FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT GEORGIA TECH IN ATLANTA ON SATURDAY AT 12 NOON

FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT GEORGIA TECH ON SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 28, 2026 AT 12 NOON

Florida State, which has won seven of its last 10 games since defeating Miami on January 20 in Coral Gables, travels to play at Georgia Tech at the McCamish Pavilion on Saturday, February 28, 2026 at 12 Noon. The Seminoles' game against the Yellow Jackets is the final game of a 'February to Remember' as they have won four of six games with victories at Notre Dame (February 7, 82-79), at Virginia Tech (February 14, 92-69), at home against Boston College (February 17, 80-72) and at No. 24 Clemson (February 21, 70-65) to vault first-year head coach Luke Loucks into the conversation for ACC Coach of the Year honors. Florida State has won seven ACC games beginning with a 65-63 win over Miami on Coral Gables (January 20) and are looking for their fifth won of the month of February when it plays at Georgia Tech. Following Saturday's game against the Yellow Jackets, the Seminoles close out their season with games at Pitt (March 4, 2026, 9:00 p.m.) and at home against SMU (March 7, 2026, 2:00 p.m.). A group of six Florida State player will be recognized on Senior Day prior to its game against the Mustangs (Lajae Jones, Kobe MaGee, Robert McCray V, Shah Muhammad, Alex Steen, and Chauncey Wiggins).

SEMINOLES' MCCRAY V NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Florida State senior guard Robert McCray V, who averaged 28.0 points in Seminole victories over Boston College and No. 24 Clemson last week, has been named as the ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career on February 23, 2026. In addition to averaging 28 points McCray V shot .559 from the field (19 of 34), 467 from the 3-point line (seven of 15), and .846 from the free throw line (11 of 13). He scored 27 points in Florida State's victory over Boston College (February 17) and 29 at Clemson (February 21). McCray V totaled his second consecutive 20+ point game against Clemson as he scored his ACC career-high of 29 points in the Seminoles' victory over the Tigers on Saturday in Littlejohn Coliseum. He scored 27 points in Florida State's victory over Boston College and 29 against Clemson. McCray V has scored 20 or more points in six ACC games, 20 or more points in eight games as a Seminole, and in 33 career games entering Saturday's game against Georgia Tech averaging 15.5 points per game. McCray V is the first Seminole to earn ACC Player of the week honors since Jamir Watkins on January 20, 2024 and the first to earn ACC POW honors during the ACC schedule since RaiQuan Gray on February 15, 2021.

FLORIDA STATE IS THE FIRST TEAM IN THE ACC TO GO FROM 0-5 IN LEAGUE PLAY TO .500 AFTER 14 GAMES

With its 70-65 victory on February 21 at Clemson, Florida State became the first team in ACC history to go from 0-5 to 7-7 in regular-season league play. Counting only seasons in which teams played or are scheduled to play more than or equal to 14 regular-season conference games, the 2025-26 Seminoles became the 52nd ACC team to start 0-5. They are the first of the 52 to get to the .500 mark at any point.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

- ...Defeat Georgia Tech and gain its second consecutive victory over the Yellow Jackets. The Seminoles defeated Georgia Tech, 91-78, in Tallahassee on January 18, 2025 with their highest scoring output in the series since scoring 108 points in a 111-108 Yellow Jacket victory on February 11, 1999 in Tallahassee;
- ...Defeat Georgia Tech and win its fifth game of the month of February thus enjoying its most successful second month of the calendar season since also winning five games against Wake Forest, Virginia, Pitt, Miami, and Boston College in finishing 11-4 in ACC play during the 2020-21 season.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE DEFEATING MIAMI ON JANUARY 20

Florida State is 7-3 in ACC play since winning at Miami, 65-63, on January 20. The Seminoles have won three of their last four, six of their last eight, and seven of their last 10 games with victories over Miami (January 20, 65-63), Cal (January 28, 63-61), Stanford (January 31, 88-80), at Notre Dame (February 7, 82-79), at Virginia Tech (February 14, 92-69), Boston College (February 17, 80-72), and at No. 24 Clemson (February 21, 70-65).

FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY

Florida State enters Saturday's ACC road game at Georgia Tech with four conference road victories (at Miami, at Notre Dame, at Virginia Tech and at Clemson, and are one of six conference teams with four or more road victories (Duke, 7, Virginia 7, Miami, 6, Clemson, 6, NC State, 6, and Florida State, 4). The Seminoles most recently won five or more ACC road games (six) during the 2019-20 season when they won the first ACC regular season ACC Championship with a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 conference record (10-0 at home and 6-4 on the road). The Seminoles were the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament before the quarterfinals, semifinals, and championship game of the tournament were cancelled on March 12, 2020. The Seminoles have also won at least five ACC road games in five different years: 1992, 6; 1993, 5; 2010, 5; 2014, 5; and 2020, 6.

SEMINOLES SET SCHOOL RECORD FOR 3-POINT SHOTS ATTEMPTED; APPROACH RECORD FOR 3-POINT SHOTS MADE

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Georgia Tech ranked fourth in the ACC in 3-point field goals made (285) and second in the league statistics for 3-point field goals attempted (894). The Seminoles' 285 3-point field goals made are ranked second in school history for a single-season and are only 11 shots made from distance from trying the all-time school record for 3-point field goals made in a single season (296 in 20023-04) The Seminoles established a new single-season school record for 3-point field goals attempted in a single season against Boston College and enter Saturday's game against Georgia Tech with 894 3-point field goals made - an ongoing school record.

FLORIDA STATE TIES SEASON HIGH FOR BLOCKED SHOTS AGAINST MIAMI

Led by a career-high tying three blocked shots by Lajae Jones, the Seminoles blocked a season-high tying seven shots against Miami on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. Coupled with their seven steals against the Hurricanes, the Seminoles totaled at least seven blocked shots and at least seven steals in the same game for the third time this season. In two games against Miami the Seminoles blocked 13 shots and earned 19 steals.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN TURNOVERS FORCED; SECOND IN TURNOVER MARGIN

Florida State has forced an ACC-high 391 turnovers for an average of nearly 14.0 turnovers forced in its first 28 games of the season. The Seminoles are just nine turnovers away from forcing 400 or more turnovers for the third consecutive and for the eighth time in the last 10 seasons. The Seminoles are ranked second in the ACC in turnover margin this season (+2.79) after ranking eighth in the ACC with a +1.2 turnover margin during the 2024-25 season.

LAST GAME AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Taylor Bol Bowen scored a career-high 20 points, and Malique Ewin earned his fourth consecutive double-double of 17 points and 11 rebounds to lead Florida State to its second consecutive ACC victory with a 91-78 win over Georgia Tech at the Donald L. Tucker Center on January 18, 2025. Bol Bowen and Ewin led three Seminoles in double figure scoring as senior Jamir Watkins scored 17 points. Bol Bowen topped his previous career high of 17 on a dunk with 3:11 remaining in the game. He reached the 20-point plateau for the first time in his career in another dunk with 1:59 remaining in Florida State's fourth win in its last five conference games. Florida State started hot and gathered a tremendous amount of momentum early on both ends of the court. Ewin scored the first basket of the game and Florida State never trailed.

7 Senior Lajae Jones has scored in double-figures in seven straight games and is averaging 15.9 points per game since scoring 18 points against Stanford (January 31).

10 Sophomore AJ Swinton has 10 steals in his last 11 games including two each at Miami (January 20) and against Virginia (February 10).

16 Senior Kobe MaGee has at least one steal in 16 of Florida State's 28 games this season. He has 27 steals in his 28 games played this season.

17 Senior Martin Somerville has 17 steals in the last 10 games for an average of 1.7 steals per game. He totaled seven steals in two games against Miami including four against the Hurricanes on January 20.

39 Senior Alex Steen has pulled down 861 rebounds. He needs just 39 rebounds to reach 900 for his career.

42 Sophomore Martin Somerville has a team-leading 42 steals for a 1.5 steals per game average in the first 28 games of his Florida State career.

45 Senior Lajae Jones has made 45 3-point field goals this season. His single-season career-high is 49 3-point field goals made during the 2024-25 season while he was a St. Bonaventure.

91 Senior Chauncey Wiggins has made 91 career free throws and needs nine free throws made to reach 100 for his career.

99 Senior Robert McCray V has pulled down 9 career offensive rebounds. He needs just 1 offensive rebound to reach 100 for his career.

Lajae Jones – A Great Shooter On A Team of High Level Shooters

TALLAHASSEE – Just before one of the final practices of his first summer at Florida State, head coach Luke Loucks gathered his team on the court at the FSU Basketball Training Center and cued video coordinator Kyle Washington to start an eye-opening series of shots.

Once the video started, Loucks began to count ...

1 ... 2 ... 3 ... 4 ... 5 ... 6 ... 7... 8 ... 9.

When he got to nine, he led a loud cheer with his team as they had just witnessed nine consecutive 3-point shots made during an earlier scrimmage by newcomer Lajae Jones, a transfer from St. Bonaventure University.

"We've got some serious high-level shooters," said Loucks as he extolled Jones's nine consecutive made 3-point shots. "And that's from me coming from the NBA, where it's the best shooting in the world. We have some guys who can really, really shoot the ball."

A natural lefthander with a disruptive 6-10 wing span, Jones comes to Florida State known both for his offense and as a lock down defender. In three collegiate seasons and 80 career games played – most recently at St. Bonaventure in the Atlantic 10 during the 2024-25 season -- he averages 12.2 points scored and shoots .399 percent from 3-point range. Jones averaged nearly 50 made 3-point shots in the last two seasons.

In his only season at St. Bonaventure, he averaged 10.8 points and 5.8 rebounds in leading the Bonnies to the 2025 NIT.

Jones was born into a basketball family and has been told that his father, Jackie, put a basketball in his hands the day after he was born.

"My parents have had a very big impact on my life and my basketball career," said Jones. "They sacrificed a lot of their time for me to play the game I love. My mom and dad blessed me with a very good childhood."

It's also from his parents that he got his first name. LaJae's dad wanted him to be known as 'Little Jackie' without having the formal name of Jackie.

Jones credits his father with instilling the love of basketball into his everyday life.

Jackie was an All-American at Barton Community College and finished his career as one of the most prolific players in Cougar history. He averaged a double-double in points and rebounds in helping Barton to a program record for wins, including the program's highest ever ranking. Jackie moved onto the University of Oklahoma where he is still in the Sooners' record book for blocks during his 'Big Eight Newcomer of the Year' season. He averaged 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds during his one season at Oklahoma and was a member of the Dallas Mavericks' roster prior to the start of the 1991 NBA season.

"My father impacted my basketball career by teaching me how to play the game the right way," said Jones. "He instilled a work ethic in me and always pushed me to improve myself. No matter what, he has always had my back."

Jones followed his dad to Barton C.C., following his first collegiate season at Tarleton State.

And what a year it was.

Jones led the Cougars to the junior college national championship, leading the team in scoring (15.4 points per game), rebounding (9.2 rebounds per game) and field goal shooting percentage (.540). Barton finished with a 36-1 record – a record that included a 27-game winning streak. Jones earned All-American Second-Team honors from the National Junior College Athletic Association, was named to the Region VI/KJCCC (Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference) First Team, and was named as the Most Valuable Player of the NJCAA Division I Tournament (winning the William French Most Valuable Player Award).

While he was staring at Barton during the 2023-2024 season, he was on hand to watch in person as his father was inducted into the Barton Community College Athletics Hall of Fame.

"It was a great experience for me," said Jones. "My dad had me come up and give a speech at the last minute. I had to come up with something to say; the speech and the ceremony turned out great."

Jones celebrated his father's Hall of fame induction with a 19-point, four-rebound effort in a 71-65 win over Cloud Community College on January 31, 2024 – the day of his father's ceremony on the Barton campus.

As illustrated by his statistics throughout his career, Jones has always been an exceptional player.

He totaled 1,426 points, 594 rebounds, 197 assists, 176 steals and 165 blocks in his high school career at Duncan U. Fletcher in Jacksonville. Upon his graduation in 2022, he became the first player from Fletcher since 1997 to sign a scholarship at a Division I men's basketball program directly out of high school.

In three seasons as a collegian, he is shooting .508 percent from the field, .394 from the 3-point line, and .760 percent from the free throw line. He's made 95 career 3-point shots and needs just 26 points to reach 1,000 career points for his career.

As he makes the journey down Interstate 10 from his hometown on the Gold Coast of Florida, he is squarely focused on earning his degree in social science in May of 2026 and being the best version of himself on the basketball court.

"With Coach Loucks and his staff coming from the NBA, I am looking forward to continuing to improve as a basketball player," said Jones. "The NBA knowledge of our coaching staff at Florida State definitely influenced me to become a Seminole. I felt like Florida State under Coach Loucks was the best fit for my style of play and Florida State University was the best fit academically."

One of Jones's most vivid memories of his first season at Florida State will certainly date back to the beginning of his Seminole career when Loucks made a big deal of his success from the 3-point line in a mid-week practice during his third month on campus.

"It definitely felt good for Coach to show that clip," said Jones. "All of the coaches like to celebrate the big wins as well as the little wins, too. That's a big part of what's going to make this year special for me."

The game served as the final exhibition contest for both teams as the 2025 season approaches on November 3 against South Florida for Florida A&M and on November 4 at home against Alcorn State for Florida State. TALLAHASSEE – Senior Robert McCray V was credited with a school-record 17 assists, and Luke Loucks won his first game as the Seminoles' head coach in a 108-76 season-opening win for the Seminoles over Alcorn State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. McCray broke the school record for assists in a single game, formerly held by Otto Petty in 1972 and matched by Tony William in 1983. With 12 points to go along with his 17 assists, McCray became the first player to record a double-double in a season-opener since Malik Osborn totaled a double-double of 18 points and 13 rebounds against Penn on Nov. 10, 2021. Loucks earned his first victory as Florida State's head coach as he became the eighth Seminole coach to win his first game. Every coach in school history has now won his first game as Florida State's head coach. McCray V also was the first player to record at least 13 assists since Loucks recorded 13 against North Carolina in leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history on March 11, 2012. The Seminoles' 2025 season opened with an alley-oop slam from McCray to Alex Steen.

TALLAHASSEE – Florida State senior Lajae Jones scored a game-high 20 points, and the Seminoles made a near-school record 18 3-point shots, as they won their second consecutive game to open the season with a 101-64 win over Alabama State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles made 18 3-point shots (two shy of tying the school record for 3-point shots made in a game) while attempting a school and ACC record 47 3-point field goals. The 18 3-point baskets made by the Seminoles rank as the third highest total for made 3-point shots in a single game at Florida State and the most made since Florida State made 17 against Clemson on Feb. 5, 2017. TALLAHASSEE – Florida State's Lajae Jones scored a career-high 36 points – and tied the single-game school-record for 3-point shots made with 10 – to lead the Seminoles to a 98-72 victory over Georgia Southern at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Jones tied the all-time school record for 3-point shots made in a game first set by George McCloud at La Salle on Feb. 23, 1989. BLACKSBURG, Va. - Sophomore Martin Somerville scored 23 points to lead the Florida State men's basketball team to a 92-69 victory over Virginia Tech. Trailing 42-39 at the half, the Seminoles outscored the Hokies 53-27 in the second half to secure their fourth win in the last five games. The win was FSU's first win in Blacksburg since February 2020 and its third ACC road victory of the 2025-26 season. With steals

from AJ Swinton and Somerville, Florida State reached 201 steals this season, becoming the third ACC team to surpass the 200 mark. The Seminoles also now have 95 total blocks, led by Lajae Jones with three in Saturday's win, tying his season high. Alex Steen added two blocks to match his season best. Virginia Tech led 17-11 just over six minutes into the game before Florida State trimmed the deficit to 26-22 with 7:57 left. Chauncey Wiggins converted a dunk off a forced turnover to keep the Seminoles within striking distance. Jones added two driving layups and grabbed four rebounds in the first half.

TALLAHASSEE - Florida State outscored Boston College 17-5 in the final 4:36 to erase a 14-point deficit and defeat the Eagles by an 80-72 margin at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles trailed the Eagles by a 68-63 score with 4:51 remaining to play and held the visitors to two field goals the rest of the way to gain their sixth ACC win in their last eight games. Florida State trailed by 14 points in the first half and took the lead for good on a 3-point shot by Chauncey Wiggins with 1:49 remaining in the game. Robert McCray V led the Seminoles with 27 points to lead four Seminoles in double-figure scoring.
