#### NEED TO KNOW

- Georgia Southern men's basketball hits the road on Tuesday, taking on in-state rival Georgia Tech at the McCamish Pavillion. The Yellow Jackets hold the all-time series over the Eagles, 5-2, with the Eagles last victory coming on the road in Atlanta in 1958. The Eagles won the first two meetings over the Yellow Jackets in '53 and '58, before dropping five-straight.
- Graduate guard **Spudd Webb** had another takeover moment for the Eagles on Friday, after scoring just four points in the first half and the Eagles holding a one-point lead, Webb fired off a perfect second half, finishing 6-for-6 from the field and 4-for-4 from the line to tally a 16-point effort. The Hartwell, Georgia, native posted his second 20-point contest, adding three rebounds, tying a season-high with six assists, one blocked shot, and setting a new career-high with five steals.
- Averaging 93.8 points per game, the Eagles have one of the most explosive offenses in the Sun Belt Conference, posting the highest points per game average. Georgia Southern is the only team in the Sun Belt scoring 90-plus points a game, including three-straight contets hitting that mark, averaging six points more than Troy (87.8 ppg). On Friday, the Eagles recorded 98 points, the most under head coach **Charlie**

#### Henry

- Graduate guard, **Tyren Moore**, has produced 1,152 career points in his four seasons in Division I. Entering Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech, Moore sits with 914 points in a Georgia Southern uniform. Moore looks to become the 47th Eagle all-time to collect 1,000 points with Georgia Southern.
- **Tsvet Sotirov** and **Shainen Carter** registered their first career starts in an Eagles' uniform. Sotirov was one of six Eagles with double-digits in the scoring department and grabbed nine boards. Carter posted six points, added two rebounds, and blocked one shot. **Dwayne Williams**Jr. recorded a career day on the court, scoring 17 points on 60 percent shooting and a perfect 4-for-4 from the stripe. He added five boards and tallied one steal.

### **GAME NOTES**

#### Here Comes The Road Stretch

• Georgia Southern men's basketball opens a stretch of road and neutral site games on Tuesday, traveling to Atlanta, Georgia to face off against Georgia Tech. The Eagles continue a short ACC stretch, heading to Tallahassee, Florida, to take on the Seminoles of Florida State. From Tallahassee, Georgia Southern will head to Jacksonville to face off against Youngstown State and UTSA at the Jacksonville Classic, hosted by Edward Waters University. The Blue and White will not return to the friendly confines of the Jack and Ruth Ann Hill Convocation Center until November 29. hosting Houston Christian at 3 p.m.

### **Everybody Eats**

• Entering play on Tuesday, Georgia Southern men's basketball ranks inside the top-35 for points per game, scoring 93.8 per contest. Additionally, the Eagles have scored 90-plus points in their last three contests, including 98 against Johnson C. Smith on Friday at The Hill. The 98-point performance was the most points scored under head coach **Charlie Henry**. On the court, four Eagles are averaging double figures on the season through four games. **Spudd Webb** (19.5), **Nakavieon White** (14.5), **Alden Applewhite** (14.0), and **Tyren Moore** (13.0) all sit with 10-plus points per game.

### Get to the Line and Knock 'Em Down

• After shooting just 60 percent from the free throw line in the Eagles season opener against East Carolina, Georgia Southern has made it a point of emphasis during the week to focus on converting at the charity stripe. In Friday's victory over Johnson C. Smith, the Eagles converted on 77.3 percent of their attempts (17-22), bringing the season tally to 75-for-109 (.688). With 75 made free throws, the Eagles sit third in the league in made attempts, behind Texas State (86) and Arkansas State (84).

### **Go Ahead Then Spudd**

• Graduate gurad **Spudd Webb** once again showed why his length and tenacity pushes the Eagles energy levels through the roof. On top of stealing a possesion before half by diving on the floor to get a loose ball and draw a foul, as well as saving a possesion with a tipped rebound, Webb scored 16 of his 20 points in the second half. His second half effort included a perfect 6-for-6 from the field, 4-for-4 from the stripe, one rebound, six assists, one blocked shot, and two steals.

### Pressure Causes Mistakes

• Georgia Southern's defense continued to force the issue on Friday at the Jack and Ruth Ann Hill Convocation Center, forcing Johnson C. Smith into 18 turnovers and collecting 9 steals. Through four games, the Eagles have forced their opponents into 15.5 turnovers per game and are averaging 10.0 steals per game. The 62 turnovers forced are third in the Sun Belt and the steals are tied for second with Southern Miss (40) and trailing Troy (50).

### The Bosnian Big Man

• Freshman forward **Pavel Ridesic** makes history for the Eagles this season, after signing with Georgia Southern out of Western Reserve Academy. The 6-foot-8, 230 pound big man, hails from Trebinje, Bosnia and Herzegovina, becoming the first player from Bosnia in Georgia Southern Men's Basketball history. Additionally, Ridesic is one of less than 10 active Division I college basketball players to hail from the country. Ridesic also competed for his home country at the FIBA U18 level.

### Welcome (Back) to Statesboro Tyren Moore

• Graduate guard **Tyren Moore** returns to Statesboro for his final season in 2025-26, following a one-year stint with the UAB Blazers. While in Birmingham, Moore appeared in 37 games, making three starts, averaging 6.4 points, 1.9 assists, and 1.2 rebounds. The Louisville, Kentucky, native surpassed 1,000 career points against UTSA while with the Blazers, adding a season best 22-points in 34 minutes of action against Arkansas State. During the 2023-24 season, Moore started 29 games for the Eagles, leading in scoring (17.0), assists (3.0), and three-point percentage (.406). He also led the roster in field goals, field goal attempts, three-pointers, three-point attempts, assists, steals, and points, earning his way onto the All-Sun Belt Second Team at the end of the season. Moore was tabbed to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference First Team to

begin the new campaign and will look to anchor a young but diverse roster in 2025-26.

### **Preseason Awards and Order of Finish**

•The Sun Belt Conference announced its 2025-26 Preseason All-Conference teams, in addition to the preseason poll earlier this month, as two Eagles landed on their respected teams for the first time since 2020. Graduate **Tyren Moore** and redshirt-senior **Nakavieon White** became the first duo to earn preseason accolades for the Eagles since *Elijah McGadden* and *Zack Bryant* were named to the second and third teams respectively. Moore earns the first team preseason honor as the Louisville, Kentucky, native returns to Statesboro to play for the Eagles once again, while White claimed a thrid team nomination, after averaging 10.2 points, 3.4 rebounds, and 2.4 assists for the Eagles during the 2024-25. Additionally, the 2025-26 Preseason Poll was released, as voted on by the coaches, selecting Georgia Southern to finish 10th this season.

### Jacksonville Classic on the Horizon

• Georgia Southern men's basketball will take part in the Jacksonville Classic MTE, hosted at the Adams-Jenkins Community Sports & Music Complex of Edward Waters from November 23-25. The 10-team field features multiple mid-major programs and is the largest MTE on the East Coast. The 2025 Jacksonville Classic field includes: Abilene Christian (WAC), Delaware (CUSA), Southern Illinois (MVC), UAB (AAC), UNC Greensboro (Southern Conference), UTEP (CUSA), UTSA (AAC), William & Mary (CAA), Youngstown State (Horizon), and Georgia Southern. The Eagles will face off against Youngstown State and UTSA on Monday and Tuesday of that week. It marks just the second meeting between Youngstown State and GS, while Tuesday's contest is the first between the Roadrunners and Eagles. The Jacksonville Classic has quickly established itself as a staple of the college basketball schedule, delivering competitive matchups, national exposure, and a boost to the local community. With programs from across the country converging in Jacksonville, fans can expect three days of high-energy basketball and memorable moments from the largest college basketball event on the East Coast.

### **New Faces on the Coaching Staff**

• Head coach **Charlie Henry** promoted two of his coaches and hired a new member of the staff before the 2025-26 campaign, as **Kente' Hart** was elevated to Associate Head Coach, while **George Neilson** was promoted to Assistant Coach. Taking over Neilson's previous role as the Director of Basketball Operations is **Will Arnold**, who spent the previous two seasons as a graduate assistant under Bryan Hodgson at Arkansas State and was a part of the team's 2024-25 Sun Belt regular season championship. While in Jonesboro, Arnold assisted in skill development and participated in offensive and defensive scouting, among other duties. The Eagles new DOBO also spent time at Alabama as a student manager where he prepared live analytics and statistics and helped assist in player workouts and practices.

## Year Two of "The Hill"

• On December 7, 2024, Georgia Southern opened the brand new Jack and Ruth Ann Hill Convocation Center on the campus of Georgia Southern University. The 5,500 seat arena is the new home of the Eagles men's and women's basketball teams, retiring Hanner Fieldhouse as basketball's primary arena. In February 2021, the University System of Georgia approved plans for the new convocation center to be dedicated to former Georgia State senator and alumnus Jack Hill, along with his wife, Ruth Ann, in recognition for his service to committees that help expand the university's funding for facilities. In May 2022, construction broke ground on a 95,000 square feet of land located on the south-side of the university campus along Veterans Memorial Parkway, serving as the centerpiece of the "South Campus" expansion. Georgia Southern men's basketball defeated North Florida in overtime, 93-91, to secure its first victory in the new area last season.

## The Lone Duo... or Trio

• Two Eagles, well technically three, return to the court for Georgia Southern this season, as **Dwayne Williams Jr.** and **Nakavieon White** are back in Statesboro. The third "returner" on the roster is **Tyren Moore**, who spent the 2024-25 season in Birmingham with UAB, after spending the previous two seasons in Statesboro with the Eagles. Williams Jr. did not see action last season, taking a redshirt year on the court, while White was one of four players to appear in all 33 games for the Eagles, starting 14 and averaging 10.2 points per game, 3.4 rebounds, and 2.4 assists. He led the team with 80 assists and had six games with five or more dimes and was third on the team with 340 points. A familiar face returns to Statesboro this season, reuniting with head coach **Charlie Henry** after spending a year at UAB. Moore has appeared in 65 total games for the Eagles, adding 40 starts. He has tallied 1,725 minutes of action, posting 26.5 points per game and shooting at a .426 clip.
