TOP STORYLINES

- One of the most intriguing matchups of the 2025 Bowl Season comes in the Pop-Tarts Bowl, where No. 22 Georgia Tech will square off with No. 12 BYU.
- In what has become one of college football's premier bowl games, the 2025 Pop-Tarts Bowl is one of only three non-College Football Playoff postseason matchups this season that pits two teams in the CFP's final top-25 rankings.
- Georgia Tech is making its 48th all-time bowl appearance, which are the 14th-most in college football history and the third-most by a current member of the Atlantic Coast Conference (behind only Clemson's 52 and Florida State's 49).
- The bowl berth is the Yellow Jackets' third in three full seasons under head coach Brent Key. The Jackets are making a third-straight bowl appearance for the first time since 2012-14.
- Georgia Tech is tied for 13th all-time with 26 bowl/College Football Playoff victories and are 12th in NCAA Division I FBS history with a .533 postseason winning percentage (26-21 - min. 15 victories).
- Tech is making its third appearance in what is now known as the Pop-Tarts Bowl. The Jackets are 2-0 in the bowl, having defeated West Virginia, 35-30, in 1997 when it was known as the Carquest Bowl in Miami Gardens, Fla. (a game that Key played in as a redshirt freshman offensive guard), and routed Syracuse, 51-14, when it was known as the Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando.
- The Pop-Tarts Bowl will be the Georgia Tech's third all-time bowl appearance in the stadium now known as Camping World Stadium. Tech defeated Nebraska, 45-21, in the Florida Citrus Bowl on Jan. 1, 1991, to clinch the 1990 national championship at the stadium, which was then called the Florida Citrus Bowl.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech is one of only two power-conference teams, and one of just three teams overall (including Texas Tech and USF), that ranked among the top 30 nationally in all five major offensive statistical categories in the regular season — total offense (12th - 466.3 ypg), passing efficiency (18th - 156.09), rushing (19th - 203.0 ypg), scoring (25th - 33.1 ppg) and passing (29th - 263.3 ypg).

r-Sr. QB **Haynes King** ranked second among power-conference players, and third nationally overall, in total offense during the regular season with 329.0 yards per game.

King is only the fourth ACC Player of the Year in Georgia Tech history, joining QB Joe Hamilton (1999), WR Calvin Johnson (2006) and WR Jonathan Dwyer (2008). Hamilton and Johnson both went on to be inducted in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Georgia Tech won nine regular-season games for only the 16th time in its 133-season football history (1917, 1928, 1942, 1947, 1951, 1952, 1956, 1966, 1990, 1998, 2000, 2006, 2008, 2009, 2014 and 2025).

r-Sr. DL **Jordan van den Berg's** 11 tackles for loss this season are the most in the nation among power-conference defensive tackles and the second-most among all DTs (according to *sports-reference.com*).

Brent Key has led Georgia Tech to 23 wins since taking the reins at his alma mater on a full-time basis in 2023. With one game still to play in his third full season at the helm, Key's 23 victories are already tied for the second-most by a coach in his first three full seasons at Georgia Tech. The only three coaches that won as many games as Key already has in their first three full seasons at Tech are all in the College Football Hall of Fame — Paul Johnson (25 - 2008-10), Bobby Dodd (23 - 1945-47) and William Alexander (23 - 1920-22).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- give the Yellow Jackets a final record of 10-3;
- clinch the 10th 10-win season in the program's 133-season history (joining 1928, 1947, 1951, 1952, 1956, 1990, 1998, 2009 and 2014);
- all but assure the Jackets of finishing in the top 25 for the first time since 2014;
- be its eighth win over a nationally ranked opponent in head coach **Brent Key's** 46 games as head coach;
- be its 27th bowl win all-time, which would move it into a tie for 11th or 12th in college football history (depending on Clemson's result versus Penn State in the Pinstripe Bowl);
- move it to 27-21 in bowl games all-time (.563), the 12th-highest winning percentage in bowl/College Football Playoff games in NCAA Division I FBS history;
- up it to 2-3 all-time against BYU;
- be its third-straight win over a Big 12 opponent;
- up it to 18-9 all-time against current members of the Big 12;
- up it to 3-0 all-time in the game now known as the Pop-Tarts Bowl;
- secure the first trophy that doubles as a functioning toaster in school and ACC history;
- spur the "Biggest Sacrifice Ever," according to Pop-Tarts Bowl officials, as an entire three-Pop-Tart team of edible mascots will be toasted and enjoyed by the winning team following the conclusion of the game.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- give the Yellow Jackets a final record of 9-4, their best since 2016;
- be its fourth defeat in five games to close the season after an 8-0 start.



GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY



Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, is in his third full season as the head coach at his alma mater. He took over as the program's 21st head coach on a permanent basis in 2023, after stepping into the role as interim head coach during the 2022 campaign.

After winning just 10 of its previous 38 games, Georgia Tech has won 27-of-46 games since Key took the reins as interim head coach five games into the 2022 season. His 27-19 mark includes a gaudy 7-1 mark against nationally ranked Atlantic Coast Conference opponents.

In Key's three seasons as permanent head coach (2023-25):

- The Yellow Jackets have won 23 games, which are tied for the second-most wins ever by a Georgia Tech head coach in his first three full seasons at the helm. The only other head coaches that have won as many as 23 games in their first three full seasons at Tech – Paul Johnson (27 – 2009-11), Bobby Dodd (23 – 1945-47) and William Alexander (23 – 1920-22) – are all enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.
- The Jackets have earned fourth- (2023), fourth- (2024) and second-place (2025) finishes in the ACC, making Tech the only team that has finished fourth or better in the ACC each of the last three seasons.

Off the field, the Yellow Jackets have also excelled in the classroom under Key's watch. For the first time in its history, Tech football has recorded four-straight semesters with a team grade point average of 3.0 or higher – 3.02 in spring 2024, 3.00 in fall 2024 (the program's first-ever fall semester with a 3.0 GPA), 3.03 in spring 2025 and an ultra-impressive, program-record 3.17 in fall 2025.

Coinciding with their record-setting semester in the classroom, the Yellow Jackets have also had a historic season on the field in 2025. Most notably, Georgia Tech's nine-win regular season in 2025 is its first since 2014 and only the 16th in the program's 133-season history. The 9-3 regular-season record included an 8-0 start, Tech's best since 1966, and the Jackets rising to as high as No. 7 in the national polls, their highest regular-season ranking since 2009.

Led by quarterback Haynes King, the ACC Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year who finished 10th in balloting for the Heisman Trophy, Georgia Tech fielded one of the nation's most explosive offenses in 2025. The Yellow Jackets were one of only three teams — and one of only two from a power conference — that ranked among the top 30 nationally in all five major offensive categories during the 2025 regular season — total offense, scoring, rushing, passing and passing efficiency.

In addition to King being recognized as one of college football's top players, two Jackets earned all-America recognition in 2025 — offensive lineman Keylan Rutledge and place kicker Aidan Birr — which marked the first time since 2009 that Tech had multiple all-Americans in a season. Rutledge, who earned first-team all-America honors in both 2024 and '25, became the first Yellow Jacket to be named all-America in consecutive years since 2011-12 and the first to be a first-team selection in back-to-back years since College and Pro Football Hall of Famer Calvin Johnson in 2005 and 2006.

In all, headlined by four first-team selections, its most since 2009 (King, Rutledge, Birr and defensive lineman Jordan van den Berg), Georgia Tech had nine all-ACC performers in 2025.

The 2024 campaign was highlighted by a pair of wins over top-10 opponents – a 24-21 victory over No. 10 Florida State in the season opener in Dublin, Ireland and a 28-23 home triumph over previously unbeaten and No. 4-ranked Miami (Fla.) in November – as Tech became only the ninth team in ACC history to defeat two top-10 teams in the same regular season. The Yellow Jackets' 7-5 regular-season record was their best since 2018.

A year after fielding one of the nation's most improved offenses, the Jackets had one of college football's most improved defensive units in 2024. Tech's defense surrendered 342.8 total yards and 122.2 rushing yards per game in '24, improvements of 94.3 and 99.1 yards per game over 2023. At the same time, despite a plethora of injuries — including one that cost King two full games and parts of three others — Tech continued to boast one of the nation's top offenses. The Jackets finished in the top 35 nationally in total offense (424.5 yards per game) and also ranked among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (third), fewest turnovers (11th), completion percentage (24th), rushing offense (32nd) and red-zone offense (32nd). On special teams, Tech ranked third nationally with five blocked kicks and, as a team, the Jackets were one of the nation's 25 least-penalized teams.

Ten Yellow Jackets were named all-ACC in 2024, Tech's most all-conference selections since 2014.

In 2023, Key led Tech to its first winning season since 2018, capped by a 30-17 win over UCF in the 2023 Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl in Tampa, Fla., which was the Yellow Jackets' first postseason victory since 2016. The Jackets' 7-6 mark in 2023 included wins over No. 17 Miami (Fla.) and No. 17 North Carolina.

The Yellow Jackets' success in 2023 was highlighted by one of the nation's most prolific offenses. Befitting Key's background as an all-ACC offensive lineman and one of college football's most successful offensive line coaches, the Jackets led the ACC and ranked among the top 15 nationally in rushing offense (203.8 ypg – 12th nationally) and sacks allowed (1.15 pg – 15th) in '23.

However, the offense wasn't the only area where the Jackets reflected their head coach's identity in '23, as they also ranked among the ACC and national leaders in blocked kicks (four – good for first in the ACC and a tie for third nationally), turnovers forced (25 – second in the ACC and ninth nationally) and fewest penalties (5.15 pg – third in the ACC).

Seven different Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC recognition in 2023, highlighted by all-America safety Jaylon King. Additionally, three freshmen – Birr, OL Ethan Mackenny and WR Eric Singleton Jr. – earned freshman all-America honors, putting a spotlight on the Jackets' bright future under Key.

Key took the reins of the program on a full-time basis after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's

highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022, Key served as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach/offensive line coach/run game coordinator for three-plus seasons. In four total seasons at his alma mater prior to taking over as head coach on permanent basis, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. He also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 5 Baylor in the Fiesta Bowl. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 47, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

- Georgia Tech is making its third all-time appearance in the game now known as the Pop-Tarts Bowl.
- The Yellow Jackets are 2-0 in the bowl.
- Georgia Tech defeated West Virginia, 35-30, on Dec. 29, 1997, when the game was known as the Carquest Bowl and played in Miami Gardens, Fla.
- Seven years later, after the game relocated to Orlando, Georgia Tech routed Syracuse, 51-14, in the 2004 Champs Sports Bowl.
- Tech head coach **Brent Key** was the Yellow Jackets' starting right guard as a redshirt freshman in the 1997 Carquest Bowl win over WVU. It was the first of four-straight bowl games that Key would start for the Jackets (1997 Carquest Bowl, 1999 Gator Bowl, 2000 Gator Bowl, 2000 Chick-fil-A Bowl).

GEORGIA TECH AT CAMPING WORLD STADIUM

- Georgia Tech is playing for the third time in the venue now known as Camping World Stadium.
- Each of the Yellow Jackets' two previous appearances at the stadium came when it was known as the Florida Citrus Bowl.
- Most notably, Georgia Tech sealed the 1990 national championship — its fourth national title — with a 45-21 rout over Nebraska in the 1991 Florida Citrus Bowl (Jan. 1, 1991). The victory capped the Yellow Jackets' 11-0-1 campaign and national title in the UPI coaches' poll (Colorado was voted national champion in the AP media poll).
- Georgia Tech returned to the Florida Citrus Bowl on Dec. 21, 2004, when they romped over Syracuse, 51-14, in the 2004 Champs Sports Bowl.

- The Yellow Jackets' No. 7 national ranking earlier this season was their highest since they were ranked No. 7 in the final coaches poll of 2014 and their highest regular-season ranking since they were seventh in both polls for three weeks in 2009.

- Prior to Week 4 of this season, Georgia Tech had not been in the top 25 of both the AP and coaches polls in the same week since Week 4 of 2015.

- Last season, Georgia Tech was nationally ranked for the first time since '15, when it came in at No. 23 in the AP Top 25 poll on Sept. 3. The Jackets' ranking lasted only one week, as they lost 31-28 at Syracuse on Sept. 7 and never re-entered the top 25 in 2024.

- Tech has been ranked in the AP poll 320 times since the poll's inception in 1936 (the poll listed 20 teams from 1936-88, except for from 1961-67, when only 10 teams were ranked; it began ranking 25 teams in 1989).

- With 944 rushing yards in 2024 following his 1,059-yard campaign in 2023, Haynes became the first Georgia Tech player to rush for at least 900 yards in consecutive seasons since QB TaQuon Marshall in 2017 and 2018.

- Haynes is the only Georgia Tech running back to rush for at least 900 yards in consecutive seasons since Jonathan Dwyer in 2008 and 2009.

- Haynes, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the 2023 offseason, ran for 1,059 yards in his first season at the position in '23. He became Georgia Tech's first 1,000-yard rusher since QB TaQuon Marshall (1,146 yds.) and RB KirVonte Benson (1,053 yds.) both reached the 1,000-yard plateau in 2017.

- Haynes' 1,059 rushing yards in 2023 were the 15th-most in Georgia Tech single-season history.

- Georgia Tech's running backs room features a deep, talented group behind Haynes.

- Hosley joined the Yellow Jackets in 2025 after being named 2024 Ivy League Player of the Year at Penn.

- In his first season at Georgia Tech, Hosley ranks second on the team with 625 rushing yards (first among RBs).

- Hosley recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season on Nov. 15 at Boston College (107 yards and a TD on 15 carries - 7.1 avg.).

- Hosley's 154 yards from scrimmage at BC were his most as a Yellow Jacket.

- Hosley has averaged at least 10 yards per rush four times in his 12 games as a Yellow Jacket — 11.1 vs. Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), 11.8 vs. Temple (Sept. 20), 11.7 vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 11) and 10.1 vs. Syracuse (Oct. 25).

- Hosley had a season-high 129 rushing yards against Virginia Tech.

- Hosley ran for 59 yards on just five carries and had another two-touchdown game (34 and 2 yards) against Temple.

- Including his three 100-yard games in his first 12 appearances as a Yellow Jacket, Hosley has rushed for 100 yards 13 times in his collegiate career. He eclipsed the 100-yard mark 10 times in two seasons at Penn (2023-24).

- Hosley totaled 2,250 yards from scrimmage (1,915 rushing, 335 receiving) and 17 touchdowns (16 rushing, one receiving) in two seasons at Penn.

- In 2024, Hosley ran for 1,192 yards and led the Ivy League in rushing yards, carries (191), rushing touchdowns (9), yards per rush (6.2) and yards per game (119.2).

- Hosley averaged 100.8 rushing yards per game and 6.1 yards per carry over 19 games with the Quakers.

- In his three collegiate seasons combined (2023-24 at Penn, 2025 at Georgia Tech), Hosley has compiled a total of 2,543 rushing yards, 2,985 yards from scrimmage (including 442 receiving yards) and 24 touchdowns (23 rushing, one receiving).

- Hosley's 6.39 yards per carry over his three collegiate seasons ranks seventh among all active FBS players (regardless of how many total seasons played at the FBS level).

- The 47-yard run was nearly six times longer than his previous career rushing total of 8 yards.

- True Fr. **J.P. Powell** nearly scored his second-career TD against Temple too, but came up just short of paydirt on his 61-yard run on the final play of the game.

- Powell's 61-yard run against Temple is Georgia Tech's longest rush of the season.

- Georgia Tech's embarrassment of riches on the offensive side of the ball extends to wide receiver, led by r-Sr. **Malik Rutherford**, r-Sr. **Eric Rivers** and So. **Isiah Canonion**.
- Rutherford, Rivers and Canon have combined for 103 receptions, 1,454 yards and seven touchdowns this season.
- On Nov. 15 at Boston College, Rutherford (121 yards and a TD on five receptions) and Rivers (119 yards on seven catches) became the first Georgia Tech duo in 20 years and the seventh overall to have 100 receiving yards apiece in a single game.

- Rivers has racked up 704 all-purpose yards — 556 receiving, 49 rushing and 99 on punt returns — in his one and only regular season as a Yellow Jacket (58.7 ypg).

- Rivers' eight receptions at Wake Forest (Sept. 20) were his most as a Yellow Jacket.
- Rivers' 14-yard touchdown reception at Wake Forest was his first at Georgia Tech.
- Rivers, a transfer from Florida International, was a third-team *Associated Press* All-American at FIU last season, when he caught 62 passes for 1,162 yards (18.9 avg.) and 12 touchdowns.
- This season, Rivers was named second-team preseason all-America by *The Sporting News* and *Phil Steele College Football Preview*.
- So. **Isiah Canion** is Georgia Tech's second-leading receiver with 480 yards this season.
- After hauling in two touchdowns versus Pitt (Nov. 22), Canion leads the team with four touchdowns receptions.
- Canion also ranks second on the team with 14.5 yards per reception (min. 12 receptions) and ranks third on the squad with 33 catches.
- In addition to the two touchdowns, Canion had four total catches for 67 yards against Pitt. The four receptions tied the second-highest total of his career, while the 67 yards were the second-most of his career.
- Canion set a career high with 70 receiving yards at Wake Forest (Sept. 27).
- Canion shattered his previous career high with five receptions on Sept. 13 against Clemson (prev.: two - three times).
- Canion hauled in the second touchdown catch of his career, a 37-yarder from Haynes King, in the second quarter of Georgia Tech's win over Temple (Sept. 20).
- Canion's first TD came on an 11-yard catch in the first quarter of Tech's win over Gardner-Webb.

r-Sr. **Brett Seither**'s four receptions and 73 receiving yards at NC State (Nov. 1) were both his most in 50 career collegiate games, which includes four seasons at Georgia (2019-22) and three at Georgia Tech (2023-25).

Seither's previous career highs were set more than two years ago, when he had two receptions for 40 yards vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28, 2023.

Seither's 26-yard catch against Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6) was his first in 651 days, as he missed the entire 2024 season after sustaining a season-ending knee injury during fall camp.

In 2023, Seither was one of QB **Haynes King's** favorite red zone targets, finishing with four touchdown receptions among his seven total catches for 101 yards.

r-Sr. **J.T. Byrne** has made a position-high seven starts this season.

Byrne's 2-yard touchdown reception at NC State (Nov. 1) was the first TD of his 35-game collegiate career (Oregon State – 2021-22, Cal – 2023-24, Georgia Tech – 2025).

Byrne delivered the key block from an H-back alignment on King's game-winning, 45-yard touchdown run with 1:07 to go in the Yellow Jackets' 27-20 season-opening win at Colorado (Aug. 29).

Byrne hauled in a career-long 21-yard reception at Duke (Oct. 18), which set up go-ahead field goal that gave Tech a 13-10 lead in the fourth quarter.

OFFENSE

- The Yellow Jackets' tight ends room is not short on experience, as Seither, Beetham, Byrne and Harpring have combined to play in 128 games over 20 collegiate seasons.

- Seither and Beetham also bring championship experience to the Jackets' locker room, as they have both won national titles — Seither in 2021 and 2022 at Georgia and Beetham in 2023 at Michigan.

- Through the first seven games of the season, Georgia Tech had the same five starters on its offensive line all season — r-So. LT **Ethan Mackenny**, r-Sr. LG **Joe Fusile**, So. C **Harrison Moore**, Sr. RG **Keylan Rutledge** and r-Jr. LT **Malachi Carney**.

- Going into its Oct. 25 game vs. Syracuse, Georgia Tech was one of only 16 teams in the nation whose starting five offensive linemen had remained intact throughout the season (Air Force, Arkansas, Auburn, Duke, Iowa, Kansas, Kennesaw State, Kentucky, Old Dominion, Oregon, San Diego State, Tennessee, Texas A&M, Texas Tech and UAB were the others).

- However, Moore missed the Syracuse game due to injury, snapping Georgia Tech's string of seven-straight games with the same starting offensive line.

- Leading the way for the Yellow Jackets up front is Sr. RG **Keylan Rutledge**, who is widely regarded as one of the nation's top offensive linemen.

- Rutledge has been named all-America by four of the five organizations that are used to determine the NCAA's consensus all-America team.

- Rutledge is only the third Lombardi Award semifinalist in Georgia Tech history and the first Yellow Jacket to earn the distinction since DL Coleman Rudolph in 1992. DL Rock Perdoni was a finalist for the first-ever Lombardi Award in 1970.

- Rutledge was also named the winner of the ACC's 2025 Brian Piccolo Award, which is given to the ACC's most courageous player.

- One the ACC's most prestigious individual recognitions, Rutledge won the Piccolo Award due to overcoming very serious injuries sustained in an automobile accident in December 2023 to become one of college football's top offensive linemen over the last two seasons.

- Rutledge has allowed no sacks and just three QB hurries in 801 snaps this season, according to *Pro Football Focus*.

- Among guards that have played at least 80% of his teams snaps this season, Rutledge ranks among the nation's top 10 guards overall (fifth), in run blocking (sixth) and in pass blocking (10th) according to PFF.

- Rutledge was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his career after helping the Yellow Jackets amass 628 yards of offense at Boston College (Nov. 15).

- Earlier this season, Rutledge was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 147 yards and total 358 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 24-21 win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

- An image of Rutledge with a bloody nose during the Clemson game, personifying his grit and toughness, went viral.

- Rutledge also earned first-team all-America honors from *Sports Info Solutions* as a junior in 2024.

- Rutledge is the first Georgia Tech student-athlete to be named first-team all-America in consecutive years since College and Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Calvin Johnson in 2005 and 2006.

- Mackenny picked up his first ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week Award for his performance Tech's win over Syracuse (Oct. 25).

- Mackenny was especially impressive protecting QB Haynes King's blindside as a pass blocker against Syracuse, as he did not allow a quarterback sack, hit, hurry or pressure, en route to a gaudy 87.0 pass-blocking grade from PFF.

**DEFENSE****TEAM**

- Georgia Tech's defense is under the direction of first-year coordinator **Blake Gideon**.

- Gideon's first season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets' defense can be by three distinct segments:

First Eight Games

In its first eight games under Gideon, Georgia Tech's defense allowed 24 points or less in regulation of each game. It was the Yellow Jackets' first eight-game, same-season stretch of surrendering 24 points or less in regulation since they allowed 24 points or less in each of their first eight games of the 2008 season.

- The Jackets also allowed 24 points or less in regulation of eight-straight victories for the first time since 1966.

Next Two-and-a-Half Games

The streak of eight-straight games allowing 24 points or less in regulation came to an end with a 48-36 loss at NC State on Nov. 1, followed by a 36-34 win at Boston College on Nov. 15 and a 42-28 defeat to Pitt on Nov. 22.

Tech's defense have turned a corner in the final two-and-a-half quarters against Pitt. After Pitt racked up 240 yards and scored 28 points on its first four possessions of the game, the Jackets limited the Panthers to just 172 yards and seven points over their final eight offensive series (Pitt's remaining seven points came on an interception return for a touchdown).

Georgia Tech also had a breakthrough in terms of getting to the quarterback against Pitt. The Jackets' six sacks against Pitt matched a season high (prev.: 6 vs. Gardner-Webb - Sept. 6).

Last One-and-a-Half Games

Georgia Tech's defensive turnaround in the second half of its game against Pitt carried over into its regular-season finale against No. 4 Georgia.

After allowing 40.7 points and 510.7 yards per game in its previous three games, Georgia Tech limited Georgia's offense — which was ranked 29th nationally in total offense going into the game — to less than half of the Bulldogs' season scoring (33.7) average and 170 yards below their yardage average (430.3 ypg).

The Yellow Jackets' defense was particularly impressive against UGA QB Gunner Stockton. Stockton, who finished seventh in voting for the Heisman Trophy, managed just 70 yards on 11-of-21 passing with an interception and no touchdowns against Tech.

Tech's eight combined sacks against Pitt (6) and Georgia (2) account for 40% of the 20 combined sacks that the Yellow Jackets have in 11 games against FBS opponents this season.

- In Georgia Tech's 41-16 win over Syracuse (Oct. 25), Georgia Tech's defense allowed just 118 yards in the first half, which allowed the Yellow Jackets to race out to a 20-3 halftime lead.

- After gaining 41 yards on its first offensive play of the game, Syracuse managed just 77 yards over its final 23 plays of the first half (3.3 avg.).

- in Georgia Tech's 27-18 win over Duke (Oct. 18), the Yellow Jackets held the Blue Devils to less than half their season scoring average going into the game (Duke was averaging 36.5 points per game).

- Georgia Tech also limited Duke to just 68 rushing yards, which is the fewest that the Yellow Jackets have allowed this season (prev.: 117 vs. Gardner-Webb – Sept. 6) and were a season low for the Blue Devils (prev.: 82 vs. Illinois – Sept. 6).

- Tech's defense was especially stout in the second half at Duke. The Yellow Jackets held the Blue Devils to just 66 yards and no points over three series that spanned 14:53 of the second half, which allowed the Jackets' offense to score on four-straight possessions and turn the 10-7 deficit into the 27-10 lead.

- Against Virginia Tech (Oct. 11), Georgia Tech held the Hokies to 0-for-8 on third downs. It marked only the second time in GT history — as well as the first time since 1988 and the first time ever against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent — that the Yellow Jackets did not allow a third-down conversion.

- Georgia Tech also had four sacks against Virginia Tech, the Yellow Jackets' most against an FBS opponent since they had eight at Wake Forest on Sept. 23, 2023.

- Georgia Tech had a breakout performance in terms of negative plays on defense versus Gardner-Webb (Sept. 6), with six sacks and 14 tackles for loss.

- Prior to recording six sacks against Gardner-Webb and Pitt this season, Georgia Tech had not had as many as six sacks in a game in two years, dating back to the Yellow Jackets' eight sacks at Wake Forest on Sept. 23, 2023.

- The Jackets' 14 tackles for loss against Gardner-Webb tied for the eighth-most in Georgia Tech history and, coincidentally, were Tech's most since it also had 14 TFL in its only previous meeting with Gardner-Webb on Oct. 11, 2008.

- Georgia Tech forced a season-high two turnovers in its win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

- With seven takeaways in 12 games, Georgia Tech ranks 130th out of 134 teams nationally in turnovers gained. This comes after finishing 117th nationally in takeaways last season.

- Prior to 2024, Tech had been one of the nation's leaders in takeaways for two-straight seasons. The Yellow Jackets tied for ninth nationally with 25 takeaways in 2023 and tied for seventh with 24 forced turnovers in 2022.

- However, the Yellow Jackets still tend to make the most of takeaways when they get them. Since the beginning of the 2024 season, Georgia Tech has either scored or run out the clock after 14 of their 18 takeaways (eight touchdowns, three field goals and three end of halves/games), including 4-of-7 this season (two touchdowns, two field goals).

- Perhaps Georgia Tech's biggest takeaway of the season was a 95-yard fumble return for a touchdown by r-Sr. DB **Omar Daniels** at eventual ACC champion Duke (Oct. 18).

- Daniels' scoop-and-score was Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season. The Yellow Jackets' hadn't scored defensively since LB **E.J. Lightsey's** 21-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. NC State last season (Nov. 21, 2024).

- The fumble return for a touchdown was Georgia Tech's first since DB Jaylon King scored on a 40-yard return at Miami (Fla.) in 2021.

- Daniels' 95-yard fumble return at Duke was the longest official fumble return in Georgia Tech history (fumble returns became an official NCAA statistic in 1992).

- In the season opener at Colorado, the Yellow Jackets had 10 defenders with at least three tackles and 13 with multiple stops. r-Sr. DB **Omar Daniels** was the Jackets' leading tackler with five.

- Spaulding's 2.0 sacks and TFL against Pitt shattered his career high as a Yellow Jacket (prev.: 0.5 sacks/TFL vs. Temple - Sept. 20).

- Lightsey led Georgia Tech's stellar defensive performance against Georgia with a career-high 12 tackles — which tied the most by a Yellow Jacket in a game this season — against his former team.

- In all, four different Yellow Jackets — Lightsey, Daniels, (10), Spaulding (6) and true freshman DB **Fenix Felton** (6) — matched or surpassed their most single-game tackles at Georgia Tech against UGA.

- With their 12 and 10 stops against No. 4 Georgia, respectively, Lightsey and Daniels became the second Georgia Tech tandem this season to both record double-digit tackles in a game, and both came against ranked opponents.

- On Sept. 13, Powell-Lee and Lightsey led Georgia Tech with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively, in its win over No. 12/11 Clemson.

- Prior to it happening twice this season, Georgia Tech had not had multiple players record double-digit tackles in the same game since Nov. 12, 2022 vs. Miami (Fla.), when LBs Ayinde Eley and Charlie Thomas had 12 and 11 stops, respectively.

- Felton's six stops against Georgia came in his collegiate debut. The true freshman was called to action on defense for the first time in his career when Powell-Lee was forced from the game due to injury in the first quarter.

• r-Sr. nickel back **Jy Gilmore** stuffed the stat sheet with 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, a half sack and two pass breakups at Duke (Oct. 18).

• In addition to making perhaps the biggest defensive play of the season for the Yellow Jackets with his 95-yard fumble return for a score at Duke (Oct. 18), r-Sr. safety **Omar Daniels** also had a career day in Georgia Tech's win over No. 12/11 Clemson (Sept. 13).

• Daniels led Georgia Tech's defensive effort against Clemson with a forced fumble and an interception to go along with seven tackles.

• Daniels' first-quarter forced fumble set up a field goal that gave Tech an early 3-0 lead, while his third-quarter interception in the red zone thwarted a Clemson scoring opportunity.

• Against Clemson, Daniels became only the 13th Georgia Tech player since 2005 with a forced fumble and an interception in the same game. He is the first Yellow Jacket to accomplish the feat since current Los Angeles Chargers DL Kyle Kennard had a FF and INT against South Carolina State on Sept. 9, 2023.

• Daniels is the first Yellow Jacket with a FF and INT in the same game against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since LB Bruce Jordan-Swilling at Virginia on Nov. 4, 2017.

• Powell-Lee is one of five Yellow Jackets in the last 45 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same contest (LB Charlie Thomas – Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, DB LaMiles Brooks – Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia, Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech – Nov. 5, 2022, DL Kyle Kennard vs. South Carolina State - Sept. 9, 2023 and DB Jaylon King vs. Wake Forest - Sept. 23, 2023 and Virginia - Nov. 4, 2023).

- Making Birr's walk-off field goal against Clemson even more impressive was that field goal unit took the field as time was winding down without the benefit of a timeout — known as a "Toro" situation in Georgia Tech football's parlance.

- Tech repeated the challenging Toro situation again at Wake Forest (Sept. 27), as Birr and the field goal unit had to once again take the field with time ticking away and no timeouts, this time needing a 33-yard field goal to send the game to overtime. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 24 of its 38 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-36 overall in turnover margin.

• This season, Georgia Tech bucks the trend, as it is minus-3 in turnover margin in its nine wins and minus-2 in its three losses.

• Last season, Georgia Tech was plus-7 in turnover margin in its seven wins and minus-6 in its six defeats

• Georgia Tech ranks 20th in NCAA Division I FBS history with 772 all-time victories.
