GAME 21: AT GEORGIA TECH

- The Tar Heels (16-4 overall, 4-3 ACC) return to action on Saturday, January 31, at Georgia Tech.
- Tip time is 2 p.m. on the ACC Network (Wes Durham, Dennis Scott).
- The Yellow Jackets are 11-10, 2-6 in the ACC after consecutive losses to Clemson and at Virginia Tech.
- Carolina last played one week ago, an 85-80 win at Virginia. The Tar Heels trailed 43-27 late in the first half but went on a 31-14 run to take the lead seven-plus minutes into the second half. Jarin Stevenson's three-point play gave UNC the lead for good with 2:51 remaining, and he hit a three-pointer a minute later to increase Carolina's advantage to seven. Caleb Wilson's basket with 31 seconds to play sealed the win, the Tar Heels' second in a row in Charlottesville.
- Wilson led UNC with 20 points, tying UNC freshman records for consecutive double-figure scoring games to begin a career (20) and 20-point games (14).
- Stevenson scored a season-high 17 points, all in the final 12:42.
- It was the Tar Heels' largest comeback win since they beat UCLA last season in Madison Square Garden, also when trailing by 16.

- It was Carolina's third win over an AP-ranked team this season. The Tar Heels beat No. 19 Kansas in Chapel Hill, No. 18 Kentucky in Rupp Arena and No. 14 Virginia in John Paul Jones Arena, where UNC is now 6-8.
- Following wins last week over Notre Dame and Virginia, the Tar Heels moved up six spots in the Associated Press poll to No. 16.
- Carolina is 2-3 on the road this season and 4-4 in games away from Chapel Hill. That includes a 1-3 mark in ACC play and 1-0 in Atlanta. The Tar Heels defeated Ohio State, 71-70, in State Farm Arena on December 20 in the CBS Sports Classic.
- Georgia Tech is 10-4 at home with ACC losses to Syracuse, Pittsburgh and Clemson.

UNC-GEORGIA TECH

- Carolina is 73-28 all-time against Georgia Tech, including a win last season and wins in four of the last five games.
- The Tar Heels are 23-16 on the road against the Yellow Jackets, including 17-14 in McCamish Pavilion, formerly Alexander Memorial Coliseum. Carolina is 5-3 since 2014, when the arena was renovated and renamed McCamish Pavilion.
- Last season, the Tar Heels beat Georgia Tech, 68-65, in Chapel Hill in the ACC opener for both teams. Seth Trimble went 8 for 9 from the line, led Carolina with 19 points and had seven rebounds and four steals. The game was

tied nine times and there were 12 lead changes. Both teams shot under 40% from the floor and combined for 32 turnovers.

- The Yellow Jackets overcame an 11-point deficit in the first half to edge Carolina, 74-73, on 1/30/2024, the last time the teams met in McCamish Pavilion. RJ Davis led the Tar Heels with 28 points. The loss snapped a 10-game UNC win streak.
- Freshman forward Caleb Wilson is from Atlanta. He led Holy Innocents Episcopal School to the 2025 private school state title and was the Gatorade Player of the Year in the state of Georgia.

CAROLINA & THE ACC

- This is the 73rd season of competition in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Tar Heels were a charter member of the league, which began play in the 1953-54 season.
- Carolina is the only school with 50 or more combined ACC men's basketball championships (33 regular season and 18 Tournament). Duke is second with 44 (21 regular season and 23 Tournament) and NC State is next with 18 (seven regular season and 11 Tournament).
- Hubert Davis is 60-27 in regular-season ACC games. Only one other team has more ACC wins in the last five seasons.
- Davis led the Tar Heels to ACC records of 15-5, 11-9, 17-3 and 13-7 in the previous four seasons. The 2023-24 team won the regular-season title, Carolina's 33rd.
- Carolina is 775-323 (.706) in regular-season ACC games. The 775 wins are the most in ACC history. Duke is second with 745.

FRONTCOURT FORCE

- Junior center Henri Veesaar and freshman forward Caleb Wilson are combining for 36.5 points and 18.9 rebounds per game. They have blocked 51 shots, have 96 assists, shot 60.7% from the floor and attempted 241 free throws.
- Wilson is averaging 19.9 points and 10.1 rebounds, while Veesaar is averaging 16.6 points and 8.8 rebounds.
- The last pair of Tar Heels to average 16 points and eight rebounds in a season was Jerry Stackhouse and Rasheed Wallace in 1994-95.
- Combined, they have 21 double-doubles and scored 20 or more points 19 times.
- Per BartTorvik.com, Wilson leads the country in dunks with 62, while Veesaar is ninth with 40.
- Either Veesaar or Wilson has led the team in scoring 18 times in 20 games and in rebounds 18 times.
- They account for 44.2% of Carolina's scoring, 47.1% of the rebounds and 46.9% of the field goals made.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Caleb Wilson (11) and Henri Veesaar (10) rank one-two in the ACC and ninth and 14th, respectively, in the nation in double-doubles.
- Veesaar and Wilson both have recorded double-doubles in points and rebounds seven times (NC Central, St. Bonaventure, Kentucky, Georgetown, Ohio State, ECU and Florida State).
- Their seven games with double-doubles by both players already equal the third-most in a season by a pair of Tar Heels.

WILSON: MIDSEASON AWARDS CANDIDATE

- Caleb Wilson is one of the most productive and engaging freshman in Carolina Basketball history.
- On January 29, the Atlanta Tipoff Club named Wilson one of 25 players on the midseason watch list for the National Defensive Player of the Year.
- Wilson was one of 25 players named to the midseason watch list for the John R. Wooden Award, presented to the National Player of the Year by the Los Angeles Athletic Club, and the USBWA's Oscar Robertson Trophy.
- He was also one of 15 players named to the Midseason Watch List for the Wayman Tisdale National Freshman of the Year award.
- The 6-10 Atlanta native has made an immediate impact on the Tar Heel record book, becoming the first freshman to score 20 or more points in six consecutive games. The previous record was five by College Basketball Hall of Famer Phil Ford in 1974-75.
- Wilson has scored 20 or more points 14 times, including a season-high 26-point performance at Stanford. His 14 20-point games have already tied Tyler Hansbrough for UNC's single-season rookie record. Hansbrough scored 20 or more 14 times in earning first-team All-America and first-team All-ACC honors in 2005-06.
- Hansbrough, Rashad McCants, Wilson and Ford are the only UNC freshmen with 10 or more 20-point games.

- Wilson leads the Tar Heels in scoring, rebounding, offensive rebounds, steals, free throws (made and attempted) and blocks and is second in assists (five off the lead) and field goal percentage.
- His scoring average of 19.9 points per game is on pace to set the UNC freshman record.
- In seven ACC games, Wilson is averaging 20.3 points, 8.6 rebounds and 3.7 assists

- Hansbrough (in 2005-06) is the only Tar Heel freshman to lead the team in both scoring and rebounding. He also led the team as a freshman in steals. No Tar Heel freshman has ever led the team in scoring, rebounding, blocks and steals.
- Joseph Forte (16.7 ppg in 1999-2000), McCants (17.0 in 2002-03), Hansbrough (18.9 in 2005-06), Harrison Barnes (co-leader at 15.7 in 2010-11) and Cole Anthony (18.5 in 2019-20) are the freshmen who have led UNC in scoring.
- Hansbrough (7.8 rpg in 2005-06), Antawn Jamison (9.7 in 1995-96) and J.R. Reid (7.4 in 1986-87) are the freshmen who led UNC in rebounding.
- Wilson is averaging 10.1 rebounds per game. The UNC freshman record is 9.6 per game in 1995-96 by Jamison.

- Eighteen Tar Heels have averaged a double-double in points and rebounds in a season, but none of them were a freshman.
- He has scored in double figures in all 20 games and has 11 double-doubles, the second-most by a Carolina freshman. He has 12 or more rebounds in 10 of his 11 double-doubles, including a season-high 16 vs. Florida State.



SETH TRIMBLE hit two second-half three-pointers, scored 16 points and had no turnovers in the win at Virginia, Carolina's second straight on the Cavaliers' home court.

- With his 20 points at Virginia, Wilson tied Rashad McCants (2002-03) for the longest streak of double-figure scoring games by a UNC freshman to begin a season.

- Wilson leads the ACC in double-doubles (11) and rebounds per game (10.1). He is second among all freshmen nationally in double-doubles and is tied for third in rebounding.

- In Carolina's 79-66 win over Florida State, Wilson became the sixth Tar Heel ever with at least 20 points, 15 rebounds and five assists in a game, joining an illustrious list of Tar Heels that includes Billy Cunningham, Mitch Kupchak, James Worthy, Forte and Luke Maye.

- Against the Seminoles, Wilson became the third Tar Heel ever to lead UNC outright in a game in points, rebounds, assists and blocks (joining Jerry Stackhouse vs. Murray State on 3/17/1995 and Mike O'Koren vs. Detroit on 12/4/1978).

- Wilson set a UNC freshman record with four consecutive double-doubles against Radford, NC Central, Navy and St. Bonaventure. Bacot

(twice), Jamison and O'Koren were the only Tar Heel freshmen with three in a row.

- Against Navy, he became the first Tar Heel ever to score 23 points, grab 12 rebounds, make three blocks and have four steals in any game.
- He netted 22 points vs. Central Arkansas and 24 vs. Kansas to become the first Tar Heel freshman ever to score more than 20 points in his first two games.
- Wilson compiled a game-high 24 points with seven rebounds, four assists and four steals in the win over Kansas. He became just the second Tar Heel freshman (with Coby White against Virginia Tech in 2018-19) and the fourth Tar Heel regardless of class (with Walter Davis and O'Koren) to have at least 24 points, seven rebounds, four assists and four steals in a game.
- His 22 points in the opener vs. Central Arkansas were the fourth-most by a Tar Heel freshman in his debut since first-year players became eligible in 1972-73.

VEESAAR A DUAL THREAT

- Red-shirt junior center Henri Veesaar, a transfer from Arizona, leads the team in field goal shooting (63.0%) and three-point accuracy (47.3%), is second in scoring (16.6), rebounding (8.8) and blocks (23).
- The Estonia native scored the game-winner against Ohio State, had a game-high 17 points in the win at Kentucky and grabbed a career-best 15 rebounds in the win over Georgetown.
- Veesaar has 10 double-doubles as a Tar Heel, the first 10 of his collegiate career. He played in 66 games over two seasons at Arizona.
- He is second in the ACC and 14th in the country in both field goal shooting and double-doubles. He's also fifth in the ACC in rebounding and 10th in points per game.
- He scored in double figures in each of the first 19 games, a streak snapped at Virginia, when he scored seven.
- Veesaar has set numerous career bests as a Tar Heel, including points (26 vs. ETSU and Stan-

ford), rebounds (15 vs. Georgetown), offensive rebounds (six vs. Florida State), blocks (five vs. NC Central), assists (five vs. Ohio State) and three-pointers (four vs. ECU).

- He has established career highs in rebounds four times – 10 vs. Central Arkansas, 11 vs. NC Central, 13 vs. St. Bonaventure and 15 vs. Georgetown.
- He has scored 20 or more points five times – 26 vs. ETSU and Stanford, 25 vs. Wake Forest, 24 vs. the Bonnies and 20 vs. Kansas. He had one 20-point game in his first two seasons at Arizona.
- Veesaar leads UNC in plus/minus at plus 271 and has led the Tar Heels in plus/minus six times, which also leads the team.

HENRI THE FIRST

- Henri Veesaar is Carolina's first 7-footer ever to make multiple three-pointers.
- Veesaar is 26 for 55 from three and leads the team in three-point percentage (.473).
- He is tied for second on the team in three-pointers, three behind Luka Bogavac, in 36 fewer attempts.
- Prior to this season, two 7-footers made one three apiece. Serge Zwicker made a three in the ACC semifinals vs. Tim Duncan's Wake Forest Demon Deacons on 3/8/1997 and Walker Kessler made one vs. Northeastern on 2/17/2021.
- Veesaar has made two or more three-pointers eight times this season, including a career-high four vs. ECU.

TRENDING TOPICS

- Since the beginning of ACC play on January 3 at SMU, the Tar Heels are second in the nation in offensive efficiency, averaging 131.2 points per 100 possessions. Illinois is first (131.7) and Houston, Wisconsin and Texas Tech rank third through fifth.
- Offensively, the Tar Heels are 16th in the country in assist/turnover ratio, 29th in turnovers, 43rd in field goal percentage, and 45th in assists per game and effective field goal percentage.
- The Tar Heels are 26th in the country in field goal percentage defense, holding their opponents to a combined 39.9% from the floor. They've held seven opponents below 35% and 11 under 40%.
- UNC is 11-0 this season and 56-4 under head coach Hubert Davis when holding opponents under 40% from the floor and 0-4 this season and 6-19 under Davis when the opponents make 50%.
- The Tar Heel defense is fifth in the country in two-point field goal percentage defense (43.8%) and 18th in effective field goal percentage (46.4%).
- The Tar Heels held each of their first 14 opponents to fewer than 75 points. It was the first time Carolina held its first 14 opponents under 75 points since 1981-82.
- Carolina is making 8.8 three-pointers per game, which would be the all-time single-season UNC record, edging the 8.67 made per game in 2018-19, when the Tar Heel lineup included Cameron Johnson, Coby White, Kenny Williams and Luke Maye.
- Carolina has made 10 or more three-pointers seven times this season, including 23 against Notre Dame and 10 at Virginia in the previous two games.

• In ACC play, both the Tar Heels and their opponents are making threes at a higher rate than all season. Carolina is averaging 9.4 threes in the seven ACC games, including 10 or more three times. The ACC opponents are hitting 12.3 three-pointers per game, including a five-game stretch from SMU to Cal when they made 70, the most UNC ever allowed over five games.

- Five different Tar Heels have made at least 23 three-pointers – Luka Bogavac (29), Derek Dixon (26), Kyan Evans (26), Henri Veesaar (26) and Jonathan Powell (23).

• Carolina is attempting 25.5 three-pointers per game, which would break the previous school record of 23.9 in 2018-19.

- The Tar Heels attempted a season-high 34 threes against Notre Dame and made a season-best 13 vs. the Irish on January 21.

• The Tar Heels are making 8.8 threes per game while allowing 8.3. UNC is in on track to make more 3FG than its opponents for the fifth consecutive year. From 2006-07 to 2019-20, Carolina made more 3FGs one time (in 2012-13).

- The Tar Heels have won 19 straight games when making more three-pointers than their opponent. However, the opponents have made more threes in all four of UNC's losses this season (by a combined 18 in the four games).

• Including the win over Notre Dame, Carolina has made 50% or better of its field goal attempts in 10 of the first 20 games. The Tar Heels are 44-2 under Davis when they make at least 50% from the floor.

- Michigan State and Virginia are the only teams this season to outrebound Carolina. The Tar Heels are 102-26 under Davis when they outrebound their opponents.

• The Tar Heels committed four turnovers at Virginia, which tied the sixth-fewest in Carolina history. UNC is averaging 9.85 turnovers, the fewest in UNC history (previous low is 10.08 in 2023-24).

- Carolina committed 12 turnovers in the last two games (eight vs. Notre Dame and four at Virginia), which equaled the third-fewest ever in consecutive games. The record is 11 vs. NC State and Virginia in the 1982 ACC Tournament and against Duke/Clemson in 2023-24.

• Carolina has committed fewer than 10 turnovers in seven of the last 12 games.

- Including this season, Davis' teams have produced the four-lowest turnover per game averages and five of the six-lowest in UNC history.

• Carolina's assist/turnover ratio of 1.73 is the best in UNC history (1.65 in 2015-16).

- The Tar Heels force 9.6 turnovers per game. Carolina is 340th in the nation in forced turnovers. The 9.6 turnovers are the fewest forced in

500+ WINS IN THE SMITH CENTER

- This is the 41st season the Tar Heels are playing in the Dean E. Smith Center.
- The win over Wake Forest on January 10 was UNC's 500th in the Smith Center.
- Carolina is 501-90 in regular-season and NIT games in the Smith Center.
- UNC became the ninth current ACC team with 500 or more wins in their respective home venues.
- Carolina has won 84.8% of its games in the Smith Center. Only one team in the ACC that has 500 or more wins in its current venue has a higher winning percentage (.850 by Duke). Syracuse and Virginia are the only other ACC teams that have won 80% of their games in their current home arenas.
- Carolina's first win in the Smith Center came 40 years ago this week, on 1/18/1986, when No. 1-ranked UNC defeated No. 3 Duke, 95-92.
- Carolina is 260-71 (.785) in ACC games in the Smith Center.
- The Tar Heels have won 12 straight games in the Smith Center, all this season.
- UNC has played 46.4% of its home games in the Smith Center (591 of 1,275).
- Carolina has played 154 different opponents in regular-season or NIT games in the Smith Center.
- The Smith Center is the fifth home venue for the Tar Heels. Carolina has won 501 games in the Smith Center, 210 in Woollen Gym (1939-65), 170 in Carmichael Auditorium (1965-86, 2010), 130 in the Indoor Athletic Court (1924-38) and 63 in Bynum Gym (1911-23).

IN-SEASON AWARDS

- Freshman forward Caleb Wilson has earned National Player-of-the-Week honors twice this season. He was one of five players named National Player of the Week by the USBWA for the week of November 3-9 and he won the award from Andy Katz at NCAA March Madness for this play the week of December 15-21.
- Wilson also was named ACC Freshman of the Week twice, following the games against Central Arkansas and Kansas and against ETSU and Ohio State.
- He is the first Tar Heel to win multiple ACC Freshman-of-the-Week awards since Caleb Love was a two-time recipient in 2021.
- Wilson also was the ACC's Co-Player of the Week after the Central Arkansas and Kansas games.
- Wilson was the first Tar Heel freshman to also win ACC Player-of-the-Week honors since Cole Anthony in 2019-20.
- Wilson became the eighth Tar Heel to win ACC Player-of-the-Week honors as a freshman, joining Jerry Stackhouse (1994), Antawn Jamison (1996), Rashad McCants (2003), Tyler Hansbrough (2006), Brandan Wright (2007), Coby White (2019) and Anthony.

DEREK DIXON had 11 points and seven assists at UVA. The seven assists tied the single-game high for assists by any Tar Heel this season.



LUKA BOGAVAC tied his season high with three 3FGs at Virginia. The junior from Montenegro leads the Tar Heels with 29 three-pointers.

- Seth Trimble started 18 of UNC's 37 games last season. Even with Trimble's return, this is the first season in which UNC did not return a player who started at least half the games in the previous season since 2005-06, when the Tar Heels replaced all five starters from a national championship team.
- Carolina's probable starters against Georgia Tech have made a combined 92 college starts. That includes 32 by Trimble, 25 by Henri Veesaar, 20 by freshman Caleb Wilson, 12 by Jaydon Young and three by freshman Derek Dixon.
- UNC has used five different starting lineups in the first 20 games. Veesaar and Wilson have started all 20 games.

PRESEASON ALL-ACC, POLL

- The Tar Heels were picked to finish third in the 18-team Atlantic Coast Conference by the media at the ACC's preseason media day in Charlotte.
- Caleb Wilson was voted to the league's preseason All-ACC second team and the All-Freshman team.
- UNC was picked No. 25 in the country in the Associated Press preseason poll.
- This is the 69th different season in the 78-year history of the AP poll the Tar Heels have been ranked at any point in the AP poll.

HUBERT DAVIS: YEAR FIVE

- The 2025-26 season is Hubert Davis' fifth as head coach at the University of North Carolina and his 14th on the coaching staff at his alma mater. He is the only Tar Heel head coach to win 20 or more games in each of his first four seasons.
- Davis, 55 (turns 56 on May 17, 2026), has won National and ACC Coach-of-the-Year honors, led the Tar Heels to a national title game appearance, 116 wins, a 60-27 record and 25 road wins in ACC regular-season play, a regular-season ACC title and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Only one other team has won more ACC games in the last four years.
- Two of his players – RJ Davis and Armando

Bacot – rank second and third, respectively, in all-time UNC scoring, set numerous records and earned national and All-ACC awards.

- Carolina won its 100th game under Davis in the 2025 ACC Tournament, making him the third-fastest coach in UNC history and the sixth-fastest in ACC history to win 100 games. Only Duke's Vic Bubas, UNC's Roy Williams and Frank McGuire, Wake Forest's Skip Prosser and Maryland's Lefty Driesell reached 100 wins in fewer games than Davis (who won his 100th in 143 games).
- Under Davis, Carolina is 8-3 in NCAA Tournament play, including wins against three national championship-winning coaches (Baylor's Scott Drew, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski and Michigan State's Tom Izzo) and three other coaches who have taken teams to the Final Four (Marquette's Shaka Smart, UCLA's Mick Cronin and San Diego State's Brian Dutcher).
- Davis has led the Tar Heels to 17 wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including eight over top-10 teams (No. 4 Duke, No. 4 Baylor and No. 9 Duke in 2022; No. 6 Virginia in 2023; and No. 10 Tennessee, No. 7 Oklahoma, No. 7 Duke and No. 9 Duke in 2024).

2025-26 SCHEDULE NOTES

- In ACC play, the Tar Heels play host to Florida State, Wake Forest, Notre Dame, Syracuse (Feb. 2), Duke (Feb. 7), Pitt (Feb. 14), Louisville (Feb. 23), Virginia Tech (Feb. 28) and Clemson (March 3).
- Carolina plays at SMU, Stanford, Cal, Virginia, Georgia Tech (Jan. 31), Miami (Feb. 10), NC State (Feb. 17), Syracuse (Feb. 21) and Duke (March 7).
- UNC is not scheduled to play Boston College.
- This will mark the first season since 1919 the Tar Heels are not playing NC State in Chapel Hill.
- The Tar Heels played Kansas in Chapel Hill for the first time ever. Last year, the Jayhawks defeated UNC in Lawrence. The November 7 game was just the third on-campus matchup in 14 games between the Tar Heels and KU.
- The Tar Heels made their first trips as ACC opponents to SMU, Stanford and Cal.

CBS SPORTS CLASSIC EXTENSION

- UNC, Kansas, Kentucky and Ohio State will compete in the CBS Sports Classic the next four seasons.
- The Tar Heels are 8-4 in the event since the annual doubleheader was first played in December 2014.
- Next season, Carolina will play Kentucky on December 19, 2026, in Madison Square Garden.
- The Tar Heels will play Kansas in 2027-28, Ohio State in 2028-29 and Kentucky again in 2029-30.

HEAD COACH HUBERT DAVIS



HUBERT DAVIS
Head Coach

The 2025-26 season is Hubert Davis' fifth as head coach at the University of North Carolina and his 14th on the coaching staff at his alma mater. He is the only Tar Heel head coach to win 20 or more games in each of his first four seasons.

Davis, 55 (turns 56 on May 17, 2026), has won National and ACC Coach-of-the-Year honors, and led the Tar Heels to a national title game appearance, 117 wins, a 60-27 record and 25 road wins in ACC regular-season play, a regular-season ACC title and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Only one other team

has won more ACC games in the last four years.

Two of his players – RJ Davis and Armando Bacot – rank second and third, respectively, in UNC career scoring. Both set numerous records and earned national and All-ACC awards.

Carolina won its 100th game under Davis in the 2025 ACC Tournament, making him the third-fastest coach in UNC history and the sixth-fastest in ACC history to win 100 games. Only Duke's Vic Bubas, UNC's Roy Williams and Frank McGuire, Wake Forest's Skip Prosser and Maryland's Lefty Driesell reached 100 wins in fewer games than Davis (who won his 100th in 143 games).

Over the previous four seasons, UNC had the 10th-most wins among teams in the ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12 and SEC.

Under Davis, Carolina is 8-3 in NCAA Tournament play, including wins against three national championship-winning coaches (Baylor's Scott Drew, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski and Michigan State's Tom Izzo) and three other coaches who have taken teams to the Final Four (Marquette's Shaka Smart, UCLA's Mick Cronin and San Diego State's Brian Dutcher).

Davis has led the Tar Heels to 17 wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including eight over top-10 teams (No. 4 Duke, No. 4 Baylor and No. 9 Duke in 2022; No. 6 Virginia in 2023; and No. 10 Tennessee, No. 7 Oklahoma, No. 7 Duke and No. 9 Duke in 2024).

In 2024-25, the Tar Heels went 23-14 against the fifth-hardest schedule in the country, went .500 on the road and 13-7 overall in league play and won an NCAA Tournament game for the third time in his four seasons as head coach. Seven of the 14 losses came against teams seeded first or second in the NCAA Tournament. RJ Davis earned his third consecutive Dean Smith Award as Carolina's MVP, broke all-time school records for three-pointers and free throw percentage and ACC records for games played and

double-figure scoring games. Freshman Drake Powell became the 55th Tar Heel selected in the first round of the NBA Draft.

In 2023-24, Carolina won the ACC regular-season title with a 17-3 record, earning a No. 1 seed in the NCAA West Regional, where it advanced to the Sweet 16.

He was the 2024 ACC Coach of the Year. Davis also won ACC Coach-of-the-Year honors from the Associated Press, was the NABC's District 3 Coach of the Year and a semifinalist for the 2024 Naismith National Coach of the Year, the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year, the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year and the Skip Prosser Man of the Year awards.

Davis was the fourth UNC head coach to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament with Dean Smith, Bill Guthridge and Williams.

Carolina went 8-2 on the road in the ACC in 2023-24, clinching sole possession of first place in the ACC with an 84-79 win at ninth-ranked Duke. It was the second time in his first three seasons the Tar Heels closed the regular season with a victory at Duke.

RJ Davis was a landslide winner in the voting for 2024 ACC Player of the Year, was a unanimous first-team All-America (Associated Press, USBWA, NABC and Sporting News) and became the first Tar Heel to win the Jerry West Shooting Guard Award. He set UNC's single-season points record for a guard (784) and made the most three-pointers in a season by a Tar Heel (113).

Bacot earned his third All-ACC award in 2024 and third-team All-America honors (USBWA). He finished his career as UNC's all-time leader in rebounds and double-doubles and second in scoring, is among the top 10 in ACC history in each of those categories and the top 10 in NCAA history in rebounds and double-doubles.

Coach Davis led the Tar Heels to the 2022 NCAA East Regional championship, a win at Cameron Indoor Stadium in Mike Krzyzewski's final home game, another win over the Blue Devils in a historic Final Four matchup and a berth in the national championship game in his first season as a head coach. He was rewarded with two National Coach-of-the-Year awards as UNC won 17 of its last 21 games and came within a few possessions of securing the program's seventh NCAA Tournament title.

The 1992 Carolina graduate was named the 20th head coach of the UNC men's basketball program on April 5, 2021, becoming the fourth former Tar Heel player to become head coach and the first Black head coach in Carolina men's basketball history.

Davis played for Dean Smith at Carolina from 1988-92 and was an assistant coach on Roy Williams' staff from 2012-21.

He played a key role coaching, recruiting and scouting and was head coach of the UNC junior varsity program for six seasons from 2013-19.

Davis led the Tar Heels to a 29-10 record in his rookie season as head coach. UNC went 15-5 in the ACC to tie Notre Dame for second place, just a game out of first. The Tar Heels went 7-3 on the road in league play, including five straight victories at Clemson, Louisville, Virginia Tech, NC State and fourth-ranked Duke when UNC won 11 of 13 games to conclude the regular season.

UNC entered the 2022 NCAA Tournament as an eight seed but played some of its best basketball in winning the East Regional. The Tar Heels had 51 assists on 62 field goals and sank 24 three-pointers in the first- and second-round wins over Marquette and Baylor, when they routed the Golden Eagles by 32 points and eliminated the defending NCAA champion Bears in overtime.

Carolina trailed UCLA with two minutes left in the Sweet 16 but went on an 8-0 run to beat the Bruins and overpowered Saint Peter's, 69-49, in the regional final to send the Tar Heels to the Final Four for a record 21st time.

The Tar Heels defeated Duke, 81-77, in the national semifinals, the first time the two great rivals ever played in the NCAA Tournament. The game featured a dozen ties and 18 lead changes, 13 of which came in the second half.

Bacot earned third-team All-America and first-team All-ACC honors, setting the single-season UNC record with 511 rebounds and tying David Robinson's NCAA record with 31 double-doubles

In nine seasons on the bench with Williams, the Tar Heels played in eight NCAA Tournaments, advanced to the Final Four and national championship games in 2016 and 2017 and won the NCAA title in 2017. The Tar Heels went 228-95, including 107-60 in Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season play, winning the regular-season ACC title in 2016, 2017 and 2019 and the ACC Tournament title in 2016.

Carolina earned three No. 1 seeds and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament in those nine seasons. The four-year run from 2016-19 was the best four-year NCAA seed average in UNC basketball history.

Prior to joining Roy Williams' staff in 2012, Davis worked for seven years with ESPN as an analyst and co-host of the College GameDay program.

Born in Winston-Salem, N.C., Davis grew up in Burke, Va., where he attended Lake Braddock High School, the same high school UNC and US Soccer star Mia Hamm attended. Davis was a high school football teammate of future Olympic hurdles gold medalist Allen Johnson.

Davis played in 137 games as a Tar Heel from 1988-92, during which UNC went 102-37, won the 1989 and 1991 ACC Tournaments and played in the 1991 Final Four. He scored 1,615 points, an average of 11.8 per game. He still holds the UNC record for career three-point percentage at .435 (197 of 453). He scored in double figures 80 times with 23 games scoring 20 or more points.

He scored in double figures in each of his last eight NCAA Tournament games, averaging 18.5 points in those games. That included 19 against Temple in the 1991 NCAA East Regional final and 25 against Kansas (coached by Williams) in the 1991 Final Four.

Davis averaged 21.4 points and earned second-team All-ACC honors as a senior. He scored in double figures in 32 of 33 games that season, including 20 games with 20 or more points and 30 or more in four games. He netted a career-high 35 points at Duke on March 8, 1992. That 35-point game was part of a seven-game stretch late in the season in which he averaged 28.7 points.

The New York Knicks selected Davis with the 20th pick in the first round of the 1992 NBA Draft. He played 12 seasons in the NBA, scoring 5,583 points, an average of 8.2 per contest. He made 728 three-point field goals and enters the 2025-26 season second in NBA history in career three-point percentage at .441



behind only Steve Kerr.

Davis averaged double-figure scoring in four different seasons – a career-high 11.1 with Dallas in 1997-98 and with the Knicks in 1993-94 (11.0), 1994-95 (10.0) and 1995-96 (10.7).

He scored a career-high 32 points twice – as a second-year pro with the Knicks vs. Minnesota and in 2000 with Dallas against Seattle.

Davis played for NBA head coaches Pat Riley, Don Nelson, Jim Clemons, Leonard Hamilton, Doug Collins, Rick Carlisle and Larry Brown. His NBA teammates included Anthony, Chauncey Billups, Ewing, Michael Finley, Richard Hamilton, Michael Jordan, Jason Kidd, Steve Nash, Dirk Nowitzki and Rivers.

Upon retirement as an NBA player, Davis spent one season as a player development coach and TV analyst with the Dallas Mavericks.

Hubert's uncle, Walter, starred at UNC from 1973-77 and was a six-time NBA All-Star. He was the NBA Rookie of the Year in 1978 with the Phoenix Suns, who retired his jersey number. Walter died in 2023, just six months prior to being elected to the Naismith Hall of Fame.

Davis graduated from UNC in 1992 with a degree in criminal justice. He and his wife, Leslie, have three children – Elijah, Gracie and Micah.

Elijah is in his second season as a member of the UNC basketball team after playing three seasons at the University of Lynchburg. Gracie is a junior at Carolina, and Micah is a freshman at the University of Mary Washington, where he is playing soccer.

- Carolina is 26-18 against Kentucky. The 26 wins are the most by any non-SEC team against the Wildcats.
- It was UNC's fourth road win over a ranked team under Hubert Davis (also at Duke in 2022 and 2024 and at Clemson in 2024).

- Carolina's opponents have made 12, 14, 14 and 16 three-pointers in the last four games,

the most ever by the opponents (56) in any four-game stretch. The 30 three-pointers by Wake Forest and Stanford equal the most allowed by UNC in a two-game stretch (NC State and Clemson both made 15 in consecutive games in 2018).

- Stanford made 16 of 28 three-pointers. The Cardinal's percentage of .571 equaled the fifth-highest ever against UNC in a game the opponents attempted at least 20 three-pointers.

• Carolina shot 51.7% from the floor in the first half and 65.4% in the second. It was the first time UNC lost when shooting 50% from the floor in both halves since losing to Michigan State last season.

- The Tar Heels shot 58.2% from the floor for the game, their highest percentage in a loss since 3/8/2014, when they shot 59.6% in a 93-81 loss at Duke.

• Carolina shot 65.4% from the floor in the second half. That was the highest percentage in a half in a loss since 3/8/2002, when UNC shot 66.7% in the second half in a loss to Duke in the 2002 ACC Tournament.

- The Tar Heels made 16 of 17 two-point field goals in the second half. UNC was 1 for 9 from three and 8 for 16 from the free throw line in the second half.

• Carolina led for 37:56, the longest time it has held the lead in a loss this season.

- Carolina led by as many as 12 points in each half, including 67-53 with 14:47 to play. Twelve points is the largest lead in a loss since the 2022 NCAA championship game loss to Kansas, when Carolina held a 16-point advantage.

• Stanford shot 57.1% from the floor. UNC fell to 0-3 this season when the opponent shot 50%.

- The Tar Heels had seven assists on 32 field goals. The seven assists were a season low.

• Wilson set his career scoring high with 26 points and Veesaar tied his career high with 26 points.

- It was the first time UNC lost when two Tar Heels scored 25 or more points since 2018 at Clemson (32 by Cameron Johnson and 27 by Joel Berry II).

• Wilson led or co-led UNC in scoring (26), rebounds (9), assists (2), steals (2) and blocks (1). It was the seventh time ever a Tar Heel has led or co-led in those five categories. The last to do it was Coby White vs. Virginia Tech in 2019.

- Veesaar became the first Tar Heel to score 25 or more in consecutive games (25 vs. Wake Forest) since RJ Davis had 25 vs. Pitt and 30 vs. NC State in the 2024 ACC Tournament.

• It was the second game in a row and fourth time this season both Veesaar and Wilson scored 20 or more points.

- Wilson was 11 for 16 from the floor. The 11 field goals were the most by a Tar Heel since Ian Jackson made 11 last season at Notre Dame.

• It was Wilson's 12th 20-point game, which tied Rashad McCants for the second-most by a UNC freshman (Tyler Hansbrough holds the record with 14).

- Stanford's Ebuka Okorie led all scorers with 36 points, most by an opponent since Tennessee's Dalton Knecht scored 37 on 11/29/2023.

• Okorie, Ryan Agarwal (20) and Jeremy Dent-Smith (20) were the first trio to score 20 or more since Duke's Jared McCain, Kyle Filipowski and Jeremy Roach on 2/3/2024.

- Carolina lost its second straight game, the first time this season UNC has dropped back-to-back games.

- The Bears led by 17 at the half and by as many as 20 in the second half. Those were the largest deficits of the season. The previous largest halftime deficit was eight to Kansas. The previous largest deficit at any point was 16 to Michigan State.

- The Tar Heels are 5-2 against Cal, including 1-1 in Berkeley.

- Carolina outscored the Bears, 41-30, in the second half. It was the first time UNC outscored an opponent in the second half by double digits and lost since the Ole Miss game in the NCAA Tournament last season.

- This was the first time this season UNC never led.

- The Bears scored 10 of their first 12 points as second-chance points and outscored the Tar Heels, 18-10, on second-chance points. The 18 points were the most by an opponent this season (previous was 15 by Florida State).

- UNC missed 11 free throws. The Tar Heels went 17 for 28 from the line for 60.7%. It was the second straight game UNC shot a season-low percentage (20 or more attempts) after making 20 of 32 (62.5%) at Stanford.

- The Bears shot 50.0% from the floor (29 of 58). It was the third time in the last four games (all three were losses) the opponent shot 50% from the floor.

- Cal made 14 of 26 three-pointers (53.8%), including 10 of 16 (62.5% in the first half).

- It was the fourth consecutive game the opponent made 14 or more three-pointers and the fifth in a row with 12 or more.

- The 70 three-pointers were the most UNC has ever allowed in a five-game stretch.

- It was the second consecutive game the opponents made at least 50% from three-point range (Stanford was 16 for 28).

- It was the first time opponents made 50% from three in consecutive games since 2018, when NC State and Clemson both went 15 for 30 (50.0%).

- It was the third time in the last four games the opponent made better than 50% from three-point range (51.9% by SMU, 57.1% by Stanford and 53.8% by Cal).

- Cal scored 54 first-half points, most allowed in Davis' five seasons in the first 20 minutes. It was the third time in the last four games an opponent scored 50 points in a half (58 in the second by SMU, 50 in the second by Stanford and 54 in the first by Cal).

- Wilson led UNC with 17 points on 6 for 12 from the floor and 5 for 6 from the line.

- Veesaar recorded his ninth double-double (season and career) with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

- Both Veesaar and Wilson have scored in double figures in all 18 games.

- Wilson's 18 straight double-figure scoring games to begin a career as a freshman tied Brandon Wright (2006-07) for the second-most as a Tar Heel. Rashad McCants opened his career with 20 in a row in 2002-03.

- Dixon started for the first time, made a season-high four three-pointers and tied his scoring high with 14 (also had 14 against Georgetown).

- Carolina made a season-high 13 three-pointers (previous high was 12 vs. ECU and SMU).

- UNC rallied from a 16-point deficit to beat 14th-ranked Virginia, its largest deficit in a victory since trailing UCLA by 16 in the second half in a 76-74 win in New York City on 12/21/2024.

- Carolina became the first team to beat Virginia in Charlottesville this season (UVA was 10-0 at home).

- The comeback was UNC's largest of the season (previous was 10 points in the win over Kansas).

- Carolina trailed, 43-27, with 1:33 to play in the first half but scored the final seven points of the half to cut the deficit to nine at the break. The previous largest halftime deficit this season in a win was eight against Kansas.

- Virginia led by as many as 11 in the second half. It was the first time UNC has trailed by double digits in the second half and rallied to win since the UCLA game.

- The Tar Heels led for 7:02, their least amount in a win this season (previous 8:29 at Kentucky).

- Carolina's 85 points were the most by UNC against Virginia since a 93-81 win in Chapel Hill in 2013.

- The 85 points were the most by UNC in Charlottesville since a 110-76 win in 2005 (in University Hall).

- Carolina has won three in a row over the Cavaliers, including two straight in John Paul Jones Arena.

- The Tar Heels are 6-8 in John Paul Jones Arena and 46-38 in Charlottesville.

- It was Carolina's first ACC road win this season (1-3) and the second time UNC has won on the road against a ranked team (beat No. 16 Kentucky in Lexington).

- Virginia came into the game averaging 84.0 points, 10.6 three-pointers and 47.4% shooting from the floor. The Tar Heels allowed 80 points, the Cavaliers made eight 3FGs (two in the second half) and shot 45.3% from the floor.

- Carolina made 10 three-pointers and allowed eight. It was UNC's 19th-straight win when they made more threes than it allowed.

- Five Tar Heels, led by Wilson (20), scored in double figures. It was the second time this season five Tar Heels scored in double figures (also against Central Arkansas in the season opener).

- Wilson tied Rashad McCants' UNC freshman record (set in 2002-03) by scoring in double figures for the 20th consecutive time to begin his college career.

- It was Wilson's 14th 20-point game, which equaled Tyler Hansbrough's UNC freshman record, which Hansbrough set in 2005-06.

- Wilson had two blocks and two steals. It was the third game he scored 20 points and had multiple blocks and steals.

- Stevenson scored all of his season-high 17 points in the second half, including a dunk with 11:57 to play that gave UNC its first lead since first two minutes in the game. After UVA regained a four-point lead, Stevenson hit a three with 5:09 to play then converted a three-point play with 2:09 remaining for a 75-74 Tar Heel lead, which they held the rest of the game.

- Stevenson's six field goals (6 for 9) were a season high (five at SMU).

- Stevenson's 17 points were the fourth time he scored in double digits as a Tar Heel, and tied the most points off the bench by a Tar Heel this season (Powell had 17 vs. USC Upstate).
- Bogavac tied his season high with three 3FGs and scored 14 points, his most in an ACC game.
- Dixon hit two 3FGs, scored 11 points and had a game-high seven assists, which tied the most by any Tar Heel this season.
- It was Dixon's third start and third straight game making multiple threes and scoring in double figures.
- Dixon was a game-high plus 22 (Stevenson was second at plus 19). No other player on either team was better than plus 9. It was the first time Dixon has led UNC in plus minus. His previous best was +20 vs. NC Central.
- Powell led UNC with a season-high seven rebounds. It was the first time someone other than Wilson or Veesaar led UNC in rebounding since Powell co-led with Wilson against Michigan State. It was the first time a Tar Heel other than Wilson or Veesaar outright led the team in rebounding since Trimble against Kansas.
- Trimble scored 11 of his 16 points in the second half and did not have a turnover (had 11 in the previous four games).
- Veesaar's double-figure scoring streak ended at 19. He had a season-low seven points and one rebound.
- The Cavaliers beat the Tar Heels on the boards by 16 (44-28). It was only the second time this season UNC was outrebounded (also in the loss to Michigan State).
- It was the largest rebound margin in favor of the opponents since Duke outrebounded the Tar Heels by 16 in a 20-point Duke win on 2/5/2022.
- It was the largest rebound margin in favor of the opponents in a UNC win since 3/1/2003, when the Tar Heels beat Georgia Tech, 67-66, despite being outrebounded by 16 (22-38).
- Virginia grabbed 16 offensive rebounds that led to 17 second-chance points, one point shy of the season high by an opponent (18 by Cal last Saturday).
- Carolina committed only four turnovers, the fewest in the Hubert Davis era. The four turnovers equaled the sixth-fewest in UNC history and were the fewest since the Tar Heels set the single-game school record with two against Duke on 2/8/2018.
- The four turnovers equaled UNC's fewest in an ACC road game (also four at Pitt in 2015).
- The Tar Heels scored 19 points off 11 Virginia turnovers. The 19 points were the most by UNC in an ACC game this season and equaled the second-most in any game this season.
- Carolina scored 21 fastbreak points, most since it had 26 vs. Central Arkansas.

CREDENTIALS: Media seating in the Smith Center is located in section 212. Seats will be prioritized for media who regularly cover Carolina Basketball, the visiting team and national media.

Credential requests may be made online. Email Steve Kirschner at stevekirschner@unc.edu for the link where you may submit your request.

Single-game requests should be made at least 14 days prior to a scheduled game.

All photo/TV passes will be issued on a game-by-game basis. There are no season photo/TV passes.

Approved credentials may be picked up at media will call at Smith Center Entrance D, which will open two hours before the scheduled starting time. Entrance D is closest to the reserved parking lot behind the natatorium and the Smith Center/basketball offices.

MEDIA WORK ROOM: The media work room is located on the ground floor adjacent to the visiting team's locker room. Seats are typically assigned. Overflow seats are available at tables in the hallway outside the media room. Media may also choose to work from their seat in section 212.

MEALS: Light meals are provided at most games. Soft drinks and water are available while supplies last. There is a beverage cooler located just outside the media workroom.

PHOTO SPOTS/PHOTO WORKSPACE: Photo spots are assigned by half. Note your assigned seat may change by half. Credentials for photographers and videographers will be issued on a game-by-game basis and will be numbered to match the space on the baseline where they are assigned to shoot.

Workspace for photographers and videographers will be available in or just outside the media work room on the ground floor adjacent to the visiting team's locker room.

ARENA WiFi: Wireless Internet access is available in the arena. Instructions for logging on will be emailed to credentialed media. Please do not publicize the network or password for WiFi access. Live stats are available at UNC.statbroadcast.com.

MEDIA PARKING: Media parking is located in the Bowles Lot on Skipper Bowles Drive. Parking, if requested and approved at least 14 days before the game, will either be mailed to you or you may pick up at the Athletic Communications office in advance.

GPS Directions: Skipper Bowles Lot, S-11, UNC campus (there is no street address number for this lot).

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Carolina head coach Hubert Davis will conduct a postgame press conference in the media workroom. UNC players will be available for interviews in the team dining room just off the home tunnel.

Interviews with the visiting team at the Smith Center will be handled on a per-game basis. The visiting team may use the press room for an interview with the head coach, but it may choose to make its coach and players available for questions outside their locker room.

NON-GAMEDAY INTERVIEWS: Throughout the season, Davis and players will be available a day or two before select games. The schedule of these sessions will be updated throughout the season in UNC's media game notes.

Interview requests should be made through the athletic communications office. Contact Kirschner with interview requests for Coach Davis. Due to contractual obligations, Davis is unable to participate in live radio call-in shows.

Media should direct player interview requests to Matt Bowers (mattbowers@unc.edu, 919-619-7021). Player interviews typically occur before practice. Players are not available for interviews on game day or on non-practice days.

ACC COACHES ZOOM: Beginning January 5, Coach Davis will be available most Mondays for 10 minutes on the ACC media Zoom. Coaches do not participate if their teams play that evening (February 2 and 23 for UNC).
