TOP STORYLINES

- No. 15/12 Georgia Tech hosts one of the most consequential games in school history on Saturday when it welcomes Pitt to Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field with Tech's first ACC Championship Game berth in 11 years on the line.
- With a win, Georgia Tech (9-1, 6-1 ACC) would clinch a spot in the 2025 ACC Championship Game, which will be held on Dec. 6 in Charlotte, N.C. It would be the Yellow Jackets' first conference title game appearance since 2014 and its fifth overall since the ACC adopted its championship game in 2005.
- A win would also guarantee that Tech would finish with no worse than a tie for the ACC's best regular-season record. The Jackets have not had the conference's best regular-season record since 2009, when they also finished with a 7-1 record in ACC
- A victory would give the Jackets 10 regular-season wins, a feat that has been accomplished just four times in the school's first 132 seasons of football (1951, 1952, 1990, 2014). It would be the program's ninth 10-win season overall, including the postseason (prev.: 1928, 1951, 1952, 1956, 1990, 1998, 2009, 2014).
- Georgia Tech has raced to its 9-1 record on the strength of the nation's No. 1 offense, which is averaging 496.7 yards per game and 7.47 yards per play, both tops in the country.
- Tech's offense has been especially explosive of late, with the Jackets averaging a whopping 576.7 ypg in their last three games.
- Leading the way for the Jackets' offense is Heisman Trophy candidate QB **Haynes King**, who leads the nation individually with 340.7 yards of total offense per game.
- Defensively, the Yellow Jackets are looking to return to form at home, where they are allowing just 18.6 points and 356.6 yards per game this season, compared to 29.8 ppg and 461.8 ypg on the road.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech has the nation's No. 1 offense, leading NCAA Division I FBS in both yards per game (496.7) and yards per play (7.47).

Individually, r-Sr. QB Haynes King also leads the nation in total offense (340.7 ypg).

Last Saturday at Boston College, Georgia Tech had two 100-yard receivers (Malik Rutherford - 121 yds. and Eric Rivers - 119 yds.) for the first time since Sept. 10, 2005, when Damarius Bilbo (131) and Calvin Johnson (114) both surpassed the 100-yard mark vs. North Carolina.

Last Saturday marked only the second time in Georgia Tech history that the Yellow Jackets had a 300-yard passer (King -371), a 100-yard rusher (Malachi Hosley - 107) and two 100-yard receivers (Rutherford and Rivers) in the same game. The Jackets also accomplished the feat in the 27-21 win over North Carolina on Sept. 10, 2005 (Reggie Ball had 320 passing and P.J. Daniels had 103 rushing yards to go along with Bilbo's and Johnson's 131 and 114 receiving yards, respectively).

Georgia Tech's 9-1 record marks just the 10th time in its 133-season football history — and only the third since 1966 that the Yellow Jackets have won at least nine of their first 10 games (1928, 1942, 1947, 1951, 1952, 1956, 1966, 1990, 2009 and 2025).

Brent Key has led Georgia Tech to 23 wins since taking the reins at his alma mater on a full-time basis in 2023. With at least three games still to play in his third full season at the helm, Key's 23 victories are already tied for the second-most by a coach in his first three full seasons at Georgia Tech. The only three coaches that won as many games as Key already has in their first three full seasons at Tech are all in the College Football Hall of Fame — Paul Johnson (25 - 2008-10), Bobby Dodd (23 -1945-47) and William Alexander (23 - 1920-22).

r-Sr. WR Eric Rivers has caught a pass in 31-consecutive games, which is the longest active streak in the ACC and the 10thlongest active streak in the nation.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- clinch a berth in the 2025 ACC Championship Game, which would be the Yellow Jackets' fifth ACC title game appearance overall and first since 2014;
- up the Jackets to 10-1 overall and secure the fifth 10-win regular season in school history;
- give it a final ACC record of 7-1, which would be its best in conference play since 2009 and tie for the second-best league record in Tech's 43 seasons in the ACC;
- extend its winning streak at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field to 11 games;
- give it back-to-back unbeaten seasons at Bobby Dodd Stadium for the first time since 1952-53;
- up it to 7-11 all-time against Pitt;
- · be its second-straight win over Pitt, after having lost the previous four matchups:
- be just its third win in nine all-time home games against the Panthers.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop the Yellow Jackets to 9-2 overall;
- give it a final ACC record of 6-2 and leave it needing significant help to reach the ACC Championship Game;
- snap the Yellow Jackets' 10-game winning streak at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field;
- be its first defeat at Bobby Dodd Stadium since a 31-23 loss to No. 1 Georgia on Nov. 25, 2023;
- drop it to 6-12 all-time against Pitt;
- be its fifth loss in the last six meetings and seventh defeat in the last nine matchups with Pitt;
- drop it to 2-7 all-time at home against the Panthers.

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, is in his third full season as the head coach at his alma mater. He took over as the program's 21st head coach on a permanent basis in 2023, after stepping into the role as interim head coach during the 2022 campaign.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech has won 27-of-44 games since Key took the reins as interim head coach five games into the 2022 season.

In his first two full seasons as head coach (2023 and 2024), Key led his alma mater to consecutive winning seasons and back-to-back bowl berths for the first time since 2013-14. The Yellow Jackets also have consecutive fourth-place finishes in the Atlantic Coast Conference, after being picked to finish 12th in the 14-team conference in 2023 and 10th in the 17-team league in 2024. The back-to-back fourth-place showings have been spurred by Tech's gaudy 7-1 versus nationally ranked ACC opponents since Key took the reins of the program five games into the 2022 campaign.

His 14 wins in his first two full seasons at the helm of the Jackets are tied for the third-most in Georgia Tech history, behind only College Football Hall of Famers Paul Johnson and William Alexander.

The 2024 campaign was highlighted by a pair of wins over top-10 opponents - a 24-21 victory over No. 10 Florida State in the season opener in Dublin, Ireland and a 28-23 home triumph over previously unbeaten and No. 4-ranked Miami (Fla.) in November – as Tech became only the ninth team in ACC history to defeat two top-10 teams in the same regular season. The Yellow Jackets' 7-5 regular-season record was their best since 2018.

A year after fielding one of the nation's most improved offenses, the Jackets had one of college football's most improved defensive units in 2024. Tech's defense surrendered 342.8 total yards and 122.2 rushing vards per game in '24, improvements of 94.3 and 99.1 vards per game over 2023. At the same time, despite a plethora of injuries — including one that cost starting guarterback Haynes King two full games and parts of three others — Tech continued to boast one of the nation's too offenses. The Jackets finished in the top 35 nationally in total offense (424.5 yards per game) and also ranked among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (third), fewest turnovers (11th), completion percentage (24th), rushing offense (32nd) and red-zone offense (32nd). On special teams, Tech ranked third nationally with five blocked kicks and, as a team, the Jackets were one of the nation's 25 least-penalized teams.

Ten Yellow Jackets were named all-ACC in 2024, Tech's most all-conference selections since 2014.

In 2023, Key led Tech to its first winning season since 2018, capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016. The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg - 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg - 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four - good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC)

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – PK Aidan Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents - a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries - including to its top two quarterbacks - to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings - North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022, Key served as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach/offensive line coach/run game coordinator for three-plus seasons. In four total seasons at his alma matter prior to taking over as head coach on permanent basis, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. He also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks - tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven firstteamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008)

Blake Bortles

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala, native, Key, 47, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN AT BOSTON COLLEGE

- Georgia Tech proved its resiliency once again and moved within one win of a spot in the 2025 Atlantic Coast Conference Championship Game with a 36-34 victory at Boston College.
- Georgia Tech, which trailed 28-17 going into the fourth quarter, drove 69 yards in 13 plays to set up **Aidan Birr's** game-winning 23-yard field goal with 11 seconds to go in the victory.
- The Yellow Jackets moved to 3-1 this season when trailing going into the fourth guarter.
- Tech scored 19 points in the final period to erase the 11-point deficit in Saturday's come-from-behind win.
- The Jackets were led by another spectacular day from Heisman Trophy candidate **Haynes King**, who finished with 424 yards of total offense 371 through the air and 53 on the ground.
- It was King's fourth-straight game with at least 325 yards of total offense and his third-straight with at least 300 passing.
- King once again did it in a strikingly efficient manner, connecting on 26-of-34 passes (76.5 percent), good for the fifth-best completion percentage in Georgia Tech history for a passer with at least 30 attempts in a game. He now holds six of the top seven single-game completion percentages in school history (min. 30 attempts).
- WRs **Malik Rutherford** and **Eric Rivers** were King's favorite targets with 121 and 119 yards, respectively, which marked the first time in 20 years that Tech had two 100-yard receivers in a game (Damarius Bilbo 131 and Calvin Johnson 114 vs. North Carolina on Sept. 10, 2005).
- RB **Malachi Hosley** also had a 100-yard game on the ground, rushing for 107 on 15 carries, including a 27-yard touchdown to open the scoring in the first quarter.
- In all, the Jackets racked up 628 yards of offense, good for their third-straight game with at least 500 yards, their highest total of the season against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent and the most yards by any team in an ACC game this season
- The 628 yards of offense were the seventh-most in Georgia Tech history and its second-most in an ACC game (behind only its 635 against UNC in 2023).
- Georgia Tech moved to 12-3 in games that immediately followed a loss under head coach **Brent Key** (dating back to him taking over as interim head coach prior to the fifth game of the 2022 season).
- For the sixth time this season, Georgia Tech lost the turnover battle, as Tech committed one and Boston College had none. The Yellow Jackets moved to 5-1 on the campaign when losing the turnover battle.
- Georgia Tech lost the opening coin toss for the ninth time in 10 games this season. The Yellow Jackets' lone win on an opening coin toss came in their second game of the season (Sept. 6 vs. Gardner-Webb). Including losing the coin toss at the beginning of overtime at Wake Forest (Sept. 27), Tech is 1-10 in coin tosses this season. The statistical odds of winning just 1-of-11 coin tosses are just 0.54% (1 in 186.2).

GEORGIA TECH-PITT SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia Tech and Pitt renew their old ACC Coastal Division rivalry on Saturday when they square off for the first time since 2022.
- Georgia Tech and Pitt played annually from 2013, the Panthers' first season in the ACC, through 2022 but have not met since the Yellow Jackets upset 24th-ranked Pitt, 26-21 in Brent Key's first game as Tech's interim head coach on Oct. 1, 2022.
- The Jackets and Panthers are meeting for the 19th time overall and the 11th time as ACC foes.
- Pitt leads the overall series, which dates back to 1918, 11-6.
- The Yellow Jackets are 4-6 against the Panthers since Pitt joined the ACC in '13.
- Pitt has won four of the last five and six of the last eight games in the series.
- Prior to becoming conference-mates in 2013, Pitt had won all five regular-season meetings with Georgia Tech (1918, 1919, 1920, 1974 and 1976) but the Yellow Jackets had won both postseason matchups (in the 1956 Sugar Bowl - following the 1955 season - and in the 1956 Gator Bowl).
- The most notable game in the teams' series history was the 1956 Sugar Bowl. Controversy preceded the game, as segregationists tried to prevent Georgia Tech from playing in the game against Pitt, which had a Black student-athlete (RB Bobby Grier). Georgia Tech players voted unanimously to play the game, a sentiment that was shared and supported by Tech head coach Bobby Dodd and president Blake Van Leer. Two thousand Tech students marched to the governor's mansion in protest of Gov. Marvin Griffin's opposition to the game. Eventually, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia voted 13-1 to allow Tech to play in the game, which the Yellow Jackets won, 7-0.
- Pitt's 32-0 win over Tech on Nov. 23, 1918 (the firstever meeting between the schools) snapped a 33-game unbeaten streak for head coach John Heisman's Golden Tornado (as Tech's teams were known at the time).
- Georgia Tech and Pitt are two of college football's all-time winningest programs. Pitt ranks 19th in NCAA Division I FBS history with 775 all-time wins while Georgia Tech is 20th with 772

TECH IN THE CFP RANKINGS

- Georgia Tech was No. 16 in last week's College Football Playoff rankings, which were released on Tuesday evening.
- The Yellow Jackets rose one spot in last week's CFP top 25 after coming in at No. 17 in the CFP's initial rankings of 2025 on Nov. 4.
- Georgia Tech's No. 16 CFP ranking is its highest since it was tabbed 12th in the final rankings of 2014, which was the playoff's inaugural season.
- The Jackets were ranked in the CFP's top 25 six times in seven weeks in 2014, reaching as high as No. 11, but did not return to the playoff rankings until this season.
- The CFP selection committee ranks the top 25 teams each of the final seven weeks of the college football season.
- The five highest-ranked conference champions and the next seven highest-ranked teams in the final rankings will be seeded into the CFP's 12-team bracket, with the four highest-ranked teams receiving a first-round bye.
- The teams ranked Nos. 5-12 will play in the CFP first round, with the higher seeds hosting the lower seeds.
- This year's CFP quarterfinals will be played at the Goodvear Cotton Bowl Classic, Capital One Orange Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. The semifinals will be held at the Vrbo Fiesta Bowl and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The 2026 College Football Playoff National Championship will be played on Monday, January 19 at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Florida.

- The Yellow Jackets' No. 7 national ranking earlier this season was their highest since they were ranked No. 7 in the final coaches poll of 2014 and their highest regularseason ranking since they were seventh in both polls for three weeks in 2009.
- Prior to Week 4 of this season, Georgia Tech had not been in the top 25 of both the AP and coaches polls in the same week since Week 4 of 2015.
- Last season, Georgia Tech was nationally ranked for the first time since '15, when it came in at No. 23 in the AP Top 25 poll on Sept. 3. The Jackets' ranking lasted only one week, as they lost 31-28 at Syracuse on Sept. 7 and never re-entered the top 25 in 2024.

• Tech has been ranked in the AP poll 317 times since the poll's inception in 1936 (the poll listed 20 teams from 1936-88, except for from 1961-67, when only 10 teams were ranked; it began ranking 25 teams in 1989).



- Tech is one of only two teams to finish in the top four in the ACC each of the last two seasons (joining Louisville).
- Georgia Tech's consecutive fourth-place finishes came after it was picked to finish 12th out of 14 teams in the ACC's 2023 preseason poll and 10th out of 17 teams in the league's 2024 preseason poll.
- Georgia Tech will finish above .500 in ACC play for the third-straight season, marking the first time since 2012 (5-3), 2013 (5-3) and 2014 (6-2) that the Yellow Jackets have three-consecutive winning records in conference action.

- Tech's rise to No. 1 in the nation in total offense has come on the heels of three-straight 500-yard games: 543 vs. Syracuse (Oct. 25), 559 at NC State (Nov. 1) and 628 at Boston College (last Saturday).

- The most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense is its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has averaged 0.9 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.8 turnovers per game in losses.
- Georgia Tech's offense is guided by third-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulkner**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia (2020-22).
- Faulkner boasts 20 years of experience on college football staffs, including 14 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18), Southern Miss (2019) and Georgia Tech (2023-pres.).

- 240 of King's 325 yards of total offense at Duke (Oct. 18) came in the second half, as he engineered scoring drives of 63 (FG), 89 (FG), 72 (TD) and 71 (TD) yards after halftime. He led the Yellow Jackets to points on all four of their full possessions in the second half (a series of kneel-downs to end the game notwithstanding).
- King accounted for 273 yards of offense (213 passing, 60 rushing) to go along with his three touchdowns in Georgia Tech's win over Virginia Tech (Oct. 11).

- King had 314 total yards (211 yards on 20-of-28 passing and rushing for 103 rushing yards on a career-high 25 carries) in the Yellow Jackets' heart-stopping win over longtime rival Clemson (Sept. 13).
- King was at his best in the win over Clemson in the fourth quarter. He opened the period with a 1-yard touchdown run that gave the Yellow Jackets a 21-14 lead then, after Clemson knotted the score at 21-21 with 3:26 to go in the ballgame, led the Jackets into field goal range, setting up **Aidan Birr's** game-winning 55-yard field goal as time expired.
- King accounted for 36 of Tech's 38 yards (18 passing, 18 rushing) on the game-winning drive against Clemson. He picked up two key first downs with runs of 9 and 4 yards on third-and-1 and third-and-2 to keep the drive alive.
- The win over No. 12/11 Clemson was King's fifth over a nationally ranked team as Georgia Tech's starting quarterback.
- In nine total games against ranked opponents, King has completed 158-of-234 passes (.675) for 1,907 yards, 10 touchdowns and just three interceptions, while also rushing for 630 yards and 10 scores.
- In all, King has accounted for 2,537 yards of total offense and 20 touchdowns in his nine games against ranked opponents at Tech. That averages out to 281.9 yards of total offense (211.9 passing, 70.0 rushing) per game with a 147.52 pass-efficiency rating.
- In the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29), King completed 13-of-20 passes for 146 yards and ran 19 times for a career-high 156 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 win.
- King's 156 rushing yards at Colorado topped his previous career high of 150, set against Boston College on Oct. 21,
- His three touchdown runs (4, 17 and 45 yards) at Colorado matched the career high that he originally set in last season's eight-overtime defeat at No. 6 Georgia (Nov. 29, 2024).
- King's 45-yard touchdown against Colorado came with 1:07 to go in the game, and proved to be the game-winner in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 victory.
- King's game-winning TD run with 67 seconds left on the clock at Colorado marked the second-straight year that Tech scored the winning points of its season opener on its final offensive play (PK **Aidan Birr's** 44-yard FG as time expired were the winning points in the Jackets' 24-21 win over No. 10 Florida State in the 2024 opener in Dublin, Ireland).
- King is one of only two NCAA Division I FBS players since 2000 with at least 140 passing yards, 140 rushing yards and three touchdown runs in a season opener, joining reigning Super Bowl MVP Jalen Hurts.

- Haynes opened the season with 92 yards from scrimmage (65 rushing, 27 receiving) in the season opener at Colorado (Aug. 29) then amassed 100 yards (92 rushing, eight receiving) vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6).
- Haynes matched a career-high with two touchdowns against Gardner-Webb (runs of 47 and 1 yards). He previously ran for two touchdowns in wins over North Carolina on Oct. 12, 2024 and No. 10 Florida State on Aug. 24, 2024.
- The two-TD game against Gardner-Webb was the fourth of Haynes' career in all. He had a rushing touchdown and a receiving touchdown against Syracuse on Nov. 18, 2023.
- Haynes had 62 yards from scrimmage (26 rushing, 36 receiving) and scored his third touchdown of the season on a 5-yard run in Georgia Tech's 24-21 win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).
- With 944 rushing yards in 2024 following his 1,059-yard campaign in 2023, Haynes became the first Georgia Tech player to rush for at least 900 yards in consecutive seasons since QB TaQuon Marshall in 2017 and 2018.
- Haynes is the first Georgia Tech running back to rush for at least 900 yards in consecutive seasons since Jonathan Dwyer in 2008 and 2009.
- Haynes, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the 2023 offseason, ran for 1,059 yards in his first season at the position in '23. He became Georgia Tech's first 1,000-yard rusher since QB TaQuon Marshall (1,146 yds.) and RB KirVonte Benson (1,053 yds.) both reached the 1,000-yard plateau in 2017.
- Haynes' 1,059 rushing yards in 2023 were the 15th-most in Georgia Tech single-season history.
- Georgia Tech's running backs room features a deep, talented group behind Haynes.
- Hosley joined the Yellow Jackets in 2025 after being named 2024 lvy League Player of the Year at Penn.
- In his first season at Georgia Tech, Hosley ranks second on the team with 625 rushing yards (first among RBs).
- Hosley recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season last Saturday at Boston College (107 yards and a TD on 15 carries 7.1 avg.).
- Hosley's 154 yards from scrimmage at BC were his most as a Yellow Jacket.

- Hosley has averaged at least 10 yards per rush four times in his 10 games as a Yellow Jacket 11.1 vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), 11.8 vs. Temple (Sept. 20), 11.7 vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 11) and 10.1 vs. Syracuse (Oct. 25).
- Hosley had a season-high 129 rushing yards against Virginia Tech.
- Hosley ran for 59 yards on just five carries and had another two-touchdown game (34 and 2 yards) against Temple.
- Including his two 100-yard games in his first nine appearances as a Yellow Jacket, Hosley has rushed for 100 yards 12 times in his collegiate career. He eclipsed the 100-yard mark 10 times in two seasons at Penn (2023-24).

- The 47-yard run was nearly six times longer than his previous career rushing total of 8 yards.
- True Fr. **J.P. Powell** nearly scored his second-career TD against Temple too, but came up just short of paydirt on his 61-yard run on the final play of the game.
- Powell's 61-yard run against Temple is Georgia Tech's longest rush of the season.

- Ruteldge is only the third Lombardi Award semifinalist in Georgia Tech history and the first Yellow Jacket to earn the distinction since DL Coleman Rudolph in 1992. DL Rock Perdoni was a finalist for the first-ever Lombardi Award in 1970.
- Rutledge has allowed just one QB hurry and one sack in 675 snaps this season, according to *Pro Football Focus*.
- Among guards that have played at least 80% of his teams snaps this season, Rutledge ranks among the nation's top 11 guards overall (seventh), in run blocking (eighth) and in pass blocking (11th) according to PFF.
- Rutledge was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his career after helping the Yellow Jackets amass 628 yards of offense last Saturday at Boston College.
- Earlier this season, Keylan was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 147 yards and total 358 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 24-21 win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).
- An image of Rutledge with a bloody nose during the Clemson game, personifying his grit and toughness, went viral.
- Prior to this season, Rutledge was named preseason all-America by the *Associated Press* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview* (both second team).
- Last season, Rutledge earned first-team all-America honors from *Sports Info Solutions*.
- Rutledge's all-America honor in 2024 came after he ranked in the top 10 offensive linemen nationally in SIS's Total Points metric, including a top-five national ranking in run-blocking Total Points.
- In pass protection, Rutledge had only two "blown blocks" in nearly 400 regular-season attempts last season, according to SIS.
- Mackenny picked up his first ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week Award for his performance Tech's win over Syracuse (Oct. 25).
- Mackenny was especially impressive protecting QB Haynes King's blindside as a pass blocker against Syracuse, as he did not allow a quarterback sack, hit, hurry or pressure, en route to a gaudy 87.0 pass-blocking grade from PFF.

- Georgia Tech's defense is under the direction of first-year coordinator Blake Gideon.
- Under Gideon's tutelage, Georgia Tech's defense is surrendering 24.2 points per game this season, nearly a point-and-a-half less per game than last year and almost five-and-a-half points less than two seasons ago.

- In its first eight games under Gideon, Georgia Tech's defense allowed 24 points or less in regulation of each game. It was the Yellow Jackets' first eight-game, same-season stretch of surrendering 24 points or less in regulation since they allowed 24 points or less in each of their first eight games of the 2008 season.
- The Jackets also allowed 24 points or less in regulation of eight-straight victories for the first time since 1966.
- The streak of eight-straight games allowing 24 points or less in regulation came to an end with a 48-36 loss at NC State on Nov. 1, followed by a 36-34 win at Boston College last Saturday.
- Returning to Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field for the first time in nearly a month will be a welcome sight for Tech's defense, as it has been significantly better at its home on The Flats than it has been on the road this season.

• In Georgia Tech's 41-16 win over Syracuse (Oct. 25), Georgia Tech's defense allowed just 118 yards in the first half, which allowed the Yellow Jackets to race out to a 20-3 halftime lead.

- After gaining 41 yards on its first offensive play of the game, Syracuse managed just 77 yards over its final 23 plays of the first half (3.3 avg.).
- in Georgia Tech's 27-18 win over Duke (Oct. 18), the Yellow Jackets held the Blue Devils to less than half their season scoring average going into the game (Duke was averaging 36.5 points per game).
- Georgia Tech also limited Duke to just 68 rushing yards, which is the fewest that the Yellow Jackets have allowed this season (prev.: 117 vs. Gardner-Webb Sept. 6) and were a season low for the Blue Devils (prev.: 82 vs. Illinois Sept. 6)
- Tech's defense was especially stout in the second half at Duke. - Georgia Tech also had four sacks against Virginia Tech, the Yellow Jackets' most against an FBS opponent since they had eight at Wake Forest on Sept. 23, 2023.
- Georgia Tech had a breakout performance in terms of negative plays on defense versus Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), with six sacks and 14 tackles for loss.
- Georgia Tech's six sacks against Gardner-Webb were its most in almost two years, dating back to the Yellow Jackets recording eight sacks at Wake Forest on Sept. 23, 2023.

• Georgia Tech forced a season-high two turnovers in its win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

- With six takeaways through 10 games, Georgia Tech ranks 127th nationally in turnovers gained. This comes after finishing 117th nationally in takeaways last season.
- Prior to 2024, Tech had been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for two-straight seasons. The Yellow Jackets tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.
- However, the Yellow Jackets tend to make the most of takeaways when they get them. Since the beginning of the 2024 season, Georgia Tech has either scored or run out the clock after 13 of their 17 takeaways (eight touchdowns, two field goals and three end of halves/games), including 3-of-6 this season (two touchdowns, one field goal).
- Georgia Tech's most recent turnover that led to points was a 95-yard fumble return for a touchdown by r-Sr. DB **Omar** Daniels at Duke.
- Daniels' scoop-and-score was Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season. The Yellow Jackets' hadn't scored defensively since LB **E.J. Lightsey's** 21-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. NC State last season (Nov. 21, 2024).
- The fumble return for a touchdown was Georgia Tech's first since DB Jaylon King scored on a 40-yard return at Miami (Fla.) in 2021.
- Daniels' 95-yard fumble return at Duke was the longest official fumble return in Georgia Tech history (fumble returns became an official NCAA statistic in 1992).

- van den Berg and fellow r-Sr. DT **Jason Moore** combined for a gaudy 10 tackles (five apiece), a sack (0.5 each), a QB hurry (van den Berg) and a forced fumble (Moore) from their interior line positions vs. Syracuse (Oct. 25).
- r-Sr. nickel back **Jy Gilmore** stuffed the stat sheet with with 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, a half sack and two pass breakups at Duke (Oct. 18).
- Gilmore's 11 tackles are tied with Powell-Lee's 11 vs.
 Clemson for the second-most by a Yellow Jacket this season
- In addition to making perhaps the biggest defensive play of the season for the Yellow Jackets with his 95-yard fumble return for a score at Duke (Oct. 18), r-Sr. safety **Omar Daniels** also had a career day in Georgia Tech's win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).
- Daniels led Georgia Tech's defensive effort against Clemson with a forced fumble and an interception to go along with seven tackles.
- Daniels' first-quarter forced fumble set up a field goal that gave Tech an early 3-0 lead, while his third-quarter interception in the red zone thwarted a Clemson scoring opportunity.
- Against Clemson, Daniels became only the 13th Georgia
 Tech player since 2005 with a forced fumble and an interception in the same game. He is the first Yellow Jacket to
 accomplish the feat since current Los Angeles Chargers DL
 Kyle Kennard had a FF and INT against South Carolina State
 on Sept. 9, 2023.
- Daniels is the first Yellow Jacket with a FF and INT in the same game against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since LB Bruce Jordan-Swilling at Virginia on Nov. 4, 2017.
- Powell-Lee and r-Jr. LB E.J. Lightsey led Georgia Tech with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively, in the win over Clemson. It marked the first time since Nov. 12, 2022 vs. Miami (Fla.) that two Yellow Jackets had double-digit tackles in the same game (LBs Ayinde Eley and Charlie Thomas had 12 and 11 stops, respectively, against Miami in '22).
- Powell-Lee is one of five Yellow Jackets in the last 43 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same contest (LB Charlie Thomas Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, DB LaMiles Brooks Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech Nov. 5, 2022, DL Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State Sept. 9, 2023 and DB Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia Nov. 4, 2023).
- Prior to five Tech players recording an interception and a fumble recovery in the last 43 games, only two other Yellow Jackets had accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy – Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling – Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).

- Georgia Tech boasts two of the ACC's top specialists in r-Jr. PK **Aidan Birr** and r-Sr. P **Marshall Nichols**.
- Earlier this season, Birr and Nichols were named ACC Specialist of the Week in consecutive weeks Birr for his performance vs. No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13) and Nichols for his exploits against Temple (Sept. 20).
- This week, Birr was named ACC Specialist of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his career in recognition of his career-high-tying three field goals including the game-winner with 11 seasons left — in last Saturday's 36-34 victory at Boston College.
- Also this week, Birr was named one of 20 semifinalists for the 2025 Lou Groza Award, which is presented to college football's top place kicker.

- Making Birr's walk-off field goal against Clemson even more impressive was that field goal unit took the field as time was winding down without the benefit of a timeout — known as a "Toro" situation in Georgia Tech football's parlance.
- Tech repeated the challenging Toro situation again at Wake Forest (Sept. 27), as Birr and the field goal unit had to once again take the field with time ticking away and no timeouts, this time needing a 33-yard field goal to send the game to overtime.
