#### THE OPENING TIP

- Duke aims to make it 10 straight wins Sunday when the Blue Devils host Georgia Tech. The Blue Devils are 12-6 overall, 7-0 in league action with their last loss coming Dec. 4 against LSU. The 7-0 start in ACC play is Duke's best under head coach Kara Lawson. The last time a Duke team won more than six conference games to start was in 2012-13 - going 15-0 en route to a 17-1 conference record.
- Duke's six losses are against the current NET No. 5 LSU, No. 2 UCLA, No. 3 South Carolina, No. 21 West Virginia, No. 27 Baylor and No. 69 South Florida. The Blue Devils are led on offense by sophomore Toby Fournier's 17.7 points per game. Taina Mair is having a career year, averaging 11.6 points, 5.1 assists and 5.2 rebounds per game. Ashlon Jackson is dropping 12.5 points per game and a team-best 36 three-pointers. Fournier, Delaney Thomas and Arianna Roberson lead the charge on the glass, averaging 7.2 and 5.7 rebounds per game, respectively. Thomas also contributes 10.4 points per game on a team-high 63 percent shooting, while Roberson adds 8.1 points and 1.1 blocks per game. Fournier is the top rim protector, averaging 2.3 blocks per game.
- Georgia Tech is back in action after having a midweek break. The Yellow Jackets are 8-10 overall and 3-3 in league play after battling to a tough 58-55 win over Clemson. Talayah Walker and Catherine Alben lead the scoring charge, averaging 16.8 and 10.7 points per game. Walker is also the top rebounder at 6.1 boards per contest. Erica Moon and is the playmaker on offense with 3.9 assists per game. Brianna Turnage and Walker pace the defense with 29 and 28 steals, respectively.
- Duke and Georgia Tech play for the 78th time with the Blue Devils holding a commanding 66-11 lead in the series. The Blue Devils are 31-4 at home against the Jackets and last lost to Georgia Tech, 59-46, in 2022.

## LAST TIME OUT NOTES

- Toby Fournier and Ashlon Jackson were the stars of the show for the Blue Devils against Virginia. Fournier finished with 25 points, while Jackson had two late threes and shut down Virginia star Kymora Johnson on the defensive end.
- Fournier scored 15 points in the first quarter - the most by a Duke player in a first quarter in program history and tied for the fourth most in any quarter in Blue Devil lore.
- Defensively, Jackson drew up the primary matchup against Virginia's top scorer, Kymora Johnson, and limited her to 13 points and zero assists when she came in averaging 18.4 and 6.5. It marked the first time Johnson did not record an assist in a game.
- For the second time in three games, Duke trailed entering the fourth quarter and came away with the win. The Blue Devils, after committing seven turnovers in the third quarter, gave it away just twice in the final 10 minutes.

## NOTRE DAME NOTABLES

- Duke's Toby Fournier (20 pts, 5a) and Taina Mair (23 pts, 6a) both finished with at least 20 points and five assists against Notre Dame, marking the first time Duke has had two players with 20 points and five assists in a game since Jan. 11, 2001 when Alana Beard and Georgia Schweitzer had 29/5 and 24/7, respectively. Duke defeated Georgia Tech, 86-83, in that game. Eleven programs have had at least two players register 20-plus points and five-plus rebounds in a game this season.
- Fournier's five assists were a career high for the sophomore forward and the first time since 2019 a Duke forward had at least five assists in a game. The last time was Leonna Odom and Jade Williams both dishing five dimes against Boston College, Dec. 8, 2019.

## INSIDE THE ACC

- Duke and Louisville are the lone teams to remain unbeaten in league play, sporting 7-0 records. Those two teams meet Feb. 5.
- Duke's offense has been steady in conference play, leading the league in assists (18.14), ranking tied for second in assist to turnover ratio (1.30), fourth in scoring offense (76.1) and fifth in both field goal (.452) and three-point field goal percentage (.336).
- Individually, Toby Fournier ranks third in league scoring average at 18.9 points per game. Ashlon Jackson (4.9) and Taina Mair (4.6) are fifth and seventh in assists, respectively. Duke, California and Georgia tech are the three ACC teams to have two players averaging at least 4.0 assists per game in league play.
- Defensively, Duke is one of the best in the ACC. The Blue Devils lead the league in scoring defense (59.1), sit in third in assist to turnover ratio (1.30) and in blocks (5.57) and fourth in opponent field goal percentage (.386) and steals (9.29).

## NUMBERS BEHIND THE WIN STREAK

- The Blue Devils have won nine straight as inch closer to 15 wins. Duke is averaging 78.4 points per game, has a +21.3 scoring margin and has shot 45.8 percent in the nine-game stretch. On the glass, Duke sports a +7.1 rebounding margin.
- Defensively, the Blue Devils are holding opponents to just 57.1 points per game, 38 percent shooting and forcing 17.4 turnovers per game.

## INDIVIDUAL NUMBERS INSIDE THE WIN STREAK

- Toby Fournier has shined for the Blue Devils during the seven-game win streak, averaging 19.8 points and 8.6 rebounds per game.
- Overall, Duke has four players averaging double digits over the eight games. Three players are averaging at least 3.3 assists per game during the win streak, including Riley Nelson, who has upped her assist average from 1.6 to 3.3. Ashlon Jackson is dropping 5.2 dimes per game compared to 3.6 in the unranked November contests.

## BREAKING DOWN THE NET RANKINGS

- The first edition of the NET rankings was released Dec. 1, with Duke coming in at No. 49. As of Jan. 16, Duke was ranked No. 19, with its NET strength of schedule sitting at third. Stanford is 33rd with a NET SOS of 30.
- Duke has faced seven current Q1 teams, going 2-5 in those games. The five non-conference Q1 opponents the Blue Devils face are the most a Power 4 team has played this year. Duke is 5-1 against Q2 teams, 1-0 versus the Q3 and 4-0 against Q4.

## WHAT THE ANALYTICS SAY ABOUT DUKE

- Duke has made great strides in the past month. Defensively, the Blue Devils are excelling when it comes to breaking down the numbers. According to HerHoopStats, Duke is eighth in defensive rating at 72.6.
- Offensively, HerHoopStats has Duke ranked 23rd of 363

teams with a 111.5 offensive rating. The Blue Devils average 100.6 points per 100 possessions overall this season.

- The Blue Devils lead the nation in opponent average win percentage with Duke's foes winning 67.5 of their games this season. The simple RPI by HHS has Duke at No. 10.
- Individually, Delaney Thomas tops the list as one of Duke's most efficient players, averaging 1.15 points per possession and holding an efficiency rating of 62.9. Toby Fournier is right behind her at 0.98 PPP and 54.7 efficiency.

## IT'S A ONGOING BLOCK PARTY

- Featuring nine players standing 6-0 or taller, and five Blue Devils at 6-2 or taller, Duke is long and athletic and wreaks havoc defensively on the perimeter and around the rim. The statistics reflect that with Duke ranking third in the ACC and 12th nationally in blocks per game (5.9).
- Duke recorded an impressive 14 blocks against Baylor - tied for sixth in program history and the most since the 16 against Winthrop in 2016.
- The Blue Devils' 107 total blocks are 10th in the country. The 14 denials against Baylor are tied for the second most in a game by a Division I team this season.

## THE BLOCK PARTY HOSTESSES

- Toby Fournier (2.28/gm), Arianna Roberson (1.07) and Jordan Wood (1.06/gm) are the hostesses of the party, ranking second, 14th and 15th in the league in blocking average, respectively. Duke and Virginia are the only two teams in the ACC to have three players averaging 1.0 blocks.
- Fournier, with 40 blocks on the year, recently passed her blocks total of 39 in her 37 games as a rookie. She has tallied four blocks in five games and multiple blocks in 11 outings already this season. Fournier had 11 multiple-block games last year.



MARATHON MAIR AND JACKSON

- Seniors Taina Mair and Ashlon Jackson have been marathon women for the Blue Devils this season, averaging 33.9 and 33.7 minutes per game to rank fifth and seventh in the ACC, respectively. Duke, Cal and Notre Dame are the three ACC programs to have players averaging at least 33.0 minutes per game. The Irish have three players putting in at least 33 minutes per outing.
- Both Mair and Jackson have played 35-plus minutes in 11 of the 18 games. In Mair's previous 71 games at Duke, Mair played 35 or more minutes just eight times. Coming into the 2025-26 campaign, Jackson had played more than 35 minutes in 14 of her 103 contests.
- The last Duke player to average at least 33 minutes per game was Haley Gorecki during the 2019-20 season - playing an astounding 36.2 minutes per game.

DELANEY THE STEADY EDDY

- Junior Delaney Thomas is a consistent force for the Blue Devils and can be counted on for a solid six to 10 points per game. Averaging 7.0 points per game for her career, Thomas is steady on the offensive end, shooting at least 50 percent in 52 of her 88 career games. She owns 28 double-digit scoring games, 10 of which have come in the past 14 games. She is averaging 10.4 points per game this season, up 3.3 from last season and an increase of 5.5 from her rookie campaign.
- On the defensive end of the floor, Thomas averages 4.4 rebounds per game for her career and has collected five-plus rebounds in 35 contests. She is tied second on the team this season, averaging 5.7 rebounds per game and helps anchor the defense with 33 steals and a team-high four drawn charges.

ALL ABOUT ARI

- After missing 440 days due to injury, Arianna Roberson is back on the court and the reigning ACC Rookie of the Week following two strong outings in California. The redshirt freshman is tied for second on the team in rebounding (5.6). Roberson has scored at least three points in 14 of her 15 games and has three double-digit outings in the past five contests. She had her best defensive game of the season at Syracuse, pulling down a career-high 12 rebounds and blocking three shots. She is coming off a stellar 20-point outburst on 73 percent shooting at Cal and a six-point, six-rebound, two-assist outing at Stanford en route to her first ACC weekly award. She had 10 points, six rebounds and two blocks against Virginia.
- Arianna did not start playing basketball until middle school, and split her time between hoops and volleyball. She comes from a family of accomplished athletes. Her parents, John (basketball) and Lisa (volleyball), were athletes at New

Mexico State. Arianna is the youngest of seven - Ashlee (basketball at Texas Tech, 2007-10), Amber (volleyball at Texas, 2008-11), André (7 seasons in NBA), Arielle (basketball at Colorado, 2012-15, and WVU, 2015-16), Anthony (Central Oklahoma and for Thunder G League) and Aaliyah (women's basketball senior at TCU).

ACC ARI

- Freshman Arianna Roberson has stepped up her game as conference play has gotten started. The rookie center is averaging 9.3 points, 6.5 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.0 blocks per game in her six conference games. She is shooting 46 percent in league action, including 33 percent from distance.
- In her nine non-conference games, she averaged 7.3 points, 5.1 rebounds, 1.1 blocks and .78 steals per game. She shot 40 percent against the non-conference opponents and 31 percnet from behind the arc.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP FOR FOURNIER

- Toby Fournier is off to a great first half of her sophomore season, leading the Blue Devils in points and rebounding. Overall, Fournier is the top scoring forward in the league and ranks third overall in scoring in the ACC at 17.7 points per game.
- Fournier is eighth in scoring average for forwards from Power 5 basketball programs.

FOURNIER GETTING TO THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Able to post up and score, beat her defender off the dribble or pull up for a three, sophomore forward Toby Fournier is a triple threat, meaning she is the most fouled player in the ACC. She has drawn 81 fouls in the 18 games and leads the conference and ranks seventh nationally in free throws taken at 121. Only four players in the ACC and 34 nationally have attempted 100-plus free throws this season.
- Despite hitting just 51.0 percent of her freebies, Fournier ranks fourth in the ACC with 62 makes. In her rookie season, Fournier averaged 4.8 free throws per game. One year later, she is going to the line 6.7 times per game.

SHARING IS CARING

- Duke has done a good job of sharing the ball this season, averaging 17.2 assists per game to rank fourth in the ACC. The Blue Devils have 309 assists on 494 field goals for a 63-percent assist-to-field-goal ratio. Senior guards Taina Mair and Ashlon Jackson have been the most generous, dishing 92 and 77 helpers, respectively. They are responsible for 55 percent of Duke's assists through 17 games - 20 percent higher than the 2024-25 season (212 of 610 team assists).
- Through games Jan. 8, Duke is one of eight Division I programs to have two players average at least 4.0 assists per game.

ASHLON JACKSON FINDS WAYS TO IMPACT THE GAME

- Ashlon Jackson, often drawing the opponents' top perimeter defender, might not be shooting as well as she'd like (36% overall and 31% from three), but she continues to have an incredible impact in other ways. The senior captain has doubled her assist production from last season and is averaging 5.2 per game over the past eight games.
- Defensively, she has increased her rebounding average by 38 percent and has five five-plus rebound games - one more than she had in 37 games last year.
- Jackson got off to a slow start, going 12-of-44 (27.2%) in the first seven games. She has gotten into a better rhythm, knocking down 24-of-72 (.322) in the past 10, including 12-of-35 (.343) in league action.
- With 198 trifectas for her career, she needs just two more threes to become just the fifth player in Duke lore to reach 200. Her 566 attempts are fourth.

ASHLON JACKSON'S CAREER ARC ON THE COURT

- Senior leader Ashlon Jackson has taken big strides throughout her time under Kara Lawson's tutelage. As a freshman, Jackson came off the bench and averaged just 13.3 minutes per game and shot .315 from the floor. Three years later, Jackson joined the 1,000-point club in perfect fashion, draining a three-pointer against South Dakota State.
- The China, Texas, native took a leap forward in her sophomore year, starting all 33 games and averaging 29.2 minutes per game while shooting .384 from the field for the year. Last season, she tied the single-season record for three-pointers in a season (87), draining 12 more trifectas than she did in her two previous seasons combined.

ASHLON JACKSON'S CAREER ARC OFF THE COURT

- While Jackson's excellence on the court is impressive, perhaps more amazing is that the Blue Devil guard graduated from Duke in three years and is now pursuing her master's degree in her final year of athletic eligibility.
- Jackson graduated with a degree in sociology in May, 2025. She is in the middle of completing her Master of Arts in Liberal Studies (MALS) at Duke, giving her two Duke degrees in May.

"TANKING" CARE OF THE BALL

- Senior point guard Taina Mair has been excellent for the Blue Devils throughout her time quarterbacking the team in Durham. In her two-plus seasons as Duke's point guard, the Blue Devils are 63-26. For her career, Mair is 79-43 as a point guard.
- Year three in Durham so far has been the best for Mair, with 92 assists and 51 turnovers. She is fifth in the league in assists per game (5.1) and eighth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.91).
- The Boston native has improved her consistency each season at Duke and finished the 2024-25 campaign seventh in the ACC with an A/TO ratio of 1.81.

MAIR DOES IT ALL

- Mair has done it all this season for the Blue Devils. She has scored double-digits in nine of the 18 games, collected at least five rebounds in 11 contests, including 10 at Cal, and picked up three-plus steals eight times. The Boston native's 41 steals are fifth in the ACC. Mair has led Duke in points five times, rebounds four times, assists in 10 games and steals seven times.
- With 19 points and three assists at South Florida, Mair became the fifth player to reach 1,000 career points and 500 career assists while wearing a Blue Devil uniform. She is the sixth to hit 500 assists. Needing 12 rebounds to surpass 500, Mair

#### MORE ABOUT MAIR

- Mair, asked to be a pass first guard in her previous two seasons with the Blue Devils, has been more aggressive on the offensive end this season and it's paying off for the Blue Devils and the senior point guard.
- Mair, averaging 11.6 points, 5.2 rebounds, 5.1 assists and 2.3 steals per game, has nine double-digit performances this season - matching the nine she had in 37 games last year. She has increased her averages from last season in virtually every statistical category.
- Mair and Hannah Hidalgo of Notre Dame are the lone players in the ACC to average at least 10 points, five rebounds and five assists and two steals or blocks per game this season.

#### RILEY NELSON IS SO BACK

- Redshirt sophomore Riley Nelson saw her first action as a Blue Devil against Baylor in Paris. It was the first game for the Clarksburg, Maryland, native in 659 days, dating back to Jan. 14, 2024, in a Maryland uniform.
- Nelson is starting to figure out the Duke offense, distributing 30 assists during the nine-game win streak, 70 percent of her total of 43 this season. In the past nine games, Nelson is averaging 9.2 points, 3.6 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game with five double-digit outings, including a career-high 20 points against Boston College and a trio of critical three-pointers versus Notre Dame.

#### EMILEE SKINNER

- Duke freshman Emilee Skinner returned to the court against Virginia Tech - her first game since Nov. 14. Playing just 13 minutes, Skinner had her most productive game as a Blue Devil, finishing with seven points, seven rebounds and one steal.
- Skinner made her collegiate debut Nov. 12 with five assists and four points in 13 minutes before being sidelined for the next five games.
- The rookie guard was the No. 4 recruit in the espnW 2025 class, finishing her scholastic career with 2,313 points - fourth most in Utah state history. She was the third girls basketball player from Utah to earn McDonald's All-America honors, joining Timea Gardiner (2022) and Lehi's Michelle (2006).

#### LOOKING AT THE LAWSON COACHING ARC

- Kara Lawson has launched Duke women's basketball back into the national spotlight, totaling 94 wins over the previous four seasons and increasing the wins total from her first complete season (2021-22) through the 2024-25 campaign by 71 percent. Of ACC coaches who have been at their respective schools for at least five years, Lawson is second in wins in the first four years at the helm and leads the way in overall percentage increase from year one to year four. Winning her 100th game earlier this season, Lawson became the second fastest coach in ACC women's basketball history to reach the milestone - doing so in 143 games.

- Eight of the Blue Devils' non-conference matchups took place during the month of November. Duke played five games in 12 days - Nov. 9-20. The Blue Devils traveled to three different states Nov. 14-20 as the final six games of the month took place away from Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- Duke traveled nearly 1,800 miles from Nov. 13-20, making stops in West Virginia, Virginia and Florida during the eight-day span. The Blue Devils capped the month with a trip to Las Vegas, tacking on 4,600 more miles.
- Including the 8,100-mile round trip to Paris, the total mileage for the month of November was 14,500.

#### BRING IT ON!

- After finishing last season with the nation's No. 2 strength of schedule, the Blue Devils are once again set to face one of the nation's most daunting non-conference schedules ahead of ACC play.
- Nine of Duke's opponents competed in the 2025 NCAA Tournament, while six finished in the top 50 of the NCAA Evaluation Tool (NET) rankings: Baylor (Nov. 3), Norfolk

State (Nov. 12), West Virginia (Nov. 14), Liberty (Nov. 16), South Florida (Nov. 20), South Carolina (Nov. 26), UCLA (Nov. 27), LSU (Dec. 4) and South Dakota State (Dec. 18).

- Fleary headlines the class as a 5-7 point guard from Sidwell Friends, while Bella Flemings comes to Durham as a 6-0 combo guard out of San Antonio for SA Finest on the AAU circuit.
- Sainai Green is a 6-0 wing from Long Island Lutheran who averaged 20.1 points per game over her previous three seasons.
- Soflikanich is a 6-5 center from New Jersey. She heads into her senior season after scoring 271 points and pulling down 183 rebounds as a junior.

#### USA! USA! USA! LAWSON NAMED USA BASKETBALL WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM HEAD COACH

- Three-time Olympic champion Kara Lawson was named head coach of USA Basketball's Women's National Team Sept. 22, 2025.
- Lawson, who has earned 13 combined gold medals as a player and coach with USA Basketball, will lead the U.S. women at the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup (Berlin) and at the 2028 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Additionally, she will coach at qualifying tournaments, training camps and exhibitions throughout the Olympic cycle.
- This past summer, Lawson served as head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team at the FIBA Women's AmeriCup in Santiago, Chile, leading the Americans to a 7-0 record and the gold medal.
- Lawson recently was named USA Basketball 5-on-5 Senior Coach of the Year by the organization after leading the team to the U.S. to gold in Santiago.

### BIO SNAPSHOT

Former WNBA and three-time Olympic Champion Kara Lawson was named Duke University's sixth women's basketball head coach on July 11th, 2020. Lawson enters her sixth season at the helm in 2025-26. Through five seasons at Duke, Lawson has led the resurgence of Duke women's basketball, elevating the Blue Devils into one of the nation's most elite teams. She has compiled a 97-41 (.703) overall record and is just three wins away from reaching 100 career victories. This past year, Lawson guided Duke to its most successful season since 2012-13 as the Blue Devils went 29-8 overall, captured the 2025 ACC Championship and advanced to their 12th NCAA Elite Eight.

An icon in women's college basketball, Lawson's impact on the women's hoops community is evident. Lawson brought her decorated basketball career, both on and off the court, to the Blue Devils after spending the 2020 season as an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics. She was the franchise's first female coach in its 73-year history.

Additionally, Lawson's playing career has her in a league of her own as she is currently the only active NCAA Division I women's basketball coach to play in an NCAA Final Four, win a WNBA Championship and win an Olympic Gold Medal.

On Sept. 22, 2025, Lawson was named head coach of the USA Basketball Women's National Team through 2028. She was selected by USA Basketball's Women's National Team managing director Sue Bird and was approved by the USA Basketball Board of Directors. In this role, Lawson will lead the USA women at the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup in Berlin and at the 2028 Olympics Games in Los Angeles, in addition to coaching at qualifying tournaments, training camps and exhibitions throughout the Olympic cycle.

Lawson holds extensive experience with USA Basketball, racking up 13 career gold medals across her playing and coaching career with the organization. During the summer of 2025, Lawson served as head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team at the FIBA Women's AmeriCup in Santiago, Chile, where she led Team USA to an unblemished 7-0 record and the gold medal. Prior to that, she was an assistant coach for Team USA at the 2024 Paris Olympics and 2022 FIBA Women's World Cup (Sydney, Australia), aiding the United States to gold medals at both events. Since 2017, Lawson has helped lead USA Basketball women's 3x3 teams to seven gold medals, including the USA's 3x3 Women's National Team in its Olympic debut at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. She is one of only three women in Olympic basketball history to win gold as both a player and head coach.

In 13 WNBA seasons, Lawson averaged 9.8 points, 2.6 rebounds, and 2.5 assists in 377 career games with the Sacramento Monarchs, Connecticut Sun and Washington Mystics from 2003 to 2015. She surpassed 3,000 points, 800 rebounds and 700 assists in the WNBA. Lawson was the No. 5 overall selection by the Detroit Shock in the 2003 WNBA Draft. In addition to her WNBA career, which included winning a WNBA championship with the Monarchs in 2005 as well as an All-Star appearance in 2007, Lawson was a member of the Team USA roster that captured the gold medal at the 2008 Summer Olympic Games in Beijing.

A four-time All-SEC selection and two-time All-America at Tennessee, Lawson played for the late Pat Summitt where she led the Lady Vols to four straight SEC regular season and tournament crowns and three NCAA Final Four appearances (2000, 2002, 2003) during her collegiate career. Lawson appeared in 143 games, making 137 starts, and helped Tennessee to a 126-17 overall and 54-2 mark in the SEC over her four seasons.

Following an exceptional playing career, Lawson spent 17 years as a broadcaster, game and studio analyst for the Washington Wizards with NBC Sports Washington, as well as for men's and women's college basketball and the NBA with ESPN. On January 12th, 2007, she became the first female analyst for a nationally televised NBA game when the New Orleans Hornets squared off against the Washington Wizards. Lawson also served as a color announcer during the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo with NBC.
