TOP STORYLINES

- For the first time in five years, Georgia Tech hosts longtime rival and No. 12/11-ranked Clemson at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field on Saturday.
- Georgia Tech is 2-0 for the second-straight season and rides a six-game winning streak at Bobby Dodd Stadium into Saturday's highly anticipated matchup.
- The Yellow Jackets put a 6-1 record against nationally ranked Atlantic Coast Conference opponents under head coach **Brent Key** on the line against the No. 12/11 Tigers.
- Georgia Tech brings a top-10 offense into Saturday's showdown with Clemson. The Yellow Jackets rank 10th nationally in total offense, averaging 547.5 yards per game, and also feature top-25 national rankings in rushing offense (21st - 247.5 ypg), passing offense (22nd -300.0 ypg) and passing efficiency (25th - 176.0 rating). The Jackets also rank just outside of the top 25 in scoring offense (43.0 ppg).
- The Yellow Jackets' offensive output has been driven by the play off their offensive line and, in particular, their evasion of negative plays. Tech is one of only 12 teams that has not surrendered a sack this season and also ranks in the top five nationally with just five tackles for loss allowed.

- Georgia Tech and Clemson are meeting for the 90th time overall but the first time since 2023 and the first time at Bobby Dodd Stadium since 2020. Last season, the Yellow Jackets and Tigers did not square off for the first time since 1982 due to the ACC's new scheduling model. The teams' last matchup in Atlanta in 2022 was played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium as part of the Aflac Kickoff Game.

- Tech holds a 50-36-2* advantage in the all-time series between the two programs but Clemson has won nine in a row in the series.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech is one of just 12 NCAA Division I FBS teams that has not surrendered a sack this season. Last season, the Yellow Jackets led all Power Four conference teams and ranked third overall nationally with just nine sacks allowed (0.69 per game).

Georgia Tech's 457 passing yards and 11.9 yards per play in last Saturday's 59-12 win over Gardner-Webb both rank second in program history.

The Yellow Jackets' 680 yards of total offense against Gardner-Webb were the third-most in school history.

How uncharacteristic are Georgia Tech's five turnovers through two games this season? Last season, the Yellow Jackets did not commit their fifth turnover of the season until the ninth game of the year (Oct. 26 at Virginia Tech), a total they matched in the first five quarters of the 2025 campaign.

Making his first-career start, r-Fr. QB Aaron Philo threw for 373 yards in last Saturday's win over Gardner-Webb. The 373 passing yards were the most ever by a Georgia Tech freshman (true or redshirt), the most ever by a Yellow Jacket in his first-career start, the sixth-most overall in school history and the most by a Jacket since George Godsey's program-record 486 passing yards at Virginia on Nov. 10, 2001.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- move it to 3-0 for the first time since 2016;
- up it to 21-22 all-time and 14-8 since 2004 in ACC openers;
- up it to 7-1 against nationally ranked ACC opponents under head coach **Brent Key**;
- be its first over Clemson since 2014, snapping a nine-game losing streak to the Tigers;
- up it to 51-36-2 all-time against Clemson;
- move it to 45-17-2 all-time at home against Clemson;
- extend its longest winning streak at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field since 2016-17 to seven games.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in ACC play;
- be only its second loss in eight games against nationally ranked ACC opponents under Key;
- be only its ninth loss in its last 22 ACC openers;
- extend its losing skid against Clemson to 10 games;
- drop it to 50-37-2 overall and 44-18-2 at home all-time against Clemson;
- snap its six-game winning streak at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field.

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, is in his third full season as the head coach at his alma mater. He took over as the program's 21st head coach on a permanent basis in 2023, after stepping into the role as interim head coach during the 2022 campaign.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech has won 20-of-36 games since Key took the reins as interim head coach five games into the 2022 season.

In his first two full seasons as head coach (2023 and 2024), Key has led his alma mater to consecutive winning seasons and back-to-back bowl berths for the first time since 2013-14. The Yellow Jackets also have consecutive fourth-place finishes in the Atlantic Coast Conference, after being picked to finish 12th in the 14-team conference in 2023 and 10th in the 17-team league in 2024. The back-to-back fourth-place showings have been spurred by Tech's gaudy 6-1 versus nationally ranked ACC opponents since Key took the reins of the program five games into the 2022 campaign.

His 14 wins in his first two full seasons at the helm of the Jackets are tied for the third-most in Georgia Tech history, behind only College Football Hall of Famers Paul Johnson and William Alexander.

The 2024 campaign was highlighted by a pair of wins over top-10 opponents – a 24-21 victory over No. 10 Florida State in the season opener in Dublin, Ireland and a 28-23 home triumph over previously unbeaten and No. 4-ranked Miami (Fla.) in November – as Tech became only the ninth team in ACC history to defeat two top-10 teams in the same regular season. The Yellow Jackets' 7-5 regular-season record was their best since 2018.

A year after fielding one of the nation's most improved offenses, the Jackets had one of college football's most improved defensive units in 2024. Tech's defense surrendered 342.8 total yards and 122.2 rushing yards per game in '24, improvements of 94.3 and 99.1 yards per game over 2023. At the same time, despite a plethora of injuries — including one that cost starting quarterback Haynes King two full games and parts of three others — Tech continued to boast one of the nation's top offenses. The Jackets finished in the top 35 nationally in total offense (424.5 yards per game) and also ranked among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (third), fewest turnovers (11th), completion percentage (24th), rushing offense (32nd) and red-zone offense (32nd). On special teams, Tech ranked third nationally with five blocked kicks and, as a team, the Jackets were one of the nation's 25 least-penalized teams.

Ten Yellow Jackets were named all-ACC in 2024, Tech's most all-conference selections since 2014.

In 2023, Key led Tech to its first winning season since 2018, capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016. The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022, Key served as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach/offensive line coach/run game coordinator for three-plus seasons. In four total seasons at his alma mater prior to taking over as head coach on permanent basis, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. He also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 47, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER GARDNER-WEBB

• Making his first-career start, redshirt freshman quarterback **Aaron Philo** led Georgia Tech to one of the most prolific offensive outbursts in school history in the Yellow Jackets' 59-12 win over Gardner-Webb last Saturday.

• Behind Philo and his career-high 373 passing yards, Georgia Tech (2-0) amassed a whopping 680 yards of offense, including 457 through the air.

• Georgia Tech's 680 yards of total offense were the third-most in program history, behind only its 768 yards vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011 and 712 yards vs. Presbyterian on Sept. 8, 2012.

• Tech's 457 passing yards were the second-most in school history (record: 486 vs. Virginia – Nov. 10, 2001).

• The Yellow Jackets' 11.9 yards per play were the second-most in school history (record: 13.5 vs. Kansas – Sept. 17, 2011).

• The Jackets also rushed for 223 yards, including 100 yards and two touchdowns from Jr. RB **Malachi Hosley** and 92 yards and a pair of scores from r-Sr. RB **Jamal Haynes**.

• Hosley's 100-yard rushing game was his first as a Yellow Jacket but the 11th of his career. The 2024 Ivy League Player of the Year had 10 100-yard games in two seasons at Penn (2023-24).

• All eight of Georgia Tech's touchdown drives took less than three minutes off the clock.

• In all, the Yellow Jackets put 59 points on the board despite only having the ball for 22 minutes and 37 seconds.

• Georgia Tech's defense also turned in a stellar performance, as it recorded six sacks, 14 tackles for loss and allowed just 12 points to a Gardner-Webb squad that scored 52 and amassed 627 yards of total offense in its season opener at Western Carolina a week earlier.

• Not to be overshadowed by the impressive performances on both sides of the ball, the Yellow Jackets were nearly flawless on special teams, highlighted by a field goal block by **Jordan van den Berg** that was returned 65 yards for a score by **Ahmari Harvey**. It was Georgia Tech's first blocked field goal return for a touchdown since the game-winning TD in the famed "Miracle on Techwood Drive" win over No. 9 Florida State on Oct. 24, 2015.

• A week after turning the ball over on its first three possessions in its season opener at Colorado, Georgia Tech had turnovers on its first two possessions against Gardner-Webb.

• Georgia Tech became only the 10th NCAA Division I FBS team since 1995 with at least five turnovers and one or less takeaway through its first two games of the season that has won both games.

• Georgia Tech moved to 2-0 for the second-straight season. Prior to 2024, the Yellow Jackets had not won their first two games of the season since 2016 (the Jackets were 1-1 after two games every season from 2017-23).

• Tech is 2-0 in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2015 and 2016.

GEORGIA TECH-CLEMSON SERIES HISTORY

• Georgia Tech and Clemson are meeting for the 90th time in a series that dates back to 1898.

• The Yellow Jackets officially hold a commanding 50-36-2 advantage in the all-time series*.

• Despite Tech's stranglehold on the all-time series, the Yellow Jackets have lost nine in a row overall against the Tigers (dating back to a 28-6 win at Bobby Dodd Stadium in 2014).

• Clemson is Georgia Tech's fourth-most common all-time opponent.

After playing at Clemson's Memorial Stadium for the first time in 1974, the next three matchups were all played at Georgia Tech (1975-77) before the teams started alternating home and away games when Georgia Tech began ACC play in 1983.

• Saturday's matchup is Georgia Tech and Clemson's 43rd since the Yellow Jackets joined the Tigers in the ACC in 1983. Clemson holds a 26-16 advantage in ACC matchups between the longtime rivals.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

• Georgia Tech has received votes in the first three *Associated Press* (media) and U.S. LBM (coaches) of the season.

• In the latest polls, Georgia Tech is third in the receiving votes category by the AP (78 points) and ninth in receiving votes designation by the coaches (26 pts.).

• This year marks the first time Georgia Tech received votes in both the AP and coaches' preseason polls since 2015, when Tech has preseason rankings of No. 16 (AP) and No. 17 (coaches).

• The Yellow Jackets last received preseason votes in either major poll in 2017, when it had 10 votes in the coaches' poll (44th overall).

• Last season, Georgia Tech was nationally ranked for the first time since 2015, when it came in at No. 23 in the AP Top 25 poll on Sept. 3.

• The Yellow Jackets' ranking was their first since they were No. 20 in AP poll on Sept. 20, 2015.

• Tech has been ranked in the AP poll 308 times since the poll's inception in 1936 (the poll listed 20 teams from 1936-88, except for from 1961-67, when only 10 teams were ranked; it began ranking 25 teams in 1989).

GEORGIA TECH vs. TOP-10 OPPONENTS IN 2024

• For only the second time in program history, Georgia Tech had multiple regular-season wins over top-10 opponents in 2024 — Aug. 24 vs. No. 10 Florida State (24-21 in Dublin, Ireland) and Nov. 9 vs. No. 4 Miami (28-23 at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field).

• The only other season that Tech ever knocked off multiple top-10 teams in the same regular season was 1959, when the Yellow Jackets beat No. 6 SMU (16-12 - Sept. 26), No. 6 Clemson (16-6 - Oct. 3) and No. 8 Tennessee (14-7 - Oct. 10) in three-consecutive weeks.

• Tech also tied the ACC record for most regular-season wins over top-10 opponents (2) in 2024.

• The Jackets became only the ninth team in ACC history to knock off two top-10 opponents in the same regular season (joining Clemson - 1981, Florida State - 1993, Florida State - 1999, Florida State - 2000, Miami - 2004, Virginia Tech - 2004, Maryland - 2007, Florida State - 2013).

• The Yellow Jackets were one of 14 unranked teams to defeat a top-10 opponent in 2024, and the only team to do it twice.

TECH IN THE ACC STANDINGS

• Georgia Tech finished tied for fourth place in the Atlantic Coast Conference in each of the last two seasons (2023 and 2024).

• Tech is one of only two teams to finish in the top four in the ACC each of the last two seasons (joining Louisville).

• Georgia Tech's consecutive fourth-place finishes came after it was picked to finish 12th out of 14 teams in the ACC's 2023 preseason poll and 10th out of 17 teams in the league's 2024 preseason poll.

• The consecutive winning records in ACC play mark the first time since 2013 (5-3) and 2014 (6-2) that the Yellow Jackets have finished above .500 in conference action in back-to-back seasons.

• The most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense is its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has averaged just 1.0 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.8 turnovers per game in losses.

• Georgia Tech's offense is guided by third-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulkner**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia (2020-22).

• Faulkner boasts 20 years of experience on college football staffs, including 14 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18), Southern Miss (2019) and Georgia Tech (2023-pres.).

• King completed 13-of-20 passes for 146 yards and ran 19 times for a career-high 156 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 win at Colorado.

• King's 156 rushing yards at Colorado topped his previous career high of 150, set against Boston College on Oct. 21, 2023.

• His three touchdown runs (4, 17 and 45 yards) at Colorado matched the career high that he originally set in last season's eight-overtime defeat at No. 6 Georgia (Nov. 29, 2024).

• King's 45-yard touchdown against Colorado came with 1:07 to go in the game, and proved to be the game-winner in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 victory.

OFFENSE

- Georgia Tech's running backs room features a deep, talented group behind Haynes.
- Jr. **Malachi Hosley** joins the Yellow Jackets in 2025 after being named 2024 Ivy League Player of the Year at Penn.
- Hosley had a breakout performance in last Saturday's home opener against Gardner-Webb, rushing for 100 yards on just nine carries (11.1 avg.) and two touchdowns (55 and 5 yards).
- The 100-yard rushing game was Hosley's first as a Yellow Jacket, but 11th of his career. He eclipsed the 100-yard mark 10 times in two seasons at Penn (2023-24).
- In his first season at Georgia Tech, Hosley ranks third on the team (second among RBs) with 147 rushing yards. His two rushing touchdowns are tied for second on the team while his 9.2 yards per carry lead the squad (min. 10 carries).
- Hosley totaled 2,250 yards from scrimmage (1,915 rushing, 335 receiving) and 17 touchdowns (16 rushing, one receiving) in two seasons at Penn.
- In 2024, Hosley ran for 1,192 yards and led the Ivy League in rushing yards, carries (191), rushing touchdowns (9), yards per rush (6.2) and yards per game (119.2).
- Hosley averaged 100.8 rushing yards per game and 6.1 yards per carry over 19 games with the Quakers.
- 6-foot-2, 225-pound r-Fr. **Trelain Maddox** returns after battling injuries on both ends of his first season on The Flats in 2024.
- Maddox saw action in just two games as a true freshman in 2024 due to injury, but ran for 67 yards and averaged 5.7 yards per carry in his limited playing time as a true freshman.
- The Yellow Jackets also expect to get Jr. **Chad Alexander** back from injury early this season.
- A former walk-on who earned a scholarship midway through last season, Alexander ran 58 times for 280 yards as a sophomore in 2024.
- Also adding to the depth in the Yellow Jackets' running back corps are r-Sr. **Daylon Gordon** and a pair of talented true freshman in **Shane Marshall** and **J.P. Powell**.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech's embarrassment of riches on the offensive side of the ball extends to wide receiver, led by r-Sr. **Malik Rutherford**.
- Rutherford has a legitimate shot of becoming Georgia Tech's all-time leader in receptions, as he needs just 55 catches to break the school record for career receptions of 195, held by Kelly Campbell (1998-01).
- Rutherford's 141 career receptions are the most by a Yellow Jacket since College and Pro Football Hall of Famer Calvin Johnson caught 178 passes at Tech from 2004-06.

• Returning to the Yellow Jackets at wideout in 2025 are sophomores **Bailey Stockton** and **Isiah Canion**, who combined for 23 catches for 289 yards last season (17-206 for Stockton, 6-83 for Canion).

• Stockton leads Georgia Tech with six receptions for 91 yards through two games this season.

• Stockton led Georgia Tech with four catches for 48 yards in the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29). The totals were just one reception and 6 yards shy of his career highs, set last season vs. NC State (Nov. 21, 2024).

• Canion hauled in his first-career touchdown, an 11-yarder from **Aaron Philo**, in the first quarter of last Saturday's win over Gardner-Webb.

• The Jackets also added Rivers' former FIU teammate **Dean Patterson**. Patterson was a second-team all-Conference USA selection in 2024 after catching 50 passes for 685 yards and seven touchdowns last season.

• Patterson's 84-yard touchdown reception from Graham Knowles in the fourth quarter of last Saturday's win over Gardner-Webb was the seventh-longest reception in Georgia Tech history.

• Leading the way is Sr. RG **Keylan Rutledge**, who earned first-team all-America honors from *Sports Info Solutions* in 2024.

• In 2025, Rutledge was named preseason all-America by the *Associated Press* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview* (both second team).

• Rutledge began his quest for back-to-back all-America campaigns by not being charged with allowing a QB pressure, hit or sack while also helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to run for 320 yards in its season-opening win at Colorado last Friday.

• Rutledge is the 54th first-team all-American in Georgia Tech's 132-year football history.

• Through two games this season, Rutledge is the nation's 39th-ranked guard in run blocking, according to *Pro Football Focus*, with a 70.4 run-blocking grade.

• Rutledge also has a 78.8 pass-blocking grade from PFF through two games in 2025.

• r-Fr. LT **Ethan Mackenny** is the nation's top-graded tackle in pass blocking through two games this season, according to. Mackenny's 90.5 pass-blocking grade is at what PFF considers to be an all-American level (90 or higher).

• r-Jr. RT **Malachi Carney** ranks 14th nationally among all tackles in run blocking, according to PFF, with an 80.7 run-blocking grade through two games.

- Prior to last season, Tech had surrendered at least 100 rushing yards in 33-consecutive games, dating back to allowing 68 yards on the ground in a 45-22 win over North Carolina on Sept. 25, 2021.
- Last Saturday versus Gardner-Webb, Georgia Tech had a breakout performance in terms of negative plays on defense with six sacks and 14 tackles for loss.
- Georgia Tech's six sacks against Gardner-Webb were its most in almost two years, dating back to the Yellow Jackets recording eight sacks at Wake Forest on Sept. 23, 2023.
- The Jackets' 14 tackles for loss tied for the eighth-most in Georgia Tech history and, coincidentally, were Tech's most since it also had 14 TFL in its only previous meeting with Gardner-Webb on Oct. 11, 2008.
- Georgia Tech has forced just one turnover through two games in 2025, continuing a trend that saw the Yellow Jackets uncharacteristically rank 117th out of 133 NCAA Division I FBS teams with just 11 takeaways last season (six fumble recoveries and five interceptions).
- However, the Yellow Jackets have also continued a trend of making the most of their takeaways. Tech scored a touchdown following its only takeaway of this season (fumble recovery vs. Gardner-Webb on Sept. 6), which falls in line with the Jackets either scoring or running out the clock after 10 of their 11 takeaways in 2024 (six touchdowns, one field goal and three end of halves/games).
- Prior to 2024, Tech had been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for two-straight seasons. The Yellow Jackets tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.
- Despite the atypical recent takeaway numbers, Georgia Tech's 61 fumble recoveries since the beginning of the 2019 season are the second-most in the nation during that span.

- Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 2.3 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 0.9 takeaways per game in losses.

INDIVIDUAL

- The depth of Georgia Tech's defense has been on display over the first two games of the season.
- In the season opener at Colorado, the Yellow Jackets had 10 defenders with at least three tackles and 13 with multiple stops. r-Sr. DB **Omar Daniels** was the Jackets' leading tackler with five.
- Last Saturday versus Gardner-Webb, the 15 different Yellow Jackets had at least three tackles and a whopping 21 different defenders had multiple stops.
- *Pro Football Focus'* metrics also illustrate the Yellow Jackets' depth on defense, as 10 different Tech defenders have an overall defensive grade of 70 or higher and 18 have an overall defensive grade of 65 or higher through two games.
- Leading the way in PFF's metrics is So. DL **Amontrae Bradford**, who owns the Jackets' best overall defensive (89.5) and pass rush (90.8) grades.
- Bradford had the first two sacks of his career last Saturday against Gardner-Webb.
- Sr. DB **Clayton Powell-Lee** and r-Sr. DL **Jordan van den Berg** are the Yellow Jackets' top defenders against the run, according to PFF, with rush-defense grades of 86.7 and 84.2, respectively.
- In pass coverage, cornerbacks **Daiquan White** and **Zachary Tobe** lead the way with PFF pass-coverage grades of 75.0 and 72.1, respectively.
- Perhaps marking a full return from an injury that cost him three games last season and required offseason surgery, r-Jr. LB **Kyle Efford** was Georgia Tech's leading tackler last Saturday vs. Gardner-Webb with six.
- Efford has been Georgia Tech's top tackler each of the last two seasons with 81 stops in 2023 and 64 tackles in 2024.

- van den Berg returns as Georgia Tech's most-decorated defender in 2025.
- van den Berg perhaps flew under the radar in 2024 in terms of stats (23 tackles, 5.0 TFL in 13 games) but he caught the attention of the ACC's coaches and media.
- van den Berg was a second-team all-ACC selection in 2024, as voted on by the league's coaches and media.
- van den Berg recorded the first field goal block of his career last Saturday vs. Gardner-Webb, and r-Sr. DB **Ahmari Harvey** returned it 65 yards for a touchdown.
- With last Saturday's blocked field goal return for a touchdown, Harvey became only the 31st player in college football since the beginning of 2024 with an interception, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble and a touchdown to his credit.
- However, Harvey is the only player in the nation since the beginning of 2024 who has had an interception, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble and a touchdown that was scored on a blocked field goal return.
- Harvey's blocked field goal return for a touchdown against Gardner-Webb was Georgia Tech's first since Lance Austin's 78-yard return of a blocked field goal for the winning touchdown on the final play of the Yellow Jackets' famed "Miracle on Techwood Drive" victory over No. 9 Florida State on Oct. 24, 2015.
- Powell-Lee is one of five Yellow Jackets in the last 36 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same contest (LB Charlie Thomas — Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, DB LaMiles Brooks — Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech — Nov. 5, 2022, DL Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and DB Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).
- Prior to five Tech players recording an interception and a fumble recovery in the last 35 games, only two other Yellow Jackets had accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy — Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling — Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).

• The first two games of this season notwithstanding, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the last five-plus seasons. In their 27 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in 18-of-27 games and are plus-34 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 22 of its 35 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-33 overall in turnover margin in those 35 losses.
