TOP STORYLINES

- Riding its best start in 59 years and its highest in-season national ranking in 16 years, No. 7 Georgia Tech (7-0, 4-0 ACC) returns home to face Syracuse for homecoming at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field.
- With last Saturday's 27-18 win at Duke, Georgia Tech moved to 7-0 for the first time since 1966 and only the eighth time in the school's 133 seasons of football (1917, 1928, 1942, 1947, 1952, 1964, 1966 and 2025).
- The Yellow Jackets' leapt to No. 7 in this week's *Associated Press* and US LBM (coaches) polls, which is their highest national ranking since they were ranked No. 7 in the final coaches poll of 2014 and their highest in-season ranking since they spent three weeks at No. 7 in both polls in 2009.
- Tech is also 4-0 in Atlantic Coast Conference play for the first time since 1998.
- The Jackets moved to 7-0 with a 27-18 win at Duke last Saturday. Tech used a 20-0 scoring spurt in the second half to turn a 10-7 deficit into a commanding 27-10 lead in the victory.
- Georgia Tech QB **Haynes King** was once again the catalyst to victory for the Yellow Jackets at Duke. King had 325 yards of total offense in the win (205 passing, 120 rushing), including 240 yards in the second half alone.
- Tech's defense held Duke to less than half of their season scoring average (the Blue Devils were averaging 36.5 ppg coming in) and to a season-low 68 rushing yards in last Saturday's win.
- For the first time in their series history, Georgia Tech and Syracuse are squaring off for a third-straight season. The Yellow Jackets topped the Orange, 31-22, the last time Syracuse visited Atlanta in 2023, but dropped a 31-28 decision last season in Syracuse.

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GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Twice this season, Georgia Tech has posted one of the top-10 yards-per-game averages in school history. The Yellow Jackets averaged 11.9 yards per play against Gardner-Webb on Sept. 6, good for second in program history, and 9.8 yards per snap versus Temple on Sept. 20, their sixth-highest ever.

Georgia Tech is one of only four teams that rank among the top 10 in the nation in red zone offense and in the top 15 in red zone defense, joining Alabama, Cincinnati and San Diego State. Tech ranks ninth nationally in red zone offense (.963) and 14th nationally in red zone defense (.739).

Georgia Tech's No. 7 ranking in this week's Associated Press (media) and US LBM (coaches) polls is its highest national ranking since was ranked No. 7 in the final coaches poll of 2014 and its highest regular-season ranking since it was ranked seventh for three weeks in 2009.

Georgia Tech r-Sr. QB **Haynes King** is one of only four NCAA Division I FBS quarterbacks since 2015 to rush for at least 10 touchdowns in three-straight seasons. He is the first ACC signal-caller to accomplish the feat since Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson did it at Louisville from 2015-17.

Brent Key has led Georgia Tech to 21 wins since taking the reins at his alma mater on a full-time basis in 2023. Only halfway through his third full season at the helm, Key's 21 victories are already tied for the fourth-most by a coach in his first three full seasons at Georgia Tech. The only three coaches that won more games in their first three full seasons at Tech than Key already has are all in the College Football Hall of Fame — Paul Johnson (25 - 2008-10), Bobby Dodd (23 - 1945-47) and William Alexander (23 - 1920-22).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- extend its winning streak to eight-straight games, which would be its longest winning streak since it won eight-straight games in 2009, match its longest overall winning streak since it won nine in a row spanning the 1989 and 1990 seasons and match its longest same-season winning streak since it won its first nine games in 1966;
- make the Jackets 5-0 in ACC play for the first time ever;
- be its seventh-straight ACC win, dating back to last season;
- up it to 5-2 all-time versus Syracuse;
- move it to 3-0 at home against the Orange;
- up it to 57-18-1 all-time on homecoming;
- be its fourth-straight homecoming win.

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, is in his third full season as the head coach at his alma mater. He took over as the program's 21st head coach on a permanent basis in 2023, after stepping into the role as interim head coach during the 2022 campaign.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech has won 25-of-41 games since Key took the reins as interim head coach five games into the 2022 season.

In his first two full seasons as head coach (2023 and 2024), Key has led his alma mater to consecutive winning seasons and back-to-back bowl berths for the first time since 2013-14. The Yellow Jackets also have consecutive fourth-place finishes in the Atlantic Coast Conference, after being picked to finish 12th in the 14-team conference in 2023 and 10th in the 17-team league in 2024. The back-to-back fourth-place showings have been spurred by Tech's gaudy 7-1 versus nationally ranked ACC opponents since Key took the reins of the program five games into the 2022 campaign.

His 14 wins in his first two full seasons at the helm of the Jackets are tied for the third-most in Georgia Tech history, behind only College Football Hall of Famers Paul Johnson and William Alexander.

The 2024 campaign was highlighted by a pair of wins over top-10 opponents – a 24-21 victory over No. 10 Florida State in the season opener in Dublin, Ireland and a 28-23 home triumph over previously unbeaten and No. 4-ranked Miami (Fla.) in November – as Tech became only the ninth team in ACC history to defeat two top-10 teams in the same regular season. The Yellow Jackets' 7-5 regular-season record was their best since 2018.

A year after fielding one of the nation's most improved offenses, the Jackets had one of college football's most improved defensive units in 2024. Tech's defense surrendered 342.8 total yards and 122.2 rushing yards per game in '24, improvements of 94.3 and 99.1 yards per game over 2023. At the same time, despite a plethora of injuries — including one that cost starting quarterback Haynes King two full games and parts of three others — Tech continued to boast one of the nation's top offenses. The Jackets finished in the top 35 nationally in total offense (424.5 yards per game) and also ranked among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (third), fewest turnovers (11th), completion percentage (24th), rushing offense (32nd) and red-zone offense (32nd). On special teams, Tech ranked third nationally with five blocked kicks and, as a team, the Jackets were one of the nation's 25 least-penalized teams.

Ten Yellow Jackets were named all-ACC in 2024, Tech's most all-conference selections since 2014.

In 2023, Key led Tech to its first winning season since 2018, capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016. The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022, Key served as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach/offensive line coach/run game coordinator for three-plus seasons. In four total seasons at his alma mater prior to taking over as head coach on permanent basis, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. He also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 47, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER DUKE

• No. 12 Georgia Tech once again shook off a slow start on the road to dominate the second half and move to 7-0 on the season with a 27-18 victory at Duke last Saturday.

• The Yellow Jackets managed just 110 yards of total offense in the first half but went into halftime tied at 7-7 thanks to **Omar Daniels'** school-record 95-yard fumble return for a touchdown in the first quarter.

• However, as they've done in each of their three road games this season, the Jackets turned on the jets offensively after the break. Tech ranked up 266 yards of offense and scored on all four of its offensive possessions after the break (a final kneel-down notwithstanding) to pull away from the Blue Devils.

• After managing just 110 yards and averaging 4.6 yards per play in the first half, Georgia Tech's offense had 266 yards and averaged 8.1 yards in the second half.

• Once again, r-Sr. QB **Haynes King** was the catalyst for the Yellow Jackets' high-octane offense, totaling 325 yards of offense (205 passing, 120 rushing), including 240 in the second half.

• King engineered scoring drives of 63 (FG), 89 (FG), 72 (TD) and 71 (TD) yards after the break.

• King capped his impressive performance with a 28-yard touchdown run that gave the Jackets a commanding 27-10 lead and all but sealed the Blue Devils' fate with 2:10 left in the game.

• In recognition of his performance, King was named ACC Quarterback of the Week for the third time this season.

• After Duke racked up 238 yards of offense in the first half, Georgia Tech's defense was spectacular in the second half, surrendering just 116 yards on the Devils' first four possessions after the break (before a relatively meaningless touchdown drive after the Jackets had taken the 17-point lead with only 130 seconds to go).

• Georgia Tech held Duke to less than half of its season scoring average going into the game (the Blue Devils were averaging 36.5 points per game).

• Duke's 68 rushing yards the fewest that Georgia Tech has allowed this season (prev.: 117 vs. Gardner-Webb — Sept. 6) and were a season low for the Blue Devils (prev.: 82 vs. Illinois — Sept. 6).

• Daniels' 95-yard fumble return for a touchdown in the first quarter is the longest official fumble return in Georgia Tech history (fumble returns became an official NCAA statistic in 1992).

• Daniels' touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first score on a fumble return since Jaylon King's 40-yard touchdown at Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 6, 2021.

GEORGIA TECH-SYRACUSE SERIES HISTORY

• Georgia Tech and Syracuse are meeting on the gridiron for only the seventh time.

• Georgia Tech owns a 4-2 lead in the all-time series.

• The only ACC teams that the Yellow Jackets have faced less than Syracuse are Louisville (four meetings) and conference newcomer Stanford (two meetings).

• After having never even faced each other in consecutive seasons prior to 2023, Tech and Syracuse are squaring off for the third-straight season

• The Yellow Jackets and Orange are squaring off for just the fifth time since Syracuse joined the ACC in 2013. The home team has won each of the first four conference games between the two schools.

• In their two meetings prior to becoming conference-mates, Georgia Tech won a pair of neutral-site matchups against Syracuse — 13-7 in the 2001 Kickoff Classic in Eas Rutherford, N.J. and 51-14 in the 2004 Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando.

• The Yellow Jackets' No. 7 national ranking is their highest since they were ranked No. 7 in the final coaches poll of 2014, following the conclusion of an 11-3 season that was capped by a 49-34 Orange Bowl victory over Mississippi State.

• The No. 7 ranking is Tech's highest in the regular season since it came was ranked seventh in both polls for three weeks in 2009.

• For only the second time in program history, Georgia Tech had multiple regular-season wins over top-10 opponents in 2024 — Aug. 24 vs. No. 10 Florida State (24-21 in Dublin, Ireland) and Nov. 9 vs. No. 4 Miami (28-23 at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field).

• The only other season that Tech ever knocked off multiple top-10 teams in the same regular season was 1959, when the Yellow Jackets beat No. 6 SMU (16-12 - Sept. 26), No. 6 Clemson (16-6 - Oct. 3) and No. 8 Tennessee (14-7 - Oct. 10) in three-consecutive weeks.

• Georgia Tech has scored 30 or more points 13 times since the beginning of the 2023 season (33 games), after scoring 30 or more points a total of nine times in its previous 46 games (2019-22).

• One area where Georgia Tech's offense was very uncharacteristic through the first two games of this season was in turnovers.

• King accounted for 273 yards of offense (213 passing, 60 rushing) to go along with his three touchdowns in the win over VT.

• King accounted for a season-high 349 yards of total offense (243 passing, 106 rushing) and a season-high-tying three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) in the overtime win at Wake Forest (Sept. 27).

• King accounted for 349 of Tech's 411 yards of total offense and all three of its touchdowns in the win at Wake.

• King broke two school records with his performance at Wake Forest.

• King accounted for 314 total yards (211 yards on 20-of-28 passing and rushing for 103 rushing yards on a career-high 25 carries) in the Yellow Jackets' heart-stopping win over longtime rival Clemson (Sept. 13).

• Hosley has averaged at least 11 yards per rush three times in his six games as a Yellow Jacket — 11.1 vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), 11.8 vs. Temple (Sept. 20) and 11.7 vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 11).

• Hosley's 129 rushing yards in Georgia Tech's last home game against Virginia Tech (Oct. 11) were his most as a Yellow Jacket.

• Rutherford had a streak of 29-straight games with a reception coming into this season. Unfortunately, that streak was snapped in the season opener at Colorado, as he left the game following a 13-yard run on the game's first play.

• Rutherford's 29-consecutive games with a catch was the fourth-longest streak in Georgia Tech history.

• Rivers is tied with Rutherford for the team lead with 23 receptions and ranks second on the team with 257 receiving yards.

• Rivers has racked up 390 all-purpose yards — 257 receiving, 49 rushing and 84 on punt returns — in his first seven games as a Yellow Jacket (55.7 ypg).

• Rivers' eight receptions and 77 receiving yards at Wake Forest (Sept. 20) were both his most as a Yellow Jacket (prev.: three receptions for 72 yards vs. Clemson — Sept. 13).

• Rivers' 14-yard touchdown reception at Wake Forest was his first at Georgia Tech.

• Rivers, a transfer from Florida International, was a third-team *Associated Press* All-American at FIU last season, when he caught 62 passes for 1,162 yards (18.9 avg.) and 12 touchdowns.

• This season, Rivers was named second-team preseason all-America by *The Sporting News* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview*.

• So, **Isiah Canion** is Georgia Tech's leader in receiving yards with 301 yards this season.

• Canion also leads the Yellow Jackets with 15.8 yards per reception (min. six receptions) and ranks third on the team with 19 catches.

• Canion set a new career high with 70 receiving yards at Wake Forest (Sept. 27).

• Earlier in the season, Canion shattered his previous career high with five receptions against Clemson (prev.: two - three times).

• Canion hauled in the second touchdown catch of his career, a 37-yarder from Haynes King, in the second quarter of Georgia Tech's win over Temple (Sept. 20).

• Canion first TD came on an 11-yard pass from **Aaron Philo** in the first quarter of Tech's win over Gardner-Webb.

• So, **Bailey Stockton** led Georgia Tech with four catches for 48 yards in the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29). The totals were just one reception and 6 yards shy of his career highs, set last season vs. NC State (Nov. 21, 2024).

• In all, Georgia Tech has four wideouts with double-digit receptions this season — Rutherford (23), Rivers (23), Canion (19) and Stockton (13).

• The Jackets also added Rivers' former FIU teammate **Dean Patterson** to the receivers' room. Patterson was a second-team all-Conference USA selection in 2024 after catching 50 passes for 685 yards and seven touchdowns last season.

• Buoyed by an 84-yard touchdown reception against Gardner-Webb, Patterson is averaging 18.8 yards per catch (five receptions for 94 yards).

• Patterson's 84-yard touchdown reception from **Graham Knowles** in the fourth quarter of the Yellow Jackets' win over Gardner-Webb was the seventh-longest reception in Georgia Tech history.

• While their statistics might not jump off the page, Georgia Tech also boasts great experience and depth at the tight end position in 2025.

• Tech's top four tight ends — redshirt seniors **Josh Beetham**, **J.T. Byrne** and **Brett Seither** and redshirt freshman **Luke Harpring** — have combined to play in 112 games over 20 collegiate seasons.

• Since its first open week of the season (Oct. 4), the tight end group has become a much more utilized aspect of the Georgia Tech passing game. Through the first five games of the season, Tech's tight ends combined for seven catches and 88 yards. In the two games since the bye (vs. Virginia Tech and at Duke) the group has combined for eight catches and 193 yards.

• The only underclassman of the group, Harpring leads Tech's tight ends with eight receptions for 100 yards this season.

• Harpring had three receptions for 39 yards — both career highs — in Tech's last home game versus Virginia Tech (Oct. 11).

• After having just three catches for 29 yards in his first 14 games as a Yellow Jacket, Beetham has hauled in three receptions for 97 yards over the last three games — a 17-yard catch at Wake Forest (Sept. 27), a then-career-long 31-yard reception vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 11) and a new career-long 49-yarder at Duke (last Saturday).

• Seither ranks second among the Yellow Jackets' tight ends with 59 receiving yards, albeit on three receptions — a 26-yarder against Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), a 4-yarder vs. Temple (Sept. 20) and a 29-yarder against Virginia Tech (Oct. 11).

• Seither's 26-yard catch against Gardner-Webb was his first in 651 days, as he missed the entire 2024 season after sustaining a season-ending knee injury during fall camp.

• In 2023, Seither was one of QB **Haynes King's** favorite red zone targets, finishing with four touchdown receptions among his seven total catches for 101 yards.

• Byrne delivered the key block from an H-back alignment on King's game-winning, 45-yard touchdown run with 1:07 to go in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 season-opening win at Colorado (Aug. 29).

• Byrne hauled in a career-long 21-yard reception last Saturday at Duke, which set up go-ahead field goal that gave Tech a 13-10 lead in the fourth quarter.

OFFENSIVE LINE

• Despite losing three starters on the offensive line from a season ago, offensive line remains a talented, experienced and deep position for Georgia Tech.

• The offensive linemen on the Yellow Jackets' 2025 roster have combined to play in 225 collegiate games with 143 career starts.

• Georgia Tech has had the same five starters on its offensive line all season — r-So. **LT Ethan Mackenny**, r-Sr. **LG Joe Fusile**, So. **C Harrison Moore**, Sr. **RG Keylan Rutledge** and r-Jr. **LT Malachi Carney**.

• Georgia Tech is one of only 16 teams in the nation whose starting five offensive linemen have remained intact throughout the season (Air Force, Arkansas, Auburn, Duke, Iowa, Kansas, Kennesaw State, Kentucky, Old Dominion, Oregon, San Diego State, Tennessee, Texas A&M, Texas Tech and UAB are the others).

• Leading the way is Sr. **RG Keylan Rutledge**, who is widely regarded as one of the nation's top offensive linemen.

• Rutledge has allowed just one pressure and no sacks in 455 snaps this season, according to *Pro Football Focus*.

• Rutledge ranks among the top 30 guards in the nation and top three guards in the ACC in all three of PFF's major blocking metrics — overall grade (19th - 73.2), run blocking (21st - 72.4) and pass blocking (28th - 82.5).

• Rutledge was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time in his career after helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 147 yards and total 358 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 24-21 win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

OFFENSE

- An image of Rutledge with a bloody nose during the Clemson game, personifying his grit and toughness, went viral.
- Prior to this season, Rutledge was named preseason all-America by the *Associated Press* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview* (both second team).
- Last season, Rutledge earned first-team all-America honors from *Sports Info Solutions*.
- Rutledge's all-America honor in 2024 came after he ranked in the top 10 offensive linemen nationally in SIS's Total Points metric, including a top-five national ranking in run-blocking Total Points.
- In pass protection, Rutledge had only two "blown blocks" in nearly 400 regular-season attempts last season, according to SIS.
- Rutledge was the Yellow Jackets' first first-team all-American since P Pressley Harvin III was a unanimous first-team honoree in 2020.
- Rutledge became Tech's first non-specialist to receive first-team all-America honors since Shaq Mason in 2014.
- Rutledge is the 54th first-team all-American in Georgia Tech's 132-year football history.
- Georgia Tech is tied for fourth nationally with just three sacks allowed in seven games this season. The Yellow Jackets are one of only five teams nationally that have surrendered a half-sack or less per game.

• In its first seven games under Gideon, Georgia Tech's defense has allowed 24 points or less in regulation of each game. It is the Yellow Jackets' first seven-game, same-season stretch of surrendering 24 points or less in regulation since they allowed 24 points or less in each of their first eight games of the 2008 season.

• The Jackets have surrendered 24 points or less in regulation of seven-straight victories for the first time since 1978.

• For the season, Georgia Tech is allowing just 20.6 points per game. The Yellow Jackets have not surrendered less than 22 points per game over the course of a full season since the 2008 squad allowed just 20.3 ppg.

• In last Saturday's 27-18 win over Duke, Georgia Tech held the Blue Devils to less than half their season scoring average going into the game (Duke was averaging 36.5 points per game).

• Georgia Tech also limited Duke to just 68 rushing yards, which is the fewest that the Yellow Jackets have allowed this season (prev.: 117 vs. Gardner-Webb — Sept. 6) and were a season low for the Blue Devils (prev.: 82 vs. Illinois — Sept. 6).

• Tech's defense was especially stout in the second half at Duke. The Yellow Jackets held the Blue Devils to just 66 yards and no points over three series that spanned 14:53 of the second half, which allowed the Jackets' offense to score on four-straight possessions and turn the 10-7 deficit into the 27-10 lead.

• In its last home game (Oct. 11), Georgia Tech held Virginia Tech to 0-for-8 on third downs. It marked only the second time in GT history — as well as the first time since 1988 and the first time ever against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent — that the Yellow Jackets did not allow a third-down conversion.

• Georgia Tech forced a season-high two turnovers in its win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

• With five takeaways through seven games, Georgia Tech ranks 115th nationally in turnovers gained. This comes after finishing 117th nationally in takeaways last season.

• Prior to 2024, Tech had been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for two-straight seasons. The Yellow Jackets tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.

• However, the Yellow Jackets tend to make the most of takeaways when they get them. Since the beginning of the 2024 season, Georgia Tech has either scored or run out the clock after 13 of their 16 takeaways (eight touchdowns, two field goals and three end of halves/games), including 3-of-5 this season (two touchdowns, one field goal).

• Georgia Tech's most recent turnover that led to points was last Saturday's 95-yard fumble return for a touchdown by r-Sr. DB **Omar Daniels** at Duke.

• Daniels' scoop-and-score was Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season. The Yellow Jackets' hadn't scored defensively since LB **E.J. Lightsey's** 21-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. NC State last season (Nov. 21, 2024).

• The fumble return for a touchdown was Georgia Tech's first since DB Jaylon King scored on a 40-yard return at Miami (Fla.) in 2021.

• Daniels' 95-yard fumble return at Duke was the longest official fumble return in Georgia Tech history (fumble returns became an official NCAA statistic in 1992).

• Powell-Lee and r-Jr. LB **E.J. Lightsey** led Georgia Tech with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively, in the win over Clemson. It marked the first time since Nov. 12, 2022 vs. Miami (Fla.) that two Yellow Jackets had double-digit tackles in the same game (LBs Ayinde Eley and Charlie Thomas had 12 and 11 stops, respectively, against Miami in '22).

• r-Sr. DL **Jordan van den Berg** recorded the first field goal block of his career vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), and r-Sr. DB **Ahmari Harvey** returned it 65 yards for a touchdown.

• With his blocked field goal return for a touchdown vs. Gardner-Webb, Harvey became only the 31st player in college football since the beginning of 2024 with an interception, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble and a touchdown to his credit.

• However, Harvey is the only player in the nation since the beginning of 2024 who has had an interception, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble and a touchdown that was scored on a blocked field goal return.

• Harvey's blocked field goal return for a touchdown against Gardner-Webb was Georgia Tech's first since Lance Austin's 78-yard return of a blocked field goal for the winning touchdown on the final play of the Yellow Jackets' famed "Miracle on Techwood Drive" victory over No. 9 Florida State on Oct. 24, 2015.

• Powell-Lee is one of five Yellow Jackets in the last 40 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same contest (LB Charlie Thomas — Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, DB LaMiles Brooks — Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech — Nov. 5, 2022, DL Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and DB Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

• Making Birr's walk-off field goal against Clemson even more impressive was that field goal unit took the field as time was winding down without the benefit of a timeout — known as a "Toro" situation in Georgia Tech football's parlance.

• Tech repeated the challenging Toro situation again at Wake Forest (Sept. 27), as Birr and the field goal unit had to once again take the field with time ticking away and no timeouts, this time needing a 33-yard field goal to sent the game to overtime. Birr drilled the 33-yarder with two seconds remaining to send the game to overtime knotted at 23-23, and the Jackets went on to win, 30-29, in OT.

• As a team, the Yellow Jackets have a 43.5-yard net punting average this season, which is for the 15th-best mark in the nation and second-best in the ACC.

• Nichols was named a member of the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8 list, which honors the nation's top punters of the week, following back-to-back games vs. Temple (Sept. 20) and at Wake Forest (Sept. 27).

• Nichols averaged 51.2 yards over four booming punts in the win over Temple, which tied for the 19th-best punting average in Georgia Tech single-game history.

• Perhaps even more impressively, Nichols had a net average of 50.3 yards per punt in the win over Temple.

• Nichols' two longest punts against Temple — a 64-yarder and a 55-yarder — were downed at the Owls' 5 and 1 yard lines, respectively.
