TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech opens the home portion of its 2025 schedule and puts a five-game winning streak at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field on the line when it hosts Gardner-Webb on Saturday.
- Georgia Tech opened the season with a hard-fought 27-20 victory at Colorado last Friday night. The Yellow Jackets turned the ball over on each of three first three possessions (all in the first eight minutes of the game), but bounced back to score five of the last seven times they had the ball, capped by quarterback **Haynes King's** game-winning 45-yard touchdown run with just 1:07 remaining.
- The Jackets became only the seventh team in the last 10 seasons to win a road game against a power-conference opponent when turning the ball over at least three times while its opponent had zero turnovers.
- King was the catalyst behind the comeback win in Colorado, rushing for a career-high 156 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns, while also passing for 143 yards. He became only the second NCAA Division I FBS player since 2000 with at least 140 passing yards, 140 rushing yards and three touchdown runs in a season opener, joining Super Bowl MVP Jalen Hurts, who accomplished the feat as Oklahoma's QB vs. Houston in 2019.
- Gardner-Webb is fresh off an impressive come-from-behind victory of its own in last Saturday's season opener at Western Carolina. Gardner-Webb rallied from a 35-7 deficit to defeat WCU, 52-45.
- Saturday's matchup is the second all-time between Georgia Tech and Gardner-Webb. In 2008, Hall of Fame head coach Paul Johnson's first season at Tech, the Yellow Jackets needed a field goal block by future first-round NFL Draft pick Derrick Morgan in the final 10 seconds of the game to eke out a 10-7 win over the Runnin' Bulldogs.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Saturday's game is the second all-time meeting between Georgia Tech and Gardner-Webb. In their only previous meeting on Oct. 11, 2008, during Hall of Fame head coach Paul Johnson's first season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets, Tech eked out a 10-7 win over the Runnin' Bulldogs. A field-goal block by future first-round NFL Draft pick Derrick Morgan in the final 10 seconds of the game sealed the victory for Tech, who would go on to finish 9-4 with wins over Clemson, Florida State, Miami (Fla.) and Georgia. Gardner-Webb finished the season at 7-5.

How uncharacteristic were Georgia Tech's three turnovers in its first three possessions of the season last Friday at Colorado? Last season, Georgia Tech did not commit its third turnover of the season until its eighth game (Oct. 19 vs. Notre Dame). This season, the Yellow Jackets committed three turnovers in the first eight minutes of the campaign.

Since the beginning of the 2023 season (head coach **Brent Key's** first full season at the helm), Georgia Tech has rushed for at least 300 yards four times in 23 games against NCAA Division I FBS opponents. That is the most 300-yard games against FBS competition by any team in the nation since the beginning of the '23 season.

With 299 yards of total offense last Friday against Colorado, QB **Haynes King** moved into the top five in Georgia Tech history with 6,280 yards of total offense as a Yellow Jacket. Only Joe Hamilton (10,640 yards from 1996-99), Reggie Ball (9,579 - 2003-06), Shawn Jones (9,296 - 1989-92) and Justin Thomas (7,166 - 2013-16) have had more yards of total offense at Georgia Tech than King.

PK **Aidan Birr** needs just 13 points to become the sixth kicker in Georgia Tech history with 200 career points, joining three-time Super Bowl champion Harrison Butker (337 points from 2013-16), Luke Manget (322 - 1999-2002), Travis Bell (321 - 2004-07), Scott Sisson (299 - 1989-92) and Scott Blair (239 - 2007-10).

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, is in his third full season as the head coach at his alma mater. He took over as the program's 21st head coach on a permanent basis in 2023, after stepping into the role as interim head coach during the 2022 campaign.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech has won 19-of-35 games since Key took the reins as interim head coach five games into the 2022 season.

In his first two full seasons as head coach (2023 and 2024), Key has led his alma mater to consecutive winning seasons and back-to-back bowl berths for the first time since 2013-14. The Yellow Jackets also have consecutive fourth-place finishes in the Atlantic Coast Conference, after being picked to finish 12th in the 14-team conference in 2023 and 10th in the 17-team league in 2024. The back-to-back fourth-place showings have been spurred by Tech's gaudy 6-1 versus nationally ranked ACC opponents since Key took the reins of the program five games into the 2022 campaign.

His 14 wins in his first two full seasons at the helm of the Jackets are tied for the third-most in Georgia Tech history, behind only College Football Hall of Famers Paul Johnson and William Alexander.

The 2024 campaign was highlighted by a pair of wins over top-10 opponents – a 24-21 victory over No. 10 Florida State in the season opener in Dublin, Ireland and a 28-23 home triumph over previously unbeaten and No. 4-ranked Miami (Fla.) in November – as Tech became only the ninth team in ACC history to defeat two top-10 teams in the same regular season. The Yellow Jackets' 7-5 regular-season record was their best since 2018.

A year after fielding one of the nation's most improved offenses, the Jackets had one of college football's most improved defensive units in 2024. Tech's defense surrendered 342.8 total yards and 122.2 rushing yards per game in '24, improvements of 94.3 and 99.1 yards per game over 2023. At the same time, despite a plethora of injuries — including one that cost starting quarterback Haynes King two full games and parts of three others — Tech continued to boast one of the nation's top offenses. The Jackets finished in the top 35 nationally in total offense (424.5 yards per game) and also ranked among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (third), fewest turnovers (11th), completion percentage (24th), rushing offense (32nd) and red-zone offense (32nd). On special teams, Tech ranked third nationally with five blocked kicks and, as a team, the Jackets were one of the nation's 25 least-penalized teams.

Ten Yellow Jackets were named all-ACC in 2024, Tech's most all-conference selections since 2014.

In 2023, Key led Tech to its first winning season since 2018, capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016. The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022, Key served as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach/offensive line coach/run game coordinator for three-plus seasons. In four total seasons at his alma mater prior to taking over as head coach on permanent basis, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. He also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 47, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER COLORADO

- QB **Haynes King's** 45-yard touchdown run with 1:07 to go in the game — his third TD run of the night — lifted Georgia Tech to a 27-20 win over Colorado last Friday in Boulder, Colo.
- Georgia Tech had a disastrous start to the season, as it committed turnovers on each of its first three possessions, all in the first 7:56 of the game.
- However, Tech's defense, in its first game under first-year coordinator Blake Gideon, minimized the damage by allowing just seven points after the trio of miscues.
- The Yellow Jackets' offense bounced back from the challenging start by scoring on five of their final seven possessions.
- With the game tied at 20-20 and the ball on their own 39-yard line with 2:51 left on the clock, King needed just five plays to put the Yellow Jackets ahead.
- King accounted for 57 of the Jackets' 61 yards on go-ahead drive, including 4-yard gain on third-and-2 that gave Tech a critical first down coming out of the two-minute timeout.
- Two plays later, King burst through a hole on the right side of a line and ran past Colorado's defense for the 45-yard game-winning score with 67 seconds remaining in the contest.
- Georgia Tech held significant statistical advantages in total yards (463-305), rushing yards (320-146) and first downs (27-19).
- King led the way, totaling 299 yards of offense (a career-high 156 rushing and 143 passing) and running for a career-high-tying three touchdowns (4, 17 and 45 yards).
- King became only the second NCAA Division I FBS player since 2000 with at least 140 passing yards, 140 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns in a season opener, joining Super Bowl MVP Jalen Hurts, who accomplished the feat as Oklahoma's QB vs. Houston in 2019.
- RB **Jamal Haynes** chipped in with 92 combined yards (65 rushing, 27 receiving).
- Hayne led four Yellow Jackets running backs and wide receivers that accounted for at least 45 yards from scrimmage (RB **Malachi Hosley** — 71, WR **Bailey Stockton** — 53 and WR **Eric Rivers** — 45).
- PK **Aidan Birr** was a perfect 10-for-10 on kicks — 2-for-2 on field goals (32 and 43 yards), 3-for-3 on PATs and 5-for-5 on touchbacks on kickoffs.
- Georgia Tech won its season opener on its final offensive play for the second-straight season. On Aug. 24, 2024, Birr's 44-yard field goal as time expired lifted Tech to a 24-21 win over No. 10 Florida State in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic in Dublin, Ireland.
- Georgia Tech moved to 4-6 all-time and 2-3 in regular-season games in the Mountain Time Zone.
- The win was Georgia Tech's first regular-season victory in the Mountain Time Zone since a 42-21 win at Air Force on Nov. 11, 1978, snapping a three-game losing streak in Mountain time during the regular-season.
- The win was Georgia Tech's first regular-season non-conference win over a power-conference opponent since a 28-27 win at Georgia on Nov. 26, 2016

GT-GARDNER-WEBB SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia Tech and Gardner-Webb are meeting for the second time.
- In the only previous meeting between the two programs, Georgia Tech escaped with a 10-7 win over Gardner-Webb on Oct. 11, 2008.
- The matchup, which came during Hall of Fame head coach Paul Johnson's first season at Tech, came down to the Yellow Jackets blocking Gardner-Webb's 44-yard field goal attempt with nine seconds remaining in the game.
- Georgia Tech DE Derrick Morgan, a future first-round NFL Draft pick and nine-year pro with the Tennessee Titans, blocked the would-be game-tying field goal to preserve the win for the Jackets.
- Georgia Tech is 39-2-1 against NCAA Division I-AA/FCS opponents since Division I split into football subdivisions in 1978.
- The Yellow Jackets' only losses to I-AA/FCS opponents came on Sept. 17, 1983, a 17-14 loss to Furman, and on Sept. 14, 2019, a 27-24 overtime loss to The Citadel. The Jackets also tied Furman, 17-17, on Sept. 13, 1986.
- Gardner-Webb's only win ever over an NCAA Division I FBS opponent was a 38-37 overtime win over Akron on Sept. 11, 2010.
- Gardner-Webb is a member of the OVC-Big South Football Association, which also includes Charleston Southern, Eastern Illinois, Lindenwood, Southeast Missouri State, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, Tennessee-Martin and Western Illinois.

GEORGIA TECH IN HOME OPENERS

- Georgia Tech is 97-29-4 (.762) in 130 home openers all-time (Tech did not play any home games in 1897 or 1898).
- The Yellow Jackets are 20-5 in home openers since 2000, but have lost four of their last five.
- While the Yellow Jackets have lost 4-of-5 home openers overall, they have won their last three lid-lifters at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field. The Jackets' home openers in 2022 and 2023 were played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- After playing 12-straight home openers against NCAA Division I FCS opponents from 2007-18, Tech is facing an FCS opponent in its home opener for the first time in seven seasons.
- The Yellow Jackets faced FBS opponents in their last six home openers (2019-24), which marked the first time since 1977-82 that the Jackets faced FBS competition in six-straight home openers.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Georgia Tech has received votes in the first two *Associated Press* (media) and U.S. LBM (coaches) of the season (preseason and Week 2).
- In the latest polls, Georgia Tech is third in the receiving votes category by the AP (67 points) and tied for 10th in receiving votes designation by the coaches (17 pts.).
- This year marks the first time Georgia Tech received votes in both the AP and coaches' preseason polls since 2015, when Tech has preseason rankings of No. 16 (AP) and No. 17 (coaches).
- The Yellow Jackets last received preseason votes in either major poll in 2017, when it had 10 votes in the coaches' poll (44th overall).
- Last season, Georgia Tech was nationally ranked for the first time since 2015, when it came in at No. 23 in the AP Top 25 poll on Sept. 3.
- The Yellow Jackets' ranking was their first since they were No. 20 in AP poll on Sept. 20, 2015.
- Tech has been ranked in the AP poll 308 times since the poll's inception in 1936 (the poll listed 20 teams from 1936-88, except for from 1961-67, when only 10 teams were ranked; it began ranking 25 teams in 1989).

• With a pair of wins over nationally ranked teams in each of the last three seasons, the Yellow Jackets have defeated multiple ranked teams in three-consecutive seasons for the first time since 1955-57.

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1, 2022. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher – L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee – 1972; Pepper Rodgers – L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame – 1974; Bill Curry – L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama – 1980; Mac McWhorter – W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford – 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins – L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson – 2019).

GEORGIA TECH vs. TOP-10 OPPONENTS IN 2024

• For only the second time in program history, Georgia Tech had multiple regular-season wins over top-10 opponents in 2024 — Aug. 24 vs. No. 10 Florida State (24-21 in Dublin, Ireland) and Nov. 9 vs. No. 4 Miami (28-23 at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field).

• The only other season that Tech ever knocked off multiple top-10 teams in the same regular season was 1959, when the Yellow Jackets beat No. 6 SMU (16-12 - Sept. 26), No. 6 Clemson (16-6 - Oct. 3) and No. 8 Tennessee (14-7 - Oct. 10) in three-consecutive weeks.

• Tech also tied the ACC record for most regular-season wins over top-10 opponents (2) in 2024.

• The Jackets became only the ninth team in ACC history to knock off two top-10 opponents in the same regular season (joining Clemson - 1981, Florida State - 1993, Florida State - 1999, Florida State - 2000, Miami - 2004, Virginia Tech - 2004, Maryland - 2007, Florida State - 2013).

• The Yellow Jackets were one of 14 unranked teams to defeat a top-10 opponent in 2024, and the only team to do it twice.

TECH IN THE ACC STANDINGS

• Georgia Tech finished tied for fourth place in the Atlantic Coast Conference in each of the last two seasons (2023 and 2024).

• Tech is one of only two teams to finish in the top four in the ACC each of the last two seasons (joining Louisville).

• Georgia Tech's consecutive fourth-place finishes came after it was picked to finish 12th out of 14 teams in the ACC's 2023 preseason poll and 10th out of 17 teams in the league's 2024 preseason poll.

• The consecutive winning records in ACC play mark the first time since 2013 (5-3) and 2014 (6-2) that the Yellow Jackets have finished above .500 in conference action in back-to-back seasons.

- Tech rushed for at least 300 yards just once from 2019-2022, the first four years following the retirement of head coach Paul Johnson and the Yellow Jackets' departure from his vaunted spread-option offense.

- The Yellow Jackets have rushed for at least 200 yards in 12 of its last 21 games (dating back to Oct. 21, 2023 vs. Boston College).

- From its win over UCF in the 2023 Gasparilla Bowl through the fifth game of last season, Georgia Tech went six-straight games without allowing a sack. The string of six-straight games without a sack allowed doubled the previous school record for consecutive games without surrendering a sack.

• Georgia Tech has scored 30 or more points nine times since the beginning of the 2023 season (27 games), after scoring 30 or more points a total of nine times in its previous 46 games (2019-22).

• One area where Georgia Tech's offense was very uncharacteristic in last Friday's opener at Colorado was in turnovers.

• The Yellow Jackets committed turnovers on each of their first three possessions of the season at Colorado (two fumbles and an interception). All three turnovers came in the first 7:56 of the game.

• Last season, Georgia Tech did not commit its third turnover of the year until its eighth game (Oct. 19 vs. Notre Dame).

• The Yellow Jackets' three turnovers were their most in a game since they had four in a 42-21 loss at Clemson on Nov. 11, 2023.

• Georgia Tech finished tied for 11th nationally (6th among Power 4 teams) with just 10 turnovers lost last season.

• The most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense is its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has averaged just 1.0 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.8 turnovers per game in losses.

• Georgia Tech's offense is guided by third-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulker**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia (2020-22).

• Faulker boasts 20 years of experience on college football staffs, including 14 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18), Southern Miss (2019) and Georgia Tech (2023-pres.).

• Georgia Tech's offense is engineered by one of the nation's top quarterbacks in senior **Haynes King**.

• King added to his burgeoning resume with his performance in Georgia Tech's season opener at Colorado last Friday.

• King completed 13-of-20 passes for 146 yards and ran 19 times for a career-high 156 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 win at Colorado.

• King's 156 rushing yards at Colorado topped his previous career high of 150, set against Boston College on Oct. 21, 2023.

• His three touchdown runs (4, 17 and 45 yards) at Colorado matched the career high that he originally set in last season's eight-overtime defeat at No. 6 Georgia (Nov. 29, 2024).

• King's 45-yard touchdown against Colorado came with 1:07 to go in the game, and proved to be the game-winner in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 victory.

• King's game-winning TD run with 67 seconds left on the clock marked the second-straight year that Tech scored the winning points of its season opener on its final offensive play (PK **Aidan Birr's** 44-yard FG as time expired were the winning points in the Jackets' 24-21 win over No. 10 Florida State in the 2024 opener in Dublin, Ireland).

• Despite enduring a shoulder injury that caused him to miss two games and greatly limited his ability to throw in three others, King completed 196-of-269 passes (.729) for 2,114 yards and 14 touchdowns with just two interceptions in 11 games last season.

• King is one of only two NCAA Division I FBS players since 2000 with at least 140 passing yards, 140 rushing yards and three touchdown runs in a season opener, joining reigning Super Bowl MVP Jalen Hurts.

• King turned in one of the most memorable performances in the illustrious history of the "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate" rivalry when he completed 26-of-36 passes for 303 yards and two touchdowns and ran 24 times for 110 yards and three more scores last season at No. 6 Georgia (Nov. 29, 2024).

• Philo's performance against NC State included him leading the Yellow Jackets on a seven-play, 75-yard drive that spanned 1:08, capped by a 18-yard touchdown run with 22 seconds remaining that lifted Tech to a 30-29 come-from-behind victory over the Wolfpack.

• Like at running back, Georgia Tech has a treasure trove of depth in its wide receivers room, led by r-Sr. **Eric Rivers**.

• Rivers, a transfer from Florida International, was a third-team *Associated Press* All-American at FIU last season, when he caught 62 passes for 1,162 yards (18.9 avg.) and 12 touchdowns.

• This season, Rivers was named second-team preseason all-America by *The Sporting News* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview*.

• Rivers racked up 64 all-purpose yards in his Georgia Tech debut at Colorado — 34 rushing, 11 receiving and 19 on punt returns.

• Returning to the Yellow Jackets at wideout in 2025 are sophomores **Bailey Stockton** and **Isiah Canion**, who combined for 23 catches for 289 yards last season (17-206 for Stockton, 6-83 for Canion).

• Stockton led Georgia Tech with four catches for 48 yards in the season opener at Colorado. The totals were just one reception and 6 yards shy of his career highs, set last season vs. NC State (Nov. 21, 2024).

• The Jackets also added Rivers' former FIU teammate **Dean Patterson**. Patterson was a second-team all-Conference USA selection in 2024 after catching 50 passes for 685 yards and seven touchdowns last season.

TIGHT ENDS

• While previous years' statistics might not jump off the page, Georgia Tech also boasts great experience and depth at the tight end position in 2025.

• Tech's top four tight ends — redshirt seniors **Josh Beetham**, **J.T. Byrne** and **Brett Seither** and redshirt freshman **Luke Harpring** — have combined to play in 89 games over 20 collegiate seasons.

• Seither returns in 2025 after sustaining a season-ending knee injury during fall camp in 2024.

• In 2023, Seither was one of QB **Haynes King's** favorite red zone targets, finishing with four touchdown receptions among his seven total catches for 101 yards.

• Seither made his first catch since 2023 in the season opener at Colorado.

• Harpring matched a career high with two receptions in the season opener at Colorado.

• Byrne delivered the key block from an H-back alignment on King's game-winning, 45-yard touchdown run with 1:07 to go in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 season-opening win at Colorado.

OFFENSIVE LINE

• Despite losing three starters on the offensive line from a season ago, offensive line remains a talented, experienced and deep position for Georgia Tech.

• The offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2025 roster have combined to play in 172 collegiate games with 112 career starts.

• Leading the way is Sr. RG **Keylan Rutledge**, who earned first-team all-America honors from *Sports Info Solutions* in 2024.

• In 2025, Rutledge was named preseason all-America by the *Associated Press* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview* (both second team).

• Rutledge began his quest for back-to-back all-America campaigns by not being charged with allowing a QB pressure, hit or sack while also helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to run for 320 yards in its season-opening win at Colorado last Friday.



OFFENSE

• Rutledge's all-America recognition in 2024 came after he ranked in the top 10 offensive linemen nationally in *Sports Info Solutions'* Total Points metric, including a top-five national ranking in run-blocking Total Points.

• In pass protection, Rutledge had only two "blown blocks" in nearly 400 regular-season attempts last season, according to SIS.

• Rutledge was the Yellow Jackets' first first-team all-American since P Pressley Harvin III was a unanimous first-team honoree in 2020.

• Rutledge became Tech's first non-specialist to receive first-team all-America honors since Shaq Mason in 2014.

• Rutledge is the 54th first-team all-American in Georgia Tech's 132-year football history.

• As a unit, Georgia Tech's offensive line picked up right where it left off last season when it did not surrender a sack in last Friday's season-opening win at Colorado.

• Tech set school records last season for fewest total sacks allowed (9) and fewest sacks allowed per game (0.69).

• When Georgia Tech held three-straight opponents to less than 100 rushing yards last season — Sept. 14 vs. VMI (12), Sept. 21 at Louisville (57) and Oct. 5 vs. Duke (74) — it marked the first time that Tech allowed less than 100 rushing yards in three-straight games since Oct. 19-Nov. 2, 2013 (Syracuse – 75 yds., at Virginia – 68, Pitt – minus-5).

• Prior to last season, Tech had surrendered at least 100 rushing yards in 33-consecutive games, dating back to allowing 68 yards on the ground in a 45-22 win over North Carolina on Sept. 25, 2021.

• While Georgia Tech's defense was one of the most improved overall units in the country in many regards last season, it will continue to look to improve in two big areas in 2025 — turnover creation and pass rush.

• The Yellow Jackets uncharacteristically ranked 117th out of 133 NCAA Division I FBS teams last season with just 11 takeaways (six fumble recoveries and five interceptions).

• While Georgia Tech only forced 11 turnovers last season, it has made the most of those takeaways. The Yellow Jackets scored following seven of their 11 takeaways in 2024, good for a total of 45 points off 11 turnovers (six touchdowns and one field goal).

• The half or game ended on three of Georgia Tech's four remaining possessions following takeaways. The only time that Tech either didn't score or run out the half/game following a turnover in 2024 was when it missed a field goal following a fumble recovery at North Carolina (Oct. 12).

• Prior to 2024, Tech had been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for two-straight seasons. The Yellow Jackets tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.

• Despite last year's atypical takeaway numbers, Georgia Tech's 61 fumble recoveries since the beginning of the 2019 season are the second-most in the nation during that span.

• Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 2.3 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 0.9 takeaways per game in losses.

• Georgia Tech is also looking to improve on a pass rush that saw it rank 122nd nationally last season (1.38 sacks per game) and 109th in 2023 (1.62 pg). The last time that the Yellow Jackets were in the top half of the FBS rankings in sacks was in 2022, when they ranked 48th nationally (2.33 pg).

INDIVIDUAL

• The depth of Georgia Tech's defense was on display in last Friday's opener at Colorado.

• The Yellow Jackets' leading tackler at Colorado was r-Sr. DB **Omar Daniels** with five.

• However, the Jackets had 10 defenders with at least three tackles, and 13 with multiple stops.

• *Pro Football Focus'* metrics also illustrate the Yellow Jackets' depth on defense, as nine different Tech defenders received overall defensive grade of 65 or higher and 18 had an overall defensive grade of 60 or higher for the opener against Colorado.

• Jr. DB **Daiquan White** led the way with Georgia Tech's highest overall defensive grade (79.9) and pass coverage grade (80.2) against CU.

• Against the run, r-Jr. LB **E.J. Lightsey** was PFF's highest-graded Yellow Jacket against Colorado with an 76.0 run-defense grade.

• Despite missing three games in the second half of last season due to injury, r-Jr. LB **Kyle Efford** has been Georgia Tech's top tackler each of the last two seasons with 81 stops in 2023 and 64 tackles in 2024.

• Efford ranked among the top 25 tacklers in the ACC last season with 6.4 stops per game, en route to third-team all-ACC selection.

• Efford has recorded double-digit tackles five times in 17 games since moving into the starting lineup midway through his redshirt freshman season in 2023.

• He was very much a part of the Yellow Jackets' impressive defensive depth in last Friday's opener at Colorado, finishing with three tackles (all solo).

- r-Sr. DL **Jordan van den Berg** returns as Georgia Tech's most-decorated defender in 2025.
- van den Berg perhaps flew under the radar in 2024 in terms of stats (23 tackles, 5.0 TFL in 13 games) but he caught the attention of the ACC's coaches and media, as well as *Pro Football Focus*.
- van den Berg was a second-team all-ACC selection in 2024, as voted on by the league's coaches and media.
- PFF ranked van den Berg as the No. 8 interior defensive lineman in the ACC against the run during the regular season (81.5 grade).
- PFF also tabbed van den Berg as the No. 10 overall interior DL in the ACC during the regular season (76.6 grade).
- Sr. DBs **Clayton Powell-Lee** and **Rodney Shelley** ranked No. 2 and No. 5 in the ACC as juniors last season in slot pass coverage by PFF. The duo allowed just one reception every 18.1 and 13.4 coverage snaps in the slot, respectively.
- Shelley and r-Sr. **Ahmari Harvey** were two of the ACC's best cornerbacks in overall pass coverage last season according to PFF. Shelley ranked 18th in conference and Harvey ranking 22nd in the league with PFF coverage grades of 71.5 and 67.2, respectively.
- Harvey also finished second on the team last season with 63 tackles from his cornerback position last season, just one shy of Efford's team-high 64 stops.
- Harvey was the only Yellow Jacket with an interception, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble in 2024.
