Series vs. Southeastern Louisiana

- Monday marks the second time in program history, and first since 2015, Georgia Tech and Southeastern Louisiana will meet on the hardwood
- The programs first met on Dec. 21, 2015 in McCamish Pavilion with the Jackets grabbing a 75-62 victory under head coach Brian Gregory

Last Time Out

- Georgia Tech shot 46.0 percent from the floor to pick up its second win of the season, defeating Bryant handily, 74-45
- Four Yellow Jackets finished in double figure scoring numbers paced by Kowacie Reeves Jr. with a game-high 18 points, just three points shy of matching his career-high
- Mouhamed Sylla continued his impressive collegiate start, registering his second straight double-double behind 10 points and 11 rebounds
- Georgia Tech hit 10-of-23 three-point attempts, marking the 16th time under Damon Stoudamire the Yellow Jackets have hit 10 more triples in a game
- Tech recorded 13 steals for its second-straight outing and currently ranks second in the ACC in steals, just behind Wake Forest at 13.50
- Bryant was held to a 25.0 percent shooting efficiency. The Yellow Jackets rank second in the ACC in field goal percentage defense, having limited both their opponents to under 36 percent (UMES was held to 35.7).

2025-26 Storylines

- Georgia Tech begins the third season under head coach **Damon Stoudamire**, former Arizona All-American and NBA star point guard. Tech went 17-17 overall and 10-10 in the ACC last season. Through two seasons under Stoudamire, the Yellow Jackets are 31-35, 17-23 in the ACC.
- The 2025-26 returning class will be led by 6-9 junior forward **Baye Ndongo** (Mboro, Senegal), a third-team All-ACC performer, 6-7 wing **Kowacie Reeves, Jr.** (Macon, Ga.) and 6-5 guard **Jaeden Mustaf** (Bowie, Md.).
- The Jackets also added four transfer players to the roster in 6-3 guard **Chas Kelley** (Boston College), 6-6 wing **Kam Craft** (Miami, Ohio), 6-4 guard **Lamar Washington** (Pacific) and 7-0 center **Peyton Marshall** (Missouri). The four transfers conclude a 10-member newcomer class that also features six freshmen.
- Tech's freshman recruiting class ranked No. 13 in the nation in the team rankings compiled by Rivals, No. 4 among Atlantic Coast Conference teams, and No. 24 in the nation in the 247Sports composite listing. Tech's freshman class includes four-star 6-4 guard **Akai Fleming** (Marietta, Ga.), four-star 6-10 center **Mouhamed Sylla** (Loug, Senegal), three-star 6-5 guard/foward **Brandon Stores, Jr.** (The Bronx, N.Y.), three-star center **Cole Kirouac** (Cumming, Ga.), three-star 5-11 point guard **Eric Chatfield** (Atlanta, Ga.) and international 6-4 guard **Davi Remagen** (Cologne, Germany). Fleming and Kirouac attended Overtime Elite in Atlanta.
- Georgia Tech's 2025-26 roster includes 10 newcomers (four transfers and six freshmen). Of its roster, five players are

from the Atlanta metro area and three are international, including two from Senegal.

- The Yellow Jackets grabbed a pair of strong shooters out of the portal in redshirt-junior **Kam Craft** (Chicago, Ill./Miami(Ohio)) and **Lamar Washington** (Portland, Ore./Pacific).
- A 6-6 wing, Craft had a standout season last year at Miami (Ohio), as the team's second-leading scorer, helping the RedHawks to a 25-9 overall record and 14-4 ledger in the Mid-American Conference. He started all 34 games, hit 44.6 percent of his shots from the floor, including an impressive 43.1 percent from three-point range. Craft averaged 13.6 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game.
- A 6-4 guard, Washington earned West Coast All-Conference second team honors last season, after breaking the school record for assists in a season with 191. He ranked in the top-25 in the nation in both assists and assists per game, and averaged 13.5 points and 5.8 assists per outing.
- Kelly and Marshall bring competitive playing experience from Boston College and Missouri, respectively. Kelly played in 30 games at BC, starting 14, to average 18.7 minutes per game as one of the Eagles' primary ballhandlers. Marshall took the floor in 22 games for the Tigers to bring size and depth to the floor.

2024-25 Review

- Georgia Tech finished the regular season in 8th place in the ACC standings, four slots ahead of the media's pre-season projections, and has finished ahead of the pre-season projection eight of the last nine years.
- Tech earned a first-round bye in the ACC Tournament

for the first time since 2021, when the Yellow Jackets won their fourth ACC championship. It is the Yellow Jackets' second top-9 seed since the ACC expanded to 15 teams ahead of the 2013-14 season.

- Tech earned its most conference wins since 2020-21 (11-6) and had a .500 or better record in league play for the first time since then.

- **Baye Ndongo** was named third-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference, while **Naithan George** earned honorable mention. **Duncan Powell** was runner-up for the ACC's Sixth Man Award, and made the ACC all-tournament second team. George was fourth in the voting for the ACC's Most Improved Player Award.

- Tech finished the regular season 14-5 on its home court after beginning the season 2-3, and 8-2 in ACC games, having clinched its first winning home conference record since the 2020-21 season, when the Jackets were 8-1.

- This Tech team was the seventh in program history to win 14 or more games at home in a regular season, and the first since the 2016-17 season, when the Jackets were 17-4 (including two home games in the NIT).

- Tech won its last 6 ACC games at home, the first time the Jackets have won 6 conference games in a row since late in the 2019-20 season, when they won their final 7 ACC home games.

- Tech was 2-5 vs. top-25 teams in 2024-25 (including a win over Clemson, which was No. 21 in the coaches poll but unranked in AP at the time), and 5-6 under Damon Stoudamire.

- Tech, which stood 2-6 in the ACC at one point, won 8 of its last 13 dating back to its Feb. 1 win over Louisville.

- Tech won its first ACC Tournament game since its run to the 2021 championship.

- Tech's 17 wins matched the most for the program in a season since 2015-16, when the Yellow Jackets went 21-15 (Tech also won 21 games in 2016-17 though all those wins were vacated by the NCAA). Tech won 17 games in 2019-20 and 2020-21.

- Tech was the only ACC team to defeat both Clemson and Louisville, the teams tied for 2nd place in the standings, during the regular season. The Jackets stopped a 10-game winning streak by Louisville, who then won its next 11 games before falling to Duke in the ACC Championship game. Tech ended a 6-game win streak by Clemson, who responded by defeating Duke and North Carolina and won its next 9 in a row before falling to Louisville in the ACC Tournament semifinals.

- In his first two seasons at Tech, **Damon Stoudamire's** Yellow Jackets have beaten every ACC opponent - outside of three 2024-25 newcomers Cal, SMU and Stanford - at least once, and have beaten every current ACC opponent except SMU at least once. Only Clemson and Duke have beaten every other ACC team in the last two years, while Louisville, North Carolina and Wake Forest have defeated all but one.

Tech Returns to Post-Season

Georgia Tech returned to the post-season for the first time in four years to cap the 2024-25 campaign, receiving a bid to the National Invitation Tournament after winning 17 games during the regular season. The postseason appearance marked the 27th in Georgia Tech men's basketball history and 10th in the NIT.

Tech won five of its last seven regular season games to finish eighth in the Atlantic Coast Conference, earning a first-round bye for the first time since 2021. The Yellow Jackets went 8-5 after the calendar turned to February, including wins over two of the top three teams in the ACC standings, Louisville (77-70) and Clemson (89-86 in 3 overtimes). The Yellow Jackets split their two games in the ACC Tournament, defeating Virginia (66-60) in the second round before falling to No. 1 Duke (78-70) in the quarterfinals.

advanced to the quarterfinals for the first time in four years before being eliminated by top-seeded Duke in a close game.

Duncan Powell scored 21 points, **Baye Ndongo** registered his ninth double-double in the last 11 games and **Naithan George** nearly recorded a triple-double, leading 8th-seeded Georgia Tech to a 66-60 win over No. 9 seed Virginia in the second round. The win was the Yellow Jackets' first over UVA since Jan. 9, 2016, snapping a nine-year, 13-game losing skid against the Cavaliers.

In the quarterfinals, Tech raced out to a 14-point lead in the first half, but top-seeded and No. 1-ranked Duke rallied to defeat the eighth-seeded Yellow Jackets, 78-70.

The Yellow Jackets dominated the action early in the game, making 10 of their first 21 shots while holding Duke to just six makes on 23 attempts, and Baye Ndongo's tip-in with 5:02 to go in the first half gave the Jackets a commanding 26-12 lead.

Tech led by five at the half (31-26), but Duke opened the second period with a 12-0 run to take a 38-31 advantage. Duke stretched its lead to as many as 11 points, but the Yellow Jackets hung tough and cut the deficit to six on three occasions in the final 90 seconds before succumbing to the top-ranked Blue Devils.

Do You Know Mo?

- Mouhamed Sylla continued his impressive freshman debut against Bryant on Nov. 7, logging his second straight double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds

- He became the first player in Georgia Tech men's basketball history to record a double-double in his first two collegiate games

- Sylla is also the first GT freshman to post back-to-back double-doubles since Derrick Favors do so against Clemson on Jan. 19, 2010 (17 points, 14 rebounds) and Florida State on Jan. 24, 2010 (10 points, 10 rebounds)

- Sylla also logged four blocks against Bryant, becoming the second GT freshman to record a double-double with four or more blocks since Derrick Favors did so against Southern California on Dec. 5, 2009

Baye's Back

- After missing the first game, Baye Ndongo returned to action against Bryant on Nov. 7 for his 64th career start

- Ndongo finished with 10 points, including hitting his 12th career three-pointer with less than a minute expired into the second half

- Ndongo returned to the starting lineup and logged 20:39 minutes of playing time like he never left

Red Hot Kowacie

- Kowacie Reeves Jr. has opened his senior season with a pair of double-figure scoring outings

- The redshirt-senior posted 12 points in the opener against UMES and followed up with a game-high 18 points against Bryant

- Reeves' 18-point performance against Bryant was just three points shy of matching his career-high as the Macon, Ga., native connected of 3-of-6 from beyond the arc

- The 15-rebound performance also marks the most by a Georgia Tech freshman in his first game

- The 15 rebounds are also the third-most by a Georgia Tech freshman in any game - joining the list with teammate Baye Ndongo's 19 vs. Penn State (12/16/2023) and Derrick Favors' 18 at Maryland (2/20/2010)

- Sylla becomes the second Yellow Jacket freshman in program history to post a 14-point/15-rebound performance. Derrick Favors was the first, recording 21 points and 18 rebounds at Maryland (2/20/2010)

- Sylla recorded the most rebounds by a freshman in the Atlantic Coast Conference on Monday night with his 15

- He was one of two freshman in the ACC to record a double-double in their collegiate debut on Monday - the other being Thijs De Ridder of Virginia (21 pts/10 rbs vs. Rider)

- Kam Craft, Chas Kelley III and Peyton Marshall each made their Yellow Jacket debuts, combining for 16 points, 11 rebounds, six assists and three steals

Preseason Accolades

- Ahead of tipoff of the 2025-26 season, Georgia Tech's Baye Ndongo picked up a few preseason accolades

- For the second consecutive season, Ndongo was selected to the 2025-26 Preseason ACC second team. He was an all-ACC third team selection in 2024-25.

- Ndongo was also one of 20 power forwards named to the 2026 Karl Malone Award preseason watch list, presented by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The Yellow Jacket was one of five representatives on the list from the ACC, joined by Duke's Cameron Boozer, Miami's Malik Reneau, North Carolina's Caleb Wilson and Syracuse's Donnie Freeman.

Baye the Way

- Junior forward, Baye Ndongo, returns for his third year on The Flats in 2025-26. The Mboro, Senegal native capped the season picking up all-ACC third team honors.

- Last season, Ndongo was one of two Yellow Jackets to start all 34 games. He returns as the team's leading scorer (13.4 ppg) and rebounder (8.9 rpg) after finishing second offensively on the team last year and leading the Jackets on the glass.

- Ndongo has started 63 consecutive games dating back to the 2023-24 season.

- Ndongo posted a strong finish to the season last year, recording 9 double-doubles in Tech's last 13 games and had 3 in which he scored 20 points with 10 rebounds. He capped the ACC regular season averaging 14.4 ppg and 10.2 rpg.

- He ranked second in the ACC in rebound average and third in field goal percentage (54.4%) in conference games. Overall, the 6-9 forward averaged 13.4 points and 8.9 rebounds per game, ranking fourth in the ACC in rebound average and third in field goal percentage (53.6%).

Kowacie's Back

Since his arrival on The Flats in 2023, Kowacie Reeves Jr. has started all 38 games he's appeared in as a Yellow Jacket. That streak was set to continue last season when Reeves

started the first six contests before a foot injury sidelined him the remainder of the season.

Through the first six games opening the season, Reeves averaged 9.3 points, 6th on the team, with just three turnovers. In the first three games, he reached double-figures to average 15.7 points per game.

His first season on The Flats (2023-24), Reeves was one of two Yellow Jackets to start every game and was No. 3 on the team in minutes per game. Reeves averaged 9.8 ppg to rank third on the team.

Reeves joined Georgia Tech in Damon Stoudamire's first year as head coach and begins his third year with the program, also Stoudamire's third year.

Year Two for Mustaf

Sophomore guard Jaeden Mustaf returns for year two after he took the floor in 26 games, starting 10, as a freshman last season. He finished 7th on the team in scoring, averaging 8.3 ppg, hitting 39.3% from the floor, 34.4% from three-point range and 71.4% from the charity stripe. Picked up a starting role last season when Tech's lineup was thinned due to injury before suffering a foot injury of his own. Mustaf recorded nine games scoring in double-digits, including ACC regular season games against Clemson, NC State and Wake Forest.

A Family Tradition

Basketball runs in the family - at least for the Yellow Jackets.

- Kam Craft - father, Mark Craft, was a letterwinner in both basketball (1988-90) and baseball (1987-90) at VMI. He ranks 8th in single-season field goal percentage records, converting 55.9 percent from the field in the 1988-89 season. Mark was a two-time Robert L. Watson '64 Award winner for leading rebounder in both 1989 and 1990. On the baseball side, Mark was drafted in the 10th round of the 1990 MLB Draft by the Oakland Athletics. He played one season in the minor leagues for Southern Oregon A's.

- Akai Fleming - father, Atibah, played basketball for the U.S. Virgin Islands national team before moving to Atlanta to attend Morris Brown College.

- Chas Kelley III - father was a walk-on at the University of Houston for two seasons before he was injured.

- Jaeden Mustaf - son of former Maryland star Jerrod Mustaf, who played for the Terrapins in the late 1980s and was selected 17th overall in the 1990 NBA Draft by the New York Knicks. Three sisters played collegiate basketball as well, including Ashley who played at Maryland Eastern Shore

- Davi Remagen - father played second division basketball in Germany for 2-3 years before injury

- Dylan Thompson - mother, Tina, was a former USC All-American and 9-time WNBA all-star. In 1997, she was the 1st overall pick of the WNBA Draft by the Houston Comets. She served as head women's basketball coach at Virginia from 2018-22. She was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2018.

She is also a two-time Olympic gold medalist, helping USA Basketball to gold medals in the 2004 Athens Olympics and 2008 Beijing Olympics.

Two Jackets on 2025-26 NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 46 draft picks overall. A total of 42 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Two former Georgia Tech players are on NBA rosters for 2025-26 - **Jose Alvarado** in his fifth season with the New Orleans Pelicans, and **Josh Okogie** in his eighth season in the NBA, having recently joining Houston in July. He played his first four years in Minnesota and then three with Phoenix before one year in Charlotte and the 2024-25 season with Toronto.

Baye One, Get One

Cumming off the heels of a standout freshman year, Baye Ndongo developed into one of the ACC's best players once conference play began last season, especially when Tech's rotation became thinned by injury. The 6-9 forward finished the ACC regular season averaging a double-double in conference games (14.4 ppg, 10.2 rpg), one of two ACC players to accomplish that. He also ranked third in field goal percentage (.536), and among the top 5 in offensive rebounds per game and defensive rebounds per game.

Ndongo was the first Tech player to average a double-double in ACC play since 2000-01 (Alvin Jones) and only the third to do so (*see list on page 9*).

Despite battling foul trouble and more intense focus from opposing defenses, Ndongo improved his numbers during his sophomore season, averaging 13.4 points and 8.9 rebounds in all games.

- **Ndongo** also led the Jackets in blocked shots (24) and steals (22) in conference games. The sophomore led Tech in blocked shots (39) and was third in steals (35) in all games.

- Since Tech began competing in the ACC in 1979-80, there have been 14 games where a Yellow Jacket scored 15 points and pulled 15 rebounds, 10 of those came against ACC opponents. **Ndongo** had 3 of those in 2024-25 (15/16 vs. Stanford, 17/15 at Boston College). In that period, **Moses Wright**, the 2021 ACC Player of the Year, had 2.

Pre-Season Storylines for 2025-26

- **110 seasons** - Georgia Tech has played 110 seasons of basketball, having compiled an all-time on-court record of 1,468-1,340 (*22 wins and one loss from the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons were vacated by the NCAA Committee on Infractions*).

- **Tech in the ACC** - Tech has played 46 seasons as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, having won the conference championship in 1985, 1990, 1993 and 2021. Prior to that, Tech competed in the Metro Conference for three seasons from 1975-78, was an independent from 1964-75, and was a member of the Southeastern Conference for 32 years from 1932-64, winning one title in 1938.

- Tech was projected to finish 13th in the ACC standings this season by a vote of the conference's official media panel. Tech has finished ahead of its media projection eight of the last nine seasons after finishing eighth in 2024-25.

- Tech's last two recruiting classes have been ranked 20th (2024 class) and 13th (2025 class).

Cumming, Ga., and 5-11 point guard **Eric Chatfield, Jr.**, from Atlanta also signed scholarship documents to attend Tech.

Fleming and Stores were nominated for the McDonald's All-America team.

Tech's class is ranked No. 13 in the nation, and No. 3 among Atlantic Coast Conference teams in the team rankings compiled by Rivals. It comes on the heels of the Yellow Jackets' 2024 freshman class, which was rated 20th-best in the nation.

Fleming, ranked No. 56 nationally by 247Sports, played the 2024-25 season at Overtime Elite after starring at Osborne High School in Marietta, Ga. As a junior at Osborne, Fleming scored 22 points per game to go with seven rebounds, four assists, two steals and one block per contest.

Considered a three-star big guard/small forward prospect by the 247Sports Composite and the sixth-best player in the state of New York at the time of his commitment last February, Stores Jr., averaged 19.8 points per game as a sophomore and scored 18.2 points per game in 25 games last season at St. Raymond High School for Boys.

Kirouac, a three-star prospect last year and now, originally signed a letter-of-intent to attend Tech last fall while attending Brewster Academy in New Hampshire, but re-classified and decided to attend Overtime Elite in 2024-25.

As a senior at Pace Academy, Chatfield led his team to the AAA state finals, scoring 20 points in the championship game. He averaged 18.6 points, 4.2 assists, 2.5 steals and 2.5 rebounds as a senior.

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech has compiled a 145-81 record at home in 13 seasons in McCamish Pavilion. Tech is 56-55 on its home court in ACC games, 43-32 over the past eight seasons.

Tech set a program record for wins at home (17) in 2016-17, including a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

McCamish Pavilion was essentially brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most impressive features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Prior to the opening of McCamish Pavilion, Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the

first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at State Farm Arena and Gas South Arena.

Tech's NCAA Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in the NCAA Tournament 17 times in its history. Sixteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present, 10 under Bobby Cremins and five under Paul Hewitt.

The most recent was 2021, when the Yellow Jackets won the ACC Championship and earned an automatic bid, then fell 71-60 to Loyola Chicago in the opening round of the Midwest Regional.

That ended an 11-year hiatus from the NCAA Tournament that dated back to 2010, when the Yellow Jackets defeated Oklahoma State in the first round before losing to Ohio State in the round of 32 of the Midwest Regional.

Tech has a record of 23-17 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were Tech's first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-93.

Tech's ACC Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in 45 ACC Tournaments and has a 30-41 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won four championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte), 1993 (Charlotte) and 2021 (Greensboro).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro. Tech also made the finals in 2005 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including three titles), 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010), 2-5 under Brian Gregory, 3-5 under Josh Pastner (won 2021 title) and 1-2 under Damon Stoudamire.

COACHING STAFF

Head Coach Damon Stoudamire • 3rd season at Tech

Well-known throughout the basketball world for his success as a player and coach at the collegiate and professional levels, Damon Stoudamire became the 15th head coach in Georgia Tech men's basketball history on March 14, 2023.

In his first year on The Flats, the former collegiate All-American and NBA standout remade the Tech roster and guided the Yellow Jackets to victories over three top-25 teams and wins over three ACC teams that advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament - Duke, North Carolina and Clemson.

In year two, he led a late-season surge in which the Yellow Jackets finished eighth in the ACC at 10-10, earning their highest regular-season finish, first ACC Tournament win and first post-season berth in four years.

Stoudamire came to Georgia Tech after most recently serving as an assistant coach of the Boston Celtics, who sat atop the NBA's Atlantic Division standings at the time of his hiring at Tech. He was with the Celtics for nearly two seasons (2021-22 and 2022-23), after a successful five-season stint as the head coach at Pacific (2016-21). At Pacific, he was named West Coast Conference Coach of the Year in 2020 after leading the Tigers to a 23-10 record in 2019-20, good for the program's best winning percentage (.697) in 15 years, and a third-place finish in the powerful WCC (behind only national powers Gonzaga and St. Mary's). He also was honored with the Ben Jobe Award, given annually to the nation's top minority head coach.

Stoudamire established himself as one of his generation's premier players when he was a three-time all-conference performer, the 1995 Pac 10 co-Player of the Year and a consensus first-team All-American at Arizona, where he played four seasons from 1991-95. After helping lead the Wildcats to the Final Four as a junior in 1994, he capped his collegiate career by averaging 22.8 points per game, en route to the co-conference Player of the Year and consensus first-team All-America recognition in 1995.

At the conclusion of his Arizona career, Stoudamire was the Wildcats' all-time leader in 3-pointers made (272) and ranked second in points (1,849) and fourth in assists (663). He was the only player in Arizona history with two 40-point games.

His amateur career also included helping lead the United States to the gold medal in the 1993 World University Games (where he led the team in assists and steals despite being the youngest player on the roster) and the bronze at the 1994 Goodwill Games.

Stoudamire was selected by the Toronto Raptors with the seventh overall pick in the 1995 NBA Draft and averaged 13.4 points and 6.1 assists per game over the course of a 13-year professional playing career that included stints with the Raptors (1995-98), Portland Trail Blazers (1998-05), Memphis Grizzlies (2005-08) and San Antonio Spurs (2008). He was named the 1996 NBA Rookie of the Year after averaging 19 points and 9.3 assists per game in his first NBA campaign.

Following the conclusion of his NBA playing career in 2008, Stoudamire immediately embarked on his coaching career, beginning as director of player development at Rice in 2008-09. He then went on to serve as an assistant coach with the Memphis Grizzlies for two seasons (2009-11), before getting back into the college game with stints as an assistant at Memphis (2011-13), his alma mater Arizona (2013-15) and again at Memphis (2015-16).

After helping lead Memphis and Arizona to four conference championships (two Conference USA titles at Memphis, two Pac-12 crowns at Arizona) and four NCAA Tournament berths (including back-to-back Elite Eight appearances at Arizona) in six seasons, Stoudamire was hired as the head coach at Pacific in 2016. He inherited a program coming off an 8-20 campaign and built it into a WCC contender, highlighted by the 23-10 campaign in 2019-20. The Tigers' 11-5 conference record that season remains their most-ever wins in WCC play.

After posting a 9-9 overall record during the Covid-shortened 2020-21 season, Stoudamire returned to the NBA as an assistant coach for the Celtics. In his first season in Boston, he helped lead the Celtics to the 2022 NBA Finals. The Celtics stood in first place in the Atlantic Division and in second both in the Eastern Conference and in the NBA's overall league standings at the time he took the Tech position. With Boston, he coached a pair of metro-Atlanta natives in Malcolm Brogdon (Norcross, Ga.) and Jaylen Brown (Alpharetta, Ga.).

A Portland, Ore. native, Stoudamire, 51, graduated from Woodrow Wilson High School in 1991 and earned his bachelor's degree from Arizona in 2008. He has a daughter, Kemeco, and two sons, Damon and Brandon.

Karl Hobbs, who directed George Washington to three straight NCAA Tournament appearances as a head coach, captured two national titles as an assistant at Connecticut and helped Rutgers to three post-season appearances in his most recent stop, joined the Georgia Tech men's basketball staff as associate head coach in April of 2023.

Hobbs has 36 seasons of Division I coaching experience and 21 post-season appearances on his resume, and comes to The Flats following seven seasons as associate head coach at Rutgers. He helped guide the Scarlet Knights to post-season appearances each of the past three seasons, including back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2021 and 2022, marking the first time RU made the big dance in consecutive seasons since 1976. Hobbs helped Rutgers snap a 30-year NCAA Tournament drought when the Scarlet Knights earned a berth in the 2021 the NCAA Tournament, their first appearance since 1991.

GREG GARY

Assistant Coach • 2nd season at Tech

A veteran of 30 years as a coach on the Division I level, including seven years as a head coach, Greg Gary joined the Georgia Tech men's basketball staff in June of 2024 as a quality control analyst.

Gary comes to The Flats after five seasons as the head coach at Mercer University in Macon, Ga., where the Bears won 81 games, and nine players earned all-Southern Conference honors during his tenure. He has made 17 postseason appearances as a college assistant and player, reaching the NCAA Tournament nine times.

PERSHIN WILLIAMS

Assistant Coach • 3rd season at Tech

A former graduate assistant with the Georgia Tech men's basketball program, Pershin Williams joined the Yellow Jackets' men's basketball staff as assistant coach in April of 2023 following four seasons on the bench at Kennesaw State.

Now with 12 years of full-time college coaching experience, Williams helped head coach Amir Abdur-Rahim build the KSU program into a championship team in the Atlantic Sun Conference and an NCAA Tournament team in 2023. KSU went 26-9 last season, 15-3 in the A-Sun, and three Owls earned all-conference recognition after being picked to finish eighth in the pre-season conference poll.

NATE BABCOCK

Assistant Coach • 3rd season at Tech

After two seasons as an assistant coach with the Grand Rapids Gold in the G League, Nate Babcock joined the Georgia Tech men's basketball staff as quality control coach in June of 2023. He returns to the collegiate ranks after nine years on the professional level.

Prior to his time in Grand Rapids, the G League affiliate of the Denver Nuggets, Babcock spent seven years in various support roles in the NBA and G League. He joined the Gold after three years as the special assistant to the head coach with the Atlanta Hawks organization where he assisted with player development as well as opponent scouting and game preparation.

BONZI WELLS

Assistant Coach • 3rd season at Tech

A 12-year veteran of professional basketball, including 10 in the National Basketball Association, Bonzi Wells joined the Georgia Tech men's basketball staff as an assistant coach in August of 2023. Wells will concentrate his efforts on player development and on-court coaching.

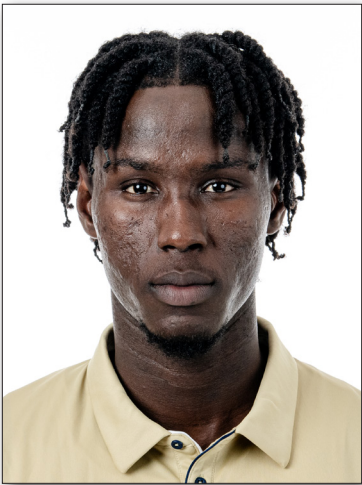

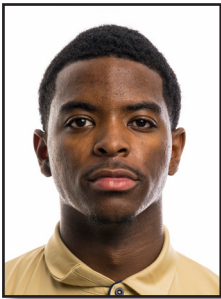

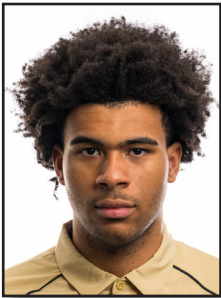
