TOP STORYLINES

- No. 8/7 Georgia Tech begins the final month of the regular season with an Atlantic Coast Conference road trip to NC State.
- With a win at NC State (4-4, 1-3 ACC), Georgia Tech would move to 9-0 overall and 6-0 in ACC play.
- The Yellow Jackets are 8-0 for only the sixth time in their 133-season football history (1917, 1928, 1942, 1952, 1966, 2025). In each of its five previous 8-0 starts, Tech won its ninth game to move to 9-0.
- The Jackets are 5-0 in ACC play for the first time in their 43 seasons in the conference.
- Tech has won seven-straight conference games dating back to last season, which ties its all-time record for most-consecutive ACC victories, set from 2009-10.
- The buzz continues to build around Georgia Tech r-Sr. QB **Haynes King**, who turned in a performance for the ages in last Saturday's 41-16 win over Syracuse.
- King accounted for 395 total yards (304 passing, 91 rushing) and five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in the win over Syracuse. He completed 25-of-31 passes, good for the highest single-game completion percentage in Georgia Tech history for a passer with at least 30 attempts.
- King also became the first Yellow Jacket to ever throw for three touchdowns and run for two in a game.
- With 81 touchdowns responsible for (48 passing, 33 rushing) in his first 31 games as a Yellow Jacket, King needs just three TDs to break Heisman Trophy runner-up Joe Hamilton's school record of 83 touchdowns responsible for in a career (1996-99).

With 81 touchdowns responsible for (48 passing, 31 rushing) in 31 games as a Yellow Jacket, r-Sr. **Haynes King** needs just three touchdowns to break Georgia Tech's all-time record for touchdown responsibility, currently held by Heisman Trophy runner-up Joe Hamilton, who was responsible for 81 touchdowns in four seasons (43 games) as a Jacket from 1996-99.

Last Saturday vs. Syracuse, King became the first player in Georgia Tech history with three touchdown passes and two touchdown runs in a game.

With 304 passing yards, 91 rushing yards, three touchdown passes, two touchdown runs and a .806 completion percentage (25-of-31) against Syracuse, King became only the fifth NCAA Division I FBS player since 1995 with at least 300 passing yards, 90 rushing yards, three TD passes, two TD runs and an .800 completion percentage in a game, joining an exclusive list that also includes LSU's Jayden Daniels (2023 vs. Georgia State), Kent State's Dustin Crum (2020 vs. Akron), Oklahoma's Jalen Hurts (2019 vs. Houston) and Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler (2001 vs. NC State).

Georgia Tech is 8-0 for only the sixth time in its 133-season football history (1917, 1928, 1942, 1952, 1966, 2025) and is 5-0 in ACC play for the first time in its 43 seasons in the conference.

Brent Key has led Georgia Tech to 22 wins since taking the reins at his alma mater on a full-time basis in 2023. Barely halfway through his third full season at the helm, Key's 22 victories are already the fourth-most by a coach in his first three full seasons at Georgia Tech. The only three coaches that won more games in their first three full seasons at Tech than Key already has are all in the College Football Hall of Fame — Paul Johnson (25 - 2008-10), Bobby Dodd (23 - 1945-47) and William Alexander (23 - 1920-22).

After setting a single-season school record by completing 65.3% of its passes as a team in 2024, Georgia Tech has completed 72.6% of its passes through eight games this season (156-of-215).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- move the Yellow Jackets to 9-0 for the sixth time in school history (1917, 1928, 1942, 1952, 1966, 2025);
- extend its winning streak to nine-straight games, which would be its longest winning streak since it won nine in a row spanning the 1989 and 1990 seasons, and be its longest same-season winning streak since it won its first nine games in 1966;
- clinch the 22nd nine-win season in school history and the first since 2016;
- make it 6-0 in ACC play, extending its best conference start in its 43 seasons in the league;
- be a school-record-setting eighth-straight ACC victory, breaking the Yellow Jackets' record of seven-straight ACC wins from 2009-10;
- move it to 22-11 all-time versus NC State;
- up it to 10-7 all-time at NC State;
- be its first win at NC State since 2014;
- be its fifth win in its last six matchups and 15th win in its last 19 meetings with NC State;
- be its fourth-straight road win, which would give it its longest road winning streak since it won five-straight road games in 2009.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- be its first of the season, dropping it to 8-1 (5-1 ACC);
- snap an eight-game overall winning streak;
- snap a seven-game winning streak in ACC play;
- drop it to 21-12 all-time versus NC State and 9-8 in Raleigh;
- be only its second loss in the last six matchups and fifth defeat in its last 19 meetings with NC State.

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, is in his third full season as the head coach at his alma mater. He took over as the program's 21st head coach on a permanent basis in 2023, after stepping into the role as interim head coach during the 2022 campaign.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech has won 26-of-42 games since Key took the reins as interim head coach five games into the 2022 season.

In his first two full seasons as head coach (2023 and 2024), Key has led his alma mater to consecutive winning seasons and back-to-back bowl berths for the first time since 2013-14. The Yellow Jackets also have consecutive fourth-place finishes in the Atlantic Coast Conference, after being picked to finish 12th in the 14-team conference in 2023 and 10th in the 17-team league in 2024. The back-to-back fourth-place showings have been spurred by Tech's gaudy 7-1 versus nationally ranked ACC opponents since Key took the reins of the program five games into the 2022 campaign.

His 14 wins in his first two full seasons at the helm of the Jackets are tied for the third-most in Georgia Tech history, behind only College Football Hall of Famers Paul Johnson and William Alexander.

The 2024 campaign was highlighted by a pair of wins over top-10 opponents – a 24-21 victory over No. 10 Florida State in the season opener in Dublin, Ireland and a 28-23 home triumph over previously unbeaten and No. 4-ranked Miami (Fla.) in November – as Tech became only the ninth team in ACC history to defeat two top-10 teams in the same regular season. The Yellow Jackets' 7-5 regular-season record was their best since 2018.

A year after fielding one of the nation's most improved offenses, the Jackets had one of college football's most improved defensive units in 2024. Tech's defense surrendered 342.8 total yards and 122.2 rushing yards per game in '24, improvements of 94.3 and 99.1 yards per game over 2023. At the same time, despite a plethora of injuries — including one that cost starting quarterback Haynes King two full games and parts of three others — Tech continued to boast one of the nation's top offenses. The Jackets finished in the top 35 nationally in total offense (424.5 yards per game) and also ranked among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (third), fewest turnovers (11th), completion percentage (24th), rushing offense (32nd) and red-zone offense (32nd). On special teams, Tech ranked third nationally with five blocked kicks and, as a team, the Jackets were one of the nation's 25 least-penalized teams.

Ten Yellow Jackets were named all-ACC in 2024, Tech's most all-conference selections since 2014.

In 2023, Key led Tech to its first winning season since 2018, capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016. The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022, Key served as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach/offensive line coach/run game coordinator for three-plus seasons. In four total seasons at his alma mater prior to taking over as head coach on permanent basis, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. He also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 47, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER SYRACUSE

• **Haynes King** solidified his standing as one of college football's top players, accounting for 395 yards of total offense and five touchdowns, and No. 7 Georgia Tech continued its run as one of college football's top teams in a 41-16 rout of Syracuse.

• King completed 25-of-31 passes for 304 yards and three touchdowns and ran 12 times for 91 yards and two more scores.

• King's .806 completion percentage was the highest in Georgia Tech history for a passer with at least 30 attempts.

• King became the first player in Georgia Tech history with three touchdown passes and two touchdown runs in a game.

• King became only the fifth NCAA Division I FBS player since 1995 with at least 300 passing yards, 90 rushing yards, three TD passes, two TD runs and an .800 completion percentage in a game.

• Georgia Tech scored on 7-of-10 possessions (a kneel-down on the final series of the game notwithstanding), including a pair of touchdown passes from King to r-Sr. TE **Josh Beetham** (21 and 13 yards), another scoring strike to r-Sr. WR **Dean Patterson** (37 yards) and two TD runs of King's own (2 and 4 yards).

• Beetham's two touchdown catches were the first two of his 29-game collegiate career.

• Beetham became the first Yellow Jacket with two touchdown receptions in a game since TE Brett Seither vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28, 2023.

• Georgia Tech's 543 yards of offense were a season high against NCAA Division I FBS competition (prev.: 481 vs. Virginia Tech — Oct. 11; the Yellow Jackets had a season-best 680 yards against FCS opponent Gardner-Webb on Sept. 6).

• Not to be outshone by the offensive fireworks, Tech's defense also turned in one of its best performances of the year, particularly in the first half, when the Orange managed just 118 yards as the Jackets opened up a commanding 20-3 lead.

• In contrast to the efficiency of Georgia Tech's explosive offense, Syracuse managed points on just three of its 10 possessions.

• The Orange had just 17 first downs (compared to Tech's 28), as the Jackets' defense allowed just five third-down conversions on 14 attempts.

• Georgia Tech outgained Syracuse, 543-381, including a 322-118 margin in the first half.

• The game was played in front of a sellout crowd of 51,193. It was Georgia Tech's first home sellout for an ACC game in 10 years and one day, dating back to its 24-16 "Miracle on Techwood Drive" win over Florida State on Oct. 24, 2015. It was the Yellow Jackets' first home sellout against any opponent since the 2021 edition of "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate" versus archrival Georgia.

GEORGIA TECH-NC STATE SERIES HISTORY

• Saturday's game is the 33rd all-time between Georgia Tech and NC State, in a series that dates back to 1918.

• Georgia Tech leads the all-time series, 21-11, including 9-7 edge at NC State.

• Tech has won four of the last five and 14 of the last 18 matchups in the series.

• The series began with Georgia Tech outscoring NC State by a combined 145-0 in their first two matchups in Atlanta in 1918 (128-0) and 1922 (17-0).

• The teams would not meet again for 61 years until Tech began play in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 1983.

• The Yellow Jackets and Wolfpack met annually from 1983-2006. However, with the dawn of ACC divisional play in 2005, Tech and NC State have squared off just six times in the last 18 seasons.

• Last season's matchup was a barn-burner, as Georgia Tech true Fr. QB **Aaron Philo** engineered a game-winning touchdown drive, leading the Yellow Jackets 75 yards in a minute and eight seconds, capped by his 18-yard touchdown run with 22 seconds left that lifted Tech to a heart-stopping 30-29 win in Atlanta.

• For the second-straight week, Georgia Tech comes in at No. 7 in the US LBM (coaches) poll.

• Tech dropped one spot from No. 7 to No. 8 in the *Associated Press* (media) poll. Ole Miss leapfrogged the Yellow Jackets after the Rebels' win at then-No. 13 Oklahoma.

• Prior to this season, Georgia Tech had not been ranked as high as seventh nationally since it came in at No. 7 in the final coaches poll of 2014, following the conclusion of an 11-3 season that was capped by a 49-34 Orange Bowl victory over Mississippi State.

• The No. 7 ranking is Tech's highest in the regular season since it came was ranked seventh in both polls for three weeks in 2009.

• For only the second time in program history, Georgia Tech had multiple regular-season wins over top-10 opponents in 2024 — Aug. 24 vs. No. 10 Florida State (24-21 in Dublin, Ireland) and Nov. 9 vs. No. 4 Miami (28-23 at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field).

• The only other season that Tech ever knocked off multiple top-10 teams in the same regular season was 1959, when the Yellow Jackets beat No. 6 SMU (16-12 - Sept. 26), No. 6 Clemson (16-6 - Oct. 3) and No. 8 Tennessee (14-7 - Oct. 10) in three-consecutive weeks.

• One area where Georgia Tech's offense was very uncharacteristic through the first two games of this season was in turnovers.

• The Yellow Jackets committed turnovers five turnovers over their first two games of this season. They turned the ball over on each of their first three possessions in the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29) and both of their first two possessions against Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6).

• Last season, Georgia Tech did not commit its fifth turnover of the year until its ninth game (Oct. 26 at Virginia Tech).

• Tech has reversed the trend over its last six games, with just three turnovers in the last six contests — zero vs. No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13), one vs. Temple (Sept. 20), one vs. Wake Forest (Sept. 27), zero vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 11), zero vs. Duke (Oct. 18) and zero vs. Syracuse (last Saturday).

• Georgia Tech's lost fumble on the second play of the game last Saturday against Syracuse was the Jackets' first turnover in three games, dating back to a lost fumble in the fourth quarter of its 30-27 overtime win at Wake Forest (Sept. 27).

• The Yellow Jackets' three turnovers at Colorado were their most in a game since they had four in a 42-21 loss at Clemson on Nov. 11, 2023.

• Georgia Tech finished tied for 11th nationally (6th among Power 4 teams) with just 10 turnovers lost last season.

• Despite its six fumbles this season, Tech has lost just 13 fumbles since the beginning of the 2023 season (33 games), which is tied for the 20th-fewest in the nation.

• Georgia Tech has the second-fewest fumbles lost by ACC teams since the beginning of the 2023, behind only Virginia (11).

• In all, King has accounted for 2,537 yards of total offense and 20 touchdowns in his nine games against ranked opponents at Tech. That averages out to 281.9 yards of total offense (211.9 passing, 70.0 rushing) per game with a 147.52 pass-efficiency rating.

• In the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29), King completed 13-of-20 passes for 146 yards and ran 19 times for a career-high 156 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 win.

• King's 156 rushing yards at Colorado topped his previous career high of 150, set against Boston College on Oct. 21, 2023.

• His three touchdown runs (4, 17 and 45 yards) at Colorado matched the career high that he originally set in last season's eight-overtime defeat at No. 6 Georgia (Nov. 29, 2024).

• King's 45-yard touchdown against Colorado came with 1:07 to go in the game, and proved to be the game-winner in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 victory.

• King's game-winning TD run with 67 seconds left on the clock at Colorado marked the second-straight year that Tech scored the winning points of its season opener on its final offensive play (PK **Aidan Birr's** 44-yard FG as time expired were the winning points in the Jackets' 24-21 win over No. 10 Florida State in the 2024 opener in Dublin, Ireland).

• King is one of only two NCAA Division I FBS players since 2000 with at least 140 passing yards, 140 rushing yards and three touchdown runs in a season opener, joining reigning Super Bowl MVP Jalen Hurts.

RUNNING BACKS

- Georgia Tech also boasts two of the nation's top running backs in r-Sr. **Jamal Haynes** and r-Jr. **Malachi Hosley**.

- Haynes and Hosley have combined for 920 rushing yards (Hosley - 488, Haynes - 432), 1,116 yards from scrimmage (Haynes - 596, Hosley - 520) and nine touchdowns (Hosley - 6, Haynes - 3) through eight games.

- In addition to being the only team in the nation with three players with at least 400 rushing yards this season (QB **Haynes King**, Haynes and Hosley - see full note on p. 6), Haynes and Hosley make Georgia Tech one of only 13 teams with two running backs that have already eclipsed the 425-yard mark (joining Cincinnati, Fresno State, Indiana, Iowa State, Louisiana-Lafayette, Memphis, Michigan, Mississippi State, Missouri, Northern Illinois, Notre Dame, Tennessee and UCF).

- Haynes has 596 yards from scrimmage in eight games this season (432 rushing, 164 receiving) — 74.5 yards from scrimmage per game.

- Haynes opened the season with 92 yards from scrimmage (65 rushing, 27 receiving) in the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29) then amassed 100 yards (92 rushing, eight receiving) vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6).

- Hosley has averaged at least 10 yards per rush four times in his eight games as a Yellow Jacket — 11.1 vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), 11.8 vs. Temple (Sept. 20), 11.7 vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 11) and 10.1 vs. Syracuse (last Saturday).
- Hosley had a season-high 129 rushing yards against Virginia Tech.

- r-Sr. **Daylon Gordon** scored the first touchdown of his career on a 47-yard run versus Temple (Sept. 20).
- The 47-yard run was nearly six times longer than his previous career rushing total of 8 yards.
- True Fr. **J.P. Powell** nearly scored his second-career TD against Temple too, but came up just short of paydirt on his 61-yard run on the final play of the game.
- Powell's 61-yard run against Temple is Georgia Tech's longest rush of the season.
- Powell found paydirt for the first time in his career when he scored from 1 yard out against Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6).
- 6-foot-2, 225-pound r-Fr. **Trelain Maddox** returned from injury and had his first two carries of the season for 12 yards in Georgia Tech's win over Virginia Tech (Oct. 11).
- Maddox has seen action in just two games as a true freshman in 2024 and four games as a redshirt freshman this season due to injury. He ran for 67 yards and averaged 5.7 yards per carry in his limited playing time as a true freshman.
- The Yellow Jackets' RB room will get even deeper when Jr. **Chad Alexander** returns from injury.
- A former walk-on who earned a scholarship midway through last season, Alexander ran 58 times for 280 yards as a sophomore in 2024.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech's embarrassment of riches on the offensive side of the ball extends to wide receiver, led by r-Sr. **Malik Rutherford**, r-Sr. **Eric Rivers** and So. **Isiah Canion**.
- Rutherford, Rivers and Canion have combined for 72 receptions for 818 yards and five touchdowns this season.
- Despite missing the better part of three games this season due to injury (he was injured on Georgia Tech's opening plays at Colorado on Aug. 29 and at Duke on Oct. 18, then missed last Saturday's game versus Syracuse), Rutherford still ranks second on the team with 23 receptions, is third on the squad with 202 receiving yards and is tied for the team lead with two touchdown catches.
- Rutherford still has a chance at becoming Georgia Tech's all-time leader in receptions, as he needs just 37 more catches to break the school record of 195, held by Kelly Campbell (1998-01).
- Rutherford's 159 career receptions are the most by a Yellow Jacket since College and Pro Football Hall of Famer Calvin Johnson caught 178 passes at Tech from 2004-06.
- Rutherford needs just six catches to move into Georgia Tech's top five all-time for career receptions.

• Rivers leads the team with 28 receptions and ranks second on the team with 300 receiving yards.

• Rivers has racked up 433 all-purpose yards — 300 receiving, 49 rushing and 84 on punt returns — in his first eight games as a Yellow Jacket (54.1 ypg).

• Rivers' eight receptions and 77 receiving yards at Wake Forest (Sept. 20) were both his most as a Yellow Jacket (prev.: three receptions for 72 yards vs. Clemson – Sept. 13).

• Rivers' 14-yard touchdown reception at Wake Forest was his first at Georgia Tech.

• Rivers, a transfer from Florida International, was a third-team *Associated Press* All-American at FIU last season, when he caught 62 passes for 1,162 yards (18.9 avg.) and 12 touchdowns.

• This season, Rivers was named second-team preseason all-America by *The Sporting News* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview*.

• So. **Isiah Canion** is Georgia Tech's leader in receiving yards with 316 yards this season.

• Canion also leads the Yellow Jackets with 15.0 yards per reception (min. 10 receptions) and ranks third on the team with 21 catches.

• Canion set a new career high with 70 receiving yards at Wake Forest (Sept. 27).

• Earlier in the season, Canion shattered his previous career high with five receptions against Clemson (prev.: two - three times).

• Canion hauled in the second touchdown catch of his career, a 37-yarder from Haynes King, in the second quarter of Georgia Tech's win over Temple (Sept. 20).

• Canion first TD came on an 11-yard pass from **Aaron Philo** in the first quarter of Tech's win over Gardner-Webb.

• Twice this season, So. **Bailey Stockton** has had four catches for 48 yards — in the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29) and last Saturday vs. Syracuse. Those totals are just one reception and 6 yards shy of his career highs, set last season vs. NC State (Nov. 21, 2024).

• In all, Georgia Tech has four wideouts with at least 17 receptions this season — Rivers (28), Rutherford (23), Canion (21) and Stockton (17).

• True Fr. speedster **Jordan Allen** saw the most extensive action of his career last Saturday against Syracuse and responded by leading the Yellow Jackets with six receptions for 67 yards.

• Allen's six receptions against Syracuse tripled his previous high of two, set the previous week at Duke (Oct. 18).

• The Jackets also added Rivers' former FIU teammate **Dean Patterson** to the receivers' room. Patterson was a second-team all-Conference USA selection in 2024 after catching 50 passes for 685 yards and seven touchdowns last season.

• Buoyed by an 84-yard touchdown reception against Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6) and a 37-yard TD last Saturday vs. Syracuse, Patterson is averaging 21.8 yards per reception (six catches for 131 yards).

• Patterson's 84-yard touchdown reception from **Graham Knowles** in the fourth quarter of the Yellow Jackets' win over Gardner-Webb was the seventh-longest reception in Georgia Tech history.

• Beetham scored the first two touchdowns of his career with TD catches of 21 and 13 yards last Saturday vs. Syracuse.

• After not recording a catch through the first four games of the season, Beetham now leads Georgia Tech's tight ends with 131 receiving yards and two touchdowns on the season.

• r-Fr. **Luke Harpring** leads Tech's tight ends with nine receptions this season. His 107 receiving yards rank second among the Yellow Jackets TEs.

• Harpring had three receptions for 39 yards — both career highs — versus Virginia Tech (Oct. 11).

• r-Sr. **Brett Seither** ranks third among the Yellow Jackets' tight ends with 59 receiving yards, albeit on just three receptions — a 26-yarder against Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), a 4-yarder vs. Temple (Sept. 20) and a 29-yarder against Virginia Tech (Oct. 11).

• Seither's 26-yard catch against Gardner-Webb was his first in 651 days, as he missed the entire 2024 season after sustaining a season-ending knee injury during fall camp.

• In 2023, Seither was one of QB **Haynes King's** favorite red zone targets, finishing with four touchdown receptions among his seven total catches for 101 yards.

• r-Sr. **J.T. Byrne** has made a position-high five starts this season.

• Byrne delivered the key block from an H-back alignment on King's game-winning, 45-yard touchdown run with 1:07 to go in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 season-opening win at Colorado (Aug. 29).

• Byrne hauled in a career-long 21-yard reception at Duke (Oct. 18), which set up go-ahead field goal that gave Tech a 13-10 lead in the fourth quarter.

• The Yellow Jackets' tight ends room is not short on experience, as Seither, Beetham, Byrne and Harpring have combined to play in 116 games over 20 collegiate seasons.

• Through the first seven games of the season, Georgia Tech had the same five starters on its offensive line all season — r-So. LT **Ethan Mackenny**, r-Sr. LG **Joe Fusile**, So. C **Harrison Moore**, Sr. RG **Keylan Rutledge** and r-Jr. LT **Malachi Carney**.

• Going into last Saturday's game vs. Syracuse, Georgia Tech was one of only 16 teams in the nation whose starting five offensive linemen had remained intact throughout the season (Air Force, Arkansas, Auburn, Duke, Iowa, Kansas, Kennesaw State, Kentucky, Old Dominion, Oregon, San Diego State, Tennessee, Texas A&M, Texas Tech and UAB are the others).

• However, So. **Tana Alo-Tupuola** made his first-career start at C against Syracuse in place of Moore, who missed the game due to injury, snapping Georgia Tech's string of seven-straight games with the same starting offensive line.

• Leading the way for the Yellow Jackets up front is Sr. RG **Keylan Rutledge**, who is widely regarded as one of the nation's top offensive linemen.

• Rutledge has allowed just one pressure and no sacks in 524 snaps this season, according to *Pro Football Focus*.

• Rutledge has logged 332 snaps over five games since the only pressure he allowed all season vs. Clemson (Sept. 12).

• Rutledge ranks among the top 25 guards in the nation and top three guards in the ACC in all three of PFF's major blocking metrics — overall grade (11th - 76.3), run blocking (11th - 76.0) and pass blocking (24th - 81.8).

• Rutledge was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time in his career after helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 147 yards and total 358 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 24-21 win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

• An image of Rutledge with a bloody nose during the Clemson game, personifying his grit and toughness, went viral.

• Prior to this season, Rutledge was named preseason all-America by the *Associated Press* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview* (both second team).

• Last season, Rutledge earned first-team all-America honors from *Sports Info Solutions*.

• Rutledge's all-America honor in 2024 came after he ranked in the top 10 offensive linemen nationally in SIS's Total Points metric, including a top-five national ranking in run-blocking Total Points.

• In pass protection, Rutledge had only two "blown blocks" in nearly 400 regular-season attempts last season, according to SIS.

• Rutledge was the Yellow Jackets' first first-team all-American since P Pressley Harvin III was a unanimous first-team honoree in 2020.

• Rutledge became Tech's first non-specialist to receive first-team all-America honors since Shaq Mason in 2014.

• Rutledge is the 54th first-team all-American in Georgia Tech's 132-year football history.

• Mackenny picked up his first ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week Award for his performance in last Saturday's win over Syracuse.

• Mackenny was especially impressive protecting QB Haynes King's blindside as a pass blocker against Syracuse, as he did not allow a quarterback sack, hit, hurry or pressure, en route to a gaudy 87.0 pass-blocking grade from PFF.

• As a team, Georgia Tech ranks fifth nationally with just four sacks allowed in eight games this season.

• Last Saturday versus Syracuse, Georgia Tech's defense allowed just 118 yards in the first half, which allowed the Yellow Jackets to race out to a 20-3 halftime lead.

• After gaining 41 yards on its first offensive play of the game, Syracuse managed just 77 yards over its final 23 plays of the first half (3.3 avg.).

• In Georgia Tech's 27-18 win over Duke (Oct. 18), the Yellow Jackets held the Blue Devils to less than half their season scoring average going into the game (Duke was averaging 36.5 points per game).

• Georgia Tech also limited Duke to just 68 rushing yards, which is the fewest that the Yellow Jackets have allowed this season (prev.: 117 vs. Gardner-Webb — Sept. 6) and were a season low for the Blue Devils (prev.: 82 vs. Illinois — Sept. 6).

• Tech's defense was especially stout in the second half at Duke. The Yellow Jackets held the Blue Devils to just 66 yards and no points over three series that spanned 14:53 of the second half, which allowed the Jackets' offense to score on four-straight possessions and turn the 10-7 deficit into the 27-10 lead.

• Against Virginia Tech (Oct. 11), Georgia Tech held the Hokies to 0-for-8 on third downs. It marked only the second time in GT history — as well as the first time since 1988 and the first time ever against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent — that the Yellow Jackets did not allow a third-down conversion.

• Georgia Tech also had four sacks against Virginia Tech, the Yellow Jackets' most against an FBS opponent since they had eight at Wake Forest on Sept. 23, 2023.

• Georgia Tech had a breakout performance in terms of negative plays on defense versus Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), with six sacks and 14 tackles for loss.

• Georgia Tech's six sacks against Gardner-Webb were its most in almost two years, dating back to the Yellow Jackets recording eight sacks at Wake Forest on Sept. 23, 2023.

• The Jackets' 14 tackles for loss against Gardner-Webb tied for the eighth-most in Georgia Tech history and, coincidentally, were Tech's most since it also had 14 TFL in its only previous meeting with Gardner-Webb on Oct. 11, 2008.

• Georgia Tech forced a season-high two turnovers in its win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

• With six takeaways through eight games, Georgia Tech ranks 111th nationally in turnovers gained. This comes after finishing 117th nationally in takeaways last season.

• Prior to 2024, Tech had been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for two-straight seasons. The Yellow Jackets tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.

• However, the Yellow Jackets tend to make the most of takeaways when they get them. Since the beginning of the 2024 season, Georgia Tech has either scored or run out the clock after 13 of their 17 takeaways (eight touchdowns, two field goals and three end of halves/games), including 3-of-6 this season (two touchdowns, one field goal).

• Georgia Tech's most recent turnover that led to points was a 95-yard fumble return for a touchdown by r-Sr. DB **Omar Daniels** at Duke.

• Daniels' scoop-and-score was Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season. The Yellow Jackets' hadn't scored defensively since LB **E.J. Lightsey's** 21-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. NC State last season (Nov. 21, 2024).

• The fumble return for a touchdown was Georgia Tech's first since DB Jaylon King scored on a 40-yard return at Miami (Fla.) in 2021.

• Daniels' 95-yard fumble return at Duke was the longest official fumble return in Georgia Tech history (fumble returns became an official NCAA statistic in 1992).

• In the season opener at Colorado, the Yellow Jackets had 10 defenders with at least three tackles and 13 with multiple stops. r-Sr. DB **Omar Daniels** was the Jackets' leading tackler with five.

• In Week Two versus Gardner-Webb, 15 different Yellow Jackets had at least three tackles and a whopping 21 different defenders had multiple stops.

• Ten different Yellow Jackets had multiple tackles in their 24-21 win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

• Against Temple (Sept. 20), eight Yellow Jackets made at least four tackles and 20 had multiple stops.

• In their win at Wake Forest (Sept. 27), nine different Jackets made at least three tackles.

• Powell-Lee and r-Jr. LB **E.J. Lightsey** led Georgia Tech with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively, in the win over Clemson. It marked the first time since Nov. 12, 2022 vs. Miami (Fla.) that two Yellow Jackets had double-digit tackles in the same game (LBs Ayinde Eley and Charlie Thomas had 12 and 11 stops, respectively, against Miami in '22).

• van den Berg recorded the first field goal block of his career vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), and r-Sr. DB **Ahmari Harvey** returned it 65 yards for a touchdown.

• With his blocked field goal return for a touchdown vs. Gardner-Webb, Harvey became only the 53rd player in college football since the beginning of 2024 with an interception, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble and a touchdown to his credit.

• However, Harvey is one of only players in the nation since the beginning of 2024 who has had an interception, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble and a touchdown that was scored on a blocked field goal return (BYU LB Jack Kelly is the other).

• Harvey's blocked field goal return for a touchdown against Gardner-Webb was Georgia Tech's first since Lance Austin's 78-yard return of a blocked field goal for the winning touchdown on the final play of the Yellow Jackets' famed "Miracle on Techwood Drive" victory over No. 9 Florida State on Oct. 24, 2015.

• Making Birr's walk-off field goal against Clemson even more impressive was that field goal unit took the field as time was winding down without the benefit of a timeout — known as a "Toro" situation in Georgia Tech football's parlance.

• Tech repeated the challenging Toro situation again at Wake Forest (Sept. 27), as Birr and the field goal unit had to once again take the field with time ticking away and no timeouts, this time needing a 33-yard field goal to sent the game to overtime. Birr drilled the 33-yarder with two seconds remaining to send the game to overtime knotted at 23-23, and the Jackets went on to win, 30-29, in OT.

• Nichols is averaging 48.3 yards per punt, which would rank first in the ACC and third nationally if he had enough attempts to qualify for the official conference and national rankings (Georgia Tech's explosive offense has only punted 20 times in eight games, which leaves Nichols nine attempts short of qualification for ACC and NCAA rankings).

• As a team, the Yellow Jackets have a 43.6-yard net punting average this season, which is for the 11th-best mark in the nation and the best in the ACC.

• Nichols' averaging 59.5 yards over his two punts last Saturday vs. Syracuse, which was the third-best single-game punting average in Georgia Tech history (min. two punts).

• In just eight games as a Yellow Jacket, Nichols already owns two of the top 20 single-game punting averages in Georgia Tech history — 59.5 vs. VT (third) and 51.2 vs. Temple (t-20th).

• Nichols was named a member of the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8 list, which honors the nation's top punters of the week, following back-to-back games vs. Temple (Sept. 20) and at Wake Forest (Sept. 27).
