing so in the 32nd game of the year (April 8 vs. Auburn). Since then, he leads the team in home runs (four – tied with Baker) and extra base hits (eight, four 2Bs and four HRs).
- Sophomore Vahn Lackey matched his career-high for the fifth time this season with three hits tonight, going 3-for-5 with a double and a run scored
- It was his team-leading 22nd multi-hit performance of the season, more than any Yellow Jacket not named Burress accomplished last year.
- Burress reached base for the ninth game in a row and 47th time out of 48 games this season, going 1-for-4 with a walk and 2 runs scored.
- He leads the team with 64 runs scored this season. There has not been a Jacket score 70+ in consecutive seasons since Richard Lewis in 2000 and 2001 Burress scored 73 runs in 2024.
- Freshman Caleb Daniel extended his on-base streak to 14 games, the longest active streak on the team. He went 1-for-5 with a run scored, his 46th this season, the third most among Power 4 freshmen.
- He extended his hitting streak to a career-best seven games with a leadoff single in the second inning.
- Freshman Drew Rogers filled the box score, in one column, going 0-for-0 with a career-high three walks and a SAC bunt to put Baker in scoring position for the top of the order in the seventh inning.
- The effort extends his on-base streak to a career-best six games while keeping his hitting streak at two, since he never officially recorded an at-bat tonight.
- Sophomore Kent Schmidt drove in yet another run tonight, doing it the hard way with a bases loaded HBP. He has 35 RBI on the year and

has driven in at least one in six of seven games since returning from an injury that forced him out of the lineup for 20 games from March 18-April 25.

- All seven players that entered the game with lengthy onbase streaks extended them tonight: Caleb Daniel reached base for the 16th game in a row, one shy of his career high. Drew Burress has reached base in 11 straight games. Kerce for 10, Kent Schmidt and Alex Hernandez improved their streaks to 7 games while Drew Rogers (8) and Will Baker (7) each extended their career-long on-base streaks.
- Hernandez matched his career-best by extending his hitting streak to seven games, going 2-for-3. He was the only Yellow Jacket to achieve multiple hits tonight, he is tied with Vahn Lackey for the most multi-hit games of anyone on the team, with 22.
- Kerce hit his 17th double of the season. Georgia Tech is the only Power 4 program with three players at 17 or more doubles – also Burress and Kyle Lodise with 19 each.
- Lodise hit a triple in the seventh inning, his team-leading third triple of the year. He takes sole possession of 1st place in the ACC extra-base hit race, now with 36, one more than Burress who was tied with him entering the weekend.
- Burress drove in both of Tech's runs with a two-RBI single in the fifth inning. That hit gave him 120 RBI over his GT career.

Sunday Highlights - The Bats - GT 6 - LOU 0 / GT 2 - LOU 1

- Freshman Alex Hernandez extended his career-best hitting streak to nine games today, going 1-for-3 with a run scored in game one and 1-for-3 with a double in game two.
- The freshman from Cumming, Ga. is tied with Vahn Lackey for the team lead in hits this year, both with 66.
- Junior Kyle Lodise hit out of the three-hole in the lineup for the first time all year, responding with three RBI, including both of Tech's RBI in game two. That brings his season total to 53 RBI, third-most on the team behind Hernandez (55) and Drew Burress (54).
- His two-RBI game in game two was his team-leading 17th mutli-RBI game of the season, tied for the most by a Yellow Jacket over the past three seasons.
- Lodise finishes the series with a team-high .500 batting average and OPS (1.333).
- Sophomore Kent Schmidt recorded two hits in both games today, giving him 17 multi-hit games in just 31 games with multiple ABs (54.8 percent of opportunities).
- He hit his 14th double of the year in game one, putting him at a 22.6 double pace had he not missed 20 games due to injury. That number would lead all of Power 4.
- Sophomore Drew Burress hit in the leadoff spot for the first time this season, collecting two hits, drawing a walk, scoring one run and earning one RBI. Game one was his 21st multi-hit game of the season and 52nd multi-hit game in White & Gold

 — the most on the team.
- Burress leads the team with 65 runs scored this year moving him one step closer to 70, a Jacket hasn't scored 70+ in consecutive seasons since Richard Lewis in 2000 and 2001 – Burress scored 73 runs in 2024.
- He hit his team-leading 20th double of the season, the 2nd-most by any Power 4 player this season and the most in the ACC.
- Caleb Daniel connected for his 15th double of the season in game two, tied for 12th in the ACC.

Spinning From The Start

- The Georgia Tech pitching staff got off to a historically strong start in 2025 - holding its opponents to fewer than five runs in each of its first six games for the first time since 2002.
- The pitching staff allowed nine runs over the course of the series, a 10-run improvement after averaging 19 runs allowed over the previous three opening series sweeps (14 RA in 2024, 24 RA in 2023 and 19 RA in 2022).
- The Jacket pitchers struck out 40 in the opening weekend against Old Dominion tied with 2022 for the most strikeouts through the first three games this century.
- In March, the Jackets allowed only three hits in back-to-back games against Georgia State (March 11) and Pitt (March 14) the first time Tech has allowed 3 or fewer hits in back-to-back games since a doubleheader against Duke in 2012 (March 31st 3 hits in game one / 2 hits in game two) those games featured a complete game shutout from Buck Farmer and 4.1 innings from Luke Bard both future major leaguers.

No PATEL-ing How Long This Will Last

- Senior RHP Mason Patel is simply put, the most effective pitcher in the ACC so far in 2025.
- He became the first Yellow Jacket pitcher this century to win each of his first six starts.
- He was awarded ACC Co-Pitcher of the week on Feb. 24 after dominating both Marshall and Georgia Southern to the tune of 8.1 innings with a 0.00 ERA, 11 strikeouts and a 2-0 record while only allowing four base runners.
- Patel becomes the first GT pitcher to earn pitcher of the week since Andy Archer (March 29, 2021).
- Patel's award-winning week got started on Wednesday, when he came out of the bullpen to start the third inning in Tech's road opener at Georgia Southern. Patel was perfect through 5.1 innings, retiring the first 16 batters he faced in order to quiet the Georgia Southern bats and allow for Tech to take the game, 5-3. He struck out a career-best nine batters in that appearance, which also goes down as his longest outing in White & Gold Patel's longest since pitching 6.0 innings in a start against Brown for Georgia State back in 2023, all in only 50 pitches.
- He followed that with another gem of an outing on Sunday against Marshall, entering the game with runners on second and third and nobody out in the fifth inning, working around a hit-by-pitch to keep the Thundering Herd off the board with yet another scoreless inning. He would pitch two more scoreless to earn the victory, leaving after the 7th inning with the Jackets in front 10-3
- In his third appearance of the season, Patel entered in the sixth inning retiring the first batter he saw to get Tech into the 7th inning and earning the win and improving to 3-0 becoming the first Yellow Jacket pitcher to be 3-0 after only nine games since Xzavion Curry in 2018.
- Patel was first out of the bullpen vs. KSU, working a pair of flyouts to get Tech out of the second inning before striking out two around a couple of hits in the third and adding another K in the fourth around a two-out walk for 2.2 scoreless innings
- He would get credit for the win, improving to 4-0 on the season and becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the win in each of his first four appearances since Mark Pope in 2011.
- Patel came out of the bullpen in the 5th inning of the series opener at VT and continued his unconscious season, pitching 4.2 innings without allowing a hit.
- Patel allowed only three base runners (one walk, one HBP, one ROE) and retiring 7 straight during the middle innings.
- He would get credit for the win, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn a win in each of his first five appearances since Kyle Bakker in 2002.
- Patel slammed the door yet again in Tech's last game (vs. GSU) pitching the final 3.0 innings and allowing only one base runner to secure his sixth victory in as many appearances, still without allowing a run.
- He came in to pitch the final three innings of the Saturday win against Pitt, earning his first save of the season. He gave

up his first run of the year in the seventh inning, bringing his scoreless streak to an end at 22.2 innings to begin the year — the best by any Tech pitcher this century.

- Patel came out on Saturday at Virginia Tech, pitching a career-best 6.2 innings - the longest outing of any Yellow Jacket at that point — while striking out seven and throwing only 73 pitches.
- He entered the game at Notre Dame (March 22) in the third inning, coming in with the bases loaded, one out and a two-run lead (5-3). He proceeded to get a three-pitch strikeout before inducing an inning ending groundout to escape the jam and set the tone for what would be yet another dominant outing.
- He gave up one earned run on a solo homer, just his second earned run allowed over 29.2 innings of work.
- He is the only GT pitcher in the 21st century to earn a part of the decision in a each of his first eight appearances (seven wins, one save).
- Patel took the reins for the final four innings on Friday vs.
 Clemson, allowing a pair of home runs for a total of three earned runs allowed while striking out four. He got saddled with the tough-luck loss, dropping his season record to 7-1 with a save over nine appearances.
- Patel showed why he was a consensus midseason 1st Team All-American, pitching the final 4.1 innings on Friday at Stanford with five strikeouts and only one run allowed, off a SAC fly following a leadoff triple in which the Tech fielder missed a diving catch to allow for extra bases.
- Patel earned the win, his NCAA leading eighth win of the season, improving to 8-1 with a save.
- He would collect a pair of saves over two appearances in GT's sweep over Cal (April 11 & 13).
- In his first appearance, on Friday, he pitched the final 3.1 innings to collect his second save of the season while recording his 40th K of the season, his first 40 K season in college.
- He followed that with a pitching clinic on Sunday, needing only 13 pitches to collect the final six outs of the game and his second save of the weekend.
- Against UVA, he bounced back after a three-run outing on Friday, pitching 3.0 socreless innings in the 8th, 9th and 10th against Virginia, earning his Power 4 leading 9th win of the season
- It was his fifth outing of at least three innings in which he hasn't allowed more than one base hit this season as he proves why he was one of only nine relievers in the nation listed on both the National Pitcher of the Year and Stopper of the Year midseason watch lists.
- Two weeks ago, after graduating from Georgia Tech on Friday morning, Patel pitched the final three innings on Saturday afternoon, allowing only one run and striking out four to collect his team-leading fourth save of the season against Western Carolina
- He emerged for the 9th inning against Georgia Southern, collecting the final three outs for his 5th save of the year.
- The Knoxville, Tenn native earned the win in game two on Sunday, allowing one run and one hit over three innings and earning his 10th win of the season, becoming the first GT pitcher with 10 wins since 2011.
- Patel is the only pitcher in Division I with at least 8 wins and at least 5 saves and has set career highs this season in innings pitched (56.1), strikeouts (52), wins (10) and saves (5).

Wed. Highlights - The Arms - GT 4 - Mercer 3

- Freshman Connor Chicoli, simply put, made the best start by any Yellow Jacket this season. He pitched 7.2 innings, the longest of any Tech pitcher this season, struck out a careerhigh four batters and earned his first-career quality start & win.
- Chicoli was remarkably efficient, facing the minimum through three innings, thanks to pair of double play balls turned

- by the Tech defense. By the end of his outing, he had thrown just 92 pitches to get his 23 outs, doing all of this without allowing a free base in any form.
- It was his first win of the year in his fourth start, and first start since March 11, improving his record to 1-0 while lowering his ERA to 4.05 for the season.
- R-freshman Jackson Blakely got the Jackets out of the eighth with the lead in hand, he would get the first out of the ninth before exiting after allowing a solo homer, pitching 0.2 innings when all was said and done.
- Freshman Alex Hernandez became the first underclassmen pitcher in Division I to record a second save while also hitting for double-digit home runs. He would record the final two outs of the game.
- It was his second save of the season and his second appearance in the last three games.
- He played the first 8.1 innings in right field, where he recorded one putout while going 1-for-4 at the dish, extending his hitting streak to six games in the process.

Tues. Highlights - The Arms - GT 8 - GaSo 5

- Carson Ballard made his 1st start of the season and 7th as a Jacket. He pitched 2.0 innings and struck out three while allowing a pair of solo home runs.
- Kayden Campbell enjoyed his best outing of the season, pitching a career-long 3.0 scoreless innings while striking out three. It was only his fourth outing of more than one inning all season.
- His effort was enough to get the W, improving his record to 2-0 and lowering his ERA back under 3.00 (2.45).
- Campbell's 2.45 ERA is second best on the team among those with more than two appearances, behind only Jaylen Paden (2.25).
- Mason Patel came in to close out the game in the ninth, facing four batters to collect three outs and earn his 5th save of the season.
- He struck out 2 batters, bringing his season tally to 51, the 1st time he has ever recorded 50 Ks in a season & the 1st Tech pitcher to reach 50 Ks without starting a game since Zach Maxwell in 2021 – currently playing for the Cincinnati Reds' AAA affiliate, the Louisville Bats.
- Patel has played a part in the end result in 15 of his 17 appearances this year, with a 9-1 record with 5 saves.

Friday Highlights - The Arms - GT 2 - LOU 16

- Sophomore Tate McKee made his 13th straight Friday night start. He would suffer the loss, dropping his record to 6-3 for the year.
- Freshman LHP Adam McKelvey recorded his second career strikeout in his third-ever appearance, pitching a career-long 1.2 innings.
- Senior RHP Sam Swygert returned to the mound for the first time this month, pitching 2.0 scoreless innings and allowing only one base runner, off a walk.
- It was the third time this season he has pitched more than one inning without allowing a run.
- Sophomore RHP Porter Buursema pitched the final two innings. It was his longest outing since recovering from an injury that forced him to miss all of March.

Sunday Highlights - The Arms - GT 6 - LOU 0 / GT 2 - LOU 1

- May 11, 2025 will go down as one of the best pitching days in recent history for Georgia Tech as Brady Jones, Jaylen Paden and Mason Patel combined to allow just two hits and one earned run over 16.0 innings while striking out nine and walking six.
- Jones tossed a complete game, one-hit shutout in game one – the first one-hit shutout by a Tech pitcher since Mark Pope on April 15, 2011 (at Wake Forest).
- Jones is the first Tech pitcher since at least the turn of the century to record a one-hit complete game against a ranked opponent.
- It was Jones' first-career complete game while only tying his career-high for pitches thrown (96 – set March 29 vs. Clemson and tied on May 3 vs. WCU (his last start).
- The Decatur, Ga. native has delivered quality starts in four of his last five outings and leads the team with four quality starts this season.

- He has completed at least five innings in seven consecutive starts, the longest streak by any Tech pitcher this season, and lowers his season ERA back under 4.00 (3.81) as he aims to be the first GT starter with an ERA under 4.00 since current major leaguer Brant Hurter did so back in 2021 (3.90 over 15 starts).
- His 3.81 ERA is the lowest of any Tech starter with 10+ starts since current major leaguer Connor Thomas posted a 3.11 ERA over 16 starts back in 2019.
- Jones recorded five strikeouts today, bringing his season total to 65, tied with Tate McKee for the most on the team.
- He recorded 10 straight outs across innings 4-7, the secondlongest stretch of the season behind only Patel's 16 straight retired at Georgia Southern (Feb. 18).
- Paden posted the best start of his career in game two, pitching 6.0 no-hit innings, allowing only three walks to 23 batters faced on 93 pitches.
- The outing ties his career-best for innings pitched & is the 1st time he hasn't allowed a hit over 6.0+ innings as a college pitcher.
- He retired eight straight from the third to the sixth inning, his longest such streak of the year.
- The Atlanta native recorded his first quality start as a Yellow Jacket and his first since recovering from an injury that forced him to miss most of 2023 and all of the 2024 season. It was his first QS since going for 6.0 innings vs. Georgia State as a member of Georgia Southern back on April 15, 2022, more than three years and
- Paden threw a season-high 93 pitches today, the most he's thrown in a game since April 23, 2022, leading to a call to the bullpen before the start of the seventh inning.
- He lowers his ERA to a team-best 1.89 over 38.0 innings of work this season, the lowest ERA of any GT pitcher with at least 35 IP since 2016 when Matthew Gorst posted a 0.55 ERA over 49 innings in an All-ACC season.
- Over his last two starts, Paden has thrown 11.0 scoreless innings allowing only two hits and four walks while striking out 11.
- Patel emerged from the bullpen and, despite allowing the only earned run of the day off a solo shot in the seventh, ended up going 3.0 innings with just the one hit allowed and recording the final out of the day with a strikeout.
- He would get credit for the win, improving his record to 10-1 on the year and becoming the first GT pitcher with double-digit wins since Mark Pope and Buck Farmer won 11 games in the 2011 season (14 years ago).
- Patel and UNC's Jake Knapp lead all Power 4 pitchers with 10 wins this season.
- This was his 12th appearance of at least 3.0 innings this season, tied with Tate McKee for the most on the team despite not starting a single game.
- The Yellow Jacket defense played a big factor in the results today with Caleb Daniel and Kyle Lodise each delivering web gems to save out. Daniel robbed a would-be three-run homer in the sixth inning of game two, keeping the no-hitter in tact and the momentum in Georgia Tech's dugout.

Jim Poole Number - John Giesler

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, senior infielder John Giesler becomes the third Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023 and Ben King last season.

"I am excited that John Giesler will wear number 21 this year," Head Coach Danny Hall said. "Jim Poole was part of an era in Georgia Tech Baseball that established us as a national power. Jim's prowess on the mound and in the classroom set the bar high for future Yellow Jacket players and teams. John exemplifies those same character traits of excellence on the field and in the classroom. As a two-time Captain he is the ultimate "Tech Man" to honor Jim's legacy."

Giesler, a sixth-year senior from Marietta, Ga. (Walton HS) will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. Giesler is a five-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time academic all-district honoree and earned Academic All-America (3rd Team) in 2023. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in real estate development.

On the diamond, Giesler is entering his second season as team captain. He is a career .308 hitter for the Yellow Jackets and set career highs in doubles (17), home runs (10) and RBI (43) last season while delivering a .990 fielding percentage in 41 games in the corner infield. He will be a key piece of the Jackets' offense again in 2025 as Tech strives for its 36th NCAA Regional berth and fifth in Giesler's career in White and Gold.

"Simply put, this is the greatest honor I have ever been given," Giesler said. "From knowing Jim and knowing who he was as a person, I don't feel deserving but I am incredibly honored. I will do everything I can this year to wear this number with respect and honor him and his family the best I can."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to

graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease, with an estimated 30,000 people living with ALS in the United States at any given time. Primarily affecting people between the ages of 40 and 70, ALS is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. There is no known cure.

2025 ACC TOURNAMENT

Beginning this spring with the 2025 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, North Carolina, all 16 teams in the ACC will compete in a single-elimination championship. The championship will remain six days as it has in previous years, running from Tuesday, May 20, through Sunday, May 25, 2025, from Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

"There's once again tremendous excitement surrounding ACC Baseball and today's announcement will bring an improved championship experience for our student-athletes, coaches, and fans alike," stated ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips Ph.D. "Nationally, the ACC is once again well-represented in the preseason polls and award lists. After what we know will be a highly competitive regular season, we look forward to showcasing all 16 baseball teams in Durham this May."

Since 2006, the ACC Baseball Championship has been played in a pool play or round-robin style format. The tournament last expanded its field size in 2017, moving from 10 to 12 teams.

Under the new format, the top four seeds in the championship will be based off the performance in the regular season and will receive a double-bye into the quarterfinal round, which is scheduled to be held on Thursday and Friday. Seeds five through eight will earn a bye into Wednesday's second round. Seeds 9-16 will begin play with four first round games on Tuesday.

"Burress is as big a star as you'll find in college baseball, the reigning D1Baseball Freshman of the Year and a 2024 first-team All-American after hitting .381/.512/.821 with 25 homers. He's a no-brainer first-team preseason All-American as a sophomore, and our preseason pick for ACC Player of the Year.

D1Baseball

- In 2024, Drew Burress established himself as one of the best hitters in college baseball and one of the most exciting prospects to watch leading up to the 2026 draft. If he can continue his historic run through the ranks of NCAA Baseball, every MLB front office will be begging for Burress to become the next face of the franchise.
- Burress hit 25 home runs last season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well.

"If he continues to crush the ball at anything mirroring his current rate, he could follow in [Dylan] Crews' footsteps and reach his high ceiling when he's eligible for the 2026 Draft."

- Burress can claim to have an unofficial piece of the GT home run record since he hit a home run against Georgia that would ultimately not be recorded officially after the game was ended due to rain.
- Last year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.
- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field.
